National President's Notes



The Legal & Governance Committee is currently handling the delicate issue of a possible conflict of interest involving our NCD (National Coaching Director). There has been much confusion and misinformation circulating regarding this matter and in an attempt to clarify things I wish to advise all that: The NCD has been asked to stop all duties associated with the position until the matter has been reviewed. This DOES NOT MEAN that he is suspended from the Association. The NCD is still able to attend, compete etc at all ACTA grounds and events as normal. This whole situation, whilst regrettable, is certainly not any

reflection on Graeme's character.

ACTA met with AISL (Australian International Shooting Limited) on Monday the 28th of February to address the concerns raised at the informal shooters meeting recently held in Perth, and other matters. A Question and Answer column is being introduced in the CTSN to address matters raised by Olympic Discipline shooters. AISL response to questions raised at the Perth informal meeting has been provided to the shooters Rep.

Briefly I would like to say that AISL exists primarily to produce medals for Australia. AISL is funded almost entirely by the Federal government, is totally independent from its members (ACTA included), and has an independent board. Whilst having to adhere to a strict reporting regime to the government, constitutionally it has little responsibility to report financially or otherwise to its members, the shooting associations. Its aim is to select and fund shooters in accordance with the selection policies readily available on their website, who can shoot World Class scores ie: being the best in Australia means nothing to AISL if you are not shooting an internationally competitive score regularly. Simply put, performance, performance, performance, is the requirement. ACTA affiliates with AISL to allow our Olympic Discipline shooters to be considered for these selection opportunities.

The ACTA encourages clubs to apply for whatever government flood assistance is available. Flood affected clubs who are applying for government support are encouraged to copy their applications to the ACTA office. Flood appeal support from the ACTA can then be easily considered without the club having to duplicate an application. Once again I encourage all clubs to consider fundraising for this cause, to help our own.

I have received some positive comment regarding the financial result achieved last financial year. This positive comment is much appreciated. The policies etc that achieved this result were put in place in 2009 and so we need to thank those involved at that time for their input to the budget, and ensure reviews are conducted regularly to keep the ACTA in a healthy financial situation.

This magazine may reach some households prior to the Trap Nationals, and so I wish all competitors well. Many concentrate on their shooting but many others attend to catch up on old friends, look at the traders goods and generally enjoy the atmosphere. Don't forget your Hall of Fame dinner tickets available via the office. Once again, on your behalf, I thank all of our Sponsors for their terrific support of this event. Until next month,

competing but in keeping the ACTA in its position as the lead body for clay target competition in Australia.

Shooters are represented by a number of organisations who developed originally to represent different types of shooting. Shotgun shooters can be found as members of Field and game, Sporting Shooters as well as the ACTA. The different types of shooting require different facilities and different representation although there are many issues we all have in common. At times it appears that we could work better together.

This column has raised a number of problems and issues which need to be addressed to ensure that the sport continues to grow and that the ACTA best represents and supports all Clay Target shooters in Australia. It is quite clear that I have not provided solutions and it would be stupid of me to think that I knew the answers so soon after starting, however I can assure you that I will be working with the executive to address them. Whilst the Executive consists of delegates from all states we are not the only ones with good ideas. All members can have input through their club, zone and state delegates. If this does not occur the executive can only base decisions on information they have been provided with.

The role of Executive Officer is both challenging and rewarding. Challenging because of the range of issues from development of grounds, members issues, legislation and governance and rewarding because of the people you work with at all levels and the satisfaction from being able to improve the Association and the enjoyment for its members in their sport.

I look forward to meeting a lot of members at the various nationals and when my role takes me to your state or clubs events. If I look a bit lost please feel free to come up and say hello and talk about our sport.

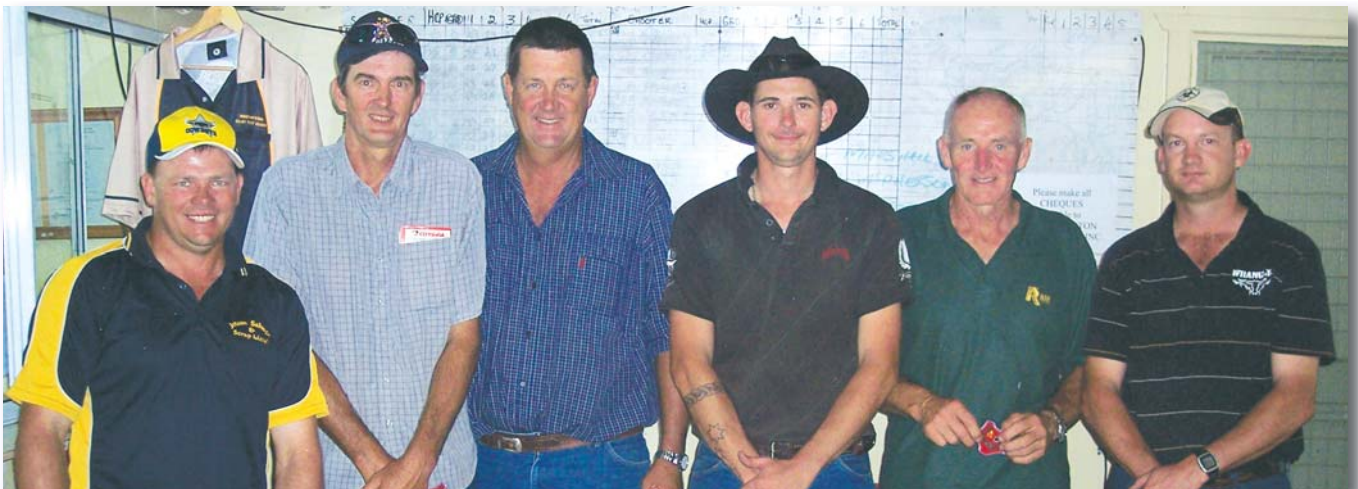

The 500 targets thrown consisted of 50 pair of doubles on the Friday, 100x12 gauge & 100x28 gauge on Saturday concluding with 100x20 gauge & 100x410 on Sunday. Nominations were a respectable \$200.00 for the weekend with purses for grades, high guns and overall available.

I attended this shoot primarily to support the Brisbane gun clubs endeavours to run a NSSA registered shoot, my secondary motive was to tie one on with Dave Dundon which I scored the perfect 200 out of 200. I initially had reservations regarding the need to have an American modelled shoot here in Australia. I was of the mind "we can do it as well as anybody" we don't need to be told how to do business by the Yanks. I am now a convert. I can honestly report that a shoot of this nature is not only fun as you get to shoot the whole event in one visit but when finished, its over and done with, you can relax, shoot through or have an ale, no waiting around getting cold or stale and having to get hyped up again to perform the next wave of the same event.

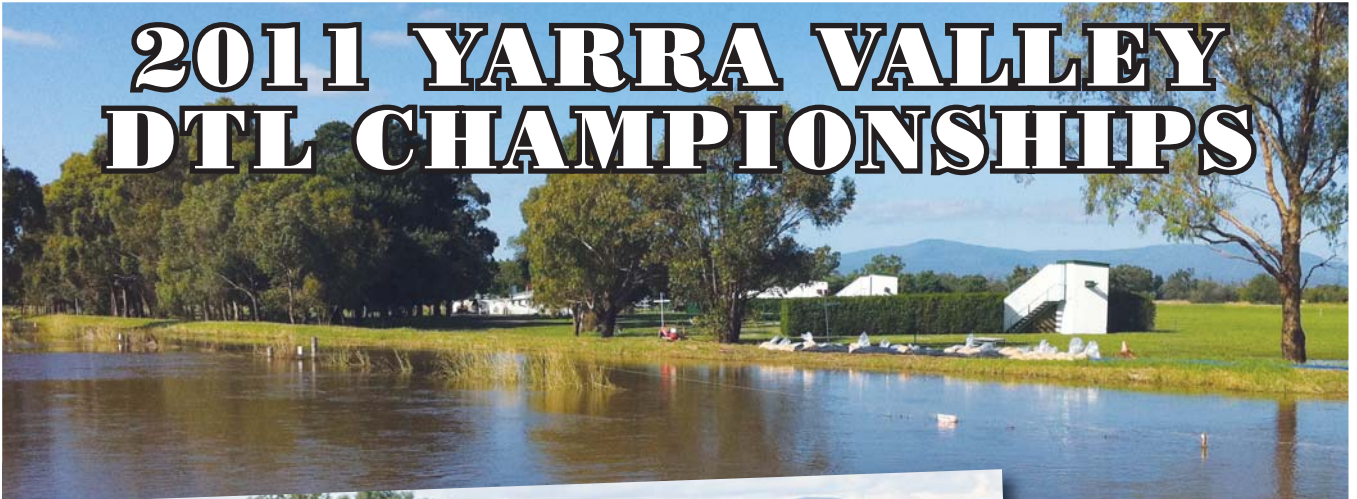

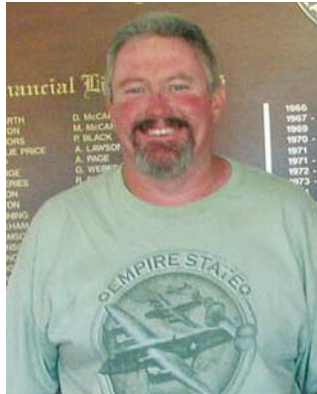

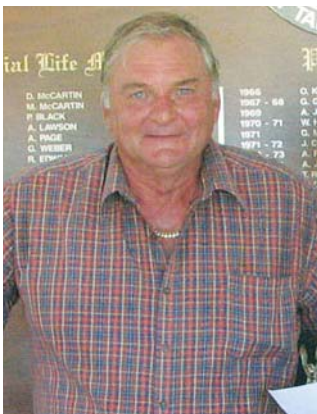
by junior shooter Adam Bozier from Bundaberg club with 43/50 and second to Betty Fawcett with 42/50.

Letter to the Editor



18 February 2011

We write this letter partly in response to the *National President's Notes* in the February 2011 *Clay Target Shooting News* and partly out of concern for our sport and the Australian Clay Target Association.

In his notes the President continually uses acronyms (eg CTSF, ICTSF, NSSA) in fact they were used 17 times – some of them we recognised, some of them we did not.

Surely if you wish to write to the heartland then you must communicate in language we understand and is of interest to us!

The President was concerned that there were no photos of the Commonwealth team members in our journal. We know they are great sportspersons. We do not want to see Michael Diamond's photo in our journal again, it is far more important to see it on the back pages of our national newspapers promoting our sport. You are preaching to the converted!

We believe that we are let down by our Association in not actively promoting our sport to the 20.5 million Australians who are not shooters.

We return to the heartland –and it is here that we believe our Association exists for all members and clubs across Australia.

We hear people, other than ourselves questioning the value for money from our membership. What are we /is our club getting as a benefit? We feel neglected.

At club level it appears to be very little, not even promotion at a national level.

People in the heartland are losing interest and deserting to other disciplines which, in general, appear to have lower membership fees and event nomination costs.

Whilst clubs need to promote themselves at a local level, support from the higher echelons needs to be targeted to produce a positive image which clubs can also elevate in their own locality.

There have also been recent very pointed articles in the journal concerning non member visitors to clubs which we presume is a not so veiled reference to Field and Game type Associations and the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia members.

In small clubs these visitors can mean the difference between having a shoot and not having a shoot, they are potentially new members and a source of funding. Driving them away does not endear them to our sport.

The old chestnut of insurance was mentioned but surely members belonging to the associations are adequately insured. In my opinion it should be the individual club's discretion to admit these shooters to a club competition.

I thank you Mr. Schirmer and Mr. Duncan for your letter and apologise if I have confused you. By my count I used 21 abbreviations in February column with 4 of these being ACTA thrice and CTSN once. That leaves ICTSF (International Clay Target Shooting Federation) 9 times, NSSA (National Skeet Shooting Association) once, AISL (Australian International Shooting Limited) thrice and ISSF (International Shooting Sports Federation) 4 times.

The ICTSF is the recently formed (app 3 yrs) body that controls the World Down the Line Championship, The World Skeet Championship and The World Sporting Clays Championship, all now shot under English Rules

The NSSA is the American body controlling American Skeet.

The AISL is the Australian company tasked and funded by the government to

oversee our International teams, training and selection in the ISSF disciplines as shot at Commonwealth and Olympic Games. AISL replaced the old Australian Shooting Association.

The ISSF is the international controlling body of all Olympic shooting sports.

I hope this clarifies this as you can see how much room even a simple explanation takes up in the CTSN when I am sure simply asking around, a call to the office or searching the abbreviations on google could have provided the answers.

Now to the balance of your letter. How can you expect a national newspaper to carry a photograph of our commonwealth games medal winners when you do not wish to see them in your own magazine. Newspapers are there to make money so I hope they never see your letter as why would they ever print another shooting related story if there is this little interest even amongst the "converted" Don't forget there are new members who join annually who have never seen our medal winners, or the recognition rightly offered to those that excel in our sport. AISL and ACTA both provide Press releases regularly to a large number of Newspaper conglomerates, and television and radio channels but we have no control over what they choose to use.

Exposure of our sport in any media, whilst certainly limited is almost always positive, and that is why we expose our high profile shooters at every opportunity, both within our Association and externally.

Regarding the comment "People in the heartland are losing interest and deserting to other disciplines" I've lived most of my life in Western Queensland. I come from a club formed in 1914, 500 kms from the coast where all shooters are members of the ACTA, we shoot ACTA rules, and we all have a good time. I think this qualifies as being from the "heartland" After 3 visits to our club you are expected to join. This is how our club is the fastest growing in Queensland at the moment, not by allowing them all the benefits for free, and them never joining. Perhaps you need to look at your local circumstances, and how much effort is being put into keeping your members and growing your club or are you still doing what you were doing 20 years ago? This is a time of change and we must change with it. More flexibility with shooting times and dates, ability to shoot practice, offering other disciplines etc. there are many things you can try.

I make no apologies for the Association stance about unregistered shooters competing on our grounds, which incidentally is the same position held by the other two National Associations you mentioned. Please don't assume that I was making a "veiled reference" to any other association members. I meant unregistered shooters, as I said, and if you knew me you would know I am not one for making "veiled references" anyhow.

I think your last paragraph sums it up. Anyone who believes insurance issues are an "old chestnut" lives in a bygone era. The ACTA covers your Club office bearers, your Zone office bearers, and your State office bearers, for Officers and Directors Indemnity, your Club, State and Zone for public liability and covers your clubs members for Accident and Death and Permanent Disability from when they leave home to shoot until when they return home. This includes Loss of Income insurance. There have been claims paid on all of these member policies. Having non-members competing outside of the rules is fine until something goes wrong, and it does, so are you prepared to wear the consequences personally yourselves? It won't be that we won't help you, it will be that our insurer does not have to because you operate outside the rules.

A U S T R A L I A N CLAY TARGET SHOOTING NEWS

DIGITAL ARCHIVING

Over the past months you would have read, in our President's Notes or heard about the archival digitisation of the Clay Target Shooting News (CTSN).

In this report I will try to briefly explain how this digitisation is achieved, how we are progressing, what it will mean to our members and historians, how you will be able to access the data and importantly how as members you may be able to help us locate the missing issues that will complete our records.

After the decision was made by the ACTA Executive to have the CTSN archived, funds were allocated and quotations sought. The company chosen to undertake this project was Midland Typesetters, one of the leaders in book production in Australia and a company that specialises in this area. At this point I was given the task of managing the project and duly set about compiling a list of the available CTSN issues.

It was first necessary to establish the total number of pages that needed scanning. We knew the money allocated would only go so far and we needed a cut-off date to work to. The ACTA was always aware that further allocations would be needed to complete the archiving. With the help of Maureen at the ACTA office and Glenn Woodhatch, (past President of the ACTA) we counted, or in some cases estimated just how many pages we were dealing with and established that the archiving could be completed, at least up to the end of 1985.

I had fortunately saved, with the exception of a few misplaced copies all of the CTSN issues since I started shooting in 1975 and to get the job underway sent the years 1976 to 1985 to Midland Typesetters.

The process of digital archiving firstly involves the scanning of all pages into a Portable Document Format (PDF), a task usually done quickly through the document feeder on the scanner. However in the case of the CTSN issues, which needed to be kept intact, this process becomes a quite lengthy, one page at a time exercise.

After the initial scanning, the pages are then transferred to a PC

running Xerox proprietary software, which straightens and cleans up the scans and converts the PDF through an OCR (Optical Character Recognition) application into a readable and searchable document. The single page PDF files are then transferred to a Mackintosh computer where using Acrobat Pro and Enforce Pitstop programs the pages are individually opened and checked for quality integrity and re-collated into issues and years.

Prior to December 1969, CTSN was published in an A5 format and as a consequence the presentation of these issues will be 2 pages on view. This effectively cuts our costs in half for these years. The first batch of Newsletters are now almost finished and I am about to deliver the second batch to Midlands.

Early in February I was contacted by Moira Henwood, (Craig's Mum) who had heard about the archiving and who had in her possession many old CTSN issues. It turned out to be a wonderful offer and after further investigation Moira discovered that all issues from 1960 up to 1975 inclusive were to hand. These copies will constitute the 2nd batch to be processed.

The ACTA first started to produce a newsletter in October 1947 but at that time it was titled "Australian Clay Pigeon Shooting News". The name changed to the "Australian Clay Target Shooting News" in January 1958. We have been contacted by many people already offering copies for scanning including Frank James from Kerang who recently supplied me with the May 1956 and April 1958 issues, both of which were missing from our files.

The following is a list of issues that are still missing and the Association would be most grateful for any assistance from members in locating these errant copies. Any copies we receive for scanning will be recorded and dutefully returned to their owner.

All issues from 1986 to 2005 are to hand and the ACTA has indicated the availability of more funds being available in the future to complete the archiving task. From May 2005 the CTSN files are already fully digitised and held by Ironbark Graphics ready to be made into a searchable PDF file at no extra charge to the Association.

When complete the digital archives will most likely be stored by a third party server provider and files will be accessible through an ACTA website link. All members will be able to access the total history of the ACTA through the pages of the CTSN. The files will be fully searchable and members will be able to type in a search request to access the relevant information.

Over the next months I will endeavour to keep you up to date with our progress and let you know when the first files are accessible.

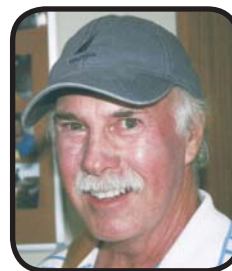

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2011 Australian Skeet Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2011 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2011 registered shooter record book before nominating.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for, Womens, Juniors, Sub Juniors and Veterans, excepting the National Skeet Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 10.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Womens, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans section only. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Australia/New Zealand Skeet Postal team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Veterans - are those competitors who, on May 16, 2011 will be over the age of 65 years.

Juniors - are those competitors who, on May 16, 2011 will be under the age of 18 years.

Sub Juniors - are those who, on May 17, 2011 will be under the age of 15 years.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination and will be re-squadded towards the end of the event. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the National 20 gauge Championship, load size is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.7. For the National 20 gauge Championship load size is limited to 24gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.7.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Management Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

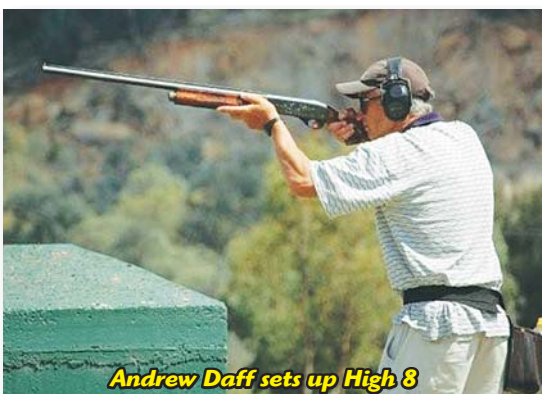

ISSF SHOOTING

Performance Qualifying Scores (PQS)

Given the importance of ISSF competition to our sport, the Board has directed that a regular column be established in this magazine to, over time, address the various issues that our elite shooters have to contend with. It is hoped that this column will also provide useful information not just to ISSF shooters but to the wider audience of DTL, American skeet and sporting shooters and thus enhance the understanding of the elite portion of this wonderful sport of clay target shooting.

It is intended that this column will deal with a specific issue each month in a simple question and answer format.

If our good readers have particular questions you would like to see discussed please send those into the ACTA office. However please be aware that there will be a backlog of subjects for the column so it may take some time before your particular question features in the column. If you wish an immediate reply please inform the office and we will endeavour to oblige.

For the inaugural issue we have decided to address the issue of performance qualifying scores (PQS) as this is a major issue of concern raised by many ISSF shooters.

QUESTION: What is the purpose of the PQS and why are the current levels set so high?

ANSWER: The ultimate purpose of any sport entering international competition is to compete and win medals at the Olympic Games. Australia is a small country and international competition is the toughest there is. Money is always limited, international prestige is at stake and so sports administrators are regularly faced with tough choices. As a general rule all Australian sports organisations involved in the Olympics, require that for athletes to be supported for international competition, they must demonstrate that they can perform at a minimum level that enables them to have any realistic chance of winning medals. That level will always be perceived as arbitrary but in reality it is set by standards achieved elsewhere by our

competitors. In some sports athletes are not considered for high performance training unless they can effectively equal current world records. Thankfully clay target is not so stringent.

Make no mistake: it is all about winning medals. The Australian Sports Commission (ASC) and the Australian Institute of Sport is charged by Government to do everything in its power to win medals for Australia and in the end there is only one medal that counts – an Olympic one preferably gold. All else is secondary. Funding is inexorably tied to winning medals – no medals no funds. The prevailing view across all sports administrations is that there is no point sending athletes overseas to represent Australia if their performance has not been demonstrated to be internationally competitive. Because it is considered that there is no point, no money is available to send second level athletes to ‘gain overseas experience’ (this can be obtained at the competitors expense at the many Grand Prix events held throughout the world). Any sports administration that uses government funds i.e. taxpayers money, for such purpose would soon be called to order. AISL is responsible to the ASC and therefore must adhere to that policy.

This is rather a long winded introduction to our PQS but it is important to understand the forces that drive AISL at least in their broadest sense. A PQS is proposed by the AISL High Performance Manager and approved by the High Performance Program Joint Management Committee (which is responsible to the AISL board and ultimately the ASC) as the **minimum** performance level to be **considered** for entry into the high performance squad. (For those who may not be familiar with all this, AISL take responsibility for the development and training of a select group of clay target, rifle and pistol shooters selected for the high performance squad. Selection of teams to represent Australia overseas is made from those within the respective HP squads.) Shooters must be able to demonstrate that they have shot a PQS several times under different circumstances before being accepted into the HP squad. The HPPJMC ideally would like demonstration of ten PQS over two years but AISL have agreed that five is a fair indication of consistent performance.

A common misconception is that having

shot one PQS a shooter is therefore entitled to represent Australia overseas. This is incorrect as the **PQS is not a travelling score**. AISL maintain individual shooter records over many years and are able to graph the rise or fall of performance enabling scientifically robust assessments of individual performance. This is no different in principle to any other sport in the international arena. Team selection is thus based on long term performance under a range of conditions not just at one event.

The criticism has been made that the system is training people to shoot just for a PQS and not how to handle pressure in a final to win. Unfortunately the game is unforgiving – to win one must be able to get into a final and on international standards the level of PQS is the average minimum to even get close to a final.

The levels of the PQS (140 in double trap, 121 in men's trap & skeet and 69 in women's trap & 70 in skeet) have been set from ongoing analyses of international competition. It is an unfortunate fact that average performance levels of international athletes in all sports keeps increasing due to new technology, sports psychology, sports science etc. A score of 118 put Michael Diamond into the final when he won gold at the 1998 World Cup in Lonato. Nowadays that score may see a person finish as far down as 20th. The recent World Cup in Concepcion in Chile is illustrative of current standards. In the double trap four shooters with a score of 142 shot off for the last two places in the finals. The four shooters who shot 140 were placed 10th downward.

A criticism raised at the ISSF athletes' meeting in Perth is that it is 'easier' to shoot good scores on overseas grounds. Unfortunately the figures held by AISL do not support the argument. We are reluctant to list individual scores but please be assured that we looked very carefully at the specific example put forward by the Perth meeting. The record of that shooter simply did not demonstrate that it is easier to shoot good scores overseas. The broader records indicate that it is equally hard wherever an event may be.

Up till now Australia has a wonderful record of winning medals in this enormously challenging sport and we all should be extremely proud of our elite shooters' achievements. Unfortunately if Australia is to continue to win at this rate our shooters are going to have to shoot better and better scores. It is indeed a most unforgiving sport. We wish all you ISSF shooters the very best but you personally need to work very hard to get to the top.

Next issue we intend to examine what is an MQS and its relevance to the HP squad.

NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

GENERAL

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
3. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred.
4. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
5. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
6. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
7. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
8. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
9. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
10. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
11. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
12. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any section prize.
13. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
14. Pre-Nominations will close at 5pm on Friday 15th April 2011.
15. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
16. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
17. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
18. Reduced Nominations shall apply to Juniors and Sub-Juniors. Also partners' entering into the same event whose nomination is lodged at the same time as a member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced Noms are eligible for Overall, Grade and section prizes.
19. ***All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.***
20. Squads of 5 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5 to shoot 100 targets in one visit to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.

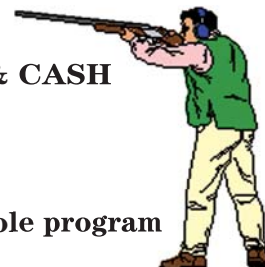

Psychological Skills for Shooting

HOW TO VISUALISE

At the ACTA Junior development camp in Wagga last year, rather than just lecture, I asked the participants to pose questions that they wanted answers to. From that camp one question springs to mind: "How can you deal with pressure?"

Stress has a profound effect on performance. According to Raedeke & Burton, it can impair performance, destroy self-confidence and deprive performers a sense of enjoyment. Stress also promotes interpersonal conflict, destroys teamwork, increases the likelihood of injuries and when sustained leads to burnout that may drive athletes to early retirement. When we are functioning well our resources are capable of dealing with the demands. When the demands increase and are equal to the resources then we become strained. Stress however occurs when the demands are greater than the resources to deal with them. If this stress is prolonged then this will lead to burnout.

Stress is often blamed for problems in sport but this assumption may be due to one of two misconceptions. Firstly, it is thought that excessive competitive demand: eg, having to sink the putt to win, kick the goal to win when the game is on the line, etc. increases the stress level. This is often associated with choking (which is due to self doubt) but if the athlete has the skills and resources to cope then they should be able to handle this level of stress. Secondly, that the increase in physiological signs (sweating, increased heartbeat, tension, etc) and psychological symptoms (poor attention, concentration, etc) then this must be stress. It may just be the state of arousal that the athlete is going through at the time.

Raedeke and Burton define stress as the substantial imbalance between what we believe is demanded of us (competitive demand), and what we perceive our capabilities to be for meeting those demands (personal control) for situations in which success is important. This is important to understand because it is the perceptions (not the competitive demands themselves) that determine the amount and nature of the stress we experience. Perceptions can either lead to positive or negative self-talk, that can develop into beliefs that can either lead on to being in the flow or choking.

Athletes have to weigh three types of information to make sense of stressful situations; competitive demand, personal control and coping strategies.

Competitive demand involves your evaluation of how a demanding situation will affect your ability to attain important goals. If you go to a club shoot with a goal to shoot the possible and win the event, there may not be much stress. However, if the goals are more important: ie, State or National championship, there will be a greater amount of uncertainty in achieving this goal, therefore increased level of competitive demand.

Personal control refers to your perception of how well you can manage competitive demand and achieve important goals. Personal control relies on two factors: whether you believe the source of stress is surmountable and whether you believe that you have sufficient performance capabilities to do so. Your performance capabilities are things like knowledge, skills, tactics, and preparedness. So, if you feel that you have the skills and capabilities to beat the stressors then you have high personal control and you will probably achieve. If on the other hand you think that you are unable to deal with the stress of the situation, then you will have low personal control and will most likely fail. If you remember the articles on self-talk, then you will understand the concept of challenge appraisals that mean you will put a positive spin on the competition and turn the obstacles into opportunities. Threat appraisals on the other

hand, highlight negative beliefs and cause you to fear failure, feel pessimistic and adopt poor problem management strategies: threat appraisals therefore lead to failure.

Coping strategies are just that. They are the things that will help you deal with the stressors and develop challenge appraisals. Coping strategies can be put under the headings of problem management, emotion management and maladaptive coping. Maladaptive coping strategies hurt rather than help: drugs, alcohol abuse, excessive venting of emotions and avoidance are all examples of maladaptive coping and should be avoided. Problem management, using techniques such as goal setting, planning, performance routines) will help reduce or eliminate stressor. Emotion management (positive thinking, relaxation, etc) enhances positive well-being by reducing emotional distress even if the problem remains.

Next month I will explore the concepts of problem management and emotion management in more detail.

Last week I was pleasantly surprised to find in the mail another Arrow Laser Shot. Those readers who have attended a clinic or approached me at a shoot will vouch for my level of passion for this simple but effective tool. I know of no better way to determine correct gun fit, check your gun's point of impact or practise gun mounting. With just a few minutes each day you can have an efficient way to perfect gun mount with immediate feedback as to whether you are on the mark or not. When I opened the Arrow Laser Shot it became apparent that this is the model for skeet shooters, especially those shooters who use sub-gauge barrels or full length tubes. You can use this model for all gauges: .410, 20g, 28g, 16g, 12g and even 10g. The 12g version or the multi-gauge version can be obtained via www.arrowlasershot.com

Hopefully soon there will be an Australian distributor for Arrow Laser Shot, but in the meantime ask me to demonstrate mine when you catch me at a shoot.

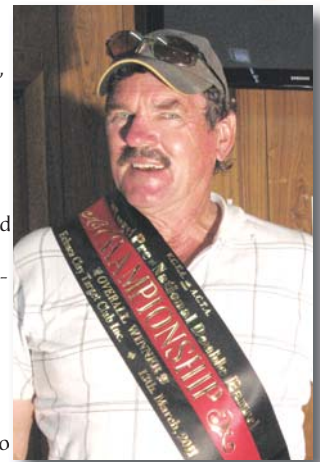
Hay NSW member, Phillip Heaton, also had a day out, claiming event
