President's Notes

It gives me great pleasure on behalf of the Executive, as the President of the Australian Clay Target Association (ACTA) to report on the Association affairs for the 12 month period ending the 31st December 2018.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership for the period has decreased from 14,126 to 13,646. All states except NSW exhibited a fall. The majority of the fall was in Queensland with a decline of 300 members. Almost that entire decline was due to a large club choosing to flaunt the ACTA constitution and allow a class of membership not affiliated with the ACTA.

2374 new members joined the Association. This is down almost 600 from last period, and the reduction is more than the total fall in membership. Clearly clubs flaunting the constitution are not offering ACTA Recreational membership to new members.

This continuing problem of clubs that do not ensure that all their shooting members are registered with the ACTA as required by the Constitution, is now the major risk to the Association. Something will need to be done soon to stop this practice. All clubs have now been provided with a copy of the current ACTA Constitution and officially advised that it is a clear breach of the ACTA Constitution to retain shooting members who are not registered with the ACTA.

The Recreational category of membership was extended at the request of clubs to allow members to shoot practice and targets only in any ACTA discipline and at any ACTA club. Target only shooting is important as it allows the Recreational member to take part during, and be exposed to the competition shoot and environment which could encourage them to become full competition members.

The Recreational category also provides all the insurance coverage, including personal firearms insurance cover, access to the E-Magazine and provides genuine reason for the holding of a firearms licence. All of this for only \$60?

INSURANCE

The Executive has insured the Association, its member clubs, and registered shooters as comprehensively and economically as possible. During the period, the brokerage firm Marsh brokered our cover using various underwriters at Lloyds of London.

The Protection Package provided cover for Public Liability, Accident, Death, Loss of Income, Officers and Directors Indemnity Insurance for Committee Members at all levels in our Association, Travel Insurance for team members and the personal Firearms cover.

Liability insurance is a specialist field and the ACTA strives to provide the best to protect members. Premiums are assessed on membership numbers and some clubs are jeopardising this cover by not joining all shooting members with the ACTA and thus under-disclosing the numbers actually able to attend ACTA affiliated grounds on a regular basis. These numbers are used to assess premiums. The ACTA relies on the support of all member clubs to provide this important service which for the majority of clubs would be unaffordable otherwise.

The actions of these few non-compliant clubs continue to negatively impact all ACTA clubs, States and the ACTA itself as well as increasing the cost burden on those that operate constitutionally.

The personal Firearms insurance provided within the membership cost has now passed its second anniversary. Many claims have been settled during the period and a large premium increase was absorbed by the ACTA. It is important to note that cover can be increased to \$25,000 for a payment of \$10 per annum, and higher amounts by negotiation. Following rises in premiums passed on by other shooting bodies to their members this is now undoubtedly the cheapest and best firearms cover in the country. This policy covers all firearms registered to the member. The cover applies anywhere within Australia (including in the field) and 21 days per annum overseas. This cover continues to be brokered by Marsh Insurance and details are on the website.

FINANCIAL

The Association once again traded well during the year showing a profit of \$1,493,290 in the audited accounts. After removal of an extraordinary figure of \$1,413,205 attributable to a portion of the NSW State Government Grant, a profit of approximately \$80,000 remains. Allowing for the introduction of a large depreciation expense relative to the Range, a profit of \$160,000 would be more useful for comparison purposes.

This result was achieved without any increase in affiliation, or competition entry fees.

Payments of the Wagga Wagga City Council Loan to purchase the National Ground freehold have all been met when due and the loan now has only approximately 2 years left of the original 10 year term.

The Association's equity base has now risen to over | \$10 million for the first time in the history of the ACTA.

GROUND DEVELOPMENT

The completion of The Range function centre was the major development on the grounds. The development was completed in time for the 2018 DTL Nationals and the World DTL. I am sure members were proud to host their international friends in such a high standard and comfortable facility. It will change the face of the National Ground forever and provide a spacious, comfortable area during ACTA competitions and its major functions and use by the wider community. The Range Function centre now has its own website at: www.therangefunctions.com.au

Reasonable profits have again allowed continuing development at the National Ground, including the new entry road and lighting, more sealed car parking and office fencing.

The ACTA Arms Fair permit application continues to come under closer scrutiny. One of the benefits from the building project has been the need for the builder to lay concrete slabs for the purpose of pouring the tilt up wall slabs. Some of these slabs are now car parks but a large slab remains at the southern side of the workshop shed. It is proposed this slab will form the base of a new traders area. This proposal received Executive approval during the year, and has had a Development Application prepared and once approved will be shovel ready when funding is available. Once constructed it will free up the old existing carpark and do away with the necessity of a security fence around the traders. All firearms and ammunition traders would then be in a secure, weatherproof building with direct access to the strong room.

NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

During the period, National Championships were conducted in all disciplines. All were well attended with most showing an increased attendance over last year.

The National DTL saw a large increase which was pleasing, but of course, this was due to the event being conducted with the World DTL. On average 611 shooters competed in each of the 6 main events. This is down from 613 at the Nationals conducted with the previous Worlds in Australia, but up more than 110 from the 2017 Nationals average. National DTL High Gun winner was Tom Turner – well done Tom.

The National ISSF Championships were hosted by the VCTA at the Echuca club and despite a flooding episode and damage to infrastructure weeks prior to the event, the competition went ahead and was a great success. Attendance was affected by the misinformation spread on social media and was down by 28 in total over the 8 main events. Congratulations to High Gun winners Keith Ferguson, Aislin Jones, Emma Cox, James Willett,

Laetisha Scanlan and Jack Wallace. Venues of this size in the ISSF disciplines require a lot of maintenance and therefore expense to remain operational and we extend our thanks to the VCTA and the Echuca club for investing in the venue. Thanks must go to the volunteer ISSF accredited officials without whom these types of events could not be hosted.

The National Skeet Championships were conducted at the National Ground with total entries of 853 which can't be compared to previous years due to the change in the way the Champion of Champions is now conducted. This was again almost a full field. National Skeet High Gun Winner was Antony Ballarino, well done Antony.

The National Sporting Clays Championships were conducted at the National Ground with a full field of 240 in total over the two events, up an average of 12 on each event. This event was conducted by the Wagga Gun Club on behalf of the ACTA and we thank them for the preparation and conduct. National Sporting Clays High Gun was won by Christopher Brown, congratulations Chris.

WORLD DTL

The ICTSF World DTL was conducted at the National Grounds following the DTL Nationals. Despite having Pre-nominations of 800 at the closing date and a waiting list, the event saw 722 competitors take part in what was without a doubt the greatest World DTL to date. This event was the largest ever conducted by the ACTA and the results for Australia was beyond expectations. Every team overall and all Individual overalls were taken by Australia except one. The event saw Frazer Roberts crowned as the World Champion and our congratulations go to him. This was the last event under my control as ICTSF President and I welcome Conor Mooney from Ireland as the new President. Many of you may have had the opportunity to meet Conor at the event.

Another notable visitor was Mike Herman, President elect of the Amateur Trapshooting Association of America. Mike was very interested in the Mackintosh competition and I am hoping we will soon see USA competing at the World DTL and in the Mackintosh Cup event.

ADMINISTRATION

The National Office has seen changes during the year with groundsman, Dave Jocelyn being replaced by Marcus Pim due to Dave's retirement. The effect on the grounds has been swift and impressive. You can all look forward to a beautifully prepared and presented facility next time you visit.

The biggest change in the year was the retirement of Executive Officer Tony Turner. Tony had served in this

position from 2009 for 18 months and then from 2013 to his retirement in late 2018. The ACTA was left in a much better place than when Tony came on board and we thank him and wish him and wife Julie all the best for their future.

We have welcomed Paul McLoughlin as our new CEO and look forward to having his input and influence on our future direction.

EXECUTIVE CHANGES

During the year we saw the retirement of long standing delegates Mrs Elaine Forward and Mr. Robert Fox. Both have served voluntarily for well over 20 years, a great contribution to both their State and the ACTA. Like many of us they have received more than their fair share of misinformed criticism at times. That would be simple to avoid by just doing nothing but these two have never dodged the hard decisions.

I extend the Association's thanks to these two retiring members and welcome their replacements Mr Ian Watson and Mr Ray Niven.

The Executive again supported the election of a Management Sub-Committee being Mr Robert Nugent (Chairman), Vice Presidents Mr Mal Dyson and Mr Garry Read, Treasurer Mr Alan Styles and Mr Bronte Evans.

MEDIA

The CTSN continued as one of our largest cost areas, and its future was decided during the period. The Executive decided to move to a digital E-magazine from the January 2019 issue.

This was a hard, but inevitable decision. Electronic media is playing an ever increasing role in society and will no doubt overtake the print media long term. I remind members that all back copies are available on the website for viewing, downloading and research projects. Our thanks to Jim and Judy Shepherd for their efforts in this area.

ELECTRONIC MEDIA

The Association now has a growing large presence in the electronic media area. The ACTA website is a valuable resource for members and clubs alike. The ability for members and club secretaries to renew online is of great value. The Facebook page also allows the ACTA to keep in contact with members quickly and economically.

Unfortunately there continues to be a huge down side to the advent of Facebook, Twitter etc. Negative comment, often misinformed, does untold damage to the sport's image. "Keyboard warriors" taking cheap shots at volunteer officials brings nothing to this sport. The mis-information spread in relation to availability of camp sites at nationals, nominations being full when

they are not, grounds being flooded and not going to be ready etc. etc. has a detrimental effect on every event. I encourage people to ignore Facebook posts which are regularly full of mis-information and make contact direct with those running events to get the facts. These are the people actually doing the work and they have a much better understanding of situations than someone often thousands of kilometres away on a laptop.

AFFILIATIONS

Shooting Australia (SA)

Matters of concern to ACTA include the reduction in funding to member bodies (ACTA receives nil), the growth of staff numbers (approaching 20) and the continual inroads into what has always been member bodies responsibilities.

The current selection criteria's have received very little negative comment so the changes made after the last Olympics must be appropriate. Clearer pathways and more objective criteria are always welcomed.

International Clay Target Shooting Federation (ICTSF)

This body met in Australia in March at the World DTL. Australian teams had great success at this event and represented their country honourably.

On behalf of the ICTSF I would like to thank all who worked at the event in any capacity, Office, Jury, Trappers and Marshalling and Refereeing. It was a very successful and professionally run event.

During the meeting I retired as President and Conor Mooney of Ireland was elected President. Bywell in England was set as the venue for the next World DTL in July of 2020.

Our Sporting team selected In August will now be preparing for the Worlds soon to be conducted in Ireland. We wish them well.

COACHING

Most States now have excellent programs in place and a large body of willing coaches travelling large distances to make our sport more satisfying for our members.

I congratulate these volunteers on their efforts.

The Academy programs run under the control of Suzy Corry continue to prosper with good attendances and performances. States are now putting more effort into the coaching sphere and many young talented shooters are coming through this pathway.

MEMBERSHIP VALUE

The Association decided to reduce membership fees and club affiliation costs during the period effective from the 1st January 2019. Full membership was reduced by \$18 and club costs reduced by a third. The ACTA has continued to provide a full suite of insurances to shooting members and to states and clubs. Large increases in some covers were absorbed by the Association.

We continue to have a lot of passionate and energetic people in the Association at all levels, but unfortunately only a few are able to be at the helm at any one time. If we can all work together I am confident the ACTA will have a great future.

I take this opportunity to thank our staff, my fellow Executive members, and Committee Chairpersons for the support, time and effort they have given so freely during the period.

A special thanks to my two Vice-Presidents, Mal Dyson and Garry Read.

In closing I would like to thank the thousands of volunteers without whom the efforts of your Executive would be futile, that is the volunteers at Club, Zone and State level. I am sure they would also appreciate your personal thanks as well.

You don't have to go too far before hearing about the new epidemic that is prevailing in the Australian community with mental health issues now a major concern for society.

In this month's edition of Clay Target, Georgina Gold, General manager, Operations, with the NSW Police Force Firearms Registry, raises many important points about our responsibilities in this field.

Holding a firearms licence is no different to a driving licence in that both are, under our system of government, privileges. And with privilege comes responsibility.

The Australian Clay Target Association has a proud safety record but we must remain ever vigilant that we continue this path as there are some sectors of the community who would prefer to have firearms banned completely.

As an Association, we are fortunate to have great networks and access to resources to ensure we continue to enjoy this wonderful sport in a safe and supportive environment.

Mental health issue will almost certainly strike each and every one of us at some stage – there is no reason to be ashamed or silent about this – in an enlightened society being able to reach out to family, friends and peers is an important part in coping with what can be a difficult and traumatic time.

The Firearms Registry has a challenging task in this area – essentially trying to weigh up risk versus the potential impact of removing or suspending someone's licence.

What the registry has made clear is that it will not make these decisions lightly.

And this is where our established club system can play such an important role – and it's as simple as looking out for your mates.

To ensure that we can continue in our sport we need to actively participate in its policing – watching out for each other and, where appropriate, creating awareness around situations that might be harmful to our reputation as a responsible sporting organisation.

We are more than participants in sports shooting – we are its custodians and it is up to each and every one of us to ensure it continues to prosper.

The Range Function Centre update

The development of a website, creation of brochures, social media presence and the hosting of significant events has seen demand for The Range Function Centre spike.

It is rare that a day goes by when there isn't an inquiry or booking, with the calendar starting to fill quickly.

The recent Wedding Expo has generated numerous inquiries and as I write this column, Craft Alive

organisers are transforming the centre for a three-day event that will attract up to 5000 guests.



"Since going digital at the start of the year we have seen a significant uptake in the number of people reading Clay Target," Mr McLoughlin said.

"While we know how many print editions were published and circulated, we never really knew how many were being opened and read.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

For the Year Ended 31 December 2018

NOTE 1 – STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report includes the financial statements and notes of the Australian Clay Target Association Inc as an individual entity. The Australian Clay Target Association is a not for profit entity incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

These financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements and the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012*.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the entity in the preparation of the financial statements:

(a) *Income Tax*

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(b) *Cash and cash equivalents*

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and demand deposits, together with other short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

(c) *Receivables*

Accounts receivable include amounts due from members. Accounts receivables are recognised at the amounts as they are due for settlement. Accounts receivables do not carry any interest and are stated at their nominal value.

(d) *Inventories*

Inventories comprises goods for resale and goods for distribution and use at no or nominal consideration as part of the Association's ongoing activities.

Inventory held for sale is measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(e) *Trade creditors and other payables*

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Association during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days on recognition of the liability.

(f) *Property, plant and equipment*

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Where the cost model is used, the asset is carried at its cost less any accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses. Costs include the initial purchase price and other directly attributable costs.

Land

Land held for use is stated at re-valued amounts. Revalued amounts are fair market values based on appraisals prepared by external professional valuers once every three to five years or more frequently if market factors indicate a material change in fair value.

Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are recognised in other comprehensive income and accumulated in the revaluation surplus in equity. Revaluation decreases that offset previous increases of the same class of assets shall be recognised in other comprehensive income under the heading of revaluation surplus. All other decreases are recognised in profit or loss.

Buildings, plant & equipment

Buildings, plant and other equipment (comprising fittings and furniture) are initially recognised at acquisition cost, including any costs directly attributable to bringing the assets to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management.

Buildings, plant and other equipment are subsequently measured using the cost model, cost less subsequent depreciation and impairment losses.

Depreciation is recognised on a straight-line basis to write down the cost less estimated residual value of buildings, plant and other equipment. The following useful lives are applied:

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

(g) *Revenue*

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured by reference to the fair value of consideration received or receivable, excluding sales taxes, rebates or discounts.

Rendering of services to members

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably. If the outcome can be estimated reliably then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period.

Government grants

The Association has received significant financial support from the NSW State Government during the financial year.

Where conditions are attached to a grant which must be satisfied before the Association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue is deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

Where a grant is received on the condition that specified services are delivered, to the grantor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction. Revenue is recognised as services are performed and at year-end until the service is delivered.

Revenue from a non-reciprocal grant that is not subject to conditions is recognised when the Association obtains control of the funds, economic benefits are probable and the amount can be measured reliably. Where a grant may be required to be repaid if certain conditions are not satisfied, a liability is recognised at year end to the extent that conditions remain unsatisfied.

Sale of goods

Revenue from the sale of goods comprises revenue earned from the sale of goods donated and purchased for resale. Sales revenue is recognised when the control of goods passes to the customer.

Interest revenue

Interest income is recognised on an accrual basis using the effective interest method.

(h) *Deferred income*

The liability for deferred income represents the unutilised amounts received from members of the Association on the condition that specified services are delivered or conditions are fulfilled. The services are usually provided or the conditions usually fulfilled within 12 months of receipt of the contribution.

(i) *Goods and services tax (GST)*

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of an asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

(j) *Employee benefits*

A provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

The Association's liabilities for other employee obligations are included in other long-term benefits as they are not expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the period in which the employees render the related service.

(k) *Capital expenditure*

Capital commitments represent assets still under construction at year-end. These assets often require extensive installation work or integration with other assets, and contrast with simpler assets that are ready for use when acquired, such as motor vehicles and equipment.

Capital works in progress are not depreciated as the Association is not currently deriving any economic benefits from them.

(l) *Reserves*

Asset revaluation reserve comprises gains and losses from the revaluation of land.

All other reserves comprise surplus funds that have been designated to be spent for a specific purpose in the future to which the individual reserve relates.

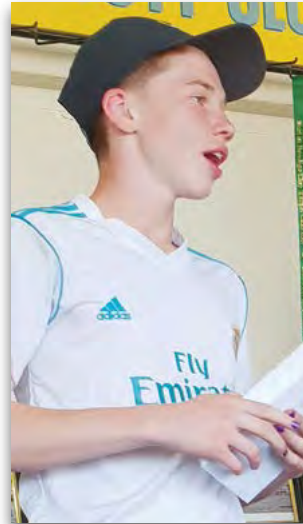

Firearms and Mental Health

One of the most challenging issues in the firearms space is the intersection between firearm access and mental health.

Most people would agree that a person who, because of their mental illness, cannot safely continue to access firearms, should be prevented from doing so. This is reflected clearly in the *NSW Firearms Act 1996*, which prevents a person who is deemed unsafe to access firearms.

This is found in section 11 where there is a general power to refuse an applicant if there is reasonable cause to believe that

the applicant may not exercise continuous and responsible control over firearms because of a previous suicide attempt or self-harm incident or the applicant's intemperate habits or being of unsound mind.

Also, people wishing to try shooting prior to being licensed or who are undertaking the firearm safety training course are required to answer the following mental health related questions on the P650 form prior to gaining access to firearms:

- (b) *Have you ever attempted suicide or self harm?*
- (c) *Have you in the past 12 months been treated or referred for treatment for alcoholism, drug dependence, or a mental illness within the meaning of the Mental Health Act 2007 or as a mentally disordered person within the meaning of that Act?*

A mental illness is defined as:

mental illness means a condition that seriously impairs, either temporarily or permanently, the mental functioning of a person and is characterised by the presence in the person of any one or more of the following symptoms:

- (a) *delusions,*
- b) *hallucinations,*
- (c) *serious disorder of thought form,*

- (d) *a severe disturbance of mood,*
- (e) *sustained or repeated irrational behaviour indicating the presence of any one or more of the symptoms referred to in paragraphs (a)–(d).*

And a mentally disordered person is defined as:

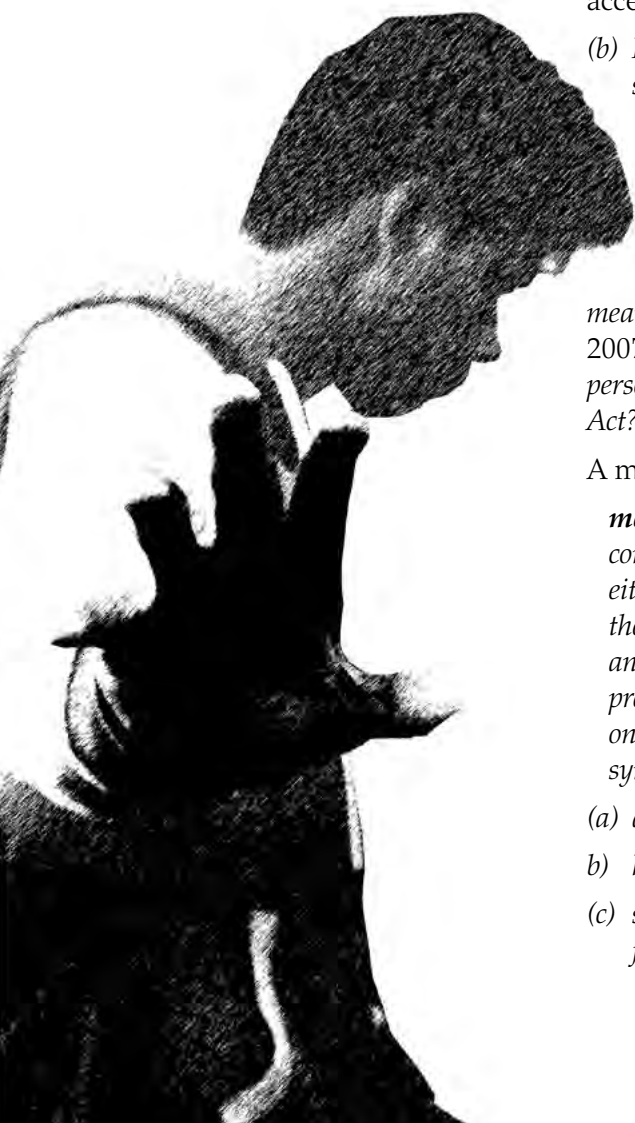
A person (whether or not the person is suffering from mental illness) is a mentally disordered person if the person's behaviour for the time being is so irrational as to justify a conclusion on reasonable grounds that temporary care, treatment or control of the person is necessary:

- (a) *for the person's own protection from serious physical harm, or*
- (b) *for the protection of others from serious physical harm.*

The increase in diagnosis of mental health conditions in Australia has meant that this is a growing area of work for the Firearms Registry as more licence holders are presenting information about illness and treatments.

Declaring a mental illness to the Firearms Registry in no way means you will be automatically prevented from obtaining or keeping a licence. We recognise that many people with mental illnesses continuing to be able to exercise continuous and responsible control over their firearms. And we recognise that mental illness can be situational or transitory or treatable.

We are fully aware that there are circumstances, such as family breakdown, job loss, or financial



stress which can lead people to act out of character. We analyse the situation, consider the severity of the circumstance, and look at the totality of the person's holdings and advice provided by treating medical professionals.

As the regulator we need to reduce risk and so we weigh all these factors in making decisions about licence issue or continuity. Risk mitigation is established firmly in the principles of the Firearms Act in that firearm possession and use is a privilege conditional on the overriding need to ensure public safety. To satisfy this, we require that a person supplies to us documentation from their treating medical professional to support ongoing or future firearm access.

The NSW Police Force has recently sent your association and club a poster, asking for your vigilance in contacting us if you hold any concerns about a person accessing or wanting to access a firearm. Concerns may be wide ranging and could include someone who is displaying unusual, suspicious or unsafe behaviour, someone who may be suffering a mental illness which would hinder safe use of a firearm or someone you suspect of criminal or terror related activity.

We have had good responses from the firearm community about this campaign and we thank you for helping us to keep your sport and industry safe.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

Psychological Characteristics of Peak Performance

This article will hit the computers of shooters just before the nationals in Roma. As I have said many times over the last twenty years, psychological skills training for shooting involves those topics that have been the subject of previous articles; goal setting, concentration, attention, visualisation, relaxation and competition preparedness, however before we can incorporate these into a training program it is necessary to know if there is an optimal psychological state for peak performance. This optimal psychological state is what we are all trying to achieve every time we compete and more importantly when we compete in a high level competition. What I have also noticed over the years is that we need to be able to consistently reach this optimal psychological state.

Williams (1993) believes that if such a state can be identified for programs or for a given individual, then there is a foundation for developing a mental skills program, provided these skills can be trained. She examined three sources for helping her identify the psychological characteristics underlying successful athletic performance. These are; firstly, the data generated from researchers who have asked athletes to recall their subjective perceptions during their greatest moments they ever had whilst participating in sport. Secondly, the data from studies that compared successful athletes with less successful athletes, and thirdly, information from what top athletes, coaches, scouts and sport psychologists think about what it takes to be successful in sport.

Psychological Characteristics During Peak Performances

Eight mental and physical conditions have been identified by athletes as being characteristics of the feelings they have at those moments when they are doing something extraordinarily well;

1. Being mentally relaxed or in a state of inner calm. Sometimes this can be described as the sense of time being slowed down and having a high degree of concentration.
2. Being physically relaxed so that muscles feel loose and fluid.
3. Confident/optimistic; feelings of self-confidence, being

optimistic and positive about our own performance. This is very important during challenging times within the competition.

4. Focused on the present. Shooting is a here and now sport and we feel a sense of harmony when the body and mind is able to work as one unit. In order for the body to perform here and now, our minds must also be in the here and now. This means shooting this target and not the one missed (in the past) or not the ones in the shoot off (in the future). By controlling the thoughts about the future and the past the body can perform automatically without conscious or deliberate mental effort.
5. Highly energised. A high-energy state is frequently described as feelings of joy, ecstasy, intensity or being 'hot'.
6. Extraordinary awareness: A state of mind that allows the athlete to be acutely aware of their own bodies and everything around them.
7. In control. The body and mind seem to do automatically what is right without the need to exert or impose control.
8. In the cocoon. This involves feelings of detachment from the external environment and any potential distractions, where the athlete has complete access to one's powers and skills.

The eight qualities listed above are those that are evident when athletes reach peak performance. But there is a difference between being a very good club competitor and being a national champion. Williams (1993) continues and describes a psychological construct referred to as flow. Flow was defined by Csikszentmihalyi when the challenge equals skill level, when one knows what to do, one has clear goals, deep concentration, a sense of being in control, and a sense of loss of time; and the activity becomes autotelic. For a competitor to be a good club competitor then they need to be in flow whereas to be a state or national champion the flow has to be combined with the other qualities of peak performance.

Psychological Differences Between Successful and Unsuccessful Athletes

Research involving Olympic qualifiers and non-qualifiers found that finalists coped more easily with competitive mistakes, were better able to control and utilise anxiety, had higher self confidence and more positive self talk, had more gymnastics related dreams, and had more frequent imagery of internal versus external nature.

External imagery occurs when the person himself/herself from the position of the external observer, for the shooter this would mean watching yourself as if on video. Whereas internal imagery involves an approximation much more like the actual perspective when the skill is being performed. For the shooter this means imagining being inside the body of the person shooting and experiencing the same sensation that one would expect to experience if one was actually shooting.

From the research that studied successful and unsuccessful athletes certain commonalities appeared in the psychological characteristics of the successful competitors. Firstly, the researchers reported that the athletes believed in themselves more and were more self-confident. Secondly, successful athletes concentrated more and were less likely to be distracted and were more task orientated in their concentration rather than being preoccupied with outcome thoughts. Thirdly, successful athletes were preoccupied with their sport in a positive way. Next, successful athletes were found to have less anxiety before and after the competition and were more able to control anxiety levels during competitions. Finally, most of the better athletes have a higher ability to rebound from mistakes.

What Top Sport People Think It Takes To "Make it".

When interviewed regarding what it takes to be a top sports person, there was considerable disagreement about

the physical attributes necessary for excellence. However, when asked about psychological attributes there was total agreement that commitment and self control were identified as the two key ingredients for excellence.

Commitment means having the drive, determination, heart and attitude. Setting appropriate goals and being hungry helps. Self control means being able to perform well in big games and tight situations as well as in normal games and situations.

Williams (1993) believe training for competitions such as the Nationals or state championships is a product of both body and mind. Just improving physical skills, strategies, and conditioning increases the likelihood of peak performance, learning to control psychological readiness and the ideal mental climate for peak performance also enhances performances.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – National Skeet Championships

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Skeet Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **Squadding is by Pre-Nomination Only. The close date for nominations is the 3rd May 2019**
3. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
4. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
5. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
7. For the National 28gauge Championship load size is limited to 21gr (3/4oz) maximum struck measure shot size not larger than no. 7. For the National .410bore Championship load size is limited to 14gr (1/2oz) maximum struck measure shot size not larger than no. 7”
8. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management
9. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
10. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
11. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
14. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Women's, Junior's or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Anyone participating in the practice of card playing at the National Championships is expected to be considerate of the requirements of others, and the presence and behaviour of the card players must not cause inconvenience or disturbance. Tournament Director to adjudicate.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final. The ACTA reserves the right to alter the program.
20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
21. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.**
22. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one or two visits to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
23. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.
24. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
25. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event needs to be done in writing or by ringing the National Office (02 6938 2121) & leaving a message **PRIOR** to the event. All refund requests will be dealt with on an individual basis.
26. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorization from the Tournament director or the Shoot Marshal.
27. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade prior to entering State and National Championships.

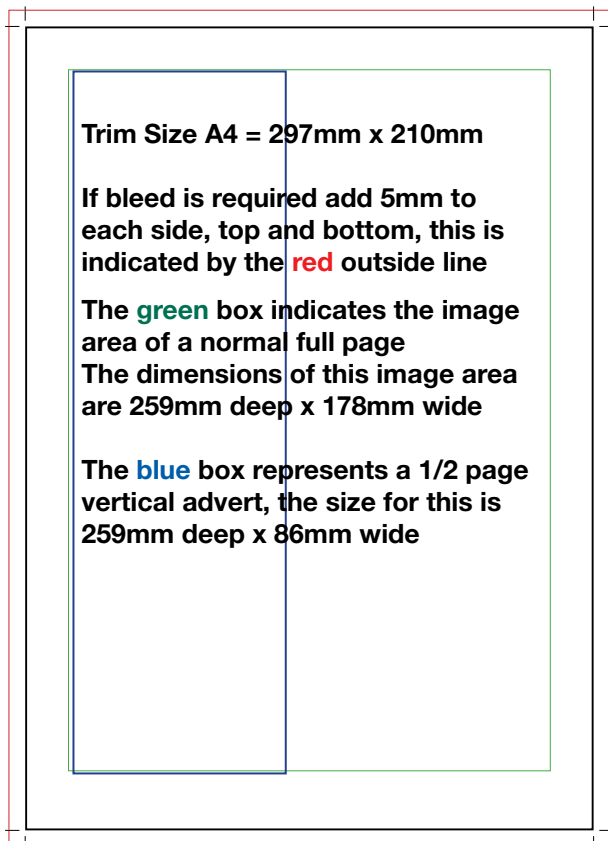
