PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT 2009



As the President of the Australian Clay Target Association (ACTA) it is with pleasure that I bring you my 2009 annual report, the third as your President.

Our membership ending 2009 was slightly down on the previous year finishing with 12,332 members, when we consider the world's financial crisis I believe our association has done extremely well to hold our membership numbers so close.

Our 2009 ISSF National championships were conducted at Cecil Park in N.S.W. where we received record entries, and with a compact National program the Oceania Games to were run conjointly with our championships. Thank you to the Cecil Park gun Club in providing their excellent facilities to hold our associations ISSF Championships.

The National Trap Championships were held at the Roma Gun Club in Western Queensland; again we received record entries of 3850 over the five days of championships. The hospitality extended to all our members was a credit to the Roma club.

Our National Skeet Championship were held at the National Grounds in May where teams were selected to represent Australia at the 1st World ICTSF Skeet Championships in England.

Our World Skeet teams travelled in August to England and were successful with Blake Slater becoming the 1st Junior World Skeet Champion, and in the Veterans Laurie Chelepy narrowly lost in a shoot off for the World Veteran Champion title. Our teams acquitted themselves admirably with the Open team placing 3rd, our Ladies team placing 2nd, our Veterans team placing 2nd. Our Junior team topped their division of the championships taking 1st place.

During August our National sporting Championships were held jointly at Maryborough and Bendigo Gun clubs, a huge effort was provided by both clubs to host our championship but despite their best efforts we received low entries.

The junior development squad is now in its 11th year and under the watchful eye of National coaching director Mr Graeme Boyd and his junior development staff continues to produce talented shooters, our appreciation to Graeme and his team for their continued support in the delivery of this program.

The National Office has had several changes during the last year. In the lead up to the placement of a full time Executive Officer, Mr Drew Maywald temporary filled in until March when our new executive officer Tony Turner joined our association at what has to be our busiest time of the year along with the National Ground improvements and the negotiations with council it has been my pleasure to assist and work together with Tony. Ally Taylor joined our staff in accounts and Judy Ferry as our receptionist. To all our staff at the National Office your efforts have once again been greatly appreciated.

The Executive changes for the year has seen Mr. Brian Bailey replaced long time serving executive member Mr. Allan Kenny as the Tasmanian delegate.

Mr. Terry Marsden replaced Mr. Geoff Faulkes as the Western Australia delegate.

Welcome to Brian and Terry and the associations appreciation to both retiring executive members Allan Kenny and Geoff Faulkes for their years of service to our association.

After a year of meetings and negotiations with the Wagga Wagga City Council our association has been successful in acquiring the National Grounds and the adjoining land to our south giving our association 33.5 hectares on a freehold title and thus securing our long term future in Wagga. All persons involved in our negotiations were impressed by the professional manner the Wagga council and its officers worked with our association to bring this to fruition. This in turn has allowed your executive to invest in major ground improvements;

Three extra permanent DTL layouts on our neighbours land

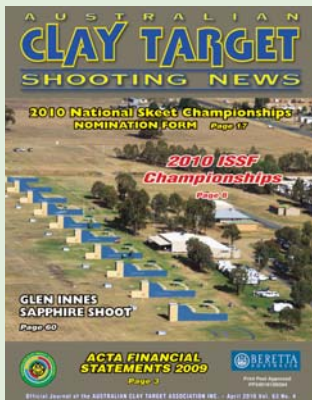

Scope

Executive Officer's Report

The National Office is currently running at maximum output with the completion of the ISSF Championships and the audit by Tudor and Company being completed in the last month. Tas and Nam, who were responsible for the audit were very thorough and ensured all of the requirements of the audit were addressed in the appropriate manner. Whilst in the office they provided up to date information regarding our requirements under the Corporations act and further training for Ally. The audit results are in the magazine for your perusal, it has also been sent to all member Clubs and States.

With the National Trap Championships being only a month away the office is very busy with nominations and the development of the ground. The three new Mattarelli traps for the practice traps have been delivered by Beretta and installed by our trap specialist Fred Rapley. Fred is always prepared to give up his time and expertise to install and set the traps which is greatly appreciated by the ACTA and also no doubt by the shooters. We have also purchased two Matterelli coin operated boxes to complement the new traps which will enable us to have three practice traps running throughout the Nationals.

We have applied for and received our Arms Fair permit through NSW Firearms which enables us to have traders on site for the Championships. This is also an exercise in risk assessment and safety, which was completed by Paul Marsden and Associates to ensure we are conforming to all risk areas of running the National event.

One area we need to ensure we are more diligent with is the completion of forms for the National Championships (all of them) and that is ensuring that members fill out all of the information required on the nomination form. This will simply make your championship hassle free, the format for nominations will be as follows:

We receive your nomination and you will be squadded the week after nominations close (Friday 12th March 2010). We will send you a letter stating your first event time and squad, when you arrive at the National ground you will be required to report to the events office with your handicap book and licence (in NSW you must have your licence on you at all times) once you confirm your Handicap and grade details are correct and we sight your licence you will be given your full squad card for the week (except for the handicap event which will be posted Thursday) and you can proceed to shoot. You will not be able to shoot until you have completed these tasks.

To ensure you are not held up please ensure your handicap book is up to date and signed off. These are simple requests that will make your time and our volunteers at the Nationals a more enjoyable experience. If you turn up without your book there is a \$20.00 fee to obtain a new one for the duration of the Championships.

Ground developments continue with a further development application lodged with the Department of Sport and Recreation. This is a part of the continuing process of developing the ground into a National and International standard venue.

Now we own the ground the possibilities on the ground for further expansion of facilities may enable us to attract "outside" money to assist our growth.

The AGM is booked for Sunday the 11th April at the Wagga Commercial Club whilst the ACTA presentation night will be on Tuesday the 13th of April at the Wagga RSL Club. The evening will feature the presentation of the Doug Smith Medal and the induction of Arthur Turner and Donald Mackintosh into the Hall of Fame along with the awarding of the Presidential Medal and Life Registration. This promises to be a great night so book early.

With rain over the past three weeks the ground looks great with an extensive coverage of grass. Camping sites have now been numbered giving us 160 sites. During the next few years we will further develop another 36 powered sites at the Western end of the complex for campers' convenience.

BRISBANE GUN CLUB, 19TH – 24TH JANUARY

The opening day commenced with the 75 target Commonwealth women's Skeet Championships as the opening event of the Championships. A small but very competitive group took to the layouts with Zita Dettori from Normanton, Queensland taking the overall first prize shooting 88/100 to edge out Lauren Mark Werribee, Victoria second 87/00 whilst young up and comer Laura Coles from the WAGC came in third with 84/100.

The next event in the 2010 ISSF Championships was Commonwealth Double trap event with 26 competitors taking on the 75 pair plus final event.

Nicholas Kirley Mansfield VIC shot a 182/200 to take the overall from Russell Mark Werribee, VIC 179/200 with club mate Craig Trembath 177/200. Thomas Turner took out the AA grade with 128/150 Whilst Craig Henwood Melbourne VIC 114/150 took A Grade. Isle of Man visitor Jake Keeling took B Grade 121/150 with Joshua Collard, Frankston taking C Grade with 107/150

2010 is going to be a very busy year in the coaching scene. We have to conduct coach the coach's weekends and coaching camps throughout each State with bigger and better numbers than we ever have. But this will not happen unless the States and Zones plan and budget now.

shooters to use. They are a very valuable tool for shooters and coaches not just to fire a shot at and say wow what a great pattern . . . if used correctly the pattern board will give you back valuable information on a number of things. You may have a shooter with good gun fit and they are looking straight down the rib but the pattern is hitting a bit right for a right hander or left with a left hander. The gun could have heavy triggers and the shooter has to use so much pressure to fire the shot that they pull the gun to the right or left. Look for this if you see this on a board. You will find that some cartridges will pattern better than others. You will know what your pattern size is at your target breaking point and be able to determine the best choke to suit your shooting discipline eg skeet chokes do not work very well on trap targets. You will have the pattern impact point compared to the aiming point, this will give you a very good idea what sight picture your shooter must see when they pull the trigger. A very low pattern would mean the shooter would have to cover the target to break it? Most likely blotting out the target and pulling the trigger or a very high pattern would require a shooter to judge a distance under each target to hit it in the middle of their pattern. You can't

judge over or under accurately each and every shot. A good pattern height is when the gun shoots where you look and the target is hit in the centre. Know what suits your natural aiming point, it may be 60/40, 75/25 ??? This must be determined by watching how the shooter breaks their targets eg tops off, centre or bottoms, the pattern board is a guide, how targets are broken is the proof.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

GENERAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred.
4. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management
5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
7. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
8. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility will be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for they're failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
9. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
10. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
11. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
12. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
13. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
14. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
15. Nominations will close at 5pm on Friday 23 April and no late entries will be accepted.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
18. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
19. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
20. ***All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.***
21. Squads of 5 to shoot 50 targets targets in brackets of 25, one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5 to shoot 100 targets in brackets of 50, two visits to the traps.
22. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.

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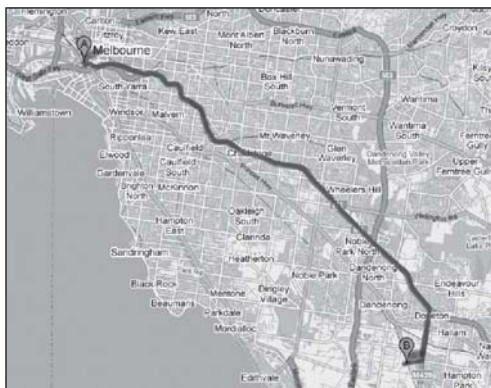

Psychological Skills for Shooting

MYTHS

I was recently asked at workshop: Does mental skills training work?

I was a little taken aback because this person had gone to the trouble to come to the workshop and yet the question implied that he wasn't really committed. Burton & Raedeke (2008) claims that researchers evaluating the effectiveness of mental skills training found that performance can be improved across a wide variety of sports. For me, and yes, I have a vested interest, I would argue that all athletes can benefit from mental skills training.

In thinking about this I agree with Burton & Raedeke that mental skills training can have an impact in three areas: improved performance, enhanced enjoyment and the development of strong life skills. Improving performance does not just mean getting to the top. For most of us that may not happen, but we can improve our performance. Moving up a grade, getting back to 25 metres, achieving personal bests in one or many disciplines are just a few examples of improving performance. It may be difficult to be in "the zone" all the time but if we can decrease the frequency of sub-par performances and choking, and increase the ability to score higher more often, then we are improving our performance. Secondly, if we are enjoying what we are doing more then we will start to develop mental toughness: competitiveness, composure, confidence, competence, commitment, etc and we handle competitive stress better and feel more self-confident. Because we have improved we will want to compete more. This improvement will motivate us to achieve better results. Finally, mental skills training programs can facilitate strong personal development that can be transferred to other areas of our life: work, school, relationships, etc. Athletes who are self-disciplined to set goals, train and compete are just as likely to set goals in other areas of their lives and achieve in these areas with the same level of self-discipline. Athletes who have used and developed mental skills programs are more likely to be able to bounce back from injury or deal with adversity and catastrophes better because they can use the learned skills such as goal setting, visualization, mental rehearsal, etc to assist with their recovery.

After the workshop had finished I wondered about the myths surrounding mental skills training and what roadblocks were getting in the way of everyone adopting them.

Myth 1: Mental skills training takes too much time. Athletes and coaches alike felt that there is barely enough time to focus on the physical and technical skills let alone add more time by doing mental skills. Mental skills should be integrated into practice and competition. For the shooter, lawn bowler, golfer, a well-rehearsed and maintained set up routine is essential before each shot. Part of your mental skills program should be to develop this routine and mentally rehearse it over and over again until it is habitual in training and competition. Mental skills such as centering, breathing, focusing on the here and now, etc can be practiced anywhere and anytime: waiting in a queue at the supermarket, at a red traffic light, while walking, etc.

Myth 2: Mental skills are innate. According to Burton & Raedeke, it is easy to assume that for the elite athletes or shooters, aspects of mental toughness: composure, confidence, competence, control, commitment, etc, are innate. On the contrary, we are born with certain physiological and psychological predispositions, but being motivated, staying calm under pressure and maintaining confidence are learned skills and it is

more efficient using a mental skills training program than relying on trial and error.

Myth 3: Mental skills training is only for psychological problems. Therapy is effective for psychological problems. Mental skills training is to help effective and already positive athletes to become more mentally tough, more efficient and achieve better results.

Myth 4: Mental skills training provides a quick fix. I had a boss years ago that used to say, "every problem has a simple answer, and it's wrong". If your game has suffered from learning the wrong technique and you have been persevering for years, then you need to unlearn the mistake and relearn what you have to do. Mental skills training programs can help but they should be part of a sustained program. A one off lesson may whet your appetite but it will not be the "silver bullet".

Myth 5: Mental skills training can create performance miracles. I wish! Mental skills training is designed to increase performance matched to potential. It cannot produce results that are beyond the athlete's ability. But that said, mental skill training, can increase ability and potential overtime because the skills lead to an increase in concentration, attention, focus and mental toughness. Improvement may not happen immediately but it will happen. You should be mindful that learning new skills take time, so if you're doing some relaxation and visualization don't expect great things next week. But instead, plot your performance over a twelve month period and you should start to see an improvement.

Myth 6: Mental skills training is for the elite only. Why? Elite sportsmen are at the top because, whether they know it or not, they have mastered the mental skills required to compete and stay at a high level. There is no reason that everyone shouldn't learn the skills and improve, thereby at best challenging the elite, and least, improving your own performance and increasing your enjoyment in the sport. By learning the skills and maintaining the program you will be maximizing your potential and facilitating personal growth.

So to become an elite athlete and stay there, you will need to have the requisite physical skills for the sport, the appropriate technical skills to play the game and the mental skills such as goal setting, concentration, relaxation and visualization, to maintain mental toughness.

A TRIBUTE TO ONE OF NSWCTA's LEGENDS

Ernie Hawkins: 1927-2009



Ernie grew up at Wilberforce, in the Hawkesbury area. He started shooting at 10 years of age and was given a single barrel 410 shotgun by his Uncle. That gun is still in the family. With it he shot rabbits, quail etc, to supplement the families larder.

He worked as a farm hand, then an apprentice electrician, linesman mechanic, and ended up as electrical superintendent for Prospect County Council, a position he held until retirement in 1988.

In 1943, at age 16, he joined the RAAF Air Training Core. At age 18 he was selected for Fighter Pilot training, and was to be initially posted to Canada to learn to fly the Spitfire, however, with the Wars end in 1945, his unit was disbanded and his potential flying career never eventuated.

Ernie started Clay Target Shooting in 1957. His first gun was a double trigger Beretta under and over. In 1962 he purchased a "Breda" U&O from Malcolm Fuller, and used this

distinctive gun from then to his last competition a little while ago. He was a foundation member of the Hawkesbury Gun Club (now Cecil Park) and served as its President for 12 years.

Ernie was elected to the National Executive in 1970. About this time he started formation of the NSWCTA, and served as its inaugural President for 5 years. He also assisted with the formation of the Queensland, Victorian, and Northern Territory Associations. He was elected National President in 1977.

He was awarded life registration of the ACTA, and life membership of the NSWCTA, Ernie was also a life member of Hawkesbury (Cecil Park) Gun Club, Melbourne Gun Club, Coffs Harbour Gun Club, and had Life registration of Cobar Gun Club.

He was humble about his shooting achievements, but these include:

Bronze medal in the National Skeet Championship, Melbourne 1974, 5 Open Mackintosh Trap Teams, 2 Veteran Mackintosh Trap Teams, 3 International Shoulder to Shoulder teams matches against New Zealand and New Caledonia, Overall Veterans High Gun at Adelaide Nationals 1993. Won 3 Gold Medals and 1 Silver in individual events at the same Nationals, NSW Open Trap Team 5 time, NSW Open Skeet Team 9 times, 2 Commonwealth Championships, 8 State Championships, 56 District Championships, Awarded ACTA Presidential Medal in 1990.

His last competitive shoot was the Roma Open Shoot in 2007. He loved the sport and enjoyed the company of many great friends.

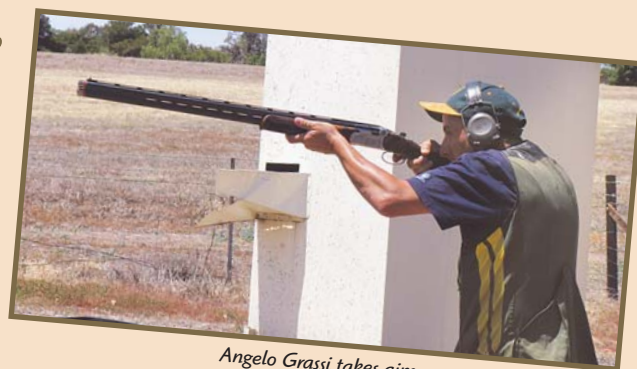

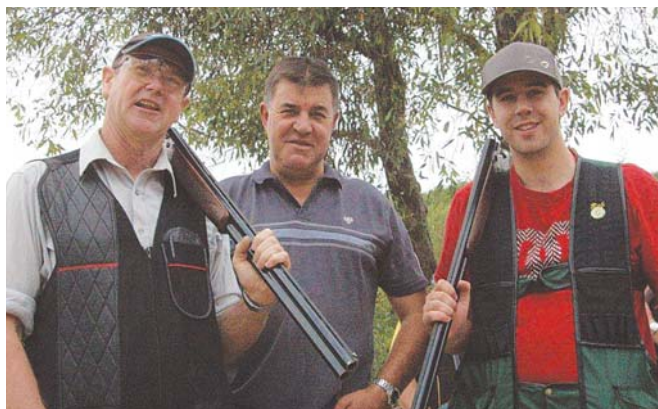

During 2009, four trap records were broken. In January, the Tasmanian 15 metre break record was broken when Arty Del Ben from



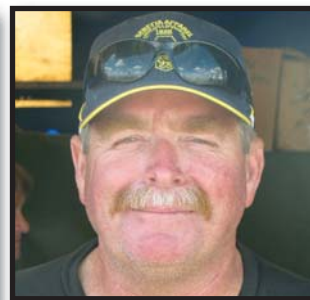
