Many shooters recorded personal best scores and attendance at presentations was at a new level with almost all competitors enjoying the new facility after the completion of the day's events.

The Skeet Hall of fame Dinner saw the induction of Gil Farish. Congratulations Gil. All agreed the dinner was of a much higher standard than previous and I have passed on our thanks to our caterers, Nathan and Danette Gale.

It is almost inevitable that we forget someone, and after reading the hard copy of the last CTSN it was obvious that we did not mention Charlie Strike and his helpers who looked after the gun vault at the World DTL. With over 300 firearms in storage at times it is a very onerous task and coupled with the strict compliance requirements and the need to be available from early each morning until after the conclusion each evening, it is not a job to be taken lightly. Executive Officer's Report

It seems like a long time since we conducted the World and National Trap events, following these events the Commonwealth Games was also conducted on the Gold Coast and surrounding districts.

Congratulations to Laetisha Scanlan on her back to back win in the Ladies Trap event taking out Gold to compliment her Gold Medal from Glasgow in 2014. Laetisha has been a very consistent performer over the past ten years having also represented the ACTA in the ICTSF World DTL Championships in South Africa in 2010 before commencing her domination in ISSF Ladies Trap.

Emma Cox took Silver in the Ladies Double Trap, this is the last Silver Medal for the discipline as it has now been removed from ISSF competition. Emma overcame some personal misfortune and illness leading into the Commonwealth Games, however still performed at an elite level.

We congratulate our entire team who contested events at the Commonwealth Games: Laetisha Scanlan, Catherine Skinner, Laura Coles, Aislin Jones, James Willett, Thomas Grice, Mitchell Iles, Emma Cox, Gay Shale, James Bolding and Paul Adams.

Whilst there are World Cups and World Championships over the next two years this team and those on the cusp of selection will be eyeing Olympic selection and concentrating on the requirements to be selected for these positions. The criteria is on the Shooting Australia website. As the competition for places heats up the participants have the opportunity to set themselves up for selection by being the best performer over the next two years in qualifying events. We wish them all well in their quest for selection.

The ACTA has now appointed a new groundsman, with Marcus Pim taking up the role. Marcus has a long history in ground maintenance and design so his skills will be of great benefit to the ACTA as we continue to develop the National Ground and the Function Centre. Marcus has been around the sport all his life although he does not compete. Marcus I am sure will be a valuable asset to the Association for the foreseeable future.

The ACTA will soon be advertising for an operations manager to take responsibility for the Function Centre and functions operations for National events. This position will also cover the growing Social Media portfolio, and Marketing of the ACTA. With enquiries continuing to come to the National Office for use of the venue it is important that we market and promote the venue and meet with local and regional tourism bodies to maximise our exposure in the market.

The National Executive Annual Meeting is being conducted on Thursday 23rd, Friday 24th and Saturday 25th August. The meeting will be conducted at the National Office with an agenda to be prepared by the 17th August. If a Club, Zone or State has agenda items they wish to have put forward they can do so through their National delegate or through their State. Agenda items should be accompanied by a briefing paper. One of the major items on the agenda is the current and future membership structure, there are many opinions on how this may work, we look forward to seeing these submissions, bearing in mind the viability of the Association is the number one priority.

I will ask a couple of questions leading into the meeting, so those who have an opinion may be prompted into action. Why do we have so many categories? Should we not all pay the same to be members of the same organisation? Should we all not get the same benefits?

One of the situations we constantly face is requests for members of other organisations to shoot on ACTA affiliated ranges. The fact is under

our constitution all persons shooting on ACTA ranges must be ACTA members. Our Insurers and Solicitors advise this is the case. The ACTA by requiring clubs to comply with this section of the constitution are doing so to protect office bearers and members of clubs. Insurance is only ever used in the case of accident, however if a club is operating outside the ACTA constitution they may very well void their insurance. The ACTA is here to act in the best interests of OUR members, not those of other organisations.

Whilst stating these facts we are still in constant dialogue with other organisations to further progress to the day when we may all be more closely aligned. How that looks in the future is for discussion. One thing is constant, all shooting organisations have their own "area of interest" and as such do not wish to dilute any of their power base. We all have many commonalities, firearms licences, shotguns in particular and targets in most cases.

An area of concern is the length of licences and length of membership of shooting organisations. There has been discussion over the past month in regard to the possibility of gun licences requiring the person to be a member of a National organisation for the period of the licence. This, at this point in time has not been confirmed, however it would have benefits and drawbacks already identified, as we look at the possibilities of what may happen in the future.

Rule Clarification

COMPLETION OF WEATHER IMPACTED EVENTS

Early in May I was alerted to an incident that occurred at a major Carnival that necessitated an event that was already in progress, being postponed because of weather conditions until the following day.

Although this is not a common occurrence within ACTA competition the procedure is clearly spelt out in the Rule Book.

In this reported incident, the event had been started with 3 squads having already shot, when due to extremely inclement weather the shoot was called off for the day. As the Carnival was scheduled to run into the following day it was appropriate that the event be completed then and competitors were notified of this.

However the following day, after a Club Delegates meeting it was decided to restart the event from scratch and the first squads, having already shot the day before were called upon to shoot again.

Although I can accept that perhaps the Committee, concerned that the squads who had shot the evening before may have been disadvantaged because of the weather and made the decision to restart the event in good conscience, the decision was in fact absolutely incorrect. The circumstances for postponing an event because of bad weather is clearly described under Rule: Management 4.15c. (See following)

4.15 MANAGEMENT

- (c) Should darkness, bad weather, or other cause interfere with the competition, the Management shall have the right to decide when and how the competition shall be **completed**. If postponed the event must be completed within one calendar month. Any competitor who defaults in respect of such postponed competition forfeits all his rights and standing therein.

2018 Universal Trench Series

What a season of Universal Trench 2018 turned out to be. Never in our wildest dreams did we expect this fun exciting discipline to take off in Australia as well as it has. This season we trialed a new online booking system where a shooter could not only enter online but select the squad number and shooting position they wished to start in. What a hit and god-send this proved to be for all concerned.

276 entries, 4 clubs, 2 new Australian records and 1 equal Australian record and a lot of fun was what happened in 2018.

We kicked off at Frankston Australian CTC with a record crowd of 95 shooters and having to cut the event back to 150 targets. While we know cutting targets back isn't ideal it is a good problem to have and we thank the shooters for their understanding. Some amazing scores were recorded with Danny Di Pietro and Vinnie Mollica shooting off with 147/150 and Danny coming out on top. Michelle Beecham won the ladies with 133 (apologies to Michelle for not having her listed as a winner in previous article), Thomas Armstrong last years Junior World Champ won Juniors with 145 and Phil Matthews Veterans with 143/150. A big thank you to FACTC and to Winchester Australia for sponsoring this round

Round 2 saw us return back to Cecil Park CTC in February and 70 shooters entered for the weekend. It was great to be able to use 3 layouts for the event ensuring the smooth running of the shoot. Some big scores were recorded over the first 150 targets and then the weather took a turn for the worse ensuring the \$1000 up for grabs from Shane Pinner and Andrew Brady for an Australian Record to be broken still remained. Charlton Vella came out on top with 195/200, Mitch Iles the Junior with 193, his grandfather Bill the Veterans with 187/200 and Suzy Corry the ladies with 185/200. Thank you Cecil Park and Bornaghi Australia for sponsoring the event.

Round 3 was held in March in Adelaide at the International Clay Target Club

with 43 shooters and proved to be a tough affair for most but not Nathan Cassells who recorded a truly world class score of 194/200 in some tough conditions to win by 3 targets from the ever improving Aaron Zupanic. Martin Collumb was the Veterans winner with a 190/200, Amanda Holt the ladies with a 182 and the juniors proved to be a great spectacle with Tom Armstrong and Nathan Argiro both tied on 186. In the shoot off both boys shot a clean round of 25 and then went to sudden death single barrel before Nathan came out on top a further 6 targets later. It was great to watch. A big thank to all involved at International CTC and Polyaire for their sponsorship.

Round 4 the final was held again at Melbourne Gun Club in April in some of the best conditions ever experienced for UT in Australia and boy did the records plummet. 68 shooters entered the event and it wasn't long till the red ink hit the scoreboard. At the end of the 200 tgts Matt Schiller from Young, NSW had extended the Australian Record of 196/200 out to 198 with a great display of UT shooting to win the Australian National Title. But the records didn't end there with Phil Matthews recording an excellent 193/200 to break the Australian Veterans record, Thomas Armstrong a 196/200 to equal the Junior Australian record and Suzy Corry a 187/200 to claim the ladies National Title. Some amazing shooting and a big thanks to everyone at Melbourne Gun Club and also Perazzi Australia for their support.

Nathan Cassells won the Mialls Gunshop prize for Overall High Gun and Aaron Zupanic won the Top Shot Industries award for the most improved. Well done guys.

SACTA State Trap Carnival

State Shooting Park, February 1 – 4, 2018



It's unbelievable that another year has already passed us by. Yes, almost 12 months to the day, and we are here again at the South Australian Clay Target Association State Trap Carnival. This year from Thursday February 1st through to Sunday February 4th sees again the Carnival extended to be 4 days of competition, based on the success of last year's inaugural reintroduction of the State Champion of Champions.

A good decision on behalf of the State Board, 22 squads attended on this extra day last year, and we're going to see if we can top that for 2018.

By Wednesday afternoon, the grounds of the State Shooting Park were already buzzing with activity as the usual caravanners and campers arrived, getting themselves a favourable vantage spot for the 4 days of shooting competitions. All the Trade stands were being erected with lots of great goodies on show for everyone to feast their eyes on and buy. Attendances from nearly every State this year came in at a record equalling 209 guns over the 4 days of competition, all vying to try their skill at claiming one of the many 'Red' State sashes that were on offer.

Temperatures for the 4 days were going to be reasonably comfortable in the high 20's to low 30's. The days leading up to the Carnival were quite scary earlier in the week with temperatures reaching 43 + 44 degrees only a couple of days ago, and we all had thought of how awful it was a couple of years ago when the Carnival had to be run in similar temperatures. In the background, everyone was out there practicing to make sure they had a psychological edge and to be sure they were used to the background of the various layouts that were being used before the competitions starting tomorrow at 11am.

Early on Thursday morning the officials were running around in a scurry of activity while final checks were being done to the layouts – angles, heights, distances and speeds. To this part, a word of thanks has to go out to the 'Chair' of the Championships Committee (Steve Baynes) and his committed team for overseeing trap set-ups over the 4 days. Friends that hadn't seen each other for ages were seen all over the park having a good laugh, telling stories and catching up on the last 12 months. Most interstate visitors came in with their families for the events, and this certainly made for a large crowd of onlookers and a great ambience at the grounds.

Even the office was a flurry of activity as we made sure everything was in readiness, especially the important stuff like all the lollies being in their respective bowls for the staff (very important)!! The grounds had been manicured nicely for our competitors, so that everyone could have a great 4 days of competing without a worry in the world. The office was prepared for the rush of shooters at the ticket window and with nominations and squadding on cue, right

on 11am sharp, 120 competitors (20 squads) started to get called and filed out to the walks to contest the 1st event which was the 75tgt State 'Champion of Champions'. Lurking around every corner and walking amongst us you could see some of the best shooters in Australia waiting to pounce and claim one of the available 'Red' State title sashes. After shoot-offs, when all had gone quiet, the results were counted and came out as follows: C Grade 1st went to Ilario Dimasi 98/125, and 2nd was Richard Warden. B Grade 1st went to Harry Cranendonk 110/125, and 2nd was Ray Mack. A Grade winner was Kelvyn Prescott 119/125, followed by Anthony Varchione in 2nd place. AA 1st was taken by Acacio Mota with a well shot 122/125, with Jack Cullinan 2nd place. The Junior winner, Acacio Mota, Veteran winner Robert Andrews and the highest scoring Lady was Lisa Hawker. The Overall Open for this event was taken by a very happy Clayton Cusack with the only perfect score of 125/125.

Presentations were all over by 4pm and a great day was had by all. For only the 2nd time of holding a 4-day Carnival, the evidence is there and competitors have spoken with their feet by showing up in large numbers making for a very successful Thursday. Everyone started to head to their accommodation for a relaxing break before tackling tomorrow's events.

Friday morning came around and everyone was excited about the next event which was the 25 pair State Double Rise Championship. 119 shooters came out to contest the event in near perfect conditions, which were calm with only a light breeze and temperatures around the low to mid 20's. However, by the time the shoot-off's started, it was a bit blowie which made the targets a little tricky for the shooters. It was over fairly quickly and when the final results came

in, they looked like this: C Grade winner was Charlie Noto 41/50, and 2nd went to Tristan McKinnon. B Grade was won by a Rino Rossi 49/60, while Luke Batten took 2nd. A Grade 1st was taken by Harry Clark on 54/60, with 2nd place going to John Hawker. AA was won by Jarred Nicholls 57/60, and 2nd went to Patrick Guida. Veteran winner was Max Medhurst, Ladies was Sara Kosch and the Junior winner was Acacio Mota. The Overall State title went to Darryn Nicholls with a near perfect 49/50. Congratulations Darryn!

No sooner had the shoot-offs finished, the first wave of squads were called out for the 50tgt. State Handicap. Squad sheets were already out for the 128 competitors so everyone started getting kitted up and at 11.30 we started the rounds to get through 33 squads of shooters. Conditions started to change as we got a bit further into the day with the afternoon winds that prevail here to contend with. As everyone came off, they were 3 and 4 deep at the scoreboard to see what the damage was, and how they had fared up. Eventually, everything went quiet and the shoot-offs went to the grounds to decide the top 5 positions. Targets were starting to head up to the heavens, with the gusty breezes swinging around to be face on.

The final results were: 5th Michael Veenstra 68/70, 4th Patrick Guida 50/52, 3rd Kane Hawker 68/70, 2nd Rino Rossi 75/77, (earning himself and extra 1m) and then finally the Overall winner of the South Australian State Handicap

title for 2018 was Harry Clark with a well shot 76/77 and also earning himself the privilege of 2 extra metres. Congratulations Harry!

When Saturday morning started off, it was another nice clear day. There was a heap of activity at the ticket window as a rush of competitors came through to nominate for the important qualifying events of the final 2 days. At 8.30am sharp the 50tgt State Single Barrel Championship got started with 200 entrants (32 squads). After all was said and done Kane Hawker took out C Grade with 45/51, and John Clark was 2nd. B Grade went to Frank Caltagirone 48/50, and 2nd was Ray Mack. A Grade was won by Phil Mules 49/50, and 2nd went to Allan Vilcins. AA Grade went to Craig Bentley 55/56, and 2nd was Andrew Evans. Taking the Red State Single Barrel sash and Overall title this year with a perfect score of 56/56 was Des Mills. Great effort to stay focussed. Veteran went to Gary Hayden, Ladies winner was Lisa Hawker and the Junior was Acacio Mota.

Most of the competitors got to have a small break here while the South Australian Zone teams came out to contest their titles. Open winners were Western Zone with 122 targets shot out of 125 and 375 points. Team members were Billy Baynes, Kym Firth, Darryn Nicholls, Matt Wilson, Ted Stringer & Liam Morgan. The Veteran Team winners were the Eastern Zone with 73 targets. This team was made up of Steve Chambers, Bob Andrews & Bob Crane. The Junior winning team came from Central Zone on 70 targets. This team was Jack Tapscott, Harry Cranendonk & Molly Bretag. Central Zone also took out the Ladies with 67 targets. The team was made up of Tania Evans, Lisa Smith & Layne Pontifex. Well done to everyone who competed and congratulations to all the Zone winners.

Presentations were done to all the Single Barrel winners at this point, as well as calling up the South Australian Hall of Fame inductee Matt Stokes, who has a world of achievements as was expressed in a magnificent recital to all present, by SACTA Patron, Kelvyn Prescott. Matt has certainly worked his way through some of the highest areas in the shooting world to represent Australia and earn his points to qualify for this very prestigious accolade. A very grateful Matt, thanked everyone, as well as the State, as he was presented with his blue Blazer.

At this point, SACTA President Garry Read asked Kelvyn back to the presentation area. After so many years of dedicated commitment and service to this sport, Kelvyn was awarded a SACTA Life Membership. A very surprised and humbled Kelvyn expressed his love for the sport and what an honour it has been to serve in so many ways over the years. We congratulate you and thank you for your knowledge and continued support in your area of expertise.

Finally, the battle was on for the 50tgt State Double Barrel Championship. With the light

The conditions eased during the afternoon and the targets were just floating nicely. As the crowds watched from the fence line, at 7.45pm they were down to the last 2.

FUTURE ISSF CHAMPIONSHIPS: PRE-NOMINATION ONLY FROM 2019

The ACTA Executive has agreed to move into line with ISSF events held throughout the world by moving to a Pre-nomination format only. Whilst this is now the only way to enter the National events the vast majority of shooters already Pre-nominate, so the change should not impact anyone.

FUTURE PROGRAM

With the removal of Double Trap from the ISSF calendar the ACTA will review all aspects of the National Championships at their meeting in August 2018.

The program whilst dropping the double trap will need to accommodate the decision to increase the ladies events to the same target numbers as the Men, however still shooting separately throughout the Championships. This will result in substantial changes to the program and format.

DATE OF 2019 CHAMPIONSHIPS

A proposal to move the 2019 and future National ISSF Championships will be the subject of a review. Suitable times to conduct the event have been proposed with the Expansion Committee expected to provide a proposal for the consideration of the full Executive at the August 2018 meeting. - No cover will be provided under this policy where the insured, or any other person or entity the equipment has been entrusted to, has breached any law relating to either the storage or use of the firearm(s.)

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Goal setting: an uninteresting but essential topic

I have been writing these articles for the CTSN since 1999. Some have also appeared in the New Zealand Magazine, *Gunshot*. Over the years I have met some great people who

have taken the opportunity to positively comment on the articles and in the process made some valuable friends.

At the 2018 Trap Nationals and the World Championships, I meet a number of people who took the opportunity to ask me questions: some specific and some more general about the psychology of shooting. Even though the weather was awful, and my shooting not much better, talking to shooters about their shooting and how to improve made it a great time.

Some of the original articles, written back in the nineties are now getting old. This doesn't mean that they are not correct, but they may only reflect the research at the time. With that thought in mind, I will be revisiting some of the topics covered over the past 18 years and where possible incorporate some more recent research.

Some topics, and aspects of those topics, however will not change.

In this article I want to explore goal setting. As the title says it is an uninter-

esting but essential topic. If we want to improve or achieve a significant milestone, then we need to set goals and develop a plan to meet these goals. Most of what you will read next, may not be new but I am hoping it will be in a different format to what you already know and will move you toward doing some personal research or at least developing goals.

Firstly, goals need to be **specific, observable and measurable**. Setting general goals such as improving your grade or percentage is easy but becomes hard to work out how to do this without specific criteria or objectives.

Secondly, all goals should have a clearly defined **time** constraint. Time constraint means have an objective of how long before you should reach your goal and how to monitor your performance.

Next, use **moderately difficult** goals. When Edwin Locke developed his Goal Setting theory back in the sixties he found there was better performance from athletes who chose difficult goals as opposed to those that chose easier goals. This is still borne by current research. Goals need to be defined in three types: Process goals (how you complete the task), performance goals (how well you did) and outcome goals (what was the product).

Fourthly, **write goals down and regularly monitor progress**.

Goal Type	Poorly written goals	Rewritten and improved goals
Process	1. improve my score on hitting righthand swingers	1. focus on moving the body rather than arms to shoot righthand swingers
Performance	2. improve my percentage	2. Focus on hitting the next target
Outcome	3. improve score from last years Nationals	3. Focus on reducing stress in major competitions by focusing on breathing and process of shooting

The focus here is to concentrate on the process of shooting the target and let the outcome (score) look after itself.

After each practice session or competition, you may need to revisit where you are up to in achieving your goals.

Next, **use short-term goals to achieve longer-term plans**. If your goal is to make a state or national team then use the goal of shooting well at club championships or zone carnivals to practice the skills need to achieve the longer-term goals.

It is important to **set practice goals as well as competition goals**. It is a waste of time and money if you do not have a plan of what you want to achieve in practice sessions.

Another step is to make sure the **goals are internalized by the athlete**. By setting your own goals you are in control of the process and the outcomes. This will make it easier to commit to a workable plan. If someone else, decides your goals you will be less likely to make sure they are achieved.

The eighth step is to determine **goals based on your personality**. We are all different and our goals have to reflect our individual differences in what we want to achieve. Are you task or process orientated (comparing your performance against yourself) or are you ego orientated (comparing your performance against others)?

The final aspect is that you have to **set positive goals**. This should be a no brainer. Goals should be framed such as 'hit this target', rather than have the goal of getting 45 out of 50 or 97 out of a hundred. Negative goals focus on missing rather than hitting every target.

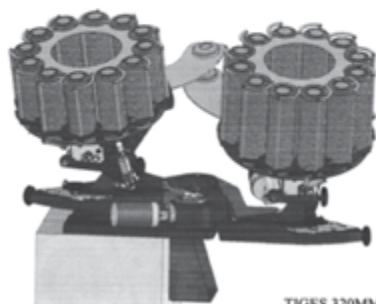

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Sporting Clays Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held or a member of another ICTSF affiliate.
2. Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
3. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
4. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
5. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
6. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
7. Shooters will be squaddled as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
8. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
9. Shooters who fail to appear on time for their squad may be re-squaddled towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
10. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
11. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
12. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
13. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
14. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
15. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
16. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
17. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
18. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
19. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$10.00. Nominations will close daily at 10 .00am.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to juniors and second family members, they being wives and husbands entering into the same event whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as a family member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 23. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.**
24. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
25. Upon application to the A.C.T.A office, refunds less a \$5.00 administration fee will be available. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with these conditions of entry.
26. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
27. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade prior to entering State and National Championships.
28. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorisation from the Tournament Director or Shoot Marshal.

The 13th ICTSF World DTL Championship held in Wagga Wagga on the 25th – 27th March 2018 resulted with Australia winning all Team categories as well as claiming another World DTL Champion in Frazer Roberts.

The Championship was a great success with entries initially making up a full capacity field. Unfortunately because of withdrawals, a replacement list which proved to be too small to fill the empty placings and the fact that nominations on the day were not allowed, a total of 722 competitors made up the final field.

Our International visitors were made up of 88 New Zealanders, 8 South Africans, 23 were from England, Wales had 5 competitors, Fiji 2, Ireland 13, French Polynesia 7, Northern Ireland 18 and France 5. We also had 6 competitors from the United States but these shooters were not able to compete in the Teams Match as the US is not a member of the ICTSF.

Of the 722 shooters 99 were Super Veterans, there were 173 Veterans 55-65, 122 Ladies and 102 Juniors and the grades were as follows; AA – 455, A – 164, B – 76 and C grade 27. The competition as expected was at a high standard following a very successful National Championship event. It was tight at the top of the leader board in all categories of the competition.

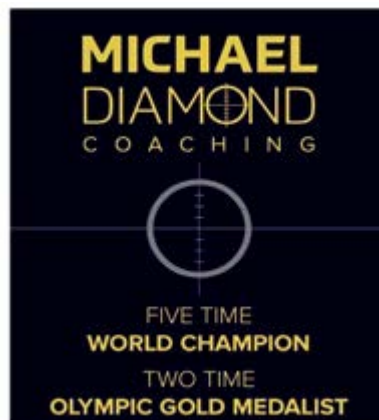

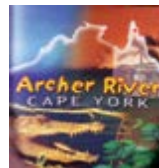

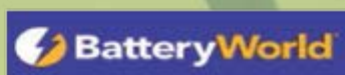

ACTA ACADEMY SKEET MINI-CAMP

With our ACTA Academy programme for our elite juniors it is always hard to gather the juniors together all in one place and at a mutual time for camps as they have school, apprenticeships, shooting competitions and work and family commitments. So I tried a different approach where I have gone out to the regions where these juniors are.

The first mini-camps held in April have been at Frankston and Toowoomba with a focus on the ACTA Academy skeet juniors prior to the Skeet Nationals in May. The mini-camps are intensive and not only focus on technical shooting skills (foot position, gun hold, balance etc.) but also mental toughness, competition preparation, goal setting and performance benchmarks. These mini camps have also worked out as a more economic option with just myself doing the travelling, the camps being shorter and the juniors don't travel so far. Factors important due to the removal of funding from Shooting Australia from the ACTA coaching programme and ACTA junior athlete development pathway.

The focus was not solely on the juniors as there were also coaching sessions available for the local shooters too. Toowoomba particularly had a good

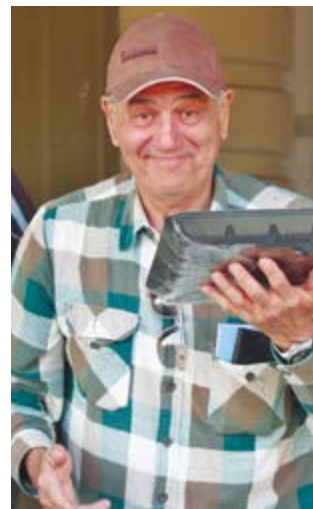

I will remember Pete as a kind, friendly and generous man who would go out of his way to make sure you were having a good time.

Peter J Strueber, two time Ohio ATA champion and 2008 state trap-shooting hall of fame enshrine, died Dec 29, the Dayton resident was 83.

He was state veteran champion in 2004 and senior vet titlist in 2008 both after scores of 199.

He earned many additional trophies at his state shoot, ATA Central Zone and Grand American and as a non resident. He competed at the Australia and New Zealand trap nationals and sponsored the Woods Point Gun Club in Australia, where in 2004 the 75tgt Double Barrel Strueber Buckle Shoot began.

He worked as a referee at the Grand and Ohio state tournaments. He was elected to The OSTA board in 1979, served as president in 1983 and held places on numerous committees.

An ATA life member since 1967, his second year in the sport, he registered totals of 142,750 singles, 89,650 handicap and 52,625 doubles.

Mr Strueber worked with automotive parts builders then in sales for Red Devil Tools. In 1970 he began his own business Repete Sales Co. Selling paint sundries and hardware tools for 25 years. After he closed the business in 1995, he was national and international sales manager for the Embree Corp. Until July 1999 when he retired.

He was a Navy veteran, spending two years in the submarine service and continuing in the reserves until 1963. He enjoyed hunting. In 2013 he was inducted into the Stivers High School Athletic Hall of Fame. At age 78, he joined his daughter and grandson in repelling 27 stories off the Key Bank Building in a fundraiser for Big Brothers and Big Sisters.

Survivors include Jacqueline, his wife of 61 years, plus two sons, one daughter, four grandchildren, a sister, and nieces and nephews.

Henry Samuel "Harry" Somers

31-8-1928 to 8-4-2018

Born in South Australia and raised on a dairy farm, Harry learned to shoot at an early age. As a young man he hunted and fished on the Murry River with his close mate Laurie Randall.

His interest in clay target shooting developed after his doctor advised him to find a hobby that he enjoyed for relaxation. He commenced shooting in the Melbourne area in the late 1960s. Rather than gain much relaxation he was soon an eager competitor and got heavily involved with the Melbourne Gun club committee where he served as shoot marshal.

In 1971 he travelled to Singapore and competed at the Pesta Sukan Games. In 1975 he moved to Sydney and joined the Royal Aero Club where he served on the committee.

Harry won many events over the years but he was particularly proud of two achievements, he won he won the National Champion of Champions at Perth in 1976 and in 1978 won the Royal Aero Club American 300, which reflected as being one of the more challenging shoots he had been to.

In 1984 he moved to Armidale NSW and became involved with the Guyra Gun Club.

Harry was an excellent trap mechanic and was a key member in the upgrading of the clubs facilities to six DTL layouts to secure the 1988 state trap carnival.

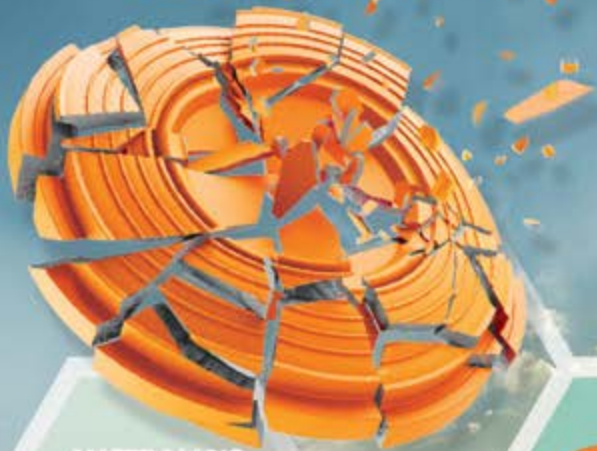
