





Invitations have been issued to many overseas shooters who competed this year. It is hoped the U.S. Army Marksmanship Unit at Fort Benning will again send a team, and that John Primrose and Susan Nattrass from Canada will make the trip.

The New Zealand Olympic Discipline Training Squad plans to compete, following confirmation from squad chief

Gavin Searle.

An International Teams Match will be conducted in conjunction with the first 150 targets of the Commonwealth/Australia Games Championships in both disciplines.

I refer to the photograph of the 1938 I.C.I. shoot published on page 19 of the February, 1984 issue of "Shooting News" and the subsequent letter from P. Ferris, Traralgon, Vic. on page 11 of the May 1984 issue.

It may be of interest that the shooter "Baker (N.S.W.)", as set out in the latter item, is, in fact, Alex Baker, of the Tumut Gun Club.

At the time of the photo Alex was a member of Ganmain Gun Club, of which he was a foundation member and President, and which was formed in 1925 and still operates.

In 1946 he moved to Tumut where he initiated the formation of the local club.

Alex did much towards improving the Club facilities and locations and has seen various ranges come and go until the present time, at which a permanent range with full club house facilities, etc. has been established.

He was, in about 1970, given Life Membership for his services to this Club.

At the age of 84 he still competes, using a side by side Purdey, and shows that he has lost little of the past ability for which he was noted.

Amongst his many recollections are the "Eley Universal" cartridges, which were loaded with black powder and priced at 2/6 per box.

NEW ZEALAND DUMPS REGISTRATION - ROSS WILLIAMS

Ross Williams is the Technical and Reloading Editor of the Australian Shooters' Journal and the former Shooting Editor of the old Australian Outdoors magazine.

He also writes a regular column, "Firearms & Shooting", for the sports pages of the Weekly Times. This newspaper, published by the Herald & Weekly Times Ltd, 44 Flinders St, Melbourne, 3000, is available in most states.

The following three pieces are reprinted from the editions of the Weekly Times indicated by the dates.

When its Arms Act 1983 came into effect last June, New Zealand put an end to 64 years of rifle registration and 16 years of shotgun purchase permits (registration of shotguns having been abandoned back in 1930).

Under the new system, people who own or use firearms are issued with a firearms licence if the police consider them fit to be licensed. This licence entitles the holder to buy, sell and borrow rifles and shotguns without notifying the police.

Pistols and "restricted" firearms, however, continue to be recorded by the police computer at Wanganui.

NZ authorities did not seriously question the value of the old system until 1973 — the year that Victoria threw out registration of centrefire rifles after lengthy deliberations. Thus there is a touch of irony in the fact that Victorias. Cain government re-instituted and widened the reach of long arms registration in the very same year that New Zealand finally dumped it.

Now, Australian gun laws differ from state to state. Some jurisdictions have long arms registration; others do not. Consequently, where gun laws are concerned, Australia is its own laboratory.

Statistics show NO correlation between the practice of registration and the incidence of crime, violence, suicide, accidents and vandalism involving firearms. (See the relevant chapters in Prof. Richard Harding's book, Firearms & Violence in Australian Life, published by the University of Western Australia).

Registration confers no benefit on society — in fact, it is counter-productive because it wastes time and resources and causes conflict.

As shooting organisations are quick to point out, effort ought to be directed towards developing programs and facilities for training people in safe and responsible gun handling. These organisations do what they can but government assistance is urgently needed.

In support of registration, Mr Race Mathews, Victoria's Minister for Police and Emergency Services, has argued that police need to know what firearms are in a house when attending a domestic disturbance.

But the precise make and calibre (or gauge) are irrelevant at such close quarters. Police can get all they need to know from the categories on the computerised shooter's licence.

Mr Mathews has also said that registration records will assist in returning lost or stolen firearms to their owners. New Zealand's answer makes more sense, however. The new NZ licence form has provision on the back for licensees to record details of their firearms after they receive the licence. None of this information goes into the police computer unless a firearm goes astray. The missing firearm's details will then be recorded; if it is recovered, the police will be able to locate the owner.

To assist with the introduction of the new firearms legislation, the NZ Police Department put out a paper called **Project Foresight** — **Licensing Firearm Users**. This tells why registration was introduced in 1920, why its value began to be questioned, the reasons for abandoning it, and the rationale for switching to licensing of the person. Since its contents have a bearing on the local situation, I will

summarise as much as possible of it next week. (Wednesday, September 26, 1984).

New Zealand has scrapped the general principle of firearm registration and now restricts the record-keeping to pistols, "restricted" firearms and those reported by their owners as lost or stolen.

The new system, which dates from June 1st, is based on a licence issued for life to persons who own or use firearms. To assist with its introduction, the New Zealand Police Department put out a paper called "Project Foresight".

This document gives the background to the NZ Arms Act 1983 and supports many of the things that Australian shooting organisations have been saying about gun laws in general and shoulder arms registration in particular.

A copy of the complete paper can be obtained from the Australian Firearm Law Institute, GPO Box 1434M, Melbourne 3001. Here, without comment, is a summary.

Summary

During the drafting of the Act many fundamental issues were addressed and critically examined. Amongst these was the question of whether the registration of firearms was achieving its purpose.

However, you can't tell whether a measure is achieving its purpose unless you know precisely what that purpose is — and it was discovered that no one was sure why registration had been introduced in the first place.

Research revealed that registration of rifles, shotguns, pistols and restricted firearms started with the Arms Act of 1920. Three factors (the recent Russian revolution, the problems associated with ex-servicemen returning to the workforce and the many firearms brought back from the war) led to the fear of riot and revolution in New Zealand. It was felt that firearms registration would control the risk. In short, registration was introduced largely for political reasons.

By 1928 the sheer volume of work in registering all firearms was proving difficult for the police. In 1929 the government tried to dispense with shoulder arms records but was defeated in the Upper House. The compromise reached in 1930 was to drop the registration of shotguns. They have not been registered since, although a permit to procure shotguns was brought in in 1968.

Whether the police in 1920 intended to use the records for locating offenders is open to speculation. In recent times, however, many believed that this was the primary reason for keeping a register. Therefore the next question concerned the value of the register to the police in the location of offenders. Here research proved inconclusive and it was thought reasonable to assume that the records were of only limited value, for the following reasons.

First the firearm used in a crime has to be found. If it is found but has never been registered, the police will have no record of it. If it does not have a serial number the index cannot be used. And if the offender has stolen the firearm he cannot be traced through it.

From this a third question arose: could the cost of maintaining a registration system be justified in view of its limited usefulness?

Between 1967 and 1973, the police had tried to bring the records up to date and found it impossible. There was no way to seek correctness and completeness short of calling every firearm owner in the country into police stations with their firearms—and even this extreme measure could not guarantee accuracy in either the short term or the long. So the answer was clearly no.

We will conclude the summary of this important paper next week. (Wednesday, 3 October, 1984).

Inspector Neville Cook, representing the NZ Police Department, told those present at the 1980 International Shooting Sports Symposium in Wellington that his department saw no reason for stricter controls on firearms ownership.

"No one," he said, "has yet been able to establish with any degree of certainty that an increase in the number of lawfully held firearms in the community is in any way tied to the increased use of firearms by criminals."

This precise point does not appear in the NZPD's paper, "Project Foresight", which gives reasons why our trans-Tasman cousins have rejected calls for the return of shotgun registration, terminated 64 years of rifle registration and brought in a licence system.

However, like other points made in the paper, it accords with the results of research in other countries.

Supporters of registration have tried to belittle this research in various ways. For example, by using jargon—statements like Inspector .Cook's are dismissed as examples of the "Swissraeli argument" (Switzerland and Israel are countries which have very high rates of arms ownership and relatively low rates of crime and personal violence involving firearms).

It's an old ploy: instead of examining the evidence closely, you hang a title on it — preferably one with slightly derisive overtones.

Another technique is to cast aspersions on the psychological health of people who show an interest in firearms. A third is to argue that registration is "common sense", that it "must" be a good thing.

But none of these responses addresses the heart of the matter. The plain and simple fact appears to be that nobody has hard evidence sufficient to refute the research. As the NZ paper clearly shows, shoulder arms registration is a wasteful practice which diverts time, energy and money up a blind alley.

It then goes on to summarise the rationale for the new system, based on a licence issued for life unless revoked. The key points are as follows:

• Through the Wanganui computer, the police will have immediate access to details of licensed firearm users and will be able to speedily determine who is in unlawful possession.

Recreational shooters will be able to pursue their sport without undue restrictions.

Police time will be freed for productive work.

The Act gives the authorities the power to come down hard on offenders. For instance, a \$4000 fine or three years in prison can be handed down for unlawful possession of a pistol or "restricted" firearm. Similar maximum penalties await those who injure others through careless handling, including leaving a loaded firearm unattended. Possession of a firearm with criminal intent is good for five years in jail without a fine.

Here, too, New Zealand's official thinking is broadly in line with the position adopted by Australian shooting organisations.

And that's not all — safety receives the sort of attention we need locally. All new applicants for the NZ licence have to pass a safety test. Certified instructors from the NZ Mountain Safety Council Inc. are rostered to police stations for lecturing and testing.

In view of the evidence now before us, it is pertinent, I feel, to ask why certain Australian state governments continue to insist that shoulder arms registration is here to stay. (Wednesday, 10 October, 1984).






 Stan Collins congratulates the winners in the first 200 target elimination, Ian Hale and Bill Iles.



MULTI MILLION DOLLAR SHOOTING COMPLEX STARTED

Clay Target shooters attending next year's National Clay Target Titles in Perth, Western Australia will be among the first competitors to use the Multi Million Dollar International standard shooting facility being built on the outskirts of the City.

Work on the Whiteman Park Complex has commenced with bulldozers moving in to start land clearing and forming work.

Stage one of the five stage development will be completed for the Clay Target Nationals to be held from April 13th to 18th, 1985.

Over 600 shooters from every State in Australia and around the world are expected to be among those competing for titles and the many thousands of dollars in trophies given by sponsors.

The entire complex which measures over 2632 hectares will have little of its natural setting disturbed during construction.

The Western Australian Shooting Association will act as the umbrella group whose job it will be to represent eight Associations including Clay Target, Archery, Small Bore, Rifle, Pistols, Field and Game, Practical Pistol and Sporting Shooters who will use the facilities at the complex.

This group will liaise with the Department of Youth Sport and Recreation during construction.

Although the entire complex is expected to take a number of years to complete, stage one valued at \$2.5 million will be operational prior to the Clay Target National Titles.

Features to be included in stage one will be the construction of buildings and club facilities, access roads, services, security fencing for the Clay Target Association, Archery and Practical Pistols.


Included in this work will be a caretakers Residence and Central Gates, workshop and other essential services.

Clay Target facilities will include a 10 interposed Australian Trap and Skeet layout while in a separate area three Trench and ISU Trap ranges will be built.

Two of the three Trench and ISU ranges are to be fully set up for 15 traps while the third will be built but not equipped with machinery until necessary.

All facilities have been designed to the requirements of the International Shooting Union and Australian Clay Target Association and are suitable for any International standard event.

Also incorporated will be facilities for the increasing number of paraplegic and handicapped shooters joining the sport.

Located behind the Trap/Skeet layout will be a modern club house and facilities for members and visitors valued at around \$400,000.

Although operational during the championships the building is expected to require minor finishing touches after the Nationals.

The new facilities will also be home for the Azzurri Gun Club and the Perth Gun Club who have both contributed many thousands of dollars towards the construction and operation of the new complex.

President of the W.A.S.A. and Western Australian Clay Target Association, Mr Murray Alexander said, "All facets of work on the complex are right on schedule.

"The 119 hectares set aside for the sport of Clay Target Shooting will be some of the best seen anywhere in the world.

"The standard of facilities and equipment will be second to none," he said.


"With the use of computer data and much discussion it was found the layouts were best to face 155 degrees South East.

"In this position the sun will not affect any shooter."

Each of the Associations included in the W.A.S.A. will be separated from each other and the public by two metre high security fencing.

Designed as a public area Whiteman Park will be used extensively by individuals and family groups.

With Perth located only a mere 15 kilometres or 20 minutes away from Whiteman Park visitors will be provided with the best possible facilities for competing and holidaying available.



AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET NEWS -- DECEMBER 1984

HISTORY OF OUR SPORT IN WORDS AND PICTURES

A Committee meeting of the Nobel Clay Bird Club on May 10, 1930 instructed the Secretary to write to Mr Guthrie, to get his permission for the Club to promote the first Commonwealth Clay Bird Championship, on the Nobel Club ground at West Footscray.

In a letter to the Club re the above, Mr Guthrie stated he had no hesitation in granting permission for the Championship to be held. At a later date the Gun Clubs Association also agreed to the request and advised the Club accordingly.

Saturday October 24, 1931 was set down for the event—conditions were stipulated as follows: 21 birds from 20 yards 3 misses retire conditionally. Nominations and sweeps 25 shillings, 20 20 shillings, and gold medal. Winner to take 60%, second 30%, third 10%, after the club deducting 10%.

Cartridges would be available at 4/6 and 5/- per 25 and clay targets at 10 for 1/6.

Starting time for the Championship would be 2 p.m., practice would be available from 11 a.m. 500 dodgers would be distributed and if possible a canteen should be available on the ground for the shooters and visitors.

A further Committee meeting just prior to the Championship decided that events shot prior to the Championship be shot from 22 yards and that birds be at the rate of 5 for one shilling. It was also decided that the Commonwealth Clay Bird Championship be shot from the centre track only.

Following the success of the Commonwealth Championship the stage was set for a series of Club, State and Commonwealth events. Nobel Club applied to the Gun Clubs Association for permission to stage the 1932 Commonwealth Single Barrel and State Single Barrel Championships. A suggestion was also put up for consideration that all trapshooting be restricted to 2½" x 1 1/8.2 cartridges.

It was also decided that the Championships allotted to the Club by the Gun Clubs Association for 1933 be conducted on the following dates:

July 1 — Victorian Single Barrel

August 12 — Victorian Skeet Championship

September 23 — Commonwealth Skeet Championship October 24 — Commonwealth Clay Bird Championship

The following conditions would apply:

Victorian Single Barrel: 15 bird from 18 yards nominations 10/- (\$1) including birds.

Victorian Skeet: 14 birds nomination 10/- (\$1)

Commonwealth Skeet: 21 birds nomination 25/- (\$2.50) Commonwealth Clay Bird: 21 birds from 20 yards nom. 25/- (\$2.50) including birds (cup value 3 pounds, 3 shillings

(\$6.30) or trophy and cash prize).

A condition of the Skeet Championship was that there be no restriction on where the birds were "shot" (I've been unable to work this one out).

A Club Committee meeting on July 31, 1933 agreed that the Club should provide an attractive program for the forthcoming Centenary celebrations. It was agreed the program should include the Southern Hemisphere Clay Bird Championship and a 100 pound handicap event.

Because clay target shooting was controlled by a live bird shooting Association in the early days, it was natural to expect that shooting rules and conditions for Championships be similar. However, it soon became obvious that live bird rules were not suitable for the clay target shooter. Championships for instance could not be such that after three misses you would retire. A more suitable handicapping system would also be needed. Also can you figure out how they would shoot 14 birds at skeet?

From 1927 through 1929, clay target clubs resisted AUSTRALIAN CLAY TARGET NEWS — DECEMBER 1984

increasing pressure from the Gun Club Association to affiliate with them, and become registered shooters. It also became clear that unaffiliated clubs could not conduct official State and Commonwealth Championships that were controlled and allocated by the G.C.A.

At the Annual General Meeting of the Club held September 25, 1929, it was moved and seconded that the Nobel Clay Bird Club affiliate with the Gun Clubs Association of Victoria.

Mr Shilling moved as an amendment, that the Nobel Clay Bird Club try to get some agreement with the G.C.A. of Vic. without actually affiliating. Mr. Sainsbury seconded the amendment.

A great deal of discussion followed and much time was spent as most members expressed their views for and against. It became obvious that for the time being anyhow, the Nobel Clay Bird hadn't much choice. The meeting Chairman then put the amendment which was lost. The motion was then put to the meeting and carried.

Although many clay bird shooters weren't happy with the decision to affiliate, they saw it as a short-term arrangement.

Several new clubs were formed in Victoria and soon after in other States. It became obvious that clay bird clubs were outnumbering live bird clubs. New types of competition were introduced, new rules were made and applied. Overseas especially America was getting into top gear at both trap and skeet and ideas were drifting out to

Australia. By the year 1936 clay target shooting was almost Australia-wide. At this point it became apparent that clay target shooting would be better off by forming their own National Association. The first step was to form a Victorian body which was followed one year later by the formation of a National Association with delegates from other States as they developed.

I'm pleased to acknowledge with many thanks letters from Mr Ian Stanley Argyle of Perth, and one from Mr Nick Rogley of Warriewood, N.S.W. Extracts from both letters appear below:

Your September 1984 issue reached me yesterday, and your "Continuing History of our Sport" by George Biggs caught my attention by your reference to my grandfather, Dr Stanley Argyle at that time, in April 1935, and as Sir Stanley Argyle was Premier of Victoria.

Stanley Argyle was an enthusiastic shooter from boyhood, and in later years he was a Member of the Kew Rifle Club (he was Mayor of Kew 1900-1904). Later on, along with several others, they founded the Hawthorn Private Sparrow Shooting Club, selling the land many years later for a handsome profit.

I find your articles in Clay Target Shooting News very interesting. Being an oldtimer, I started clay target shooting in 1936. I joined C.T.A. in 1937 and have maintained continuous membership. My membership number was No. 145.

HEADING FOR GOLD 1984 ISU NATIONAL TRAINING SQUADS AT THE A.I.S.

MONDAY 29th OCTOBER:

We all met National Coach Peter Quire at the Edmund Barton Motel, then it was off to the Australian Institute of Sport in the bus provided for the week.

Dr Dick Telford (Director of the Institute) welcomed the Inaugural ISU Shotgunners Squad and we were conducted on a tour of the vast facilities of the Institute, by hurdler Don Wright. We were all absolutely astounded at the magnitude of the complex and the array of facilities available — a truly great training ground for future champions. Preliminaries over, it was down to business.

Sports psychologist Jeff Bond was first on the agenda. His aims are to improve mental preparation and concentration. A 198 item questionnaire, computer-designed to accurately access the psychological attitudes of competitive shooters, was completed by all. We didn't realise that Ian Hale was perfect.

TUESDAY 30th OCTOBER:

Dr Telford (nutritionist). He didn't think we were the fittest lot of blokes he had seen especially when his spy caught us all hoeing into the cream biscuits and coffee. His main aims outlined a nutrition and fitness program to combat the stress and nervous condition suffered by most shooters in open competition. Some have already heeded his advice and now follow a diet and physical routine. It does work. It was then off to the shooting range.

Peter Quire used the Institute's visual equipment to record both front and side positions of all shooters. Later that evening we all reviewed the tapes and discussed each shooter's style and any improvements that could be made. This was felt by all to be most helpful (no Robert Redfords in this lot).

WEDNESDAY 31st OCTOBER:

Surprise day — psychology feedback from Jeff Bond. Each shooter was given a very comprehensive written report on how to improve his mental approach and concentration. The vast wealth of information contained in these documents was a surprise to all. With our results plus a group average from other athletes (showing above-average for us which was not a surprise at all) we discovered some interesting facts about ourselves.

Jeff Bond and staff came to the range with us where they all had their first skeet and trench shots. They realised the amount of skill and dedication required to hit the targets. Their enthusiasm was refreshing and their experience with these tests will be invaluable for future training squads.

THURSDAY 1st NOVEMBER:

Off to the range with video equipment, computers and pressure pads. Each shooter had a rigorous test. The pad graphing movement with weight placement and the video noting head movement and stock placement were excellent and of particular value to the skeet shooters.

Peter Anderson from the A.S.A. met us to discuss the value of the camp. We all agreed they are a must if we are to continue to win medals at international level and maintain our high world ranking. We all want to bring home gold in 1988 and feel these training camps are a definite step in the right direction. The support of the A.S.A. was pleasing.

FRIDAY 2nd NOVEMBER

Early to the Institute to evaluate the previous day's results then back to the gun club for the first 100 targets, Australia Games Elimination. The first three past the post after 400 targets make up the team.

For the trenchies, a tough course set up to the 1984 Italian Grand Prix program.

Results Day 1²— Trench: R. Mark 97, G. Mark 96, G. Boyd 94, J. Ellis 91, J. Maxwell 91, T. Rumbel 88. Skeet: I. Hale 98, J. Summers 97, B. Thompson 85.

SATURDAY 3rd NOVEMBER:

Again an early start for the final 100 targets. Trenchies had another tough course set to the last World Moving Target Championship program and Jim Ellis shot a brilliant 99 in the trench.

Final scores first round of elimination: Trench — R. Mark 191, G. Mark 190, J. Ellis 190, G. Boyd 188, J. Maxwell 186, T. Rumbel 183, J. Summers 193 + 25, I. Hale 193 + 24, B. Thompson 179.

Everyone agreed the camp was a monumental success not only for the shooters, but also for the Institute. They now have data as a gauge for future squads.

As the guinea pig squad, we have only the highest praise for the genuine interest shown by all. Although it was all work and no play, we were all keen to learn and apply what we were taught and the shooters concerned were a credit to the ACTA

Our special thanks goes to Barry, Flip, Frank and all the members of the ACT International Gun Club for opening the club to us for the week. They never stopped working and it could not have succeeded without their help. Thanks to Steve Balough for cartridge and cup donation. It was much appreciated.

Last, but by no means least, everyone's sincere thanks to the man with the hardest job of all; National Coaching Director Peter Quire. He was always available helping each shooter individually and we have the utmost confidence in his ability. A job well done.

TRADE TOPICS

J.R. 12G 12 GAUGE SHOTGUN CHOKE GAUGE

This precision tool will enable you to quickly check choke sizes on any 12G shotgun.

An important feature when checking or buying a shotgun is to know what size chokes are built into the gun. Simply insert the J.R. 12G gauge into the barrel and read to closest line. C = cyl. bore. 1 = %. 2 = %. 3 = %. F = full choke. Anywhere in between lines designates more open or more full.

Always bear in mind most gun manufacturers employ various methods to obtain the desired choking effect on their guns; it is therefore important to pattern every gun to get the precise pattern percentage. However your J.R. 12G precision gauge will give you an approximate quick guide to your gun's choke size. Every serious shotgunner should have one.

Suggested retail around \$15.00.

SOME OTHER TECHNICAL INFORMATION

The derivation of a twelve gauge shotgun was one having a bore diameter of .729 - .730 thousandths of an inch or cylinder bore as we know it. Full choke was then designated as 40 points or forty thou tighter with all other chokes changing by approximately ten (10) thou per ¼ choke.

The rings on the J.R. Shotgun gauge are at: Full .690 thou, % .697 thou, ½ .709 thou, ¼ .721 thou, C .729 thou.

The flat surface on the gauge is ground with a high speed grinder so as not to alter the temper of the material. Also the gauge marks are engraved not stamped on the measuring surface again designed not to alter the tolerances of this precision tool and in fact take the marks below the surface of the metal.

The finished tool is blued to give a longlasting gun metal finish.

It is interesting to note that the standards by which we devise our measurements for 12 gauge were back in the days when shotgun shells were paper and used cardboard wads. It is of course possible nowadays with plastic wads to achieve a much tighter pattern through any given choke.







REFEREE'S ASSOCIATION — RULE INTERPRETATION

It has become the practice at some clubs to shoot handicap events under the point score system, thereby lessening the likelihood of shooters being penalised for winning or running second in a handicap event.

As an example, a 25 target handicap event shot points score, the winner shoots 74/75, second place getter 73/75. Club Management decides that neither shooter has shot the possible so they are not penalised a metre. This is incorrect.

In a handicap event whether it be points score or double barrel, broken targets are to count in terms of whether or not the possible was shot, as is the case with the recording of targets shot in common mark events for grading purpose.





EDITOR'S MAILBOX

Dear Sir,

I would like to comment on the statement in the October A.C.T.A. News by the South Australian executive regarding the skeet nationals. I have heard similar sentiments expressed by a Western Australian executive. The statement is basically that, 'the skeet and trap nationals should be recombined'. In states with few registered shooters and where very little skeet is shot, these sentiments may have some validity.

In South Eastern Australia where the majority of shooters reside, there are many shooters that only shoot skeet, many do not own a trap gun. In the Melbourne area alone, these would amount to about 60 to 80 shooters (more than attended the S.A. skeet carnival and these included interstate entries). Two years ago when times were better, Melbourne Gun Club would have 40 to 50 skeet shooters, 52 Saturdays a year.

I cannot see these skeet only shooters travelling interstate to shoot 50 targets on the first day of the old combined Nationals and then coming home. But I believe many of them would travel to shoot three or four days of skeet at a separate skeet Nationals.

Many shooters who came to the first skeet Nationals from interstate deplored the lack of opportunities to shoot skeet in their home states and said if skeet was available in their home states, they would only shoot skeet.

As an example of the extent of skeet shooting in our area, I as an average competitor will shoot about 4000 registered competition skeet targets this year. The keener ones would shoot many more targets. In the Melbourne area there are from 100-200 competition skeet targets available every weekend and public holiday with practice available at mid week. With the separate skeet Nationals, skeet has come of age as a sport in its own right. The demand for skeet is there, even if it is not catered for throughout the country.

The success of the first skeet Nationals speaks for itself; hopefully next year they will include a skeet doubles championship. I hope the separate skeet Nationals go from success to success. To remain successful they would have to be held in the area of the country where the shooters are, and where skeet is popular.






