In late September to early October 2018, the Australian skeet team competed at the 83rd World Skeet Championships held by the National Skeet Shooting Association (NSSA) in San Antonio, Texas. There were 630 shooters in the mini championship and 754 who participated in the main event in hot and humid conditions with heavy downpours.

The Australian team of Michael Buttigieg, David O'Sullivan, Jack Stockdale, Adrian Cousens and Salvatore (Sam) Agostino won the five-man 12 Gauge Zone Championship (742/750) – the second time the team has won the event since 2012 – as well as the five-man 12 Gauge World Division Championship. For the 12 Gauge main event, the team members scores were: Michael Buttigieg 150/150, David O'Sullivan 150/150, Adrian Cousens 148/150, Sam Agostino 148/150 and Jack Stockdale 146/150.





Their commendable shooting continued through the main event, with the team winning the High Overall (HOA) fiveman World Division Championship with a total of 2183/2250 across all gauges. Each member of the team also experienced significant individual successes. Most notably, two shooters stood on the podium, with Jack Stockdale winning 3rd overall in the 12 Gauge event of the Mini World championship and Michael Buttigieg also finishing 3rd overall in the Main World 12 Gauge event.

Michael, along with Harry Bader, set the yearly 20 Gauge long run record with perfect scores of 225/225, meaning neither shooter missed a single 20 Gauge target through the duration of the World Championships. Furthermore, Michael and fellow Australians David O'Sullivan and Glenn Clarke shot 150/150s in the Krieghoff 12 Gauge event – three of just 28 perfect scores for the day.



In the main Doubles event, there were only eleven possibles (100/100) shot, which included David O'Sullivan who finished AAA 5th. David set the Australian yearly long run in Doubles with 145 straight. Sam Agostino also started off the world championships well with a 99/100 in the Mini World Doubles event, claiming AAA 3rd. He and fellow Australian Matthew De Paoli won the two-man triple sub team in both the 12 Gauge and 20 Gauge in the main event.

Adrian Cousens was warmly welcomed back to the World Shoot nearly two decades after his last attendance. Members of the Australian team attended the NSSA's Hall of Fame, where Adrian's previous successes on the world stage were recognised by the NSSA. He surpassed 90,000 registered NSSA targets at this World Shoot and had stand out performances in shooting 148/150 in the 12 Gauge event and an

extremely respectable 99/100 in the 410 Bore. After a successful Doubles shoot off in the 410, he won the seniors section and finished AAA 8th.

In total, there were 29 Australian shooters who competed at the World Championships, many of whom had considerable achievements in grades and personal bests. Fours shooters in particular stood out, each winning the overall in small gauge events in their grades and taking home new shotguns – Michael Buttigieg 20G AA1 100/100, Matthew De Paoli 20G A1 100/100, Richard Ball 28G B1 98/100 and 410 Bore B1 98/100,

and Tahnee Davenport 20G C1 99/100. Other shooters had victories in their concurrent individual and team divisions, including Nigel and Lorraine Hughes who won the HOA husband and wife team (860/900), and Mal Briggs and Paul Johnston who won the HOA two-man senior team (851/900). The total cost of the project was \$7.3 million.


Former ACTA Executive Officer Tony Turner said the building provided a bright future for the sport – the Wagga facility now rated as one of the best in the world.

In this article there are some relaxation scripts for deeper relaxation through breathing and guided imagery and ego-strengthening and goal rehearsal scripts from Gordon Milne's *Hypnosis and the Art of Self-Therapy*.

Relaxation Script

- 1. Gently close your eyes . . . settle back comfortably . . . feet together, hands resting on the sides of the chair or on your thighs (5).
- 2. Take a deep breath and hold it (5). Let go the breath and feel yourself letting go the tension as you breathe out.
- 3. Again . . . deep breath and hold I t(5). Let go the breath and feel yourself letting go the tension as you breathe out.
- 4. In a moment I am going to say five relaxing phases . . . as I say each phase slowly . . . breathe in deeply . . . then as you breathe out repeat the phrase slowly . . . not aloud, just think it in your mind as you breathe out . . .
- 5. Letting go the tension now (5). Unwinding now, as I breathe out (5). Feeling the calm and the relaxation (5), flowing all through my mind and body (5). Relaxing all over (5)
- 6. Once more (repeat).
- 7. And I want you to notice that each time you breathe out, you become more and more completely relaxed over your whole body . . .
- 8. Just take a minute taking deep breaths and saying "letting go of the tension" as you breathe out. Start now (60)
- 9. Good now focus your whole attention on your body where it is lying (5) Feel how comfortable it is, from your toes . . . to your scalp.
- 10. Just think of nothing else but how your body feels at this moment (5) If your attention wanders bring it straight back to your body's feelings (5)
- 11. And once more I want you to notice each time you breathe out, you become more and more completely relaxed over your whole body . . .
- 12. Deep breath now, and hold it (5) say to yourself as you breathe out "letting go of the tension" (5) now repeat this over and over for one minute, until I stop you (60)
- 13. Now focus your attention on your legs . . . from your toes to your thighs . . . just let it happen on its own . . . first your toes . . . and a nice, calm, soothing relaxed feeling is beginning in your toes . . . and moving into your feet (5)

- 14. from your feet, past your ankles . . . into your legs (5) past your knees . . . into the thighs(10)
- 15. a numb, heavy wooden like feeling is moving up from your toes . . . into your feet (5), past your ankles and into your legs . . . and into your thighs (5)
- 16. just let all those muscles in your legs go completely limp, relaxed and numb(5) the same sort of feeling you get if you sit cross legged for very long(5) a numb heavy wooden like feeling . . . your legs are so heavy they are sinking right down where you are resting (10)
- 17. Now I want you to notice the same feeling moving from your thighs into your body . . . into your abdomen (5), into your chest v, your back (5). Just let all those muscles in your chest, your back, and your abdomen go completely limp and relaxed (10)
- 18. It may be a very heavy, numb feeling . . . or a floating feeling . . . or it may be a heavy and a floating feeling (5) Your subconscious mind will decide which feeling you should have (10). Good.
- 19. Now think of your face and forehead (5), and feel your face and forehead smooth out with relaxation (5) as the tension flows out . . . and the relaxation flows in to take its place. (10)
- 20. The muscles around your eyes (5) and around your mouth (5) let them relax(10)And let the muscles in your jaw feel limp and loose as your lips part slightly as the tension lets go. (10)
- 21. The relaxation spreads from your forehead (5), through your scalp (5), to the back of your neck, where so much tension gathers... and feel the back of your neck go limp and soft and loose as the muscles let go and the tension flows out. (10)
- 22. The shoulder muscles too . . . let them go limp (5) That numb wooden like feeling spreading down your arms from your shoulders to your fingers . . . your arms feel like dead weights where they are resting (5), so much you doubt whether you could move them . . . but you don't want to move them (5), A heavy detached feeling is in your arms . . . as if you've been sleeping on them (10).
- 23. Now I'm going to count from 1 to 20 . . . and as I count . . . each time I count . . . I want you to let yourself sink more and more deeply into this nice relaxed state. .
- 24. 1 . . . deeper and deeper . . . 2 . . . more and more calmly relaxed . . 3 . . . nicely, deeply now . . . 4 . . . 5 . . sinking deeper and deeper . . . 6 . . . 7 . . . 8 . . . 9 . . . 10 . . . half way there . . . so relaxed that nothing can disturb you . . . 11 . . . 12 . . . 13 . . . 14 . . . 15 . . . going down to a deeper, tranquil state of mind . . . 16 . . . 17 . . . 18 . . . 19 . . . 20 . . .
- 25. Completely relaxed now . . . eyes so heavy you don't think you can open them . . . just feel your whole body thoroughly and completely relaxed, it's so calm, so peaceful to remain in this nice, relaxed state.

26. Just remain in this nice, quiet state until I speak to you again. (60)

Ego-strengthening Script

- 1. Now listen carefully to what I say . . . While you're in this calm, comfortable, relaxed state . . . your mind is so sensitive and receptive to suggestions I give you . . . that each will flow straight into your unconscious mind . . . where, as you repeat it daily, it will be indelibly implanted . . .
- 2. For a long time you have been giving yourself negative self-statements...and negative self-images...while you are tense and anxious...and these have become implanted in your subconscious mind...
- 3. Now, because you are relaxed and calm . . . these positive suggestions I give you will cancel out the negative self-statements from the past . . . which have caused you such harm . . .
- 4. Tell yourself . . . 'Everyday I can feel physically strong and fit . . .
- 5. "I can enjoy being alert . . . wide awake . . . and energetic . . . and find my-self calm . . . composed . . . and tranquil . . .
- 6. Every day I will become more and more completely relaxed and less tense . . .
- 7. 'I will accept myself as self confident and self assured . . .
- 8. Everyday I will play the Inner Game . . . with goal rehearsal . . . the obstacles will diminish . . .
- 9. 'As I feel closer and closer to my important goal . . . enjoying the winning feeling the obstacles will melt away . . .
- 10. 'As I activate my full potential in the Inner Game . . . my unconscious mind tells me that I can soon achieve it somewhere . . .
- 11. 'For before long I will be fully equipped to overcome physical and technical difficulties in the outer game . . . '

The goal rehearsal for the inner game continues with the goal rehearsal script below. The object of the goal rehearsal and the ego-strengthening scripts is to develop a level of mental toughness necessary to perform at a maximum level. Mental toughness components, such as confidence, composure, competence, competitiveness, etc can be improved and maintained through these processes.

Goal Rehearsal Script

- 1. There is a large TV screen in your room, and as you focus your attention on it, it lights up. Then you have a clear three dimensional image of yourself...
- 2. As you continue to watch, you will be able to view yourself demonstrating a peak performance (10) (Watch yourself shoot 25 straight, clear round of skeet, etc)
- 3. In your imagination each of your sensory and motor systems is activated as you watch . . . so that you will actually feel that you are performing (5) Feel the weight of the gun, the recoil, the smell of the shell, the sight of the smoked target.
- 4. It maybe that you have caught yourself in a past peak performance . . . such as you have been striving to achieve again for a longtime (10)
- 5. You mayor may not be engaged in a contest . . . but you are completely involved with that winning feeling (10).
- 6. Repeat over and over again, as necessary. Let the TV screen

fade away, focus on your breathing (10) then move on to the dehypnotizing script.

Dehypnotising script: In a few moments I'm going to count backwards from 20 to 1. As I do you will gradually return to your normal state feeling . . . losing numbness, heaviness, or any other unusual feeling . . . your mind will return to it's normal alert contact with the outside world . . . On the count of 3 your eyes will begin to open . . . on the count of 1 your eyes will be wide open and you will feel GOOD . . . calm, relaxed, and confident. Ready now . . . 20, 19, 18, etc . . . 3, 2, 1. Feel good now calm and alert.

Whilst it is best to practice this process in full several times per week, elements of the process, especially some of the breathing components can be practiced whenever you have time. This might be when you are in a queue at the bank or post office, for example. By practicing it in these settings you will be able to use these skills to help you focus before a competition or refocus during a competition. You can also use these techniques to go over your performance: to reinforce those things that went right and to restructure those things that need changing.





Len and Lil Baker Memorial



licence and ACTA membership until his passing. Guyra shooters would see his 1967 Dodge Phoenix rumble across the grass at the club grounds, with his hat peering above the steering wheel and his old Miroku in the copious boot

Since his old shooting vest had seen better days, his equipment included a cartridge pouch made from an old handbag and belt, both purchased at St Vincent de Paul! Being a Ben Lomond carrier he had the job of transporting the stringy bark logs, used in the construction of the Guyra Club House, which was built in the 1960s. He was one of the shooters

who would remember the hand pull device and the trap set up in an old ship's water tank.

In recent years he was attending a club shoot in Guyra and asked Tim Bourke in the office for a couple of boxes of cartridges. "Do you want No 8 or 7.5 shot?" asked Tim.

"Doesn't matter," came the reply, "Anything will do, as long as they're not loaded with sand! Make sure they've got shot in them!"

In November 1968 his two sons, Jim and Bernie, were woken at about midnight to be proudly shown the Winchester he had won that day at the Guyra Open Shoot, a 30 Target Double Barrel event. The hospitality of Athol Cregan, Club President at the time, was legendary, as was the camaraderie of the Guyra shooters! Celebrations went on well into the night as Vince made the most of one of his biggest wins.

In 1972 he won a sapphire at the Inverell RSM Club, for the 40 Target Commonwealth Continental Single Barrel Championship. He was always proud of this victory.

He was a regular visitor to Ballandean with his Guyra mates in the late 60s and early 70s where he was always competitive and successful. He would travel to shoots at Gunnedah/Boggabri, Narrabri and Coffs Harbour.

He enjoyed telling the story of shooting at the old Glen Innes club, north of the town, on the main road to Deepwater. Mackenzies Store in Deepwater had the reputation, at the time, of being rather poorly stocked. His squad prepared for their event this day and the first shooter called, "Pull!"

"CLICK, CLICK" was heard and the referee and shooter examined the gun. "It's like Mackenzies Store in Deepwater," stated the shooter, "There's nothing bloody in it!"

Junior training with a difference



All over the Country, there are always training sessions being held for our upcoming juniors. South Australia is no different, and, on Thursday October 11, SACTA offered a coaching day to juniors that are already competing to encourage their development.

Our State Junior Development Chair, was tasked with putting on a coaching session that was open to any junior clay target shooter. An acknowledgement of appreciation must be offered here to the growing number of juniors and their parents for taking an interest in this type of diversified improvement style for our sport of clay target shooting, a sport that seems to be getting more popular as each year goes by. The coaching was offered free of charge to our juniors on the day with the generosity of our sponsors. We also thank the students for taking part in this clinic.

Each and every one of our juniors that was asked took away some pearls of wisdom from the guest speakers information and were thankful for the opportunity to be involved. The day was about promoting issues that are often overlooked when being trained at this level and these trainings are usually reserved for the athletes at a more elite level.

The first of our guest speakers was Luke Higgins. I asked Luke to send us a brief overview of his lecture of the day and this is included below:

I was invited to be involved with the junior training day held at Monarto Clay Target Club, to talk about clay target shooting and vision. In attendance was a group of South Australian Clay Target Association juniors who were all keen to learn ways to improve their performance – a hallmark of future champions.

As a keen clay target competitor myself, I was more than happy to provide any advice and help to our juniors, that are the future of our sport. The target sports have a greater

emphasis on vision and vision performance than any other sport. Simply put - you can't shoot what you can't see. As an optometrist and a clay target shooter I am interested in how we utilise and train our visual system to achieve improved performance.

During the junior clinic I gave a presentation on the following topics:

General ocular anatomy [overview of how the eye works] What makes up vision

- -Visual acuity [how small the target can be that the human eye can see it].
- Contrast sensitivity [how well we can see a target compared to its background].

- Visual fields [how well we detect targets across our field of vision and how this allows us to detect and track targets].
- Binocular vision [how our eyes work together to give us accurate 'single' vision and depth perception].
- Eye Muscles [how eye movements help track targets].
- Colour vision [the incidence of colour deficiency within the population and ways to manage this].
- -Tear film/dry

eye [the importance of the ocular surface for clear vision].

Once we had covered these aspects, we delved into how to get the most out of these components of our vision. We covered the importance of having our best vision through spectacles and contact lenses, choosing correct tints for improving contrast and reducing glare symptoms but still allowing enough light through to allow our eyes to perform at their best, utilizing the more sensitive parts of our visual field for fast target acquisition and speed of tracking, eye exercises to improve tracking accuracy and to warm up our eyes before competition, eye dominance issues, and how to deal with colour deficiency [colour blindness].

Getting the most out of our vision has a direct correlation with improved scores on the range. The object of my presentation to our future champions was to demonstrate the complexity of the human's visual system and to give advice on how to get the most out of this great asset so that they break more clays consistently and with greater ease!

Dr Luke Higgins – Optometrist B. MSc [V. Sc.], M. Optometry, Oc. Therapeutics, Spec. Cert MLVP, Lecturer – Flinders University Clinical Optometrist and Sports Vision Consultant – Luke Higgins Optometry

At the end of Luke's session the floor was open to questions, and the next half hour saw a barrage of personal development questions being had on a one-on-one basis between juniors and Luke.

Following on from Luke's presentation was our next guest speaker. *Mike Fenwick* presented our juniors the

Psychological Skills of Shooting. I also asked Mike to send us a brief overview which is attached below:

Brief overview of Psychological Skills Session. The introduction to using the mind/body connection to enhance consistent performance.

with good
execution of
skills. They learnt

how Imagery is a useful skill for preparing, performance & focusing on the processes to get a positive outcome. Students learnt that the way they think (speak to themselves) will influence their ability to perform - the need to speak to themselves like their best friend would. Juniors now need to know how to flip a negative thought to a positive thought.

Affirmations are also important to setting up positive habits for life & sport. The key to executing a skill well is to focus on the processes to produce a positive outcome. Focusing on the outcome only produces pressure. Greater understanding of the brain functions will allow participants to develop positive habits for sport & life.



The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

The magenta box represents a 1/2 page horizontal advert, the size for this is 126.5mm deep x 178mm wide

The cyan box shown represents a 1/4 page vertical, its new dimensions are 126.5mm deep x 86mm wide

The black box shown represents a 1/4 page horizontal, its new dimensions are 60mm deep x 178mm wide

The orange box above represents a 1/8 page, its new dimensions are 60mm deep x 86mm wide


