ACTA REPORT

Membership Renewals

Firstly, a big thank-you to all of our members who have already renewed your 2020 memberships. As you are aware, our membership renewal cycle currently has a definitive date of 1 January which makes it very busy in the ACTA office for staff trying to process new memberships, especially if they all come in during the first couple of weeks of January. Unfortunately, we have unearthed a glitch this year in the database we use which is having problems matching up partners and processing some members in this category. We are working with the database provider to rectify this issue and thank you for your patience while they solve this problem.

Target Testing Update

Over the last week we have been performing our Target Testing at the National Ground. On Saturday 30 November, we performed the Skeet Target Testing with 7 targets tested from 5 suppliers. These included both banded and solid black targets, with targets thrown from both the high and low towers. Interestingly, the solid targets were preferred over the banded and one brand of target stood out above the rest, both with their traditional pitch and new eco target. On 5 December, four of our AA Grade Trap Shooters attended the National Ground to put 19 targets to the test. This involved targets from 5 suppliers and 8 manufacturers and, again, an assortment of traditional pitch, eco, standard and high domes. Like the Skeet test, we had a couple of stand-outs and one eco target comparable favourably with the best. This being the case, it is very likely that the National Grounds will be throwing

enviro targets in 2020 and 2021, at least in Skeet. Watch this space for the announcement of the chosen targets in the next edition!

Shooting Australia Update

Shooting Australia has had recent discussions with the South Australian Government about applying for some funding to allow the recruitment of a Manager, Participation and Sport Development in that state. This dialogue occurred shortly following the decision of the SA Government not to pursue the 2026 Commonwealth Games. In brief, if successful, the employee will be responsible for building strong working relationships with South Australian Shooting Associations and Clubs by developing programs and services that will drive participation at club level with the ambition of increasing the capability and capacity of these Associations and Clubs and growing the sport.

Staff Update

We have had another busy month in the office. Maureen finished with us on 13 December and we had a small lunch send-off for her on 5 December. This included a quick trip from Victoria by the ACTA President Mal and his wife Helen as well as Clay Target publisher, Jim Shepherd and his wife, Judy. Maureen expressed her appreciation for the kind words and wishes for a happy retirement that have been expressed to her by members over the recent month and is looking forward to 7 day weekends, moving forward! Our newest staff member, Aileen Storey, joined us on 2 December. Aileen's role will be working predominantly with the Function Centre as

well as a smaller portion of her time editing the Clay Target newsletter and some social media. Aileen has had a number of years working as the Events Manager at the Wagga Wagga Showgrounds, so her wealth of experience in that domain will provide us with some new and innovative

marketing methods moving forward. Given that Maureen's departure will leave a void in our administration team's size, we have determined that it will be necessary to reinstate another part-time reception person to cope with the phones and other office duties. Advertising has now closed for this position and we will have a person appointed into this position early in the new year.

New Constitution

As some of you will recall, a couple of years ago the Executive Committee of the ACTA attempted to deliver a new Constitution for our Association. At the time, there were a number of elements within that proposal that weren't accepted, resulting in the process being abandoned at that time. Moving forward to 2020, a Constitution Sub-Committee has again been appointed with the intention to deliver a more useful and updated Constitution.

In order to ensure that the process moves forward in the most collaborative manner, the Constitution Sub-Committee wishes to keep members fully informed of their progress. The Committee has unanimously agreed that there are a number of key elements to the new Constitution that will need to be provided to Members, Zones and States for review, discussion and response prior to any final decisions being made and before the ACTA bears the expense of drafting a full Constitution. The Constitution Sub-Committee appreciates that this is a step-by-step process and it will only undertake each additional step when they are satisfied with the work that has been done to date and the vast majority of stakeholders agree with what is being presented to them.

Early in the New Year, we will be releasing the first key element of the proposed Constitution and we look forward to receiving your constructive submissions. After the submissions have been received, they will be taken into account, collated and responded to by the Constitution Sub-Committee either individually or through the Clay Target News. Thank you for your kind assistance in this process.

Presidential Medal Nomination

Finally in this report, we would like to advise that the Presidential Medal Nomination is advertised in this edition of the Clay Target News and we are seeking nominations for this prestigious award.

In closing, we would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the members who have made generous contributions to our Club, Zone, State and National events and programs, especially our office bearers, volunteers, referees and coaches, and we wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a safe and prosperous New Year in 2020.

ACTA PRESIDENTIAL MEDAL 2020 NOMINATIONS NOW OPEN

Preamble

ACTA National Presidents have traditionally awarded Medals for outstanding achievement in coaching, administration, or contribution to the sport of clay target shooting.

The following is a guideline for the assessment of individual nominations for the award of Presidential Medals outlining both the process and assessment criteria.

Process

- A call will be made to all States and the Territory by advertisement in the *Clay Target*.
- The nominations to be forwarded to the Chief Executive Officer by the closing date stipulated in the advertisement. The letters shall be marked "confidential" on the outside of the envelope and shall only be opened by the Chief Executive Officer.
- The Chief Executive Officer will treat the nominations as confidential and shall only release them to the President.
- The President will request advice from the Management Sub-committee on a confidential basis and will carefully consider such advice.
- Management Sub-committee members will keep all details of the nominations and any relevant discussions confidential.
- The President shall make the final decision on the award of the Presidential Medal(s).
- The formal announcement and presentation of the medal(s) will occur during the annual Hall of Honour dinner held during the Trap National Championships.

Criteria

- Outstanding contribution to the sport from Club to National level.
- Generally only one medal to be granted per year but the President may, if the situation is warranted, grant a maximum of two medals in a year.

The State Single Barrel Championship followed the teams event. Sponsored by Winchester Australia the event was hotly contested. Overall winner was

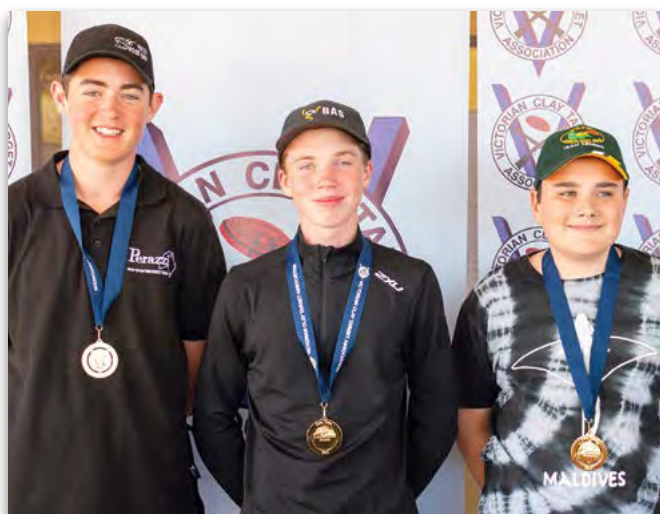

2020 ACTA Rule Book

A new revised edition of the ACTA Shooting Rules will take effect from January 1st 2020.



This revised Rule Book is the culmination of many months of work following on from the July 2019 Rules Supervisors' meeting. The ACTA Executive have now ratified the proposed changes and every ACTA member will find an emailed link to the new 2020 Shooting Rules along with their emailed link of this January 2020 edition of Clay Target.

All new or altered Rules will appear in **RED** type to enable shooters to quickly recognise and comprehend the changes.

Two important changes, which shooters, handicappers and club management need

to be aware of, are in relation to scores to be recorded in the shooter's Record Card.

1. DOUBLE RISE – this is now a recordable event, see below for explanation and new Rule 1.14.

EXPLANATION:

As of Jan. 1, 2020 all shooters will be without a grade in DOUBLE RISE.

Shooters will initially shoot the first 25 pair (50 targets) under their present trap grade and will then be given a PROVISIONAL GRADE as per Rule 2.01(v). At the conclusion of another 75 pair (150) targets they will be GRADED.

As to where the DOUBLE RISE scores are recorded – the suggestion is that shooters/handicappers change either manually or by sticker or stamp, the heading on page 26 of the grading card to read "DOUBLE RISE". This will ensure a uniformity of page number for handicappers to look for and use when recording Double Rise. Alternatively if these pages are already taken up with scores, find other alternate unused pages.

Please Note: AA ELITE status does not apply to Double Rise grading, as this status was bestowed based on Trap scores off 15 metres and the 25 metre Handicap mark. This will therefore mean that AA Elite shooters will need to produce their Record Cards at shoots to have their Double Rise scores recorded.

AA ELITE shooters, who have established this status under either the Trap or Skeet disciplines need to understand that this status only applies to the discipline that they qualified in. In the alternate discipline, that is TRAP or SKEET as well as TOWER,

BALL TRAP, SPORTING and now DOUBLE RISE, Record Cards need to be presented when nominating for scores to be recorded.

RULE:

1.14 DOUBLE RISE

- (a) Double Rise shall be shot squad system and called by the referee, 1-1 or lost – 1 or 1 – lost or lost lost, whichever the case may be, each target to count one point.
- (b) A competitor must shoot at a complete pair of targets on every occasion, each target broken by the competitor's shot shall score one point. Two shots must not be fired at either target.
- (c) For initial grading refer Trap Rule 2.01(p)(i-vi). Grades shall be: AA 92% and over; A 84% and under 92%; B 76% and under 84%; C under 76%.
- (d) A shooter may have his grade increased after shooting 100 pair (200 targets), but must shoot three (3) consecutive groups of 100 pair (600 targets) at a lower grade percentage to be down graded.
- (e) No re-grading will apply until the end of the club's programme of that day. Should a shooter shoot at another Club later on that day the new grade will take effect.

2. RECORDING OF ALL SCORES IN TRAP OTHER THAN 15 METRES –

New Rule 2.01(a)

EXPLANATION:

ALL Trap event scores shot from metrages other than those shot at Double Barrel from 15 metres will be recorded in the secondary column now used for listing Single Barrel and Continental.

However there is an exception – if 15 metre Double Barrel shoot-offs (Points Score events naturally included) are finalised from a metrage further back, then these scores will be included as shoot-off targets and recorded in the DOUBLE BARREL column,

not the secondary Single Barrel/Continental column.

RULES:

2.01 COMMON MARK AND HANDICAP SHOOTING

- (a) All appropriate 15 metre scores (competition) shall be recorded for percentage performance classification irrespective of how the event is run, **with the exception of Eye Openers (maximum of 10 targets), Double Rise, and those shot Targets Only.**

All targets shot other than 15 metre Double Barrel shall be recorded in the second column designated as Cont and SB. That includes Single Barrel, Continental, and any targets shot as single targets off oscillating traps on any metrages shot in competition. Specific Handicap events are not included.

- (h) It shall be the responsibility of a designated club official to enter individual event scores and progressively mark the shooter's card with his 15 metre results. After each 200 targets double barrel regrade the shooter if necessary. **Double Barrel scores will be transposed for any better scores from the other events column that have a greater percentage value, ie Continental and Single Barrel and targets shot from a different mark. If the 200 targets fall during an event or shoot-off, re-grading will not take place until the completion of that event. All targets to the end of that event and shoot-off targets including those shot from greater metrages are to be entered into the event column and used in calculation of percentage, except the last target missed in any shoot-off will not be recorded.** Once 200 or more targets have been shot at and recorded and after the substitution of any bad scores, the percentage shall be calculated.

Choosing shotguns for juniors

I was pretty spoilt with my first shotgun which was a Perazzi MT6 with a nice short montecarlo stock, small grip, a thin Schnabel forend and a soft recoil pad. My brother and I spent hours and hours of family “bonding” time helping Dad reload subsonic shells for both of us to use.

I recently did some interviews and asked some shooters what their first guns and loads were:

Renae Birgan started with a Winchester 101 which was handed down through all the kids in her family, Mitch Iles started with a Browning Ultra trap and the lightest loads he could get his hands on. Aislin and Renae Jones both started with the same 20 gauge Yildiz. Matt Molan a .410 Yildiz, whilst William Freni-Lizzi started with a 100 year old single barrel .410 and then progressed to a 20 gauge. Catherine Skinner started with another family ‘hand me down’ this time a Miroku and she shot subsonics for her first couple of years.

13 year old Chloe Evans (famous for winning the car at the Roma Chariot Shoot in 2019) shoots an MX3 Perazzi with a short montecarlo stock, with a substantial soft recoil pad and an adjustable cheek piece.

Obviously starting juniors off with a well fitting gun and light loads that don’t cause pain or injury helps juniors stay in the sport and flourish.

In NSW, ACT, Vic, Tas, NT and SA juniors can start competing at 12 years, in QLD 11 years and in WA there is no age limit.

I’ve spent time coaching hundreds of juniors over the years through private coaching, coaching for the ACTA and for try shooting. Here are some points to consider when selecting and setting up guns for juniors.

GUN WEIGHT and RECOIL

Junior’s guns should be light enough in weight for the junior to handle comfortably and particularly safely, however heavy enough to assist in absorbing recoil. I once had a very light weight 28 gauge gun and using normal 28 gauge loads the perceived recoil was painful for me let alone the small juniors it was purchased for.

A balance needs to be struck between the juniors size, stature and strength, the weight and size of the gun, the gun’s calibre and the load type. If they are a strong,

tall junior then a normal 12 gauge with light loads or subsonics may suit. For my try shooting sessions I have normal 30” 12 gauge shotguns and I also have 26” 12 gauge, field, Beretta silver pigeons with shortened yet weighted stocks that suit most small, short juniors and petite ladies when matched with subsonic loads. However sometimes even the small 26” field gun is too much weight and recoil for some very small juniors and ladies so I also have the same configuration in a .410 version for those occasions.

EASY TO OPEN

A gun needs to be easy to open or else the junior will struggle to do so and safety may be compromised. A gunsmith should be able to “loosen” it up with a bit of tooling if it is too tight. Keep the hinges well oiled too.

STOCK LENGTH

As I travel around Australia for coaching I often come across juniors trying to shoot guns that are just too big for them – too heavy and too long in the stock.

Commonly when a stock is too long for a junior they may lift the elbow of the arm that the gun is shouldered in well above horizontal so that they can move their face further down the stock towards the sights to see them. A stock of a suitable length will allow the shooter to lower their elbow and comfortably place their head forward on the stock avoiding neck and particularly shoulder injury in the form of scapulothoracic bursitis and also wrist strains.

Having elbows lower than horizontal allows the junior to be able to swing smoothly forward and towards targets when shooting. Allowing them to stay on the line of the target instead of incorrectly rocking their weight backwards and pulling off the line of the target as they swing. When weight is transferred backwards usually the resulting shot is above and behind swinging targets.

There is lots of discussion on how long a stock should be, some say a shooters nose should be a couple of inches from your thumb. My thoughts are that the shooters cheek should be in the front half of the stock comb allowing for comfortable balanced movement towards the target.

A good stockmaker should be able to cut a stock appropriately for a junior, adding weight to the stock

if necessary for balance. Keep the off-cut as it may be added back in when that junior grows. Rubber shotgun kickpad stock extensions may be a quick add on for that junior outgrowing their stock.

ADJUSTABLE COMBS

Adjustable combs allow the top of the stocks comb to match the height of an individual's cheek for a perfect sighting plane. Permanent adjustable combs built into the stock will also often allow for the comb to move sideways as well as up and down to fine tune the sighting plane even more. Rubber comb raisers that fit over just the top of the comb are good for adding height. Neoprene comb raisers are useful for adding height and softening the contact between cheek bone and stock, as is also just slipping a "stubby holder" over the stock too. With these slip on options be careful the stock doesn't become too thick and prevent the cheek from sitting against the stock whilst maintaining the cheekbone and eye over the top of the comb with the head on straight and eyes positioned level.

LENGTH OF PULL

Juniors have little hands and if length of pull is too great they may not be able to hold the stock firmly whilst reaching the trigger; they might not even be able to get their finger on the trigger at all. The length of pull may need to be reduced. The length of pull is the distance from the trigger 'shoe' to the centre of the recoil pad. A forward sweeping pistol grip may move the hand closer to the trigger. If guns have adjustable trigger distance then this may be set back towards the grip to reduce the length of pull. Sometimes I have seen add ons to grip such as tennis racquet tape or auto body putty to get the finger closer to the trigger. However purchasing a gun designed with a reduced length of pull such as some ladies guns on the market Caesar Guerini's Syren, Beretta's Vittoria, Franchi's Catalyst, Miroku's Diana to name a few may be an option for small hands. Stocks can be made and fully adjustable stocks can be fitted to also overcome this issue.

PALM SWELLS AND HAND GRIPS

Juniors have little hands and may require a gun with a reduced thickness of hand grip or reduced palm swell to allow for comfortable and safe holding of the shotgun. Similarly adjustable options, custom stocks and ladies/juniors guns may be good options. I have seen some stocks head off to stockmakers to make the grips slimmer and more suitable for small hands.

GOOD RECOIL PADS

Check the recoil pads on particularly the old guns that get handed down through the family's begin-

ners as the rubber can perish on them and be quite brittle and hard and not offer much recoil absorption. Check that the recoil pad doesn't dig into the junior's chest, shoulder or even arm/bicep. I personally have experienced a recoil pad that was too thick and actually was quite wobbly when fired not giving the stability needed. There are many brands of good kick pads available which will definitely help with making the experience a little bit more comfortable for juniors.

PITCH OF THE GUN

Pitch is the angle of the recoil pad in reference to the gun's rib. Pitch directs the recoil through the kick pad into the shooter's chest and shoulder. A right angle of the kick pad to the gun's rib is called "zero pitch". Less than a right angle and it is known as "positive pitch", greater than a right angle it is "negative pitch". An incorrect gun pitch can be quite an issue for young shooters – not only will they struggle to hit a second barrel consistently with the increased muzzle flick, the gun will also feel uncomfortable in the shoulder and dig in. It is also likely that the stock will slap up into the cheek bone and bruise the shooter's face. Wedges can be placed into the top or bottom of the stock to even out the gun's pitch. I do recommend a good gun fitter assist with this.

RECOIL REDUCTION DEVICES

Any way of reducing perceived recoil for juniors so they are comfortable and hence maybe help them enjoy their new sport a little bit more should be explored. There are many types, from gas operated, spring loaded and mercury slides. In Western Australia juniors are allowed to use semi-auto shotguns which is a good way for juniors to get into the sport without worrying about recoil.

SHOOTING JACKETS

I've seen some very slight shouldered juniors where the stock just fits in between the end of their collar bone and ball of their shoulder, on these very slight framed juniors the outer edge of the stocks recoil pad can even rub on the side of their arm or along their neck. I've also seen juniors with very boney, deep shoulder pockets and collar bones that stand out and the shooter never feeling like the gun sits comfortably anywhere on their chest or shoulder.

The padding on the shooting jacket doesn't necessarily need to be thicker in depth to prevent injury – though this will help lessen felt recoil – but the padding itself needs to be dense. Neoprene (stubby holder/wetsuit) or dense gel pads can assist with smoothing out and covering over shoulder pockets and collar bones and lessening felt recoil. Shooting

jacket padding can also be extended out onto the arm or in towards the neck to stop chaffing from the stocks recoil pad. Shooting jackets with the inner layer as mesh can also cause quite a bit of chaffing this should be replaced with soft fabric as the inner layer.

FULLY ADJUSTABLE STOCKS

Fully adjustable stocks such as Evocomp, Puma, Woody and TSK to name a few have become very popular with juniors.

In the photos accompanying this article is Fletcher Richardson, 15 years from Guyra, NSW. Fletcher

may be quite short now but it is likely he will grow to around six feet or even more and in just the next couple of years. He is a talented young shooter whom qualifies for the NSW Junior DTL team when only 13 years old and in 2019 won the NSW Handicap Title.

To assist Fletcher with not only shooting pretty good scores but also to avoid injury and flinching his father has got Fletcher's gun fitted with a fully adjustable stock. Within the first month of having the fully adjustable stock Fletcher's shape and height had changed quite a bit and likewise the stock dimensions had been adjusted too.

Fletcher's father Jeff Richardson said he bought a TSK as he "needed a stock that had the ability to be adjusted with a quick growing body. And is able to adjust length, pitch, height and cast".

STOCKMAKERS AND STOCK ADJUSTERS

Stock adjusters/fitters can add kick pads, change pitch, add in adjustable combs, cut/weight and balance stocks etc. Stockmakers can do all of this plus make a stock from scratch from a block of wood.

A list of stockmakers and fitters can be found in the coaching section of the ACTA website.

Last minute suggestions:

- Use the power of Facebook and ask who might have a suitable gun for a junior sitting in their gunsafe, or a shortened stock, or even an adjustable stock ... there are lots out there that have served generations of young shooters well for years maybe you can get your junior started off on one of them.
- Have a look at the growing range of ladies guns that are now available they may just be perfect for your junior.
- Clubs should have a gun suitable in their armoury for juniors and ladies to try.

Take it one target at a time!

2019 SA State ISSF Titles



Well here we are again for the South Australian State ISSF titles for 2019. Thursday saw a few competitors at the practice traps getting themselves familiarised with the background and conditions of our State Shooting Park.

October 25th to 27th 2019 saw near perfect conditions to start the day, around 20 degrees for the morning and with just a slight breeze, in comparison to the day before which was around 38/9 degrees. However, the day was certainly going to change a little later. It was a steady flow of participants that came to the ticket window to contest the first event which was the State Mixed Pairs title. Held for the first time here in South Australia, a good mix of top end shooters came with some new ones that hadn't shot the mixed pairs before. Targets were being checked in the early morning for distances, heights, speeds and angles. Although a challenging first set of 75 with lots of low, fast and wide targets, no one could wish for better targets, with great visibility in front of the traps. The weather gods were going to be kind to us this weekend with great spring days ahead but a chance of showers later.

As everyone wandered around the grounds seeing who they were up against, there was a great atmosphere of anticipation. Office staff was well catered for with lollies in the bowls for keeping the energy levels up. At 9am everyone was called out to the layout to see the targets. Everything looked fine, and the game got under way.

Steadily but determined they all got through their rounds. Competitors were coming in, in-between the rounds to check the progressive scores and see how they had fared up, and there were smiles as well as sad faces to be had. As we started going through the 2nd round, the prevailing winds at our State Shooting Park started to get a little fiercer, making the targets more unpredictable.

When all the numbers had been calculated at the end, the shoot-off's got underway: 25 targets of Single Barrel for each competitor to determine the winners of the sought after State Red sash. The top 4 pairs went out to face it off Craig Bentley and Molly Bretag against Sam Daou and Beth Hayden for the Bronze medal match. And, with only 1 point in it, the Bronze medal winners

were Sam Daou and Beth Hayden 149/200. By this time the predicted showers had come through. The Gold medal match then got underway with Gary Coppola & Lisa Smith against Martin Collumb & Deserie Baynes. When all had gone quiet the Silver medal went to Martin & Deserie, and the Gold was won by Garry & Lisa, taking out the State Red Sashes and the State title.

Presentations got under way nice and early at 2pm which gave everyone a chance to have a relaxing afternoon and some well earned R & R before the games begin again tomorrow. Congratulations to the winning participants. While the participants had gone, all the officials were hustling over the trap layouts with their protractors, height sticks, angle and distance markers etc. to get everything right for the morning. A few people stayed behind to get some much needed practice in.

and Bronte Evans and Noel West it's a pretty thankless task, but we would like to acknowledge your efforts thank you all so very much.

So today, the commencement of the qualifying 125 target singles rounds of which the first 75 targets would be shot today and would determine our SA Postal team. At the Skeet end, everything was also checked and double checked and as the rules tell us, the participants were called to the 1st and 2nd traps to check all the targets before they all headed out

to undertake the task. Once again the forecast was for blustery conditions and 18 degrees, which made for an awesome day with targets bouncing and being wind effected. Scores on the board certainly reflected the conditions with some being absolute train wrecks, and hopes of being in the winner's circle being dashed.

At the end of the day, there were lots of smiles and lots of sad faces again as the scores came in and got tallied. At 2.30 pm everything was over and everyone started making their way to the bars and hotels for some well earned rest and to get refreshed for the last 50 targets of the qualifier before the real work starts tomorrow in the finals. Squad sheets were redrawn and rotated ready for a start on time.

Sunday morning saw a change in the weather, with milder breezes and cloudy conditions. As the first wave headed out at 9am, everyone started contemplating where they were going to end up. Competitors went out and did whatever they had to do to stay in the running for the State titles that were on offer for the select few that could manage their way through the changing conditions.

The last 50 targets were shot and calculations were being done in the office. A lot of head shaking was happening around the grounds and competitors were thinking – what could

Congratulations and well-done Bronte, and commiserations to Martin for staying focussed under pressure for so long but just missing out.

Meanwhile, down at the Skeet end, it was Don Molina, Craig Scheele, Will Darlington, Doyle Yoannidis, Rick Dalese & Rob West on the battlefield for the finals. Competitors had to deal with the same changing conditions as well as a breeze which had come in making the targets a little more unpredictable.

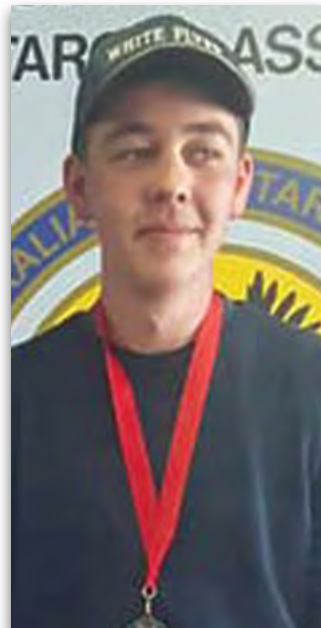

Psychological Skills for Shooting

GOLD MEDAL READY

I have been doing some casual school counselling and was pleasantly surprised when I arrived at West Wyalong a couple of weeks ago, only to find all the students in the hall listening to Suzy Balough as part of the OPTUS and Australian Olympic Committee 'Olympics Unleashed' program.

Taken from the Olympians Unleashed website; Olympians and athletes aspiring for Tokyo 2020 are excited to visit schools to inspire Aussie school kids to be the best version of themselves – whether that's in the classroom, the playground, the sporting field or at home.

Talking to a group of students, years 7 to 10 can be a very daunting task. Suzy had them enthralled. She was a great ambassador for our sport, making it sound accessible, exciting and sparked their interests. West Wyalong would be one of the few rural towns in NSW where the gun club boasts a trench layout,

ISSF Skeet as well as DTL, Skeet and sporting. Even though it was a very hot morning they listened intently to her description of clay target shooting, her experiences growing up as a shooter, her personal and athletic journey to make the Australian Olympic team and the recollection of her feelings, thoughts and reactions around her gold medal win in Athens. Suzy is also a member of a group of Olympic champions, known as the Gold Medal Alumni, who are showing their support to the next generation of athletes as part of the Australian Institutes of Sport's Gold Medal Ready program. Teaming up with AIS Sports Psychologists and the Australian defence Forces Commandos the Gold Medal Alumni are a part of the program to share their personal stories and knowledge, through experience, with other athletes. The incredible support from our Olympic gold medallists shows the special bonds and national spirit that sport can provide. The Alumni come from 13 different sports and their athletic careers have spanned Olympic Games from 1988 through to the most recent 2016 Rio Olympics.

The Gold Medal Ready program aims to support medal potential athletes and coaches be "ready" for the stress, pressure and expectation to perform to their best and win at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games. More than 150 athletes and coaches will participate in the program prior to the 2020 Olympics including education, skill development and mentoring. ACTA shooters attending state based coaching clinics or national training camps are fortunate to benefit from the knowledge and skills Suzy has developed from the program. The Gold Medal Ready Program objectives are as follows:

- Learning from those who have achieved success at the Olympic Games
- Mindset, Mental Preparation & Ready to Perform at the Olympic Games
- Familiarisation with the Olympic Games Environment & Experience

As we move into the 2020 shooting year it seems natural that we can all benefit from the concept of the 'Gold medal ready' program by being mentally fit whenever we compete. A club shoot is a long way from the Olympic games but it is still a competition and it still requires the same psychological skills to be mentally tough to win. Research published in the Journal of Sports Sciences has found successful Olympians have a high degree of self-confidence, are able to block out distractions, manage their arousal level, are goal-oriented and demonstrate a healthy form of perfectionism. Nicole Forrester, Assistant Professor from Ryerson University in Canada, is an Olympian and a registered member with the Canadian Sport Psychology Association. She argues that 'when it comes to sport psychology, mental toughness is possibly one of the most widely used terms, and yet, there is no agreement on its definition. Mental toughness is essentially a constellation of various mental skills, including unshakeable self-

belief, resiliency, motivation, focus and the ability to perform under pressure, as well as to manage physical and emotional pain'.

Forrester cites researchers who determined mental toughness to be an athlete's ability to outperform their competitors in managing demands and demonstrating consistency, drive, focus, confidence and control under pressure. They also found mental toughness to be a characteristic that was both innate and developed over time, meaning an athlete who doesn't appear to be "born with it" can certainly cultivate it.

Forrester continues by stating, in sport psychology, we use mental skills training to help athletes develop mental toughness. Mental skills training involves assessing athletes' areas of strengths and weaknesses and devising a program that builds key areas essential to their sport and their individual needs.

While the needs of each athlete will vary, there are common strategies used by many Olympians. These strategies are:

- Goal-setting
- Self-talk
- Imagery
- Arousal control

Over the years I have covered each of these strategies in articles for the CTSN. Back in 2006 I also wrote about mental toughness and identified the following as characteristics of mental toughness: competitiveness, confidence, control, commitment, composure, courage and consistency. I will revisit these strategies and the characteristics of mental toughness next month.

I would like to thank readers for the interest in The ShootSP. There has been an overwhelming interest and take up of the device. Some readers have been understandably sceptical. The SP trains your brain to recognise which are the 'right' barrels when you shoot with both eyes open if you have an eye dominance problem. You still have to look at and focus on the target. 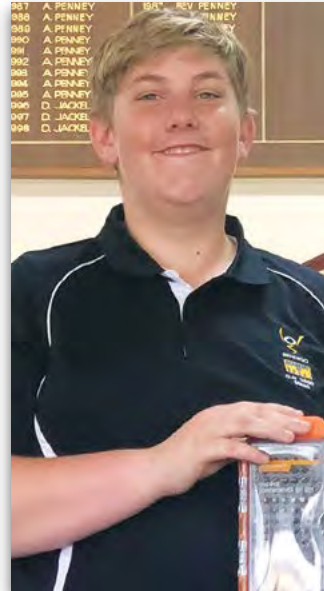

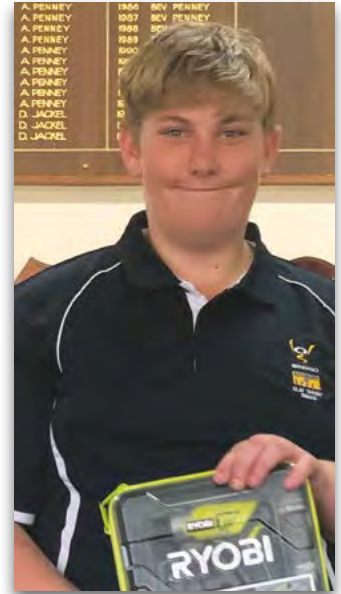
