ANNUAL MEETING

The 11th Annual Meeting of the A.C.P. T.S.A. at Scott's Hotel, Melbourne was well attended. Several important changes were approved. In future at least three seats will be reserved on the Executive Committee (inclusive of Vice-presidents) for shooters resident outside Victoria—more may secure seats if elected. From 1st January 1948, the individual registration fee for all shooters will be 10/- per annum. The election of office-bearers resulted as per personnel listed on Page 3 of this issue.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The following is a special instruction to clubs conducting shoots under walk-up conditions including championships. The previous condition which instructed that, "The stock of the gun to be held below the elbow, which must be kept against the side," should now read, "The gun may be held in any position—consistent with safety."

"Silence behind please"—how often is this request heard, called either by the referee, scorer or some interested shooter/spectator during the deciding of a shooting event—be it a modest five-birder or a major title event? The call is one that should not have to be made where experienced shooters congregate.

In our "Letters to Editor" section this month, is a suggestion or two from a prominent shooter who feels very strongly on the matter. The correspondent adds something concerning another annoying habit which has been on the increase of late—that of trying out guns or cartridges during the shooting of an event. The commentary by the correspondent is very much to the point.

This page is in full agreement with the suggestions outlined and considers the matter of such importance as to be front-page discussion.

All too frequently a shooter with a winning chance has his concentration upset completely by over-loud talking, banter, jovial side-wagering and occasional unauthorised trying out of guns and cartridges at the rear of the puller. The result is often a slow pull or sometimes the call is not even heard by the puller. This should not be. Association referees should not hesitate to "sit on" such indifference immediately it is noticed. Clubs and referees will have the full backing of the Association in any steps taken to bring about eradication, and the establishment of reasonable discipline.

OVERSEAS ITEMS

Scores are to hand of the final Championship of Scotland. Shot at Stirling, the event was scored under the improved Scottish system, 100 birds, 2 points for first barrel kill and 1 for second. Details are of special interest to Australian shooters who favour the points scoring system. Scores—J. Speirs (Argyll), 182 points, 1st.; R. A. Brown (Lossiemouth), 178, 2nd.; T. Many shooters have voiced their pleasurable surprise at the exclusive article by the great English trapshot, Mr. W. P. Grosvenor, appearing in the October issue of "News." A number have expressed the hope these will continue—we can answer simply—they will. Mr. Grosvenor has already supplied us with authoritative copy matter which will be sufficient for several months issue of "News." We resume in his own words—

"I have twice visited the United States of America and competed under their "one barrel 1¼ oz. of shot conditions." I have also had the pleasure of shooting against their best exponents at the Olympic Games on three occasions—1912 when we finished second gaining silver medals. In 1920, when we had exceptionally bad luck, being the only team to shoot in a sudden thunder storm and half gale and again in 1924 when we shot very badly and finished nowhere. If my considered opinion is of any value, I would again state emphatically,

that the U.S.A. trapshooters are outstanding in their ability and much above our Empire best. At Antwerp in the 1920 Olympic Games the Americans had in their team at least three shooters with most wonderful averages and runs of several hundred straight.

"I have always considered that we in Britain and probably you in Australia have always followed the wrong line in using two barrels and short events. As I previously stated Canadian and U.S.A. shooters use mainly one barrel and run events to 25 birds and this accounts for their general superiority. When we reorganised clay bird shooting after the first world war I did my best to get this style adopted here, but with only minor success. The bulk of the shooters, with their more limited experience, voted for the old style of two barrels and this stands today. I did convince them to run 100 bird programmes, of four 25-bird events. American and Continental style shooting of a 25 bird event is shot through at nearly double the speed of our leisurely English events. Percy Stanbury, one of our best here is a deliberate style shooter. Enoch Jenkins, a Welshman, was high-gun at Berlin in 1936 over the whole meeting of 500 birds. In the actual championship Jenkins finished fourth and registered 269/300.

In the Olympic Games the traps are set to beat the gun all the time, not to enable a high score to be made. The difficulties of this have to be seen and endured to be be-

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lieved. For instance at Stockholm we were not allowed to raise the gun from "below elbow" position until the bird appeared and the referee stood behind the shooter to see that it was observed and did not hesitate to inflict instant disqualification if he thought it was merited. I broke 89/100 under these conditions and consider it was one of the best shoots of my career. The highest score that day being 93/100 by the best U.S.A. shot of that year.

"I met Cody and Annie Oakley when they visited England long ago. I shot against Annie Oakley, and needless to say, was well beaten. Another interesting U.S.A. personality who impressed me here was Bat Masterton, the great Peace Marshall. A man who could claim over "40 scalps" in the course of his duties. Masterton, at our request, gave a demonstration with a borrowed Colt's "Frontier" and got his five shots off in under 3 seconds, the 5 bullet holes could have been easily covered by the palm of your hand. This mind you, was hip shooting and cocking the gun every shot—not "fanning" the gun. By the way, if you ever

want to try this later, my advice is —don't—as you can very easily hurt your hand with the spur of the hammer. Two of the Earls of Winchester, as young man, farmed sheep extensively in Australia, on a huge run at the back of Townsville (Qld.) I believe. When they returned here I secured some of their boomerangs—I never mastered the art of throwing however."

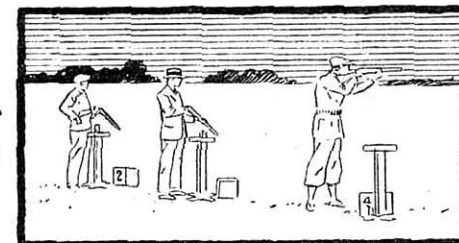

viewed for the first time the club's first class scoring board. Mounted on stout uprights it stands about 12 feet high. The recording section carries places for no less than 72 names, 24 names side by side three times, and is made from prepared masonite. This section is removable and can be placed on a runner in the pavilion for use on wet days. The club's enterprise in providing a good programme attracted a big muster of top-liners for the two day fixture. The main £25 handicap on the first day went to a division by J. Wise (Deniliquin), Frank Brown (Dandenong) and "Duxbac" (Melbourne). Wise, the local shooter is credited with shooting at clays for the first time. Each registered the possible of 15 straight. Forty-eight faced the mark for the N.S.W. Double-barrel title on the second day. Shot from the regulation 20 yards at 25 birds rise, the outright winner was "Duxbac" 25/25 (2 second barrels), J. Bryant (missed 3rd) and Frank Brown (10th) each stopped 24/25 and shot on. Bryant totalled 33/35 to Brown's 32/35 in the tie shoot. G. Biggs (16 and 17), J. McCraith (6 and 18), and "Drongo" (3 and 5) tied in 4th place 23/25. The £100 handicap course was reduced to 15 birds to allow its completion before darkness. The result was an all Victorian triumph, the following taking £20 each—A. F. Johnson (Blackburn), J. J. Dawson (Beaumaris), J. Bryant, junr., Frank Brown and "Drongo," all gained the full complement. J. Bryant, junr. won the tie shoot for the front-markers trophy in the championship from J. Bateman (Cohuna) 22/26 to 21/26. The meeting was splendidly run and the officials are to be complimented on the excellent organisation.

Food for Britain Parcels

In order to give the movement an immediate start the Association has already arranged for the forwarding of several parcels. The addresses having been informed, in some cases have already replied. So that our Australian shooters will realise how important these parcels are to our kinsmen overseas, the following are extracts from some of the replies:—

No. 1. "To say that we were flabbergasted with this wonderful news of the coming parcel of good things does not convey in any respect our reaction. My wife, at the news that

she is going to get some fats, has been going about our cottage, singing like a bird. When the parcel arrives I will acknowledge it and thank your Association properly."

No. 2. "My wife is delighted at the prospects of a parcel. Many thanks, will write again when parcel arrives."

No. 3. "I read your letter of advice regard the parcel for us, with much gladness, and passed it round the breakfast table. My wife insisted I must write at once her grateful thanks for this most generous gift, feeling that this is intended as a help to the harassed housewife. My daughter and my son were eagerly and heartily thankful and I add my heartfelt appreciation. We started today very, very happily."

No. 4. "I must write and thank your Association for the parcel of food you tell us will be reaching here before Christmas, the fats and dried fruit will be most helpful."

Ten Years Ago

A turn-back of the records recalls the last pre-war visit of the English cricket eleven. During a lull in the cricket programme members of the English team were entertained at a clay pigeon shoot by the members of the Benalla Gun Club (Vict.). Indifferent weather marred much of the social side. Wally Hammond won the presentation cup for the visitors stopping 8/15 to Sims 7/15. The local combination, Messrs D. Toner (now senior detective attached to Melbourne C.I.B.), Laurie Feldtman, Morrie Evans, Harry James (War-

renbayne) and secretary J. Johnston, won a teams' match comfortably, shooting from the extreme mark of 30 yards. The Englishmen voted it a "great day."

A letter received from the New Zealand Gun Clubs' Association, intimated that affiliation for clubs had been raised from 20/- to 30/-. In addition an extra fee of £2/2/- was charged for a provincial (district) championship, £4/4/- for an Island (State) title and £6/6/- for a N.Z. National Championship. Shooters of the sister Dominion are reported as having carried these proposals unanimously.

Sir—May I join the ranks of the many who have already congratulated you on your production of the "News." Every paragraph is of personal interest to all clay bird shooters, and the inclusion of "Overseas Items" is an excellent idea.

Mr. W. P. Grosvenor's advice from the local inn-keeper "throw the gun right over them," impressed me as probably one of the most concise and true hints on clay bird shooting I have heard or read; also his comment "speed is the essence of success." I am open to correction, but I feel that, for every bird missed by shooting over it, at least ten are missed by shooting behind them.

Our present Champion of Champions, "Doch-an-Doris," is one of the best examples to quote in confirmation of what, personally, I consider the two outstanding pieces of advice in Mr. Grosvenor's article. I have used the word "confirmation" rather than "support," as it would be presumption on my part to suggest that a shooter of the calibre and experience of Mr. Grosvenor needs any support to back up his years of experience.

How often do you hear the comment, "You were behind it"; the opposite? —D. B. O'CALLAGHAN, (North Brighton, Vict.).

Sir.—In recent months we have had several critics at work on the shortcomings of scorers and referees. To carry on the good work I would add a further suggestion.

We look upon clay pigeon shooting as a fair and clean sport and to keep anything up to the minute it is necessary to brush it up from time to time. With this end in view I beg leave to bring to the notice of all clubs a small and easily dealt with matter which is apt to cause disappointment to shooters at some time or other in their career at the traps.

When a club wishes to stage a demonstration of any kind or make an announcement, or a shooter is trying out a strange gun or ammunition etc. it would be well if the club committee or some controlling authority would ascertain the position other members of a squad held in relation to winning before sanctioning anything likely to break down the concentration of shooters holding winning chances.

It could easily be arranged for a separate squad to proceed with their "manoeuvres" at the end of the event, or at such time as the committee, together with the referee, agrees upon. We all enjoy something away from the usual routine, but at the same time it is very difficult for 95 per cent. of shooters to concentrate properly with even a casual conversation going on between other members of the same squad. Therefore our thoughtless enjoyment must not be allowed to prejudice a fellow shooter's chance.

Trusting this will be accepted as it is meant, "For the good of the sport."—DAVE WATSON ("Doch-and-Doris").

Association Annual Report

The following is the Eleventh Annual Report of the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association submitted to the 11th Annual Meeting of affiliated club delegates, held at Scott's Hotel, Collins Street, Melbourne, C.I., on Wednesday, November 5th, 1947.

"The Executive Committee is again pleased to report that the affairs of the Association, notwithstanding the many set-backs in the matter of shooting supplies, are in an entirely satisfactory state. During the period covered by this report, 1st November, 1946 to 31st October, 1947, the number of affiliated clubs rose from 29 to 55. Many others are pending affiliation. The total of registered shooters also greatly increased and the complete register is as shown in the pages of the Association's official monthly news Bulletin.

"An important development in the Association's activities has been the

inauguration and production of "Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting News"—the Association's official organ and regular monthly news publication. The first edition of which was published on 10th September, 1947. This production is sponsored and produced entirely by the Association. From the very many letters and verbal approbations received no doubt exists that the move for its commencement was a sound one. The advent of "A.C.P.S. News" is doing much to extend the Association's influence and maintain its prestige in all States.

"A pleasing feature of the year under review was the resumption of the Association's popular Champion of Champions Cup event, at 50 clay pigeons from 18 yards. Shot on Coburg Club's grounds on King's Birthday Holiday, June 16th, the event attracted a field of 87. The winner was the popular "Doch-an-Doris" (Mr. Dave Watson) of Ashburton (Vict.), who returned a score of 49/50 to win

outright. His performance was one of the most brilliant ever seen in the event. All had to contend with appalling weather conditions—in fact the worst ever experienced for events, Commonwealth, State and District.

"The Association's financial position continues to maintain its healthy state. During September an additional account, known as "Journal Account" was opened to cater for the handling of "A.C.P.S. News" finances. This was primarily necessary to enable "A.C.P.S. News" to secure the advantage of bulk postage concessions with the P.M.G. Mail Branch.

"Some disappointment has been occasioned that no International series was possible during 1947. This was mainly due to supply shortages being Empire wide. 1948 may see a change in this regard and there is a possibility of an International series being shot next year.

"The Association has been indeed fortunate during 1947 in that so many sportsmen have rallied to its cause in providing financial and material support in the form of donations. Thanks are extended for this most worthy assistance. It is pleasing to be able to append the following list of donors—a record total. To the "General Account" of the Association, Hobart Gun Club (Tas.), Mr. W. E. H. Rainbird (Launceston, Tas.), Maj-General W. Bridgeford (St. Kilda, Vict.), and Mr. J. M. Tyquin (Hobart, Tas.). To the "Competition Account"—Imperial Chemical Industries Australia & New Zealand Ltd., Mr. J. M. Wilson (Association President), Messrs. W. & A. Gilbey (Australia) Ltd., Blackburn Clay Target Club (Vict.), Messrs. Fred Brook (Gillandra, N.S.W.), J. O. Cox (Mangoplah, N.S.W.), W. E. H. Rainbird (Launceston, Tas.), A. E. Rickards (Echuca, Vict.), J. R. Schutt (Footscray, Vict.), J. J. Dawson (Beaumaris, Vict.), Frank R. Hockey (Toorak, Vict.), T. R. Wightman, (Kew, Vict.), A. F. Burns (Footscray, Vict.), Donald Mackintosh (H. G. James) and W. B. Wilkinson (Geelong, Vict.). The following presented trophies—Messrs. A. F. Johnson (Balwyn, Vict.), and V. L. "The register of "Life Registered Shooters" was added to during the shooting of the contest. Complete scores for all competitors were published in the initial issue of "A.C.P.S. News." The premier Commonwealth double-barrel title went to Mr. Roy Johns (Malvern, Vict.). This was gained at Griffith (N.S.W.) on New Year's Day. Congratulations are extended to the winners of all title year and the complete list is as under, (in order of appointment)—

"In conclusion the Executive Committee hopes to continue furthering the Association's activities throughout the Commonwealth. Members feel that with the support of affiliated clubs and shooters, as has been exemplified during the past year, the future of the Association is assured."

A full report covering the Annual Meeting and the 1948 Allocation of Championships will appear in the December issue of "News."

In order to ensure satisfactory Association handicapping, Club officials are requested to show each shooter's full surname and initials (shooting name if any in addition) when forwarding handicap returns to the Association office.
