President's Notes



Skeet Nationals

I write this column at the National Grounds during the middle of the Skeet Nationals. The field is close to full with 160 shooters and the tenth layout recently completed is in use as a practice layout. Negotiations with the neighbouring pistol club have resulted in them closing their range for the week of the Nationals allowing use of the 9th and 10th ranges uninterrupted.

The grass planted prior to the Trap Nationals has received much needed

rain and has grown profusely. The grounds now look completely different to the dusty landscape we had at the Trap Nationals. West Australia has set a new standard for Team presentation and congratulations to them. Congratulations must also go to this year's inductee into the Hall of Fame, Mr. Craig O'Neill. Craig's achievements came in a very short period of time which is testimony to his love and commitment to the sport.

Constitution

The second draft including input received from States has now been considered by the Executive for a month and only two suggested changes have been received. The document will now go before the Executive for a complete review at the June Executive meeting prior to being released to the States for further consideration and input. Regular articles will appear in this and future magazines regarding this matter for the general membership to remain informed.

Club closure

A large regional Victorian club has been closed by the environmental protection authorities because of contamination on a neighbouring football oval. Indications are that the local council has agreed to fund a cleanup. Ranges not affecting the oval may be reopened within a month and action to mitigate further pollution will hopefully see all ranges re-opened eventually. This is a warning shot over the bows for our member clubs and all need

to be aware of their responsibilities and should take whatever action is required to protect their ranges ongoing use.

World DTL

The seventeen person World DTL Team is busy preparing for the ICTSF World DTL Championships. We wish them all well and look forward to their doubtless successes at the event. I will be in attendance in my position as ICTSF President, and Executive member and Team member Gary Hayden has been appointed Team Manager.

National Grounds

The two balltrap installations are now almost complete with the traphouses in and shooting stands completed. This addition to your facility will allow club and zone level competitions to be conducted in this discipline. It will also provide the ACTA with a discipline much closer to ISSF Trap for use during our training camps for juniors. Work on the grounds will now shift to the installation of two more trap layouts and realigning fences in that area.

Consultations:

NSW Treasury

Accompanied by local NSW government member Mr. Daryl Maguire the Executive Officer and myself have met with senior officers of the NSW Treasury. The purpose was to put the Association's case for funding of the major clubhouse development, which is outside the scope of normal grants. Although no firm commitment was provided at this initial meeting, indications were that it is possible to part fund the project. Treasury has requested that a cost benefit ratio study needs to be undertaken immediately, and the Executive Officer is working with Wagga Wagga Council to provide this to them. There is an expectation that ACTA will continue progressing to a Company Limited by Guarantee as discussed in the application.

Wagga Wagga City Council

After representations to Council we have received verbal advice that the 30 metre strip along the total length of the grounds northern boundary currently not owned by the ACTA will be sold to us for a nominal amount. This is great news and we now await formal advice. Advice has also been given by council that the new town plan prohibits housing development in our immediate area. The plan has a life of 20 years.

Club non-compliance with the Constitution

Two clubs that have breached the constitution by allowing non-ACTA members to shoot competition have been sent letters requesting an explanation and reminding them of their responsibilities. All clubs are reminded that they must sight current ACTA membership cards of all shooters using their grounds in ACTA disciplines who are not Bona Fide visitors. These two clubs may face disciplinary action if their response is not both timely and acceptable.

Executive Officer's Report

The ACTA long and short term strategic plans are now being developed to include the development of the ground, the structure of the Association and the structure of the membership of the Association. The future of the sport in relation to disciplines is very strong and we see continued growth in the numbers of shooters attending National Championships. I believe this can be attributed to the enjoyment of the sport, not only in competing and ultimately winning but also the social aspect of the sport. It has never been more evident than at the three National Championships held so far this year. It sometimes occurs that we lose sight of why we actually compete in the sport. My philosophy on life is simple, if it's not fun, I don't do it.

Your level of enjoyment may just be attending your club to shoot, if that is where your interest and ambitions lie then that is great. There are however pathways to represent your Club, Zone, State and the National Organisation available to everyone and there are National teams for ISSF, Trap, Skeet and 5 Stand Sporting available.

I have attended a seminar hosted by the Australian Sport Commission in Melbourne regarding their new participation initiatives. This information will be used to further plan for the development opportunities that will arise in the future. However with all development the Association can be involved in, it will be club based. This is where the recruitment of shooters takes place. The Association and the sport of shooting in general suffers from the lack of opportunity to visit schools to entice young people into the sport. There is no easy remedy for this and we are not going to change this situation because of our association with firearms. This means that most sports who employ development staff get to the majority of young people through the primary school system at an early age.

Our challenge is to get our share of the market and hopefully some of the strategies we develop can assist with these goals. A huge market is on our doorstep through current shooters (including hunters) who are aging and not wishing to continue to walk through the bush, however they are still wanting to shoot. There are opportunities for Clubs to promote their facilities and the fact that their location is normally very accessible should encourage new members.

One of the most important aspects of any sport is to have high level coaching and officiating, the sport cannot progress without increasing the level of knowledge of those coaches and administrators. States can contact our National Coaching Director Suzy Balogh to plan a Competition Coach course, this can be integrated to include junior coaching instruction for State level shooters and referee courses. The ACTA has requested our coaching accreditation be handled by the National Office. This

would speed up the process by streamlining the number of bodies involved in the issuing of cards and verification of information. We believe this would be in the best interests of all involved in the accreditation process.

We are continuing to review the IT capabilities of the ACTA including an automated scoring and integrated handicapping system. We have spoken with numerous organisations, discussing numerous current options and integration to ensure it is a simple system to use.

I believe the Association is very well placed to deliver a very exciting future for the sport.

ACTA 2016 Hall of Fame Presentations

The ACTA Presentation evening commenced with National President Robert Nugent welcoming members and guests to the event.

After Master of Ceremonies George Barton introduced himself to the audience the night began with the awarding of Long Breaks achieved in 2015. These were presented by ACTA Vice-President Mal Dyson.

LONG BREAK AWARDS

First recipient for the evening was Darryn Nicholls. Darryn shot 82 targets from 25 metres.

Following was Matthew Patmore, shooting 154 targets Double Rise. Third recipient was James Willett who shot 1053 targets from 15 metres. Fil Petriella accepted the award on James's behalf as he was in Rio preparing for the Olympic Games.



AA ELITE AWARDS

David Crane, Des Mills and Justin Smith were presented with their AA Elite badges by ACTA Executive member Garry Read.

GRAND SLAM AWARDS



To be awarded a Grand Slam, the qualifier must achieve a combination of three individual elements. They are: 15 metres – 400 targets, 25 metres – 50 targets, Double Rise – 50 targets. This award was presented to Rob Yeo by ACTA Executive member Bronte Evans.

MASTERS AWARD

For the Masters Award, you must achieve double the criteria required in any of the three Grand



Slam elements. They are: 15 metres – 800 targets, 25 metres – 100 targets, Double Rise – 100 targets. The 2015 recipients, Matthew Patmore and Frazer Roberts, were presented with their awards by Bronte Evans, ACTA Executive member.

DOUG SMITH MEDAL

The prestigious Doug Smith Medal for 2015 was awarded to Darryn Nicholls with 60 points, winning narrowly from Glen Castellaro and Socs Piliapisidis on 40 points followed by Glenn Kable with 30 points and Ray Niven, Justin Smith and Jackson Willman, all on 20 points.



The Award was presented to Darryn by Colin Witt on behalf of the Smith family.

This is the third consecutive Doug Smith Medal for Darryn, surely a feat that will never be broken.

INDUCTION INTO THE HALL OF FAME

The first of the inductions commenced with Colin Witt introducing Pamela Moloney (nee Coxon).

At the age of 18, being interested in all sports, Pamela Coxon decided to "have a go" at clay target shooting and soon became addicted. She joined the Isisford Gun Club in 1953. At first she competed in the Central Western area of Queensland then went further afield, especially to the annual ten day shoot held in Southport, Queensland.

Pam's competitive shooting stretched from 1953 to 1960. She won the Ladies section of the National Single and Double Barrel several times including in 1956 at the Royal Aero Gun Club in Sydney, in 1958 at the Australian Gun Club in Melbourne and in 1960 at the South Coast Gun Club in Queensland. As this was in the early days of the ACTA National events starting and there was still no Points Score or High Guns, she probably would have won those too had they been available at the time.

In 1960 at Cunnamulla, aged 24, she was the only Queensland woman to make the State team. Her shooting accolades that year also saw her qualifying as the first female member of the Open Mackintosh Team after having missed out on qualifying for the team the previous year by one point. In 1960 Pam was a member of Australia's International Team.

For Pam the travel opportunities were a highlight.

Besides having success at Cloncurry in Western Queensland and Lismore in Northern New South Wales, she also went to Melbourne and Sydney to compete.

Pam shot with an Under and Over A Grade Browning. The Coxons had a trap at home on Oma where Pam and her father George would practice, shooting about 10 days each afternoon for the week leading up to an important shoot.

Time spent on her hobby ceased when she married John Moloney (a non-day shooter!) and moved to a property owned by the Moloney family outside Ilfracombe.

Pam was an inaugural member of the Queensland Hall of Fame and was inducted when the Nationals were held in Roma in 2009.

National President Robert Nugent presented Pam with her Green Jacket and Certificate of Membership to this prestigious club. Pam responded thanking her family and husband for their support and initiating the discussions that lead to her induction.

The second inductee of the night was Darryn Nicholls. George Barton described in detail Darryn's list of achievements including his many National and State titles. The highlight was his World Championship win in South Africa in 2010 where he beat the world's best DTL shooters to take the honours.



For those of you who know Darryn, you know him as a quiet country lad, humble, all round nice guy, family man and a brilliant shot. Others may only know of him by reputation, a big one to live up to for sure. Darryn is a printer by day and shooter by night. He involves himself in his local club in Broken Hill and is currently the acting President (still). He loves his shooting and that is evident in his shooting achievements to date.

Darryn's first time placing was as a junior, when he placed third in the Double Barrel at the 1983 Trap Nationals in Adelaide. Darryn continued to practice and it wasn't until 1994 when he won his first open event in Double Barrel at the SA State carnival. 1999 saw Darryn win the Double Barrel event at the Trap Nationals in Roma.

As the years moved on, he won several State and National events through 2000 to 2009.

But 2010 saw Darryn win the South African National Single Barrel event and then the ultimate event in trap shooting by becoming the 9th World DTL champion with a score of 1047/1050 only missing 3 targets during the competition and beating his closest rival from New Zealand, Neil McKeown by a point. A proud moment no doubt for Darryn and the Australian shooters who were able to witness his accomplishment first hand. The news quickly travelled back home where his family and friends and fellow shooters were able to congratulate Darryn on his well deserved win. All that hard work had paid off. Darryn was also part of the World Open Team that year which achieved 3rd place in the Team event.

2011 saw Darryn make his first Open Mackintosh Team as the highest qualifier along with making the All Australian team.

2012 saw an increase in his achievements. He won his first prestigious Doug Smith Medal. Along with being the Trap National runner-up in Double Barrel, and runner-up in the New Zealand National Points Score. He represented Australia in his first Glenn Cup Team, where Australia was defeated by New Zealand 247 to 245.

2013 was another busy year, winning 4 National events including Double Barrel, Double Rise, Champion of Champions and the Family Deauville Doubles. He set a new Australian record of 1038 targets off 15 metres and also set a new record as the highest achiever of the National High Gun. By the end of the week of the Trap Nationals in Perth, Darryn had equalled the record for the most overall wins by a single shooter. Not since 1965 when the great Warren Charlton set the bench mark, has anyone been able to take home 4 of the Overall Silver Australia Badges at any one event. Even that effort paled when his Overall High Gun total was tallied up with the record being 7 down, so when he achieved only 2 down with a score of 473/475, it was almost inconceivable. What an achievement! He also joined the ranks of the AA Elite in 2013.

2014, what a year of achievement. He broke the long standing Australian Long Run record set by Russell Mark 22 years ago with a score of 1553 straight achieved during the Trap Nationals in Wagga. Darryn won the National Single Barrel

and broke the record again with 234. He won the Double Barrel and was runner-up in the Points Score, Double Rise and Family Deauville Doubles, as well as breaking the National High Gun record again with 722/725. There has only ever been three winners before Darryn, winning the National Single Barrel and Double Barrel in the same year. They were 3 of the greatest trap shooters this county has ever produced. The first was Newton Thomas in 1959, Doug Smith did it twice in 1967 and then 21 years later in 1989 and Jim Ellis in 1970. What an elite club to belong to. Darryn received the Doug Smith medal and placed 3rd in the World DTL Championships in New Zealand. He was inducted into the SA Trap Hall of Fame and awarded the SA Presidential Medal for achievements to date. Darryn also won the NZ National Mini Championships and became the NZ National High Gun.

In 2015, the achievements kept coming. Darryn won the National Handicap and National Double Barrel events. This was the third year in a row that he won the National Double Barrel and the first person to do so. He received his Grand Slam Award and a Masters Award for achieving 800 targets straight from 15m, along with another prestigious Doug Smith medal and was the only one to shoot the Mackintosh perfect score in 2015.

2016 is no different to previous years as Darryn spent most of his time at the front of the room being lauded for his achievements. A true humble champion in the mould of those he emulated in 2014.

2016 Universal Trench Series

The 2016 Universal Trench Series was our most successful yet. 199 shooters over 4 events at 4 different clubs in 3 States. Perfect weather at all events and enough funds raised to send 10 shooters to the World Championships in Morocco in September.

Round 1 kicked off in February at Cecil Park CTC in hot conditions. 37 shooters competed in the event which saw Craig Henwood run the first 125 targets straight. The heat caught up with him in the last 3 rounds but he managed to still record a very good 195/200 to win by 3 targets from Tom Turner and Charlton Vella. Mitchell Iles was the best Junior with 185/200, Anna Shedrina the ladies with 175/200 and Eric Bullmore the Veterans with 181/200. A big thank you to Spartan Global for sponsoring this event.

Overall Craig Henwood 195, AA Grade Tom Turner 192, A Grade Charlton Vella 192, B Grade Bill Preston 188, C Grade Bill Weber 179, Lady Anna Shedrina 175, Junior Mitch Iles 185, Veteran Eric Bullmore 181.

Round 2 we had a new venue on the list for 2016 in Frankston Australian CTC in March. A great deal of work had gone into getting their 2 layouts up and going to comply to throw Universal Trench targets. A big thank you to Jane Vella, Lynne Curtis, Charlie Galea and co for their support. Weather conditions were great and a record crowd of 66 shooters had entered the weekend competition which was proudly sponsored by Winchester Australia.

Charlton Vella lead by 1 after the first day with a great 98/100. He backed it up on day 2 with a 95/100 and it was enough for him to edge out Craig Henwood by 1 tgt to post a 193/200. The Juniors saw Jack Clerke have a breakthrough win on 184/200, the ladies had Amanda Holt

equal the highest score in Australia by a woman on 180/200 and Eric Bullmore again notched another Veterans win with 179/200, Overall Charlton Vella 193, AA Grade Craig Henwood 192, A Grade Jack Clerke 184, B Grade Amanda Holt 180, C Grade Luigi Scalise 169, Lady Amanda Holt 180, Junior Jack Clerke 184, Veteran Eric Bullmore 179.

Round 3 and it was off to the city of Churches in Adelaide in April to International CTC. Again great autumn weather greeted us with sunny and 21 degrees both days and a slight breeze, enough to cause some tricky targets and keep the scores relatively low. One shooter felt right at home in Adelaide in Nathan Cassells who lead from start to finish to record a huge win with 195/200 and win by a whopping 6 targets!!! Mitch Iles again won the Juniors, Amanda Holt equalled her record with 180 for the ladies and local club President Dino Olivero took out the veterans with a well shot 180/200. We thank Alistair Scott from the Flying Pan Catering Co for his sponsorship of this round. Overall Nathan Cassells 195, AA Grade Mitch Iles 189, A Grade Brody Walters 184, B Grade Elio Marinello 182,

C Grade Tom Hetherington 158, Lady Amanda Holt 180, Junior Mitch Iles 189, Veteran Eric Bullmore 180.

The final countdown had now begun with the team positions heating right up. As a shooter could drop their worst score over the 4 rounds ALL places were almost virtually up for grabs. The National Title was the last event to be held at The Melbourne Gun Club in May and was sponsored by Perazzi Australia who have been our major sponsor since the UT Series began 3 years ago.

Weather conditions were good but again pretty breezy to keep the scores low compared to the other rounds. The fact a team spot to Morocco also kept everyones nerves on the edge. Matej Kandus got out of the blocks early to record a 98/100 and was a full chest ahead of his nearest competitors on 96/100. Charlton Vella had let a team position slip last year but he was determined that this year would be his year and he recorded a 96/100 to be equal 2nd place with Jack Collico who had ran the last 75 straight after a slow start. Could Matej hang on and be crowned National Champion?

Day 2 and conditions started out perfect!!! Matej took full advantage to record another 25 to open up a reasonably large lead, but conditions changed and the wind picked up and the light was in and out for the rest of the day. Charlton Vella and Jeff Tonna reeled him in and ended the 2 days on a respectable 191/200 for a shoot off to occur.

We also had a shoot off in

Juniors with Mitch Iles and Jack Clerke recording 187 and Kelly Coogan and Amanda Holt shot 181 to tie for the ladies. The Veterans was a clear winner with Phil Matthews in his first event record a 171/200

A decision was made that as a full round was required that all 6 shooters would shoot off together in the one squad to add to the excitement. The juniors went right to the wire with Mitch missing his very last target to give Jack Clerke his first National Title sash with a well shot 187 + 24. ACTA Constitution—Part 2

Hello again! This month we would like to explore with you some of the governance concepts and modern practice for sporting organisations that underlie the proposed new constitution. The primary determinants are to adopt higher standards of management, greater accountability and ensuring the right people are in the job of managing our sport. A somewhat lesser but also important determinant is compliance with modern standards and practices.

Starting with last determinant first it is now common practice with sporting organisations Australia wide to adopt a governance model know as a company limited by guarantee. A company limited by guarantee is sort of half way between an incorporated association and a company propriety limited. A company limited by guarantee does not have shareholders and members have the same relationship to management as they do within an incorporated association. The reporting requirements and acceptable standards of a company limited by guarantee are significantly higher than that of a incorporated association but less than that of a commercial company. If ACTA becomes a company limited by guarantee then it will have to lift its game with respect to reporting, accountability and transparency. This would have to be a win win for members and the sport.

While ACTA is not under any obligation to comply with the requirements of the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) it makes sense to seriously consider what is currently considered as best practice. The ASC have adopted have a set of mandatory principles of governance for sporting organisations under the following headings:

1. Board composition and powers
2. Board processes
3. Governance systems
4. Board reporting and performance
5. Stakeholder relationship and reporting
6. Ethical and responsible decision making

The ASC principles are widely accepted by government and industry as indicative of forward thinking and progressive organisations. Why invent our own when there is a good, well researched and accepted model available? The following briefly outlines the important aspects of the principles applicable to ACTA.

Board composition and powers

It is proposed to form a board tasked with the overall management of the sport with similar responsibilities and powers to that of the current executive. In the general sense there will little change from the current role of the executive except in that a board in a company limited by guarantee the roles of the directors are more clearly documented and understood by all stakeholders. There must be a clear separation and documentation of the roles of the board, the executive officer and the ACTA staff something which, while tacitly understood, is not well defined at present.

Board processes

This contains all the usual stuff about preparing meeting schedules, agendas, recording of minutes and so on all of which currently occur at a high standard. However an extra requirement will be for the board to plan annual activities and develop a board calendar and work plan to be made available to all members. This will enable members to more easily track the board's performance.

Governance systems

This is where the board's operation will of necessity need to be of a significantly higher standard than that currently expected of the executive.

For instance the board will have to develop:

- Strategic direction, KPIs, core values and ethics
- Protocols for interaction of board, executive officer, staff, members and networks
- Monitoring and evaluation systems
- Risk management strategy & process
- Compliance system with AS3806:2006
- Regular performance review with EO
- Audit system and audit committee
- Nomination committee with charter and TOR
- Delegations of authority to be clearly documented

Board reporting and performance

The board's reporting responsibilities will not differ greatly from that of the current executive but the board will have to routinely review its performance and that of individual directors, chair and committees and document these reviews.

Stakeholder relationship and reporting

The board of a company limited by guarantee must ascertain the aspirations of members and incorporate those into a strategic plan aligned with member plans. Members also have the right to remove board members or change the constitution in accordance with legislation. It is worthwhile noting that at present the club delegates do not have the right to remove executive members at the AGM. The board must provide a comprehensive annual report and also as now board members do not have a vote at the AGM¹. The annual report will include both achievements as now but also the relative performance of the board, individual directors and chair.

Ethical and responsible decision making

The board must establish a code of conduct to guide the directors and the executive officer and also ensure decisions are based on thorough review of available information, risk management and strategic objectives. The board must also prepare a business plan for all major projects.

While the above is just a skim through of the responsibilities of a board of a company limited by guarantee we hope that provides a useful insight in how the standard of governance will need to lift from the current management when becoming a company limited by guarantee.

¹ Section 18.1 of the current constitution states that each member state and member club shall vote at a general meeting, which subject to these rules, shall be exercised by its representative. However 18.1 does not define who the state representative may be but presumably it could be any so appointed financial member. The section is reasonably clear that each state only has one vote and in recent years at least, states have not appointed representatives to vote. Executive members may not vote in their own right but only have the right to exercise proxies on behalf of clubs or a state.

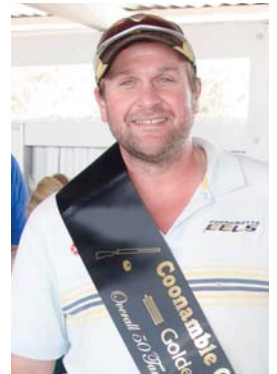

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Sporting Clays Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. Proof of ACTA membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
2. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
3. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
4. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
5. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
7. Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
10. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
11. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
14. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
17. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$10.00. Nominations will close daily at 10 .00am.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. Reduced Nominations: First time Juniors at a National event are entitled to free nominations for that event. Pre-Nomination must be received prior to the Pre-nomination closing date (15/08/2016).
21. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.**
22. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
23. Upon application to the A.C.T.A office, refunds less a \$5.00 administration fee will be available. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with these conditions of entry.
24. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Disappointment

Last week at a Field and Game shoot, after a horrid round, one of the squad suggested that I write an article about disappointment. What a great idea! Every one of us at some stage has experienced disappointment so what is it?

With the trap nationals over for another year and the skeet nationals around the corner, this seemed like a good time to explore what happens when we experience disappointment.

I know disappointment involves thoughts and emotions but is there a theoretical basis for it. I did some research on the net and it appears research into disappointment is a recent thing but it is certain that there is a definite physiological aspect to what happens in the brain when people experience the emotion that we believe to be disappointment.

When I searched for disappointment theory I came across an excellent resource from <http://visual.ly/psychology-disappointment>. I would normally acknowledge the author but was unable to find the author listed on the page, so I will admit that some of this is straight from the article, 'The Psychology of Disappointment'.

The article states that in plain English, it is obvious that when someone considers a risky action, he or she will form a prior expectation of the payoff, and the outcome is worse than expected, that person will experience an emotion called disappointment. If the outcome exceeds the expectation then the emotion will be elation. Another way of explaining this is that when things go right we feel happy, but when things go wrong you often feel frustrated, regretful and even disappointed.

There are several theories that explain disappointment.

Disappointment is

the psychological reaction to an outcome that does not match up to expectations. The greater the difference, the greater the disappointment.

... is a way in which sadness is expressed.

... the way you feel when you consider what might have been, in contrast to what exists in the present.

... the realisation that you don't have or didn't get, or never will get whatever it was you wanted.

Disappointment is often expressed as anger because you continue to idealise what could have been. Sometimes this anger can be focused inward as guilt, where you blame yourself for the failure.

To set yourself up for disappointment the following have to occur.

- You are in a situation in which the outcome is uncertain (any competition).
- You hope for a positive outcome (any competition).

- You feel you deserve a positive outcome (most competitions).
- You are surprised that you didn't achieve the outcome (some competitions).
- You couldn't control the outcome through personal actions (your ability).

There are strategies that we can use to combat disappointment.

1. *Revise your expectations.* Try a bit of retroactive pessimism. This is referred to as hindsight bias, where you limit your disappointment by revising the high expectations you once had for winning. Look at what you did achieve, that is, a personal best, for example.
2. *Increase your disappointment tolerance.* Don't have low expectations or be pessimistic about what you can achieve by letting disappoint breed pessimism. Revise your goals and be realistic about what you can achieve.
3. *Do not let disappointment skew your economic decisions.* Selling your gun for a quick sale for half it is worth, because you shot badly today is poor economic thinking.
4. *Assess what you are in control of.* You cannot control the weather, the light, trap or gun malfunctions, etc. Focus on the things you can control.
5. *Use humour.* Don't take life too seriously. There will be another competition next week.

Disappoint need not be all that bad.

It can provide information about the way we view ourselves, the world and others. It can also help us understand what is important to us if we drill down to examine the cause of the disappointment.

So now is the time to examine those feelings of disappointment you may have felt after the trap or skeet nationals. Were you justified in being disappointed?

Is there any other way you could feel? Are you able to use the feelings to improve next time?

NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

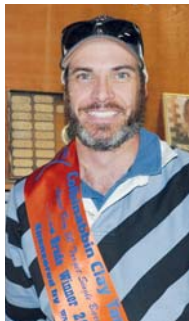

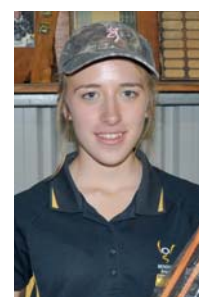
