ISSF Nationals

Commonwealth Games Shooting future

South Africa's decision to relinquish the 2022 event has resulted in the games being moved to Birmingham. Shooting, which was on the program, has now been totally removed. This has caused much angst amongst shooting bodies in the Commonwealth countries, and Shooting Australia along with others are currently campaigning to have the shooting sports reinstated. It would be a sad day for shooting if the sport remains out as it could prove difficult if not impossible to reintroduce them at later games.

Executive Meeting

Following a Motion of no-confidence in myself as President being proposed by the two NSW Executive members and them requesting a full meeting to have the matter put to a vote the Executive met in Wagga on the 11th of January.

The motion was lost. Neither the mover nor seconder offered their resignation so the Executive remains unchanged.

Nationals and World DTL

At this stage all is on schedule at Wagga Wagga for these events and we look forward to welcoming all participants from Australia and overseas to the complex. It is envisaged the main building will be completed and it will provide a comfortable space for those attending to refresh themselves.

Hall of Fame

We are still looking for financial support for the completion of this important part of the project. Anyone with an interest can contact Garry Read on 0418 859 795 who is currently overseeing the H of F development. An important part of the display is to be a mural depicting the sport and its achievers through the decades. It will be displayed high on the wall inside the foyer of the Hall of Fame area. The estimated cost for this work, which will initially be app. 1.8 metres high and 10.0 metres long equates to about \$500 per decade. Anyone wishing to "Sponsor a Decade" would be welcomed. All funds contributed will be acknowledged in the CTSN. "Decade sponsors" will be acknowledged on the mural itself. Rule Clarification

SIGHTER TARGETS

As of January 1st 2018 a sighter target is no longer to be given to the shooter at the start of each days competition. (See below "Mandatory Requirements for Officials #5").

5. Target to be shown by Referees,
 - (a) At the beginning of the day two (2) targets will be thrown for viewing by the squad.
 - (b) When the competitors are all in position the Referee must release a target for the first shooter to look at on his call.
 - (i) At the beginning of all events
 - (ii) After any breakdown or delay
 - (iii) At the commencement of all shoot-offs
 - (iv) On each trap used for a shoot-off
 - (v) After any break for shells etc during a shoot-off
 - (vi) If a competitor receives two broken targets in a row.
 - (c) There will be no sighter targets to be shot at by any shooter.

The interpretation of this rule is that the Referee, at the beginning of the day, will release 2 targets for viewing by the squad and then when shooters are in their shooting positions ready to commence the event the Referee will ask the number one shooter to call for another target to look at. This will allow the the squad to judge the response time of a called-for release.

Executive Officer's Report

I wish to thank and credit Nigel Hughes for providing the photo of the Glenn Cup team in New Zealand that featured in the last magazine. Nigel assists the ACTA in many ways including providing content for the Skeet Hall of Fame (including his legendary poems). Many thanks Nigel for your support.

The 2018 National Trap Championships followed by the 13TH World DTL Championships will present the ACTA with some challenges prior to the event and during the event. With a completely new setup of the National Ground we will require the co-operation of campers and shooters to ensure everyone is accommodated.

The building has taken a significant amount of the ground usually used for parking, in saying that the structure of carparks around the building will allow for parking in and around the new venue.

Those camping on the ground will have only one car per site, others will need to use the overflow car parking. All shooters are advised they are not to park on camp sites when going to a layout. There will be overflow parking available at the western end of the ground and next to the ACTA National office. We ask those attending to be mindful of the capacity of the ground. There is plenty of parking however not in the same places as previous.

The news that the Commonwealth Games Committee has omitted shooting from its program is concerning, this takes an enormously valued event from the sport. This issue was raised at a member forum with Shooting Australia in December 2017. The option to elevate the status of the current ISSF World Championships and World Cups was discussed as well as suggestions Shooting Australia investigate other opportunities that may present themselves or indeed start something new to accommodate the shooting sports.

There has been discussion for a number of years of forming a body in Australia to accommodate all disciplines of Shotgun shooting and to investigate the options and possibilities for the sport. The omission of the shotgun discipline from the Commonwealth Games may well be the catalyst to drive further discussion. The ACTA has sent a letter of support to Shooting Australia in their endeavours to get shooting back in the Commonwealth Games.

There continues to be a great deal of discussion on membership including cost, categories, benefits etc throughout the membership. The ACTA has a membership committee that is working on options to take the Association forward. This review is complex and based upon assumptions, the report and review is due at the National Executive meeting late in August 2018.

The ACTA has met with all clay target shooting Associations over the past two years without success on achieving the goal of one membership or allowing a viable arrangement for visitation. There are many roadblocks including the current ACTA constitution as well as other Associations rules and constitutions. The recommendations of the membership committee will need to be able to be accommodated firstly within the ACTA's rules and regulations before being used to align with others.

This is a complex situation and one that will not be solved without some give and take. The give however cannot be all one way, the ACTA

Executive have a duty to make decisions in the best interests of the ACTA and not other organisations, they have put forward numerous compromises in the past eighteen months with no meaningful response to progress the situation forward.

Most shooting organisations are looking for a solution with a "one size" fits all approach, however they are not prepared to "give up" any concessions to achieve this. The ACTA has a similar philosophy although we have started the process and driven it to this point.

From my perspective it is important we (the ACTA) look after OUR members. If members of other Associations want to participate in ACTA events, then the choice is simple, Join the ACTA. Whilst on membership it is baffling to me why we have so many categories of membership with different benefits.

If we all paid the same price and received the same benefits we would be a leader in equality in sports in this country. Mind you, these are my thoughts only.

2017 Commonwealth Ball Trap

Lake Albert Gun Club
December 2017

The day had arrived that most Ball Trap shooters had been waiting for. Saturday November 4 was the day for the battle, and what a day it was going to be. Instead there was a catastrophic failure of a major component after only a few targets and the result was that it was going to take some time to repair the trap. As many had travelled quite some distance, a decision was made to re-schedule the event to Saturday December 2nd, just a day before our final shoot of the year. So, we waited with patience and did the major repairs that were required and then some testing of the trap to ensure all would be well.

When the day finally arrived, a decent number of squads turned up, as this was now a two-fold event. Over the year, Lake Albert had been having a series of 75 target shoots that were all part of the Ball Trap Grand Prix. 5 series had been held and the 'Overall' winner from each of those series were all invited back to the 'Final'. The 6th and last series was also to be held today to determine the final 'Overall' winner to take up position 6 in the final.

Over the top of these 75 targets, we were holding the Commonwealth title as well, which meant that the 'Overall' winner would get both the Commonwealth title as well as be the 6th finalist for the Grand Prix.

The squads of competitors all filed out, one after the other, to do 3 rounds of 25 targets and contest the title. Conditions for the day were nothing short of horrendous for the squads which had to contend with gale force winds and targets that were going everywhere but where you expected them to be.

Everyone was hovering around the scoreboard as each set of 25 targets was put up, mainly to see how they were fairing up against the others or if they had become an unrecoverable train wreck in the conditions.

At the end of the 75-target qualifier, there was 1 standout score. He had shot a 23 in the 1st set, and then backed it up with 2 perfect 25's, giving him a total of 73/75. Aaron Zupanic had taken out the National Commonwealth Ball Trap title winning the very sought after Royal Blue sash and prize. To this end, Aaron had also qualified to become the 6th and final participant in the Ball Trap Grand Prix final which was being shot immediately after the presentation of the Commonwealth sash.

A very elated Aaron said in his presentation that it was his first Commonwealth sash and knew that he came there with a one-track

mind, to do whatever it took, to win.

Finally, it was time to go out on the walks again to fight it out for the Grand Prix. The 'Final', is another 25 targets of Ball Trap, shot as a Points Score. All the qualifiers from the previous 5 series including Bronte Evans (who was unfortunately unable to attend due to our rescheduling of the event after the breakdown), Peter Winsler, NJ Dreyer, Sam Daou and Michael Raper, as well as current winner Aaron Zupanic lined up, looked up at the skies, and wondered what the hell they were doing there in such awful conditions.

Nevertheless, on the call of the first target, everyone had a personality change and it was down to business. One target at a time they smashed their way through the myriad of constantly changing wind

speeds and direction. Some second shots were fired, some full targets were missed and after all had gone quiet, there were some pretty hardened competitors looking down at the ground, wondering what could have gone so tragically wrong.

At the layout, everyone turned to congratulate Aaron. Under extreme duress, he had somehow dug in to come out on top. The scorecards were taken in to the office for final counting and the result became official: Aaron Zupanic wins the 2017 Ball Trap Grand Prix as well. What a fantastic day out for this guy sheer unrelenting determination. Aaron takes home the major prize of a temperature controlled safe valued at \$250, a perpetual trophy for 1 year with his name on the shield, as well as his name on the Ball Trap Grand Prix Honor Board.

Congratulations have to also go out to the 5 other finalists who through their own extreme efforts on their day, also came out winners to claim a spot in the final not an easy challenge when everyone at the front line wants exactly the same as you.

State Shooting Park
October 2017

Well here we are again for the South Australian State ISSF titles for 2017. Thursday saw a decent amount of competitors at the practice traps getting themselves familiarised with the background and conditions of our State Shooting Park.

October 27th to 29th 2017 saw absolutely perfect conditions allegedly to start with, around 23 degrees for the morning and with no breezes at all. It was a steady flow of participants that came to the ticket window to contest the first event which was the State Doubles title. A good mix of top end shooters with some new ones that hadn't shot doubles before.

Targets were being checked in the early morning for distances, heights, speeds and angles and no one could wish for better doubles, they were sitting there just waiting to be shot. However conditions were set to deteriorate as there was a severe weather warning in place for late afternoon with up to 100km winds predicted and late thunderstorms.

As everyone wandered around the grounds seeing who they were up against, there was a great atmosphere of anticipation, and the smell of bacon & egg rolls at the ready in the kitchen. Office staff were well catered for with lollies in the bowls for keeping the energy

levels up. At 9.45am everyone was called out to the layout to see the pairs. Everything looked fine, and the game got under way. Steadily but determined they all got through their first 5 rounds of 15 random pairs. Competitors were coming in, in-between the rounds to check the boards to see how they had fared up, and there were smiles as well as sad faces to be had.

When all the numbers had been calculated at the end, the shoot-off's got underway to determine the winners of the sought after State 'red' sashes as well as postal and travelling teams for the Doubles event. The weather had started changing by now and the winds were much stronger taking the targets upwards. Final scores looked like this: C grade winner was Peter Winsler 94/150, and 2nd was Don Pratt 92/150. B grade was won by Sam Daou 107/150 with Jack Cullinan 97/152 taking 2nd place. A grade was taken by Bronte Evans 107/150, with Deserie Baynes 102/150, 2nd. AA grade went to Mitchell Iles 137/150 and

2nd to Andrew Brady 127/150. The Overall State title, Red sash and SA badge went to Matt Stokes with a well shot 184/230. (115+28+10+7+8+16). Veteran went to Bronte Evans, Junior was Mitchell Iles, Ladies was Deserie Baynes. South Australian Champion shooter went to Matt Stokes and SA Junior Champ was Jack Cullinan.

By the end of the day, the winds were howling and everyone was glad that the competition was over.

At daybreak on the Saturday morning, all the officials were hustling

over the trap layouts with their protractors, height sticks, angle and distance markers etc. to get everything right for the commencement of the qualifying 125 target singles rounds of which the first 75 targets would be shot today and would determine our SA Postal team. At the Skeet end, everything was also checked and double checked and as the rules tell us, the participants were called to the 1st and 2nd traps to check all the targets before they all headed out to undertake the task.

Once again the forecast was for calm conditions and 30 degrees, which made for a great day without targets bouncing around too much. All the bad conditions from yesterday had passed and everyone was hoping to be in the winner's circle.

There were lots of smiles and lots of sad faces again as the scores came in at the end of the day. ACTA Function Centre - a time-line of progress

The Australian Clay Target Association applied for funding for a new clubhouse on numerous occasions: 2010, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016. On each occasion we were met with a sympathetic response however, we did not fit the funding criteria.

The latest rejection was in May 2016. Following this reply, through the local member Daryl Maguire, the Executive Officer was given a half hour meeting with the Minister, Mr Stuart Ayres on the National Ground.

Assurances were provided to the Minister that we would build a "multi-functional" facility with specific requirements in terms of the number of patrons the building could accommodate.

In August a grant was provided to the ACTA for a Business Case Study to show the economic benefits of the building to the community. Following a lengthy investigation and report, it was announced on the 2nd of January 2017 by member for Wagga Wagga Daryl Maguire, that the NSW State Coalition Government would provide 5.5 million dollars toward the project on condition the venue would cater for up to 650 patrons for dinner and up to 1000 for a conference. The ACTA agreed to also contribute 1.2 million dollars to the project.

The completion date is set for the 1st of March 2018 in time for the 2018 DTL Championships and the 13th World DTL Championships which will run from the 25th – 27th of March 2018.

The building which is now at a very advanced stage was contracted to well known local Wagga Wagga builder, Kerry Pascoe.

Kerry who has been in the building trade for 50 years started as an electrical contractor but changed to building in 1972. In the mid 80's he was building

some 85 houses a year and around this time also had a brief venture into portable homes. Kerry also built 2 motels in Wagga Wagga, one of which he still owns. In early 2000 he developed an interest in commercial work and took on several projects in the \$3.5 to \$10 million bracket including a medical centre, bowling alley and the Toyota dealership and workshop buildings

Kerry has always realised a great future for Wagga Wagga and in 2004 he became a City Councillor. In the same year he was made Mayor of Wagga Wagga, a position he held for 8 years. Kerry still represents the people of Wagga Wagga as a City Councillor.

When speaking to Kerry about the ACTA Function Centre, he said "I am really enjoying this building, there are so many very different sections and components to bring together to make it all happen on time, it is a very interesting project. I have enjoyed working with the ACTA and the engineers to find solutions to problems that have arisen and I look forward to seeing its completion as the biggest and finest Conference Centre in Wagga Wagga."

Kerry also said that where possible he has used local suppliers and sub-contractors in the construction and fitting out of the building.

On the following pages you will see a pictorial time-line of the new building, from the first foundation holes being excavated in late August to the present time.

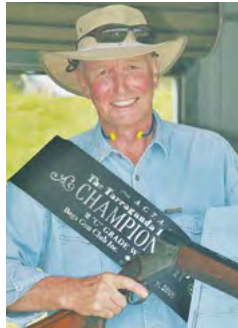

Ball Trap

Recently I have been asked, on several occasions, "what is the difference between Ball Trap shot from a straight line along the 15m mark as opposed to the way the Ball Trap layout is drawn in the ACTA Rule Book".

It is my belief, and I would be very pleased to be corrected if wrong, is that some Ball Trap layouts were originally set out as illustrated in the English CPSA Rules for Ball Trap. This shows a line of straight shooting pads set up at the 15m mark. This probably made the installation of a new independent layout easier to build and in fact some Ball Trap was shot over existing trench layouts.

However as many ACTA Clubs had neither the area for extra layouts, the use of existing trench layouts or the inclination to add further shooting pads to their DTL layouts, it evolved that Australian Ball Trap be modified in the ACTA rules to allow clubs to shoot Ball Trap over their DTL layouts from the 15m marks.

Although most clubs now shoot Ball Trap using the dimensions specified and illustrated in our Rule Book, some clubs still have Ball Traps set up where shooters shoot along a straight line. Whilst these layouts are accepted without question and in fact I know of at least one club that shoots both layouts, I urge all clubs to use the Australian Ball Trap Rules when able or when setting up new layouts.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

How to use Visualisation and the Black Box Technique

This article will appear just before the 2018 DTL Nationals and the DTL world championships.

Last month I explored the components of being mentally tough for these competitions and the processes needed during the event. In this article I want to revised visualisation and go over the "black box technique". During the lead up to the competitions and during the events many of us may be put off by 'distractions'. These can be external distractions: noise, wind, conditions, behaviour of other shooters, trappers, etc or they can be internal distractions such as self-talk, self-doubt, lack of confidence, prize money, trophies, fear and anxiety. Regardless of where the distractions come from they must be dealt with because the process of focusing on each individual target and therefore shooting each individual target is what is essential.

Visualisation

Visualisation or mental imaging is a skill that can be used to improve performance. Visualisation, according to Syer & Connolly (1984) is the process of watching yourself, as if on a screen, in your mind's eye. Whilst you watch yourself you consciously evoke and guide daydreams, in which you appear, towards a specific end.

A number of terms are often used interchangeably with visualisation. These include mental imagery, mental rehearsal, ideomotor training, visual-motor behavioural rehearsal. Mental imaging includes auditory and kinaesthetic (feeling) components as well as visual components; therefore, if you visualise yourself moving, you may see, hear and feel yourself moving. Visualisation is the most commonly used term and for the purposes of this article I will stay with it.

Visualisation is a tool that can be used to limit self-doubt because it incorporates the language that the body understands: pictures. Muscles and the nerves that are needed to move muscles, do not understand language, therefore when we tell them what to do they tighten up because they do not understand our instruction. If however, we show them a mental picture then what is needed, it is clearer and in a form that they can use. If you had to learn golf, trap shooting or a waltz, from the verbal instructions, most people would end up confused and unable to do what was expected. However, when we show the learner, what to do and better still when the task is broken up into small steps, learning is easier, understandable and more fun.

The learning process is accelerated when we visualise what we have to. The brain cannot distinguish what is real and what is imagined so if we wish to practise a skill, then doing it over and over in our mind will reinforce what we have learned and accelerate the generalisation process of the skill. It must also be noted that the same goes for visualising faults and mistakes, so it is important that the correct skill is being visualised.

Visualisation also affects physical functioning if you visualise a physical

action, state or process and your emotional functioning can be affected if you visualise an emotional state or process. Research in the 1930s demonstrated that when an person imagined tensing and relaxing a muscle group, he could influence that muscle group without doing any actual tensing or relaxing.

Visualisation can be different for different situations and Syer & Connolly draw a distinction between two classes of visualisation; Problem-solving and mental rehearsal. Problem-solving involves using visualisation to aid concentration, reduce anxiety and physical tension or to suggest possible courses of action. Mental rehearsal is the process of imagining yourself performing a specific movement of skill. For the trap or skeet shooter, mentally rehearsing the shot they are about to perform will quieten the mind because it has just seen the target break and therefore lets the body shoot the target with interfering with a lot of useless verbal instructions.

Black Box Technique

This technique was designed for Barbara Lynch in 1979 before she won the European 15 Trench Title. Barbara Lynch, a Champion English shooter, sought out Connolly & Syer to develop a way that would help her deal with distractions during a competition. Barbara found that using this technique she was able to give each of her distractions an image and then put them in the black box. Images that she put into the black box included other shooters kicking shells, having shell ejected in her direction, trap malfunctions, other shooters coughing, etc.

Having identified your concerns and distractions, sit quietly, close your eyes, take a deep breath and allow yourself to settle heavily into your chair as you breathe out slowly.

Imagine yourself sitting at a desk in front of a window. Look out and notice what you see, what the weather is like, what movements there may be. Then look down at the desk and notice a blank sheet of paper and a pen. Pick up the pen and write down a complete list of those concerns and distractions you identified. As you write, see the shape of your handwriting on the page, hear the point of the pen slide over the paper, feel the weight of your upper body on your arm. If you find it easier, you can draw a picture to represent the distractions or your distracted mood. When you have finished put down the pen, fold up the paper and turn around. You see a box behind you, somewhere within reach. It may be on a shelf or on the floor. Notice how large it is, what colour it is, whether it is in the light or in the shadow. Open the lid. Then put the folded paper inside the box, close the lid and turn around, settling back into your chair and once more looking out the window.

Having done this you can open your eyes, ready to interact with those around you.

However, it is important that once your session or match is over, you close your eyes again and go back to the imaginary desk, turn around, open the box, get out and unfold the paper and look to see what you wrote or drew. Sometimes it will no longer be of interest, that's fine, but if you promised to give the object attention then you should now keep that promise.

I have found this technique useful in a variety of settings in my practise for helping children deal with bullies, manage exams, deal with issues affecting their lives (grief, etc). This technique puts you in control and reduces anxiety because the problems are dealt with and you can get on and do what you have to.

2018 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA or recognised organisation for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **Squadding is by Pre-Nomination Only. The close date for nominations is the 31st January 2018.**
3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
4. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
5. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
6. **Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.**
7. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
8. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
9. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
10. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
11. **All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so.** While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
14. Optional sweep prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund.
22. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.
23. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
24. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorization from the Tournament Director of the Shoot Marshal.
25. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade prior to entering State and National Championships.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
