THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

STOP PRESS

1948 INTERNATIONAL

Just prior to going to press official intimation was received from the English Clay Pigeon Shooting Association in London, following a conference of Great Britain delegates, that finalisation of details had been reached for the first of the post-war International Clay Pigeon Shooting Tournaments to be held at Cardiff, in Wales. The opening day will be on Friday, June 25.

The following conditions for the International Teams Championship, in which Australia will compete, were arranged. Teams of 20 men, the best 15 scores to count. Cartridges confined to 2½" length of case with a maximum load of 1½ oz. shot. No larger size of shot than No. 6 (English) may be used.

Next month's issue of Association "News" will be an "International" number and the full details and particulars of the big shoots listed for April 24 and 26 will be dealt with at length.

In view of the many requests for an official ruling on the "definition of an amateur," as applicable especially to the Olympic Games, it is interesting to reproduce a copy of the ruling given to the English Clay Pigeon Shooting Association and laid down by the International Olympic Committee for participants in the Olympic Games. The information as published was signed by Mr. E. J. Holt, O.B.E., Director of Organisation for the XIVth Olympiad, London 1948.

"An amateur is one whose connection with sport is and always has been solely for pleasure and for the physical, mental or social benefits he derives therefrom and to whom sport is nothing more than recreation without material gain of any kind, direct or indirect.

As a condition precedent to taking part in the Olympic Games a competitor must be an amateur and a member of an organisation affiliated with the International Federation recognised by the International Olympic Committee as governing the sport in which he is to participate.

The National Association, which in each country governs each parti-

cular sport, must certify on a special form provided by the Organising Committee that each competitor is an amateur in accordance with the rules of the International Federation governing that sport. This declaration must be countersigned by the National Olympic Committee which shall verify that the competitors are amateurs according to the rules of the International Federation concerned and of the I.O.C. Finally, each competitor must sign the following statement: "I, the undersigned, declare on my honour that I am an amateur according to the rules of the International Federation governing my sport, that I have never knowingly transgressed such rules, and that I have participated in sport solely for pleasure and for the physical mental or social benefits I derive therefrom; that sport to me is nothing more than a recreation without material gain of any kind, direct or indirect, and that I am eligible in all respects for participation in the Olympic Games."

2. "We recognise that each sport has its own individual problems and that it therefore is impossible that their regulations should be entirely uniform. We believe, however, that it is important for all concerned that all International Federations should find as much common ground as possible, and we are sure that there are many basic principles which are accepted by all. Furthermore, we believe there are certain regulations which might be recognised as desirable for the Olympic Games, even though they are not applied by the Federations to other events. We, therefore, recommend that a permanent committee consisting of three members of the I.O.C. and one representative from each International Federation whose sport is admitted to the Games be appointed to study the various questions before us and to draw up regulations for submission to the I.O.C. for the conduct of the Olympic Games."

OVERSEAS ITEMS

(From Mr. W. P. Grosvenor—Famous English Shooting Authority and Coach)

This letter comes to tell you that the most welcome parcel has at last arrived. My wife was delighted with the contents, particularly the fats, and we are reserving the tin of bacon as a special treat to celebrate the demobbing of our son, who is due out on the 4th March—many, many thanks.

Doubtless you have heard of the special tournament at clay pigeon shooting being arranged by our English C.P. Association to be run in conjunction with the Olympic Games. We hope to see some of your Australian shooters competing and we will look forward to meeting them. Advance programmes are being posted out next month.

As I type I am trying to make up my mind as to whether or not I shall take my courage in both hands and go down to our flooded marshes for an evening flight for wild duck. There is so much water about now that the edges of the big dykes (the main one being 16 feet wide and over 6 feet deep) are so well covered that it is quite easy to, what we call "muddle in" and it is no joke to get out by oneself and then have to walk home a mile or two. I have been in twice and the third time might be unlucky.

An amusing incident, on a recent Saturday night one of my friends called, all het-up and excited, he having shot his first wild goose. He first met a friend and told him and the reply was, "Did you, I'm off to the village to get some sausages," which was, you will agree, rather daunting. Then he rushed off home to show his wife and her remark was, "what did you want to shoot that for?" By then, he was fully deflated, but jumped on his bike again and came about a mile and a half to tell us, feeling that we at any rate would show appreciation. This we did, got out the best and celebrated and off he went satisfied and happy.

I think this is going to be a milder winter, else there would be more geese about. Which reminds me how

opinions differ as to shot sizes for wild geese. I lean towards bigish shot, i.e., the lettered sizes, such as "S.S.S.S.G." and "A.A." But many of our successful men swear by No. 2 shot, or even smaller and at 40 yards even No. 6 will do the trick if you happen to hit them in the head or neck. My brother-in-law a few winters ago on one night fired 9 cartridges loaded with 1 oz. of No. 3 shot and got four rights and lefts and one with the odd cartridge—not bad shooting! One of my farmer friends has a small pond on the border of his farming area. One night recently, after waiting until dark and not seeing a bird, decided to wait until the moon (full) rose and then the duck started to drop in. He shot down 36, picked them all up but one. This pond is only 40 yards square. A little over a mile from here is a small Broad and the sport on it used to be first class years ago. I remember the Duke of Rutland dropping 140 mallard one night and 105 on another occasion. I was posted about 300 yards away on both these occasions and did not fire my gun—they all led in from the other side. Here on this Broad they shoot from big rum tubs sunk into the marsh on the edge of the water. If you have not shot from a tub the angle of view is very strange, as it is practically a worm's eye view of everything. The days are gone for really big bags now, but it is nice to recall the days when one always thought it necessary to take 100 cartridges for a flight, just in case. I know of nothing more exasperating than to run out of shells and the duck still coming in.

The parcel your Association so kindly sent us (23/10/47) arrived today (6/1/48). It was enthusiastically received, unpacked with much excitement and we tender you our grateful thanks. All the items, as per schedule arrived intact. I handed them over to "stores" and now from time to time we shall wait for these

good things to be served to us and enjoy them with great relish, ever remembering the donors of "A Gift parcel from Australia." It is so very good of you.—H. ROGERS (Edge-ware, London). P.S.—Just going up to town. By direct (Roman) road we are 8½ miles from Marble Arch.)
