Firearms Insurance

The Firearms cover included in your membership has provided relief to five members between December and March. These claims totalled over \$19,000. Claims varied from break and enter to a damaged gun case during air travel.

It is to be noted that the cover does not include fair wear and tear ie: it does not cover broken springs, action parts etc. purely because of fair wear and tear. However if the action was damaged in an insurable event ie: such as in a house fire, the claim would be paid. This is also the case with insurances offered by other Associations. We all need to be aware that premiums are directly related to claims history and frivolous or non-genuine claims can cost us all. Pre-existing damage especially to stocks is a common area where claims need to be carefully investigated to keep the cover affordable for us all for when we have a real and justified need for it.

Executive Meetings

Your Executive will meet on the 22nd/23rd/24th of August and hopefully make some decisions around membership issues that can be of benefit to all. There is no simple answer to the myriad of issues surrounding membership. I hope that we do not make decisions that benefit a few clubs and members to the detriment of the whole Association.

Robert Nugent

Representing at this level is a great achievement. With much larger fields and a more open competition it could be argued the World Championships are probably on a higher level than the Olympics. Congratulations to all selected and we wish you well at the event.

National Ground

The Association has successfully argued for a review of the proposed siting of a walking track to the south of the grounds. Council are now looking at a business case study and possible impacts on the ACTA National Ground will be part of the review. ACTA will now be fully involved as an interested party in the process going forward. I have spoken before on what is known as "sovereign risk" ie : the risk of some level of government making a decision that can negatively affect your business. A walking track sited on the most northerly proposed route would inevitably bring noise complaints and possibly close the grounds down as a venue for the National Championships. It would be negligent of your Executive not to recognise the negative possibilities arising with sovereign risk and plan to retain viable alternative venues for these large events.

The grounds are now being landscaped further and so it has become necessary to limit areas where vehicular traffic can access. There is more than adequate hardstand parking areas around the main hall and beside the Wagga clubhouse and generally car-parking needs to be limited to these areas.

I would like to welcome Marcus Pim to the Association as our new Groundsman. He has not been here long but you can already see the difference he is making.

Hall of Fame

The display of our Olympic medal winners along the entry foyer bulkhead is approaching completion. The seven medal winners are proudly displayed straight ahead of the entry doors and high up on the wall. Work is continuing on content for the timeline mural and DTL and Skeet areas.

Executive Officer's Report

The second half of the year is upon us and whilst there is a great deal of the year to come our National Office focus is squarely on 2019.

There are some areas of our membership renewals that we will be refining in the coming months in relation to maintaining your membership. In 2019 the data base will revert to two categories, financial and non-financial, both self-explanatory. The lapsed category will be deleted. Members are able to go through their "mypage" registration to renew, the simplest way to maintain your membership at your Club, Zone, State and Nationally.

As at the 28th February 2019 members who have not re-joined will be classed as non-financial members, Club secretaries will be able to renew a member at any time during the year, that will alter their status from non-financial to financial in the green box in the data-base.

Over the past month the ACTA has faced a number of concerning developments with Wagga Wagga City Council. There is a current rail track some 800 metres to the South of the ACTA National ground that was the subject of a campaign to re-open as part of a campaign for rail trails throughout NSW. The ACTA objected strongly to this development and I can say this option has since been taken off the table.

The other option was for a parcel of land 10 metres wide 2.8km from the National ground beyond the Southern rail trail option. This land is being donated to Council to allow a bike track to link the suburb of Forest Hill to the City. The ACTA also asked that council provide evidence this development would not place the ACTA in a vulnerable position in relation to noise and the visual impact it may cause the ACTA and to those using the track.

The ACTA was assured the Council would include the ACTA in consultations in the future in relation to the Business Case Study being prepared for the Active Travel program. The ACTA would be provided with reports on the issues raised in relation to noise and sight as well as being included in the proposed sighting of the path and screening options that have been discussed at Council level.

This proposal was only bought to light by our good neighbours Rod and Rowena Brown, Rod has facilitated the use of a parcel of his land for the extra traps the Association needed, all at no cost to the ACTA. The ACTA has first option to purchase this parcel of land at the right time for both Rod and the ACTA. We are very fortunate to have his support as a neighbour, as most people will appreciate, your neighbour can be a great asset or can cause great discomfort.

We continue to develop the National Shooting Range into a first class facility for the use of members and guests to the venue. Groundsman Marcus is planning gardens and perimeter plantings to satisfy the Council in relation to replacing trees removed in the building process, we will also be proactive in providing screening to the South of the venue.

In last month's column I farewelled Elaine Forward and told of her influence within the ACTA over many years, not long after I submitted that report, long serving Northern Territory member Robert Fox advised me that he had not re-nominated for the position of delegate for the Northern Territory on the ACTA Executive.

Rob is another person on the Executive, not only with extensive experience in Trap and particularly ISSF but he is a man of enormous knowledge about lead and the effects of lead. Rob and fellow Territorian Dave Howe initiated the ACTA Environmental Plan for the National Ground. The EMP was a substantial document that took a great deal of time to research and

implement. Rob was also the driving force behind many reviews of the Strategic Plan and governance policies along the way. Rob was also a passionate ISSF Referee and volunteered his services to the ACTA over many years.

Long days in the middle of January are a huge burden on staff who conduct these ISSF events, as we all know, there is no cool place in the middle of summer in Australia for these events and replacing staff is always hard. I know Rob is available to provide advice and guidance, good mentors with a sound platform in assessing situations and the good of the organisation are invaluable and I am sure Rob will be called upon to assist in different ways into the future. I certainly will.

As with Elaine I am disappointed to lose so much experience off the Executive. This is a time now where we need the next passionate people to step forward, we welcome Ray Niven from the Northern Territory and Ian Watson from Western Australia and look forward to moving to the next phase of the ACTA's development as a National Sporting Organisation.

Rule Clarification

AUSTRALIAN BALL TRAP

As Ball Trap is becoming an increasingly popular event and having been asked multiple times to explain why some clubs shoot Ball Trap from a straight line of shooting stations while others use shooting stations based on a 15 metre arc, I thought it might be appropriate to discuss both layouts within this column. The following is a summary.

1. A layout where the shooting pads are set in a straight line, with the centre station being set at 15 metres. These Ball Trap layouts are generally older and were often built as single purpose grounds where only Ball Trap could be shot, some even established over trench or tower layouts where the shooting stations were therefore in that straight line. Built prior to any clear instruction on layout design they followed the UK version of Ball Trap that does place the shooting stations in a straight-line configuration. In the 1975 ACTA Rule book, the earliest that I could reference and which designates its publication date as 1972, Ball Trap was clearly defined in diagram form, as being shot from an arc, not a straight line. This is over 46 years ago.

2. This second version of layout, with shooting stations constructed on an arc is the correct one and is as described fully with diagrams in the 2018 ACTA Rule book. These layouts now generally double as DTL grounds where the walls and trap are lowered for Ball Trap and shooters shoot from the 15 metre radius marks as in trap.

While being mindful of the older established straight line layouts and accepting that we will continue to use them, I can see no good reason why Ball Trap competitions, especially those being shot over multi-purpose grounds, that is those imposed over DTL layouts, should not comply with the Australian Ball Trap shooting station criteria. Some clubs may need to adjust their straight-line layouts to introduce an arc, but this can be easily implemented with little cost. Where possible and to ensure a standard competition equity for Ball Trap I encourage all clubs to conform to our ACTA rules.

In light of this investigation I have sent to the ACTA Executive, a briefing paper suggesting that Clubs not conforming to ACTA Standard Ball Trap Rules be only able to shoot club events and that the allocation of Zone, State and Commonwealth events be withheld from them.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

The Four 'Ds'

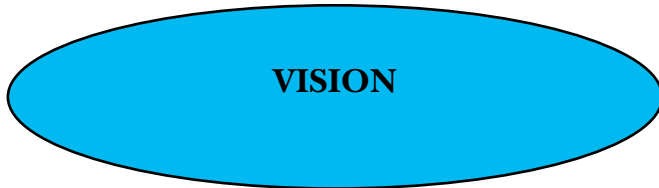
The last two articles have explored goal setting as a basic mental skill required to provide us with a path we want to follow with our competition shooting.

This article will explore the next step. Learning how to use one's mind can be as potent as any performance-enhancing drug.

The following comes from the area of organisational psychology but has been embraced by sport psychologists, and can be represented as a funnel; with the big picture at the top and funnelling down to specific skills, behaviours, attitudes and values.



Initially, the athlete needs to look at a mission. The mission might be a simple statement such as "Be a competitive shooter."



From the mission, the shooter then develops his or her vision, which should articulate the potential, purpose, passion, power and planning components that work towards facilitating the mission statement.



From the vision, the shooter now develops goals that they are working towards.

Remember that these goals will encompass physical skills, technical skills and mental skills

From this point it is now up to the athlete to actually put their goals into a plan that will become their performance. This plan needs to include the four Ds; Desire, Dedication, Determination and Discipline.

Desire is 'want' power. It is as important as will power in accomplishing your goals. What do you want to achieve for your entire sporting life, this year or even this shoot? The other question that needs to be asked is, How badly do you want it? Are you really hungry?

Dedication is about turning desire into action, which requires lasting commitment. I have written before about commitment; making a plan is well and good but to follow any plan through you must be committed to reaching the targets of that plan.

Determination is essential because everyone wants to be successful and athletes who achieve success motivated and determined to achieve it over and over again. It is important to remember that there are two types of motivation: being product orientated or being process orientated. Product orientation works towards winning and achieving those rewards. Process orientation works towards focussing on the process to improve and achieve. Process and product motivation are not necessarily mutually exclusive. An athlete can achieve the major prize if they focus on the process of shooting each target. If you focus on the process then the product will look after itself.

Discipline is action orientated. It involves doing what you have to do when you need to do it, whether you want to or not. It means not procrastinating and/or making excuses. Discipline means you will focus on staying with your plan to achieve your goals. Discipline is the action behind commitment. If you are committed to achieving your goals and vision then you need to be committed and have the discipline to follow through with the actions.

INSURANCE INFORMATION AND RISK MANAGEMENT

Prepared by Marsh Advantage Insurance

The following article was provided by the ACTA insurers Marsh Advantage Insurance in March 2018. The Risk Management manual was provided to all States for distribution to Clubs.

The information provided in the document is also of great value to our registered shooters who should know what is and isn't covered in our policies and the risk management procedures that an insurer would deem to be a requirement of complying with the terms of Insurance.

This document also provides a basic matrix to follow when assessing risk, either personal or club related. The ACTA and Marsh Insurance have worked in partnership to ensure our member Clubs, States, Zones and Registered shooters are aware of the requirements in relation to risk assessment and management. This information, now available to registered shooters should give a greater understanding of you individual responsibility in relation to risk management.

I thank Rob Low, Manager from Marsh Advantage Insurance, for providing the document. This gives an insight into how insurers assess their product and how it relates to claims.

1. WHAT IS RISK MANAGEMENT?

In our everyday lives, we face risks and we make judgements about whether we will accept these risks. For example, every time we sit behind the wheel of a motor vehicle, we accept that there is a chance of being injured in an accident, but we make a conscious decision that the benefits outweigh the risks.

However, **organisations that invite people to participate in their activities have a responsibility to ensure that these activities are free from risk of injury** and are as safe as reasonably possible. This responsibility is expressed in legislation such as the "Competition & Consumer Act 2010".

Risk Management is all about identifying those risks associated with your activities which may result in injury to another person or damage to their property. It is then the process you put in place to either remove the risk or minimise the risk to an acceptable level.

In this document, we will provide you with some essential tools to assist in developing your own risk strategy which is particular to your activities. You are in the best position to assess your risks as only you know the extent of your activities and those risks that may be peculiar to your circumstances.

Benefits of an effective Risk Management Program

There are a number of benefits and all are equally important.

Firstly, when an insurance company assesses both the premium and the acceptance of a cover, the factors which control their decision are the class of risk and the claims experience of the client. **It is not only the size of the claims but the frequency and number of claims which will be taken into consideration.**

Obviously, if there is in place an effective risk management strategy which reduces the frequency of claims and the number of incidents which could result in claims, then an insurer is more likely to give the insurance greater consideration.

Secondly, serious injuries not only affect the injured person but can impact on their family and friends as well. We have seen examples in the media of the trauma that these people experience and the effect on their quality of life. The financial impact is only one part of the problem but the social impact on the community is far reaching.

One effect of serious injuries is often overlooked and that is the **emotional effect on those people involved in the activity which resulted in the injury, namely your committee members, club members, officials etc.** This effect cannot often be measured but nevertheless it has a very real consequence.

Lastly, in these days of media scrutiny, injuries can have a significant effect on the reputation of your sport. As you are aware, there is much competition, particularly in the junior ranks, between sporting bodies trying to attract the future champions to their sport. If a sport is seen to be unsafe, it is unlikely to attract future participants.

2. RULES AND REGULATIONS

Before addressing the principles and strategies of Risk Management, we need to first deal with the issue of the rules and regulations that govern your sport.

Your association has detailed rules and regulations which govern the way in which the sport will be controlled in Australia. It is imperative that all clubs, committee members, coaches, officials, volunteers, members and others that participate in the sport, are fully aware of these rules and regulations and ensure that they are adhered to in the sport's administration and participation.

These, by their very nature, have inherent risk management elements as they put in place measures and requirements which control the way the sport is conducted. Rules provide a consistent approach to the conduct of participants and the clubs and reduce the exposures which would result from a lack of control.

It is a vital part of any risk management procedure that any rules and regulations are strictly adhered to and it is imperative that all concerned are fully aware of the requirements.

In addition to the above, there may be particular legislative responsibilities which apply to each state which impose requirements and we would suggest that these be investigated to ensure that you comply.

There are also Australian Standards which detail a minimum level requirement of safety and we would suggest that you also ensure that these are implemented. In the event of an incident, courts will generally consider the minimum standards that are set by the Australian Standards.

We have addressed the issue of the rules and regulations and other possible statutory requirements but we would expect that as part of your constitution, you also may have rules and codes of conduct which govern the way in which your committee and the club members operate as a club.

It is vital that all members of your club are fully aware of their requirements and it is essential that you have in place a system which ensures that these are complied with.

3. KEY COMPONENTS OF RISK MANAGEMENT

There are 3 basic components of Risk Management and they are as follows:

1. *Risk Identification*
2. *Risk Measurement*
3. *Management of the risk*

Having completed a review of each of the components, there are generally 2 outcomes:

1. *A loss control prevention program*
2. *Risk Financing*

In conjunction with these components, there are also strategies which you can use in the risk assessment process which will have a significant effect on the type of risk management plan you decide to put in place.

Risk Management – Strategies

There are 5 strategies when you are considering the risks associated with the sport and they are:

- + *Risk Avoidance*
- + *Risk Reduction*
- + *Risk Acceptance*
- + *Risk Transfer*
- + *Insurance*

Risk Avoidance

This simply means can the risk be totally avoided. Can the activity be changed in such a way to completely remove any risk of injury or property damage?

Risk Reduction

Having identified a risk and having made the decision that it cannot be avoided, can the risk be reduced so that the impact is contained. This can be done in a number of ways which we will discuss later.

Risk Acceptance

There are times when the risks associated with an activity are inherent and part of the activity which make it attractive. These cannot generally be removed or reduced but have to be accepted and acknowledged.

Risk Transfer

This strategy is all about making another party or organisation responsible for the identified risk exposure. An example of this would be the use of service providers at club events. You may ask the local food outlet to provide food for sale at the event, but although this will be seen as part of your risk exposure, you do not have any control over the quality or preparation of the food.

In this case, you would seek to transfer the risk to the provider by insisting they have the appropriate insurance coverage, noting your interests to cover the aspects of their involvement in your event.

This can apply to any supplier or provider of goods and services where the control over the safety aspects is under their control.

Insurance

When you have considered all of the above options, you will come to the conclusion that you will be able to avoid some risks, reduce others and transfer others as well but there will always be some risks which need to be covered by insurance.

In developing a Risk Management plan, you should consider the components as we have indicated and, using the strategies as part of the risk assessment, put in place a structured plan to deal with the risks in the appropriate manner according to your particular circumstances. *Remember, you are in the best position to make the judgements about your risk exposures but we will provide some of the tools which will assist you in developing your plan.*

Risk Management – Identification

The first step to managing risk is identifying the exposures that are present in your activities. These can take a number of forms and they are as follows:

- + *Physical hazards, and*
- + *Management systems/training*

Physical Hazards

These are the most obvious causes of risk both to participants, spectators and officials/volunteers and in many cases, can be controlled by having an effective system where inspections are carried out prior to the events/activities and/or on a regular basis.

Why are inspections necessary?

- + *To identify and eliminate transient hazards*
- + *They check hazard control measures*
- + *Because conditions change*
- + *Because changes have effects*
- + *They measure safety performance*
- + *They detect management deficiencies*
- + *They demonstrate your commitment*

The control of physical hazards which have the potential to cause injury is essential in reducing your exposure to claims. By having an inspection program, you have the opportunity to identify the areas of risk and take the appropriate steps to manage these risks, before they become the cause of a claim.

Each activity will have its own risks but some examples of physical hazards are as follows:

Competition area

- + *Is the ground surface in good condition and free of obstructions such as holes, rocks, water troughs, and other obstructions including animals*
- + *Is the fencing appropriate for the activity for both protection of participant and spectators*
- + *Is the size of the area appropriate for the number of participants*
- + *Is the practice area for competitors free from ground obstructions and appropriate for the number of competitors*

Spectator area

- + *Is the designated area ground surface free from obstructions as above*
- + *Are all spectator traffic areas clear and safe*
- + *Are any viewing structures in good condition and well maintained*
- + *Are there barriers between spectators and competitors*

+ *Is there appropriate signage clearly showing spectator areas and restrictions*

+ *Are there any barriers or officials preventing access to non-removable physical hazards e.g. creeks, dams, structures, trees etc*

Vehicle areas

+ *Is there a designated area for vehicles and is this free from obstructions*

+ *Is this area removed from the other traffic area*

The above examples are only a guide and when you carry out the inspections, you should develop your own check list to ensure that all of those potential risks which are peculiar to your activities are noted and dealt with.

4. MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS AND TRAINING

While it is very common to view risk management as dealing with the physical hazards, there are risks associated with the manner in which you manage your activities, your procedures and systems and your training programs.

The following are some examples of this which will impact on your risks:

+ *In addition to your rules and regulations, do you have a “Code of Conduct” and how do you ensure that all competitors are aware of these rules and codes and how do you enforce their compliance*

+ *How do you police the wearing of appropriate clothing and protection for competitors*

+ *Do you have a standard of apparel and protection for official, volunteers etc. and how do you police compliance*

+ *What training do you provide to officials, volunteers etc. to ensure they carry out their duties in the appropriate way*

+ *Do you have a disclaimer printed on entry forms*

+ *Do you have appropriate signage at entry points to events and restricted areas*

+ *Do you review the site layout to ensure that conflicting risk areas are kept separate*

This is not, by any means, an exhaustive list but is a start point and you will need to review your procedures and systems for any other exposures

Risk Measurement

Now having identified the risks, the next step is to measure the possible outcome i.e. is the risk likely to cause serious injury, minor injury, damage to property etc. This is an essential element of the process as it will dictate the action and the timing of the action that you will need to take.

It is important that you consider the worst case scenario particularly in the case of potential injury as it can be a fine line between a minor injury and a major injury. For example, falling down stairs may, in some cases, cause a minor injury but, depending on the circumstances, this injury can be more serious. As such, you need to not only consider the fall but take into consideration the environment as well.

Risk Management – Management/Loss Control Prevention Program

The next step is how you deal with the information that you have gathered as part of the assessment process. To assist with the process, we have included a “Risk Priority Chart” which will give you a guide to matching the likely injury to the consequences and a “Simple Risk Assessment” form to assist in the assessment process.

LIKELIHOOD: How likely is it that it will occur?	CONSEQUENCES: HOW SEVERELY COULD IT HURT SOMEONE?			
	EXTREME (Death, permanent disablement)	MAJOR (Serious bodily injury)	MODERATE (Casualty treatment)	MINOR (First aid only)
VERY LIKELY (Could happen frequently)	1	2	3	4
LIKELY (Could happen occasionally)	2	3	4	5
VERY UNLIKELY (Could happen, but rare)	3	4	5	6
INSERT NAME Could happen, probably never will)	4	5	6	7

This stage of the risk assessment is a way of ranking risks in terms of their priorities. The risk scores obtained have no absolute value. This chart ONLY ranks the risks.

The scores (1-7) in the risk priority chart indicate how important it is to do something about each risk, as follows:

SCORE	ACTION
1, 2 OR 3	Do something about these risks immediately
4 OR 5	Do something about these risks as soon as possible
6 OR 7	These risks may not need immediate attention

SIMPLE RISK ASSESSMENT	
IDENTIFY RISK ISSUE(S)?	“What would happen if?” “Is it possible that?” “Could somebody?”
IDENTIFY CAUSE(S)?	Think what could cause the issue to occur
IMPACT?	What could be the consequences? What is the likelihood of it occurring?
RANK OF THE RISK?	Complete Risk Priority Chart
CONTROLS – ARE THEY ADEQUATE?	Are there any existing controls? Are they adequate? Think what could prevent or reduce this impact – does it work?
RECOMMENDED ACTIONS	Practical steps to prevent the cause (remove the risk) or lessen the impact
ACTION PRIORITY/TIMING?	Use the Risk Priority Chart to prioritise the timing for the actions to treat the risk

5. ACTION PLAN

It is now imperative that, having collected all of the information in relation to your risks, you put in place, an action plan to ensure that the hazards are remedied or are scheduled for remedy as per the "Risk Priority Charts".

Your Risk Management Action Plan should then be a document which is under constant review. Your risks will change from time to time and, with the inspection program, these actions will need to be updated to maintain the control over the risk exposures.

The importance of a continuing education program for your members, officials, volunteers and committee members in the importance of maintaining a diligent approach to risk management is of a vital importance. These people are the key to the success of your Action plan.

There are always likely to be situations which arise that may result in an incident which inevitably result in injury. The last component of Risk Management is "Risk Financing."

The most commonly used method is to take out insurance to cover those inevitable claims that will occur from time to time.

An effective Risk Management Plan will help protect that insurance from being exposed to claims which could have been prevented and it is in your best interest to protect your cover in order to provide the greatest chance of its continuance.

The final component of your program is to assess the success of your actions. Should an incident occur (whether it results in an injury/property damage or not), it is important to review the details and circumstances surrounding the incident to evaluate whether your processes and/or your Action Plan have failed or other processes need to be put in place to prevent the incident recurring.

We have included an "Incident Analysis" form for your use. This should be incorporated into your Action Plan and become a natural part of the process of assessment. By developing an ongoing analysis of each incident, however minor, this will continue to reinforce the importance of maintaining an effective Risk Management Plan and the benefits, over time, will become part of your success.

6. SUMMARY

We are sure when this document is first read, this will seem like an onerous undertaking but once the principles and processes are adopted, it will become second nature and in time will be a natural part of the way you conduct your activities.

Remember, the benefits are substantial and not just the financial benefit. The emotional cost of accidents to the community and to each person is impossible to measure and, if, by reducing the potential for these accidents to occur, we can minimise this effect on the community to all of our benefit.

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller;

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
