National President's Notes

As your National President is away your Vice Presidents have been asked to put together this month's notes.

The Commonwealth Championships were held at Echuca Gun Club over the weekend of 14–16 September. Congratulations to the Victorian Clay Target Association for running a successful competition. The Northern Territory has put in a bid to run the Commonwealth Championships next year in Darwin but more advice on this will be in future editions of the CTSN.

Discussions have been recommenced with AISL with respect to a Memorandum of Understanding between the two organisations. This matter has had a long gestation as we note that we reported on this in the 2011 November edition of CTSN. However recently we were asked to comment on a totally new draft which bore no relation to the one that the Executive had approved after negotiation with AISL. The Board at its August meeting rejected the new draft and is asking AISL to return to the previously agreed version. Hopefully the matter will be resolved shortly.

The Board compiled the budget for 2013 which has subsequently been approved by the Executive. This is a major job but which was made a lot simpler through the professionalism of our accounting officer Judy Ferry. Many thanks to Judy for your assistance.

The Hall of Fame Sub-Committee is currently in the process of putting together a criteria and points system similar to what we have for Trap and Skeet for ISSF Hall of Fame inductees. We hope to be having our first inductee in 2014.

Readers will note that on page 2 there is a notice reminding shooters of the rules pertaining to safe handling of guns on your club grounds. This is an important issue which has featured before in this column. It is not just to ensure that the appropriate level of duty of care to all people on our grounds is fulfilled, but it is also important for those clubs whose car parks or other areas of the grounds are in view of the passing public. The future of our sport depends to a very large degree on the image we project to the public so it is imperative that gun safety and responsible gun handling must be the number one priority for every shooter and official.

We have had a request recently from a shooter who is now wheelchair bound enquiring if they can still participate in events at ACTA clubs. There is nothing to stop a person in a wheelchair from continuing to enjoy our sport as many of our clubs have been constructed to be wheelchair friendly.

The West Australian Clay Target Association has advised organisation is proceeding smoothly for next year's Trap Nationals. The WA Gun Club will be running the Pre-nationals and White Flyer targets will be used throughout the whole tournament. Shooters are reminded that one must have a permit to carry a firearm into WA. In this edition there is an outline of the process that WACTA have negotiated with WA Firearms Branch about obtaining the necessary permits for interstate and overseas visitors. WACTA are to be congratulated on finding a sensible compromise on this issue. The issue of camping has yet to be resolved and at this stage we reiterate Robert's advice in the October issue for campers and caravanners to make other arrangements in case the WACTA request is not granted.

Finally members are reminded that annual registration fees are now due.

Next month Robert should be back in the chair so until then good shooting!

Executive Officer's Report



Visitors to the New South Wales DTL Championships over the last weekend in September will notice some differences to the Wagga Wagga National Grounds with 22 new powered sites available. This brings the total number of powered sites available up to 62 sites. At this time last year there were only 16 powered sites available and we now also have the new shower and toilet block available on the western end of the grounds for shooters and campers on that end. The

ACTA has recently let contracts for changes to the existing Skeet Towers to improve safety. These changes include new steps and modification to the landings to improve safety when reloading traps and a door in the existing walls to allow reloading without having to close two layouts. All of these improvements to the Grounds will improve facilities for campers and improve the running of shoots.

ISSF shooters will notice a comment on the application form for the ISSF Nationals which states that the Nationals to be run in Brisbane in January will be conducted under the existing rules and format. Whilst there are proposed rule changes to be introduced from the 1st of January, there would be insufficient time to make changes to equipment and for shooters to adjust to the new format before the conduct of the Nationals. AISL has also indicated that the new rules will not be introduced until the Australia Cup in February.

A reminder to those members travelling to Perth for the 2013 DTL National Championships there is a link on the WACTA web site to assist with identifying accommodation for the event and there are links on the ACTA web site to access forms for firearms permits. This link is on the events page on the web site. The address for the WACTA site can be found by clicking on the map of WA on our home page. Shooters from interstate are required to obtain a permit for their firearms.

The results from the World DTL Championships and the Olympic Games provided a contrast which raises some important questions. The World DTL Championships and results in DTL and Skeet events and Championships over the last 18 months indicates that we have some very good young shooters, both male and female. While we understand the differences in difficulty with ISSF shooting we do not appear to have the depth of good shooters coming through. The ACTA and AISL are looking to identify ways in which we can improve the depth of good young ISSF shooters to help maintain our position at the International level into the future. You will hear more of this in the near future.

ATTENTION SHOOTERS – SAFETY

It has come to the attention of club administrators and officials that there a number of shooters breaching one of our most important safety rules. Many shooters around clubs have been observed mounting and dry pointing closed firearms around club grounds and car parks.

Our rule book already covers what is a safe aiming area. That is on the layout facing forward (Rule 1.02(e)) or at a pattern plate should one be installed and then only with permission of club management (Rule 1.01(c)). At all other times Rule 1.01(b) applies. Shooters need to be aware that knowingly breaching any safety rule will make them liable to suspension under Rule 1.01(k)

NSW State ISSF 2012 CECIL PARK CTC

Cecil Park Clay Target Club held the NSW ISSF State Championships over the weekend of the 23th-25th of August.

The first event up was the NSW Double Trap Championship, held on the Friday. There was a strong contingent of shooters from Majura Park, who were trying Double Trap for the first time. From the comments & camaraderie, everyone enjoyed the event even though the breeze was moving the targets around a lot, making them very tricky. The overall winner for this event was James Ewart who came from behind in the final to pip Daniel White by one target for the title.

Saturday & Sunday saw the running of both the Skeet & Trench events, in what can only be described as great shooting conditions, with lots of sunshine and generally very calm conditions.

While there was a small roll up in the ISSF Skeet, the Championship was keenly contested, over the two days, with Charlie Kyriacou (Cecil Park) taking out the title from George Bailey (Canberra International) & Angelo Santangelo (Cecil Park).

In the ISSF Trap, there was a great turn-out of shooters from not only NSW, but VIC, QLD, ACT as well as New Zealand, making up a total of 12 squads. We utilised all 3 layouts, to ensure that the shoot ran smoothly and finished in good light.

At the end of day 1, after shooting at 75 targets, Brett Dunstan led on 71 closely followed by Owen Robinson (NZ), Jeff Tonna & Alex Vassilimis on 70. Day 2 dawned to another calm sunny morning. Shooting was

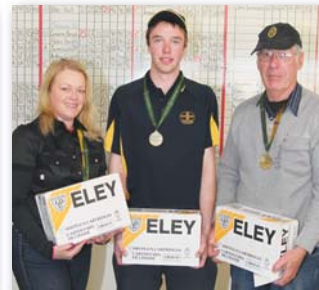

Camping on the National Ground is available to all members who wish to use the facilities provided.

The rates for camping applicable from 1st January 2013 will be:

Powered Camping - \$20 per night
Unpowered Camping - \$10 per night

Members can rebook their site for upcoming events but must provide dates and length of stay so that they can be invoiced for their accommodation six weeks prior to the event.

Your booking is not confirmed until payment is received. If payment is not received by the date stated on the invoice your site will be declared vacant.

Unfortunately due to audit constraints bookings cannot be carried over from year to year, if you cannot attend an event a refund will be paid and you will be required to rebook for the next event that you wish to attend. If the next event falls within the same calendar year we can carry the booking over to the next event provided there is a site available.

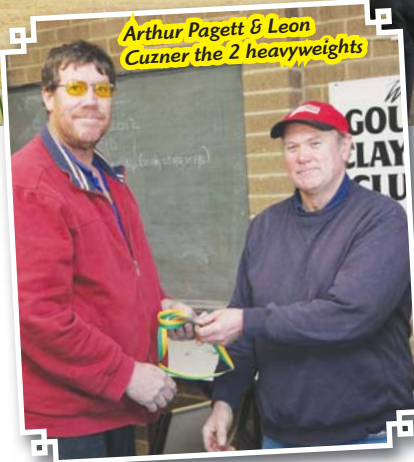

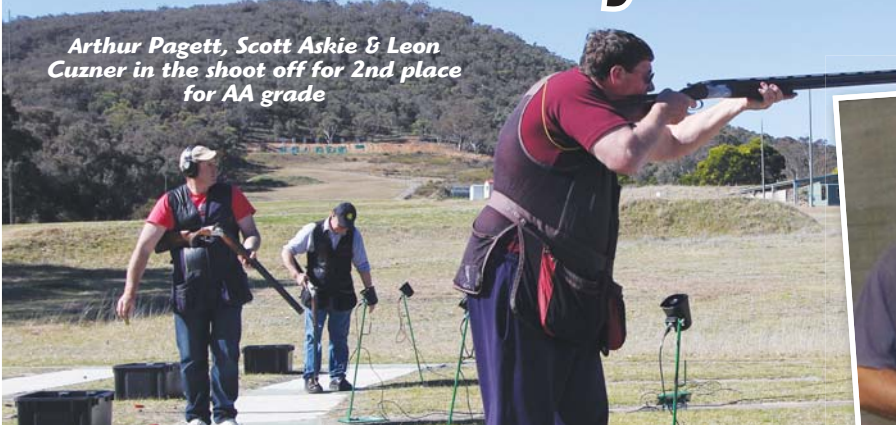

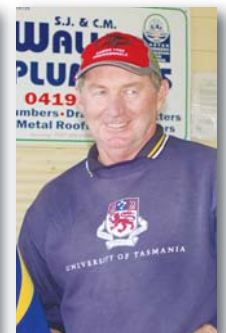

Psychological Skills for Shooting

CAN COFFEE LIFT PERFORMANCE?

By the time I arrive for work each morning, I'm ready for a coffee. As I walk into my favourite café, Miei Amici, in Griffith, coffee just the way I like it is made for me. As I am enjoying the coffee, taste and aroma, it is not unusual

for the radio to cite some recent research that coffee is bad for you, or one cup a day is good for your health and all manner of other claims.

So, is it good for you or better still can it lift your performance? Rather than make value judgements about coffee, I want to explore exactly what it is and let you the reader decide. The information contained here was taken from an article by Sarah Kalell, Executive Officer of the Clay Target Association of South Africa and published in the UK 'Clay Shooting' magazine, February 2011.

What is caffeine?

For plants, caffeine is a compound produced by a number of plants. It is likely that it is used as a defence mechanism by the plant to protect it and ensure it's survival. Within the plant caffeine is a poison and gives the leaves and seeds a bitter taste that discourages insects and animals from eating it.

For humans, caffeine is a highly addictive psychoactive drug. It isn't harmless, even though it is widely used. It is found in coffee, tea, even green tea, chocolate, soft drinks and some sports drinks.

When faced with adversity, fear or threats, humans either: fight, flee or freeze. This concept has been discussed several times over the years in these articles.

How does caffeine affect us?

Your adrenal gland houses stress hormones. These hormones are ready to set off the fight/flight response and coffee is good at stimulating the glands to pump the hormones into your blood stream. Your heart rate increases, blood pressure rises and your ready to deal with any emergency that might occur. Sugar and fat are dumped into your blood stream to prepare you to fight and the sugar adds to the metabolic stress and the fat helps clog your arteries. Now your pancreas has secreted insulin to drive your sugar level down, and you feel down. You probably feel like another cup of coffee. So caffeine doesn't give you energy: it gives you stress, by putting you into a cycle of ups and downs. This is not what you want during a shooting competition. This slump in your energy level is equivalent to post-prandial dip, that low you get just after lunch: when you feel that you should curl

up under a tree and have a siesta. For most of us we can handle this, but if you have diabetes, coffee, soft-drink or anything with sugar will seriously affect your blood-sugar level and insulin level and will you feeling exhausted and drained.

As I'm writing this I'm feeling worried because if you are a regular coffee user, then you are likely to have raised levels of cortisol (another stress hormone) which can disturb the quality of your sleep, affect your immune system, alter your mind, mood and behaviour. In a serious competition you need to be calm and yet alert. Caffeine has the opposite effect. Having a serious coffee drinking addiction will also lead to withdrawal symptoms such as headaches, nausea, depression vomiting, fatigue, etc.

Now as a regular reader to this column you will recognise that muscle tension will lead to self doubt and an inability shoot well. Coffee can increase muscle tension, chronic neck and back pain, and carpal tunnel syndrome. This tension will limit the fluid movements we need to shoot well.

So, stress and sugar levels are up, muscles are affected, but what if anything is happening in the brain? Two cups of coffee will reduce cerebral blood flow giving you a headache. And as most analgesics have caffeine, you will probably feel worse when you take a couple of pills.

So what else will coffee do to your body? According to Kalell it:

- Raise your blood pressure
- Accumulate in your system
- Taxes your liver: your liver must detoxify the caffeine and other chemicals
- Interferes with weight loss
- Stresses your adrenal glands: makes you anxious, worry and scared.
- Raises insulin and blood sugar: leads to fatigue and burnout
- Raises cholesterol levels
- Promotes calcium loss: the cause of osteoporosis: it will also deplete the body of vital B vitamins, sodium, zinc, chloride, magnesium. Magnesium is vital for muscle function and depletion can cause cramps.
- Dehydrates your body
- Leads to mood changes, irritability and depression
- Elevates cortisol levels, disturbs sleep, reduces DHEA hormone levels: low levels have been linked to premature ageing
- Causes gastrointestinal problems: heartburn, irritable bowel syndrome
- Is a contributor to heart disease
- Promotes muscle tension and inflammation of the joints
- Can cause birth defects
- Can cause fibrocystic breast disease.

Wow! It would seem that there are a range of detrimental effects of coffee consumption, and therefore for a shooter who needs to be relaxed but alert, hydrated and even-tempered too much coffee may not be a good thing. But coffee does have some good points. It is a great social facilitator when alcohol is inappropriate. To sit with friends or work colleagues and have a coffee can be a rewarding and valuable experience.

The purpose of this article is not to turn you off coffee, but to provide information about it's short term impact so that you can be informed when you make the decision to have a coffee between or during a shoot. It is very unlikely that coffee will enhance performance or your health but when consumed in moderation it will not likely affect your daily life.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

NATIONAL ISSF DISCIPLINE CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her handicap card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A fee of \$20 will be charged for the issue of any duplicate handicap card.
2. Targets to be shot in brackets of 25 for Olympic Trap and ISSF Skeet with squads of 6 shooters where possible. In Double Trap targets to be shot in brackets of 25 Pair (50 targets) with squads of 6 shooters where possible.
3. Pre Nominations to be received by close of business (**Eastern Summer Time**) Friday 4th January 2013. There is a maximum of 126 competitors for ISSF Trap. If pre nominations exceed this number a standby list of 20 will be created and used in case of withdrawals. If any vacancies exist in the program, it will be on a "first in" basis at an additional cost of \$10.00 per event to enter. Nominations at the championships close at 10.00am the day prior to the event if a vacancy exists. Nominations have been reduced, as there is no prize money awarded.
4. Shooter will be squadded as per ISSF rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Once squadding for an event has been completed, a shooter shall not be entitled to a refund if they withdraw. Withdrawals after nominating and before squadding will be accepted in writing 48 hrs prior to the event.
5. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot the applicable event.
6. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad will be penalised by the **LOSS OF THREE TARGETS**.
7. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he shall not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
8. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each round. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest recorded.
9. Any competitor may be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score or line referee must fulfil their obligation to do so or have obtained the service of a suitable replacement that must be ready to take his place at the required time. In the event of the designated persons or their replacement not being ready to take their place at the required time, the person initially designated to fill the specific role may **INCUR A PENALTY AS PERSCRIBED UNDER INTERNATIONAL RULES**.
10. Setting and adjusting of traps is the sole responsibility of Shoot Management. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised up to **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
11. All disputes must be in writing together with a \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
12. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
13. When team selection is involved, shooters are eligible for section nominated. To be eligible for selection in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.
14. High Gun awards are determined for each section. To be eligible for the High Gun recognition, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events for each respective High Gun. Gold Australia High Gun badges are only awarded when there are 20 or more competitors in a section.
15. Women shooters are eligible for their section only. Junior shooters are eligible for OA or their section and grade. Except in Double Trap.
16. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
17. The ISSF Rules will be used to determine the OA placing in all events.
18. Juniors to be under the age of 21 in the year of competition.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.
20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors - Tournament Director to adjudicate. As per ISSF Rules (clothing).
21. All competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws of the state. (When held in W.A a shooter must obtain a permit to bring a firearm into that state).

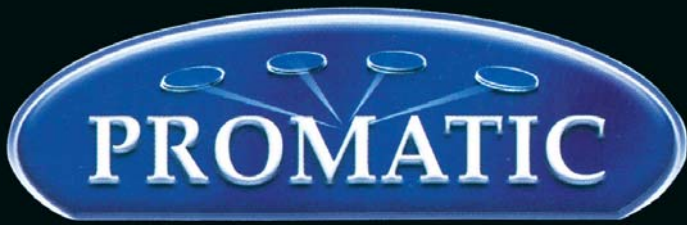
