President's Notes

"Clay Target"

This being the second electronic edition of "Clay Target" I would like to thank those that have supported the concept. Statistics from the third party "delivery" company tell

us that just on half of the membership opened the E-magazine last month. This is believed to be above expectations when digitisation of a publication occurs. We actually have no idea of how many of the printed copies were never opened, but we have all seen them lying around still in a bag. We are now actively sourcing content so as the magazine evolves you can look forward to product reviews, competitions and more current news. We would welcome club history articles and information from states and zones that you may wish to circularise.

30 Year Concessional Membership

Following a review of fees conducted last year, a reduction to the Full member category of \$18 was approved, mostly supported by the savings from digitisation of this magazine. An unintended consequence of the reduction was that the difference between the Full membership and the 30 year Concessional membership was reduced to only \$2.00. The Executive has now decided that the 30 Year Concessional membership cost will be the same as other discounted memberships and it has now been reduced to \$84.00. Members who may have paid for the ensuing year, prior to this decision have had the balance refunded. The Executive thought that this reduction recognises the importance of long standing loyal members to the Association.

ISSF Nationals – Brisbane

The ISSF Championships will be starting with full fields in the major event. Brisbane club has left no stone unturned to ensure the delivery of a quality experience for visiting shooters. The event management team led by ACTA CEO, Paul McLoughlin, Executive member Colin Kneebone and Technical delegate, Glenis Lawrence are keen to conduct a professional event. We look forward to reporting some great scores in the next edition of "Clay Target"

Hall of Fame

Donations to the ACTA Hall of Fame continue to come in but very slowly. The area still needs trophy display cases and

more work on the mural. Donations can be made direct by contacting the ACTA or via the Australian Sports Foundation thus guaranteeing their tax deductibility. I have been very surprised at the lack of interest in this important part of the ACTA history. The display is eventually meant to be the major expression of who we are, where we come from and where we are going. Some public support from high profile members would assist greatly in getting this ball rolling.

ACTA Firearms Insurance

The current Firearms policy providing \$12,000 of cover within your membership cost and the ability to increase the cover to \$25,000 by the payment of an additional \$10 is now the greatest value in Firearms Insurance available. The ACTA absorbed a sizeable increase in premium this year to be able to still provide this cover within your membership cost. Some other shooting bodies have increased their insurance costs charged to their members by just under 50% making ours now the best value in the market.

Trap Nationals – Roma

There are still limited sites available at the club for campers. The Pre-Nominations for both the Pre-Nationals and Nationals are now open on the ACTA website. Please remember the Nationals are Pre-Nomination only. The club is working tirelessly to provide great targets, great camping facilities, good food and a pleasurable experience for all who attend.

National Ground

The National Ground under the stewardship of Marcus Pim has continued to improve in appearance. Landscaping continues around the new complex and other areas around the ground are being rejuvenated. The grounds are a credit to our new caretaker and I thank him for his efforts.

ICTSF World DTL 2020

With our Sporting Team preparing to attend the ICTSF World English Sporting event in Ireland this year the ICTSF has selected Bywell in England for the 2020 DTL event. Dates are yet to be confirmed but I think it will be safe to assume they will begin in early July 2020. The event will be preceded by some quite prestigious lead up events conducted over three days prior. ACTA will be selecting a full 17 person team at the Trap Nationals at Roma this year.

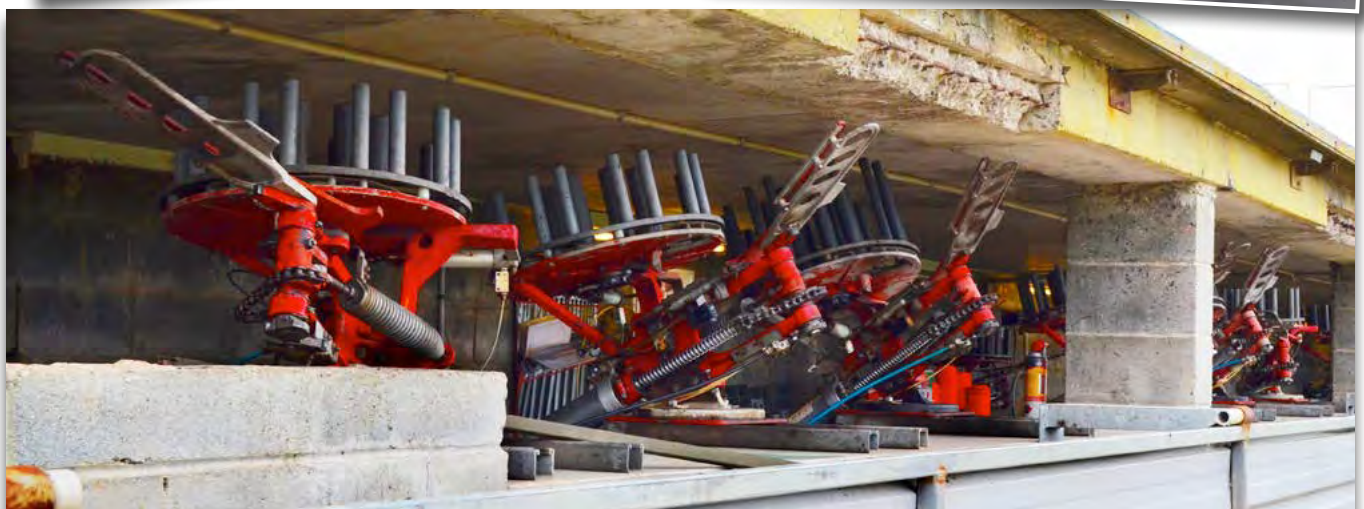

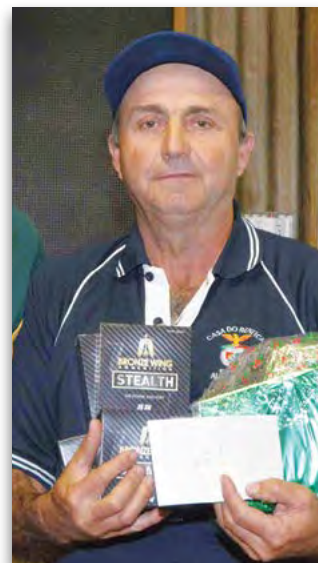

2018 National Trap Championships 1st April – 7th April 2019 OFFICIAL PROGRAM

To be staged at the Roma Gun Club, Roma Qld, by the Australian Clay Target Association.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2019 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2019 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2019 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence before competing.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors, Veterans and Super Veterans, except the Grand Australian.

Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open Section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Juniors, Veterans and Super Veterans sections; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Competitors must be over the age of 12 (NSW Firearms).

Veterans – are those competitors who, will be over the age of 55 years and under 65 years as of the 1st January.

Super Veterans – are those aged 65 years and older as of the 1st January.

Juniors – are those competitors who, will be under the age of 21 years as of the 1st January.

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 16 years as of the 1st January.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late

for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Sub-Committee. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified – an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior, Veterans and Super Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice may be available throughout the championships.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

The shoot offs will continue under the event format until a winner has been determined or at the discretion of the Tournament Director a different format is required to finalise the event. Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament director decides. In such a case the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Authority

This program shall control the 2019 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2019 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 4.16 (a) & (b)

Psychological Skills for Shooting

The Inner Game: it is important

Back in 1999 I started writing these articles for the CTSN. Initially, I was armed with an extensive knowledge of psychology and had been shooting most of my life and whilst I knew a lot about psychology and lot about shooting, I quickly found that I needed to learn about the psychology of shooting.

When I started to research "sport psychology" for shooters, I was directed to *The Inner Game of Golf* by Tim Gallwey. Regular readers will know I found this book fascinating as it seemed to explain what was happening when each of us play the outer game of golf or shooting and the Inner Game of golf or shooting.

Recently after a clinic I ran for the Southern Sports Academy golf squad I received this email from one of the team:

"I bought the book "the inner game of golf" and I find that it is really improving my head game and teaching me skills I didn't know there were."

I recently received a CD from the Inner Game foundation in USA which was a "conversation with Tim Gallwey" in which Tim talked about his books and the philosophy behind the inner game. It is interesting to note that the Inner Game Books were originally written in the seventies.

Shooting, like all sports, involves two games; the outer game and the inner game. The outer game involves the sport itself; shooting the target. The outer game involves physical fitness, well fitting gun, reliable ammunition, correct stance and gun hold and all of the variables that are outside the shooter. The inner game involves mental fitness and relies on the individual to have trust in their own ability to do what is required. Inner game strategies involve concentration, mental rehearsal, awareness, attention, relaxation, goal setting, etc.

The problem with either trap or skeet shooting is that an error will usually cost you the game or the match. There are rarely, second chances. In tennis, you can be down forty – love and still win the game; one or two poor strokes in Golf doesn't put you out. However, depending on the day, 24/25 or 49/50 may not be good enough. If a person can do something as difficult and as complicated as shoot a small moving object 49 times out of 50, then the problem is not with their technique, equipment or ability. The problem is most likely involves the inner game. We miss because we doubt our own ability.

To understand self doubt it is necessary to look at how the brain functions. Basically and for the purposes of this discussion, the brain is divided into two halves; the right side and the left side. These different sides play an important role in our ability to shoot, play golf, tennis, etc. The right side of the brain is responsible for muscle movement and

co-ordination. In shooting this involves seeing the target, identifying it, tracking it, moving the body, holding the gun correctly, pulling the trigger and following through. The right side of the brain does and can continue to do these functions effortlessly and continuously. All that it required is that the muscles need to be relaxed.

The left side of the brain however, houses our language, analytical and judgemental skills. The left side also believes that our right side is incapable of doing what is necessary and therefore provides it with a barrage of instructions and "coaching tips" so that it can do it properly. In his book, *The Inner Game of Golf*, Tim Gallwey identifies these two sides of the brain as ego states and calls them Self-1 for the left side and Self-2 for the right side of the brain. Gallwey found that when he was involved in a competition he would have to continually listen to a range of self-instructional thoughts. On closer analysis of these thoughts he determined that it was Self-1 doing the talking, it thought he knew how to play and was supervising Self-2, the one who had to hit the ball or hit the clay target in respect to shooting. Self-1 did not only give Self-2 instructions but criticised Self-2 for past errors, warned Self-2 about probable future ones, and harangued him whenever he makes a mistake. These instructions and judgements lead to an increase in tension, which in turn tightens the muscles; the result, is that we are no longer fluid or relaxed and therefore we cannot perform to our potential.

To summarise Self-1 – the talking, thought producing self – is a lousy boss when it comes to control the body's muscle system. When Self-2 – the body itself – is allowed control, the quality of performance, the level of enjoyment and the rate of learning are all improved. Self-2 is the total human organism, the natural entity. Self-1 does not have a physical existence; it is a phenomenon of mental self-interference who can and does interfere with our ability to perform.

For the brain to function closer to its potential the interference needs to be minimised. This means that the basic premise of the inner game is; $\text{Performance} = \text{Self-2 (potential)} - \text{Self-1 (interference)}$. The object of inner game is to limit the interference of self - and trust in Self-2 to perform and achieve.

Inner game techniques involve applying mental training skills that enable the shooter to maintain concentration, optimise performance and achieve results. These skills are not just the province of elite sportspeople; they can be learnt, so we can increase our performance, enjoyment and fun involved in competition.

Every time we compete, we make judgements as to our performance. When we are winning, we enjoy the handshakes, pats on the back and as a result we see ourselves and

what we did as good. However, when we lose a competition or miss a shot, it is just as easy for us to judge what we did as bad. This value judgement of our performance has wide reaching implications. For example, for a right-handed shooter, missing a hard right hand swinger from lane five. It is possible that Self-1 will say something like: "... you missed again, you always miss those right hand swingers, your'e really no good at these." If left unchecked and you miss that shot again, Self-1 will increase the criticisms and begin to make it personal; for example, "... you missed it again. You're just no good at all." We now see ourselves as the problem not just the fact that for some reason or other we missed that target.

The first step to inner game success is to **let go** of the judgements. It is important that we see our performance as simply

that: how we performed today. We must let go of the need to base our self image/esteem on what we have achieved or what we think others will think about us as a result of our performance.

The second step is to **trust** Self-2's ability and to stop trying. When we give ourselves the instruction to try harder, what we are really doing is tensing and tightening our muscles. In short; trying fails. Once we can let go of our judgements and trust in Self-2 we can go onto to quieting the mind.

2019 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA or recognised organisation for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **Squadding is by Pre-Nomination Only. The close date for nominations is the 15th March 2019.**
3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
4. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
5. **Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.**
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
11. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.

14. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
17. Section prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd with placing for 2nd and 3rd decided by countback.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund. Nominations are by pre nomination only.
22. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.
23. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
24. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorization from the Tournament Director or the Shoot Marshal.
25. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade prior to entering State and National Championships.

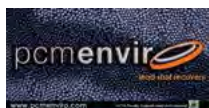

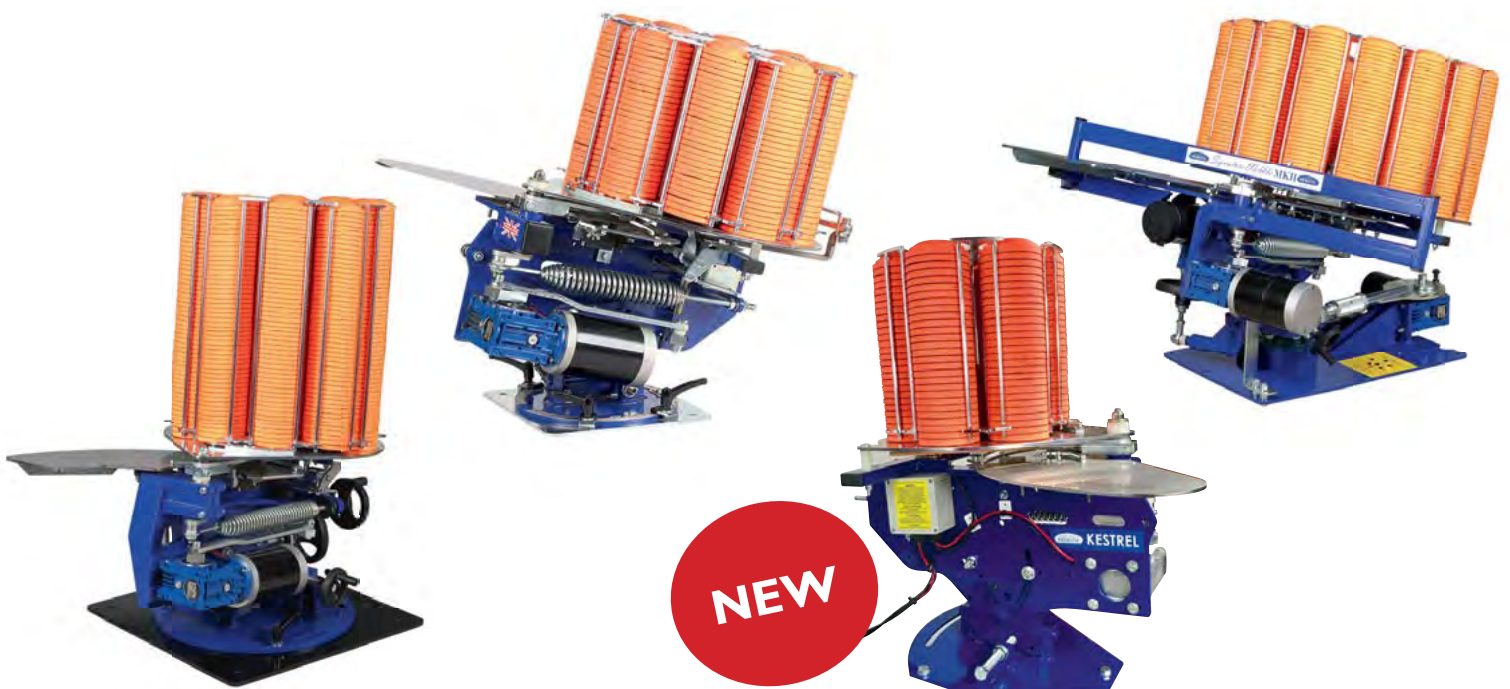

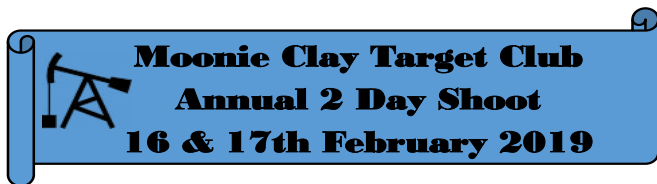

The six events will be conducted and finalised as normal. The High Guns will be finalised as normal. Presentations for the 6 events and High Guns will be conducted in the Hall as normal.

To shoot for the Mitsubishi 4x4 Twin Cab:



There will be 40 spots. To be considered for a spot You must have entered every event (6) prior to the first event starting. Overall and Grade winners in events 1 to 5 plus first 5 in the Handicap get Automatic entry to the Twin Cab shoot off.

Any shooter so qualified and then qualifying again will be replaced by the next shooter in order in their grade if a graded event or in placing if in the handicap event. Any shooter winning the Overall or any Grade High Gun who has not qualified in an event will get Automatic entry into the Twin Cab shoot-off.

Finally, any remaining spots to make up the Twin Cab shoot off field of 40 will be auctioned. Payment by the winning bidders must be immediate upon the fall of the hammer.

The 40 shooters will then be squadded as follows:

- Squad 1 Overall qualifiers as selected above from events 1 to 5.
- Squad 2 AA Grade qualifiers as selected above from events 1 to 5.
- Squad 3 A Grade qualifiers as selected above from events 1 to 5.

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

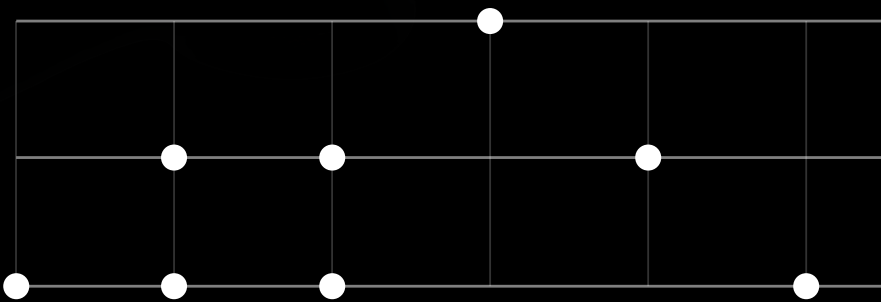
