

ACTA REPORT

Mal Dyson – President Paul Gilbert – CEO

Firstly, a big welcome back to all our current members, and a warm welcome to our new members for

2020! This year is shaping up to be a big year for the Association with the 2020 Olympics being a pinnacle event. We wish all our Olympic hopefuls the best of luck as they prepare for the upcoming ISSF Olympic Selection trial events and National Titles, and hope that our soon-to-be selected athletes for Tokyo 2020 achieve all the success they so richly desire and deserve!

17 December Executive Committee Meeting

A full Executive Meeting was held on 17 December via the GoTo Meeting Voice Conference App. This worked extremely well and gives the full Executive the opportunity to meet with great convenience and little cost to the ACTA. There were a number of items on the agenda, a brief summary being as follows:

Budget

Treasurer Alan Styles presented the Budget for the coming year and explained the main variable in 2019 and 2020 is the Deprecation of assets which are being reflected at their Write-Down-Value. This differs significantly from previous years where we either had a large cash reserve earning interest and or Grants that had been collected to expend on the *Range Building project. Consequently, assets such* as the new Function Centre, (a \$7,000,000 asset), are now being depreciated at 2.5% over 40 years, or in simple terms, for this asset alone, at a cost of \$175,000 per year. As a result, the budget suggests that 2020, while projecting an \$80,000 operating surplus, will show a \$200,000 deficit including the depreciation. A similar outcome is anticipated for 2019.

Strategic Plan

The ACTA, previously having no strategic plan, have appointed Brisbane Company, CPR Group, to conduct a Strategic Planning process so the ACTA will have a predetermined plan moving forward. They propose the preparation and facilitation of an

interactive planning day in Wagga Wagga in March 2020, just prior to the 2020 Trap Nationals. It is

envisaged that the day may include the National Executive, Administrators, State Representatives and Sub-committee members as suitable. The activities within the forum will form the basis of their consultation and reporting for this project. To further analyse the Association's needs and future opportunities, an online planning questionnaire will gather input from State bodies and affiliated Clubs. The process aims to prepare a strategic plan to guide the organisation's direction over the next three to five years. A clear strategic plan will provide agreed direction for current and future National Executive Members and Administrators and will help to ensure the long-term viability of the organisation and its affiliates.

Club Membership Incentive

A Club Membership Incentive proposal was tabled and will be introduced. This incentive is based on clubs increasing their 2020 ACTA registered members by more than 20%, using the 30 October 2019 member's figures as a base line. Clubs will receive full details regarding this incentive from the ACTA Office shortly.

Coaching Future Direction

Following the recent Shooting Australia Forum held in Brisbane, it was confirmed that the ACTA had the right to resume control of their coaching accreditation moving forward. This advice was followed by discussion about the way that we are currently delivering coaching services to members and whether this is the best value proposition. *There was general consensus that other options* may be available, one being the handing back of this service to the States for them to determine, control and deliver. Following extensive discussion and deliberation, the Executive Committee decided to re-introduce a Coaching Sub-Committee being Garry Read (Chairman), Kim Nealon and Malcolm Collins. It was also decided that the current National Coaching position would be terminated in

order to allow this new transition in direction to occur.

Doug Smith Medal

A proposal was also circulated to provide a better reward for calculation of the Winner of the Doug Smith Medal at the larger Championships. Following discussion, the motion was carried to introduce this new calculation from 1 January 2020. This event attendance will be using a multiplier system:

100 - 199 competitors - multiplier is 1 = 10 points 200 - 299 competitors - multiplier is 2 = 20 Points 300 - 399 competitors - multiplier is 3 = 30 points 400 - 499 competitors - multiplier is 4 = 40 points 500 plus competitors - multiplier is 5 = 50 points

The Executive Committee will also continue to have the direction to choose the solitary winner if the event points are tied at the completion of the year.

Target Testing

The President advised that double-blind target testing had been conducted at the National Ground and the Management Sub-Committee, having obtained the shooters and observer's scores, were submitting the following targets for approval:

SKEET: White Flyer Blackout Bio Black

TRAP: White Flyer Blackout Bio Fluro.

The scores of each of the 3 top-scoring targets were compared. While the Skeet Bio Target finished equal top in its test, the Trap Bio Target finished 3rd behind 2 pitch targets. This led to brief discussion as to whether we continue to throw a pitch target or set a better example and move to Bio. It was identified that a number of clubs, (that Executive Committee members are members of), have moved to/are now throwing the Blackout Bio targets and each of these members reported that their performance is extremely satisfactory and their clubs are happy with them. The Management Sub-Committee's recommendations were approved by the Executive Committee.

Excellence, a number of our Clay Target Athletes were honoured with awards. Out of the four main Disciplines of Elite Athletes with which Shooting Australia is affiliated, (Pistol, Target Rifle, Paralympic and Clay Target), our members achieved: Laetisha Scanlan (High Performance Athlete of the Year – Senior Female), James Willett (High Performance Athlete of the Year – Senior Male), Aislin Jones (High Performance Athlete of the Year Award – Junior Female) and Mitchell Iles (High Performance Athlete of the Year Award – Junior Male). Congratulations to all our ISSF athletes on their brilliant performances and achievements in 2019, and this wonderful accolade and recognition that a number of you have now also received.

Office Update

If any of you have had the need to ring the National Office over the past week, you may have been greeted by a familiar and friendly voice. After reassessment of office loads, it was necessary to reintroduce a part-time Reception/Administration Assistant back into the office. One of our previous employees, Jenny Robinson applied for the role and has been successful in being appointed to this position. With the bushfires, we have also seen a short revision of staff on the Grounds. Brenton, who is an Army Reservist, has been called upon to assist with the effort in the devastated Talbingo and Batlow townships and surrounding areas, as well as other areas east of that fire front. We believe that Brenton will be away for at least the month of January, leaving the grounds and facilities maintenance requirements in the hands of John. We wish Brenton a safe and speedy return after he has performed his vital duty to the Federal Government.

In closing, I have no doubt all of you would have been following, over the recent weeks, the bush fire season which has been catastrophic and ferocious over the past 6 weeks. We appreciate that many of our members are rural dwellers, a number of whom may have been personally impacted by the fires, be it through loss of property or disruption to their livelihood. We extend our empathy to all those Australians directly impacted by the bushfire crisis. On a personal note, our thoughts and prayers go out to any of you who have been personally affected by this terrible disaster.

Shooting Australia Awards of Excellence

At the recent Shooting Australia Awards of

Important New Rules for 2020

The revised edition of the ACTA Shooting Rule book is now available on the ACTA website, new or altered Rules appear in RED. Two important changes, which shooters, handicappers and club management need to be aware of are in relation to scores to be recorded in Record Cards.

1. DOUBLE RISE – is now a recordable event, see below new Rule 1.14. As of Jan. 1, 2020 all shooters are without a grade in DOUBLE RISE.

Shooters will initially shoot the first 25 pair (50 targets) under their present trap grade and will then be given a PROVISIONAL GRADE as per Rule 2.01(v). At the conclusion of another 75 pair (150) targets they will be GRADED.

We suggest that DOUBLE RISE scores be recorded on page 26 of the grading card with the heading changed to read "DOUBLE RISE". This will ensure a uniformity of page number for handicappers to look for and use when recording Double Rise. Alternatively if these pages are already taken up with scores, find other alternate unused pages.

Please Note: AA ELITE status does not apply to Double Rise grading, as this status was bestowed based on Trap scores off 15 metres and the 25 metre Handicap mark. This will therefore mean that AA Elite shooters will need to produce their Record Cards at shoots to have their Double Rise scores recorded.

AA ELITE shooters, who have established this status under either the Trap or Skeet disciplines need to understand that this status only applies to the discipline that they qualified in. In the alternate discipline, that is TRAP or SKEET as well as TOWER, BALL TRAP, SPORTING and now DOUBLE RISE, Record Cards need to presented when nominating for scores to be recorded.

1.14 DOUBLE RISE

- (a) Double Rise shall be shot squad system and called by the referee, 1-1 or lost – 1 or 1 – lost or lost lost, whichever the case may be, each target to count one point.
- (b) A competitor must shoot at a complete pair of targets on every occasion, each target broken by the competitor's shot shall score one point. Two shots must not be fired at either target.
- (c) For initial grading refer Trap Rule 2.01(p)(i-vi). Grades shall be: AA 92% and over; A 84% and under 92%; B 76% and under 84%; C under 76%.
- (d) A shooter may have his grade increased after shooting 100 pair (200 targets), but must shoot three (3) consecutive groups of 100 pair (600 targets) at a lower grade percentage to be down graded.

(e) No re-grading will apply until the end of the club's programme of that day. Should a shooter shoot at another Club later on that day the new grade will take effect.

2. RECORDING OF ALL SCORES IN TRAP OTHER THAN 15 METRES – New Rule 2.01(a)

All Trap event scores shot from metreages other than those shot at Double Barrel from 15 metres will be recorded in the secondary column now used for listing Single Barrel and Continental.

However there is an exception – if 15 metre Double Barrel shoot-offs (Points Score events naturally included) are finalised from a metreage further back, then these scores will be included as shoot-off targets and recorded in the DOUBLE BARREL column, not the secondary Single Barrel/Continental column.

- 2.01 COMMON MARK AND HANDICAP SHOOTING
- (a) All appropriate 15 metre scores (competition) shall be recorded for percentage performance classification irrespective of how the event is run, with the exception of Eye Openers (maximum of 10 targets), Double Rise, and those shot Targets Only.
 All targets shot other than 15 metre Double Barrel shall be recorded in the second column designated as Cont and SB. That includes Single Barrel, Continental, and any targets shot as single targets off oscillating traps on any metreages shot in competition. Specific Handicap events are not included.
 (h) It shall be the responsibility of a designated
- club official to enter individual event scores and progressively mark the shooter's card with his 15 metre results. After each 200 targets double barrel regrade the shooter if necessary. Double Barrel scores will be transposed for any better scores from the other events column that have a greater percentage value, ie Continental and Single Barrel and targets shot from a different mark. If the 200 targets fall during an event or shoot-off, re-grading will not take place until the completion of that event. All targets to the end of that event and shoot-off targets including those shot from greater metreages are to be entered into the event column and used in calculation of percentage, except the last target missed in any shoot-off will not be recorded. Once 200 or more targets have been shot at and recorded and after the substitution of any bad scores, the percentage shall be calculated.

Whether you shoot Trap, Skeet or Sporting there are changes in all sections, please take the time to download, or read on line and understand the changes made throughout the Rules.

NEW SOUTH WALES GUN CLUB LTD 1880 – 2020 — 140 YEARS OF HISTORY —

The Club's first President was Sir Robert Lucas Lucas-Tooth (1880-1890), founder of Tooth & Co Ltd, Kent Street, Sydney.

The original Club was situated at Lord's Road, Lauriston Park, Mascot (Sydney Domestic Airport now covers this land).

Membership fees in 1880 were 20 guineas joining fee (close to \$3500 in today's currency) & the annual fees were 3 guineas.

Liquor licence – pre 1905. The Club comes under listing of historically, one of the oldest licensed establishments.

Bookmakers operated on the grounds, and Minutes recorded in 1900 mention Members' "incapable condition" in relation to betting and losing large sums of money. Bookmakers and jockeys however were refused nomination for membership of the Club, as being considered not of best character. A candidate not elected as a member could not be proposed again for a minimum of 12 months – this rule remained until 1970.

Around 1946 the Club purchased land at Terrey Hills and moved to the current location, at 131 Booralie Road.

Over the years the suburban growth of Sydney has moved closer and closer to the Club, and what was once a rural area has become the suburb of Terrey Hills. Nevertheless, the Club has succeeded over the years in maintaining a close, friendly relationship with the surrounding neighbours.





Photographs from our archives

In 1898 the Club reported a membership of 36 members, 52 country members and 10 non-shooting members. Currently there are approximately 580 members, and a regular stream of visitors from other clubs who come for both practise and competition events.

We are immensely proud of the Club's history and reaching this milestone, and hope you will





come along to our special 2 day 140th Anniversary Trap Carnival on 14 & 15 March 2020 and celebrate with us.

SKEET AND SMASH FOR CASH WEEKEND

On the weekend of the 16th & 17th November our Club again held an extremely successful weekend of competition with the Iraq – Afghanistan War Remembrance Cup 100 tgt DB being the star event.

Competitors for the weekend numbered 73 and they came from far afield including Esperance, WA, Mundulla in the South-East and Rainbow, Western Victoria. An equal number of visitors accompanied those competing in the events so it all boded well for an exciting weekend's shooting.

In cold, gusty conditions competition got underway. Saturday's two 50 target Skeet Championships, the first was won by Lynton Schubert with a perfect score of 50/50, while Nathan Campbell took the honours in the Bill Quinn Skeet Shield Championship with another 50/50. The Bill Quinn Shield was won by members from the International Clay Target Club; L. Schubert, N. Campbell and W. Clarke with their score of 147/150. Lynton won the Overall High Gun with a score of 100/100.

Pizza was eaten for tea by a small group of people, some of whom had decided to camp out at the Club over the weekend.

The cool, sunny weather on Sunday, an improvement from the previous day's gusty conditions, saw competitors shoot in almost perfect conditions.

The 100 target Double Barrel Iraq-Afghanistan War Remembrance Cup (engraved with the names of those Australians who have lost their lives serving our country), was being contested for the third year, and this year we were honoured to have some special guests, a group of Iraq – Afghanistan war Veterans who had come to see what our Club had done in the way of remembering their fallen mates. Ryan Foster, our own Club Veteran of three campaigns to both Iraq and Afghanistan, had been the inspiration behind our taking up this idea in the first place, and this was our third year in holding it.

Competitors kept a keen interest on 'who had shot what' on the score-board, and the Cup was finally won by AA grade shooter, Lisa Smith of Adelaide after shooting a score of 98/100 and she was later presented with the Overall sash by one of the visiting Veterans who spoke of why this Remembrance Cup is so significant to them.

added with black targets interspersed among the usual orange targets. Each black target busted earnt the shooter a stubbie or a can of soft drink at the end of the day.



ACTA PRESIDENTIAL MEDAL 2020 NOMINATIONS NOW OPEN

Preamble

ACTA National Presidents have traditionally awarded Medals for outstanding achievement in coaching, administration, or contribution to the sport of clay target shooting.

The following is a guideline for the assessment of individual nominations for the award of Presidential Medals outlining both the process and assessment criteria.

Process

- A call will be made to all States and the Territory by advertisement in the *Clay Target*.
- The nominations to be forwarded to the Chief Executive Officer by the closing date stipulated in the advertisement. The letters shall be marked "confidential" on the outside of the envelope and shall only be opened by the Chief Executive Officer.
- The Chief Executive Officer will treat the nominations as confidential and shall only release them to the President.
- The President will request advice from the Management Sub-committee on a confidential basis and will carefully consider such advice.
- Management Sub-committee members will keep all

details of the nominations and any relevant discussions confidential.

- The President shall make the final decision on the award of the Presidential Medal(s).
- The formal announcement and presentation of the medal(s) will occur during the annual Hall of Honour dinner held during the Trap National Championships.

Criteria

- Outstanding contribution to the sport from Club to National level.
- Generally only one medal to be granted per year but the President may, if the situation is warranted, grant a maximum of two medals in a year.



Proceedings opened with a 20 target double barrel event with ten targets off 11 metres and ten







Psychological Skills for Shooting

Traumatic Events and Grief, how the fires might affect us

As I write this article, most of the NSW coast, Victorian high country and Gippsland and southeast Queensland, Adelaide hills and parts of the Nullarbor Plains are being ravaged by horrendous bushfires. Fires of this magnitude are not unusual, but what is unusual is the occurrence of such large intense fires in different parts of the country at the same time. Some of this article appeared in 2004 following the Boxing Day Tsunami. Whilst that was a totally different disaster the components of how we are affected by real trauma (what we experience) and vicarious trauma (what we see, hear or read about) are the same.

Firstly, I would like to offer my sympathy to any of my readers who were affected fires as individuals who have lost loved ones or their homes or members of gun clubs where the facilities and assets of the club have been destroyed.

Part of my day job over the past 30 years has been to provide critical incident response and management to schools in times of traumatic events: bushfires, severe wind storms, teacher and/or student deaths, bus accidents, kidnappings, murders, etc. I feel that it is necessary to present this point of view because the newspapers, television and radio have bombarded us with images and descriptions that make it difficult for us not to be affected. My work in schools and with the police has shown that the person who receives the phone calls at the front office or operates the radio can be more affected because they are not actually at the scene and therefore they have no way of evaluating what is actually happening. They have to rely on others (who may be emotionally distraught) and therefore imagine what is going on, which is usually far worse than the real situation. These people also feel out of control because they cannot help. For the Australian public, we have been in this position; seeing and hearing graphic images but unable to effectively respond.

The central theme in dealing with traumatic events is to get the community to understand what is happening to them when an event such as bushfires strike their communities. Traumatic events have three determining aspects:

- Firstly, **they challenge your sense of justice**; this isn't fair, why is this happening?
- Secondly, they expose your own vulnerability; we immediately think it could have me that died, or my family or children,

• and finally, they **overwhelm us**; because the event is so outside what we usually experience we cannot get it out of our head.

The interesting thing about humans is that the range of thoughts, feelings and reactions will be varied. There is no right or wrong way to respond. Some people appear as if nothing happened, whilst others are unable to function as normal. The whole range of responses is normal but because the experience is usually outside our sphere of normal and everyday experiences, we often have no way of knowing that what we are going through is a natural response to an abnormal event and our mind quickly tells us we must be losing it or cracking up.

The "cracking up" is merely the expected short-term psychological effects of dealing with trauma.

These come in four areas;

- **Cognitive** (to do with our thinking), affective (to do with our feelings), psychophysiological (to do with our bodies) and behavioural (to do with our reactions). Cognitive problems may include difficulty in attending, concentrating, sleep disturbances, recurrent and intrusive thoughts, dreams and nightmares.
- Affective problems may include feelings of rejection, overwhelming sadness, worthlessness and feelings that the situation is hopeless and therefore I must be helpless. Changes in moods and feelings of depression and anxiety are affective responses.
- **Psychophysiological** problems can be real symptoms such as pains in the chest, tingling fingers, butterflies in the stomach, headaches, dry throat, etc. These are the physical indicators of the flight or fight stress response.
- Behavioural problems may lead to alcohol and

drug dependency, withdrawal from sport and social groups.

For the majority of the population, if they receive appropriate counselling, then these problems will disappear but for a small proportion of the population, they may develop symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder. Appropriate counselling gives the person the opportunity to have their thoughts, feelings and reactions validated, legitimised and normalised. The central theme is to get the client understand that their reactions are a natural response to an abnormal event.

It is possible that some readers are now thinking; I've been feeling a bit like this but I didn't think that the bushfire would have that effect; I feel safe, I didn't know anyone there, etc. What the traumatic event has done is trigger a grief response in you because of some other event previously in your life.

All humans experience grief when something or someone of value leaves or dies. Grief is "the pain of letting go". How much we grieve is dependent upon how close we were to the person. The more central the person was to us the more we will hurt and the greater the pain of letting go. The grief response, follows a series of not so discreet steps. All grief responses follow a similar pattern but not all people grieve in the same way, or for the same time, or with the same intensity.

• The initial phase of grief is shock or numbness. When we first hear that someone has died we are shocked because up until that moment, in our mind, they were alive.

- The second phase is anger. It is not unusual for someone grieving to be angry at person who died, themselves, their God, everybody and anybody. Anger is a normal part of the grieving process.
- The next phase is denial, where we refuse to acknowledge our thoughts, feelings and actions regarding the way we are feeling. The next stage is depression, which is more of an intense sadness than a clinical form of depression.
- The final stage in the process is acceptance, where we realise that we can live with the grief as the companion instead of the person.

In conclusion, it must be remembered that grief is a normal and natural human response. It is painful but will over time diminish. Grief is the pain of letting go of someone we love and because we do not want to let them go, the pain is often very intense. The way each of us grieve is personal and different, so there are no rules. We must take it slowly and be prepared for a rough ride. The best way to deal with it is to talk it out.

I had intended to write a follow up article on some of the components of mental toughness, but it seemed more appropriate to revisit this article now.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION Entry

Entry into the 2020 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2020 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2020 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence before competing.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors, Veterans and SuperVeterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open Section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans sections; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, the top 25 shooters from the Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Points Score events will make up the Open Team. Sections teams will be selected from those eligible from the next highest scores. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Competitors must be over the age of 12, compliant with state laws.

Veterans – are those competitors who, will be over the age of 55 years and under 65 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Super Veterans – are those over the age of 65 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Juniors – are those competitors who, will be under the age of 21 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 16 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations. Shooters who miss their squad and require re-squadding, will be penalised with the loss of one target. This will be at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the ACTA Executive. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified – an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice may be available throughout the championships.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off,

they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

The shoot offs will continue under the event format until a winner has been determined or at the discretion of the Tournament Director a different format is required to finalise the event. Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament director decides. In such a case the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Authority

This program shall control the 2020 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2020 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Appeals

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 4.16 (a) & (b)

The top 25 scorers from the total field will form the Open Team which may include Women, Juniors, Veterans and Super Veterans. All that qualify regardless of age or sex, will take their place in the Open Team for the Mackintosh postal competition. The 20 highest scores to count.

The Junior Team will be selected first, and comprise the five highest scoring juniors not already qualified in the Open team, regardless of sex.

The Women's Team will be selected second and comprise the five highest scoring women not already qualified in a team regardless of age.

The Veteran 55-65 *Team* will be selected third and comprise the five highest scoring veterans not already qualified in a team regardless of sex.

The Super Veterans over 65 will be selected last and comprise the five highest scoring Super Veterans not already qualified in a team regardless of sex.

Each member shall be an official Australian citizen (Rule 3.01a). The 25 shooters having the highest aggregate score from the Australian Double Barrel Championship, Australian Single Barrel Championship and the Australia/ New Zealand Trap Championship (points score) will comprise the team.

The shooter with the highest score in the International Teams Match (points score applies) will be presented with the J.M. Bauman International High Gun Cup, ACTA Silver Australia Badge, The Perazzi Trophy and the International High Gun Sash.

The Women's International Teams Match, the Junior International Team Match and the Veterans over 55 and under 65 years and Super Veterans over 65 years International Team Match, will consist of five women, five juniors under the age of 21 and five super veterans 65 and over and five veterans over 55 and under 65 years. Ties – will be decided by counting forward, starting with the scores of the Mackintosh teams event with the first target missed used to eliminate. If this does not get a result the same process will be applied to the Points score and then the Single Barrel and then Double Barrel scores. If this does not get a result the elimination will continue on the event conducted prior to the Double Barrel and so on until a result is achieved. In the unlikely event that after counting forward on all National individual events there is still a tie, the elimination will be conducted by lot.

The Women's High Gun will receive the Perazzi Trophy and an ACTA medal and the Super Veterans over 65 years High Gun will receive the Perazzi Trophy and an ACTA medal. The Veteran 55-65 years High Gun will receive an ACTA medal.

World DTL qualifying events are National Double Barrel, Single Barrel, Points Score and Mackintosh Postal Teams score in aggregate.

Super Veterans – will be selected last and will comprise the three highest scoring Super Veterans not already not already qualified in a team regardless of sex.

Ties – will be decided by counting forward starting with the scores of the Mackintosh teams event with the first target missed used to eliminate. If this does not get a result, the same process will be applied to the Points scores and then the Single Barrel scores and then the Double Barrel scores. If this does not get a result, the elimination will continue on the event conducted prior to the Double Barrel and so on until a result is achieved. DEFINITIONS APPLYING TO THIS POLICY

Firearms & accessories means legal firearms owned by members of the named Association/Club, including any accessories or carrying cases. Loss means loss or damage caused by or arising from a sudden and unforeseen accident including theft from a securely locked building or vehicle.

- Theft cover is conditional on firearms being securely stored in an approved gun safe when the firearm(s) are not in active use.
- No cover will be provided under this policy where the insured, or any other person or entity the equipment has been entrusted to, has breached any law relating to either the storage or use of the firearm(s.)

Comments

This insurance is designed to protect each financial member up to \$12,000 with the option to increase this limit to \$25,000 for an additional \$10 payable by the member.

The policy has an excess of \$50 each for every claim and protects members anywhere in Australia 365 days of the year plus overseas for 21 days in any one year.

The full policy document is available on the ACTA website with all other insurance documents.

For an additional \$10.00 fee any eligible member will be able to increase the insurance coverage to \$25,000.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – 2020 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA or recognised organistion for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
- 2. Squadding is by Pre-Nomination Only. The close date for reduced nominations is the 6th March 2020. Nominations received after 5pm on the 6th March 2020 will not receive any squadding preferences.
- 3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.

Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.

- 4. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
- 5. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
- 6. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
- Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the LOSS OF ONE TARGET may be incurred.
- 8. Any shooter missing their squad and requiring re-squadding will be penalised ONE TARGET [At the discretion of the Tournament Director]
- 9. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
- 10. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
- 11. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
- 12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
- 13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
- 14. Optional sweep prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
- 15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
- 16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
- 18. Section prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd with placing for 2nd and 3rd decided by count forward.
- 19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
- 21. All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.
- 22. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.
- 23. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.
- 24. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
- 25. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorization from the Tournament Director or the Shoot Marshal.




