National President's Notes

"I will not be threatened. I will not be intimidated. I do not answer to blackmail, or threats of legal action whether civil or criminal against an individual or the Association."

Allan Vilcins, ACTA President – 2014



I do not say these words lightly.

Recently there has been a spate of members that have their own agenda and wish to hold individuals to account. These individuals include club, zone, State and National members, volunteers, committee members and officials.

I now make the following statement:

If any person threatens you personally or your family with harm or injury
– go to the police.

If you believe any person has committed an offence against the Firearms (or any other) legislation in any State or Territory
– go to the police.

If you believe any person has stolen or come into the possession of any stolen property
– go to the police.

If you are aware of any person that damages the property of another
– go to the police.

If you become aware of any person in possession of a firearm, that suffers from a mental illness or threatens self-harm
– go to the police.

*It is no longer acceptable in this age to take the 'soft option' and let the association Executive Officer or another ACTA official aware of an issue. **The onus is on the individual to take action and report any breaches to the appropriate authority immediately.** And . . . if you are aware of any of the above issues, and do not take action, and advise the appropriate authorities – you may also be subject to civil and / or criminal action.*

No one wants to be the "bad person" in reporting issues.

However, to threaten any individual that they (if they do not do something as directed – or take a course of suggested action) re any one of the above is incomprehensible. If you are threatened, ever, go to the police!

However, to those individuals that have made statements 'off the cuff', 'in the heat of the moment', or, 'just trying to make a point'. It is no longer acceptable. To threaten someone may result in criminal or civil proceedings commencing against you by that individual or another. Please ensure any complaints are genuine. No action can be taken against an individual if the matter is factual (unless it is of such a trivial nature). In other words, do not threaten another individual unless it is warranted.

Recently I have received some questions of the association that I believe answers will be of benefit to all of the membership. Please find one question and answer below:

Q: Why are the records of the ACTA sometimes behind 'real time' resulting in shooters not having the correct grades entered on their handicap books?

A: Previously, we had a manual system whereby data was collated in hard copy and checked, added to or altered as required. This required the club, zone or state secretary to forward completed handicap forms to the office when a grade or handicap changed. Unfortunately, sometimes the secretary was remiss in their duties or mail was lost (an incredibly common statement to the office – Australia Post has a lot to answer for).

About 10 years ago, the office changed to a computerised data system. This purely reduced the paperwork kept on file in the office. It still required secretaries to forward handicap forms to the office and sometimes Australia Post obviously did their best to lose mail, because the secretaries swore they forwarded them completed. This system although more accurate is fallible because it relied on several persons completing several duties. (This is the system in place today).

In 2013 the Executive Officer when commencing, identified that this was a major issue and submitted to the Executive Committee a proposal to incept a completely new database that incorporates on line membership renewal, online grade and handicap changes (by secretaries) and personal information changes by members.

The office has been working hard to incept this system which will commence for 2015 renewals.

Unfortunately there will still be flaws. This will require members and secretaries to update information, however is not dependent on Australia Post - most of the time. And I say 'most of the time', as, in the initial stages, some secretaries will still complete the hard copy forms and post to the office. Reliant again on the postie!

Fast forward to 2017 and the proposal is that the system will be completely automated with credit card membership cards which automatically transfer data to the secretary and back to the database server (on line) when a shooter nominates and competes. This will then automatically record scores and handicap changes at the completion of competition. The online system will then provide member handicap details to the next secretary where the member competes.

Now - in short, to answer to your question, the office can only utilise the information that is presently provided. Even though you know that a member is AA grade, I know, the handicapper knows and everyone in between, . . . If the postie loses that envelope.

I hope this answers your question and are assured that the ACTA office is working towards finding the 'perfect' system.

I have also received a letter from a New South Wales Club which raises some questions regarding the association and to which I look forward to answering in either this forum or a separate article. I thank the Secretary for the letter and apologise for not including in this CTSN.

I also thank all of the Executive Committee, staff and membership over the last four weeks of my father's illness (and passing) for their thoughts and friendship to my family and I.

I assure everyone that I am back on board and working towards a successful 2015 – which will be the result of a successful National Executive Committee meeting in June.

On behalf of all members we wish them well in their preparation and in Glasgow. Laetisha Scanlan continues to take all before her with another win, this time the Women's Trap event at the World Championship in Arizona. Catherine Skinner again proved to be close to achieving a win with 3rd in the same event. Michael Diamond shows that age is no barrier if you have the dedication (and suitable talent) in taking Silver at the same Championship event. Michael continues to be a world class competitor, Keith Ferguson was also close to a podium finish after finishing 4th in the men's Skeet. Congratulations to all of the members who attended.

The Skeet Nationals have been completed with another very successful event conducted at the National Ground. Great numbers were achieved over the Championship events. There is growing support for having small gauge events added to the National Championships in their own right. This will be discussed at the upcoming Executive Committee meeting in June. Congratulations to those winners at the event. A full report will be in the next CTSN.

I believe the first ever "Trade Fair" at the Skeet Nationals was a success for the traders and also for the shooters attending. The shooters were able to purchase goods, ammunition and have guns serviced. We will be further discussing with the traders the options and opportunities for the future. With the fair Beretta also added to the event by sponsoring two events at the Championships.

Speaking of sponsors, I failed to mention Kay and Michael Hunt (Hunts Shooting

Supplies) as sponsors of the Single Barrel event at the Trap Nationals. My apologies Kay and Michael, your sponsorship and support at the trade fair was indeed greatly appreciated.

Two sponsors, Kriehoff (Sox and Renae) and Bang on Targets Sporting Arms (Paulette and Glenn Walker) confirmed their ongoing support for the next two years with both companies not only extending their sponsorship but also increasing their contribution to cover the High Guns.

The Executive Committee meeting in June will consist of all eight sub-committees meeting to compile recommendations to be discussed by the full committee, these include plans for the Championships and the Ground leading into the World DTL Championships in 2018.

It is important to have a clear vision of where we are heading in terms of these important items before the Executive meeting. Each of the sub-committee's has been active in compiling an agenda for the meeting. These meetings are such an important component in setting the direction of the Association. As with any business we need a short (1 year), medium (3-5 year) and long term (10 year) plan. Once in place these plans are evaluated and added to on a yearly basis. Budgets and plans need to be collated and co-ordinated to provide a positive and stable platform for the development of the sport.

Olympic Gold medallist Suzy Balogh commenced work with the Association at the end of April 2014 as the National Coaching Director. Since starting Suzy has been busy developing plans for the rest of 2014 for coaching courses and implementing the ACTA Academy program. We will have a column from the National Coaching Director in the next CTSN.

Cuizzo's Ramblings

However, in line with previous years, rather than simply doubling up on the standard type of information and results which can be gleaned from the traditional write up, I had intended instead to make a number of working observations from my unique perspective as the Shoot Marshall. In addition to this I usually add some personal opinions and suggestions, explore a few side issues and then delve into some of the "car park agendas" that would otherwise go unaddressed. With the

Deauville Doubles

Two Deauville Doubles events are now conducted each year at the Trap Nationals. extended for another year, I will take the necessary steps to ensure that a similar situation cannot reoccur.

Undesirable Possibilities

Historically our premier event is TWO SHOTS from 15 METRES and as a traditionalist I firmly believe that changing either of these basic parameters is not the answer, at least until all other possible avenues have been totally exhausted. Changing to Points Score or increasing the meterage is an excellent solution for Club Shoots and I strongly support either/both alternatives. But not for the National Championship! Likewise with target angles and speed. We have only relatively recently brought ourselves into line with the major world standard and a backwards step here would be an illogical and retrograde move.

The Cost of Progress

Pre-nomination, pre-squading and computerisation have all brought great advancement, simplification and consistency to our National Program. However, all progress usually involves some trade-offs. In our case it has been the loss of the ideal staging format for the Double Barrel shoot-off. In the "old days" I would simply "temporarily shelve" selected squad-sheets from the next event, before daily squading commenced, which, with flexible and "creative" supervision, allowed me to run the shoot-off all day long in front of the clubhouse, without disturbing the normal flow of the next event. Thus the shooters had convenience and exposure, the spectators were entertained and referees and scorers were plentiful. Everyone was happy! Unfortunately the abovementioned technical advancements have effectively neutered this format.

Workable Alternatives

I believe that the two most obvious alternatives, which have previously been viewed with varying degrees of trepidation, must now move to the forefront. They are the use of the practice traps for shoot-offs and the continuation of shoot-offs at night under lights. The practice traps produce certain practical difficulties that

better advanced planning can overcome. And the fear factor generated by the "dark aura" of shooting under lights at night shares characteristics with the "bogey man" of young children's imaginations. They are both inversely proportional to the brightness of the light level.

Practical Experience

During the seventeen year window that I attended the World Skeet Championships I was fortunate enough to witness the entire evolution of their shoot-off format. From shooting regular Skeet in daylight in 1984, to shooting Doubles at all stations the following year, to Doubles at 3, 4 & 5 soon after and eventually to Doubles at night under lights by the end of the decade. Prior to the first "light year", as I had very limited experience with lights, which in hindsight were clearly inadequate, I was both hesitant and fearful. During the course of that first "afternoon" my visual target acquisition and shooting performance improved markedly without me consciously realising why.

Realisation Dawns

Around 10pm I suddenly realised several things. The first was that it had been dark for some time. The second was that if you have very strong lights and turn them on in daylight, you don't even notice it getting dark. The third and most important point was that shooting at night under VERY GOOD lights is actually better than shooting in daylight. And the last was the increased visual spectacle for the onlookers. A win-win situation if ever there was one! The last two points were clearly evident this year, not only in the Double Barrel shoot-off on Saturday night but also in the Family Deauville Doubles shoot-off late on Wednesday night when I had to push the "parents and children" a long way back onto the grass behind 25m to obtain a result before the time curfew.

The Solution

Prior to next year's Nationals I will be asking the National Executive for two things. The first is the addition of at least one, but hopefully two more layouts with lights identical to the excellent ones we currently have on ground seven. And the second is to formally sanction, by inclusion in the Terms and Conditions of Com-

petition, that all unresolved shoot-offs are to continue under lights each evening until curfew and then on the practice traps the following day until a result is obtained. With some orderly supervision on my part, this should tide us over until such time as the Double Barrel shoot-off is capable of reaching or even exceeding 2000 targets, at which time we would probably need to reassess the relevance of this event anyway.

Long Break Interruption

At the moment the potential acquisition of many "Double Barrel break badges" is being sacrificed by participation in the Single Barrel event on the "second day". To alleviate this situation I have suggested to the Championships Committee that the reversal of the order of the Single Barrel and the Points Score events would be an effective solution of this problem for most people. So far the feedback has been very positive, so if you are affected or even interested, please take it up with your designated representatives.

May's Trivia Question

This question raises a very interesting statistical point. Of the three "standard" events we shoot, neither the Double Barrel nor the Points Score had ever been won by a woman at any of our State Trap Carnivals prior to last year. Although the Double Barrel's "all male status" remains intact, Rachel Fox ended the Points Score record by winning that event in 2013 at Alice Springs. Just ask Sox, he was desperately hoping to retain the status quo! However when Rachel also won the Single Barrel at the same Carnival, she became no less than the SIXTH lady to stand on the top step of the podium for this very prestigious event. Most recently Sandra Cables won the WA Single Barrel title in 2008. A couple of years before that, Viv Moore cleaned up all the "one shot boys" in Queensland. Three years earlier, in 2003, Wendy Barton dished out a "one shell shooting lesson" in NSW.

Then we have a fifteen year gap and have to go all the way back to the Victorian Trap Carnival in Geelong in 1988 when Carol Zagor bested all comers to win the State Single Barrel outright. And to be totally honest, I originally thought she was the first lady to accomplish this great feat and therefore the correct answer to my question. However my old mate Billy Attwood, who is clearly a walking encyclopedia of shooting knowledge, alerted me to the fact that two years prior to this, in 1986, Nannette McCallum had stamped her authority on this "no second chance" event down in Tasmania. Thanks Bill and well done girls!

Psychological Skills for Shooting

POSITIVE OR NEGATIVE ATTITUDE?

On the way to a shoot on the weekend, I was listening to ABC radio: Helen Clare on Sunday, who was exploring the question of the glass half full and that being a pessimist doesn't necessarily mean that you will be unhappy. Over the years some of the ideas

I have looked at these articles have included happiness, fear, anger, attitude, personality and negative and positive thoughts.

For the past twenty or so years there has been push by the 'positive psychology' school which has endorsed the power of positive thinking, overcoming adversity with positive affirmations and being optimistic. There are truckloads of self help books that focus on being and remaining positive. Happiness is seen as an achievable state, and is then encouraged by the press, media, music, etc. Because we believe we should be happy all the time, we are depressed or anxious when we are not.

Regular readers of these articles will know that when you are shooting, I encourage you to remain in the moment: stay focused on the here and now, be in the present. By doing this you are able to let go of past judgements, and ignore future worries or fears. What happens then is you focus on the process (shooting) and the product (your score) looks after itself.

The same principle applies if you want to be happy. Happiness isn't a state that you can enter and be in for the next week, month or year. Happiness is also about being in the here and now and focusing on what is happening to you right now. So to be happy, you need to let go of the past (judgements) and ignore the future (worries and fears) and be mindful of what is happening to you right now. Enjoy the moment: feel it, smell it, taste it, hear it and touch it.

In 2004, I wrote the following in an article titled 'Attitude'. I am still happy to stand by all that I wrote then but there needs to be some amendments in light of current research.

No two people are alike. We all see, hear, feel, smell and taste things differently. Two people will see the same event of situation differently, so too will be the way they remember an event or situation. Our attitude, or the way we see (or feel) things, will affect how we act and feel about certain events. Some people perceive events or situations in a positive and optimistic way, whilst others see the same things in a negative and pessimistic way.

Optimist can have a broader view of the world which means that "they may not see reality with necessary clarity" Lilienfield & Arkowitz, 2011. They further add, "Positive thinking does encourage us to take risks and expand our horizons . . . it may be counterproductive if it leads us to blithely ignore life's dangers."

In the research literature, positive affirmations resulted in slightly better moods for those people who already had high self-esteem. Positive affirmations for those with low self-esteem, backfired because it only served to remind them that they have fallen short in life's goals. The self-help industry pushes positive thinking and positive affirmations but these can only have benefit if the individual's core values are in line with the positive thoughts or affirmations. For example, if your positive thought is that "you will shoot 100 targets single barrel" at the next shoot, the

ability to do this also needs to be there. If you have never shot 25 targets straight, then telling yourself you can shoot 100 targets straight will only produce anxiety and this anxiety will focus your thoughts in the future and this will cause you to miss.

Pessimists often have a narrower focus: eg, worrying about a job interview works for them because they are often better prepared. Pessimists are also less prone to depression than optimists after experiencing negative events such as the death of a friend.

So what is the difference between the attitudes of the optimist and the pessimist. Mack & Casstevens in their book, *Mind Gym*, claim that optimists have a positive expectancy that helps them achieve their goals. They have a can-do attitude and they take actions which are empowering. Pessimists on the other hand, take a passive attitude and play the blame game or focus on what they can't do, and in doing so becomes victims of a self-fulfilling prophecy.

So why would anyone not want to be an optimist; research shows that optimists, on average, live longer than pessimists. They enjoy life more and have far more success. They see their failures as learning experiences rather than setbacks. I often listen to other shooters talk around the traps and it's amazing how often people, shooters, friends put themselves down. I've often said to people at shoots; "you would get angry if anyone else spoke to you like that but you're prepared to speak to yourself that way". Be careful of the language you use; expressions such as "single burial" for single barrel, only reinforce the negative beliefs you have about your ability. Having a positive attitude doesn't mean that you'll always win, but having a negative attitude will almost always guarantee you will lose.

Attitudes are learned so therefore they can be unlearned. The qualities of pessimism are permanence, pervasiveness and personalisation. To change these qualities to an optimistic attitude you have to believe that when you miss a target, lose a competition or have a set back, that this will be temporary. Secondly, rather than let your doubts and troubles affect every area of your life, you need to put your problems and distractions in a "box" so that you are not bothered by them during the competition. Finally, optimists internalise victories and externalise defeats. That is, if you win or shoot well it must have been due to something you did well. Whereas if you perform poorly or lose it must have been due to something outside your control; the wind, shells, targets, lunch, etc. This doesn't mean your making an excuse, it means that you are going to take responsibility for achievement but not take the responsibility for your failure.

Finally, Mack and Casstevens claim that that if you think you can, your right. And if you think you can't, you're also right. The way you choose to think will decide if you can or can't.

As human beings, we cannot be happy all the time and when we shoot, at some stage we will miss. Some of us have more positive than negative thoughts, while some of us are negative and rarely think positively. While these thoughts will effect your moods and your attitudes, to be successful (or to be happy) you need to stay focused in the present, mindful of what is happening to you and around you, and enjoy the process of what you are doing.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Sporting Clays Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held or a member of another sporting association to which we grant reciprocal rights.
2. Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
3. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
4. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
5. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
6. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
7. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
8. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
9. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
10. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
11. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
12. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
13. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
14. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
15. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$10.00. Nominations will close daily at 10 .00am.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
21. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to juniors and second family members, they being wives and husbands entering into the same event whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as a family member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 22. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.**
23. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
24. Upon application to the A.C.T.A office, refunds less a \$5.00 administration fee will be available. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with these conditions of entry.

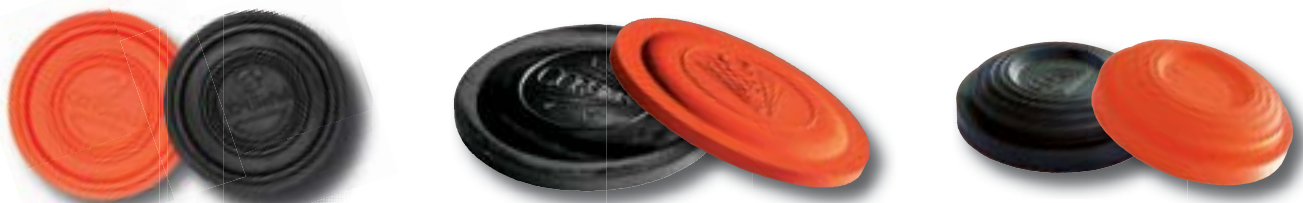

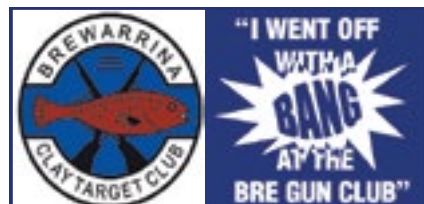

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

I will detail clearly where other organisations members sit in the scheme of things.

SSAA, FGA and FGFA members are able to shoot 5 Stand Sporting practice and competition at ACTA Club, State and National Level. That is it.

I trust this clearly states the activities they can compete in without being an ACTA member.

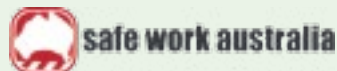
There are no scenarios where this changes, should they wish to shoot other disciplines they need to become a member.

Any person attending your club is covered under our general policy of “Public Liability”.

TRAP HOUSE SAFETY

I have had an enquiry from a shooter who attended a shoot and rang to see if it was common place for trappers to be in the trap house during an event.

The answer is trappers are not to be in trap houses except to fill up the traps, trappers are not to stay in the Trap House whilst shooting is in progress. **Below is the Explanation from the Safe Work Australia website.**



1. INTRODUCTION

Confined spaces pose dangers because they are usually not designed to be areas where people work. Confined spaces often have poor ventilation which allows hazardous atmospheres to quickly develop, especially if the space is small. The hazards are not always obvious and may change from one entry into the confined space to the next.

The risks of working in confined spaces include:

- loss of consciousness, impairment, injury or death due to the immediate effects of airborne contaminants
- fire or explosion from the ignition of flammable contaminants
- difficulty rescuing and treating an injured or unconscious person
- asphyxiation resulting from oxygen deficiency or immersion in a free-flowing material, such as liquids, grain, sand, fertiliser or water.

1.1 What is a confined space?

Regulation 5: A confined space means an enclosed or partially enclosed space that:

- is not designed or intended primarily to be occupied by a person; and
- is, or is designed or intended to be, at normal atmospheric pressure while any person is in the space; and
- is or is likely to be a risk to health and safety from:
 - an atmosphere that does not have a safe oxygen level, or
 - contaminants, including airborne gases, vapours and dusts, that may cause injury from fire or explosion, or
 - harmful concentrations of any airborne contaminants, or
 - engulfment.

A confined space is determined by the hazards associated with a set of specific circumstances and not just because work is performed in a small space.

Confined spaces are commonly found in vats, tanks, pits, pipes, ducts, flues, chimneys, silos, containers, pressure vessels, underground sewers, wet or dry wells, shafts, trenches, tunnels or other similar enclosed or partially enclosed structures, when these examples meet the definition of a confined space in the WHS Regulations.

What is not a confined space for the purposes of the WHS Regulations?

A confined space does not include a mine shaft or the workings of a mine.

The following kinds of workplaces are also generally not confined spaces for the purposes of the WHS Regulations:

- places that are intended for human occupancy and have adequate ventilation, lighting and safe means of entry and exit, such as offices and workshops
- some enclosed or partially enclosed spaces that at particular times have harmful airborne contaminants but are designed for a person to occupy, for example abrasive blasting or spray painting booths
- enclosed or partially enclosed spaces that are designed to be occasionally occupied by a person if the space has a readily and conveniently accessible means of entry and exit via a doorway at ground level, for example:
 - a cool store accessed by a LPG forklift to move stock – although the use of a LPG forklift in a cool store can be hazardous, the door at ground level means that once the alarm is raised, escape and rescue can happen quickly
 - a fumigated shipping container with a large ground level opening will facilitate easy escape and rescue.

Trenches are not considered confined spaces based on the risk of structural collapse alone, but will be confined spaces if they potentially contain concentrations of airborne contaminants that may cause impairment, loss of consciousness or asphyxiation.
