President's Notes

International achievements

Recently there have been several outstanding achievements internationally by ACTA members.

These include:

- Renae Birgan winning the Ladies section at the 2018 FITASC World Sporting Championships.
- Alexis Preston and Nathan Argiro taking the Silver medal in the Trap mixed pairs at the ISSF Junior World Cup in Germany.

Our congratulations go to these shooters.

Sports Australia

This new body has been recently announced as the successor to the Australian Sports Commission. It is expected there may be some changes to the Coaching arrangements, but this is to be confirmed. Sports Australia has released a Sports Plan which is available for viewing on their website.

25 and 50-year Medals

Some 6 years ago the ACTA introduced a series of medals to recognise ongoing and unbroken membership of the Association for registered shooters. These are for 25 and 50 years unbroken membership. It has come to our attention that some worthy recipients may have been missed as they became due. If you feel you are entitled to one of these medals and have not received same, please contact Sue at the National Office.

ICTSF

The Federation is yet to confirm dates and venue for next years World English Sporting. It is known the event will be in Ireland and probably in July, but we still await confirmation of this. The ACTA Sporting Nationals will have been conducted by the time this goes to print and it is hoped we can make an announcement at the event.

NSW Firearms

We have recently received correspondence from NSW Weapons, detailing a shotgun club (non-ACTA) that had breached the conditions of its approval by shooting at "novelty targets" NSW Police has asked the ACTA to advise all clubs that only targets as specified in the clubs approved event rules can be used on ranges in NSW.

This follows advice many years ago in Queensland that there is no such thing as a "Novelty event" and all events conducted on approved ranges must conform to the rules of the event as approved by Weapons Licensing.

National Ground –

- **Traders Area**

The ACTA has received basic drawings and perspectives for this proposed building. These should be enough for estimating purposes.

Construction has not been approved by the Executive yet and will depend entirely on the cost and on the level of support we get from the traders.

- **The Range**

The Conference Centre is still being landscaped and the access roads are now planned for completion. This required registration of an easement across both the National Office block and council land. All of this takes time.

The dividing operable walls have finally arrived from Brisbane but unfortunately some panels were damaged in transit. They have been sent back for repair.

A large Food Industry Trade Fair was conducted earlier this month and the centre received great comment from organisers and exhibitors alike.

Operations Manager

Advertising for this position has received little response from suitably qualified applicants. This position will be reviewed by the Executive later this month. The position is to carry the responsibilities of the daily running of the grounds and Function Centre as well as its promotion and sales. It will also cover our social media promotion.

Executive Meeting

From the 22nd of August your Executive members will have all given up at least three days of their time to again consider the numerous items now on committee agendas.

Please spare a thought for these volunteers charged with acting in the best interest of all members.

Executive Officer's Report

It has been a busy month with many important events being conducted.

The 5 Stand Sporting Championships have been conducted with full details in the next magazine. The event hosted a full field of 120 at the National Ground, the last event there, as the event is now being offered for rotation. The Wagga Gun Club have delivered the event on behalf of the ACTA for over 7 years and I take the opportunity now to thank and congratulate the Club, its members and Executive for their support of the event and the ACTA. 5 Stand Sporting is growing throughout the Association so taking the event to other venues will allow more members to access a National 5 Stand Sporting Championship event. We look forward to the continued growth of the sport.

The National Executive have now met for the 2018 Annual Meeting with a number of high priority items on the agenda. The new ISSF format was discussed with a number of programs put forward for consideration given the ladies now shoot the same amount of targets as the men. Double Trap has been deleted from the ISSF calendar at International level, so there is no longer a great deal of support for that discipline within ISSF. The timing of the event was also discussed, there were many issues to take into account when looking at these proposals and the Executive decisions were made in the best interests of the sport as a whole. A full review of the decision of the National Executive will be provided in the magazine in the coming months once due processes are completed.

As the Roma Clay Target Club will host the 2019 National Trap event the National Ground will have programmed works commence after the NSWCTA Trap Championships in October. Details on the National program and the Roma Pre-Nationals will be in the next CTSN.

The camping plan for the National Ground will be revised given that recreational vehicles, caravans, campers, tents and marquees are getting bigger every year so we must revise the camping sites and the maximum length of vehicles for each of these sites. We will plan the camping environment to maximise space and comfort for campers, however there is a limit to the space available to develop. This may mean less sites in the future however we envisage keeping the same number of powered sites, they will however have restrictions on the size of vehicles in particular areas. In the future booking a site will require the size of the van and annex as well as the vehicle towing to ensure they fit the site requested.

I have met with Marsh Insurance Manager Rob Low for a review of our claims at the half way mark of the year. We discussed many aspects of Insurance, however the main theme is compliance. Our insurance broker has provided the ACTA with specific insurance for all of our members, from Clubs, to States and individual registered shooters. As we published in last month's magazine the risk assessment document is reliant upon members complying with the terms in relation to insurance

Whilst this may seem by some to be a preoccupation of mine, it is because it is my job to ensure our members are covered and aware of the requirements of utilising the insurance cover provided. When we submit a claim it is going to be scrutinised to ensure compliance with the rules and regulations of the Insurance and compliance with the ACTA constitution and rules of the sport.

On that note the Firearms Insurance package continues to provide benefits to ACTA members unfortunate enough to have an accident with their firearm that includes theft and fire as well as in the field. The insurance ranks very highly with any insurance available either private or with any other shooting organisation.

There are many challenges ahead not only from statutory bodies in relation to firearms, each and every member can contribute positively to the ACTA being recognised as a highly professional safety conscious Association by locking their guns away and being role models in the community.

Many Clubs who promote the sport through school sport, corporate days and come and try days not only make a return on their investment through membership and fees they also project a positive image of the Club, State, the ACTA and the sport of Clay Target Shooting.

The third event was the 100 tgt West Darling Skeet Championship OA: R Walsh 99/100, AA Benn Baker 97/100, D Nicholls 91/100, A L

Irons 93/100, Bruce Baker 90/100, B D Barker 94/100, G Yoannidis 96/100, C W Reed 85/100, L Decandia 82/100, Lad D McPherson 92/100, Vet J Lemmich 90/100, Jnr D Yoannidis 81/100, Nov Jnr H Munro 72/100.

Overall High Gun Benn Baker 239/250, AA High Grade Gun Ross Walsh 236/250, A Grade High Gun Lawrie Irons 222/250, B Grade High Gun, David Barker 232/250, C Grade High Gun Len Decandia 195/250.

Now I wasn't able to make this shoot as I had to work, so I haven't really heard of anything funny coming out of the weekend, other than looking at the results and seeing that an old fella that reckons he can't see and can't shoot skeet comes in with a 99/100 to win the 100 tgt championship on the Sunday, well done Ross.

I did however get my fix of Skeet shooting, when I did a 3000km road trip to the Caboolture Clay Target Club the weekend before our shoot to shoot in their two day championship and a round of the American NSSA (National Skeet Shooters Association) Zone 8 competition. Zone 8 is all countries outside of America including Canada,

it was held on the Thursday and Friday. It was a Skeet Shooters dream come true, 650 targets over the four days, paid Referees & Scorers for the NSSA events and shot in one visit to the traps, that is, take 4 boxes of shells out and shoot the 100. The shoot started with 100 tgt Doubles then 100 tgt 20 Gauge on the Thursday, 100 tgt 28 Gauge & 100 tgt 410 on the Friday. Saturday was a 100 tgt championship followed by a 50 tgt super handicap in which you can get extra life's if you choose to use any of the smaller gauges. Sunday was a 50 tgt "Flash" for cash, who ever shot the most Flash targets won the \$250, then to finish off the four days was another 50 tgt Doubles event.

The weather was poor for the first 3 days, raining on and off, but then the Sunday was perfect to finish of a well run shoot. My scores, well I am not going to publish them as they were very poor, all I will say is the best I could do over the four days was a 91/100.

The Broken Hill Gun Club's next shoot is to be held on Saturday the 18th of August, a 9am start. The club's AGM will be held at this shoot, AGM starting at 1pm. So come out and have a look, I hope to see you all out there.

The ACTA has accepted an Association insurance policy that will see eligible members (defined as the legal owner of a firearm) provided with **Firearms Insurance** for up to **\$12,000**.

For an additional **\$10.00** fee any eligible member will be able to increase the Insurance coverage to **\$25,000**.

This insurance represents a significant saving on insurance for firearms and accessories.

The ACTA has been looking for this type of insurance for some time. This will allow all eligible members to have insurance at a very low cost compared to what they may pay now.

Covering member's firearms, and/or associated equipment whilst in transit, stored in a locked vehicle in accordance with State Law and/or building and damaged or destroyed whilst in use anywhere in Australia and New Zealand and overseas coverage for 21 days per year.

● DEFINITIONS APPLYING TO THIS POLICY

Firearms & accessories means legal firearms owned by members of the named Association/Club, including any accessories or carrying cases.

Loss means loss or damage caused by or arising from a sudden and unforeseen accident including theft from a securely locked building or vehicle.

- Theft cover is conditional on firearms being securely stored in an approved gun safe when the firearm(s) are not in active use.
- No cover will be provided under this policy where the insured, or any other person or entity the equipment has been entrusted to, has breached any law relating to either the storage or use of the firearm(s.)

Comments

This insurance is designed to protect each financial member up to \$12,000 with the option to increase this limit to \$25,000 for an additional \$10 payable by the member.

The policy has an excess of \$50 each for every claim and protects members anywhere in Australia 365 days of the year plus overseas for 21 days in any one year.

The full policy document is available on the ACTA website with all other insurance documents.

For an additional \$10.00 fee any eligible member will be able to increase the insurance coverage to \$25,000.

2018 36th Universal Trench World Championships

Hungary, July 2018

On Monday the 23rd of July the Australian Universal Trench Team, along with our support crew and a group of other shooters travelling with the team met at Budapest International Airport. A number of the team had flown in via Italy and had competed in the Perazzi Grand Mondiale event at Lonato. While they were there, they took advantage of the amazing hospitality of Perazzi Italy, enjoying a tour of the Perazzi factory and receiving a free service of their guns. Everyone would like to send a big thank you to Perazzi Australia for organising this and also to Mauro Perazzi for his time and dedication to his product and our team members. The remaining team members arrived from Melbourne via Doha and conveniently, both groups landed within 20 minutes of each other.

Our Australian team competing in the 36th World Championship for Universal Trench were: Men – Danny Di Pietro, Matt Schiller & Nathan Cassells, Womens – Suzy Corry, Amanda Holt & Michelle Beecham, Juniors – Nathan Argiro, Thomas Armstrong & Jack Cullinan, Seniors – Phil Matthews, Martin Collumb & Colin Dunn. Master – Bill Iles. Individual shooters – Trish Carter, Kate Puhar, Tom Turner, Jack Turner, Paul Mota, Acacio Mota, Mitchell Iles & Craig Henwood (as well as Karl Corry competing for Ireland)

With the team and individual competitors, this was largest group of Australian shooters to ever compete in the Championships. A great effort by everyone who made the trip!

Everyone was extremely excited; however we had to put our excitement on hold because we were met with the dreaded waiting game! Only one officer could sign the guns into Hungary and it was much to his surprise that we had shown up as he hadn't been made aware from the organising committee that so many guns would be arriving at once. To make matters worse the South African team and Great Britain teams had also arrived around the same time. It was taking an average of 10–15 mins per gun to clear . . . we had 19 guns in our group alone! 4 hours later we were on our bus, in the midst of a huge storm which made the trip a very slow one – especially for the members in one bus when "dunny" needed a "dunny stop!" Eventually we arrived at the Sarlópuszta Club Hotel, located on the shooting grounds 900 metres from the layouts where we would be competing.

The Club Hotel is located about 70km south of the centre of Budapest. It was built originally on an Estate in the Puszta, sometime in the early 1800's. In the "socialist times" it was used as a elementary school. In the mid 1980s

it was converted into a hotel, and even with the changing of ownership, it also operates as a conference hall and horse riding centre.

There are 76 rooms in 4 buildings – all rooms have an en suite bath and shower, plus the hotel has a swimming pool, restaurant, spa and sauna. The conference room holds between 150–180 participants. There are several stables, plenty of horses and even a riding hall for use during winter. The quality of the rooms was that of a typical European 3 star hotel, comfortable

enough however it was hit and miss whether your air conditioner worked! When it hit the mid 30's those with good air conditioners had plenty to smile about, those who didn't became tired and cranky!

Dinner at the hotel was an all you could eat buffet which had different dishes every night and even the fussiest of our eaters (looking at you Matt Schiller!) could find a dish to their liking. Breakfast was also great with plenty of toast, cereal, fruits, ham, cheeses and of course bacon & scrambled eggs.

Our first night saw most of us have a welcome drink at the bar where we found the prices to be very cheap. It had been a very long day of travelling and, exhausted, we all retired to bed early but excited to check out the range tomorrow to sort out our ammunition and have a practice.

The hotel had arranged a horse and cart to act as our 'shuttle bus' to the range which was a novel way to travel with our guns but came in very handy. When we arrived at the range on Tuesday morning, the first thing that struck us was how picturesque it was. The range consisted of 4 layouts, a lovely flat green background, Mattarelli Traps and Nasta clays being used. Plenty of ammo was available at 10-11 Euros per packet (\$16- \$17 AUD) which ensured there weren't many chips going to be shot at! A food tent had been set up which sold sandwiches and rolls, as well as hamburgers and the local "goulash".

After a day of practice, Tuesday night saw us have our traditional Australian Team dinner where everyone gets together to wish the competitors luck for the upcoming competition and also to announce who will carry the flag and lead our team out in the opening ceremony. This year it was none other than Thomas Armstrong, congratulations Thomas! A big thank you to Tom and Sarah-Jane Turner from Arms & Ammo for sponsoring our team dinner; it was greatly appreciated by all.

The opening ceremony was held at our hotel which made things very easy for us, and the Aussies really looked the part in our uniforms. We would like to send a huge thank you to Martin Collumb for supplying, and Shane Pinner from Pinner's Refrigeration & Air Conditioning for funding the striking uniforms. It was an immense honour for Australia to lead all of the teams out.

The competition kicked off on Thursday and everyone was heading into it feeling confident of producing great scores. There was a little hiccup when the 'shuttle bus' had been called off to do farm work but since it was only a 900m walk to the range we managed to make it on time. The Italian and French competitors generously gave our seniors team a lift back and forth each day in their cars.

The event was 200 targets and was shot over 4 days with 50 targets shot each day. All 4 ranges were being used and a different program was thrown on each layout. Everyone shot each ground twice over the competition.

Professional referees were provided, and the refereeing was to a very high standard. Two shooters from each squad were required to stay back to score and side ref each round. The squads rotated each day so that everyone had a turn at shooting morning, afternoon & evening.

After two days of competition at the 100 target mark, French shooter Jean-Phillipe Royere had set a blistering pace with a magnificent 100/100, but right on his heels was Aussie junior shooter Nathan Argiro on a brilliant 99/100. Danny Di Pietro was also right up there with a 50/50 on day 2 which gave him a 97. Jack Cullinan was on a 96 and in medal contention for the juniors, Martin Collumb on 94 was in touch with the seniors. Colin Dunn had shot his first ever 25/25 and our ladies team were also into a team medal position.

Friday night a huge storm hit which gave us an incredible lightning show and cleared away the humidity which had been really draining over the previous few days. We awoke on Saturday morning to overcast conditions and drizzling rain which the first couple of squads had to shoot in but which cleared to brilliant sunshine for those shooting later on in the day.

Over the next two days everyone watched nervously as Nathan and our junior team had created a good lead in the teams match. I would like to take this opportunity to commend all of our juniors on their professionalism and the dedication with which they went about their shooting in Hungary. Despite all of them being 18 and could legally have a drink, they put a self-imposed alcohol ban on themselves during practice and competition to ensure they performed at their best. Nathan was one of the first in bed each night to get a good night's sleep which was so far paying off for him. All of them were a great bunch of juniors to travel with.

Going into the last day of competition Nathan Argiro was 1 target in front of the other juniors and only 1 target behind the open competition with an amazing 148/150. If Nath was nervous he certainly didn't show it by coming out in his first round on the last day and smacking another clean 25 right in the guts. While he showed nerves of steel, the rest of us were a jangle of nervous energy including his Mum Christine and Dad Darren who were on the trip with us. We were all crossing our fingers he would come home with a medal! Nathan was tied for juniors with Karl Jovinelle of France and 2 in front of the Italian junior Ricardo Faccani who had shot the last 100 straight. He was also only 1 target behind Royere also from France in the open category.

Jovinelle let the pressure get to him in the early wave and shot a nervous 22. This meant a score of 24 or better would secure the Junior World Championship for Nathan however he had his sights set on bigger fish! Nathan and Royere were on at roughly the same time so some big crowds had gathered to watch both shooters battle it out in their last rounds. Nathan's first target got away from him but to his credit he didn't let that get to him and went on to smoke the next 24 single barrel. His incredible score of 197/200 secured him the Junior World Championship! Australian juniors have now won the Junior World Championship 3 years in a row (Mitch Iles 2016, Thomas Armstrong, 2017) which is an amazing effort.

Royere finished the event with another clean round and an enormous 199/200 to claim the World Championship. Nathan was then in a shoot off for silver and bronze with Italian Alessandro Camisotti who ran the last 100 straight to also finish on 197. Nathan shot 23 in the shoot off while Camisotti shot 25 which meant Nathan claimed bronze – an amazing achievement and one he and the rest of the country should be extremely proud of!

Australia also secured an individual bronze medal with Bill Iles coming home strong to shoot a great 47/50 in the Masters category totalling 181/200. Congratulations Bill, it was wonderful to have a grandson-grandfather combination on the trip with us and hats off to Mitch for taking care of Pop on such a big trip!

Jack Cullinan shot a very respectable 191/200 to finish equal 6th in juniors and Thomas Armstrong shot a 188 to finish in 9th place. This was enough to give the Aussie Juniors gold in the teams with a combined score of 576/600! The boys won by 1 target over the favourites from Italy. This is the 2nd time we have won the junior teams gold medal. Well done lads!

The men's team also shot consistently; Danny Di Pietro 192, Nathan Cassells 190 and Matt Schiller 188 to claim the team bronze with a score of 569/600 (yep . . . 7 behind our junior team and boy did they let them know it!) Italy claimed gold and France silver. This is the 3rd year running the men's team have claimed a team medal; silver in 2016, and bronze in 2017. Time for gold next year!

Our ladies team also came home strongly – Suzy Corry 182, Michelle Beecham 178 and Amanda Holt 173. They also claimed the bronze medal behind France & Italy. This is our second ladies team medal. Great shooting ladies!

The senior team gave it their all – Martin 187, Phil 176 and Colin 174 which gave them a score of 537. They finished in 4th place behind Italy, France and South Africa. This is great going when you consider how much UT shooting the shooters from these countries do.

He was then joined by Thomas and Jack for the team gold. It was also great to see a large number of Aussie shooters winning medals. Our new Aussie banners were a huge hit – thanks to Dan Power for sponsoring them.

Celebrations kicked off after the closing ceremony as it had been a very successful trip by everyone and there was much to celebrate. One last card game was had by the boys while singing along to the tunes supplied by the Austrian team and then everyone was ready to hit the hay for our last night in the Club Hotel. We were lucky enough to have a bit of a sleep in the next morning and were picked up by our bus at 11am. The bus took us to Budapest where we stayed the night and awoke early the next day for a 9:30am flight. We arrived at the airport at 6am to find there had been no

improvement in gun check in (another wait of 3 and a half hours!) and we were also involved in a full evacuation of the airport for 15 minutes due to a bomb scare! Qatar Airways were very good though and rushed us through as quickly as possible, delaying the flight to ensure we all made it in time. These are the joys of travelling with firearms but as we all know, it's just all part of it.

Everyone arrived home safe and sound and enjoyed their time away with the Aussie UT Team. I would like to thank everyone for being such a great group to be away with, everyone supported each other and all were great ambassadors for our sport and our country. We all cannot thank our long list of sponsors for UT enough who make this happen. Without you we could not do these awesome trips and we really appreciate all of your support.

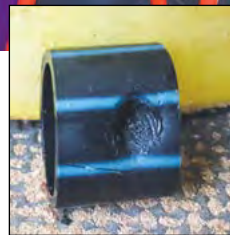

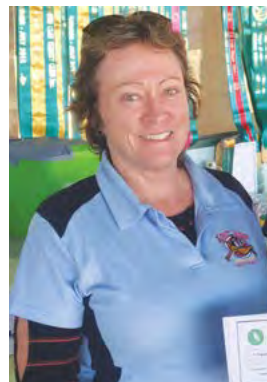

CHANGES TO FIREARMS REGULATIONS ACT

NSW Firearms branch has advised the ACTA of changes to the Firearms Regulations Act 2006, it was replaced by the Firearms act 2017 on the 1st of September 2017. The changes in particular relate to the P650 form to shoot without a license.

Direct Supervision

What is direct supervision?

Close and direct supervision is direct, personal and exclusive supervision and must not exceed a ratio of one unlicensed person to one licensed supervisor.

The licensed supervisor must be present at the firing line and not leave whilst shooting activities are being undertaken by the unlicensed person.

The licensed supervisor must be able to immediately render assistance to the unlicensed person, if required.

The licensed supervisor must personally convey the firearm and ammunition to be used by the unlicensed person from its place of storage to the firing line.

The licensed supervisor must personally convey the firearm and ammunition from the firing line to the place of storage upon the conclusion of shooting activities.

Can a club stop unlicensed persons coming back multiple times, completing the P650 form and shooting with no intention of joining the club or applying for a firearms licence?

Range official determines who they approve to shoot on their range.

Clause 155 of the Firearms Regulation 2017, provides for an offence of trespass where a person enters a shooting range without the approval of the owner/occupier of the range. The club/range is private property and they are at liberty to ask any person to leave the premises at any time. The club will need to administer this in accordance with their rules and the advice they receive from their peak firearms association and insurance provider.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Myth Busting

In relation to mental skills programs, over the past couple of months, I have gone back to basics by revisiting goal setting, what it is, how to do it and how it can help.

Before moving on to any of the other specific mental skills techniques I want to go back and debunk some of the myths that athletes have about mental skills programs and

Burton & Raedeke (2008) wrote in *Sport Psychology for Coaches* that researchers evaluating the effectiveness of mental skills training found that performance can be improved across a wide variety of sports. For me, and yes, I have a vested interest, I would argue that all athletes can benefit from mental skills training.

Over the last year, I have gone from being retired to working again part-time as a senior psychologist training interns to meet the core competencies needed to be a registered psychologist. I see little difference in this work to the work I do when training shooters, cyclists, netballers, etc. The interns need to learn the same skills as the athletes and hopefully their undergraduate and postgraduate study will help them understand why they are doing it.

Burton & Raedeke argues that mental skills training can have an impact in three areas:

- improved performance,
- enhanced enjoyment
- and the development of strong life skills.

Improving performance does not just mean getting to the top. For most of us that may not happen, but we can improve our performance. Moving up a grade, getting back to 25 metres, achieving personal bests in one or many disciplines are just a few examples of improving performance. It may be difficult to be in 'the zone' all the time but if we can decrease the frequency of sub-par performances and choking, and increase the ability to score higher more often, then we are improving our performance.

Secondly, if we are enjoying what we are doing more then we will start to develop mental toughness: competitiveness, composure, confidence, competence, commitment, etc and we handle competitive stress better and feel more self-confident. Because we have improved we will want to compete more. This improvement will motivate us to achieve better results.

Finally, mental skills training programs can facilitate strong personal development that can be transferred to other areas of our life: work, school, relationships, etc. Athletes who are self-disciplined to set goals, train and compete are just as likely to set goals in other areas of their lives and achieve in these areas with the same level of self-discipline. Athletes who have used and developed mental skills programs are more likely to be able to bounce back from injury or deal with adversity and catastrophes better because they can use the learned skills such as goal setting, visualization, mental rehearsal, etc to assist with their recovery.

During a recent supervision session my intern asked why didn't everyone just follow their therapeutic goals and tasks, if they knew that they would help. I pointed out that people often didn't follow rehab tasks, diets, exercise plans, etc and therefore to accept them to follow therapy goals or mental skills programs can be just as problematic.

I wondered about the myths surrounding mental skills training and what roadblocks were getting in the way of everyone adopting them.

Myth 1: *Mental skills training takes too much time.* Athletes and coaches alike felt that there is barely enough time to focus on the physical and technical skills let alone add more time by doing mental skills. Mental skills should be integrated into practice and competition. For the shooter, lawn bowler, golfer, a well-rehearsed and maintained set up routine is essential before each shot. Part of your mental skills program should be to develop this routine and mentally rehearse it over and over again until it is habitual in training and competition. Mental skills such as centering, breathing, focusing on the here and now, etc can be practiced anywhere and anytime: waiting in a queue at the supermarket, at a red traffic light, while walking, etc.

Myth 2: *Mental skills are innate.* According to Burton & Raedeke, it is easy to assume that for the elite athletes or shooters, aspects of mental toughness: composure, confidence, competence, control, commitment, etc, are innate. On the contrary, we are born with certain physiological and psychological predispositions, but being motivated, staying calm under pressure and maintaining confidence are learned skills and it is more efficient using a mental skills training program than relying on trial and error.

Myth 3: *Mental skills training is only for psychological problems.* Therapy is effective for psychological problems. Mental skills training is to help effective and already positive athletes to become more mentally tough, more efficient and achieve better results.

Myth 4: *Mental skills training provides a quick fix.* I had a boss years ago that used to say, "every problem has a simple answer, and it's wrong". If your game has suffered from learning the wrong technique and you have been persevering for years, then you need to unlearn the mistake and relearn what you have to do. Mental skills training programs can help but they should be part of a sustained program. A one off lesson may whet your appetite but it will not be the 'silver bullet'.

Myth 5: *Mental skills training can create performance miracles.* I wish! Mental skills training is designed to increase performance matched to potential. It cannot produce results that are beyond the athlete's ability. But that said, mental skill training, can increase ability and potential overtime because the skills lead to an increase in concentration, attention, focus and mental toughness. Improvement may not happen immediately but it will happen. You should be mindful that learning new skills take time, so if you're doing some relaxation and visualization don't expect great things next week. But instead, plot your performance over a twelve month period and you should start to see an improvement.

Myth 6: *Mental skills training is for the elite only.* Why? Elite sportsmen are at the top because, whether they know it or not, they have mastered the mental skills required to compete and stay at a high level. There is no reason that everyone shouldn't learn the skills and improve, thereby at best challenging the elite, and least, improving your own performance and increasing your enjoyment in the sport. By learning the skills and maintaining the program you will be maximizing your potential and facilitating personal growth.

To become an elite athlete and stay there, you will need to have the requisite physical skills for the sport, the appropriate technical skills to play the game and the mental skills such as goal setting, concentration, relaxation and visualization, to maintain mental toughness.

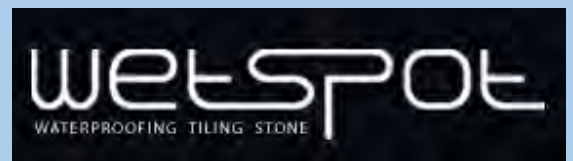

Rule Clarification

GRADING – Non-indicative Scores & Substitutions

I have written on this subject before, yet still get asked very basic questions about grading, how and when to rule out non-indicative scores and how substitutions work. Below is a simple, explanation of how to adjust a bracket of scores.

1. Make sure that the shooter has shot the full 200 targets

This may mean that with a larger event at the end of the 200 bracket, or because of shoot-offs within the bracket, the total could be over 200. This makes no difference to the percentage calculation.

2. Delete any scores that are not indicative of a shooter's ability (Rule 2.04h)

Whilst there is no set criteria or percentage for deciding what is or is not an indicative score, commonsense should prevail. As an example: If a A grade shooter averaging 94 to 96 percent or 23 to 24 targets out of 25 were to shoot a score less than say 18/25, I would strike that score out. If there were no further corrections to be made to the card, that is score substitutions, then you would calculate the percentage on the remaining targets within that bracket. Example: the A grade shooter's card shows a total of 185/200, but within this bracket you notice a score of 18/25. After deleting this score by placing a line through it, the calculation of percentage would then be made from the remaining targets 167/175 making the correct percentage of 95.4 percent.

Shooters should not rule out scores that they consider "non indicative". However once attaining a grade a shooter can simply nominate to remain in that grade, but they must remain for a further 600 targets.

3. Handicappers MUST transpose any scores (Rule 2.01h)

See Rule below which clearly sets out the procedure.

- (h) It shall be the responsibility of a designated club official to enter individual event scores and progressively mark the shooter's card with his 15 metre results. After each 200 targets double barrel regrade the shooter if necessary. Double Barrel scores will be transposed for any better scores from the other events column that have a greater percentage value, ie Continental and Single Barrel. If the 200 targets fall during an event or shoot-off, re-grading will not take place until the completion of that event. All targets to the end of that event and shoot-off targets are to be used in calculation of percentage, except the last target missed in any shoot-off will not be recorded. Once 200 or more targets have been shot at and recorded and after the substitution of any bad scores, the percentage shall be calculated. Regrading and re-handicapping shall not take effect until the end of a day's shooting.

Once you have substituted scores as above, the percentage is then calculated on the total number of targets remaining. This may mean that after 200 targets we substitute a 43/50 with a 25/25 then the percentage calculation would be made from the 175 remaining targets, not the original 200. If you take the scenario the other way and substitute, for example a 19/25 for a 49/50, then the percentage calculation is made out of 225 targets. **Make sure that any substituted score has a greater percentage value than the original score**

Under no circumstances are shooters permitted to alter their own card. Should your card require an alteration please have an authorised Handicapper address the issue.

If you have questions or need to have a Record Card issue resolved, please contact your State Handicapper or State Rules Supervisor for clarification.

NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

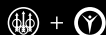
