On Friday 9th of August the main contingent of the team departed Melbourne airport to make the 29 hour long journey to our team hotel in Arcachon based on the shores of Arcachon Bay which we were soon to find is the oyster and mussel capital of the world.

Making the trek this year we had the following shooters: Mens Nathan Cassells, Matt Schiller and Craig Henwood, Ladies Georgia Pistone, Anna Shedrina and Alexis Preston, Juniors Thomas Armstrong, Jack Cullinan and Acacio Mota, Seniors Martin Collumb, Phil Matthews and John Maxwell. Individual Trish Carter, Ross Collumb, Travis Streeter, Mel Treller and Col Kneebone

A total of 29 Australians were on the trip when combined with partners, mums, dads, sisters etc making it a fantastic atmosphere in the Aussie camp.

Our first leg of the journey was 14 hours to Abu Dhabi with most getting plenty of rest. A quick 2 hour stop-over in Abu Dhabi saw us board our next flight which would be 8 hours to Paris. In Paris we again

had another 2.5 hour stopover to board a domestic flight to Bordeaux airport a 1 hour 15 minute flight.

On arriving at Bordeaux Airport we were greeted with the bad news!!! Only 1 gun had made the journey the rest were held up in Paris. At least they weren't too far away. The lucky shooter to receive his gun was Nathan Cassells who being the good team mate he is, did offer to loan his gun out to all other team members at 1 Euro per shot!!! Thanks Nathan.

Matt, Trish and Col were on a later flight out of Paris than the rest of us with Matt and Trish's guns making it to Bordeaux but Col's being left behind in Paris as well.

which proved to be a great move. Four more guns arrived at 11pm that night and we were told the remaining four would arrive the next morning. Back to the hotel for some well earned rest and for those with their guns, a nice sleep in. Morning broke and weather was cold and wet. The 4 awaiting guns jumped on the mini bus hoping for the best with only Alexis coming back with a smile. Jack, Phil & Col's still in Paris. The rest of us had to board our bus that we had arranged to Arcachon and leave Jack & Stacey Cullinan & Phil in Bordeaux until their guns arrived and catch up with them later on that evening when they arrived on a 4pm flight.

The town of Arcachon was a 50 minute drive from Bordeaux Airport and we would stay at The Roc Hotel which was a rather old Hotel but still clean and

comfy with air conditioning, comfy bed and mostly a hot shower!!! It was situated one block back from the beach and directly opposite the Casino and near many restaurants and shops, supermarkets and bars etc. A perfect place to call home for the week.

Most still being tired from jetlag had a reasonably relaxing evening and early night to bed, although a couple did enjoy the nightlife that the town had to offer and did look a little pale at breakfast the next morning.

Breakfast at the hotel was a great spread of scrambled eggs, sausages, quiches, cakes, toast etc and we had organised a bus to pick us up after breakfast to take us to the range for the team's first look around. It is at this point in time we must make a big thank you to both Anna Shedrina and Jeff Tonna for organising the majority of the team's ammunition in France. Jeff with Bornaghi being sent direct to our hotel waiting for us and Anna with NSI being sent to the range with all our shooters names on it. Thanks guys this was a great help.

The Ball Trap Club Ychoussois Range was a good 45-50 minutes bus ride from our hotel. The range is situated virtually in the middle of nowhere just north of the small town of Ychoux located in pretty dense forest with pine trees as a background. It was quite regular to come across the odd deer on the long drive to the range.

The range consisted of 8 Universal Trench layouts and all 8 were identically equipped with brand new Laporte trap machines which worked flawlessly all week with not one trap breakdown and very minimal

broken targets. The clay targets used were Corsivia Green Dream which flew great and smoked up in a nice white puff when hit in the centre. It boasted a large clubhouse with bar and large TV screens where you could watch live scores on all 8 ranges at once.

Our first hit out on the range saw some mixed results with most still a little jet lagged. Conditions were not the best with a cold head wind and the odd shower pushing targets high above the tree line where they became tough to see in the white cloud. Most just had 2 rounds to get a feel of the gun and it was back on the bus to retreat back to the hotel. We had set up our camp in a tent on the range with the Aussie flag flying proudly.

Tuesday and Wednesday the weather improved and our team members all put some good solid training rounds in with most feeling confident come competition day. Tuesday night we held our now traditional Aussie dinner at a local Italian Restaurant which we were all enjoying until a few of the other tables started complaining we were "too loud". Apparently when eating in France one must be quiet and boring!!! We all had a good feed and it was announced that Matt Schiller would lead our team out at the Opening Ceremony the next evening. Matt is the current Australian record holder and in his third consecutive team. Matt however handed the duties over to our youngest team member in Georgia Pistone on her first international team with her parents and younger sister over to watch. Well done Matt and congratulations Georgia!!

The Opening Ceremony was held at the shooting range on Wednesday night and was relatively

quick and simple. The Aussie team looked smart in uniforms arranged by Martin Collumb and Shane Pinner. Thanks guys we really appreciate this. Some local wines were available with a small bite to eat. Our bus arrived and we headed back to Arcachon just in time to get a feed before the restaurants closed up.

620 competitors had entered the event which was being shot 50 targets a day over the 4 days. The field was split in 2 with half the shooters shooting in the morning (8am til 12:30pm) and the other half in the afternoon, starting at 12:30pm and finishing approx. 5-5:30pm. We were in the afternoon shift on day 1 so everyone got to have a good sleep in and enjoy breakfast before heading out to the range.

By now all the trade displays at the range had filled up with a lot of the main names setting up a tent. 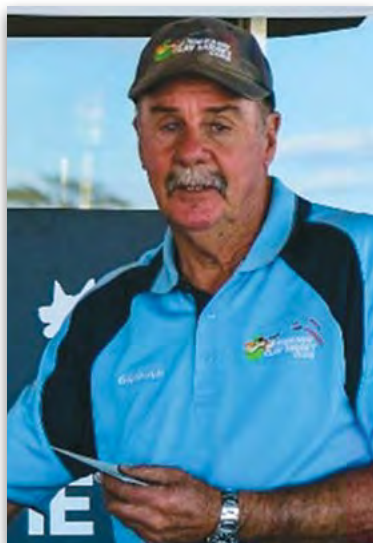

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

Practice versus training?

To compete at any level in our sport, whether it is trap, skeet, sporting or field shooting, takes a considerable effort, time and money. For most of us we can rationalise how much effort, time and money we spend because of the physical, psychological and social benefits that we get from our sport. The question is: how do we make the most of our shooting so that we are not wasting these valuable resources. It is obvious that we cannot all win but that doesn't mean we cannot be competitive and at least strive to achieve our personal bests every time we compete.

At a recent sporting clays competition, I was sitting listening to some of the shooters lament that they found some target difficult. One shooter said that he had missed every skeet target on the course while another said he found the trap targets hard. I sat and listened but eventually asked, "when was the last time you went to a skeet competition or went to the gun club to practise trap?" Their responses were that they never shoot trap or skeet because they do not like trap or skeet and that is why they shoot sporting. I replied with, "yes, but if you learn to shoot those targets, they won't be a problem. You will probably shoot better and enjoy it more." To me, this seemed obvious. I know that a lot of dedicated "sporting shooters" do not like the repetitive nature of the trap and skeet targets and the fact that missing just one target will probably put you out of the competition. But why limit your opportunity to shoot well at a sporting competition where there will be both trap and skeet like targets presented with the million other possibilities.

A great example of what I am talking about here is Socrates Pilipasidis. Sox is a renowned 'shotgunner' in both Australia and abroad. He shoots skeet, trap, sporting, FITASC, Field and Game. He shoots every discipline and shoots them all exceptionally well. He agrees that if you want to be a very good sporting clays shot you need to know how to shoot trap and skeet. Shooting skeet teaches you about lead, consistent gun mount, follow through and reading the target at different angles. Trap and skeet also let you develop a consistent pre-shot routine that allows you to address the target and then execute the shot when you are ready to take on the target. Too often

you see shooters at field and game shoots or sporting competitions just walk into the cage and call "pull", without any effective pre-shot routine or mental preparation or the technical skills involved in shooting the target.

So, what is needed to become a world beater in any sport and practise and training help? Practice often used and training are used interchangeably, but are they the same thing?

According to Flint Wallace, a US baseball coach, practice can be defined as repeated exercise in or performance of an activity or skill so as to acquire mastery or maintain proficiency in it. Practice is designed to engrain and imprint an athlete's current level of skill so they can perform more routinely. In shooting, practise helps the shooter develop muscle memory, consistency of gun mount, pre-shot routine execution and follow through.

Training on the other hand, can be defined as the "act, process or method of one that seeks to improve skill, knowledge or experience in a certain area". For the novice shooter, learning the correct gun mount will involve coaching and training, but when this had been learnt, it is necessary to practice it to master the concept.

When we were in primary school we all learnt our "times tables". We would go over the tables in rote, uniform fashion until they were imprinted on our soul and psyche. I'm sure you remember: 2 ones are 2, 2 twos are 4, 2 threes are 6, and so on. This practice was only important when we learnt (or were trained) to use multiplication in solving everyday problems, for example, if one apple cost 20c how much will 9 apples cost?

Shooting consistently well involves the same process. Learn the skill needed, train to get it right and then practice it to develop mastery.

Are there any other differences to practice and training? Yes.

- Practice is about looking good, training can often look ugly and awkward.
- Practice is about being efficient, training is about improvement and learning.
- Practice is about doing the same old, routine, training is about change and adaptation.

- Practice is about getting enough repetitions so you can perform instinctively, training is being able to perform that skill better than you could before.
- Practice is applying what you have learnt, training is learning how to improve something or to do something new.

Shooters like any athlete need to audit the skills they need to perform well over and over again. In the past I have suggested shooters do a skills audit of what they need to do to be competitive. I have broken this skills audit into four components: physical skills, technical skills, mental skills and competition skills.

Practice and training are important, but to make the most of your precious time and money, don't just practice by shooting 100's and 100's of targets unless you are focusing on a specific skill that you need to master.

Look at what physical, technical, mental competition skills you need to improve and master. Musicians practice like they are in a performance, shooters have to practice like they are in a competition. If improvement is needed then get some effective coaching and learn how to do the skill you are trying to achieve. Once you have learnt it, then practice it to achieve mastery.

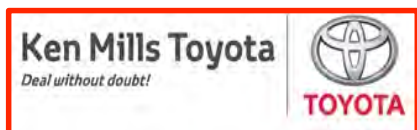

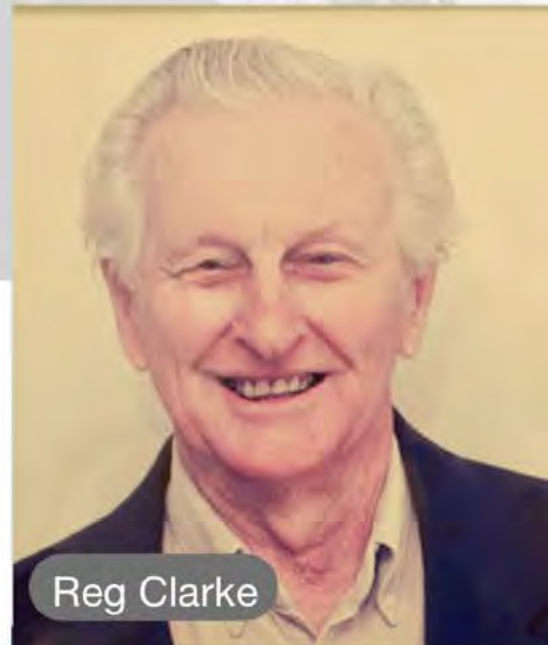

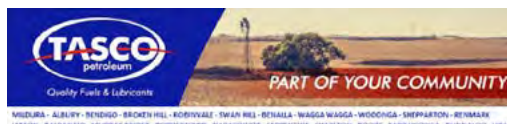

Keith Nelson – a remarkable man with a great story

Coffs Harbour Clay Target Club has given their Secretary a new lease on life, appointing him to this position at the age of 92. Keith Nelson is now in his 95th year and still going strong with no thoughts of stepping down from the Club Secretary's role.

Recently while visiting the Coffs Harbour region I decided to visit and have a shot at the Coffs Harbour Clay Target Club. Unfortunately they were only shooting a practice day, but apart from having a great afternoon in good company, I had the pleasure of meeting a very interesting and remarkable man.

When I first stepped out of the car, I was immediately made to feel welcome, which I might add was quite a different experience from past visits, and one of the members said "Come with me and I will introduce you to our Secretary, he'll sort things out for you". I must admit to being a bit taken back when the Secretary turned out to be a very spritely elderly man with a good smile and a solid handshake. When he said "My appearance might belie my age" I thought to myself, no Keith you look 80 to me, but then he said "I'm in my 95th year you know".

After introductions to other members I watched the squad that Keith was shooting in and saw him put together a reasonable round and punish some quite difficult sporting targets. Later in the day I sat down with him and he told me the following story.

"I've always been a shooter, mostly rifles and pistols. I shot at the Kempsey SSAA range from 1947 until 1952 but then moved to Sydney where I only managed to shoot big bore occasionally. In 1966 we moved back to South West Rocks and after that spent 16 years in Coffs Harbour before again returning to South West Rocks."

"So Keith, tell me when you first shot at a clay target".

"Well, I was in the RAAF during the war and one day they decided that they would sharpen up our reflexes by giving us a shot at a clay target thrown from a spring loaded trap. We were each given five

cartridges and the firearm provided was a single barrel hammer gun, I managed to shoot four of the five, missed the fifth.

"I didn't shoot at another clay until I was 90. After my wife died, my son Phil, who is the President here, thought it might be a good idea to get me

into clay shooting to give me something to do. I first joined the ACTA in 2013 and became Secretary here after a couple of years, I'm really enjoying it."

Keith now drives from South West Rocks to the Coffs Club each time a shoot is on. He said "Oh it's not far, only an hour or so down the highway".

Keith shoots C grade in all disciplines as you would expect, but he has already managed to buy three new firearms. He said "I started off with a right hand Rizzini sporter, but as you can see I'm left handed, so I upgraded to a Beretta Gold E Trap and now I also have a Beretta UGB25 semi auto".

Keith told me that he managed to shoot a 25 target single barrel possible in 2015, but hopes that there will be more to come.

I could have kept listening but he had to go and help pack up.

Keith may well be the oldest gun club secretary in Australia. If your club has any people stories like this, and I'm sure there are many, why don't you write them down and send them in for publishing.

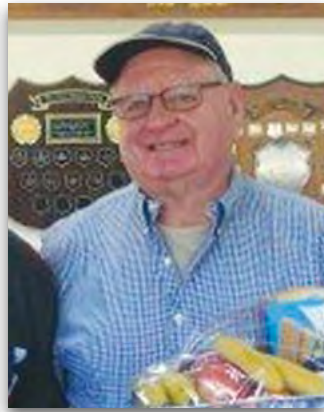

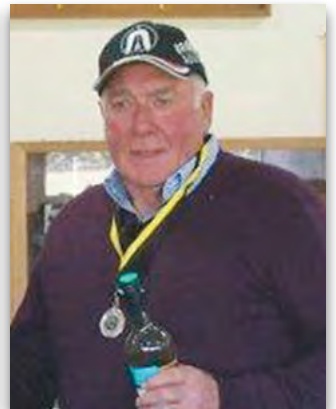
