President's Notes

Skeet Nationals

The Skeet Nationals was another great event with the National Ground in first class condition. Apart from one day of misty rain the weather was glorious and

enjoyed by all. Record scores were the order of the day. Congratulations go to Glenn Clarke for his overall High Gun win. I believe the Skeet Hall of Fame dinner with 125 guests was the largest attendance at a Skeet dinner yet. We saw David O'Sullivan inducted on the night and the Adrian Cousens medal was taken out by Jack Stockdale.

It was great to see former Commonwealth Games Champion Ian Hale in attendance supported by both the club Secretary, Jane Vella and a large contingent of Frankston members. More details in the Shoot and Hall of Fame reports.

Chief Executive Officer

The Chief Executive Officer, Mr Paul McLoughlin tendered his resignation on the 31st May 2019, due to personal reasons. I travelled to Wagga Wagga and met with Vice President Mal Dyson and Paul and accepted his resignation effective immediately on the 6th June. The Executive wishes Paul well in the future.

We then met with the office and ground staff and have organised them to "hold the fort" until a replacement can be found.

World ICTSF Sporting

Vice-President Mal Dyson will be representing ACTA at the General Assembly of the ICTSF in Ireland in July. Agenda items include the venue for the 2022 ICTSF World DTL Championships and South Africa has expressed an interest in hosting this event. Many ACTA members have travelled to South Africa in the past for both this and the Sporting event and if successful their bid would be welcomed by Australia.

Ireland has expressed an interest in hosting the 2024 event. There are no expressions of interest as yet for the 2021 ICTSF World ESP.

New Zealand has proposed lifting the Veterans age to 60 and Super Veterans to 70 for all ICTSF events. I believe this would be supported by ACTA as the 55 age for Veterans is too low.

Mal will also be managing our Sporting Team whilst in Ireland, and congratulations to them for being selected to represent their country.

Executive Meeting

Your Executive will be meeting at the end of August. We have had a great deal of difficulty in settling on a date that would suit the majority of the Executive. Peoples' lives are all getting busier and along with business and work commitments it is proving impossible to get a full attendance. At this stage only one member may not be

present and we will try to link him electronically. States now need to consider agenda items they may wish to have considered and advise both the ACTA and their delegates.

Staff Review

This process is continuing with three staff accepting new positions and some still in negotiation. Jenny Robinson has chosen not to apply for a new position and has resigned from the ACTA after 7 years. Our thanks go to Jenny for her commitment during her time with the Association. A new position of Media Officer has been created and interviews conducted. Two suitable applicants have been identified. These have been advised and will be considered during the August Executive meeting (due to no CEO). Those that followed the basic social media posts from the Trap and Skeet Nationals would understand how big a deal having a specialist in this and the mainstream media fields will be for the Association.

Rules Supervisor's Meeting

I have been amazed that approximately 40 briefing papers covering all sorts of issues have been submitted for consideration. This will be a very busy meeting for those in attendance. The ACTA is sharing attendee's costs equally with States.

Food For Thought

The National Ground, like many of the larger facilities is now a great venue. Attractive surrounds, the best target throwing equipment, excellent catering and relaxation areas etc.

Paid trappers, cleaners and ground staff help make the events conducted there an enjoyable experience for our members who have to do minimal work whilst in attendance.

However all this comes at a cost. Historically the greater membership, most of whom are not in attendance at the major events, by paying their annual ACTA subscription "prop up" the cost of providing the facilities and services we have all come to take a bit for granted, expect and demand for our National events. Costs to maintain and run such a large ground are measured in 100's of 1000's of dollars annually and have never, can never, and will never be recovered from those alone nominating for National events, approximately 800 in total in any given year. (Calculated as 500 Trap, 180 Skeet, 120 Sporting)

Another related large cost covered by subscriptions is the support of teams that are selected at Nationals to travel annually. The support given to team members travelling overseas on behalf of the ACTA is now better than it has ever been and envied by other Associations and countries.

Clubs should consider that their actions in not signing up members with the ACTA is jeopardising all we have worked

so hard for over so many decades. The travelling members, the achievers, from clubs, that do attend Nationals and make representative teams and put their club and the sport on show need to be supported by club committees recognising these events cannot survive and continue as they are, on nominations alone.

Membership of the ACTA must be promoted and insisted on by all clubs for all their shooting members not only in the spirit of being part of an Association but also because it is a binding affiliation requirement.

Sponsors

With many changes in the firearms and ammunition industry of late it is not surprising that sponsorship generally is getting harder to source from within the firearms related industries.

Therefore it was a pleasant surprise to see the level of sponsorship at the Skeet Nationals, particularly from Bronze Wing Ammunition, providing \$2000 for the Skeet High Gun on top of other existing sponsorship. Thanks to all the event sponsors and especially to Anna, Len, Deb, and of course Marcello from Bronze Wing.

ACTA Sporting

The decision was made to take the Sporting event to West Australia this year. We understand the WA Association has left no stone unturned to make this event successful. Many complain when any event is taken away from the National Grounds but let's be fair here. It is the same distance from Wagga Wagga to Perth as it is from Perth to Wagga Wagga and West Australians have to travel this distance 9 out of every 10 years. I think sometimes we lose the plot a bit. Associations are formed to achieve common goals, and make services available and be fair to ALL members. There is also the matter of equity involved when those who are on home ground at Wagga Wagga continually are pressed when they don't have the home ground advantage. I wish the West Australian organisers the very best for the event and encourage as many shooters from wherever they may be to attend.

Constitutional Review

The Sub-Committee chaired by Mal Dyson met at the skeet and has agreed a few starting points for the review.

- Proposed timeframe is for adoption at the 2021 AGM.
- Proposed entity type – Company Limited by Guarantee.
- Proposed Governance method – Independent Board.

Major Considerations –

- Broad base to choose Board nominees from.
- Ease of joining the ACTA.

Action – Committee to recommend to the Executive to co-opt a person with a legal background. The Committee will meet again at the Executive meetings in August.

I thank the volunteer committee members for freely giving their time for this meeting.

There will be no CEO report this month due to the resignation of Paul McLoughlin.

On June 7th the ACTA posted the following notice on the ACTA website for the information of members:

“ACTA Executive wish to inform members that due to personal reasons the CEO Paul McLoughlin has resigned from the position. The ACTA wishes to thank Paul for his time with the Association and wish him well for the future.”

Clay Target

As at the 1st January the ACTA magazine “Clay Target”, after being printed for some seventy-two years, became a digital only publication. This was made necessary because of the enormous cost involved, not so much in the production and printing but essentially in the postage costs associated with distribution to members.

Generally the digital publication has been well received, with many very favorable comments, along with other not so favorable opinions. Members and clubs have greatly benefited in the digital publication, which has consequently seen a reduction of annual membership registration fees because of cost reductions and reduced advertising rates for club advertising.

The new rates for Member Clubs to advertise in “Clay Target”, which came into effect as of the April issue are as follows: full page \$327, half page \$192, quarter page \$140 and eighth page \$99. This represents great advertising value to member clubs who are also receiving the benefit of interactivity between their advertisements and any website that they may reference.

The magazine is now sent out to a far greater number of members, as all membership categories are included in the mail-out. Copies printed and mailed out averaged around 9500 to 10,000 per issue, but we estimate that between 10 to 20 percent or even more were never taken out of their plastic wrapper. With the email distribution the number distributed last month was 13,637 with only 30 emails bouncing back as having uncontactable email addresses. Anyone still not receiving the emailed magazine may be one of these unknown addresses. These people should firstly check their personal data at “MyPage” on the ACTA website or contact the ACTA office who will be able to sort the problem out.

Another benefit afforded by the digital publication is that there is no longer a limit to page extent. When printed the magazine postage weight dictated that we were only able to produce 64 pages of text plus covers. Today without page limits we can have bigger issues with not only larger but more photos.

Rules Supervisors Meeting

The response for briefing papers from Rules Supervisors and States has been overwhelming with over 40 papers presented listing a variety of possible rule changes to be discussed.

The submission cut-off date was June 14 and we are now in the process of preparing the meeting agenda. All State Associations will be represented by both their Rules Supervisors and Handicappers.

The new Rule Book is now expected to be available on the 1st January 2020.

2019 Victorian State 5 Stand Sporting Championship



For most of the Saturday before the Championship, a dedicated group of Maryborough members set up three 5 Stand Sporting grounds and it was a little disappointing for the Club when the shoot attendance was nowhere near that anticipated. However the event was made quite special by competitors and spectators being able to witness some of Australia's best sporting shooters in action, producing some great scores over the three challenging grounds.

Thirty-five targets were shot on layout one, thirty on the second layout and then a further thirty-five on layout three to make up the 100 target event. Using this format, as in the past, the event ran through quickly and smoothly and the shoot including presentations finished early with plenty of daylight remaining for shooters to get home.

The Club would also like to take this opportunity to express our thanks to our Club ladies, Lorraine, Christine and Judy who maintained the canteen to the same high standard that shooters have become accustomed to.

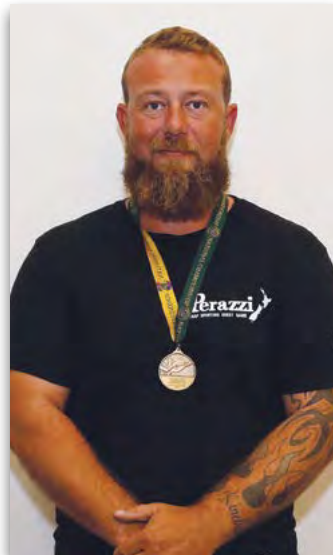

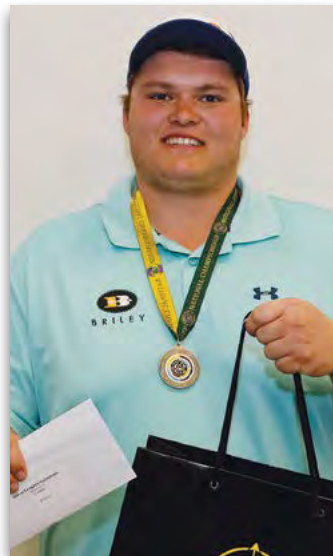

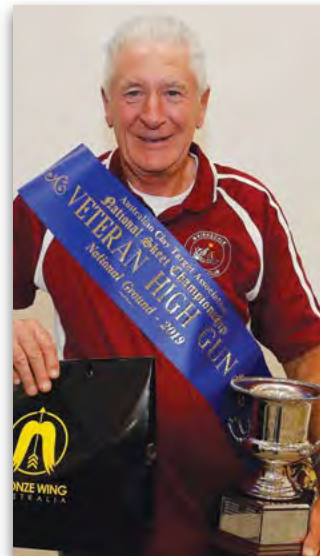

international home base to be at our dinner. Please see a separate article about Ian contained in this edition of the CT.

Ian Hale and Adrian Cousens both shot over 400 breaks at the 1984 Skeet Nationals at Melbourne Gun Club, Adrian shooting a 446 only to have

it broken approximately 2 hours later by Ian shooting at 487.

Fast forward to 2017 and Michael Buttigieg and David O'Sullivan also shot 400+ breaks with Michael going on to set an Australian 12 gauge long run of 783. It was a marvelous sight to have all 4 of these immensely talented shooters on the stage at the same time. The Masters Award were presented by Mal Dyson from the ACTA.

The last award of the evening was the Master's Award for Skeet Doubles this was won by Michael Buttigieg of Victoria with a 225 break.

2019 Skeet Hall of Fame Inductee David O'Sullivan

David O'Sullivan first started rabbit shooting on a friend's property and graduated to clay target shooting by joining the Frankston Gun Club in 1997. His mother would bring David to the club after cricket training and often he would be seen still wearing his cricket whites on the skeet field! David and his father John O'Sullivan struck up a conversation with a very nice club member one day whilst David was practicing, this kind gentlemen turned out to be Adrian Cousens! Adrian kindly took David under his wing and many weekends were spent up at the Bairnsdale gun club practicing under Adrian's watchful eye. David's big break happening in 2000 when the ACTA decided to fund

a junior team to the Skeet World Championships in San Antonio Texas. David shot extremely well at the world championship even shooting several 100 straights which bode well for the future.

Back in Australia and David was keenly following the major skeet shoots and very early success with National runner-up in the 20 gauge in 2000 and 2002 and Skeet Doubles events in 2001. David really gained international notoriety in New Zealand in 2011 where he shot off against Tod Bender, multiple world champion in the NZ 12 gauge event in cold and miserable conditions and pushed the world champion to his limits.

David's first National title came in 2012 at the Australian Skeet Nationals where he won the Champion of Champions event, but this was eclipsed several days later when he took the Overall High Gun.

During his shooting career David has amassed 9 National titles, 10 x National runner-ups, 26 State titles, 5 Glenn Cup Trophy Teams, 4 x World teams, 8 x All Australian Teams and 460 Hall of Fame points.

David is truly deserving of his induction to the 2019 Skeet Hall of Fame.

Masters Award Presented to IAN HALE

The 2019 Skeet Nationals and the associated Hall of Fame Dinner was a perfect platform to invite Ian Hale. Ian was very humbled and graciously accepted the invitation meaning he would need to travel from his now home in Indonesia, to Wagga Wagga. I was fortunate to not only assist with the arrangements for Ian's attendance, but Ian also allocated some of his time to sit down with me and paint a picture of his colourful journey through his long involvement in the Sport of Clay Target Shooting.

Ian, a Life Member of the Frankston Australian Clay Target Club (FACTC), did not commence his participation in the sport at what would become his home Club. In fact, it was not even built as yet at its current location in Rossiter Road, Carrum Downs. Ian would attend the Cranbourne Clay Target Club and later moved to the Keysborough Clay Target Club where he received some training in Skeet from Danny Parsell.

Eventually FACTC was built with Ian taking his place as one of the original Committee Members. Ian recalled shooting many rounds of Trap on the newly built grounds, and until the skeet grounds were formed, he would shoot American and ISSF Skeet (or ISU Skeet when Ian was competing) at Melbourne Gun Club. American Skeet was eventually built on Grounds 1 and 2, ISSF Skeet on Ground 3 and from here Ian would shoot many rounds of practice with Michael Inguanti, David Cunningham and Alex Crikis (partner in the Australian Team and member of Melbourne Gun Club).

There were no coaches readily available like the Australian Team has access to today, and also with minimal domestic ISSF Skeet competition, Ian had to rely on participation in American Skeet competitions to help keep that competitive edge. It was also apparent that team funding was minimal to near non-existent therefore Ian's international representation to events such as World Cups or World Championships, was primarily at his own expense.

Ian attended his first Commonwealth Games in 1978 and went on to attend four more consecutive Games in 1982, 1986, 1990 and 1994. Ian was the first in any sport to make the team for consecutive Commonwealth Games. The most memorable for him being 1994 in Canada, where

Ian had the honour of being the Flag Bearer for the Australian Team; an honour that no other Australian Clay Target Shooter has been bestowed to this day. Ian's medal haul from his Commonwealth Games representation included one each of Gold, Silver and Bronze.

Ian was part of the Australian Team in three consecutive Olympic Games in 1980, 1984 and 1988, finishing in fourth place in Los Angeles in 1984. Ian broke a World Record at a German World Cup in 1986.

Clay Target Shooting to Ian is a family sport and he believes that Clubs are a very important component in the success of anyone aiming to be competitive in their chosen discipline. Clubs create opportunity for domestic competition and form the utmost important part of any Australian Team Members training regime.

Ian was very chuffed when he was presented with

his Life Membership at FACTC in the 1990's. Ian was inducted into the VCTA Skeet Hall of Fame in 2016 and during this year's Skeet Nationals, received his Master's Award for shooting a 12 gauge long break of 486 in 1984.

Ian was presented with his award together with his good mate Adrian Cousens, who also was acknowledged for the same award for the same year.

At the now age of 69, Ian has well and truly stopped competing but his passion for the sport is ongoing. It was a perfect opportunity during the Skeet Nationals to introduce Ian to current ISSF Skeet competitors Keith Ferguson and Mat Costa.

Ian was only too happy to share his stories and offer some advice with one of the topics being discussed; should Keith and Mat be shooting American Skeet gun up or gun down!

In closing, I asked Ian if he had some primary words of advice and he said "I just loved competing and I really enjoyed the game. If you fault, you have no one else to blame but yourself. Enjoy what you have whether it is a win or a loss and then just focus on your next event".

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Cognitive Bias

I am writing this article in the last week of the 2019 federal election campaign. Please do not stop reading, the article is not political, but it is about the thinking and cognitive process behind making decisions.

According to Kendra Cherry, a cognitive bias is a systematic error in thinking that affects the decisions and judgments that people make.

Some biases are related to memory. When we make decisions we often rely on our memory. Most of us believe our memories to be an infallible record of the true course of events. This is a flawed assumption because the way that we remember an event may be biased because of a number of reasons. Other biases are related to attention. What we pay attention to in the world is affected by the focus: it can be a broad focus or it can be a very narrow focus. As a result very subtle biases can creep in and influence the way we see and think about the world.

How Do Cognitive Biases Work?

Kendra Cherry in <https://www.verywellmind.com> defines a cognitive bias as 'a type of error in thinking that occurs when people are processing and interpreting information in the world around them.' She continues by stating, the human brain is powerful but subject to limitations. Cognitive biases are often a result of your brain's attempt to simplify information processing. They are rules of

thumb that help you make sense of the world and reach decisions with relative speed.'

We all like to think that we are logical and rational in our decision making but we often make poor decisions because we are unable to always consider the information that is available to us and these biases get in the way.

Causes

Kendra Cherry continues by stating that 'if you had to think about every possible option when making a decision, it would probably take a lot of time to make even the simplest choice. Because of the sheer complexity of the world around you and the amount of information in the environment, it is necessary sometimes to rely on some mental shortcuts that allow you to act quickly.'

Social pressures, individual motivations, emotions, and limits on the mind's ability to process information as well as social media can also contribute to these biases.

Not all biases are bad and in fact they allow us to make decision more quickly. This can be paramount in life threatening situations and the ability to make quick decisions may keep you away from danger.

What are the Types of Cognitive Biases:

- *Confirmation Bias*: This is favouring information that conforms to your existing beliefs and discounting evidence that does not conform. This could be seen over and over again in the lead

up to the Federal election. Commentators would ask questions that clearly could be perceived as biased. For the shooter it may be manifested in their choice of gun or ammunition or even what gun clubs to attend. I like to use SAGA ammunition because of the reviews that I have read in some English shooting magazines, reinforce what I already believe, and the effectiveness by which they break clays for me. So if I had to buy ammunition I would more likely consider SAGA than another brand.

- *Availability Heuristic*: This is a complex way of deciding on the things that come to mind quickly.
- *Halo Effect*: Your overall impression of a person influences how you feel and think about his or her character. This especially applies to physical attractiveness influencing how you rate their other qualities.
- *Self-Serving Bias*: This is the tendency to blame external forces when bad things happen and give yourself credit when good things happen. This is actually a positive in sport. It means that you are less likely to dwell on the past and make negative judgements about yourself or your performance.
- *Attentional Bias*: This bias involves paying attention to some things while ignoring others at the same time. When buying a new gun you may focus your attention on the brand or on some aspects rather than look at whether it will suit you or your shooting discipline.
- *Actor-Observer Bias*: This is the tendency to attribute your own actions to external causes while attributing other people's behaviors to internal causes. You attribute your high cholesterol level to genetics while you consider others to have a high level due to poor diet and lack of exercise.
- *Functional Fixedness*: This is the tendency to see objects as only working in a particular way. If you think that you can only shoot targets at a particular range with a particular choke you may be limiting options.
- *Anchoring Bias*: This is the tendency to rely too heavily on the very first piece of information you learn off others by putting the first information on the table for consideration.
- *Misinformation Effect*: This is the tendency for post-event information to interfere with the memory of the original event. It is easy to have your memory influenced by what you hear about the event from others.
- *False Consensus Effect*: This is the tendency to over-estimate how much other people agree with you.

- *Optimism Bias*: This bias leads you to believe that you are less likely to suffer from misfortune and more likely to attain success than your peers.

These biases are actually distortions of our thinking that have their base in memory, attention, attribution and other mental mistakes. They should not be confused with a logical fallacy where you make a mistake because there was a fundamental error in your logical argument.

So armed with information maybe you can make sense of the decisions that were made during the federal election as well as understand why we make the decisions we do.

Firearms & accessories means legal firearms owned by members of the named Association/Club, including any accessories or carrying cases.

Loss means loss or damage caused by or arising from a sudden and unforeseen accident including theft from a securely locked building or vehicle.

- Theft cover is conditional on firearms being securely stored in an approved gun safe when the firearm(s) are not in active use.
- No cover will be provided under this policy where the insured, or any other person or entity the equipment has been entrusted to, has breached any law relating to either the storage or use of the firearm(s.)

This insurance is designed to protect each financial member up to \$12,000 with the option to increase this limit to \$25,000 for an additional \$10 payable by the member.

The policy has an excess of \$50 each for every claim and protects members anywhere in Australia 365 days of the year plus overseas for 21 days in any one year.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Sporting Clays Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held or a member of another ICTSF affiliate.
2. Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
3. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
4. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
5. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
6. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
7. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
8. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
9. Shooters who fail to appear on time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
10. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
11. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
12. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
13. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
14. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
15. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
16. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
17. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
18. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
19. Nominations will be by pre-nomination, and only if nominations do not reach the maximum entry of 120 will nominations be taken on the day. Nomination if taken on the day of the event will incur a extra fee of \$10.00. Nominations will close daily at 10 .00am.
20. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 22. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.**
23. Competitors to be eligible for A.C.T.A. team selection must be fully paid up members of the A.C.T.A. and Australian citizens prior to the competition.
24. Upon application to the A.C.T.A office, refunds less a \$5.00 administration fee will be available. Refunds will not be available for competitors not complying with these conditions of entry.
25. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
26. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade prior to entering State and National Championships.
27. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorisation from the Tournament Director or Shoot Marshal.

We would also like to extend our sincere thanks to NIOA for their generous support, supplying the ammunition for the day.



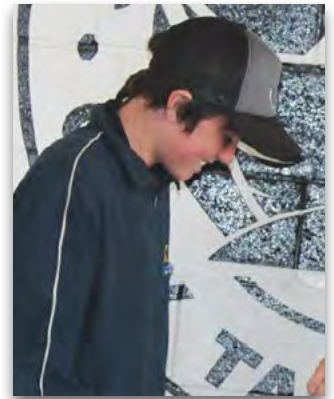
