THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

The arrival of the month of April heralds the approach of the biggest weekend of shooting since 1939, for during the period April 24 and April 26 the A.C.P.T.S.A. will shoot its 1948 Champion of Champions Cup and sponsor its team in the Second International contest against teams representative of England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales. The venue of the big series is the Blackburn Club's new 30 acre shooting grounds at East Burwood. The first-named contest will be decided at 50 clay pigeons from 18 yards, double-barrel. The International Team to represent Australia will comprise the first fifteen highest scorers in the Champion of Champions Cup and five additional shooters who will be chosen by the A.C.P.T.S.A. Selection Committee.

Those who have the honour to represent Australia in the International will be required to shoot at 100 clay pigeons per man from the Internationally regulated mark of 16 yards using 2½" shells loaded with 1½ oz. of shot. This stipulation varies considerably from the usual run of conditions as used in Australia and shooters reach-

ing the International Team are warned to prepare for a variation or two in timing until they settle down for the marathon number of releases.

Those not engaged in the International on April 26 will be provided for in two Association handicaps, at 15 and 20 birds.

The shooting enclosure is 13 miles from Melbourne G.P.O. on a splendid motor road. Visiting shooters who require transport should communicate their requirements to the A.C.P.T.S.A. Secretary Box 2038 S., Melbourne with the minimum of delay. Arrangements will then be made for mass transportation.

Accommodation is likely to be at a premium in Melbourne during the weekend of shooting (it is also Anzac Holiday weekend) and no time should be lost by those desirous of obtaining satisfactory hotel reservation.

For a number of metropolitan shooters who will be engaged in business duties on Saturday morning, April 24, arrangements will be made to accept their entries for the Cham-

pion of Champions Cup later than the normal acceptance hour. This concession will apply only to those whose circumstances in this regard are known to Association officials and provided the Association Secretary is informed at least seven days prior to the shoot. The Executive Committee is desirous that every shooter wishing to qualify for the International Team should not be precluded owing to Saturday morning

business requirements.

Intending competitors in the Champion of Champions Cup are officially informed that no championship qualification is necessary to secure entry into the contest. The A.C.P.T.S.A. Executive is of the opinion that if a shooter is good enough to win under the conditions laid down he is justly entitled to the Champion of Champions title.

THE ASSOCIATION

The Executive Committee of the Association held a meeting on March 12. There was a full attendance of members with the exception of the Tasmanian representatives, Messrs. W. E. H. Rainbird and J. M. Tyquin, both of whom were granted leave. Considerable business was disposed of and the meeting did not conclude until 11.45 p.m.

Among important dates confirmed for title events was August 14 for the Commonwealth Double-barrel championship 1948 and August 15 for £50 Handicap, at Townsville, Queensland. Another important date approved was the Coburg Club's Melbourne Cup Day holiday, November 2, for a £50 Handicap in the morning and a £250 Handicap in the afternoon. The Executive stipulated that 20 per cent. of the prize money should be reserved for trophies to the winning shooters.

The question of non-payment by shooters of registration fees was discussed at length. The Secretary was instructed to inform club secretaries, through the medium of "News" that the rule whereby a list of all club members together with their registration fees should be forwarded to the Association Secretary by 31st January each year must be adhered to—with supplementary lists for newly joined members. The Committee decided also that after the expiration of the first three months of any year that all unregistered shooters names should be marked with a small star alongside their names in the Association "News" and the star retained

against such names in all subsequent issues of "News" until dues are paid. It was felt that the Association Secretary should not be required to make repeated application to clubs and individual shooters for registration fees. The matter of the Association dinner on April 24 was given much consideration.

It was agreed that the offer of Mr. Vic. Fankhauser of the use of his commodious premises at East Burwood (adjoining the shooting ground) should be accepted. This was unanimously agreed upon. The Association dinner will therefore be held in pleasant and easy surroundings without a time limit up to a reasonable hour. Previous experience revealed that diners were compelled to leave hotel premises about 10 p.m. One of the features of dinner will be a specially prepared 100 lb. porker presented by the Holbrook Club's President, Mr. Ollie Cox.

Messrs. Harry Watts and Keith Rice were appointed official referees for Champion of Champions and International meeting. Both are most able supervisors and shooters will have every confidence in their decisions.

The slowness attached to skeet shooting was a matter of long deliberation. The Committee felt that this type of shooting would be more popular if it was speeded up and in order to do this agreed upon the semi-American style of allowing the shooter to call for his bird, as in down-the-line shooting, instead of waiting

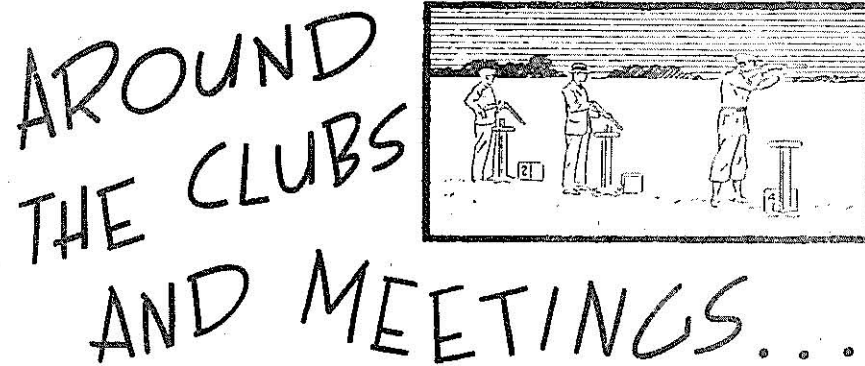

on the referees signal. The only requirement of the referee will be that he will follow each shooter from station to station and ensure complete compliance with the rules, watch for no-birds, and give lost or kill decisions.

It was reported that about 120 parcels had already been forwarded to shooters in Great Britain. Sufficient funds are available to send others, but the Association still has over 100 names on its records of shooters in England who will miss out unless additional funds or parcels are forthcoming. Australians in a position to

forward a parcel or two are asked to be mindful of their sporting kinsmen abroad.

The Association referee class series has again been deferred until about middle of May. The main reason for this is a further indisposition of the chief examiner and also a surprisingly small number of nominations. In view of the persistent demands for official referees this latter was unexpected. Therefore, those "hard-thinkers" who have deferred lodging nominations may now do so until May 1.

50 CLAY PIGEONS FROM 18 YARDS, double-barrel, either barrel to be of equal value, highest scores to count. Five track shooting system, two automatic angle traps. Five shooters in each squad, positions by ballot. Competitors shoot at 25 clay pigeons from each trap. In the event of ties to be shot off in batches of five clay pigeons until finality.

The event is open to any shooter registered with the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association who is a member of an affiliated club in any part of the Commonwealth of Australia. No championship qualification is necessary.

PRIZE LIST—CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS CUP

The winner of the Champion of Champions Cup event will hold the Donald Mackintosh Perpetual Silver Cup (valued at 75 guineas) for 12 months and will also receive the following awards—

Replica of Champion of Champions Cup,
A.C.P.T.S.A. Champion of Champions Sash.
Special Winner's Trophy.

These trophies presented by Mr. J. M. Wilson (President of the A.C.P.T.S.A.).

Trophies will be awarded to the next highest scorers, down to eighth position. Four special trophies will be awarded to competitors registering the best performance whose Association handicaps come under the following categories—12/13 yards, 14/15 yards, 16/17 yards, 18 yards and over (a competitor finishing anywhere in the first eight will not be eligible for the sectional handicap trophies).

The two Interstate competitors (resident outside Victoria), registering the best performance in the Champion of Champions Cup and not winning any other award, will be allotted special trophies.

A special trophy will be presented to the Lady drawing the winning shooter.

ENTRANCE FEE.—Entrance Fee for the Champion of Champions Cup will be 50/- (birds free). Optional sweepstakes of 20/- and 10/- will be conducted in conjunction with the Champion of Champions Cup. In addition an optional 5/- sweepstake, restricted to shooters whose Association handicap does not exceed 15 yards will also be available. All sweepstakes above will be divided (without deductions), First 60%, Second 30%, Third 10%.

AUSTRALIAN TEAMS' CHAMPIONSHIP

(To be shot concurrently with the Champion of Champions Cup)

Teams of Four Men. The first twenty birds released to each competitor in the Champion of Champions Cup will be counted as scores for the Australian Team's Championship. Four trophies to winning team. Nomination 20/- per team (Entries must be lodged prior to commencement of Champion of Champions Cup event).

No practice birds will be available owing to the restricted supply position.

Australia's Second International Teams' Match

Competing teams, England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales and Australia, for the DONALD MACKINTOSH INTERNATIONAL TROPHY, valued at 100 Guineas. (Results by cable)

The Australian Team of 20 men for the International Match will comprise the 15 highest scorers in the Champion of Champions Cup event 1948, plus 5 others to be chosen by the A.C.P.T.S.A. Selection Committee. In the event of any selected shooter being unable to take his place in the team his place will be filled by another shooter agreed upon by the Selection Committee.

CONDITIONS

100 Birds per member from 16 yards, five track shooting system, in four stages of 25 each. Automatic angle trap, double-barrel, "kills" only to count. 2½" Cartridges loaded with not more than 1½ oz. of shot, No. 6 English size.

Best 15 scores will count in the competition. Five lowest scores will be counted out.

PRIZE LIST—INTERNATIONAL MATCH

Highest scorer in the Australian Team will hold the special Hartley International High-Gun Cup (presented by Hartley's Ltd., Melbourne) valued at £20 for 12 months (or until the next International Match) and will be awarded a special replica trophy valued at £5/5/ (also presented by Hartley's Ltd.) and the International High-Gun Sash. Second and third trophies will be awarded to members of the team registering the next scores to high-gun. In the event of ties, to be shot off in batches of ten clay pigeons until finality.

Every member of the Australian Team will receive the special "International 1948" Badge.

ENTRANCE FEES—The Entrance Fee for each member of the team will be 50/-, including birds.

Optional sweepstake of 10/- will be conducted in conjunction. Sweepstake money divided 60%, 30%, 10% without deductions.

PRACTICE BIRDS—Members of the International Team will be permitted ten practice birds before the competition, in accordance with the International conditions. Practice birds 2/-.

CARTRIDGES—Special cartridges, loaded in accordance with the conditions governing International competition, will be available to members of the team only, at current rates. Only these cartridges may be used.

PROTESTS—In the event of any protest or protests, 20/- accompanying each protest, which are required to be written in ink, must be lodged with the Secretary A.C.P.T.S.A. during or within 15 minutes of the conclusion of the competition concerned. The Executive Committee's decision shall be final.

REFRESHMENTS—Refreshments and light luncheon will be available on the ground throughout the day.

NO LIABILITY—The organisers, whilst taking every precaution, do not accept responsibility for any accidental damage to any person or property on the ground, or for safe custody of guns, ammunition, clothing, etc., deposited in the pavilion or elsewhere.

DINNER TO DONORS AND COMPETITORS—A dinner to donors and competitors will be tendered by the Association on Saturday evening, April 24th.

OVERSEAS ITEMS

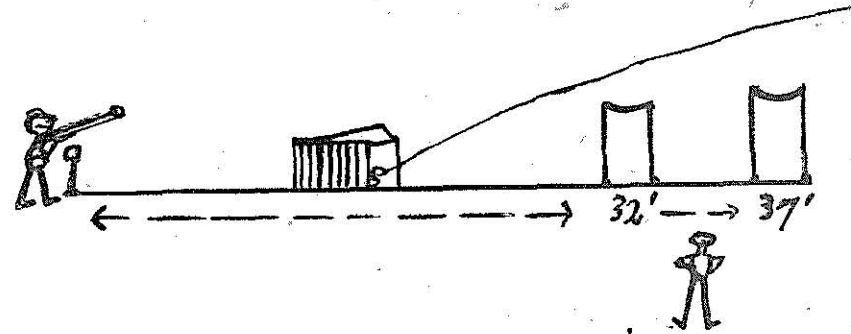
(From Mr. W. P. Grosvenor—Famous English Shooting Authority and Coach).

With a description of my team coaching methods as partly explained last month, I will resume without introductory frills so as to maintain proper continuity.

At first, a certain amount of accuracy was lost, owing to over swinging, but this was gradually regained and at the end of some half dozen afternoons the improvement was most marked. When shooting in ordinary club competitions my men were all "top of the traphouse" shots and their general standard of shooting improved wonderfully, certainly by 5 per cent. or better. Indeed, in one instance it worked so well, that one of our men in a most important shoot some months later broke all of his 50 birds with the right barrel and I think practically every one of them was pulverised, not merely broken.

Some of the important points about

speed in clay target shooting is, that it minimises angles and makes the shooting on a very windy day much easier for the reason that the breeze has so little time to effect the flight of the target. It also takes care, to a large extent, of a blown pattern—this if happening to a slow shot, would be likely to cause a miss. I always insisted, under this type of coaching, that only one cartridge be used. Another point I used to try and instil on my men—that was to try and acquire rhythm in shooting. By this I mean to cut out all those silly mannerisms that some men have—one wasting time addressing the trap-house, another raising and lowering his gun two or three times before calling, or again another trick one sees, of a man who will wait and not put his gun to his shoulder for some seconds after the man before him has shot.



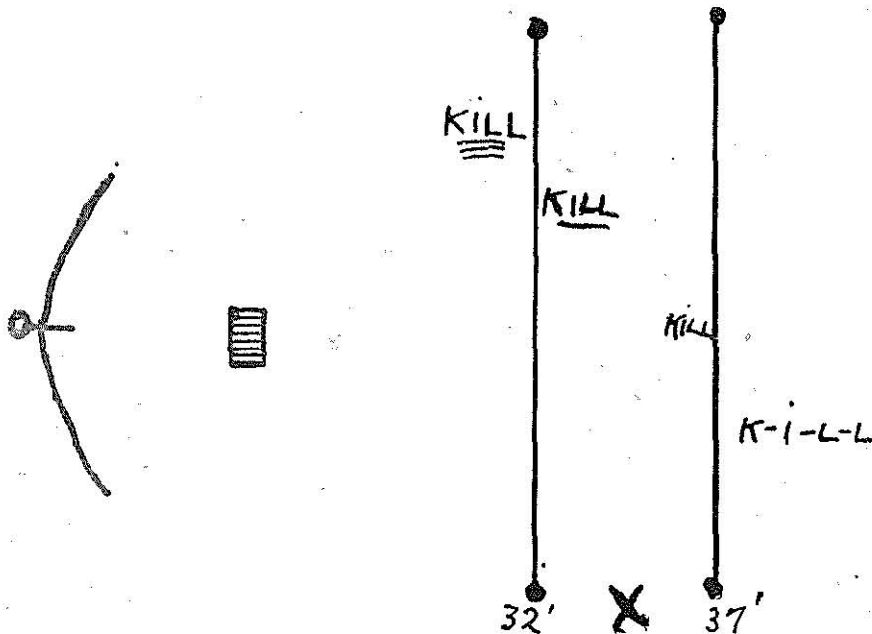
Trap wound to throw 50/55 yards, i.e., Strong Speedy Throw.

ly and helps for the betterment of the scoring. It is a treat to see a crack American or Canadian team on the line, at the easy speed they shoot. It is good odds that they will finish a 25 bird event minutes before some teams I know. If you were to put a split second watch on them, the time taken by five men to shoot a bird each will hardly vary at all. Of course such a type of schooling will

The ideal is "Pull," "Bang," "Pull," "Bang" and so on and once this steady rhythm is established, the shooting goes on regularly and steadily.
