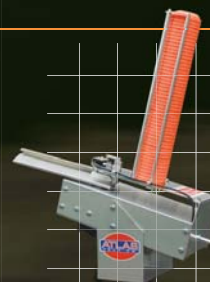

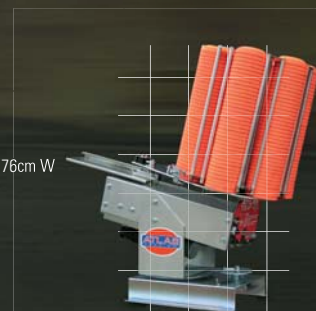

National President's Notes

Many would be aware that the position of NCD (National Coaching Director) has been under review since January following an alleged conflict of interest. Whilst the review took place the NCD remained on full remuneration. Following review, in May the Association offered to reinstate the NCD providing conflict of interest documentation, as is required of executive members and staff, be completed. This was not done at the time of his initial appointment. Unfortunately, since that date we have been unable to reach agreement with the NCD to recommence work and in early August a decision was made to terminate the contract. This position remains vacant at this time.

New categories of membership and fees will come into effect as from the 1st of January, 2012. The changes have been forced upon us following a complaint to the Anti-Discrimination Commission and a subsequent conciliation hearing. Full details appear elsewhere. There have been small rises in subscription fees, club affiliation fees and advertising, the first in a number of years. We do not feel they are excessive and in the current economic climate, they are necessary to help balance our budget. Full details appear elsewhere.

The 2012 Trap and Skeet Nationals will be conducted under a new format. The ACTA will charge a significantly reduced nomination fee, and provide the normal sashes, badges and medals. Sponsors product will be awarded as received. There will be no cash prizes paid from the base nomination. Optional Overall and Graded Cash purses will be run totally separate from the nomination fees.

High Gun Cash awards will still be made from the nomination fees. Complete details will appear in a later magazine. These changes are hoped to encourage more members to attend and compete for a National Title at all levels without the added expense of contributing to cash prizes unless they wish to. Other initiatives to try to increase attendance will be announced at a later date and may include a sizeable number of free entries for shooters who have never previously attended a Nationals.

The 2012 budget is now complete with a budgeted surplus similar to last year. Some hard decisions were made during the budget process and we hope that all can see how important it is to remain profitable.

This magazine includes a request for interested and suitably qualified persons to fill two Board positions, and one other sub-committee position. I encourage members to consider these positions if they feel they may have something to offer. Members may have a friend or associate who might be interested, so please pass on the advertisement to anyone you think has the necessary skills.

I have recently attended two major two day events, (one with over 170 in attendance) where a large number of campers resided on the grounds. At both venues the power failed due to overload greatly stressing the club management who I must say completed the events despite the interruption. It seems that at every shoot we attend now there is a growing number of campers, which is great, but which also stretches clubs facilities. The National grounds is no exception and large sums have been expended to provide a power upgrade, more showers and powered sites. The camp fees at the National grounds are quite reasonable, but clubs are loath to charge, so I would encourage the increasing number of campers to throw a few dollars in the bucket to help these clubs keep abreast of this trend. Many already do but some do not so please think of these clubs future.

The new Olympic Trap Discipline competition between Australia and New Zealand will kick off at next years NZ Nationals. The competition will be three persons from each country in the Trap discipline. This team will be funded similar to the Glenn Cup and Glenn Trophy teams. Marcello Casella is funding a perpetual trophy to be named after two historical shooters from the past, one Australian and one New Zealander, with the Australian to be Mr. Jack Sutherland – Calrossie. New Zealand are yet to propose a name for the trophy. The Sutherland family are considering providing a historical piece to form the basis for the trophy. On behalf of the ACTA I thank Marcello from Casella Wines for supporting this International competition and the Sutherland family for their continuing involvement in our sport.

Executive Officer's Report



Recently the Executive and Board of management Committee have been preparing budgets for 2012. One issue which came up was membership numbers. Whilst we have not been losing members, the numbers have not been increasing. Membership is the life blood of clubs, not only in terms of fees but in terms of competitors for competition, officials, volunteers for work and for the social life

of the club. Recently I have talked about the junior shooters and young members and the emphasis which we put on supporting and coaching them. One area I feel we do not consider enough are the 30-40 year olds.

Whilst we get good numbers of young shooters in we lose some of them when they experience the pressures of jobs, relationships, family and marriage and other competitive sport. What we, as an organisation, do not appear to do is put the time into encouraging the recruitment of shooters after these pressures have eased. After people have left other contact sports and they are more established in their careers and family life, the opportunity presents itself for current members to introduce them in to the sport which we enjoy and get satisfaction from. Members all know that it provides the competitive spirit we enjoy, is able to be enjoyed until very late in life at a high standard and able to be enjoyed with other members of the family, young and old, male and female.

Maybe Club committees could look at having a "visitors day" each year with members each inviting someone along and giving them some experience of the sport. We have the avenue of "new members" category and we know we will lose members each year for various reasons. As well as needing to replace them to remain as we are we need more members to help the sport. This is the area where we can look at the 30-40 year group. A side benefit is that if they enjoy the sport we may also get their family involved as well. During the National Trap Championships I spoke to a number of shooters who fell into this category and now shoot with their children, urging each other along.

The Promotions and Marketing Committee will be looking at this issue as well as other ideas to increase membership, but that does not mean clubs need to wait!

In last month's column I mentioned shooting for schools. I have received responses from some clubs already and it is good to see that, for some, this is not a new initiative.

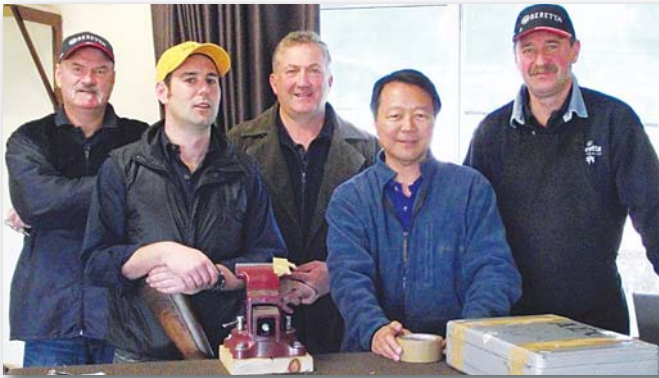

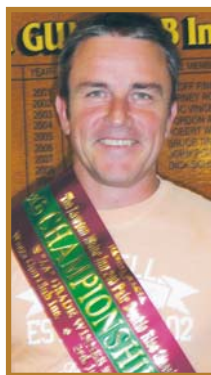

Tom has held the presidency and all other positions within the club during the last 40 years.

He has held the presidency and all other positions within his zone.

He has served as State President for two terms.

He has served as State Administrator on a voluntary basis when the association was unable to fill the position with a paid employee.

He served as a member on the Qld Govt Firerams Legislation Consultative Committee during the late 90's when oppressive legislation was being introduced following the Port Arthur massacre, a position requiring strength, knowledge and great diplomacy.

He was Chief de Mission and a member of the organising committee for the 1997 World

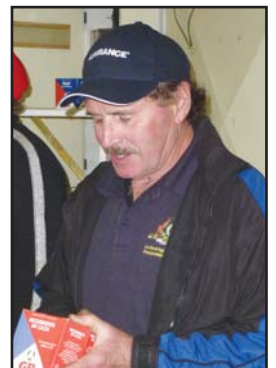

Psychological Skills for Shooting

ARE YOU GETTING ENOUGH?

During the last month I have been organizing a conference for 42 school psychologist and senior psychologists within the Riverina Region. This group has people who have been working in the field for over 25 years (me) and some younger ones who only started this year or in the last couple of years. So the range of what was needed in terms of skills, knowledge, concepts and strategies was vast.

How do you meet the needs of such a diverse group? Well, you explore topics that we all need to know. One of these subjects, sleep, I have included for this month's article because it affects shooters.

The following points about sleep are based on the APS workshop *Treating Insomnia: what psychologists need to know*, 27/5/2011)

1. You spend 1/3 of your life asleep. You cannot prevent this. We all need sleep to recharge.
2. You should not blame sleep for many things wrong in your life. It is easy to argue that because you have poor sleep habits then you have problems dealing with others, focusing on work or sport, etc.
3. The brain does not make up for loss of sleep by sleeping longer. Spending too long in bed is not how the brain works. If you don't get enough sleep tonight make sure you go to bed at the right time tomorrow. Going to bed earlier to catch up just doesn't work.
4. You do not sleep well if you are too hot. The best sleep is in the descending core body temperature curve, and the best wake up time is 2 hours after the lowest body temperature is reached. Fever and anti-depressants interfere with body temperature, and hence sleep.
5. An hour of sleep before midnight is worth 2 hours after midnight. Sleep is deeper at beginning of the night; dreams occur in the later part of night. The sleep cycle occurs every 90 minutes: stages 1-4 +REM. There are five stages of sleep: stage 1, 2, 3, 4 and rapid eye movement sleep. Throughout the night you cycle through the stages: progressively going into deeper sleep from stage 1 to four then going into REM sleep (when we dream). The depth of sleep gets shallower as night goes on.
6. Sleep deprivation is not equal to insomnia, which is poor quality of sleep. Insomnia can be either not being able to initiate sleep or not being able to maintain sleep. Sleep deprivation is a form of torture.
7. Psychophysiological insomnia is learned insomnia through classical conditioning. There are learned sleep-preventing associations, e.g. bed=awake or "I will never be able to sleep again". Most people know classical conditioning through the work of Pavlov and his dog, where he found that when he presented food to the dog the dog salivated. He then presented the food and rang a bell at the same time. Eventually, the dog would salivate at the sound of the bell alone, thinking that the food would come soon. Psychological insomnia works in the same way: you go to bed but

you stay awake, therefore you condition yourself to stay awake every time you go to bed.

8. Insomnia is what you do with it. Using bedtime to solve daytime problems will keep you awake. There is a relationship between sleep, thoughts and feelings. Just as you shouldn't rethink the day when you're in bed, you should leave sleep between the sheets and don't think of it during the day, otherwise when you go back to bed you will think of what was worrying you about not sleeping again.
9. A huge number of medications, are prescribed by GPs for insomnia, when it could be dealt with by Psychologists, using Cognitive Behavioural Therapy. This could include stimulus control therapy, incorporating sleep "hygiene", psycho-education about sleep and changing bed habits.
10. To improve sleep, there is a need to gradually reduce caffeine in the form of coffee, strong tea, chocolate, cola and energy drinks. Caffeine effects last 3-5 hours and it takes 8 hours to be eliminated from the body. As well as the caffeine the amounts of sugar in these drinks don't help either.
11. Nicotine can take 2 – 3 hours to wear off and you can be woken by nicotine cravings.
12. Alcohol in the early part of the evening helps sleep onset but the relaxed effect wears off after 3 – 5 hours. In the second part of the night, alcohol fragments sleep, and there can be more dreaming. For most people dreaming occurs during REM and is OK. But dreams can be harmful by increasing the worry or stress regarding a something happening or about to happen in our lives.
13. Eat dinner early and have a light supper of carbohydrate and milk. A large meal before bed upsets your circadian rhythm. Circadian rhythm is your sleep/wake cycle and is affected by diet and overseas travel: jet lag. Proteins wake you up! Avoid eating in middle of night – it is a reward. Avoid taking sleeping tablets in middle of night.
14. After aerobic exercise it may take 4-5 hours before your body is cool enough and relaxed enough for sleep.
15. Naps are one of nature's little gifts, but nap before 3pm or 8 hours before going to bed. Naps are not to be done in bed. The reason you shouldn't nap in bed is because of the association that your bed is where you should sleep properly.
16. Control issues in sleep are huge. Worry is in the future tense. Over the years, a central theme of these articles has been the necessity to remain in the present. If we think about the past, we develop judgments about ourselves, and our performances, and if we think about the future we become anxious and worry about what might happen. Focusing on the present is just as important for sleeping as it is for shooting.

What can you do if you have trouble sleeping? Sleep apnea, insomnia, initiating or maintaining sleep, snoring, etc can all be treated and if you have a problem and it affects your work, life or sport, then you should seek a referral to a sleep clinic from your GP. Other forms of help can come from a psychologist who can use a range of therapies: hypnotherapy, relaxation training, cognitive-behaviour therapy or Acceptance and Commitment therapy to help.

NSW Members and Dealers

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
