# 2019 ACTA Trap Nationals

## Roma Clay Target Club, Queensland. April 1 – 7



**It may have been a little wet under foot, but heavy rains in Roma just days before the official opening did nothing to dampen the enthusiasm of competitors and officials for the 2019 Trap Nationals.**

Prior to the commencement of the opening ceremony, the Glenn Cup team challenge between Australia and New Zealand was contested.

The Glenn Cup is shot in alternate years in Australia and New Zealand. After 50 targets the Australian team of Phil Grainger, Kim Nealon, James Hayden, Grady Evans and Cameron Browne was victorious with a score of 249, only one target ahead of New Zealand, 248.

The shoot was officially opened by Maranoa Regional Council Mayor Tyson Golder who acknowledged the amazing work of the Roma club in preparing

and presenting the facility to such a high standard for the event.

He also spoke of the importance of such events to regional areas, the economic benefit a great lift for the centre doing it tough with drought.

Australian Clay Target Association (ACTA) President Robert Nugent also welcomed shooters and spectators to the grounds, also praising the work of the hard-working committee and club members in hosting the Nationals.

The official opening commenced with Pipe Major Rod Smith of the City of Ipswich Pipe Band and 2001 World Champion leading the Glenn Cup and State teams onto the layouts for the

formal part of the proceedings. Following the National Anthem, Lane Brookes performed a Welcome to Country as a representative of the traditional owners of the land, the Mandandanji people. It was then time to present the first awards with the winners of the State Shoulder to Shoulder Match being announced and presented with badges. The winning junior team was South Australia consisting of Lachlan Koch, Liam Morgan and Molly Bretag with 75/75. New South Wales took out the Ladies event with Tammy Henshall, Amy Smith and Samantha Peck also shooting 75/75. Queensland's veterans were one target winners over South Australia shooting 75/75, with team members Daryl Grant, Colin Witt and Edgar Collins providing the perfect score. The Open section also went to Queensland with a perfect

Mayor Golder and Mr Brookes selected South Australia as the Best Dressed Team, members receiving a Gold ACTA medal. The official opening concluded with Mayor Golder firing the opening shot.

Eleven possibles made up the red scores on the board and after another 53 targets, Kent Nicholl from New Zealand, shooting from a handicap mark of 21 metres with a score of 103/103, was declared the winner.

Kent received the Gordon Hall Perpetual Trophy, Royal Blue Sash, Silver Australia Badge, a magnificent Beretta Silver Pigeon trap gun presented to him by George Barton from Beretta Australia.

Second place went to Luke Hipwell from the Echuca club, who shot from 17 metres, and finished with a score of 102/103. Travis Streeter from Callide Dawson came in third on 96/97, shooting from 21 metres. Fourth place went to Alexander Hawkins from Cobar, 94/95, shooting off 15 metres and fifth place was taken out by Shane Gallagher, Broken Hill, 77/78 from 22 metres.

Royce Normington from Eastern Goldfields was the winner of the prestigious Mark McInnes–Arty Del-Ben 25 Metre Perpetual Cup, Light Blue Sash and 250 shotshells. Royce shot 50/50.

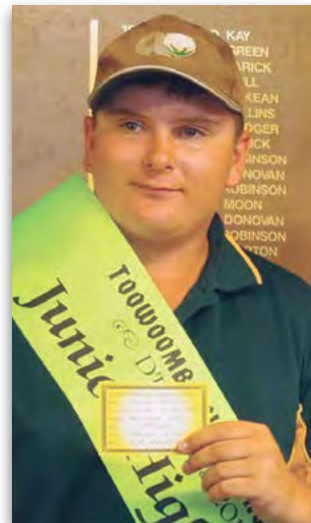
Joanne Segond von Banchet on 40/50.

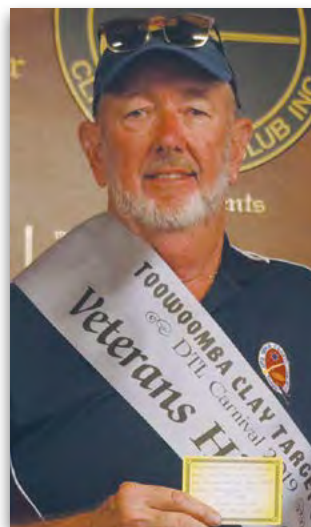

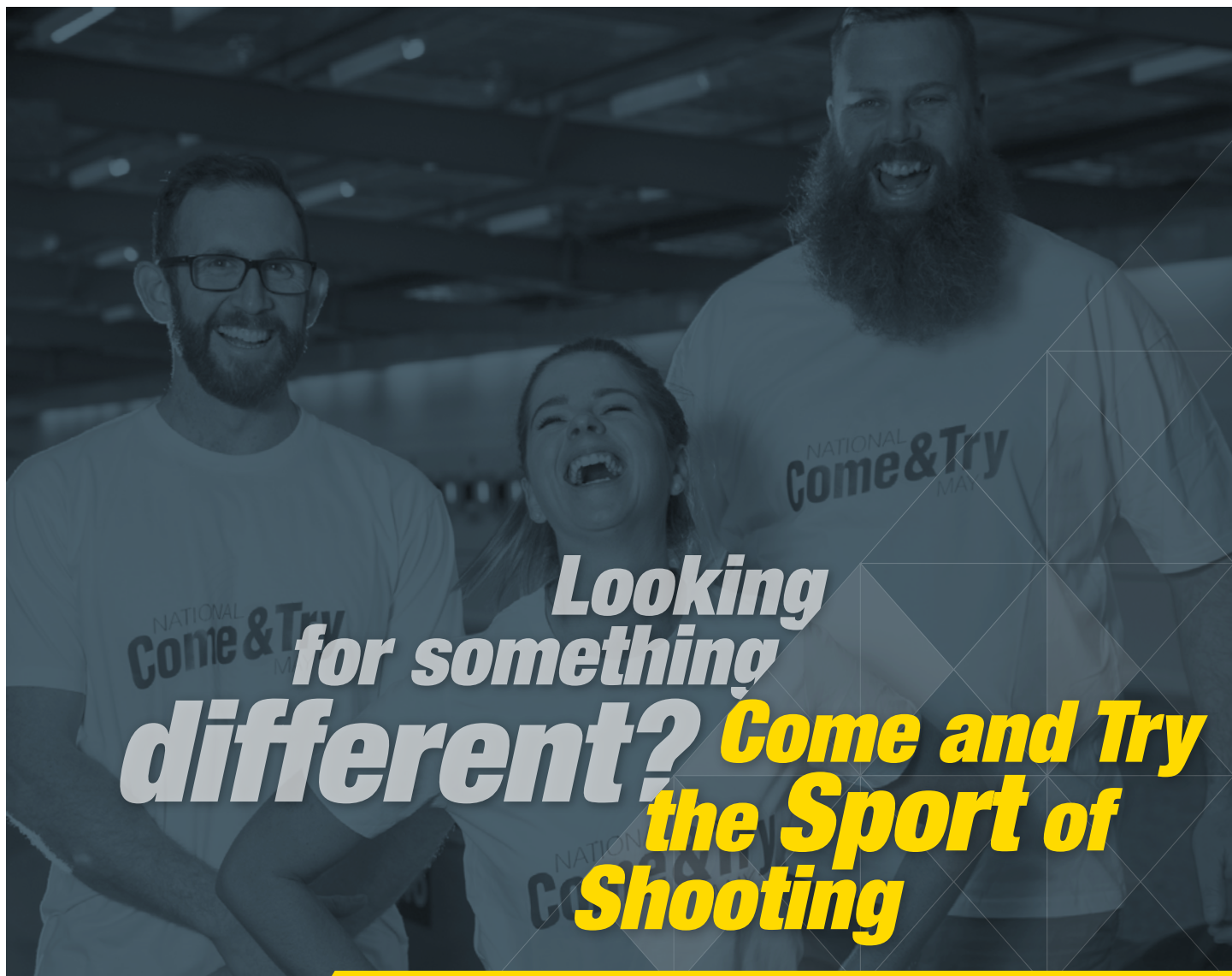

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

## Meeting Our Basic Needs

Since I retired, or possibly semi retired, I have been able to attend the Veterans Games shoot at Wagga Gun Club that is usually held in March. The games have been going for 19 years and I am annoyed now that I didn't take the time off when I was working to attend this annual shoot.

This is what would be referred to as a budget shoot. The noms cover the cost of the clays and the prizes are medals. Do not shrug off the fact that the prizes are only medals because these replica precious metal gold, silver and bronze medals are highly sought after and strongly fought for. In saying that, the competition is intense. The regular grading system of AA, A, B, and C grades is ignored and shooters compete against others in the same age group; which makes it more difficult for some because in an age group there will be AA, A, B, and C grade shooters all participating and competing.

The other interesting fact is that there is an over 80s age group. How fantastic that our sport still enables us to take part, compete and still be competitive when you are over 80 years old.

Some shooters have been attending this shoot for years and make a commitment to return next year. So why? They are not going to win a car, heaps of \$\$\$, Hall of Fame points, but they still approach this shoot with the intense drive and dedication that they would a national championship.

Because the shoot is in the Riverina in early autumn the weather is always likely to be good. The targets thrown at Wagga Gun Club (the national ground) are very good and it gives shooters the opportunity to practise on the ground a month or so before the trap Nationals and a few months before the skeet Nationals. But it is not the targets or National ground that attracts shooters and their families and keeps them coming back year after year. What they love about the shoot is that it meets their basic human needs.

I often talk to parents, teachers and clients about what our needs are as human beings. William Glasser, a famous American Psychologist, believed that humans had five main needs that were neces-

sary for our existence and wellbeing. According to Glasser, all behavior is purposeful. These needs are the general motivation for everything we do.

<b>BELONGING</b>	<b>POWER</b>
<b>FREEDOM</b>	<b>FUN</b>

The first of these needs is a primitive desire to survive; find food, shelter, safety and sex. This drive is part of the old brain that has been there since we evolved and climbed down from the trees and is therefore a physiological need because it is species specific and not individually specific.

The other four however are psychological needs not physiological needs. They are not as basic and if we do not meet these needs (or if they are met in a negative fashion) then this will tend to lead to mal-adaptive behaviours.

The first of these needs is **belonging**. We all as humans want to belong or be part of a group, strive for social connections and develop relationships. This group may be a family, social group, sporting group, church group or a group of work colleagues.

The second need is **power**. To be powerful is to achieve, to be competent, to be skilled, to be recognised for our achievements and skill, to be listened to and have a sense of self worth.

The third need is for **freedom**. The need to be free is the need for independence, autonomy, to have choices and to be able to take control of the direction of one's life. Therefore it is the freedom to make choices or being empowered to choose those things that will make us a well-adapted person.

The final need that human beings have is the need for **fun**. The need for fun is the need to find pleasure, to play and to laugh. Should you doubt that this is as important as any of the others, imagine a life without hope of any enjoyment. Glasser links the need for fun to learning. If you enjoy what you're doing you will learn and improve, and life will be more enjoyable.

Glasser's needs share five characteristics; They are universal, they are innate, they overlap, they are

satisfied in the moment and they conflict with other needs

The Veterans Games met all of Glasser's needs. Shooters felt that they belonged. The atmosphere was friendly and welcoming: like being at your favourite club. Approval was afforded to all; it didn't matter what grade you were, what handicap you were on, what score you shot, you were made to feel important because you were there.

What a great four days. The organisers did a great job. Good targets, good food and great venue and a great sense of shared purpose. What the organisers didn't plan for was the additional benefits that I (and I'm sure so many others) got out of the shoot. You cannot plan to make sure people enjoy themselves, you can't plan to make people feel sense of belonging and acceptance, but when you are able to provide these needs to those that attend you will always have people feeling positive and happy about being part of the event, and this will bring them back year after year.

Several years ago I wrote an article called "Is winning everything?" where I examined the difference between being product orientated (going for gold)

and being process orientated (going for gold but enjoying the journey if you don't win); at the Veterans games both orientations were there. Shooters were trying to win but it wasn't their only desire because their needs of approval, belonging, freedom and fun were being adequately met by making the process enjoyable.

The organisers at Wagga Gun Club did a great job, again. If you have never attended a Veterans or Masters Games, give it a go and enjoy the sport for what it is, a sport.

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – National Skeet Championships

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Skeet Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **The close date for nominations is 5pm on the 3rd May 2019. Preferential squadding will only be accepted on nominations received prior to this date.**
3. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
4. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.  
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
5. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
7. For the National 28gauge Championship load size is limited to 21gr (3/4oz) maximum struck measure shot size not larger than no. 7. For the National .410bore Championship load size is limited to 14gr (1/2oz) maximum struck measure shot size not larger than no. 7"
8. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at a designated trap at a time suitable to management if time permits.
9. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
10. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
11. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
14. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Women's, Junior's or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final. The ACTA reserves the right to alter the program.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.**
21. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one or two visits to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
22. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.
23. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline and only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating and will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
24. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event needs to be done in writing or by ringing the National Office (02 6938 2121) and leaving a message PRIOR to the event. All refund requests will be dealt with on an individual basis.
25. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorization from the Tournament director or the Shoot Marshal.
26. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade prior to entering State and National Championships.

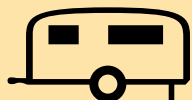

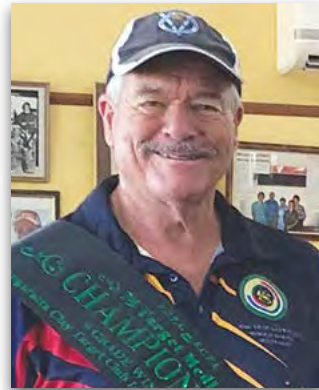

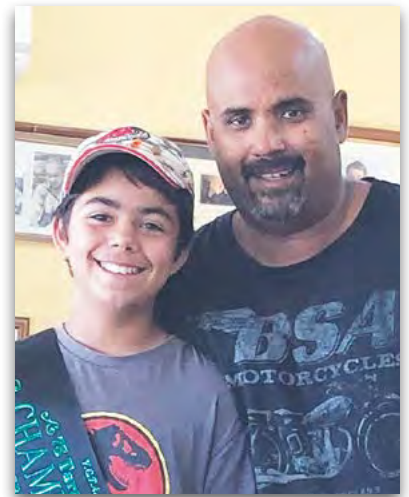

Firearms & accessories means legal firearms owned by members of the named Association/Club, including any accessories or carrying cases.

Loss means loss or damage caused by or arising from a sudden and unforeseen accident including theft from a securely locked building or vehicle.

- Theft cover is conditional on firearms being securely stored in an approved gun safe when the firearm(s) are not in active use.
- No cover will be provided under this policy where the insured, or any other person or entity the equipment has been entrusted to, has breached any law relating to either the storage or use of the firearm(s.)

This insurance is designed to protect each financial member up to \$12,000 with the option to increase this limit to \$25,000 for an additional \$10 payable by the member.

The policy has an excess of \$50 each for every claim and protects members anywhere in Australia 365 days of the year plus overseas for 21 days in any one year.

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
