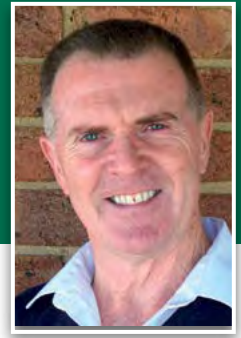

ACTA REPORT

Mal Dyson – President Paul Gilbert – CEO



Dear Members,

As our new President, Mal Dyson, advised last month, this is the first of our combined President/CEO reports. We anticipate that this will provide you with an update of the administrative progress we are making regarding management of your Association and curtail the duplication of items that sometimes were presented in both columns.

I'm happy to report that the last month has seen a few glimpses of progress with regard to forward movement. Our staff had a planning day a few weeks back where we spent a good deal of time discussing what we want to achieve as a membership-focused organisation over the forthcoming months and developing an action plan. This included the composition of the new staff position requirements and what role everyone will be performing in the Association. We also had a Risk Assessment Consultant provide us with a risk management plan for us to develop in order to ensure that we are compliant moving forward.

Our Executive Committee and Management Sub-Committee have also been heavily involved in decision-making process during the past month, and, having had our August meeting minutes ratified, we are now able to advise the membership of a number of decisions. Firstly, our 2020 calendar is now confirmed.

National Event Dates for 2020

As we move towards the close of 2019, we wish to remind all competitors to clear their diaries for the dates and venues that will be hosting our 2020 National events:

- *National ISSF: 13 – 18 January.
Venue: Newcastle – Lake Macquarie CTC.*
- *National Trap Carnival: Pre-Nationals 21 – 22 March, National Carnival 23 – 29 March.
Venue: National Ground Wagga Wagga.*
- *Skeet Nationals: 17 – 23 May.
Venue: National Ground Wagga Wagga.*
- *Sporting Nationals: 29 – 30 August.
Venue: National Ground Wagga Wagga, hosted by Wagga Gun Club.*
- *World DTL Trap Carnival: 8 – 11 August.
Venue: Bywell, England.*

Update from Annual National Executive Meeting

There were a number of items on the agenda at the August Executive Committee Meeting that were approved and we would like to share with you:

National Nominations

Walk-up nominations for all National Events from 2020 will be accepted once only at an extra cost of \$20 per event. There will be no preferential squadding request accepted and no guarantee of a position being available.

National DTL Carnival

The National DTL Carnival rotation between Wagga Wagga, QLD and WA will remain as it stands.

Commonwealth Carnival

To lift the prestige of the Commonwealth Carnival event, the entire format of this event has been changed. The event will be hosted on a rotational basis 2020 SA/NT, 2021 QLD, 2022 Vic/Tas and 2023 WA, if a State does not wish to stage this event it will go to the next State in line.

ACTA will provide sponsorship of \$12,000 with the host State to additionally add \$12,000, this \$24,000 to be awarded as prizemoney. States to also source additional sponsorship for Category prizes. ACTA is to supply all Sashes ie Overall winners for each event, High Guns including Ladies, Juniors and Veterans plus Gold Medals for Grade winners.

Increase in Fees

Camping fees at the National Grounds will be increased in 2020. The cost for an un-powered site will rise by \$5.00 to \$15.00 per night, while a powered site will increase from \$20.00 per night to \$30.00.

The New Shooter levy is now \$10.00

National Break Badges will now cost \$20.00 and Normal Break Badges \$15.00. This is an increase of \$5, the last increase being 10 years ago.

Australian Trap Association (ATA)

ATA spokesman Mark McInnes presented a proposal to the Executive to introduce an Australian Match Play Championship to run in conjunction with our National Carnival. The Executive thank Mark for

his presentation and are keen to support this event's inclusion onto the carnival program and, as such, will attempt to reach a solution to introduce this at the 2021 Nationals.

Rule Changes

The Rules Committee presented a number of revisions to competition rules, most of which were ratified by the Executive Committee. The full list of revisions and changes will be posted under the ACTA Executive Committee Minutes tab of the Web Site once this has been updated.

Office Update

As we write to you this month, the National Grounds are hosting the 2019 NSW Trap Carnival. Most of the caravan sites are full and the weather looks like it will be hot and clear, giving the competitors a wonderful weekend to participate in our sport. It is great to see our members using the facilities that your National Association is proud to be able to own and provide, and which offers such a positive experience to those who compete at it.

It has also been another month of surprises at Head Office, this time with our Grounds and Maintenance Staff Member, Ewen McLachlan resigning from his position during September. Having granted him Rec Leave for his marriage during the second half of September, we were hoping that he would be back with us in early October, however he was offered and accepted a diesel mechanic apprenticeship role so gave notice prior to taking leave. We have therefore been busy advertising for, interviewing and hiring new staff to fill this role. Given the size and expanse of the duties, (grounds maintenance and function centre set-up, pull-down and cleaning), we have employed two part-time staff to cover our requirements. Brenton and John will commence duties on 8/10/2019, both working 30 hours per week.

Maureen is also counting down to her last days with us, which has given rise to the advertising of another staff role, this time the Media, Marketing and Facilities Co-ordinator's role. This person will have a strong focus on delivery of the Grounds and the Range Function Centre.

We look forward to bringing you more updates from the Management team as they come to hand.

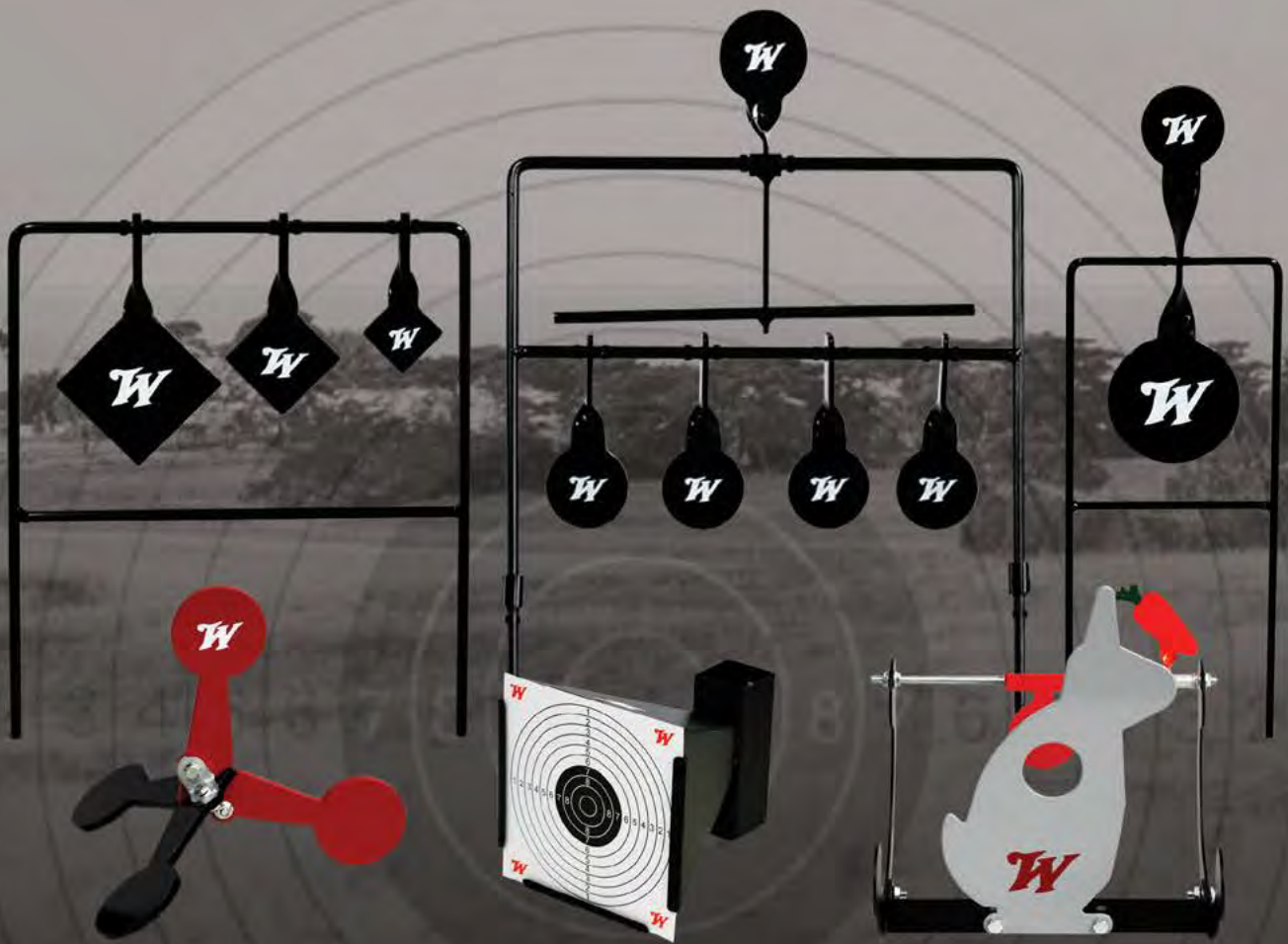

2019 Perazzi Goldfields Ball Trap Classic

This event is open to any ACTA registered club able to field a team of three shooters over the four rounds. The rounds are conducted at Castlemaine, St Arnaud, Bendigo and Maryborough.

Clubs may enter as many shooters as they wish, with the top three scores to count at any round. Each club conducting a round provides medals for the winning team on that day and team and individual scores are tallied at the completion of the four rounds. The final round is always shot at Maryborough over two layouts.

We would like to thank Fil Petriella of Perazzi Australia who have generously provided for the event – a perpetual trophy plate, overall Winning Team prize and a prize for the individual High Gun winner.

The organising committee is attempting to reinvigorate the competition and hopes that the number of competitors will grow as the event becomes better known on the shooting calendar. We again take this opportunity to challenge other clubs to field teams and participate in this unique event.

This year's final was shot on the 28th September in conjunction with the Victorian State Ball Trap. The first 50 targets being designated as the final round of the Perazzi Classic.

In its history the event winning teams are as follows: 2009 Maryborough, 2010 Bendigo, 2011 Frankston Australian, 2012 Bendigo, 2013 St Arnaud, 2014 Bendigo, 2015 Bendigo, 2016 Maryborough, 2017 Maryborough, 2018 Castlemaine.

This year attracted a total of 110 shooters from 35 clubs. The winning team was again Castlemaine who will hold the Perazzi Goldfields Ball Trap Shield until next year. The Team also won for their club shotshells donated by Perazzi.

The overall individual High Gun of the series was Chris Langridge from the Castlemaine Gun Club who finished with a score of 160/200 over the four rounds. Chris for his win received cartridges donated by Perazzi.

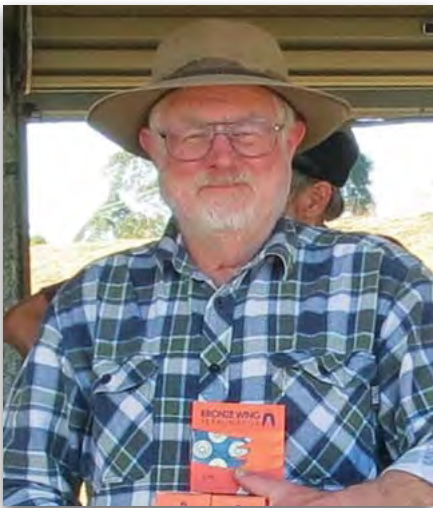
Successful September Shoot at Bega

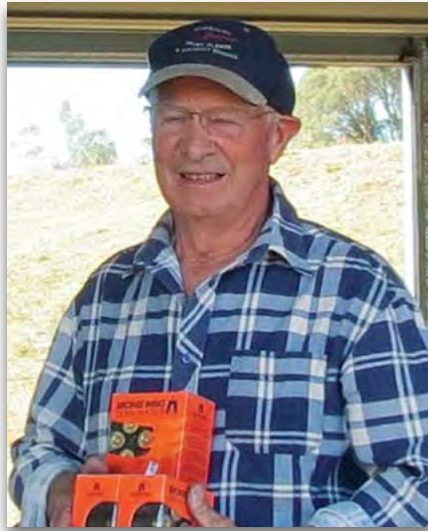

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

Relaxation training

In the October CTSN, I examined the difference between training and practise. In that article I listed a table that outlined physical, technical, mental and competition skills that need to be learned (through training) and then practised so that the skills and techniques can be mastered. Once you have mastered a skill or technique you can practise it whenever you need to; both inside and outside of competition.

Syer & Connolly (1984) sees relaxation as temporary and deliberate withdrawal from activity, which if correctly timed, allows you to recharge and make full use of your physical, mental and emotional energy. Relaxation is characterised by an absence of activity and tension; a period of stillness when you let go of the sense of need. Relaxation and its opposite, tension should be viewed as positions on the same continuum.

Relaxation.....Tension
(non-arousal).....(arousal).....(over arousal)

As athletes, each of us, must find a position on the continuum that is right for them. Different sports have different arousal requirements; archery requires calm whereas weightlifting may require the individual to be worked-up, rifle shooting will require calm as opposed to trap or skeet shooting which requires a mild level of arousal and tension.

Relaxation training is a skill and probably the most widely used application of psychology in sport. Winter & Martin (1988) suggest that there are four areas in which athletes can benefit from relaxation techniques. These are; stress management, physiological benefits, self-regulation and relaxation as the basis for mental rehearsal.

Stressors, that are likely to affect shooters are the demand or desire to "get up" for the game, injuries, relationship problems and problems related to retirement or adjusting to life without sport. Some stress management techniques such as drugs, alcohol, over eating, etc will provide short term relief of the symptoms but will not provide a solution or will have serious long term effects. Physiological benefits from relaxation are a decrease in the consumption of

oxygen, rate of respiration, heart rate and metabolism. Relaxation training helps the athlete increase body awareness and provides techniques for controlling over arousal before and during competitions. Relaxation techniques can also help quieten the mind and make it less susceptible to distractions, and keep you in the here and now.

Syer & Connolly (1984) understand that learning (or training) to relax for athletes will vary from individual to individuals and from one occasion to another;

- *Learn to relax and withdraw completely*
 - a) to acquire a point of reference, a recognition of your own zero arousal level.
 - b) to increase awareness of your own physical, mental and emotional resources and how best to use them
 - c) to gain a detached impression of your environment
 - d) to simply experience a positive pleasurable and beneficial state of being that allows regeneration of body mind and emotions.
- *Learn to relax momentarily*
 - a) to reduce over-arousal to a manageable and productive level, during and immediately before competition.
 - b) to become aware of your kinaesthetic sense.
 - c) return to your point of balance

If you train yourself to relax momentarily and to withdraw at appropriate moments before or during competition, you will find your awareness and speed of reaction to be greatly increased when you focus on your performance again.

There are numerous self-help books that describe or outline relaxation techniques. The technique that you choose for yourself must be something you enjoy and feel comfortable with. The following are some examples of relaxation techniques that shooters may find useful.

1. Progressive muscle relaxation (Winter & Martin, 1988) This approach was developed in the 1930's and involves learning relaxation by systematic tensing and then relaxing various muscle groups within the body. The theory behind the tensing

of the muscles is that an over exaggeration leads to a more pronounced relaxation of these muscles and this helps the individual to more easily recognise the feeling of relaxation in a particular muscle group.

2. Scripted relaxation techniques. These techniques involve listening to or reading a script that has been designed to focus awareness on particular parts of your body.
3. Visualisation and/or imagery are often used in conjunction with relaxation.

Syer & Connolly (1984) use an example where the athlete imagine themselves in a shell filled with a beautiful, coloured liquid and that there are taps on their fingers and toes and that as the liquid is draining relaxation suggestions are given. Gallwey (1979) gets the golfer to imagine he is floating upon a lake and as the water calms so does he. The use of scripts in relaxation provides a visual focus in our effort to withdraw from our world.

4. Nideffer's centreing technique is a way of improving concentration and staying in the here and now. This technique when learnt and generalised to a variety of situations can provide you with a quick and effective technique for calming both the body and the mind. Centreing is a relaxation and concentration skill that can be used by athletes reduce arousal level and assist their focus of attention on the task at hand. It involves standing still and taking three or four deep breaths and feeling where the sensation of breathing

begins (your centre). If you watch the Tennis Open you will see players practise this when they need to re-establish themselves.

5. Hypnosis and self-hypnosis also provide effective means of relaxing and dealing with stress, injuries and lapses in concentration. Nideffer (1992) sees self-hypnosis as a technique that allows you to become more totally immersed in your feelings and thoughts because there is a greater breakdown in the normal shifting of attention from an external to an internal focus.

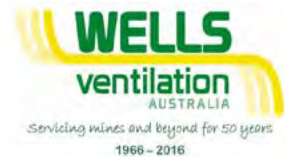

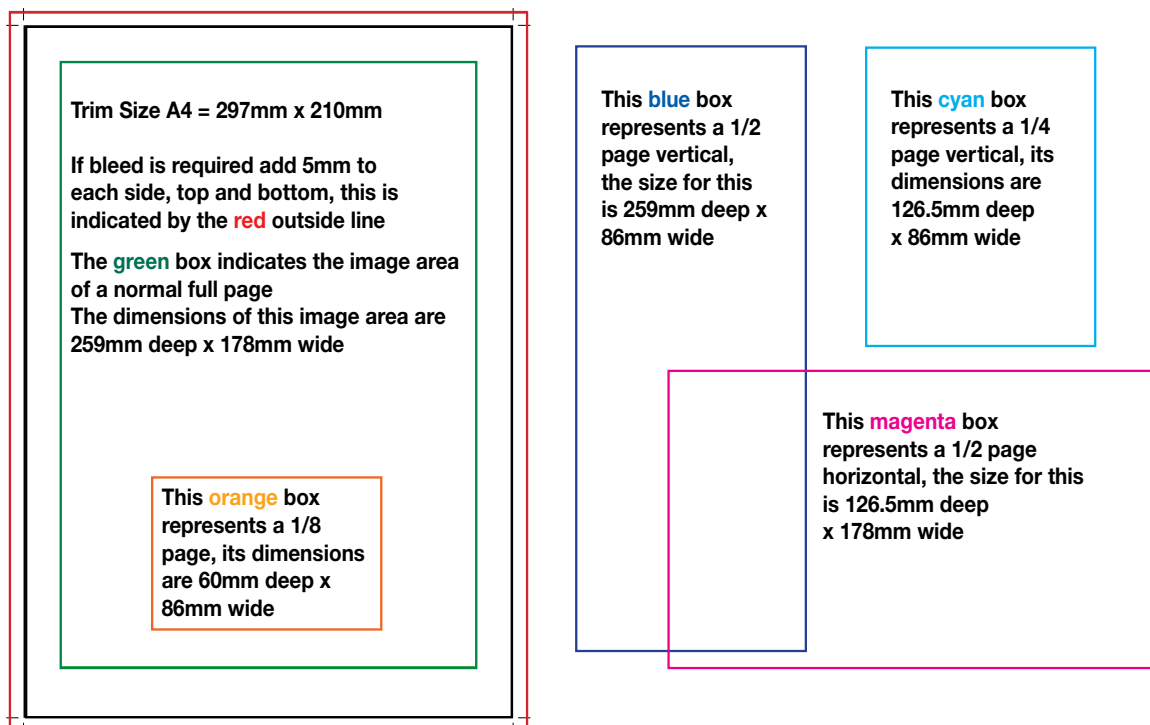

Photos need to be supplied as off-camera images (not reduced in either size or quality). This may mean that they will need to be emailed in several batches to ensure that they are sent within the limited upload/download range of the email protocols (both your own and the ACTA). Only photos that conform to ACTA quality standards will be used in future publications. Captions should not be imprinted over photos, but should be supplied separately, clearly identifying which photo they relate to.
