It's been another busy month at the National Office, with many administrative functions being performed.

AGM

We have been audited and the annual accounts have now been prepared for the upcoming Annual General Meeting which will be held on the first Sunday of the Trap Nationals, March 22. Please see the Notice of Meeting on page 3, following this report.

Event Sponsorships

Arms Fairs

As discussed above, regardless of their event sponsorship, sponsors have been invited to attend and exhibit at both, Trap and Skeet Nationals in 2020/21. So traders, thankfully we are still good to proceed!

The Chair of the Coaching Committee has reported that this committee has now met twice, and the State Coaches will be meeting in Wagga Wagga on the 19th of March to consolidate their plans and strategies moving forward.

Future Database Upgrades

Office staff met with APT / Stratum Management last week to discuss enhancements to the member's "My Page" and ways in which we might harness this resource to transform your interaction with the Association. There are many opportunities to explore including: new name (My ACTA), personalised dashboards, Club/Zone/State/national diaries, social media links, urgent notifications banner, online nominations, results, news and mobile app functionality which could include the likes of handicap status and coaching accreditation e-cards. These were also the first qualifying events for the 2020 Olympic Team Trials. Congratulations to Colin on a well-planned and run event. Congratulations also to our athletes who performed so well at the carnival. A number of you are already pressing a strong claim for selection and we look

forward to seeing how you progress at the second and third selection events in late February (Melbourne) and mid-March (Sydney).

Thankfully, we have not had any reports of damage to club facilities as a result of the horrendous fires throughout Australia this summer. This is not to say that such an event has not occurred ... but at this point, no news is good news!

After the last target was shot the Australian team were behind by 2 targets 243/250 and the New Zealand team were victorious on 245/250.

Both teams should be commended on the professionalism and sportsmanship displayed, both on

RULE CLARIFICATION

RECORDABLE SCORES

Since the introduction of the new 1st January Rules, myself and indeed many State Rules Supervisors, Handicappers and Executive members have had many questions relating to events that are NOT recordable on Record Cards.

In an attempt to clarify this, below is a list of events that are NOT to be recorded on cards.

This may not be a complete list, as it seems that nearly everyday someone questions the validity of recording different event scores on cards.

Generally these events can be described as NOVELTY and as such are NOT recordable and therefore do not fit the criteria for the recognition of Break Badges or Long Run Breaks.

NOVELTY EVENTS – These events are not listed as events in the Rule book

- * *Single Barrel Handicap*
- * *Double Rise off any mark other than 15 metres*
- * *Events where extreme angles have been set, for example where target angles may be set as wide as 45 degrees*
- * *Silent Rise*

- * *Events shot from metrages less than 15, for example from 11 – 14 metres*
- * *Reverse Points – this is where 2 points are given for a first barrel hit and 3 points for the second barrel*
- * *Events that use Midi or Mini targets*
- * *Events requiring the compulsory use of side x side shotguns*
- * *Grouped metreage Handicap Rule 2.02(h) these can only be shot as a novelty*
- * *Skeet Super Handicaps, this is where handicaps other than those designated under ACTA grading rules are allocated to those shooters using alternate sub-gauge guns*
- * *Lineal (walk through) Sporting events*

RULE BOOK EVENTS – these events are also not recordable

- * *Walk-up*
- * *Deauville Doubles*
- * *Graded metreage events as per Rule 2.01(b)(ii)*

Tasmanian State Carnival for 2020 was conducted over the Australia Day weekend commencing on Friday 24th January.

The first event was Champion of Champions, Joe Camilleri from Cecil Park CTC shooting a 123/125 after a shoot off between Justin Hitchens, Lorenzo Scribani Rossi, Brad Kidd and Chris Figgins. AA grade was won by Chris Figgins 49/50 Yarrowonga from Brad Kidd 48/50 Wagga. A grade was Norm Basile who shot off with Gary Enniss, Norm winning 142/150 WVCTC with Gary from West Coast Clay Target Club one point behind 141/150. B grade was won by Neil Hayden 112/125 Sebastopol, from local junior Kyle Chapman 111/125 Spring Bay Clay Target Club. C grade was taken out by new shooter Aaron Ford 105/125 Cressy Gun Club and

Nico Pruis 103/125 King Island Clay Target Club. The Ladies section was taken out by Desiree Baynes 116/125 Port Augusta, Veterans Paul Francis 118/125 West Coast Clay Target Club and Juniors Jack Stacey 114/125 West Coast Clay Target Club.

On Saturday 25th January the day started with a 50 pair Double Rise State Championship in conditions that weren't very kind, with a quite tricky wind behind the targets. January 26th 2020 Bendigo – the Tradition Continues

Australia Day is the official National Day of Australia. Celebrated annually on the 26th January, it marks the anniversary of the 1788 arrival of the First Fleet of British ships at Port Jackson, New South Wales, and the raising of the Flag of Great Britain at Sydney Cove.

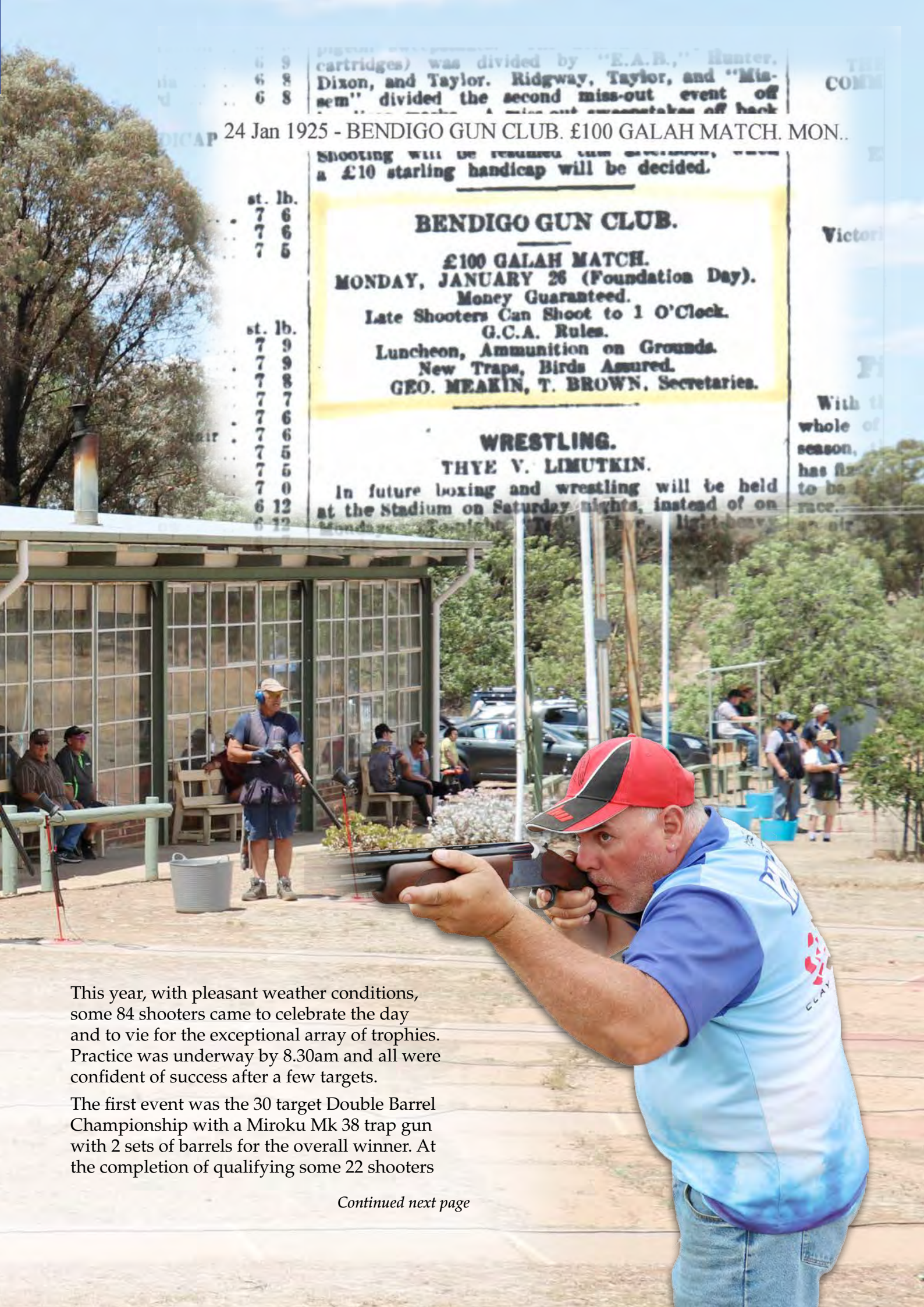
The meaning and significance of Australia Day has evolved and been contested over time, none more fiercely than at the Bendigo Clay Target Clubs Australia Day shoot.

The earliest documented shoot on Australia Day (formerly Foundation Day) held by the

Bendigo Gun Club was the 26th January 1925, however we have documented evidence a shoot was held in Bendigo on the 26th January 1856. The coincidence of this date is extraordinary in that Australia Day was not officially celebrated by all Australian States until 1935, our first



Australia Day shoot. The holiday on the actual day was not officially held until 1994. It is since 1994 that Bendigo has held the shoot on the actual day. Prior to this the shoot was always held on the Public Holiday. Bendigo conducted the shoot on the official Public Holiday from 1973 to 1994. These credentials firmly establishes Bendigo's right to hold the Australia Day competition.

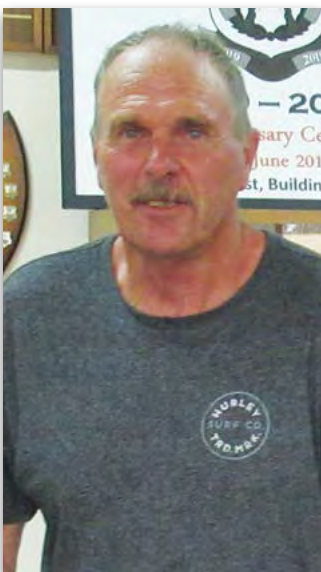

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

Self-Talk Revisited

In January, the article was about being 'Gold Medal' ready and involved work being done by the Australian Institute of Sport in getting current athletes medal ready for the Olympic Games later this year. In the article I stated there are a number of strategies that athletes use to help develop mental toughness. One of these strategies is regulating and positively using self-talk. As this article will appear just before the 2020 Trap Nationals, it may serve as a helpful reminder not to let self-talk get in our way of shooting well.

I have been asked on many occasions over the years "What should I think about while I'm shooting?" The short answer is nothing. However, as we are human beings this is practically impossible, because as humans we think almost every waking moment.

Try this exercise before you continue to read the article:

Have you ever tried to stop thinking: have a go, for the next thirty seconds think about absolutely nothing, cast out all your thoughts and clear your mind of all conscious activity.

(30 seconds later) How did you go? Tough wasn't it. For most of us it is absolutely impossible.

These thoughts and the dialogue going on in our head, can be described as self-talk. According to Burton and Raedeke, self-talk is a steady stream of thoughts and internal dialogue in our minds. Used purposefully, it can be a versatile and powerful technique for improving performance. When you tried to clear your head of thoughts a minute ago, what happened? Any attempt to clear your mind usually prompts a flood of thoughts to rush in and fill the void, often causing us to think about the worst possible things at the most inopportune times. Burton and Raedeke, go on by stating that this continuous stream of thoughts, positive and negative, is self-talk, and it plays an important role in determining moods and emotions. It also plays a big role in developing either confidence and/or self-doubt. Positive self-talk can encourage a positive mood and maintaining your confidence and

improving performance. Negative self-talk on the other hand, can lead to self-defeating thinking, that focuses our attention away from the here and now, to either the past or the future, which then leads to self-doubt and likely failure.

If thoughts are repeated over and over again, they can become beliefs. This is true for both positive and negative thoughts. Albert Ellis, an American Psychologist who developed Rational-Emotive Therapy, describes the process as ABC. **A** is the Activating event: in shooting this might be missing a particular target, for example, a right-hand swinger from lane 5, high house 2, or a rabbit in sporting. Because of this activating event, the consequence, **C**, is a miss, which will lead to a lower score. This may cause us to lose the event, not make the shoot-off or lose the high gun. These consequences can be negative and might include emotions such as stress and anxiety, leading to disruptive behaviours such as poor concentration, judgemental thoughts and interrupted attention to the target. Positive consequences might lead to emotions such as challenge or excitement which would in turn lead to successful behaviours such as good concentration, anticipation, quick reactions, etc. Finally, the **B** represents your beliefs about the situation or what you are thinking between A and C. Burton and Raedeke argue that the B is your interpretation of the situation and it determines your emotions and behaviour to a much greater extent than does the situation itself. Positive thoughts (I've prepared well, I am confident, I have always shot well at this ground, etc) should lead you to feel positive emotions and perform well. Negative thoughts on the other hand, can lead to unproductive consequences. Negative thinking (He's a better shot than I am, I hate rabbits, I've never shoot 100 straight before) will cause unproductive emotions such as anger, frustration, which will lead to self-doubt and choking.

The basic principle of self-talk is that you may not always have control over what happens to us but we can control how we respond to uncontrollable events. This principle, which was first spoken about by Epictetus, a Greek philosopher, who believed that all external events were beyond our control and

therefore we should calmly accept them and what happens. Shakespeare in Hamlet, states "Things be neither right nor wrong, but thinking makes it so." This was adopted by Ellis for his Rational Emotive Therapy and now forms the basis of Cognitive-Behaviour Therapy; "It's not the things in life that affect us, but the way we think about them."

Self-talk can have positive thought patterns, negative thought patterns and can be intertwined by irrational belief structures. Positive thought patterns help create a flow mindset by boosting confidence, maintaining an optimistic attitude, promoting concentration, enhancing motivation and facilitate mental toughness, whilst negative thought patterns involve drawing incorrect or faulty inferences based on inadequate or incorrect information or the inability to distinguish between fact and fantasy.

Before I conclude, go back and try and stop your thoughts for another 30 seconds. It should still be hard, because as I said earlier our mind doesn't like the empty space and will try and fill it something. This time, instead of trying to stop your thinking, focus on something that will keep you focused but will not affect how you feel. Think of and hum a song, think of and visualise a picture or scene of some sort, mentally rehearse something over in your mind. You can't stop self-talk and where possible it should be positive and focused. But if you are trapped by negative thoughts and irrational beliefs then put some other bland thought that is not related to your performance in its place. This technique should be practiced in-conjunction with breathing and relaxation. This will keep you focused on the present and limit the opportunity for your mind to wander into the past (where it will form judgements about past mistakes and failures) or into the future (where you will become scared and worry about failing). Staying in the present will also allow you to focus on the process of shooting 'this' target and the product (the score) will look after itself.

Next month, I will explore these thought patterns: positive thought patterns, then negative thought patterns and finally irrational beliefs.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – 2020 NATIONAL TRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Trap Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA or recognised organisation for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **Squadding is by Pre-Nomination Only. The close date for reduced nominations is the 6th March 2020. Nominations received after 5pm on the 6th March 2020 will not receive any squadding preferences.**
3. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded.
Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
4. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
5. Squads of up to 6 to shoot 50 targets/75 targets/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. National Handicap event to be 5 (five) person squads, 5 (five) targets per lane.
6. **Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.**
7. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/75 targets/50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets or pairs. Should the two-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
8. **Any shooter missing their squad and requiring re-squadding will be penalised ONE TARGET [At the discretion of the Tournament Director]**
9. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
10. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets/pairs. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
11. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS.**
13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
14. Optional sweep prizes will be available for collection on the following day of each event with the exception of the final day. All payments must be signed for and proof of identification given if requested.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall chose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Womens, Juniors or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Section prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd with placing for 2nd and 3rd decided by count forward.
19. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final.
20. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
21. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Trap Championships.**
22. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.
23. Squadding details will be available on the ACTA website, ten (10) days prior to the event. If an email address is provided on your nomination form, you will receive notification via email.
24. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
25. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorization from the Tournament Director or the Shoot Marshal.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2020 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2020 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Australian competitors must produce their 2020 registered shooter record book and produce a current firearms licence before competing.

Divisions

The competition will be divided into separate divisions for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors, Veterans and Super Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5.

Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open Section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior or Veterans sections; however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of three persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, the top 25 shooters from the Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Points Score events will make up the Open Team. Sections teams will be selected from those eligible from the next highest scores. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

Competitors must be over the age of 12, compliant with state laws.

Veterans – are those competitors who, will be over the age of 55 years and under 65 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Super Veterans – are those over the age of 65 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Juniors – are those competitors who, will be under the age of 21 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Sub Juniors – are those who, will be under the age of 16 years as of the 1st January in the year of competition.

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at the practice trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they may not be eligible for any refund of nominations. Shooters who miss their squad and require re-squadding, will be penalised with the loss of one target. This will be at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6.

Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets through the program are to be as determined by the ACTA Executive. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified – an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or their Shooter ID Card. This applies to trap grades, Womens, Juniors, Sub-Junior and Veterans divisions.

Contestants are reminded that re-grading and re-handicapping will be carried out on a daily basis, where required by the rules.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice may be available throughout the championships.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable.

The shoot offs will continue under the event format until a winner has been determined or at the discretion of the Tournament Director a different format is required to finalise the event. Where necessary, shoot offs will be conducted until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament director decides. In such a case the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Authority

This program shall control the 2020 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for.

The Association's Executive Committee, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2020 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Appeals

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 4.16 (a) & (b)

Services and Facilities

Catering:

Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

Trade Displays:

Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products. These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. Competitors and visitors to the ground are encouraged to support these trade displays as, in this way, exhibitors can be encouraged to maintain their support for clay target shooting and our sponsors of this event.

Parking:

Ample parking is available for the cars of competitors and visitors. The parking area will be clearly marked. Please do not park in any area marked as being reserved, as freedom of movement is required at all times – please co-operate.

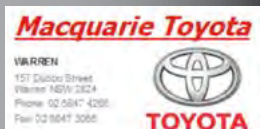

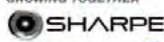
