# President's Notes

## **Chief Executive Officer**

*I have previously advised that the former Chief Executive Officer, Mr Paul McLoughlin tendered his resignation on the 31st May 2019, due to personal*

*reasons. In September of 2018 after preparation of a shortlist of five applicants, interviews took place for this position, with Mr. Paul McLoughlin being appointed at that time. This followed a costly and extended period of advertising and interviews. The Management Sub-Committee has revisited this shortlist and has found that the second preferred applicant is still interested in taking up the position.*

## **ACTA staff**

*With the position of CEO being vacant and a staff member on pre-arranged annual leave, the remaining staff members have been very busy. I cannot speak highly enough of the way that Judy, Sue and Ewen have carried the workload during this period. Maureen has now returned from leave and lightened the load a little. Thank you all.*

## **ICTSF World English Sporting**

*Team members performed exceptionally well at this event with Australia taking out the Teams Silver Medal finishing only 2 targets behind the English Team. With a large field of over 600 shooters individual placings were also taken by Australians. Team manager and ACTA Vice President Mal Dyson has prepared a full report appearing elsewhere in this magazine. Congratulations to our team members for another great result for Australia.*

## **Rules Supervisor's Meeting**

*All states were represented at the Rules Supervisors meeting held recently.*

*They have made recommendations to the Executive for consideration at the forthcoming August meeting. The ACTA is sharing attendee's costs equally with States.*

## **Sovereign Risk. National Grounds**

*I have written previously of how a decision by government at any level could jeopardise the use of our National Grounds for its intended purpose, i.e.: shooting. This has now happened again. The Wagga Wagga City Council adopted a town plan a number of years ago, with the ACTA of the understanding the plan allowed for no development to the south of the National Grounds. Approximately 2 years ago the council proposed a Cycling Track in this area and the Executive Officer of the day corresponded and campaigned boisterously against its proposed siting. The ACTA was of the understanding that this matter had been finalised with the track well to the south of the grounds along the closest row of housing, and would not affect ACTA.*

*Unfortunately council has decided to revisit this matter with the possibility of the track being moved well to the North and again to a position that would allow members of the public and shooters to be looking at each other. Whilst well outside the safety template, members of the public are totally safe but of course are unaware of this fact. This scenario could result in a member of the public contacting police, being shocked, alarmed or frightened for their safety. We cannot afford this to happen. ACTA were not advised by council of this proposed change and we only became aware of it when contacted by a member of the public. ACTA have now attended a meeting with council officers. We have expressed our disappointment that we had not been consulted earlier in this process as a major stakeholder in the area and the fact that the matter was being revisited at all. Council officers have confirmed they are recommending the most southerly proposal to Council. ACTA have now written to all councillors supporting the most southerly proposal and strongly opposing the proposal to the North. We have also strongly requested councillors to accept the recommendations of their expert staff. The ACTA will be represented at the council meeting on the 22nd of July.*

## **Constitutional Review**

*The Sub-Committee recommended to the Executive that Mr. Daniel Allam be co-opted to add some legal expertise to the committee. This was supported by the Executive and we welcome Daniel to the role. The sub-committee meets again on the 23rd of August.*

## **Insurance**

*I have been made aware of a debate going on in the social media sphere about what clubs are insured for and what they are not and whether members are covered whilst in the field.*

*I can assure all that providing the club is acting within the bounds of the ACTA constitution and the law, all activities are minuted at a meeting and are to the benefit of the club, the club is covered. This includes things like fundraisers, charity shoots, provision of camping, catering etc. etc. The cover is very broad and the premise generally is that it must be a legal activity and income is for the benefit of the club. Regarding hunting the cover was for Australia wide and not just on our ranges. I am awaiting a clarifying statement from the insurer which we will place for all to see in the near future.*

*If any member or club has any concerns or questions they need clarification of please put in an email and I will arrange a written response from the insurer.*

The 5th ICTSF World English Sporting was held at the Devenish Lands at Dowth Hall Co Meath Ireland on the 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th July. The 500 acre property consisted of some clear grounds, plus valleys covered in beautiful bushland.

In perfect weather conditions the competition of 100 targets 5 stand English Sports Trap was shot over four layouts, and the ICTSF country competition of 200 targets was shot over two

# ACTA Commonwealth Carnival

Whilst the Gympie Clay Target Club was short on time, it was big on effort to make the 2019 ACTA Commonwealth Carnival come together to be a very successful event. The 2019 Carnival was to be held in the NT, however when this didn't eventuate, it was offered further afield. Gympie Club put up its hand, nominating 28/29/30 June as possible dates, and received final approval to hold the event early in March. The committee had just over three months to organise a National event.

The Club expanded to four layouts late in 2017 as a result of a Gambling Community Benefit Fund Grant, making it eligible to hold National, State and Zone shoots. In addition, disabled pathways were installed, and Laporte traps fitted to each layout. Timing of the Commonwealth shoot (last weekend in June) meant that many prospective sponsors had exhausted their financial year budget. This made things difficult, however with assistance from the Qld Police CTC, Spartan, Aqusport, TSA Outdoors and Owens Guns Gympie, the Gympie CTC topped up the prize pool to include Gympie Gold nuggets, cash and ammunition. ACTA provided sashes, badges and perpetual plates for Overall winners.

As always, many visiting shooters camped on site, and social gatherings were commonplace. The weather was kind with temperatures in the low-mid twenties. Day 1 & 2 saw a few tropical showers which left as quickly as they arrived, and didn't deter shooters from achieving very good scores. Many commented that the Winchester targets were easy to see, and the scores throughout the event reflected this.

Around 80 shooters participated over the three days some would say we had quality over quantity! Shooters from Tasmania, Victoria, NSW and Queensland attended. Unfortunately, there was a shortage of shooters in the lower grades with only 9 B graders and 5 C graders participating. Shooters in these grades fared very well in the prize collection stakes.

Gympie Regional Council Mayor, Mick Curran officially opened the carnival, and fired the first shot of the day, shattering the target. Unfortunately for Mick the next couple of targets eluded him, so he chose to retire. Competition then began in earnest, with highlights including: 19 possibles being shot over the 6 events our youngest nominated shooter, Erin Guy from Maryborough CTC won the Handicap event in a shoot-off 56/57.

DB shoot-off started with 15 shooters and ended 452 targets later won by Toogoolawah CTC shooter, Daryl Stevens 502/502 from Greg Matthews, Maryborough CTC 501/502. Club break record of 576 awarded to Daryl Stevens.

Gympie CTC Committee is grateful to everyone who attended and to all those who assisted to organise and run the event. A great effort from all involved!

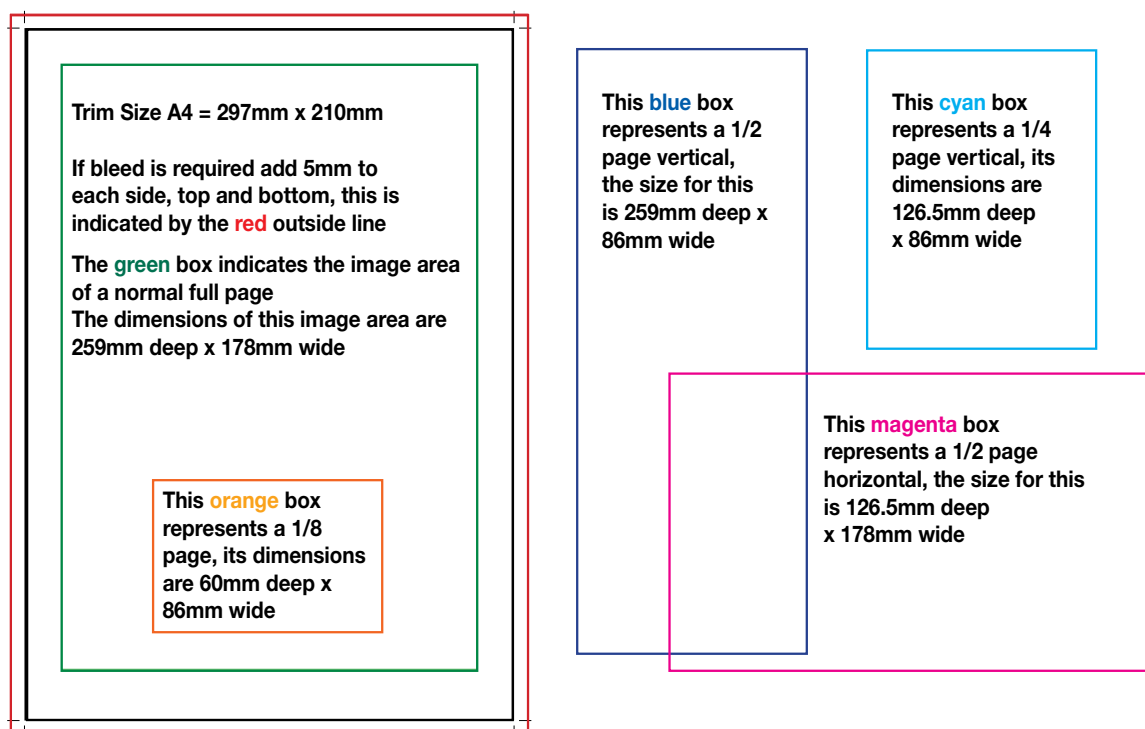

Advertisements may be supplied as a completely finished PDF or as a Word document with illustrations, photos and logos either included in format or attached as separate files. When illustrations are included as part of the document they should be imported into your document as high resolution images. When supplying a PDF ensure that the PDF is exported as an ADOBE INTERACTIVE PDF with the IMAGE HANDLING set to: COMPRESSION – JPEG (Lossy), JPEG QUALITY – High and RESOLUTION – 144. PDF files should be supplied to the exact finished size that you require.

CLAY TARGET is now produced as a standard A4 document (297mm deep x 210mm wide). If you require your full page advertisement to bleed off the page, you will need to allow an additional 5mm to the top, bottom and both sides of your finished file, and make sure that any content fits well within the actual page size. # Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

## Confidence again

At the 2019 Skeet Nationals I had the opportunity to meet with and talk to a number of shooters from all over Australia and New Zealand. I would like to thank those shooters who read these article and made favourable comments but more importantly took time to ask questions that were on their mind. I am happy to sit with shooters and answer their questions. Mental skills are essential in our sport. The questions asked often focus on core issues such as confidence.

In the past I have examined the idea of mental toughness, which is defined as the set of behaviours and beliefs about yourself, your work, your sport, and how you interact. I outlined seven characteristics of mental toughness; being competitive, confident, in control, committed, composed, courageous and consistent.

This month I want to re-explore confidence. This article was originally written in 2010 but it seems

logical to revisit it following the questions that were asked at the Skeet nationals.

### What is self-confidence?

Patrick Cohn from Peaksports defines self-confidence as “how firmly you believe in your ability to execute a physical skill or perform a task”. Confidence, according to Cohn, comes from a baseline assessment of past performances, training, and preparation. As your competency or skill mastery grows, your confidence becomes proportionally stronger, which is strengthened more with successful training and quality practice.

The following is a list of sources of self-confidence. Rank the following from 1 to 10 (adding others if I have missed an important aspect of your own):

Past successes in your sport	Mental game coaching
An effective training program	Coping well under pressure
Immediate performance	Performance review

On a separate piece of paper, write down the 5 most important sources of confidence that are under your control. Focus on what you can control to boost your confidence. Remember that what people say about your performance is not under your control.

Now that you are able to recognize the sources of confidence, it is also important to be able to recognize when confidence is dwindling. The biggest factor limiting confidence is self-doubt. I have written several articles over the years on self-doubt, and if readers need to revise, then go back over old issues or read "The Inner Game of Golf" by Tim Gallwey, which puts the whole idea of self-doubt into perspective. Self-doubt is the opposite of self-confidence and it kills momentum, and stops athletes performing well because they are scared they will fail.

Self-doubt can be developed by a set of unhealthy and irrational beliefs about yourself and life in general. These beliefs include the following:

1. **Strict expectations:** "I can't make any mistakes if I want to win." What happens here is that you try to hard and tense up. You become less fluid and your unable to move and swing the way you should.
2. **Negative self-labels:** "I'm a poor finisher." This focuses you mind on negative judgements about past performances and takes you away from the here and now.
3. **Over-generalisations:** "I don't do well on this course." Again you are focusing on the past and ignoring what you should be focusing on, which is the present.
4. **Perfectionism:** I need to be perfect. This is impossible and will lead to the following behaviours that

will further undermine your self-confidence:

- Setting unrealistic goals and strict expectations
- Dwelling on shortcomings and failures
- Worrying about past mistakes
- Being too self-critical
- Comparing yourself to others
- Overanalyzing your performance
- Viewing your performance as either good or bad
- Measuring your self worth against your sporting success
- Focusing on future gains instead of playing in the present.

Now that you can recognize the sources of self-confidence and you can identify those irrational beliefs that get in the way and produce self-doubt.

There are five steps to seeing yourself as a winner:

Firstly, write down three positive self-labels that positively describe you in your sport, which you can truly believe.

Secondly, post these descriptions on your mirror, fridge, desktop, etc where you can see them every day.

Thirdly, Strive to identify and discard any negative labels that others have given you or that you have made up yourself. Write them on a piece of paper, crumple the paper, and throw it away with authority.

Next, when speaking to others about yourself or your abilities, use the positive self-labels you have formulated with confidence. (Avoid deliberate outward displays of cockiness because people who lack confidence will view it as arrogance.)

Finally Goal: feel cocky on the inside while appearing humble on the inside.

By using the previous five steps, identifying the sources of your confidence and recognizing the negatives that get in the way, you will be on the way to being more self-confident which is an important aspect of mental toughness.

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY NATIONAL SPORTING CLAYS CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Sporting Clays Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held or a member of another ICTSF affiliate.
2. Proof of association membership must be shown. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
3. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
4. Squads of 5 shooters to shoot 100 targets in four rounds of 25.
5. The Organising Committee will decide the order of shooting.
6. Skeet or Trap targets will be thrown, as well as mini, midi battue, rockett rabbit or flash or any other sporting clay target approved by the Association. Target type for any stand will be at the discretion of the shoot official, but shall number five (5) in total.
7. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
8. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
9. Shooters who fail to appear on time for their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is a possibility.
10. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he may not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
11. All shooters must sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
12. Any competitor will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfill their obligation to do so. Failure to either referee or score may incur a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET.
13. Shooters will be drawn from each day's last round squads to referee and score the first round of the following day, being ready to officiate at the advertised starting time. Shooters who fail to fulfil their responsibility may be penalised one target. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person.
14. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap may be penalised FIVE (5) TARGETS.
15. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
16. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
17. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.

21. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.

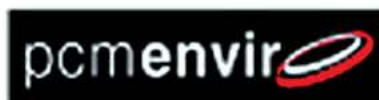

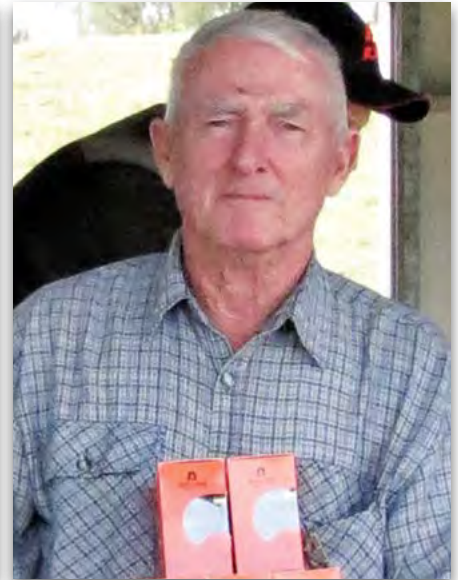

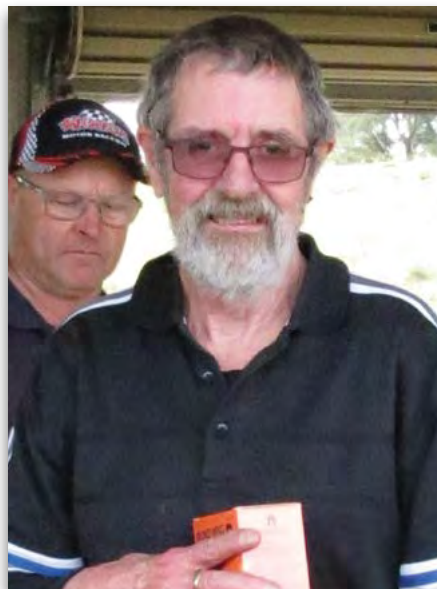

I invited him to come and shoot with myself and my wife Karen at Sydney Clay Target Club, we soon became very good friends and started to attend shoots together all over NSW.

In 1997 John, myself along with Geoff and Janenne Kidd of Wagga and Bob Rose from Illawarra Gun Club travelled to the USA to shoot the Grand American Trap shoot at Vandalia Ohio.

Every year since 1997 through to 2004 after a little break due to medical issues we then started again in 2008 thru 2013 John and I travelled to the USA along with our good friend Allan Jones from Cessnock, to say we had a ball is an understatement, we soon became known as the three amigos and in later years as we matured and filled out a little more and were affectionately known as the 3 Pillow Brothers. For those who do not know there are 4 grades of shooters in Trapshooting AA, A, B, and C. (It is common knowledge that you must eat your way to Double A and the three of us certainly attested to that statement).

John was the most easy-going guy you could meet, nothing was a problem to him anytime you needed, a hand at home, or the Gun Club Johnny was there, he became a committee member of Sydney CTC soon after joining the club and was a valuable asset to the club and to myself as we both worked together on the committee along with my wife Karen for approximately 15 years together.

Those years on the committee were very satisfying as along with the Marconi Clay Target Club we built a new larger Clubhouse also new installed new Gemini trap machines, whilst mentioning the Gemini Traps I know Ludwig Kohler's wife Fula and his daughter Christina would like me to acknowledge all the help and kindness Johnny showed them before and after Ludwig's passing.

In the Clubhouse both Sydney and Marconi have Championship notice boards and you guessed it Johnnie's name features significantly on both boards.

He was not only a Champion Bloke but also a Champion Sportsman, I call John a Champion Sportsman because while he is an exceptionally talented shooter, he is the most unassuming gracious winner or loser I have even known.

No point in asking Johnny what he has ever accomplished in our Sport as he will only give you a smile and a shrug of the shoulders and a "not really sure mate" will be his answer.

Johnny has won Australian National, NSW State and many-many local and interstate Championships, but he would never talk himself up.

He finished 5th overall in a Handicap event at the 1999 Grand American Trap shoot against nearly 23 hundred entrants and to beat the YANKS at their game is a massive achievement, he has also along with many other trophies won the High Foreign trophy twice in the Clay Target Championship the main 200 Single Barrel event at the Grand which is the highest achieving shooter outside North America, in other words against the rest of the World, And because of his size we often made a Joke with John that he did not win the High Foreign but only the Medium sized Foreign shooter award.

It is testament to John that a "Single Red Rose" floral arrangement sent to the funeral service from Mrs. Leo Harrison of Hannibal Missouri USA, Karla is the wife of Leo who was the absolute top Trap-shooter/sportsman in the USA and for her to acknowledge of Johns passing is a simple statement of how Johnny endeared himself to people, as the single rose shows he was one of a kind.

Unfortunately Big Leo (6ft 8inches and 550 pound) as he was known passed away in August 2013 whilst we were in the USA, he and his wife had become very good friends of ours.

John was a strong family man, he lived with his Mum and along with the rest of the family looked after and cared for his beloved Mum prior to her passing.

He has a very strong bond between his brothers, sisters, nephews and nieces, whenever he spoke of any of his immediate and extended family, his face light up like a Christmas tree.

It was often thought by many of his Greek trap-shooting mates that Karen and Johnny were brother and sister, I think it was something to do with their height and their bubbly personalities, I do feel that Johnny was as close to Karen and myself as if he was our brother.

If everyone could have just one friend like Johnny the world would be a much better place We became inseparable friends that could almost finish each other's sentences in all the years we travelled and shared rooms together only once or at the most twice did we have words, and they only lasted for a few minutes.

Johnny was a neat freak, extremely fussy about washing and neatly ironing his shirts, buttons all done up before folding or hanging in the closet, we were like the odd couple, he was extremely neat and tidy, and me !!! well not so much.

But it seemed to work for the both of us.

Johnny was extremely easy to like, the many friends he has made in Australia, NZ and all over the USA is testament to that, I never heard him say a bad word about anyone.

We used to call each other "Mooka" to us it was a term of endearment, John was my Mooka and I was his.

When he was given the news about his failing health, his philosophy was "well I just need to get on with it we all have our use by date, mine is just coming a little sooner than I hoped".

What a tough little Buggar he was, I never heard a word of complaint, he was always more worried about any of his beloved family and friends that might be experiencing some health issues rather than himself.

I can only hope and pray I can be half the man Johnny was when my time comes.

Goodbye "Mooka" until we all squad together again mate.

The virtual trailblazer of women's clay target shooting in Australia

Violet "Timmy" Reade passed away peacefully in her sleep in Melbourne on Saturday June 23 at the tender age of 96 years.

Timmy commenced her clay target shooting career in Melbourne in the early 1950's competing alongside famous shooters like Newton Thomas, Fred Burns, George Biggs and Jack McCraith at Coburg, Keilor, Werribee and Australian Gun Clubs where there were no allowances for lady shooters.

Timmy shot her way back to 22 metres on merit and won more than her share of championship sashes in

open competition and certainly would have won all the Women's DTL National Titles in her era had the ACTA acknowledged lady shooters at that time.

Timmy was the first ever lady shooter to be inducted into the ACTA Hall of Fame in 2010.
