# President's Notes

## New CEO

*Following the resignation of former CEO Mr Paul McLoughlin we now welcome Mr Paul Gilbert to the role. Paul started with the*

*Association on Monday the 5th of August. Paul is a former Australian champion athlete and has represented internationally. He has a lifetime of sports administration experience including 9 years as CEO of the Australian National University Recreation Club. This involved the management of a membership of 20,000 and multiple facilities. We welcome Paul who has now relocated from Canberra to Wagga Wagga and hope his time with the ACTA is rewarding to him personally and of great benefit to your Association. Thanks to the admin staff at the National Office for carrying the baton so well during this difficult time.*

## Insurance

*Many of you may have seen the Facebook post on the ACTA page regarding some examples of activities clubs have questioned the insurance cover for recently.*

*I reprint this post for those who may not use Facebook.*

### Memo to Members – ACTA Insurance.

Misinformation again being spread on Facebook and some recent club inquiries have prompted me to quell the rumours and give some rulings we have been given by the insurer.

Request. Can I confirm that ACTA insurances cover you in the field.

Answer. Confirmed Yes. Cover is Australia Wide. (Last time I looked all paddocks people hunt in would be somewhere within wider Australia)

This ruling relates to the Personal Firearms cover and your Public Liability cover as requested by some property owners before entry is permitted.

Request. A club has requested they wish to run a Show and Shine day at the club. (What a great idea.)

Answer. Confirmed Yes. If it is club organised

and run with proceeds going to the club you are insured. If you are hiring the grounds to another group who are keeping the proceeds they need to bring their own cover.

Question. The club is a venue for a wedding, are we insured.

Answer. If properly licensed for the purpose and in control of the event, liquor sales and catering with proceeds going to the club you are insured. If a caterer is brought in from outside or a contractor comes in and fits a dance floor they need their own cover.

Question. We have lots of caravanners and campers at our club both at and between shoots and we charge a fee, are we insured.

Answer. Confirmed Yes. But if you rented an area for another operator to run the camping and take proceeds he would need to have his own cover.

Please think about it logically:

ACTA Insurances are paid from members funds and are to cover our members and clubs, but do not and should not cover outside contractors providing dance floors, caterers providing food or private caravan park operators.

I hope this helps to give members an understanding of just how broad and great a cover the ACTA is providing to its members and the clubs. People should be using it as a selling point and talking it up, not spreading misinformation and trying to pick it to pieces.

Anyone having questions please do not hesitate to contact the office via email and we will get a response for you.

## Proposed Cycling Trail

*Likewise, we posted a report on this issue and it is reprinted below. This is the second time we have fought against this proposal. This type of problem has been referred to in many previous reports as creating "Sovereign Risk" to your National Grounds and its future use. This can happen at any time with any level of government or statutory authority. You must implore your Executive to keep other existing options to host this event ready and available.*

## Wagga Wagga City Council – Walking Tracks

Early in July the ACTA became aware that a matter we believed to be previously decided to our advantage was back on the Council Agenda.

A proposed cycling track to the south of the National Grounds was again up for consideration.

On the 11th of July ACTA met with council officers and were advised that their recommendation to council would be the most southerly option, an outcome that we desired. However they also advised the matter was listed for a general meeting on the 22nd of July for decision and there was a strong push from cycling groups to have the track sited much further north, close to the National Grounds.

ACTA applied to address the meeting as did the cycling group armed with a petition containing some 2220 signatures supporting their case. ACTA westerly neighbour Mr. Rod Brown was represented by his son George and spoke on the families behalf strongly opposing the northerly option which cut their property in half from East to West close to the grounds. I spoke on behalf of the ACTA and after councillors discussion I am pleased to be able to tell you that the matter was decided unanimously in our favour.

This is the second time the ACTA have had to oppose development in the area to protect the grounds. When I have previously referred to sovereign risk in the Presidents notes this is exactly the sort of issue I am referring to. The meeting was well attended and I would like to thank members of the Downside and Wagga Wagga clubs, Riverina Zone, NSWCTA and the ACTA staff who took the time to come along in support.

## Albury Wodonga Clay Target Club. (AWCTA)

*It is disappointing to have to now report on the demise of the AWCTC. Following recent turmoil around ownership and control of the grounds, the club has been split and those in control have affiliated with the SSAA. Probably the premier ground in this area is now lost to our sport. Over 50 registered ACTA shooters now need to find a new club with which to register. A group of these members are looking at forming a new club and we will keep you informed on their progress.*

*ACTA have now confirmed the legal and insurance situation and has now advised those members as follows:*

- *Firearms Registry has informed ACTA that although it is a requirement for shooters to remain a member of an approved club, they will not be taking any action against AWCTC members whilst they are deciding which club they prefer to be transferred to.*
- *ACTA insurer has informed ACTA that the full insurance package remains in place for these shooters regardless of the club's situation.*
- *ACTA has requested these members to advise the National Office where they wish to be transferred to and ACTA will handle the transfer.*

*I ask that clubs receiving these new members do so in good faith and without cost until the new membership year arrives.*

*This should serve as a timely warning to club managements everywhere as this is not the first club "swallowed up" in this way. When another Association has "the acquisition of ranges" in its aims and objectives and several paid staff trying to achieve these aims you really need to consider the risks of getting too involved with them. The history, hundreds of thousands of volunteer hours and funds all lost to our sport. This must have hurt the older members badly and I apologise that there was nothing further we could do as an Association to stop this happening. Any members who have not been contacted by the National office yet are asked to ring them as soon as possible on 02 6938 2121 to be transferred to their preferred club.*

*We also of course wish the new branch all the best for their future.*

## International Clay Target Shooting Federation (ICTSF)

*The ICTSF were to meet at the World English Sporting in Ireland recently where Australia was to be represented by Vice President Mal Dyson. Unfortunately, despite the event having over 600 entrants, the meeting could not achieve a quorum. Many of the home countries did not make the effort. One of the important agenda items was an application from the USA American Trapshooting Association to join the ICTSF. I hope this apparent lack of interest from these countries not present does not deter the Americans from joining. ACTA has corresponded regularly with Mike Herman, VP of the ATA following his visit to the World DTL in Australia in 2018 encouraging them to join and take*

*part in both the Mackintosh and World DTL events. It would be disappointing if this opportunity has been lost.*

## Membership

*We are fast approaching the end of the membership year and to date the membership is down 16 on the same time last year. This small decrease would have been a large increase if all clubs were compliant with clause 38.1 of the ACTA Constitution. One large Queensland club has been openly flaunting this rule and its membership registered with the ACTA is down by about 200. These have been offered an unconstitutional class of non-ACTA shooting membership of the club. The club has been notified of its serious breach with 7 days to respond and if necessary, will be referred to a judiciary for actioning. No individual, Club or State should be above the rules. Other clubs abiding by the Constitution and working hard to get new members are being dragged down by these non-compliant clubs.*

*A concerning aspect of this, often overlooked, is that each club has a delegate who is involved in the ACTA decision making process, be it at Zone, State or National level. These delegates are influenced by the club membership they represent. I personally believe that non-members of this association have no right to influence these decisions in any way and must be stopped from doing so.*

## Donation to ACTA

*All know that Roma is my home club and I make no apologies for thanking them publicly for the conduct of this year's Trap Nationals. As usual the club delivered a great event supported by the QCTA and ACTA administration teams. This of course was no less than expected by the ACTA. What was not expected is recent advice that the club is donating \$30,000.00 to the ACTA in appreciation for being given the privilege of hosting the event. This donation is the largest ever made by any club to the Association that I can remember and is greatly appreciated by the ACTA and shows the strength of character and commitment to the Association that the Roma club has. Well done Roma, I am proud to be a member of your club.*

## Executive Meetings

*Your full Executive meet on the 25th of August. All sub-committees will also meet prior to this time.*

*Agenda items are being finalised and will be sent to Executive members shortly.*

*I will not be standing for re-election at this meeting and will be leaving the Executive. Substitute Delegate from Queensland, Mal Collins will take my place at the Executive table. It has been a long road for me, first joining the Executive in 1990. I have now completed my 7th year as president and have written something like 85 of these reports and 7 annual reports. I have served under Presidents Jim Scott, Leighton Martin, Glenn Woodhatch, John Byrnes, Bill Jones, John Mack and Alan Vilcins. I look back at these Presidents and rarely have we all agreed about anything. However, I am sure that on any issue we all took what we thought was the best possible position to benefit the ACTA at the time. But it is a democracy and you must move on, even when you lose.*

*My 4 years as ICTSF President culminating in the 2018 World DTL at the National Grounds were very enjoyable and rewarding. I thank those who trusted me with that position.*

*I would like to thank my current Vice Presidents, Mal Dyson and Gary Read and Past Vice Presidents, Rob Fox, the late Ron Traill and Peter Hayley. I would be remiss not to thank my home club members for the support, criticism and encouragement they have provided to me over so many years.*

*I thank Donna and the boys for being so understanding over such a long period of time. They have always stood with me. At times we have struggled with the misinformed criticism, malicious comment and straight out lies propagated by the faceless keyboard warriors some of whom hardly know us. The negativity and confusion caused by some posts has had a detrimental effect on numbers at various events and eventually these people need to be held accountable for their actions. I note that none of the main offenders hold any position on State or National committees within the sport and I would encourage you that if you know everything and can fix everything, to have a go yourself.*

*On a completely positive note there are also many thousands of wonderful people in this sport. Many volunteering every spare hour to help things progress and to these I say thank you.*

# Chief Executive Officer's Report

Hello to all members and stakeholders of ACTA!

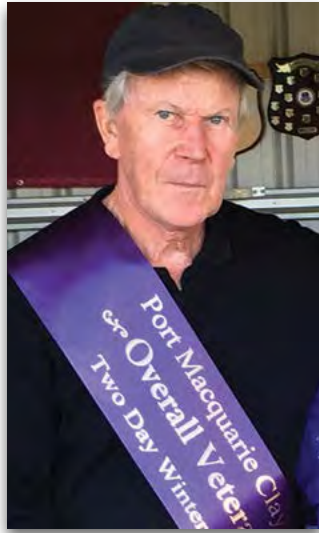

Firearms & accessories means legal firearms owned by members of the named Association/Club, including any accessories or carrying cases.

Loss means loss or damage caused by or arising from a sudden and unforeseen accident including theft from a securely locked building or vehicle.

- Theft cover is conditional on firearms being securely stored in an approved gun safe when the firearm(s) are not in active use.
- No cover will be provided under this policy where the insured, or any other person or entity the equipment has been entrusted to, has breached any law relating to either the storage or use of the firearm(s.)

## Comments

This insurance is designed to protect each financial member up to \$12,000 with the option to increase this limit to \$25,000 for an additional \$10 payable by the member.

The policy has an excess of \$50 each for every claim and protects members anywhere in Australia 365 days of the year plus overseas for 21 days in any one year.

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

## The Black Box or the “Bubble”

### The Event:

The Australian National Skeet Championships.

### The Cast:

Ray Everett, Multiple ACTA and NZCTA National Champion in Trap and Skeet

Dean Everett, damn good shot and 2018 ACTA National .410 winner

Sandro Dyer, From New Zealand’s South Island

Vicki McDonagh: 2018 ACTA Handicap Champion shooting her first skeet Nationals

And myself.

### The Scene:

Sitting in “The Range”, the new conference centre of the Australian Clay Target Association in Wagga Wagga between rounds. The weather is clear and bright, the coffee appears to be to everyone’s taste.

Ray points out to Sandro that I write articles for Gunshot, the New Zealand Clay Target Association Magazine on psychological skills for shooting and you should talk to Michael.

So over coffee we talk about how our own brain gets in the way of us performing well. We get on to the subject of keeping the mind quiet and dealing with distractions.

I mention “The Black Box Technique”. This

technique was designed for Barbara Lynch in 1979 before she won the European 15 Trench Title. Barbara Lynch, a famous English shooter, sought out Connolly & Syer to develop a way that would help her deal with distractions during a competition. Barbara found that using this technique she was able to give each of her distractions an image and then put them in the black box. Images that she put into the black box included other shooters kicking shells, having shell ejected in her direction, trap malfunctions, other shooters coughing, etc.

*Having identified your concerns and distractions, sit quietly, close your eyes, take a deep breath and allow yourself to settle heavily into your chair as you breathe out slowly.*

*Imagine yourself sitting at a desk in front of a window. Look out and notice what you see, what the weather is like, what movements there may be. Then look down at the desk and notice a blank sheet of paper and a pen. Pick up the pen and write down a complete list of those concerns and distractions you identified. As you write, see the shape of your handwriting on the page, hear the point of the pen slide over the paper, feel the weight of your upper body on your arm. If you find it easier, you can draw a picture to represent the distractions or your distracted mood. When you have finished put down the pen, fold up the paper and turn around. You see a box behind you, somewhere within reach. It may be on a shelf or on the floor. Notice how large it is, what colour it is, whether it is in the light or in the shadow.*

*Open the lid. Then put the folded paper inside the box, close the lid and turn around, settling back into your chair and once more looking out the window.*

*Having done this you can open your eyes, ready to interact with those around you.*

However, it is important that once your session or match is over, you close your eyes again and go back to the imaginary desk, turn around, open the box, get out and unfold the paper and look to see what you wrote or drew. Sometimes it will no longer be of interest, that's fine, but if you promised to give the object attention then you should now keep that promise.

At this moment, I thought I had all those around me enthralled with my knowledge and eloquence. However, this was not to be. We sat and talked and relived the targets shot well and those elusive targets that got away.

And then it happened. Someone was talking about something that was annoying them while they were shooting and Dean opened up with, (You have to imagine that what is being said is with a New Zealand accent) "What you have to do is put all things that are worrying you in a bubble, you know like one of those detergent bubbles that children love to play with. You hold the bubble in your hands" (and at this point Dean has his hands out cupped with us all looking at the imaginary bubble sitting in his hands). He continued, "now, gently blow the bubble from your hands and let it float up into the air". At this stage we are all enthralled as we watch this imaginary bubble float up when Dean raises his voice, assumes the pose of having his shotgun to his shoulder and shouts, "and now you give it both barrels and blow your troubles away. Now there is nothing to worry about and you don't have to go back and deal with the distractions because you've whacked them."

Regardless of whether you adopt the Connolly and Syer 'Black Box technique' or the Dean Everett 'Blowing up the Bubble technique' there is a need to make sure you do not step on to the pad with the distractions still on your mind.

All was going well, we all shot to the best of our ability in the afternoon, knowing that any distractions could be dealt with by putting them in the 'bubble' and giving them both barrels. I was standing next to the Events Office looking at the scoreboard. There were three other shooters, who I had never met before, also standing there, when along comes Dean Everett and as quick as a flash says to those assembled. "That'll be right. Typical sport psychologist, standing here soliciting for business."

The shooters then asked, If I was the person that wrote in the Clay Target Shooting News. I said I was, and introduced myself, and Dean and then we talked about shooting for a while.

Unfortunately, Dean was wrong this time. Nothing came from my soliciting!

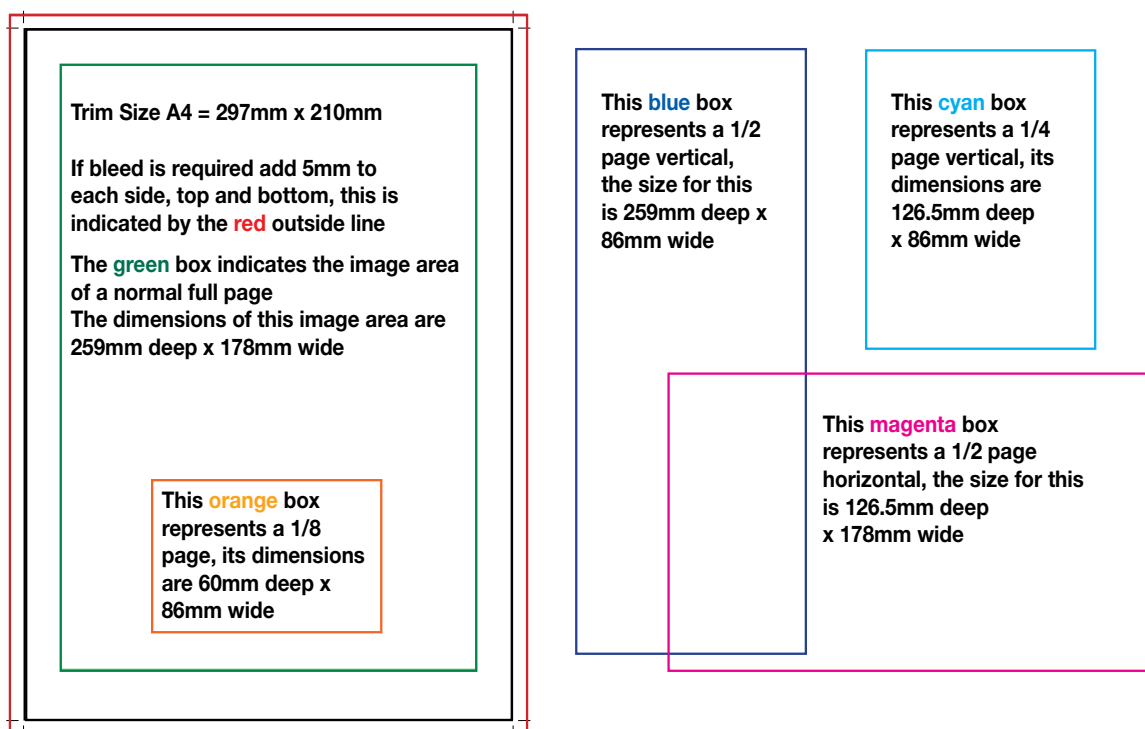

## ADVERTISEMENTS

Advertisements may be supplied as a completely finished PDF or as a Word document with illustrations, photos and logos either included in format or attached as separate files. When illustrations are included as part of the document they should be imported into your document as high resolution images. When supplying a PDF ensure that the PDF is exported as an ADOBE INTERACTIVE PDF with the IMAGE HANDLING set to: COMPRESSION – JPEG (Lossy), JPEG QUALITY – High and RESOLUTION – 144. PDF files should be supplied to the exact finished size that you require.

CLAY TARGET is now produced as a standard A4 document (297mm deep x 210mm wide). If you require your full page advertisement to bleed off the page, you will need to allow an additional 5mm to the top, bottom and both sides of your finished file, and make sure that any content fits well within the actual page size. Advert sizes are as set out below.



## EDITORIAL

All editorial should be supplied as a Word document. Photos should be supplied as separate files, not as part of the Word document.

Photos need to be supplied as off-camera images (not reduced in either size or quality). This may mean that they will need to be emailed in several batches to ensure that they are sent within the limited upload/download range of the email protocols (both your own and the ACTA).

Only photos that conform to ACTA quality standards will be used in future publications. Captions should not be imprinted over photos, but should be supplied separately, clearly identifying which photo they relate to.

## EDITORIAL AND ADVERTISING COPY DEADLINES

Deadlines for supply of advertising and editorial are set for a reason and must be adhered to. Late copy can have an impact on the distribution date. The closing date for each month is always advertised in the prior magazine but is generally the 5th of the month prior to publication date. Distribution to members is always planned to be mid-month prior to Publication date.

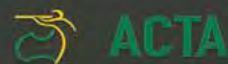
