THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

The progress established since the inception of this publication and the support accorded its pages by advertising clubs and business houses has assured it a permanent place among the gun shooting journals of Australia. It is the aim of the A.C.P.T.S.A. to increase and enlarge its "News" and introduce and include new features considered likely to provide animated news interest. Accordingly this month is introduced a new section bearing the somewhat unusual nomenclature "Tips and Tails."

The section will allow the opportunity of providing a "tip" or even a "tail" of a worthwhile incident, story, or happening which has the right sporting atmosphere. Brevity will be its overseer. Commentary will necessarily be short and much to the point. If you have a particular "tip" or come in on the "tail" of a story with news value you can be assured of it appearing in this section.

Many have asked why the feature "Ten Years Ago" has not appeared in recent issues. Owing to restricted

newsprint supply position and the increased advertising handled during the past few months certain items had to be omitted in order to ensure inclusion of what was considered the more important matter. The feature is resumed in this issue.

The final Association shoot for the current season will be held on King's Birthday holiday, June 14, on the Blackburn's spacious 30-acre shooting grounds at East Burwood (V.). The main events will be the revival of the popular pre-war A.C.P.T.S.A. Intermediate Championship, restricted to shooters whose Association handicap does not exceed 16 yards. During the shooting of this event back-markers will be catered for with a sweep-stake series. Following will be a £100 Association Handicap at 25 birds. The winner will receive £40 and a trophy valued £12/10/ and awards will be made down to sixth position, and 12/15 yarders award. This long prize allocation has been well received by shooters—it provides a wide distribution of the good stake.

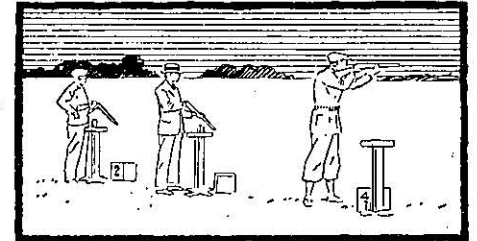

AROUND
THE CLUBS
AND MEETINGS...



BENDIGO (V.).—The Bendigo Club held its club double barrel championship on May 22. Shot at 15 birds from 15 yards the winner was George F. Carter with 13/15. He failed to stop his 2nd and 8th releases. Bill Santon, secretary at Myers Flat was runner-up 17/20 after a tie shoot with A. Bateman. George Carter had some pre-war experience at clays and on occasions visited Melbourne shoots. His win was very popular. Two minor events resulted in wins for Bateman and Santon. Bendigo Club is already arranging for a comprehensive re-building scheme The club has applied for three Midland District Championships to be shot before the end of the year. W. J. Jeffrey is Club Secretary.

BERRIMA (Bowral, N.S.W.).—On May 8 the N.S.W. Walk-up championship (first State title shot by Berrima Club) attracted a splendid field, comprising shooters from Griffith, Canberra, Young, Goulburn, Wollongong, Sydney, Bathurst and almost 100 per cent turn up of local members. Alex Palmer (Bowral) was referee. Immediate results of all scoring was made available by a newly installed public address system. George Bell (Young, N.S.W.) won the title event 19/25 birds. M. Fuller (Sydney), Bruce Hill (Haberfield) and L. North (Bowral) all 15/25 tied for the places. Hill won the tie shoot from North. A £25 handicap which followed was divided first and second by W. Ruddy (Wollongong) and Bruce Hill each 10/10. Several tied for third place and decided to shoot it out in gathering darkness. This

meant shooting after actual darkness had arrived—there are some good night duck shooters around Bowral. Weather conditions were most unfavourable—blowing half gale and very cold.

BLACKBURN (V.).—The main event during May at the East Burwood grounds of the Blackburn Club was the deciding of the Victorian premier title (double barrel) on May 22. Shot at 25 birds from 20 yards the outright winner was consistent 20 yarder, Fred Burns, who returned a clean score to defeat E. G. Biggs 24/25. The latter missed his 23rd by accepting a slow pull. The tie shoot for third went to Des. O'Callaghan 28/30 after tie shoot with W. R. Johns, Frank Brown and Jack McCraith each 27/30, then "Dubbs" 23/27. J. R. 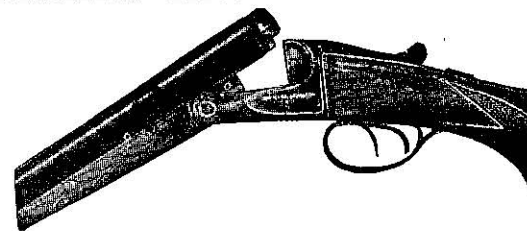

TEN YEARS AGO . . .

May 1938 was the opening period of the big pre-war boom in clay pigeon shooting. Records reveal that H. Munnings of Kempton (Tas) won the Commonwealth Single barrel Championship on the King's Meadows grounds of the Tasmanian Gun Club. Munnings, who was hardly sighted until the 15th round came from the back and won 21/25. Bob Oakley of Footscray won the principal Nobel Championship on the old Nobel Club grounds from J. Bryant and Turoa Webster, the latter one of the prominent jockeys of the day. (A week earlier Webster won the main flat race when astride Riddle at Williamstown Racecourse). Another to record a good win was Verner Fick who had just taken over the presidential chair of the Blackburn Club. He won a fifteen birder 27/27.

Australian Teams Championship

Hobart G. C. Team registered 73/80 to win the Australian Teams Title outright. The teams complement was, J. M. Tyquin (score 19), R. Pitt (18), R. Redpath (19), W. R. Morgan (17).

The runner-up team was Blackburn No. 1, J. Bryant (18), Fred Burns (17), L. L. Schilling (19) and John Bryant (18), 72/80.

Coburg No. 1, was third 69/80, J. A. McCraith (19), "Ingi" (18), "Duxbac" (15), G. Biggs (17), then followed Blackburn No. 2 and Coburg No. 2 level 68/80.

Young, NSW 66/80, Sydney, NSW 65/80, Griffith, NSW 64/80, Coburg No. 3, 62/80, Coburg No. 4 and Tasmanian G. C. (Launceston) level 61/80, Gilgandra, NSW 59/80, Deniliquin and Griffith No. 2, 56/80, Colac 49/80.

The contest was shot in conjunction with the Champion of Champions Cup and scores were counted on the first twenty birds released to each man in the Cup contests.

Stuart Johnson, son of Aubrey Johnson the Blackburn Secretary, is a versatile young sportsman. He is still a student at Geelong College and this year secured one of the coveted seats in Head of the River crew for the College. Young Johnson has registered the non-dé-plume of "Stuart" and has already had successes at the elusive discs.

It was indeed pleasing to meet once again the veteran ex-world champion trapshot, Mr. Donald Mackintosh during the shooting of the recent Association Champion of Champions Cup and International, at East Burwood grounds. Mr. Mackintosh now over 80 is in excellent health and takes a lively interest in everything pertaining to the gun. Mr. Mackintosh is the donor of the perpetual

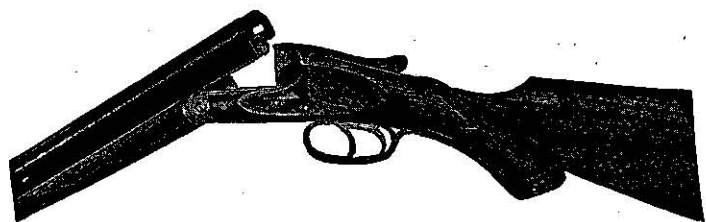

Amateur Shooting Rules

From time to time queries are raised as to whether shooters winning money prizes are infringing amateur status. The following definition of Amateur Rules as laid down by the Union Internationale De Tir (International Shooting Union) came to hand last month from the English Clay Pigeon Shooting Association. The rulings are reproduced as received:—

1. The principles of amateurism, laid down in the declaration of the I.O.C. at its congress 1947, should be valid for the members of the International Shooting Union.

2. Money Prizes. Money prizes up to £2 or 8 dollars—or its equivalent are considered as a compensation for costs. If there is a meeting covering several days, money prizes totalling £10 or 40 dollars—or its equivalent, within the same week are also considered a compensation for costs without detailed specifications from the competitors. Money prizes exceeding the above-mentioned sums should be given over to the club, to which the competitor belongs. The competitor may receive from his club only a sum corresponding to his actual costs, which may include:

- (a) entrance fees,
- (b) ammunition,
- (c) travelling expenses and cost of living according to the rules of the International Amateur Athletic Federation.

These apply only to categories of shooting supervised by the U.I. de Tir.

3. As an amateur should not be considered:

- (a) anyone who gives an exhibition in marksmanship and is paid for it,
- (b) anyone who professionally makes test shooting of guns, or ammunition from the shoulder (an operator of a test shooting machine is not included),

(c) anyone who is a professional instructor in shooting.

To (b) and (c) categories do not belong a member of the armed forces, who acts as an instructor to recruits.

In judging the status as an amateur according to this article, the activities of the competitor during the last two years should be considered.

4. The competitor should fulfill the qualifications of amateurism laid down by the National Olympic Committee of his country.

N.B. The above definition to date from the publication of the Rules for the Olympic Games, 1948.



OVERSEAS ITEMS

Programmes are to hand covering the English, European and World Clay Pigeon Shooting Championships to be shot at Bisley Camp, Brookwood, near Woking, Surrey, on July 22-24, 1948. The English Open title will be decided at 100 birds, in 4 stages of 25, "kills" only to count. The scores in this event will also count towards the European and World titles. On Friday, July 23, a further 100 birder will be staged under similar conditions, scores counting for the European Championship the final day, July 24 another 100 birder, scores of which will be added to those registered in events 1 and 2 and the competitor returning the highest score over the 300 birds will be the winner of the World Championship over the automatic trap. The World Championship teams match, 6 men per team (who need not necessarily shoot together or in the same squad) scores to be aggregates registered over the 300 birds, the best five scores only to count. The series is reported to be attracting many first class American and Continental shots.

A.C.P.T.S.A. HANDICAPS

The following are the Association Handicaps for all registered shooters competing in OPEN events. Where no handicap has been declared, insufficient record of performances are known.

Handicaps have been declared with the limit mark shooters commencing at 12 yards in accordance with the rules of the Association. Clubs are requested to conform to this rule and begin handicaps at 12 yards. Unknown shooters should commence no nearer than 16 yards.

In order to ensure satisfactory Association handicapping, Club officials are requested to show each shooter's full surname and initials (shooting name if any in addition) when forwarding handicap returns to the Association office.
