# President's Notes

## Executive Meetings

The full Executive meets in late August and States are reminded to submit items for inclusion in the agenda which closes at the end of July. Membership categories, costs and entitlements will be high on the agenda.

## Sporting Nationals

These Nationals will be held immediately after the National Executive meeting and this will give some Executive members the opportunity to attend the event. A team will be selected to compete at the 5th ICTSF World English Sporting Championship to be conducted in Ireland next year. A great event and a great country to visit.

## Governance

The Association is subject to strict audits as part of its compliance with the Victorian Associations Incorporations Act under which the ACTA is incorporated. Due to the size of our asset base and turnover we are now placed in a higher "tier" for compliance purposes and may be subject to even stricter requirements. The Executive will be briefed on this and other matters by the Association auditors during the forthcoming Executive meetings.

## Membership

Various proposals will be put to the Executive regarding membership of the Association, what it means, costs etc. I believe the membership categories we have in place cater for all scenarios except that of the growing requirements of clubs hosting the sporting disciplines. This is the only ACTA discipline that is shot on a large scale by other associations and so presents a unique set of problems to the ACTA. Many ACTA clubs have practice in the sporting disciplines available throughout the week, and this is something not as readily available on other association grounds, creating demand. Many clubs also could increase attendance if it was allowable for members of other sporting type associations to attend and compete at their club shoots in the sporting disciplines. The ACTA needs to consider these circumstances carefully. There are various constitutional matters to contend with. Meetings with other associations instigated by the ACTA have been unsuccessful in providing a resolution satisfactory to all.

Having just attended the QCTA State Sporting Championships and having the opportunity to discuss these issues with various club representatives, I suggested the CPSA (the English Association) Day membership may be something to consider. This suggestion seemed acceptable to those I spoke with.

The CPSA day membership effectively signs a non-member up for a day by the payment of a fee that is split between the club and the Association. A new class of non-voting membership would need to be created with a by-law to allow this to take place. This membership could possibly allow members of other associations to compete at club level sporting competitions by the payment of a day fee. The fee is necessary to provide a range fee to the clubs, cover the cost of casual insurance and to provide an incentive to join your Association. This is a problem unique to sporting and so the category could be limited to the sporting discipline. Administration could be fairly simple with the club adding a tick box on nomination forms for Day membership, sighting the shooters respective membership card and then after the shoot, go to the ACTA website and remit half the fee collected. The club keeps the other half as the shooters contribution to the facility ie: a range fee.

This could alleviate the need for dual affiliations, the costs to clubs taking out their own insurances and the risks associated with having numerous insurers involved in the case of an incident.

All participants could then feel comfortable that they are fully protected by a nationally arranged insurance cover, and the club could feel comfortable that it is in compliance with the ACTA Constitution, gets a regular range fee towards its facility upkeep and has an increase in attendance at its club level shoots.

Another suggestion has been that we introduce a base level membership to join the ACTA and then a fee for each discipline the shooter may wish to register for. This would mean a significant saving to single discipline shooters but to balance the books would inevitably require an increase in fees for the member who shoots multi disciplines.

One of the problems with the Recreational Membership as it currently exists at \$60 per person is that fees imposed by some Zones and States add significantly to the membership cost. Some States and Zones have not imposed any state fee on this category in an attempt to encourage new participants and retain older members, and they should be commended for this.

There are a lot of issues in this area and we are keen to address them so the ACTA, and the clubs can flourish whilst being properly protected.

## Food for thought?

## National Ground

Very little stays still on the grounds and I am pleased to announce that the Wagga club has now signed a new agreement with the Association for their ongoing use of part of the grounds. The agreement recognises the history and the generous action of the club many years ago when they allowed the ACTA to take over the council lease for the establishment of your National Ground. It also brings the lease fee up to a more appropriate level in relation to the facility they have access to. The grounds, now freehold title to the ACTA continue to develop as the premier grounds in Australia and the Southern Hemisphere. I thank the Wagga Club committees, both past and current for their past and ongoing support and contribution to this achievement.

## Threat to the National Ground

Following an approach from our westerly neighbour Mr. Rod Brown, recently the Association lodged a submission with council in regards to a proposed walking track to the south of the grounds. We indicated that we saw problems with its proposed route. Although two kilometres from the firing line we did not want to encourage the public in front of and in clear sight of shooters and vice versa.

We received a very disappointing response from council staff stating that any complaint from the public on the proposed track regarding noise etc. would be referred to the appropriate authority at the time. We saw this response as totally irresponsible and have since taken the matter up with all councillors and the Mayor. We indicated that our expectation was that council complete proper due diligence on the affect this proposal may have on existing surrounding properties especially the ACTA prior to approval of the proposal. We have since been contacted by council staff advising the matter will be reviewed. Considering the town plan adopted a couple of years ago flagged no development in the area to the south of the grounds for the next twenty years we feel we can successfully oppose the proposal.

## Retirement

Two long serving members of your Executive have retired recently.

Mrs Elaine Forward has retired after more than 25 years of continuous service on the Executive. This is truly a marathon effort and would almost certainly be an Association record for length of service at this level. We

# Executive Officer's Report

The Skeet Championships for 2018 are now completed with great fields for most events. The 410 Bore and 28 Gauge are now 100 target events with numbers around the 100 mark. The new format for the Champion of Champions was received with mixed reviews, I am sure there will be further discussion at the National Executive meeting in August. Whilst on this subject there is always an opportunity to have your proposals and suggestions put forward at this meeting. The current policy of correspondence being submitted through Club, Zone and State level is always debated. The ACTA as a National organisation cannot answer questions from 14,500 members so there has to be a process, this is currently how the process stands.

I also wish to raise the issue of the Constitution, both the current one and the 2017 proposed Constitution. During the year I have discussed the proposed Constitution with many people, some hugely passionate, some just with an opinion. The proposed Constitution that was put forward was defeated at the AGM in 2017. The document itself is a very professionally produced document based on the current Constitution with a number of differences that would ensure the Association continues to move forward.

The Constitution we currently conduct the Association under is nearly 30 years old, if you go back to road rules of 30 years ago you will find many have changed to accommodate the growth of the number of cars on the road and the variables that surround that growth. So to the ACTA has grown and developed as a sporting association and as a business and should review its practices within the Constitution to ensure we are providing the best governance available to the members of the Association and to comply with the law. I believe the proposed Constitution is fundamentally a good document. However those opposed to the implementation have not provided anything for the Association to consider going forward. This needs

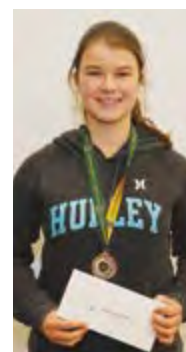

## NSW FIREARMS AMNESTY INFORMATION FOR DEALERS PARTICIPATION

New South Wales will conduct a three month Firearms Amnesty from 1 July 2018 to 30 September 2018.

The aim of the amnesty is to either register firearms or remove them from the community.

A firearm or firearm-related article can be taken to a participating licensed firearms dealer for the purpose of registration, supply or surrender. A list of participating firearm dealers will be available on the NSW Police Force (NSWPF) Firearms Registry Website.

A firearm or firearm-related article is also able to be surrendered for destruction at a police station.

Prohibited weapons can also be surrendered during the amnesty.

There will be no fee charged in relation to the registration of the firearm or firearm-related article as part of the Amnesty. The participating firearms dealer may charge an inspection, administrative and or safekeeping fee for services provided. Any fees charged for services provided are at your own discretion.

Persons wishing to obtain a NSW Firearms Licence will have a fee applied.

If the person does not wish to register the firearm or firearm-related article they can enter into a private commercial arrangement with a participating firearms dealer to supply the firearm or firearm-related article to the participating firearms dealer.

Police may investigate any circumstances where firearms previously reported stolen are surrendered, registered or sold as part of the amnesty.

**Firearms Dealers wishing to participate in the Amnesty are required to notify the NSWPF Firearms Registry by 22 June 2018 by phoning the Amnesty Information line on 1800 803 041 or email [firearmamnesty@police.nsw.gov.au](mailto:firearmamnesty@police.nsw.gov.au)**

In firearms dealer response advise if dealership has computer/internet accessibility.

Upon notification of a Firearms Dealer's intent to opt into the Firearms Amnesty, a Firearms Dealer Information Package containing firearms information, regulatory refreshing training and return acknowledgement, will be forwarded to firearms dealer.

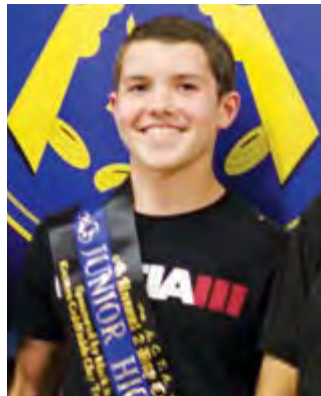
Crocker 33/35. The overall winner was Arthur Ward with a 46/48 from Northam Gun Club, W.A.

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

## Skills for shooting

Last month's article explored goal setting, which is an important skill to plan how we want our shooting sport experience to be.

Goal setting is an easy task that can be done at the beginning of the season or year or any time that you may feel it is necessary. Remember the goal setting can be redone as often as required. For the sake of this exercise I will only list one construct; sport. To do the exercise completely other constructs such as health, lifestyle, education/learning, career, etc can also be included.

Goal setting is important for practise sessions as well as competitions. Goals give you a purpose and a motivation to improve and succeed.

To do the exercise as per the text book you need four sheets of paper;

Page one: List your lifetime goals.

### Lifetime goals:

Sport: shooting.

List three goals where you want to be at the end of your shooting life.

When you have written your goals turn over the page and don't look at them again until you have completed the exercise.

Page two: List your 5 year goals.

### 5 year goals:

List where you want to be with your shooting in the next five years.

When you have written your goals turn over the page and don't look at them again until you have completed the exercise.

Page three: List your yearly goals.

### Yearly goals:

List where you want to be with your shooting at the end of next years.

- 2.
- 3.

When you have written your goals turn over the page and don't look at them again until you have completed the exercise.

Page four: List your goals for now – this month

### Goals for now or this month:

List what you want to be achieving with your shooting this month.

- 1.
- 2.
- 3.

When you have written your goals turn over the page and don't look at them again until you have completed the exercise.

When you have completed all four pages, go back and rate them in importance. This should now form the basis of your approach to shooting over the year or any length of time you choose.

So what you are doing at your local shoot this month should be a stepping stone to what you want to achieve this year. What you want to achieve this year will be the stepping stone for what you want to achieve in the next five years and so on.

As well as keeping these goals, you should also keep a log of how you are doing. Tick off when you reach goal or develop new goals if the ones you chose were too easy or too hard. Revisit and revise your goals as often as you need or when there are any changes of circumstances that may need you to refocus your efforts. For example, it may be necessary to modify your goals when there is a change that may affect your performance, such as getting a new gun, trying a new discipline or recovering from an injury or illness

Setting goals does not need to be complicated, so keep it simple. It is essential to remember that the exercise can be modified and changed when needed.

## **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS**

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Sporting Clays Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held or a member of another ICTSF affiliate.
2. Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
3. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
4. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
5. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
6. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
7. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
8. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
9. Shooters who fail to appear on time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
10. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
11. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
12. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
13. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
14. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
15. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
16. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
17. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
18. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
19. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$10.00. Nominations will close daily at 10 .00am.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
22. Reduced Nominations: These shall apply to juniors and second family members, they being wives and husbands entering into the same event whose nomination must be lodged at the same time as a family member paying full nomination fees. Shooters paying reduced noms are eligible for Open as well as section prizes.
- 23. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.**
24. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
25. Upon application to the A.C.T.A office, refunds less a \$5.00 administration fee will be available. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with these conditions of entry.
26. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
27. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade prior to entering State and National Championships.
28. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorisation from the Tournament Director or Shoot Marshal.

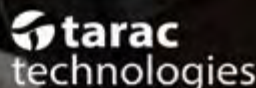

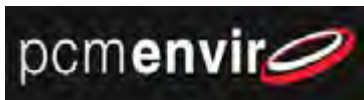

# RULE CLARIFICATIONS

## CHAMPIONSHIPS – HOW MANY TARGETS TO QUALIFY?

Over the past 12 months I have been made aware of and have also noticed in some club advertisements that not all clubs are complying with the number of targets specified in our rules for conducting Commonwealth, State, Zone and District Championships. While being realistic and realising that most programs for 2018 have already been advertised in either State program booklets or in the CTSN and accepting that most probably sashes, medals et cetera have already been acquired for 2018, this is a reminder to clubs that the number of targets for Commonwealth, State, Zone and District Championships are set out quite specifically in the ACTA Rule book.

Let's get it right for 2019, apart from National Championships where the number of targets shot is determined by the ACTA Executive Committee and for Club Championships where there appears to be no set criteria, all other titles have a prescribed number of targets. These can be found on pages 30 – 33 of the 2018 Rule book and include Rules 3.12 to 3.15.

While District Events, (Rule 3.15) have had very little significance since the introduction of Zones we may be able to use this Rule as a means of determining the number of targets shot in Club Championships, or perhaps the Rule could be changed to include the word "MINIMUM" which would then allow for some club discretion.

Although the next Rule book is not to be released until 2020 if anyone would like to have input into this rule or in fact any other, you should discuss your suggestions with your State Rules Supervisors who can determine if a briefing paper is appropriate. Other than this means of having rule changes made, all members can take suggestions through their Club/Zone/State process to have articles presented to the next Rules Supervisors conference in 2019.

## TWO BROKEN TARGETS IN SUCCESSION – WHAT IS REQUIRED OF THE REFEREE?

It is the responsibility of the Referee to show the shooter an unbroken target after 2 successive broken targets. This is made clear in the Mandatory Requirements for Referees in both Trap and Skeet disciplines. Rules MROT 5(b)vi in Trap and MROS 5(b)v in Skeet.

"If a shooter experiences two broken targets in a row during competition, and the referee does not offer the shooter a target to look at, then the shooter is entitled to ask the referee to show him a target as per Rule MROT 5(b)vi. (Referees are reminded that to show a shooter a full target after two broken targets, is a Mandatory Requirement)

It is definitely not legal for shooters to call for "one to look at" after a single broken target, nor should Referees accept the "superficial cough" the absently "gun knocked" microphone, or the "empty shell" so innocently dropped on the microphone speaker stand which sets off a target as being acceptable. If as a Referee you witness this, I suggest that you accept it on the first occasion, accidents can happen, but be wary and warn the shooter that further instances may see a call of "lost target".

## SASH COLOURS

This is a reminder to Club Secretaries that some sash colours are reserved for State, National and Commonwealth events. For the prestige that one of these sash colours represents, Club and Zone Secretaries are asked to be mindful of this when ordering sashes.

The Rules relating to this appear in Trap, Skeet and Sporting sections of the Rule book, Rules 3.16(a), 7.12(a) and 11.05(a). Only the Trap Rule is set out below.

**3.16(a)** Sash colours for clubs to be any colour other than those designated for National, Commonwealth – both royal blue, State – red or alternatively Official State colours.

## DOWN GRADING –

I have written on this subject before, but we seem to still have shooters who either do not understand or do not wish to understand how it works, so let me revisit the issue.

The Rules which cover this appear in each section of the Rule book as Rules – Trap 2.01(i), Sleet 6.01(i) and Sporting 10.01(k), all are similar, for that reason the Trap Rule only is set out below.

**2.01(i)** A shooter must shoot a minimum of three (3) consecutive groups of 200 targets, ie 600 targets, at a lower grade percentage to be down graded. Other than in the authority vested in Rule 2.04(g). **Once attaining A grade a shooter cannot be re-graded to C grade and once attaining AA grade a shooter cannot be re-graded to B grade**, other than in the authority vested in Rule 2.4(g). A shooter can only be downgraded one grade at a time. All scores after the last grading must be carried forward onto a new ACTA Record Card.

There is one other aspect to consider when down grading as per above. The date set for "highest grade" is January 1st, 2016. This date was established when this Rule was initiated to protect shooters from overzealous Handicappers who may have known that a shooter, perhaps now in his later years of shooting may have been AA in his prime. **It does not mean that this is the date where your highest grade is established, any higher grade attained after this date will become your "highest grade"**.

Shooters who have been affected by injury, or indeed any reason where they can no longer compete in the lowest grade attainable to them can apply under Rule 2.04(g) Trap and appropriate Skeet and Sporting Rules for further downgrades.

This does not apply to Elite AA grade shooters who have elected to remain AA for life. Any Elite shooter wishing to have their grade lowered must have medical certification to initiate a downgrade and must return their AA elite badge to the ACTA.

## GRADING & HANDICAP RETURNS

Club Secretaries are reminded that sending in a shoot report to the ACTA does not mean that a shooter who has had a grade or handicap change will be automatically updated on the ACTA database. Grade and handicap changes must be altered on the database as well as on the shooters Record Card. To do this Secretaries need to go into the ACTA database and log in as "Club Secretary". At this point you will be given a choice of either "Home Club" which will be for your own Club members or "Player Directory" for other shooters, find the correct member record and alter accordingly.

## DRESS CODE

To ensure that our sport projects an appropriate public image, a dress code has been established. Lately we have observed some photos sent in for publication, usually taken at club presentations that have certainly not complied with this code. The code is not particularly strict, certainly not as strict as some sports, but applies to presentations as well as competition. Photos not conforming to this code will not be published in the CTSN. The rule below is set out in all disciplines of the Rule book as below.

**1.02(o)** All competitors are required to dress in an appropriate manner. The wearing of camouflage clothing (any version), singlets or singlet style sleeveless tops is prohibited. The wearing of thongs, scuffs or bare feet is prohibited. Any shoes worn must have a restraining strap or support at the heel. The wearing of high cut shorts is prohibited.

NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

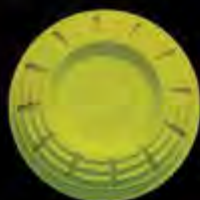
