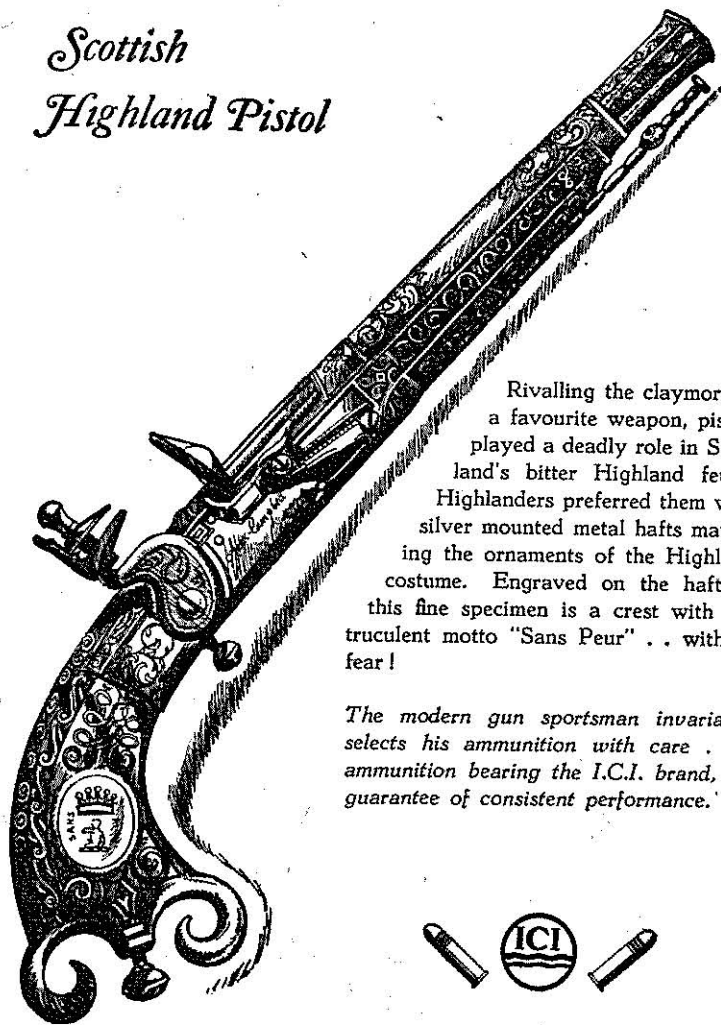

RECOMMENDATIONS
AND ADVICES**

Annual Meeting

Clubs are informed that the 11th Annual General Meeting of delegates representative of affiliated clubs with the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association will be held at Scott's Hotel, Collins Street, Melbourne, on Wednesday, November 5, 1947, commencing at 8.0 p.m. Nominations for all offices in the Association will close with the Association secretary (Box 2038 S. Melbourne) seven days prior to the holding of the meeting, i.e. 6.0 p.m., October 28.

Clubs desirous of nominating office-bearers for election to the Association should apply to the Association office for necessary official nomination forms. Proper procedure for the completion of nomination forms is quoted from Rule 11 of the Association governing regulations, which reads:

"Nominations for all offices in the Association must be in writing signed by the President or Secretary of one of the member clubs and must reach the secretary at least seven clear days prior to the Annual General Meeting."

It should be understood that a "member" club is an affiliated club the current affiliation fees for which have been paid.

Applications for 1948 Championships, Commonwealth, State and District, should reach the Association secretary on or before November 1, 1947.

Handicap Returns

A few clubs have not assimilated the fact that Association handicaps can be reviewed only if the prescribed Handicap Return Form is completed. In recent weeks some clubs have merely forwarded copies of score sheets—these cannot be accepted for handicapping. Experience has proved that it is impossible to correctly assess handicaps unless the regulation form is used. These forms are supplied by the Association and club secretaries should apply for renewal of supplies from time to time.

Safety Rules

Flagrant breaches of safety shooting rules have been noticed in recent weeks. Offenders have usually been inexperienced shooters. The following five rules are quoted from the Association's Hand-book of Shooting Rules, "A shooter must not, on any account, (1) Load his gun until he actually steps to the firing mark in his turn; (2) Turn away from the firing mark until he opens his gun—and removes the cartridges—if for some reason he did not shoot; (3) Put two cartridges in his gun, except for doubles. It is strictly against the rules and dangerous for singles; (4) Shoot at any bird when it is out of bounds; (5) Close his gun when it is pointing towards spectators or other shooters."

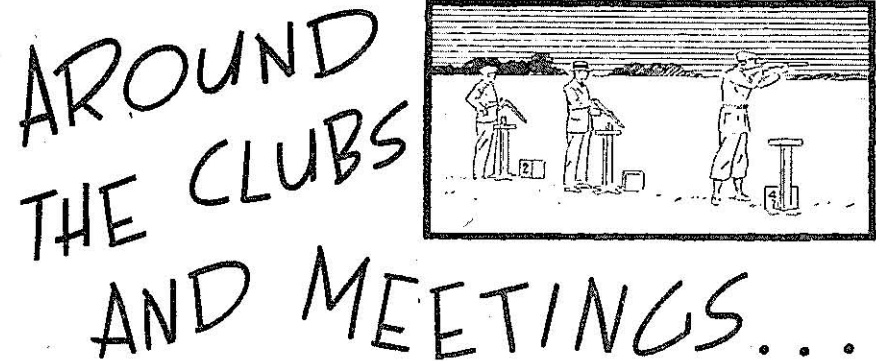

Melbourne Gun Club recently went to considerable expense to complete a first class skeet and down-the-line lay-out on its No. 2 shooting area at Tottenham (V.). The club opened on September 13 on the No. 2 area with the Victorian Skeet Championship. The winner turned up from a somewhat unexpected source in J. Byrne, a member of the U.L.V.A. Club. Byrne gained an outright win in stopping 17/20. Charlie Bell and Norman Guy (Flemington) tied for the second placing. Shooting on Bell outstayed Guy 22/30 to 20/30. Fred Burns and S. W. McIntyre were together next, each 14/20. Byrne's win was very popular and he should do well at this type of shooting in the future.

A new club has been formed at Pakenham East (V.). This body is setting about securing fullest information on first class lay-out, etc. Its secretary is F. Ramsdale. The club when properly organised will become an affiliated unit of the Association.

J. C. McNaughton has taken over the secretaryship of the Tasmanian Gun Club at Launceston from C. J. Searl. The latter has been in ill-health for some time—all wish him a speedy return to normal activities. The club is now well established at its new shooting headquarters at St. Leonards. OVERSEAS ITEMS

As mentioned in last month's issue of the "News" the Association has completed arrangements with the veteran English champion trapshot, Mr. W. P. Grosvenor, of Norfolk, to supply a series of articles on the art of "clay-busting" from its earliest years up to the present. Mr. Grosvenor is well known by sporting reputation to many in Australia but there are many of the younger trapshots to whom his prowess is unknown. Hence a paragraph or two on Mr. Grosvenor's introduction to clay pigeon shooting will doubtless prove interesting.

"When I retired from business last year and came down to this little Norfolk village to live I thought I had probably dropped out of sight entirely. But to my surprise and my very great pleasure, I find that it is not so and that the early experiences I encountered so many years ago may be of interest to some of our present day shooters.

"My first introduction to shooting took place at a "glass ball" meeting when I was ten years old at the small village of Herne, in Kent. A local shoot attracted all the family and many others besides. Watching the shooting, I boylike, felt that I could do better than my seniors. Eventually one of my relatives paid 2/6 entrance fee to a sweepstake and borrowed a 12 bore gun. The weapon was much too long in the stock for me. My relatives imagined the recoil would knock me "for six" and that would be the end of my curiosity. To everyone's astonishment, when I fired I broke the glass ball. To make this story shorter I went along and eventually won the sweepstake and 30/-—a huge sum for a lad of ten in those days. (Might mention here that several prominent shooters missed unexpectedly and I have wondered since if the misses were genuine.) After that nothing stopped me. Whispered advice by the local inn-keeper, to "shove the gun right over them" plus an apparently natural ability to point correctly put me further in the money and I halved two more sweeps that day.

"This little incident started me on the road of competition shooting, caused it to become my main hobby and was responsible for shaping my whole life from then on. I did not join a gun club until 1909, when I became a member of the old Middlesex Gun Club at Hendon. I quickly found my level and against good class shots, finding to my dismay that I couldn't break 50% of the clays shot at.

"The first thing brought home to me was that speed was the essence of success. I used to get my friends to "clock" me and by concentrating on "time" I was, before the end of the year, beginning to get somewhere. Early in 1910 I reached scratch rank, although well behind other leading shots of the day. I lacked most necessary competitive concentration, without which one is only on the fringe of real excellence.

"As a great lover of the sport of clay pigeon shooting and with all my experience of Olympic Games (Clay pigeon shooting was included in the Olympic Games programmes until about 1924—Ed.), International and competitive shooting I feel I may be able to contribute some helpful points to your shooters. Ever since the 1914-18 war I have been hammering to institute one barrel shooting and 25 bird events. To my mind this style of shooting accounts for the undoubted superiority of U.S.A. and Canadian shooters over our men. We have not a man in Great Britain who is within 5% of best American form.

"If ever Australia seriously thinks of getting a team into competition with best U.S.A. and Continental shooters do make sure that your men do their practising in mixed squads and not always shooting with the same men. There are lots of men here, making high scores who cannot reproduce their best shooting if mixed with strangers—this is really important, believe me."

From Mr. Robert A. Brown, secretary of the Scottish Association comes the following interesting letter.—

"We have just finished our first post war season and found that the sport, despite the high cost of ammunition and targets, is, if anything more popular than ever. The final Scottish competition, held at Stirling on July 19, attracted 95 guns. Since then 125 guns attended a shoot at Fort William at the beginning of August.

"We had been looking forward to another successful season, but the cancellation of the basic petrol for private cars may very adversely effect the position as public transport is not available to many of the venues of the shoots. We trust, however, that it will be possible to stage an International next year, probably in Ireland.

"With best wishes to our kindred sportsmen in Australia."

From Mr. A. Peter Page, assistant Secretary of the English Association the following letter is to hand.

Written on 8/9/1947, it reads—

"You will probably be interested to know that the annual English open Down-the-line championship was won by P. Stanbury of Crediton, Devon, with an aggregate score of 97/100 "kills" at Rowley Green, near Arkley, Middlesex, on Saturday, August 30. This was Stanbury's sixth win in this series and following his recent success at Stratford-upon-Avon, where he won the Skeet Championship for the fourth time, he now holds the dual role for the second time (the first occasion being in 1934). The Down-the-line meeting was a two day shoot and the open event on the Friday was won by W. T. Jones of Carmarthen, Wales, who scored 99/100 "kills." After three qualifying rounds of 25 birds were shot off the ten highest scorers competed for a further round on each day.

"Prizes were awarded over the 75 birds (A and B Classes). Winners being: (1st day)—Class A—E. Horlock (Corsham Wilts.) 72/75, Class B—R. J. Cooper (Sleaford Lincs.) 70/75, (2nd day)—Class A.—E. L. Nickols (Spalding Lincs.) 71/75, Class B—H. C. Foot (Liverpool Lincs.) 68/75."

TEN YEARS AGO

The "Ten Years Ago" column introduced in the initial issue of "News" revived the memories of some who competed against the late Lew. Bertram when he won the Champion of Champions Cup in 1937. We have been reminded that the full story of the day's shoot has not been divulged. Another glance back at the records reveals that some enlargement on the original story is permissible. It should be here mentioned that practice was permitted in pre-war years prior to the opening of competition in Champion of Champions events. Bertram "bought" 15 birds for practice and broke the lot. He then went on to win the big title on the 60th round with an unbroken score. He survived a tie shoot in the following event cut the proceeds on the 17th round and then failed to last out a missout. On the count up it was found Bertram had topped 95/96 from the time he commenced shooting in the morning until the trap was closed at night.

It is worth recording here that Bertram, just after commencing to shoot, asked a pressman to see if there was "dust in his eye"—as, using shooting glasses, he felt he was continually picking up a visionary black spot. Convinced he had nothing to worry about Bertram went on to gain confidence and the result mentioned. One of the first to congratulate him was Harry Waight, now mine host at the Buck's Head at Ballarat (V.). Waight held a break record of 62 at that time and was also holder of the 1937 Commonwealth Skeet Championship.
