2019 ISSF National Championships

BRISBANE GUN CLUB

Victorian shooter Aislin Jones stole the show at the ACTA's ISSF National Championships held in Brisbane last month.

At just 18 years of age, Aislin proved to be the most consistent performer of the week and became the first female shooter to win a High Gun title in the Skeet.

It was an amazing performance and was just reward for impressive and consistent shooting.

In claiming the High Gun title, Aislin shot a remarkable 239/250, beating her nearest rival Keith Ferguson who took out the National Men's championship with what would normally be considered a great shoot of 236/250.

The trophy cabinet was full to overflowing for Aislin winning both – the junior and open women's championships, in the process posting two senior World Championship qualifying scores of 121 and 118.

Speaking after the event, the talented young shooter said a recent trip to New Zealand had provided her with invaluable experience in the lead-up to the Nationals.

She also said that the pressure of Chloe Tipple had made it a tough shoot but made the point that having someone such as Chloe pushing her was important in achieving the end result.

In the Trap, the men's final proved to be a thriller.

James Willett was a strong performer all week but looked set to go down to Daniel Di Pietro who held a two shot lead with just two shots remaining.

In what was a surprising turn of events, Daniel missed his final two targets while James found the clay taking the men's final to sudden

death each having recorded scores of 44/50.

Both shooters hit their targets on the first station, James also shooting accurately on the second station but with Daniel missing, the title went to Willett.

Speaking after the tense shootout, James said it had been a tough one.

He said he had only been shooting trap full on since the Commonwealth Games last year so he was pretty happy with the way things were going at the moment.

Willett said he was now heading overseas for two world cups and was

keen to improve his world ranking with good performances in those events.

Third place in the Nationals went to Mitchell Iles 119/125 – 34/40 and Adam Vella – on the comeback trail after a coaching stint with Shooting Australia, claimed fourth with 117/125 – 30/35.

In the women's Trap Victorian Penny Smith was in great form winning both the Commonwealth and National Open women's titles.

Across the week, she also shot two World Championship qualifying scores (114 and 123).

In the final, Penny managed to hold off a determined Laetisha Scanlan.

While going down in the final,

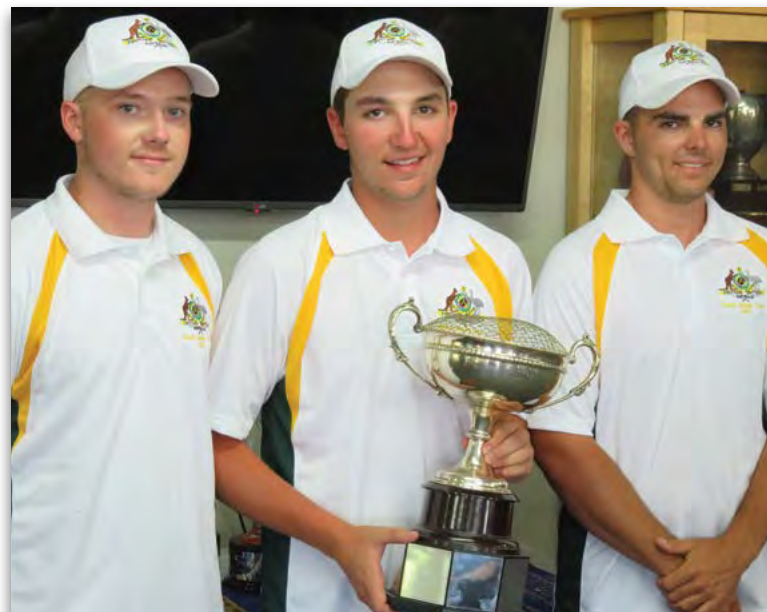

QCTA Coaching 2019

This year marks the 10th anniversary of the QCTA's state-wide coaching program

In 2009 newly appointed State Coaching Co-Ordinator and Level 2 coach Rod Woodrow implemented a system that would see basic coaching instruction made available to Queensland shooters across the state. While the program continues to most benefit novice and newer shooters, competitors at all levels are able to attend to reinforce the basics of clay target shooting.

The program ensures that during the course of a coaching session, the most basic principles of our sport are addressed: gun fit, stance, eye dominance, target acquisition, hold point, etc. Coaching clinics follow a staple format with only slight variations depending on venue facilities, and instruction includes a combination of a brief classroom session, a stint at the pattern board and the majority of time on the layouts. These principles can be further tweaked with the coaches during the one-on-one time, where shooters have the opportunity to personalise the information they have been given. Sessions are generally conducted with a team of three coaches.

Most importantly all coaching clinics lead off with the same

statement: Take whatever advice you find helpful to your shooting and leave the rest behind. Shooters are under no obligation to take or act on the advice of the coaches, but all are welcome to listen, participate and ask questions. They are simply encouraged to implement what best suits their

individual style and which practises help them to improve their scores. Sessions always wind up with a de-brief so the coaches can be confident that all participants had their topics covered and questions answered.

We also value the feedback of those attending our clinics, and while attendance registers, shoot reports, photos and feedback forms can be a tedious part of the process, they also provide necessary information with regard to preferences of club members and parents, what worked and what didn't, and for the planning of future coaching activities.

We all understand that there is a huge variation in coaching methods, styles, personalities and a wealth of differing information available. In many cases, like the tools of the clay target shooting trade, there is no right and wrong, it is simply a matter of finding the best fit for each individual. The program was orchestrated to ensure that members from all clubs and at all levels across each of the four Zones have access to the basic shooting principles, with the opportunity to further their skills if they wish.

During our first year the coaching team visited 8 clubs in 4 Zones with a total of 210 shooters signing on to attend sessions, an average attendance of 26 participants per session. While the current coaches continue to book at least 5 clinics per year, most sessions are still booked to capacity 10 years on.

Over 30 clubs have hosted coaching clinics under this program, some multiple times, and the coaches are always happy to tailor sessions to suit the needs of their members. Clubs do a terrific job providing lunch, refreshments, targets and ammunition, and offer great hospitality, especially during 2 day clinics. We have previously endeavoured to schedule coaching clinics to coincide with club annual events where clubs can benefit from increased numbers, and the coaches are on hand to see their students put their newly acquired skills to the test.

The State coaching clinics are also a perfect opportunity to include coaching accreditation courses and provide an excellent platform for new coaches to complete their practical

assessments in hands-on conditions. Queensland has 49 registered Club Coaches with representation in each Zone, and 9 registered Competition (L2) Coaches. Our coaching program has contributed significantly to being able to provide accredited coaches to service shooters across our large state.

Not to play favourites we have conducted coaching clinics in every discipline in order to cater for all our members, and some of these have been junior or ladies only activities. Some clubs have made significant commitments to junior development and women in shooting and there are ongoing programs for these sections of our membership to give them every opportunity to pursue their chosen discipline and to progress through the grades.

You can never undervalue what can be learned from a coaching session, not just for the participants but for the coaches, co-ordinators and organisers too. For those of us who have been shooting for some time it is easy to take for granted what we know about clay target shooting, how particular we are about loads, equipment and competition conditions. But don't forget how long it can take for a novice to become familiar with these aspects of our sport when they don't always have access to information, regular comps or group discussions.

A coaching session can be deemed a success by simply providing a forum for shooters to ask questions in a friendly or instructive environment. Many times I have heard shooters make comments such as "I never really understood how the chokes worked so I never changed them" or "I've heard of eye-dominance but didn't know what it was." Our coaching

team employs the policy that there is no such thing as a silly question. A shooter once said he had been competing for 40 years and had never patterned his gun. When the coach asked the question to the rest of the room, at least 70% of the 'students' raised their hands!

We thank our coaching team for their effort and commitment over the past 10 years, and they have never asked for anything in return for the service and expertise they provide to our members. Richard Morrison, who took over from Rod Woodrow as State Coaching Co-Ordinator, Daryl Stevens our stockmaker and Bill Allan make up our DTL coaching team and continue to book out sessions across Queensland. Laurie Sceresini (Skeet), Jar Smaniotto (Olympic Trap) and now Darryl Groundwater (Sporting) comprise our State coaches, a great effort by all.

In order to offer all disciplines and a healthy cross-section of experience to our members we have also been

assisted by other high-calibre coaches such as Michael Diamond, George Barton, Paul Tattam, Graham Boyd, Kevin Perkins, Paul Lillis, Craig Henwood and National Coaching Director Suzy Corry who have given up their time to contribute to our coaching program. We also thank the host clubs for making their facilities and volunteers available to allow us to conduct these sessions. We appreciate the ongoing contribution of Queensland Government, Department of Sport & Recreation for continuing to support our coaching programs through state funding.

The QCTA has signed on over 2000 shooters to courses since the programs introduction in 2009 and the positive feedback has been overwhelming. A handful of basic principles made available and delivered simply to shooters as they are just starting out, or deciding if it is something they want to do, can make a huge difference to our membership and our sport.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Dealing with the heat

At the moment, as I write this, most of southern Australia is in the grip of a heat wave. Again! For the most part of December and January this summer, temperatures in have been in the late 30s to mid 40s. Whilst this is excellent weather for growing rice, it makes participating in sport or any other outside pursuit uncomfortable. Where I live in western NSW, the temperatures have often reached 45 and even 46 degrees Celsius and we have these temperatures for several weeks with the 'cold change' bringing the temperature down to 37 or 38 degrees Celsius.

Uncomfortable as it is, most of us want to still get out and shoot, because that is what we like doing.

What effect does the heat have on performance?

Elevated body temperature, hyperthermia, can eventuate from three causes: high exercise intensity, high air temperatures and high relative humidity. According to Lawrence Armstrong, this is why an athlete, male or female, can experience performance-degrading hyperthermia if they push themselves too fast, for too long a time, in hot-humid conditions. He continues by stating that there are three ways in which such hyperthermia might degrade physical performance.

1. Hyperthermia reduces **muscular endurance**, the ability to sustain muscular contractions for several minutes to hours.
2. Hyperthermia shifts **metabolism** from primarily the aerobic (with oxygen) to the anaerobic (without oxygen) form. Unfortunately, this means that the body's stores of carbohydrate (e.g., glycogen) in skeletal muscles and liver will be consumed at a faster rate. Athletes 'hit the wall' faster.
3. Hyperthermia causes the dilation of blood vessels in the skin and pooling of blood in the limbs. This reduces the volume of blood that returns to the heart, reduces cardiac output, and increases circulatory strain. These effects are perceived as increased fatigue because the capacity to deliver oxygen to muscles is reduced.

The above facts about physical effects are relatively well known by most of us who participate in sport. In fact, Sports Medicine Australia has developed policies on sport in hot weather. These guidelines have been adopted by Government Departments, such as South Australian Sport and Recreation, to reduce the risk for athletes during very hot weather. State clay target associ-

ations have been making clubs aware of the guidelines and providing information that can maximize the enjoyment of sport in hot weather and reduce the risks. These fact sheets should be read in-conjunction with this article, as they contain important information regarding UV Exposure, heat illness guidelines, dealing with heat stress and heat stroke, etc.

What are the effects of heat on the brain and how does this impact on our mental skills?

If you are mildly dehydrated, it is likely that you are unaware of it. Even though you may be drinking fluids, they may be the wrong type or it may just not be enough. In mild cases of dehydration you are likely to become anxious, fatigued or irritable. Anxiety can affect us when we are shooting. We all worry about missing at some stage. We focus on the future and worry about our ability. When this happens we lose contact with the present and as a result we develop self-doubt and we miss the target. Fatigue also can have the effect eye dominance. It is thought that eye dominance can change: as we get older or even on a daily basis as we get fatigued. This will have a significant effect on your shooting if your non-dominant eye takes over because you are tired. Fatigue also affects muscle strength, muscle memory, reaction time and your ability to narrow your focus of attention. As a result, recoil will feel worse and you will be more prone to headaches.

If you are severely dehydrated, that is, you do not ingest fluids for long enough, confusion can set in. The symptoms of confusion are similar to the symptoms of dementia. This confusion can be manifested in reaction timing, understanding consequences and decision-making, inhibition, ability to shift thoughts. Memory will also be affected by dehydration. There can be dis-orientation and distortion of reality in the forms of auditory or visual hallucinations. For the shooter this level of confusion may mean that you anticipate where you think the target will be going and you start moving before you see the target.

Brain cells require the right amount of water and minerals in each cell. Cells will break with too much water and shrivel up with not enough. Brain dehydration, which is what happens in a hangover and dehydration, less water is available to the brain cells to use and the

transport of fluid, minerals and other materials between cells is reduced and therefore their function is affected. If the dehydration is not treated or resolved there will be a deterioration of the brain cells.

Because we like our sport, and because in Australia it is difficult to avoid the heat, especially in the summer, we should be mindful of the impact of heat stress and dehydration and make sure that we take the simple steps to keep ourselves safe.

From a National and State Association level, there should be an acceptance of the policies and guidelines as developed by organisations such as Sports Medicine Australia. All clubs should be made aware of the things they can do to limit the impact of heat and dehydration for those shooters who attend their clubs. This involves doing simple things such as having clean water available, sunscreen, having shade for referees and scorers, using shade or shelters to the best advantage. For the individual shooters, make sure that you keep yourself hydrated with plenty of water or electrolytes and keep cool when you are not shooting.

2018 SA State ISSF Titles

Well here we are again for the South Australian State ISSF titles for 2018. Thursday saw a few competitors at the practice traps getting themselves familiarised with the background and conditions of our State Shooting Park.

October 25th to 27th 2018 saw absolutely perfect conditions to start with, around 23 degrees for the morning and with no breezes at all. It was a steady flow of participants that came to the ticket window to contest the first event which was the State Double Trap title. A good mix of top end shooters with some new ones that hadn't shot doubles before. Targets were being checked in the early morning for distances, heights, speeds and angles and after a short anomaly (which meant changing a trap), no one could wish for better doubles, they were sitting there just waiting to be shot. At daybreak on the Saturday morning, all the officials were hustling over the trap layouts with their protractors, height sticks, angle and distance markers etc. to get everything right for the commencement of the qualifying 125 target singles rounds of which the first 75 targets would be shot today and would determine our SA Postal team. A special word of thanks must be given to these guys who give so generously of their time every day over the Carnival, year after year, to be at the grounds at the crack of dawn to get it all right so that the competitors can have a trouble free competition – our Patron, Judge Kelyvn Prescott, Peter Quire and Noel West – it's a pretty thankless task, but we would like to acknowledge your efforts – thank you all so very much.

At the Skeet end, everything was also checked and double checked and as the rules tell us, the participants were called to the 1st and 2nd traps to check all the targets before they all headed

out to undertake the task. Once again the forecast was for calm conditions and 23 degrees, which made for a great day without targets bouncing around too much. All the windy conditions from yesterday afternoon had passed and everyone was hoping to be in the winner's circle.

There were lots of smiles and lots of sad faces again as the scores came in at the end of the day. At 2.30 pm everything was over and everyone started making their way to the bars and hotels for some well earned rest and to get refreshed for the last 50 targets of the qualifier before the real work starts tomorrow in the finals. 2019 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA or recognised organisation for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **Squadding is by Pre-Nomination Only. The close date for nominations is the 15th March 2019.**
3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
4. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
4. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
5. **Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.**
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
7. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
8. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
9. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
10. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
11. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
12. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
13. Optional sweep prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
14. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
15. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors, Veterans or Super Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
16. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
17. Section prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd with placing for 2nd and 3rd decided by countback.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
21. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible to any refund. Nominations are by pre nomination only.
22. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event you will receive notification via email.
23. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
24. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorisation from the Tournament Director or the Shoot Marshal.
25. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade prior to entering State and National Championships.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2019 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2019 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2019 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence before competing.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors, Veterans and Super Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open Section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Juniors, Veterans and Super Veterans sections; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the Open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they may be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Competitors must be over the age of 12 years or (compliant with State laws – Queensland age qualification for Juniors 11 years).

Veterans – are those competitors who, will be over the age of 55 years and under 65 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Super Veterans – are those aged 65 years and older as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Juniors – are those competitors who, will be under the age of 21 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 16 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the Championships Sub-Committee. All targets thrown remain

the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified – an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior, Veterans and Super Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice may be available throughout the championships.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

The shoot offs will continue under the event format until a winner has been determined or at the discretion of the Tournament Director a different format is required to finalise the event. Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament Director decides. In such a case the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Authority

This program shall control the 2019 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2019 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Gambling is not permitted on events staged by the Australian Clay Target Association.

Appeals

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 4.16 (a) & (b)

Services and Facilities

Catering: Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

Trade Displays: Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting and our sponsors of this event.

Parking: Ample parking is available for the cars of competitors and visitors. The parking area will be clearly marked. Please do not park in any area marked as being reserved, as freedom of movement is required at all times – please co-operate.

Souvenirs: In addition to a variety of souvenirs which will be offered by commercial supporters of clay target shooting, the Australian Clay Target Association will merchandise a souvenir 2019 National Championships badge.

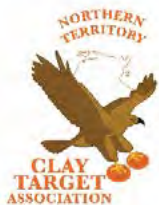

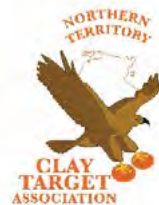

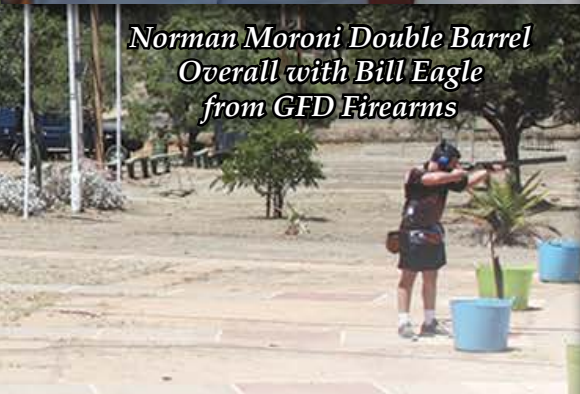

- the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- the licence or permit number of the seller,
- the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.

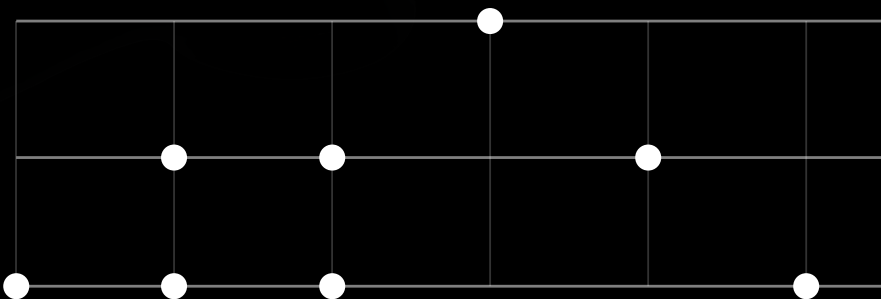
