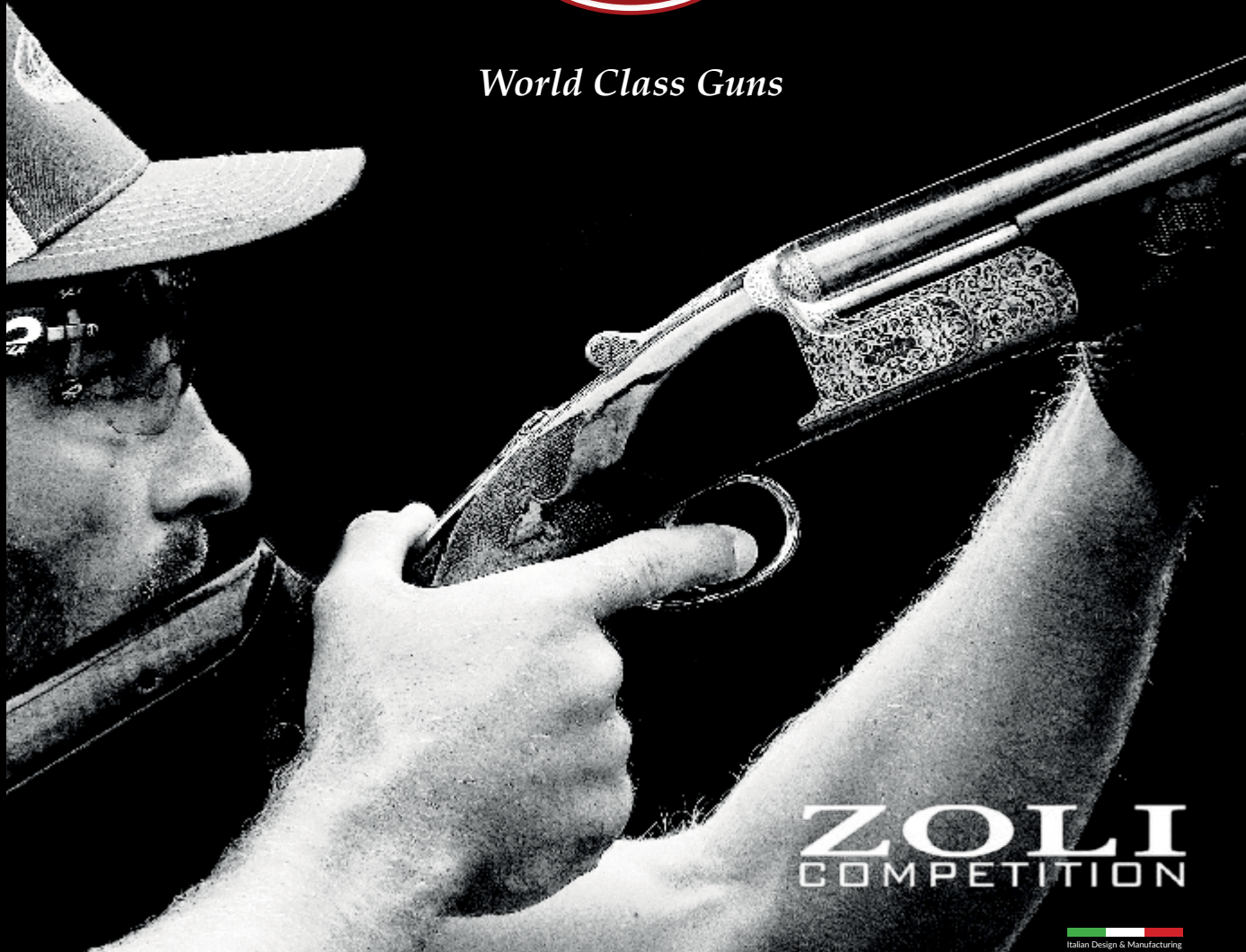

# President's Notes

## Executive Meeting Outcomes

Your Executive met again on Thursday the 25th of October. All Executive members bar one were present for the meeting which was scheduled the day prior to the official NSW Government opening of "The Range" Function Centre.

**Rules** – Matters regarding sound producing earphones and Ball Trap dimension clarifications have been sent to the Rules Supervisors meeting programmed for next year for further consideration face to face.

**CTSN** – With this issue being the last to go to print, it was suggested to approach independent printers to offer a commercial service to members who may wish to retain a Printed/Posted format of the magazine at their cost.

Arrangements have been discussed with a Wagga Wagga local printer around providing printed copies of the CTSN as a commercial arrangement between the printer and those requiring printed versions.

No commitment could be given based on unknown numbers, so NSWCTA has graciously offered to underwrite a minimum print run, with ACTA's only involvement being in granting permission to the printer to use our material, with NSWCTA handling orders etc. For further details please contact NSWCTA office, phone 02 6931 9980.

**Membership By-Law** – It was decided to have a Bi-Law drafted to clarify the Executives interpretation of Clause 38.1 of the Constitution. The proposed content has now been sent to Association lawyers, Lander and Rogers for consideration of its compliance with the constitution.

It is hoped the Bi-Law will clarify what any member can and cannot do, and remove the confusion that exists around the membership clause in the constitution.

**SportsPass** – The Association has decided to no longer support the SportsPass Loyalty Card scheme. Originally provided at no cost to either the Association or membership it has now evolved to require a subscription annually. The Executive did not support the new proposal from SportsPass.

**Quest Apartments** – The Association is pleased to announce that Quest Apartments now provides a 10% discount on its best rates for ACTA members. This offer is also available overseas with Quest's international brands. Quest will advertise this further within the ACTA in the future.

**Budget** – A long budgetary session concluded with a budget showing a small operating profit being accepted. The budget includes allowances for reduction in membership and club affiliation fees and for further development work on the National Grounds. .

## Executive Officer

As advised in last month's magazine, applicants have been sought to take over the Executive Officers position. Close to twenty applications were received and last Wednesday the management sub-committee interviewed four that had been shortlisted. From these four we have now offered the position to a candidate who will likely start with the Association in mid-November after acceptance of contract terms and eventual contract signing. The successful applicant will be named publically when all formalities have been completed.

## Retiring Executive Officer

Much was said of Tony and what he has brought to our Association in the last magazine, but I have to say that to hear the compliments flow at the Official Opening of the Function Centre really made people think about the Associations achievements under Tony's administration. We are a much stronger, more financial and resilient organisation now and I can only see great things developing in the future. Once again we wish Tony and Family all the best for their future.

## The Range – Official Opening

The NSW LNP Coalition Government officially represented by the Honourable Wes Fang MLC Deputy Government Whip, opened the Function Centre on Friday the 26th of October. Two plaques were unveiled, one recognising the LNP Governments contribution of \$5.5 million and the other recognising the Design and Build Team, the Building Committee, the Executive Committee and the financial contribution made through their membership subscriptions by the ACTA general membership.

Over 80 official guests were present to watch the unveiling and to partake in what was a lovely luncheon in a magnificent venue. Past Presidents, Association Patron, Past and Present Executive Members, Sponsors, Representatives from the engineers, builders and architects joined with a large media contingent to help promote this great venue. Wagga Wagga City Council and Riverina Water were also well represented, along with representatives from other shooting bodies and NSW Firearms Division. The positive sentiment in the room for the future of this facility was amazing and although I started out a bit disappointed about some who could not make it, I was very proud and felt extremely comfortable that I was in a crowd of totally positive and appreciative people.

The entry to the centre from Copland street was sealed and fenced prior to the event and is now awaiting landscaping and lighting. This entry will totally change the first impression people get when attending the venue. General landscaping around the facility and for that matter throughout the grounds is now transforming the venue and I think within a year it will be a real oasis for all to be proud of and want to visit.

## CTSN

As all are aware this is currently the last scheduled printed version of the CTSN that will be posted to members by the ACTA. This concludes a 70 year history of print media from the black and white copy in approximate B3 size of 1948 through the newsprint quality copies to the current full gloss we know today. All of these and all future copies will be digitally archived and attached to the ACTA website. There are not many that do not have access to the internet and so I would encourage club members to print out and provide a copy to any fellow members that are computer illiterate. This is what friends do, help their friends in need. Some clubs intend printing a couple of copies out and leaving them around the clubhouse. Anything anybody can do to help during the transition period would be greatly appreciated.

Going digital with the magazine will remove size, weight, and content restrictions that have held the magazine back for years. Please welcome the new digital era and provide more photos, more news and results and any other material your club may wish to promote.

# Executive Officer's Report

New memberships and 2019 renewals opened on the 1st of November, the new year will see a number of changes as you will read in the CTSN, Club Secretaries will be able to renew memberships throughout the year without having to login through the website. NEW members however will need to be added through the website. This should make the process much easier for Clubs to maintain their membership.

Membership for full members will be reduced to \$120.00 from the start of the 2019 membership year, affiliation is also reduced for Clubs to \$240.00, representing significant savings in both areas.

The Western Australian Clay Target Association has been allocated the 2019 5 Stand Sporting Championships. The Association is welcoming the opportunity to showcase the event in WA. Given their record in relation to previously hosting the National Trap and National ISSF Championships I am sure the event will be another first class presentation.

Whilst there will be those who are not convinced the ACTA has made the right decision in abandoning the printing of the CTSN, I suggest within the next 12 months people will be used to the new format, nothing stays the same in life and this is another example of new technology replacing old technology.

There has been a concerted effort to continue to move to digital formats and those who are the most critical of the decision to go digital with the magazine are those prominent on other digital formats of social media. There will always be some people affected by changes, there are however always other options available for those who cannot access through phones or computers.

The ACTA National Executive was advised of my intention to retire before the end of year. I have offered to continue in the position until a new person has been appointed and takes over the position. I have enjoyed the past five plus years in the position however I believe there needs to be a new EO to drive the development and commercialisation of the ACTA over the next five years. I am not in a position to take on another five years.

The Executive Officer's position has been advertised with the appointment of a new EO announced shortly. The ACTA is in a strong position going forward, the Membership is steady with around 14,500 members, consistent over the past 3 years. I don't believe we need to have a specific number of Members, we need to have happy satisfied Members who enjoy the competition and comradery of the club environment. There are opportunities to meet and compete against like-minded people all over Australia in events ranging from Club to Zone, State and National level. There are numerous disciplines available to members that can lead to National selection or just be enjoyed on a social level. The opportunities are endless, it is a matter of what each individual wants from the sport.

It is the right of any member club to have issues raised with the ACTA Executive through their State body, with the issues raised regularly in relation to membership it is astounding that we have not received any recommendations in relation to membership. These recommendations however have to align with the Constitution.

There are many different models for membership throughout many different sports, their membership however does not have four or five organisations providing variations of the sport that are inherently their intellectual property.

The ACTA membership provides competition at Club, Zone, State and National level. Access to over 270 Clubs Nationally. Insurance cover for members, visitors, directors and officers and travelling teams. The sport offers Tower, Trap, Skeet, Ball Trap, ISSF, 5 Stand Sporting and English Sporting.

The ACTA has numerous times met with other shooting organisations to discuss many aspects common to all shooting Associations, they centre around commonalities, firearms firstly, insurance and membership. The ACTA has put forward a number of proposals however they were not accepted nor were "compromises" or further negotiations forthcoming. We will continue to pursue these issues.

Over the very full 2 day course the ladies went through the normal Club Coach Course competencies. Additional to these competencies was a candid look at the strengths and weaknesses of female coaches in general and how to further strengthen their coaching skills.

Since the course these 10 ladies have established a ladies coaching network as well as held ladies open days and specific ladies coaching sessions along with their regular coaching activities at their clubs.

A grade Peter Brown (RRGC) 30/30, Graeme Turner (RRGC) 29/30, B grade Ian Priddle (RRGC) 28/30, Robyn Jackson (Guyra) 27/30, C grade Sam Green (RRGC) and Carlo Pisanu (RRGC) both 26/30.

With near perfect conditions, high scores were expected. The pressure must have been too great for some and as score sheets were handed into the office, clear winners of the medals were apparent, with only two shoot offs required.

Another shoot off was required to determine B Grade between RRG stalwarts Frank Binding and Warren Beddoes. Frank prevailed with 86/95 and Warren 81/95. It was good to see Warren back shooting again. C Grade was taken out by Sam Green (RRGC) 51/60 and Carlo Pisanu (RRGC) 48/60.

The Overall High Gun for the day went to Graeme Turner, well shot Graeme. The Intermediate High Gun was shared by Warren Beddoes and Frank Binding. The Richmond River Gun Club congratulates all NSWCTA State Mixed Title medal winners and thanks all shooters who attended on the day.

# URGENT MEMBER INFORMATION

As from January 2019 the **Clay Target Shooting News** will no longer be produced in a printed format, but will be available as a digital online publication to all ACTA Members.

Those Members who have already supplied the ACTA with an email address will be sent an automated link to click on, that will enable them to either read the magazine online or download for storage and personal printing if needed.

Members should ensure that they add their email address to their personal data by either going online to ACTA "MY PAGE" or by having their Club Secretary add a relevant email address to their information.

## Full Membership and Club Affiliation Reduced

In light of the savings made with changes to subsidies and taking the CTSN to a digital platform only, the full Executive voted to lower the cost of Full Membership to \$120.00 to encourage further Full Membership of the Association.

All other memberships categories are to remain the same as 2017 / 2018 with no CPI applied.

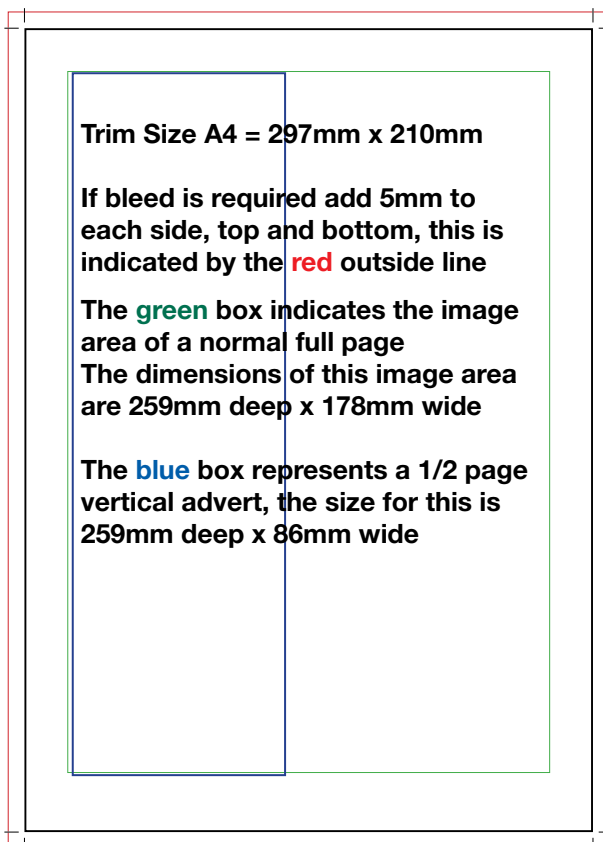

# Nathan Argiro – World Cup Men’s Junior Gold Medalist

Changwon International Shooting Centre, Changwon, Korea

**Two World Championship debutants battled for the Trap Men’s Junior Gold medal at the Changwon International Shooting Centre in Changwon (KOR).**

Australia’s Nathan Steven Argiro — whose best result in a Junior World Cup is a 5th place at this year’s competition in Sydney (AUS) — prevailed over 18-year-old Logan Joseph Lucas of the United States of

America, making his first start ever in an ISSF competition.

Despite missing three of his last five targets, Australian Nathan Argiro finished with Gold, preceding Silver medalist Logan Joseph Lucas of the United States of America and Bronze medalist Lorenzo Ferrari of Italy.

Halfway through the final, the two youngsters were already standing in 1st and 2nd position, with the Australian leading the American by the smallest margin. By missing six of the following 10 targets, however, Lucas allowed Argiro to take a four-hit lead, a lead that the young Australian shooter almost threw away when he missed three of his final five targets, finishing with 42 total hits out of 50 targets and securing the brightest medal.

Lucas concluded in 2nd position and won Silver with 41 hits.

On the highest step of the team podium Australia claimed the Gold medal with 348 total hits.

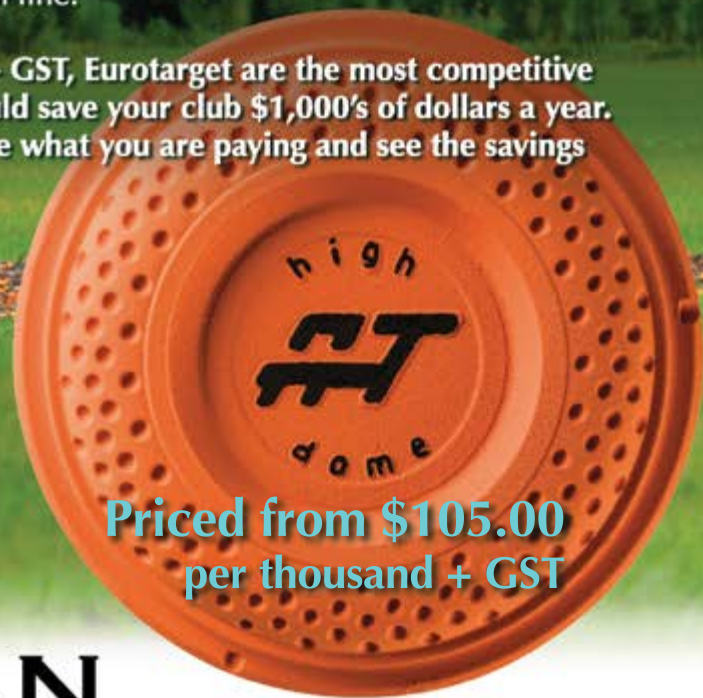

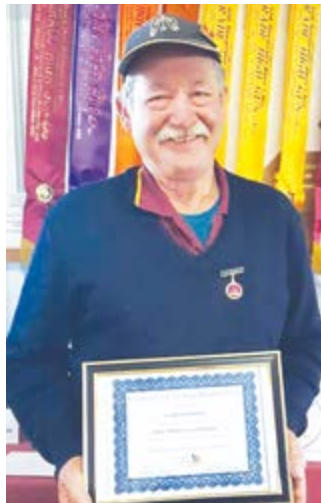

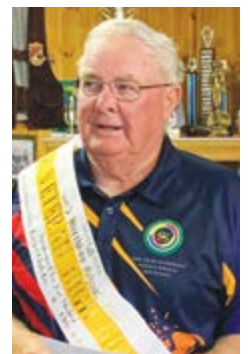

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

## Hypnosis for sport again

As I stated last month, I am reprinting some articles on hypnosis because of some requests I had from shooters at the Nationals. As a psychologist, I see hypnosis as a valuable tool for helping athletes enhance performance,

deal with injury, and stay mentally tough.

Hypnosis, for the athlete, can be divided into two areas: self-hypnosis and hypnosis induced by a professional (psychologist, doctor or dentist). Both follow a four-phase approach for using hypnosis in sport.

The preparation phase involves preparing a person by finding out about their attitudes to hypnosis and what they expect of the process. This phase is very important because the misconceptions, doubts and myths regarding hypnosis have to be dispelled, so that athlete will feel comfortable and trusting because they understand the true nature of hypnosis. If the athlete has fears, anxieties or apprehensions about the process, then this will negatively affect the outcomes and limit the benefits of the process. It is in the preparatory phase that the hypnotherapist will do some suggestibility tests and exercises. These exercises are designed to see how suggestible the athlete will be and train the athlete to listen and follow the instructions of the hypnotherapist.

The second phase is the induction phase. There many types of induction techniques: eye-fixation or focused concentration, for example. There is a similarity between the methods used for inducing hypnosis and those used for relaxation.

In the third phase, according to Winter & Martin, is the performance phase. In this phase the person is sufficiently relaxed that he or she is in a state of hypnosis. The person will still be aware of the sounds and noises outside the room : actually their concentration is much more focused, so the noises will sound clearer and louder. For the athlete, he or she is now in a stage of mind that the person is more likely to respond to suggestions such as "You can see your goals more and more clearly". The suggestions for athletes usually involve ego strengthening which focus on them feeling more confident, competent, composed and fearless. (Regular readers of this column will remember that these are the qualities of mental toughness). Where possible the suggestions should be positive and personally relevant to the athlete. For those people who use hypnosis for weight loss, or to quit smoking, for example; the suggestions involve getting the person to experience some change in feelings, attitudes, thoughts and reactions. It is essential that the suggestions in hypnosis are positive and ego-strengthening and not aversive and negative. Several years ago, I had a client who went to a hypnotherapist for treatment to give up smoking. The hypnotherapist (who was not a registered psychologist) gave the client suggestions that "he would feel bad about himself every time he had a cigarette." These suggestions meant that every time my client had a cigarette he would feel angry, depressed and guilty. After several months, his parents contacted me because the client, a young man in his twenties, was depressed and suicidal. It was necessary to re-induce a hypnotic state and to alter the suggestions so that the client did not feel bad about himself, each time he had a cigarette. Coupled with strengthening his ego, I gave him suggestions that reduced his need to smoke. After only two

sessions he was back to normal with respect to his attitude to life and after several months he gave up smoking because he no longer had a need to smoke.

The final phase is the re-alerting phase. This is the debriefing phase where the client is asked how they felt about the experience. It is usual that most people are surprised that they did not fall asleep and that they could still hear things. This is the time that questions can be answered.

According to Winter & Martin, the value of hypnosis, over many other techniques used in sport psychology is that it can be used to change stored ideas, memories or feeling more quickly and effectively than just talking about them.

Usually before I commence hypnosis with any of my clients, I give them a relaxation exercise to do as home work for a week or so before the hypnotherapy sessions begin.

The following technique is derived from hatha yoga and consists of allowing one muscle group to rest after another from the head down to the feet if sitting and the feet up to the head if lying down – whilst allowing the process to an awareness of one's breath.

*Begin by taking three deep breathes as you make yourself comfortable by placing your feet flat on the floor and your hands easily in your lap.*

*Gently let your eyes close and continue to take deep slow breathes. Listen for a moment to the sounds you can hear outside the room, then further inside to awareness of your physical position and the contact you make with the chair. Take a deeper breath, hold it for the count of four, then let it go very slowly, maybe to the count of eight. Then as you continue to breathe normally, pay attention to the muscles around your face: your forehead, your eyes, the muscles around your eyes, your cheeks, your mouth, your jaw, your neck and imagine any tension draining away through your shoulders, your arms, wrists, hands, thumbs and fingers.*

*Notice that your chest is relaxed, your back, your stomach, waist and pelvis. Pay attention to your thighs, stay with any tension you may find and then over the next out breath, imagine it draining away through your knees, through your calves, through your ankles, through your feet and into the floor; leaving you calm, relaxed and alert. Remain in this state for a few minutes before stretching and opening your eyes.*

If you include mental rehearsal in your mental training program, doing it immediately after a relaxation session will make it more effective. The benefit of this relaxation exercise is to be mindful of your body in the here and now: if you can do that at rest then you will also be able to do it out on the tracks. By staying in the present you will be able to focus on the target more successfully.

The Roma Club sadly has lost two of its main stalwarts during this year.

The passing of brothers, Bob and Geoff Bryant, both Past Presidents and both Life Members of the club has left a large void in the clubs senior ranks.

Both began shooting clays whilst employed at "Avanel" west of Roma in the early 1960's with Bob having continuous membership until his passing on the 26th April and Geoff only missing membership for a period in the eighties and nineties before his eventual passing on the 15th of September.

Their involvement at the club was not only at an administrative level as President and Committee members, and in Bob's case also as Patron for many years, but also in a practical, hands on way. Both had a wealth of mechanical and construction experience and also the tools, ability and willingness to go with it and get things done. The truly Australian way. Much of what exists at the club now has had their hand involved. Almost all that existed at the old club was constructed by them. Those that can remember the old pipe trussed clubhouse roof at the old club may not have known that those pipe trusses were cut by hand with hacksaws by Bob and Geoff prior to welding. Photos exist of them demolishing old layouts with explosives and of laying the "new" concrete



tracks and traphouses at the old grounds in the seventies.

Both competed at a high level and shot for Australia in Glenn Cup matches against New Zealand. Geoff had excelled at skeet, something he only began shooting in the late 90's and Bob was a dedi-

cated trapshooter and a member of the 1980 "Banana Bender" Queensland team that won the inaugural Interstate Shoulder to Shoulder teams match at the Trap Nationals in Perth in 1980. Both were well travelled shooters, well known across Australia, but Geoff also competed in South Africa, New Zealand and Ireland in later years.

Bob and Geoff spent their life mostly in rural and mechanical pursuits, with Bob owning Service Stations in both Roma and Toowoomba and doing contract yard building and windmill work throughout the west. Geoff worked in earthmoving and artesian bore drilling and at the time of his death was one of the very few to still hold an Artesian well borers license in Australia.

Both men were strong men, had strong personalities and were renowned for not holding back if necessary. There were not many of us onetime younger shooters that were not pulled up early in our careers for some indiscretion by one of these two and I can vouch for the fact you knew you had been corrected and we are all the better for it.

The older members of the club will miss these two members and the younger members will sadly never get to really know them now. An era has passed.

Plans are in place for a memorial shoot to be held annually in February for Bob (The Oliver Trophy) and a decision is yet to be made regarding Geoff. We extend our best wishes to both their families and especially to Betty and Veronika.

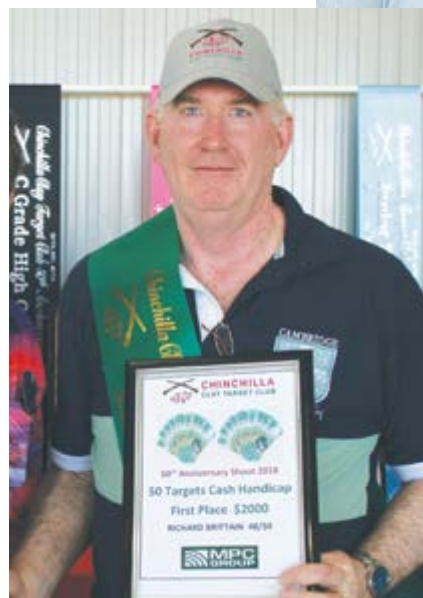

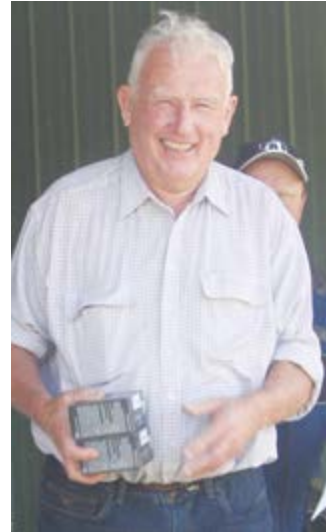

- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

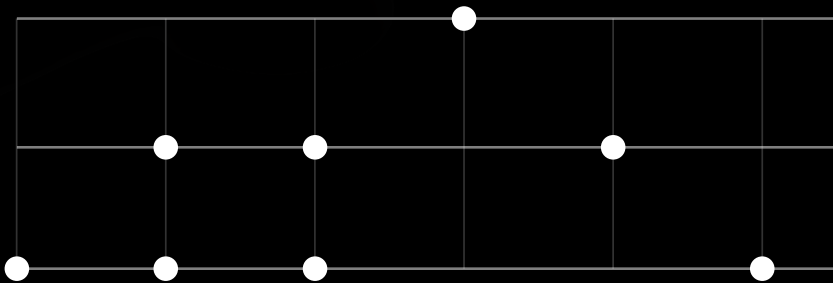
