President's Notes

Nationals and World DTL

These events now being concluded, allows us to consider the outcomes. Firstly we must acknowledge the National High Gun Overall Winner Tom Turner. Congratulations Tom.

The National Grounds were presented in the best condition we have seen to date despite construction continuing right up to the start of the event. New traps on the Eastern end were used throughout the competition with few holdups. Extensive hardstand carparks proved a great feature of the development and will come to the fore during bad weather events.

Catering was handled well by the ACTA contracted caterer Nathan Gale. Being able to enjoy a meal in such a comfortable environment was a great improvement for shooters.

Presentations were larger than at any shooting event we have seen and all present were comfortably seated, in a well-lit, air-conditioned environment, giving much better recognition to the winners and exposure for our sponsors.

Whilst much remains to be done in the way of lawns and landscaping, members can now see what they have got for their money and those with foresight will be able to imagine the future possibilities this opens for the Association.

This facility is already opening doors for the Association in areas never before thought possible and will continue to showcase our sport long after the critics have gone.

Despite all the negativity from those forever critical of your Association I noticed them all enjoying the comforts of the facility. During the event some also chose to promote negative issues to the National media. How great would it be if they put their efforts into promoting the sport to the National media instead? They have proven they obviously have the ability to do so but choose not to.

The financial outcome from the Nationals was on par with previous events as planned despite the large prize payouts. The field for the events was down by 9 entries in total from the previous record attendance at the Nationals held in conjunction with the last Australian hosted Worlds in 2006.

The 13th ICTSF World DTL Championship was held following our Nationals, and we must acknowledge Fraser Roberts as our new World DTL Champion. Congratulations Fraser on behalf of all Australians.

The World DTL began with a march of all International teams to the tunes of the Kapooka Army Band. Quite a sight I thought. Following speeches and presentations, this was followed by a great cocktail function onsite with more music from the military band.

A new record attendance at a World DTL of 722 entrants competed after large numbers of withdrawals. The level of withdrawals was both disappointing and caused much unnecessary work for the office. Originally catering for a field of 800 and having it oversubscribed with a large waiting list it is surprising that we did not start with a much larger field. The event had its difficulties with rule interpretations by some referees, but otherwise generally ran well. Certainly no shooter had to shoot in the dark. Weather conditions over the Nationals and the World varied from hot, rainy, windy, to cool and dusty so every possible scenario except snow was catered for. Interesting to note an entrants comment during a dust storm (that was as far reaching as Hay in the west and closed Canberra airport) that we (ACTA) should have had a water truck.

Existing long term sponsors were joined by some new faces and we thank all sponsors for their support of the two events and provide further individual acknowledgement elsewhere in this magazine.

What could have been better? There is always room for improvement and some issues we will be considering are the re-siting of some of the caravans, toilets on the western end of the grounds and how to better manage pre-noms. More sealing of roadways is also being looked at, constructive suggestions are always welcome, via email preferably. Check out the photos on the "News" tab on the ACTA website.

I cannot thank enough those members that worked both before, during and after these two events. If I have not thanked you personally please accept my sincere thanks for the efforts made by so many of you to ensure the success of these events. From the trappers, to the mechanics and ground staff, from the office staff to the Marshalls and Referees, all those that stepped up at short notice and those that filled traps and emptied bins and watered roadways, lawns and gardens – thank you all.

I also pass on my thanks and congratulations to the Executive Officer, National Office and Ground staff for a job well done.

These events are the end of an era for some including long time trap mechanic Fred Rapley and IT provider Frank Auditore. Our resident gunsmith of many years, Ian McGeogh is also retiring from the position and from all shooters who you have got out of trouble with a broken gun, I thank you Ian.

Thanks to you all for your efforts over so many years and Best Wishes for the future.

Hall of Fame

The first seated dinner in the new facility saw the induction of Mark McInnis into the ACTA Hall of Fame. Mark has been a long-time advocate for the Hall of Fame and we congratulate Mark on his induction. Mark is currently collating content for the

mural and the electronic displays for the Hall of Fame area in the new facility.

Life Registered shooter status was bestowed on two of our Olympians in Suzy Corey and Desiree Baynes. Congratulations to you both.

Following a tie on points for the Doug Smith Medal and on Grand Slams normally used to break ties, sportsmanship was considered and it was found impossible to support one nominee over the other so 2 Doug Smith medals were awarded, one to Phil Grainger and another to Pat Guida. This decision in no way reduces the importance of this award, the Associations most prestigious for DTL and nor does it follow automatically that those tied on points and Grand Slams in the future will both be awarded. Congratulations to Phil and Pat

With the dinner using much less than half the available space it showed all present what is possible within this facility.

Donations to Hall of Fame

Donations towards the display area in the Hall of Fame are always welcome, please contact Gary Read on 0418 859 795. All donations will be used in the Hall of Fame area, and will be suitably recognised.

Future Developments

A major power upgrade, entry works and landscaping are on the drawing board at the moment. Further work is also being considered for a covered trade area to the east of the Hall. It is envisaged this will be an air-conditioned tilt-up slab building attached to the work shed of a size to hold all sponsors displays for firearms and ammunition. All existing sponsors were approached by myself in person during the Nationals regarding a proposal to help fund this and I must say we only received positive responses.

Insurance

I have relayed previously the likelihood of significant increases to insurance costs ongoing. We have received no advice on increases as yet but I can pass on that the cover of \$25,000 of personal firearms insurance offered by the SSAA to its members has just increased from a cost of \$25 on top of their membership to \$30 on top of their membership ie an increase of 20%.

ACTA membership still provides \$12,000 at no extra cost within the membership fee and the ability to increase the cover to \$25,000 for just an extra \$10 on top of your membership. This combined with the \$60 Recreational membership is excellent value for the casual non-competition shooter. If all clubs availed themselves of this valuable membership class for non-competitive shooters both the club, all shooters and the Association would be much better represented and protected.

Commonwealth Games

Laetisha Scanlan winning the Gold in the Ladies Trap event at the Games was the highlight for clay target shooters, and congratulations Laetisha.

To date the decision to remove shooting from the next Games has not been overturned. The ICTSF (made up mostly of Commonwealth Countries) has recommended to the Commonwealth Shooting Federation that they consider hosting an event at the same time as the Games at a venue as close to the games city as possible to try and showcase our sport. To date we have not had a reply.

Mackintosh Trophy

It was pleasing during the World DTL to be able to socialise with Amateur Trapshooting Association of America Vice-President Mike Herman and his family. Mike and his party shot most of the National events and the World DTL and took a great interest in the Mackintosh trophy. The ACTA has since written to Mike inviting the ATA to take part in the Mackintosh in future years and even consider joining the ICTSF to compete as a Nation at the World DTL.

Many may not be aware that Canada competes annually for the Mackintosh Trophy, and has actually won the Open section but is not an ICTSF member body. This is because although now loosely under the ICTSF banner, the Mackintosh Trophy pre dates the formation of the ICTSF by almost 70 years and is owned and administered by the ACTA.

CTSN

The major cost associated with the magazine is the postage. This cost has again risen by approximately 20 cents per copy per month. A review of the CTSN will need to be conducted to assist in determining the magazine's future as a mailed product.

The production of the magazine is our largest expense item and so its future is not guaranteed as a posted product when there are so many cheaper ways to provide its content to the membership. One thought is that we would achieve more with it being provided electronically in the existing format ie: it would look the same. The savings on printing and postage could then be diverted to the employment of an Operations person who would have the administration of social media platforms as part of, but not their entire role.

New Lease

There is an area 30 metres wide along the entire length of the Northern Boundary of the National Ground that council would not sell to the ACTA when the grounds were purchased. It was retained by Council for a future possible flood mitigation levee, and was covered by a short term lease to the ACTA. Recent flood modelling with current data is showing that it will probably never be needed for its originally intended purpose. I have signed a new 25 year lease over this portion of the grounds that includes a First Right of Refusal if the portion is made available for sale. Indications are that if ongoing flood modelling continues along current lines the block will eventually be available for outright purchase by the ACTA, further securing your National Ground.

Executive Officer's Report

The 2018 DTL Nationals and the 13th ICTSF World Championships were successfully conducted from the 17th of March through to 27th March. The full review of the Nationals is in this edition whilst we have decided on a "Digital Supplement" to showcase the World DTL Championships. This will be available online through the ACTA and ICTSF websites. This supplement will be downloadable in full colour including teams and individual winners as well as a pictorial history of the event.

The National event was very well supported, however to put numbers in context we had over 150 withdrawals from the Nationals and over 100 from the Worlds, these numbers certainly played havoc with nominations and attendances at the end of the day.

Both events were professionally conducted with feedback from our International visitors and members glowing in the presentation of the events through to conclusion in very good time. There were very few re-squads which really assisted the Shoot Marshals in finalising each day's events.

Presentations were a huge feature of this year's events with well over 500 people in attendance every night, the catering services and the bar were an attractive proposition at the end of each day. The ability to seat and accommodate so many people gives the presentations and the recipients the credit they deserve. The opportunity to be presented with trophies in front of so many people was a highlight.

The new clubhouse was made available for the events through the tireless work of many tradesmen over the final weeks and many "volunteers" who turned up early for the event and assisted with such things as unpacking and preparation of the furniture, kitchen equipment and various other projects in order to get the clubhouse ready. To all of those people a huge thank you.

Many members would not be aware that our long serving groundsman David Jocelyn has had to resign due to ill health. David was placed on sick leave four weeks prior to the event, we covered David's position with a great deal of help provided by Fred Rapley and Barry Hall in distributing the voice releases and setting up the range for competition. Mitch Robinson was thrown in the deep end with the mowing and watering of the ground, a capable replacement in the short term. Not only helping on the ground, he assisted trades in the building of the clubhouse as well. David's position has now been advertised on the ACTA Facebook site and in the local paper, the Daily Advertiser. We wish David well in his retirement and hope his health improves in the future.

I wish to thank and introduce our licensed caterers Nathan and Danette Gale, who will be the operators of the catering and hold the liquor licence to the clubhouse. I have worked with Nathan and Wagga Catering Services for many years and fully endorse them as professional caterers of the highest standard. This fits with the presentation of the new building as a first class venue for functions, conferences and many other activities that the Association is dealing with now on a regular basis. The Hall of Fame function was catered for and is a vindication of the quality of the venue and the service it will provide in the future.

The Opening of the 13th World DTL Championships was another highlight with the Kapooka Army Band playing the Australian and the National anthem of all participating countries as well. Their jazz ensemble also playing in the club for the duration of the opening cocktail party.

The Stone the Crows RV/Caravan Festival was conducted immediately following the Worlds and the Nationals. We had over 500 RV/caravans/motor homes on the National ground and the block next to the National Office until Friday the 6th April and they were ecstatic with the new facilities. The selling features of the building through word of mouth will ensure we capitalise on the opportunities that will present themselves over many years to come.

Over the course of the past two weeks we have fielded many enquiries and there has also been enquiries made through the local tourism arm of Wagga Wagga City Council and through the regional tourism arm. All of these entities have now viewed the clubhouse and detailed the benefits of using the venue for events being bought to the city. The ACTA is currently waiting on the dividing walls to be delivered and installed, this however does not stop the ACTA taking bookings into the future. The small issues identified within the building will be the focus over the next month to ensure the building is finished to the high standard that it was designed.

On a sad note as well as groundsman David retiring, we have also been advised by Fred Rapley that this will be his last year as the trap mechanic. Fred has taken Barry Hall under his wing and worked with Barry for the past 18 months to have him take over the role at the National Ground. Fred has been a tireless worker for the ACTA over many years. Replacing people of this calibre is impossible, we know Barry will do a good job. Fred however will be sadly missed.

Frank Auditore has also advised this was his last National Trap event. Frank has developed and provided his Shoot-Master scoring and scoreboard program taking it to the ACTA website through his development of the program, live scores are now available through the website for all members to follow National events, all at no cost to the Association or our Clubs. Frank is the man behind the scenes providing data and scores to the Shoot Marshals and Tournament Director as well as through live scores. His accuracy is required to ensure we get all of the grades, sections and overall winners correct. This is not an easy task taking into account the sections can have numerous categories and sections to be sorted as well as grades and shoot-offs. Frank is another person who will be very hard to replace.

As with all organisations and entities there is always change coming, this is part of growing the organisation. If we are not growing we are going backwards. Investment in the future is a requirement not an option. There are many opportunities to be assessed in the future, there needs to be a consistent plan going forward over the next ten years. Planning for these developments should be an ongoing evolution of the sport and the business model adopted. The current building will provide an income stream in the future, we now have to decide where do we go next?

What is the future of the Association and our members, where do we want to be as an Association when the next World DTL Championships roll around in 12 years time???. Do we want to be a leader or a follower.

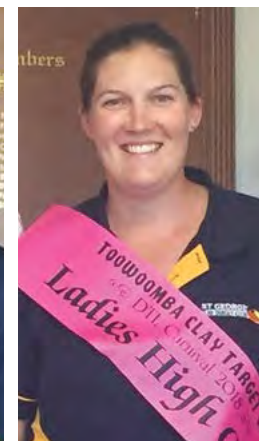

Psychological Skills for Shooting

When it matters, be in the Zone

At the 2018 Nationals a large crowd witnessed, Vicki McDonagh, a local Wagga C grade shooter win the National Handicap in extremely windy and dusty conditions. This was a great achievement: her first 50 targets straight and a win against some of Australia's and New Zealand's most formidable shooters.

When she was asked how she felt and what it was like she described all the components of being in the 'zone'. The concept of being in the 'zone' or 'the flow', is widely discussed in the literature of sport psychology, and is a state that many athletes strive to achieve but cannot achieve it over and over again.

The research and literature tells us there are eight mental and physical conditions that have been identified by athletes as being characteristics of the feelings they have at those moments when they are doing something extraordinarily well;

- Being mentally relaxed or in a state of inner calm. Sometimes this can be described as the sense of time being slowed down and having a high degree of concentration.
- Being physically relaxed so that muscles feel loose and fluid.
- Confident /optimistic; feelings of self-confidence, being optimistic and positive about our own performance. This is very important during challenging times within the competition.
- Focused on the present. Shooting is a here and now sport and we feel a sense of harmony when the body and mind is able to work as one unit. So in order for the body to perform here and now, our minds must also be in the here and now. This means shooting this target and not the one missed (in the past) or not the ones in the shoot off (in the future). By controlling the thoughts about the future and the past the body can perform automatically without conscious or deliberate mental effort.
- Highly energised. A high energy state is frequently described as feelings of joy, ecstasy, intensity or being 'hot'.
- Extraordinary awareness: A state of mind that allows the athlete to be acutely aware of their own bodies and of those around them.
- In control. The body and mind seem to do automatically what is right without the need to exert or impose control.
- In the cocoon. This involves feelings of detachment from the external environment and any potential distractions, where the athlete has complete access to one's powers and skills.

The eight qualities listed above are those that are evident when athletes reach peak performance. But there is a difference between being a very good club competitor and being a national champion. Williams (1993) continues and describes a psychological construct referred to as flow. Flow was defined by Csikszentmihalyi when the challenge equals skill level, when one knows what to do, one has clear goals, deep concentration, a sense of being in control, and a sense of loss of time; and the activity becomes automatic.

So, what its listed above is what we would all like to achieve, all the time, and if I knew the secret of how to continually achieve it, I wouldn't have to work again. Being in the 'zone' is just a by-product of reaching your Ideal Performance State. Mark Brownlee uses the term, Ideal Performance State, because it is less ambiguous than the 'zone'.

Brownlee argues that focusing on being in the 'zone' is fraught with problems. Firstly, that even though trying to do several things at once is desirable, it actually creates distractions and disrupts performance. Secondly, we should always be aiming for peak or perfect performances. Because peak performances are rare, expecting perfection leads to worry and frustration that deprives us of the

enjoyment and motivation that is required to overcome difficulties and improve our skills. Finally, Brownlee talks about mindfulness. Mindfulness is the opposite to multitasking and means focusing your attention so that you are absorbed in the activity to the exclusion of everything else.

Now, armed with the information that Csikszentmihalyi believes is apparent for peak performances, Brownlee has put together the mental and physical attributes that result in consistently high performance in sport. To experience the Ideal Performance State the shooter must be;

- Focused in the present: in the moment.
- Breathing properly and relaxed, with the right level of muscle tension.
- Energised and alert: being in a sense of calm-alertness or serene intensity.
- Free of self-consciousness and ego: not worrying about others.
- Confident: that they must feel mental and physically prepared to perform well.
- Directing concentration and awareness only to what is needed to perform well.
- Always using positive and instructive self-talk and eliminating negative self-talk.

As you can see Csikszentmihalyi's conditions and Brownlee's attributes are basically the same. What is different is that Brownlee sees them as mental skills that can be planned for, practiced and achieved more regularly, that make up our own "ideal performance state".

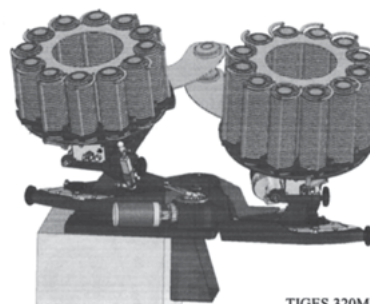

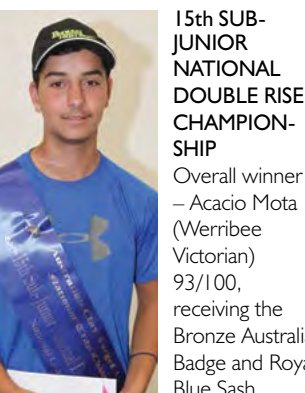

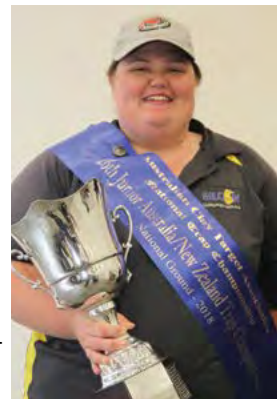

ACTA NEWS

INCORPORATION

The rules relating to incorporated bodies are slightly different in each State of Australia, however many rules and obligations are the same. All clubs should be incorporated under the ACTA Constitution but, they also have their own Constitution.

Club office holders, delegates and members should know their Constitution or have access to it. It is not expected that everyone knows the Constitutions that govern you off by heart, however a basic understanding of the rules and regulations is advantageous as these are the governing documents of your Club, and or State.

Your Constitution cannot be at odds with your affiliated State and National Body, the governing body rules are the overriding rules of all affiliated members of the Association. Constitutions are a valuable and necessary document to protect the Association and its members. There are also statutory requirement and legal obligation included in the reporting process in regard to reporting of financial statements and Audits, again these differ from State to State. It is important that your Club understands these requirement, as ignorance is no defence when things go wrong.

Brian Noel Vercoe, "Basil" 9th April 1943 – 11th March 2018

It is with great sadness that I am writing to advise you of the passing of Brian Noel Vercoe affectionately known as Basil.

Basil passed away suddenly on the 11th March and was laid to rest on Saturday the 17th March beside his beloved wife Eunice, here on Norfolk Island.

Many of you will remember Basil from your visits to Norfolk Island for our International Shoot, or his many visits to the New Zealand Nationals.

Basil was born in Te Puke, New Zealand, on the 9th April 1943 he was 74 years old and only weeks away from his 75th birthday.

Basil travelled extensively throughout NZ and Australia, before he arrived on Norfolk Island in 1970. He worked as a carpenter and was involved in building many of the Islands larger accommodation houses and shops. As time progressed, Basil started his own building company and along with his good friend, Gary Holland continued to build many of the Islands quality houses. He was renowned for his kind heart and in the great Kiwi spirit, assisted many Island residents by carrying out building work at no charge.

Basil was an inaugural member of the Norfolk Island Clay Target, and brought about mainly through boredom and the need to shoot something, worked tirelessly into making the club into what it is today. He was president for 30 years and had a month earlier overseen and organised the clubs 38th International shoot. His dedication to our club was immeasurable, his commitment to assisting young and new shooters amazing. He was proud of his club and the members. He supported us all and you could see him glowing with pride whenever any of us stepped up and performed over and above our norm.

Basil is a great loss to the shooting community and as you will all remember his dedication and skill that he brought to Clay Target Shooting. His shooting skills were well known and many of the best have fallen prey to his talent and his high held Perazzi.

Through his years he has competed around the World, he travelled to Edinburgh to be part of the first Norfolk Island team to compete in the Commonwealth Games, the following Games in Auckland he also competed in. He was the Norfolk Island Flag Bearer at both games. He has travelled the Pacific shooting for Norfolk competing in the Pacific Games, of which he called the Commonwealth Games of the Pacific. He returned from all these games with many medals. Norfolk Island also held the Mini Pacific Games in 2001 in which he loved competing in and being part of the Pacific culture on his own little Island.

In the earlier years he travelled to Japan, Canada, and New Caledonia, competing and bringing home his fair share of medals.

Basil travelled to Christchurch with almost half the club to compete in the World Championships, he exceeded himself that year shooting the possible and then a further 462 targets. Ending up 5th in the world.

Basil travelled to NZ every year for over 30 years competing in the NZ Nationals. He was always squad 1. He rarely came home without a medal or two. He was well known by many and he always looked forward to catching up with you all whilst there.

The Norfolk Island International was his heart, whilst he loved shooting, his real joy every February was the comradeship of visiting shooters. He made life time friendships with many of you. He treasured and cherished these friendships more than you would know. He loved the Kiwi night at the end of the shoot, where he could sit back with a few VB's or a whiskey and relax after a long week with his friends before they departed home.

Basil was a wonderful man with a huge heart. He will be deeply missed not



only by the shooting community but by his friends here on Norfolk and afar. The memories of this great man will never be forgotten.

On behalf of his daughter Suzy and the Norfolk Island Clay Target Assn. we wish to thank firstly his friends who made the trip to be with Basil at his passing. To his many friends who wanted to be here at this sad time but alas could not be, our heartfelt thanks to you and we know you were here with us in your hearts. And to all who sent emails, letters and cards of condolences, a huge thank you. Your beautiful words were a huge comfort.

In closing, farewell our dear friend, rest in peace now. Thanks for all the memories . . . you will be forever in our hearts.

How does the ACTA operate?

The ACTA structure is as follows. The ACTA Executive has delegated power to the Management Sub-Committee to make recommendations to the full Executive on matters raised through the reporting systems in place. Management Sub-Committee and Executive members can bring agenda items to the Management Sub-Committee at any time through providing briefing papers clearly setting out the items they wish to raise. These items make up the agenda for meetings conducted on a regular basis and at times when urgent business is received at short notice. State Associations can also bring matters to the Management Sub-Committee through their State meetings and through their delegates to the National Executive or to the Executive Officer.

Once the Management Sub-Committee has met on the agenda items they make recommendations to the full Executive for approval by the full Executive. This process takes quite a deal of time not only be decided but acted upon.

The decisions of the Executive once approved are documented in minutes then placed on the ACTA website. The ACTA National office staff do not make these decisions, the full Executive make these decisions and the staff carry out the decisions of the Executive.

If a registered shooter is looking to have an issue addressed in relation to the sport there is a process to go through. Matters should be directed to the Club in the first instance. Mostly these will be resolved at the Club in line with your constitution.

For National matters, they should be addressed in writing to your club. The Club may be able to address many of the questions you have, should the Club not be able to resolve your issue they can then forward or place on the Zone agenda for discussion and determination, should this not resolve the issue then it should be referred by the Zone to the State Association. The State, if not able to resolve the issue or be able to deal with the issue under their own constitution should send the item through their State delegates to the National Office to be placed on the agenda.

Whilst on the protocols for contact with the National Body, it is important to remember the role of the National Rules Supervisor and the National Handicapper. These volunteers give their time to work with the National body to assist in their specific areas.

The first action to be taken when you have a rules or handicapping issue is to talk to your club. The club may wish to refer this to the Zone for clarification or to the State Handicapper, Referee Examiner or State Rules Supervisors, these people can sort out your concerns.

If the concerns cannot be adequately addressed the State Rules Supervisor and or Handicapper can then contact the relevant National official. Where possible it is important to put these concerns in writing detailing the facts. A written request is so much easier to deal with as the issues and resolutions are then in writing and there is no ambiguity.

As with any rule book or handicapping system in any sport there will be grey areas. All enquiries or disputes will be adjudicated at all times by the National Office based on the written rules in each case.

Advertisers must comply with the copy deadlines as detailed on page 2 of this issue, and your name, address and telephone number must be supplied. Copy should be typed or carefully hand-written.

Payment must accompany advertisement.

NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
