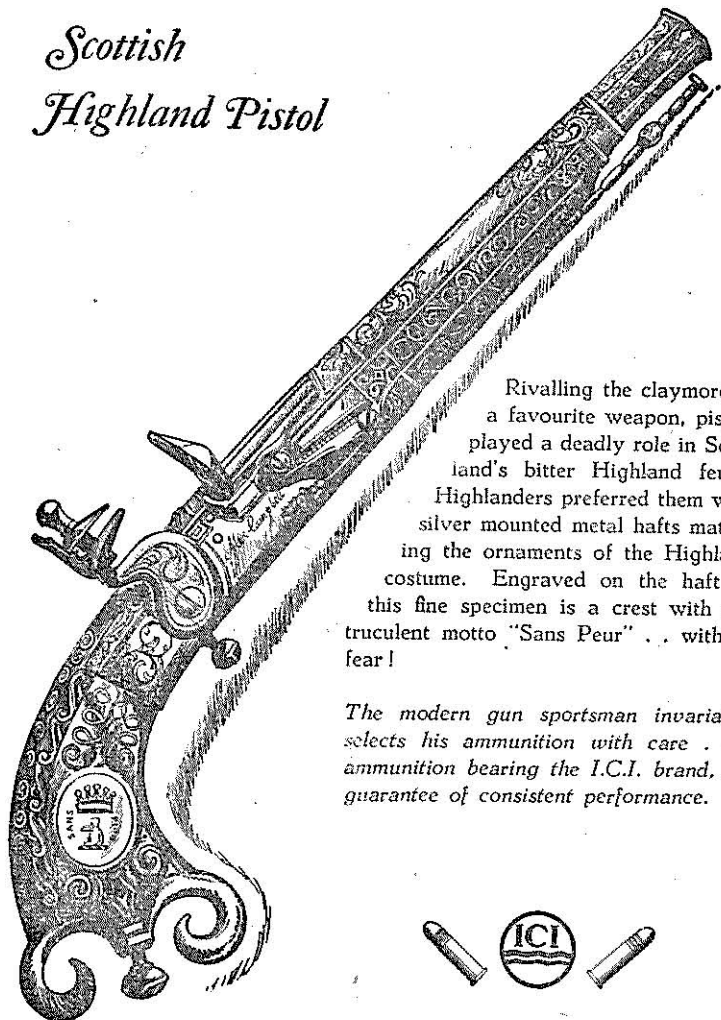

### OVERSEAS ITEMS

Following a suggestion made to the Association some months ago by Mr. Colin M. Barr, of Mount Gambier, S.A. regarding the supplying of food parcels to our kindred shooting sportsmen in Great Britain, the matter was discussed at the last meeting of the Executive Committee.

A letter forwarded to Mr. H. Rogers, secretary of the English C.P.S. Association, brought forth an immediate air-mail reply.

Portions of this interesting letter are quoted, "I want to acknowledge your letter just to hand and to express our happiness at the very kindly feeling you have given us by the offer therein of sending food parcels. It is just a naturally expressed wish of the people far away to see that the Old Folk do not lack food. The letter will go before our Committee and we will write you again. I have made one suggestions:—Our Championship meeting takes place at the end of this month and the lowest scorers should have food parcels to build up their stamina! We have not seen a steak for years and our meat supplies are very poor. Public diners (societies and clubs) have fed mainly on what has been called "poultry," yet the seagull population is as plentiful as ever it has been.

"We might call the present a Women's War because housewives have to think and toil very hard to feed their menfolk and stand for hours in queues. It is very difficult for widows or a family of say 2 to live, they have no "left overs" from other rations.

"You can understand that young brides going to Australia have had wonderful training in housewifery. Women's greatest headaches are caused by the shortage of fats and dried fruit—and the greatest of all—cooking fat.

"Yet with all our shortages I do not think we lack stamina. On Saturday (9/8/47) Middlesex cricket team scored 537 runs for 2 wickets (Edrich and Compton live on their glands) and Surrey played hard in the field all day. Your lads will do well on our "Iron Rations," if the iron lasts over next Season! They will meet greatly improved opposition in

## TEN YEARS AGO

A brief review of clay pigeon shooting news as published ten years ago will be re-printed each month as an item of interest.

As the 1947 Champion of Champions Cup result is listed in this month's issue, we repeat brief details of the event and winner in 1937.

"Looked like dinner plates," so remarked the late Lew Bertram after he had won the 1937 Champion of Champions Cup on the old Nobel grounds at West Footscray. Bertram's form that day was unbeatable and he stopped 60/60 to win from "Duxbac" (H. G. James) 59/60, others close up were, "Dubbs" (V. L. Fankhauser), 58/60, A. F. Burns 57/60, E. S. Lyons 50/53, then "Drongo" (Les. Tibb), H. G. Burrows, Cyril Fankhauser and B. Anquetil 46/50, G. A. Townsend and W. Bloomfield 45/50, "Jock" (J. M. Wilson), Alf. W. Hall, M. Evans (Benalla) and H. S. Beer 44/50. Bertram carried on in a miss-out event and broke another 17 before missing—his actual competition break being 77 straight—not bad shooting for one day.

## ASSOCIATION RECOMMENDATIONS

### HANDICAP RETURNS

The importance of submitting handicap returns to Association headquarters at least once every eight weeks, cannot be too firmly stressed. Omission to render to handicap returns makes the work of Association handicappers extremely difficult.

The rendering of shooters names in alphabetical order is an additional help to handicappers.

Open Association handicaps should be used in all events where £25 or over is given for any one event, either in cash or trophies.

### OFFICIAL SCORERS

Affiliated clubs should make a point of having an official scorer in attendance at all shoots. A recent incident reported to the Association revealed an occasion where an actual outright winner of the main event was incorrectly scored. A state of confusion followed and he was restored

among those in the tie shoot. Considerably upset he missed out immediately. The reason for all this was that no fewer than four or five "casual" scorers had a finger in the scoring "pie" with the unfortunate result indicated.

Even if a small retainer is required to be paid it is better than a repetition of the foregoing. The Association strongly recommends the appointment of official scorers for all affiliated clubs.

Handicaps have been declared with the limit mark shooters commencing at 12 yards in accordance with the rules of the Association. Clubs are requested to conform to this rule and begin handicaps at 12 yards. Unknown shooters should commence no nearer than 16 yards.

In order to ensure satisfactory Association handicapping, Club officials are requested to show each shooter's full surname and initials (shooting name if any in addition) when forwarding handicap returns to the Association office.
