ACTA REPORT

Mal Dyson – President Paul Gilbert – CEO



Well, yet another month has passed without any real certainty as to what is next to come! The ACTA is continuing to address issues that we never thought we would encounter, so please bear with us as we continue to search for the best way forward.

State Titles

Due to the continuing Covid-19 Virus pandemic, especially in Victoria, both the NSWCTA and QCTA have, in the last month, formally cancelled their State Carnivals for the remainder of the year. The VCTA will make their decision in late August which, at this point in time, will more than likely see their State Trap Event cancelled as well. We are still waiting for a decision from the WACTA.

Executive Committee

With the cancellation of all 2020 National Trap, Skeet and Sporting Events, the National Executive have discussed the situation with regard to the State Teams that qualified at their State Carnivals in 2019 to represent their States in 2020. With Tasmania, South Australia and the Northern Territory having already held their 2020 State Titles and selected new teams, these states will now be allowed to send 2 teams if they so choose, being an A team (2020-selected) and a B team (2019-selected), at the 2021 Nationals. For the other states, the teams selected at their 2019 State Titles will be the representative team from their states in 2021. Furthermore, for juniors who were selected in 2019 to represent their State and who have now turned 18 years of age, (on this one-off occasion, due to Covid-19 and no fault of their own), these individuals will be made eligible to represent their State in their originally selected age group. It was decided this will be left up to the individual States to decide if they wish to select an over-aged junior for the team or select one of their emergencies.

The ACTA Executive is currently evaluating both, the ACTA Shoot Master program currently in development as well as the My Club My Scores Shoot Program. Both these programs will need to have an automatic handicapping system and membership recognition and be able to run all ACTA discipline events. It is

envisaged that this updated program will be passed on to all clubs free of charge. If implemented, this would usher in a major modernisation, (and changes), to our handicapping system in order to meet the automated algorithm that is required to calculate the grading and handicapping process.

Due to the current Covid restrictions across the country, unfortunately, the ACTA Executive Committee's face to face meeting that was due to be held in August will this year will now be held by the GoTo Meeting Tele Conference program. The Enhancement Committee meet on 20 August and the Expansion Committee on 21 August, which will then be followed by a full Executive Committee meeting on 27 August.

Also in this issue

We are excited to welcome back our ACTA Historian, Mark McInnes. From this point forward, Mark will be supplying articles each month from our rich history for you to read. Mark will also oversee the running of the ACTA Hall of Fame.

As reported last month, the Constitution Sub-Committee are also presenting their first proposal – Governance – with regard to the new Constitution that is being developed. We ask you to fully embrace the new Constitution's delivery by providing your support, ideas and feedback as we present our suggestions and recommendations to you. We are still aiming for a 2021 AGM presentation date for this new document which we hope will be ratified for implementation at that meeting.

In closing, we just want you all to remember that the frustration everyone is feeling around the Covid-19 pandemic is universal. We are not the only sport affected by the ever-changing restrictions, and many people, (even within our sport), are likely also suffering from much greater losses than merely an interruption to their recreational pursuit. Please, let's remain patient, accepting, kind and generous towards each other as we continue to work our way through this difficult time in the hope that things can and will improve soon.

GOVERNANCE PROPOSAL

The Constitution Sub-Committee (“CSC”) has been working through how the Governance of the ACTA would operate under the new Constitution. As we have previously established, the purpose of this update is to keep you informed and to give you an opportunity to provide your initial feedback. We must stress that it is a general outline of our current thoughts. Nothing is set in stone and there is no doubt that there is still a significant amount of work that we need to do when it comes to drafting the document. If the feedback is positive, we will move on and once the new constitution has been drafted completely, you will be provided a copy so that you can review and write further. There will be a final period for you to provide your thoughts after the new constitution has been published on the ACTA website and well before we settle on the Constitution that will be put forward at the AGM.

What we want to put to you, are the key aspects of the new Governance proposal. We are not trying to provide the answer to every question in this short Clay Target e-News article, instead, we aim to highlight some of the main changes that we want you to consider. We would also like to hear your thoughts on the best way to vote for nominated board members.

Are we on the right track? What should we also think about? Is there anything that is completely wrong? Please send all formal correspondence to, Paul Gilbert, our Chief Executive Officer. Paul’s email is ceo@claytarget.com.au We also encourage you to discuss any aspect of this update with the members of the CSC. We are all in agreement, proud of what we have put together and happy to answer any of your questions.

1. ACTA Board of Directors (“The Board”)

Subject to receiving further legal advice at the time of drafting, we believe that it is in the best interest of the ACTA to move from being an incorporated association to a company limited

by guarantee. The benefits of making this change far outweigh the negatives and a simple Google search should provide you with a better understanding, if required.

As a company limited by guarantee, the current ACTA Executive will be replaced with a board of Directors who will be tasked with the day to day running of the ACTA.

The Board will appoint the company’s Chief Executive Officer (“CEO”).

We plan on maintaining the current structure where each state is run by their state body who oversee zones and the clubs. We do not propose to change the current hierarchy.

The Board will comprise of six (6) Elected Directors who must be a financial or life registered member of the ACTA. The Board will elect a Chairperson (equivalent to the current President of the ACTA) who will be referred to as the Managing Director. Each Elected Director will be tasked with an area/s that they are to manage during their tenure on the Board.

Each Elected Director will be able to set up sub-committees to assist with their management of key area/s and they will be given the authority to co-opt those who they believe will assist them with the decision making and management. Any financial or life member can be co-opted onto a sub-committee, but all final decisions must be presented to and voted on by the Board.

The Board may appoint a maximum of two (2) more Directors who may or may not be registered members of the ACTA, this is to allow the Board to bring in individuals with specific skills as required that may be desirable in running the Company. These Directors should be known as Appointed Directors and can only serve a maximum of one (1) three-year term.

Each year we will hold a vote for two (2) Director positions, replacing the Elected Directors retiring after a three-year term. Retiring Elected Directors are permitted to stand for a second term only (a total of six (6) years continuous service).

After serving for two successive terms an Elected Director must retire for a full three (3) year term before becoming eligible to be nominated and stand again.

The Company may remove any Director prior to the expiry of their term, by ordinary resolution in a General Meeting of the Member Clubs, subject to the provisions of the Corporations Act.

There are no minimum requirements or restrictions on the States that Directors may be elected from, as the objective is to elect the most suitable Directors available to manage the Company.

Exclusion Clause:

Elected Directors to the Board cannot hold any other executive position within their zone, state or nationally. Anyone holding a disqualifying position must resign prior to becoming an Elected Director on the Board.

2. Proposed Election Procedure

At least six (6) clear calendar months prior to the set election date as set annually, the CEO will call for nominations to the Board by way of public advertisement in the Clay Target e-News. This advertisement should state the position description, the general qualifications and preferred experience.

Any registered or life registered member may nominate an individual who is willing to serve as an Elected Director who meets the criteria generally as advertised. The nominee must be a registered ACTA member of an affiliated club and the nomination must be counter signed by the nominees registered Club President and Secretary.

Endorsed nominations should then be forwarded to their respective state/territory body at least four (4) calendar months prior to the election date. The nomination must be accompanied by a signed declaration from the nominee that he/she is willing to serve as an Elected Director, does not breach the exclusion clause and generally complies with the required criteria. A standardised declaration for nominated candidates will be provided.

Each respective state/territory will determine their clubs' nominations and put forward a maximum of three (3) candidates. Please note that we have deliberately omitted the zones

from this process. Our reasoning is that the zone delegates sit on the state executives and will be able to put forward their position directly to the state prior to them making their final nominations.

These nominations must be submitted to the CEO a minimum of one (1) month prior to the closing date for advertising in the Clay Target e-News selected to publish the candidate details. The CEO must ensure that all candidates receive equal space in the nominated Clay Target e-News detailing their background and suitability for a directorship.

3. Voting

Our preferred voting option – which we believe is by far the simplest – is that member clubs of the ACTA are to compulsorily vote for nominated candidates. The way we best see this working is outlined below:

To maintain membership of the ACTA, it shall be a requirement that each member club submit a voting return as required to elect Directors of

the Company each year. Voting can/may be by fax, electronically or postal.

The CEO must prepare a ballot paper listing each candidate drawn by ballot, to be forwarded to each member Club Secretary at the same time as the Clay Target e-News is posted, carrying the details of each of the nominees standing for election to the board.

Voting procedure for the member club is to number the ballot paper with the numbers one (1) and two (2) in the boxes of the candidates they would like to see elected to the Board. The President and Secretary of the member club should endorse the selection on behalf of their club and forward to the Company Secretary by the closing date as stipulated in the advice published in the Clay Target e-News and sent to each Club Secretary by the CEO.

The Company Secretary is to act as the returning officer for the election. The returning officer with the assistance of the CEO will then count and allocate the first and second preferences to each candidate from all the complying ballots lodged.

The highest number of total votes as designated 1 and 2 will then be declared elected. Should two candidates be equal in total votes the one with the most number one (1) votes is elected. In the unlikely event that the process cannot split the candidates, the result will be drawn by the Managing Director at the AGM.

We have discussed several voting options and have also considered another alternative which we could also consider:

That the members of the ACTA vote using the same 1 and 2 method outlined above. At this stage we believe that the easiest way to conduct this process would be by using an online platform, but this process will not be compulsory.

All votes will be collated, and each member vote would be totalled and used to determine the vote that their club makes to elect the nominated candidates. The same process will apply as outlined above but voting members will vote and their votes will be attributed to their club.

We decided not to make this our preferred voting option as there are some issues that arise. What happens if no members from a smaller club vote? How do we apportion votes to clubs with differing membership sizes?

Our view was that the members of each club are responsible for those who are elected to run their club and on that basis, we believe that it is easier for clubs to vote on behalf of their membership. There will be nothing restricting member clubs from conducting their own internal voting system prior to submitting their final selections.

Acknowledgements

The CSC acknowledges the following:

1. If the new Constitution is adopted, we will need to deal with the transition period until we elect six directors using the process outlined above. We will seek legal advice in this regard and work on a fair outcome for this transition which will also be made available to you;
2. That we still have a considerable amount of work to do but will only push forward if you are satisfied. If it hasn't been mentioned, we will try to keep other parts of the Constitution in line with what we currently have in place. During drafting and after obtaining legal advice, if we make any additional changes these will be made known to you. We maintain our commitment to be honest, transparent and will continue to engage with you to determine if this new Constitution can pass at the AGM; and
3. There may be things that we have missed, not considered or something that needs more thought. We will take all of your emails seriously and will discuss your responses at our next CSC meeting.

We all thank you for taking the time to read through our Governance outline. This is your opportunity to provide your feedback and to help shape our new Constitution. We look forward to hearing from you.

From the past



Donald Mackintosh, was born in Rockbank, near Melbourne in 1866 and learned to shoot at a very young age. By the time that he was six years old he was regularly shooting game with a muzzle loader and black powder.

He wasn't a very big lad and struggled with the gun but he

persevered and became an exceptional wing shot by his early teenage years. He commenced trapshooting at 16 years of age at Bacchus Marsh and enjoyed success virtually from the start.

He developed his trapshooting skills and joined the Melbourne Gun Club at 23 years of age, it only took him six months to reach the maximum 30 yard handicap and from that time on he never shot from a handicap of less.

By 1890 he was dominating trapshooting at Melbourne and travelled extensively throughout Australia to participate in the major shoots of the day. He practiced extensively and generally participated in live bird shoots at least 3 days a week.

Although trapshooting now dominated his life he still loved hunting and spent as much time as possible shooting game, particularly quail, snipe and duck.

In 1896, he decided that he would travel to Europe to participate in the major trap shoots and to test himself against the best shots in the world. He met with a lot of success and ended up staying there for more than a year.

Donald returned home in 1897 and married.

However he had got a taste of the excitement that was in trapshooting in Europe, so he decided to return to Europe in 1900 and then competed and lived there for the next 9 years.

During this period he travelled extensively and competed in all the major trap shoots of the time. The events were held in Paris, London, Monte Carlo, Florence, Milan, Genoa, Rome, Venice, Turin, Naples, Brussels, Ostend, Aix les Bains, Spa, Namur, Lyons, Vichy, Bordeaux, Madrid, Vienna, Budapest, Moscow and St Petersburg.

The grandest of all the venues was Monte Carlo, where the shooters were attended by up to 40 staff and prize money would regularly exceed \$1,000 or \$100,000 in today's terms. The betting at these shoots was huge with bets often exceeding \$1000.

Donald was very successful and won many of the major championships of the time. His list of wins includes major championships won in England, France, Italy, Belgium, Monte Carlo and Spain. He attended the 1900 Paris Olympics and won the trapshooting event, he was posthumously awarded an Olympic gold medal.

By 1903, he was the undisputed world champion, a position he maintained until he retired from international competition in 1908.

He was now 42 years old and he wanted to go back to Australia, he left Europe in September 1908 and returned home.

He had been preparing himself for life after shooting for some time and had spent a lot of time learning all the necessary skills to enable him to establish a business importing and dealing in guns.

When he arrived back in Australia he established a gun shop in Melbourne. He dealt in all types of firearms but had a real passion for guns made by Purdy, Greener, Cashmore and Boswell. His favourite gun was a James Purdy hammer gun.

Although he continued to compete in trapshooting events over the next 40 years, he spent most of his time on his business and promoting the sport.

He was one of the first trap shooters in Australia to recognise the potential of clay targets and is believed to be the first person in Australia to achieve a 100 break on clays; he did this in an exhibition shoot in Rockbank in 1928 and was awarded a gold medal in recognition.

In the early 1930's in conjunction with Jack Sutherland, Horrie James and others he founded the ACPTSA which was to become the ACTA. In recognition of his unique contribution to our sport he was appointed patron of the ACTA, he held this position from 1936 to 1951.

He maintained a passion for international

competition and was responsible for establishing what we now know as the "Mackintosh" event. He donated a trophy for the event and worked tirelessly to ensure its success.

Throughout his later years he maintained a close association with the sport and advised the association on many occasions. He was well known and respected by everyone associated with the sport.

Donald Mackintosh died in September 1951 at Essendon; he was 84 years of age.

Junior Development

At the recent State Coaching Director's Committee meeting a future plan for Junior Development was discussed.

Obviously, nothing will be attempted this year, but we hope that in the second half of next year things can proceed.

The general agreement was that the name would change and be called the ACTA Junior Development Program.

The Program would be open to Juniors from all States aged between 12 and under 21.

All disciplines with Trap, Skeet, Sporting and ISSF included in the group.

It is planned to hold the camp at a location where all disciplines can be accommodated in the one or close proximity.

When finalised and released Juniors will need to complete a form and forward to their State Associations which will scrutinise and forward to the State Coaching Directors Committee.

Juniors will need to supply scores from previous Zone and State events together with any other major recognised shoots being an advantage.

The preference was to run the camp over three days and also call for expressions of interest from coaches and sports specific specialists in the Coaching News and through State Associations to assist with the program.

When the program is adopted, an announcement will be made in the Clay Target Coaching News, through State Associations and all Clubs.

Application forms will be on the ACTA Home Page/Coaching/Junior development.

All this is still in the development stage, but Juniors, Parents and Clubs can see it is a very high priority and well to the fore with the State Coaching Directors Committee.

NTCTA Combined Skeet & Trap Carnival



Maybe isolation isn't always a bad thing. While most of Australia has been required to shut its clubs completely, or at least restrict numbers and competition at its clubs for extended periods of time, the Northern Territory has managed to avoid the worst of the corona virus due to its isolated location. July 23rd to 27th saw the NTCTA, in conjunction with the Darwin Clay Target Club, run its 2020 Combined Skeet and Trap Carnival. Originally scheduled to be run as two separate carnivals, with skeet to be held in June and trap to be held in July, March saw the State Committee make the difficult decision to postpone the skeet carnival following the announcement of national restrictions regarding public gatherings as well as the imminent closure of the NT borders to interstate travellers. In June, following a Territory Government announcement that it would not commit to a date for lifting State border travel restrictions, the decision was also made to postpone the trap carnival.



This is where our isolation really came into play. By early May some NT sporting organisations, including the shooting sports (woohoo!!), could reopen under strict guidelines. By early June all NT sporting organisations could open and recommence competition with most of the restrictions addressing public gatherings being lifted at a State level. Internal biosecurity travel restrictions were scheduled to be removed from mid-June meaning many of our previously locked down regional and remote area residents could travel freely again. The committee quickly realised that unless it worked fast to pull some dates together the chance to run the State Titles in 2020 would be lost entirely. July long weekend was looming, barely 7 weeks away, when the decision was made to change the original trap carnival to a combined skeet/trap carnival.

34 shooters participated in four skeet events – 33 locals and one lone South Australian.

67 shooters participated in five trap events – 63 locals and four South Australians.

Territory shooters arrived in Darwin from many of our remote and regional areas such as Nhulunbuy, Alice Springs, and Groote Eylandt, all keen to be a part of what would likely be one of the few major shoots held in Australia this year. While interstate participation is always welcome, the local cohort were happy just to be on the layouts pitting themselves against the best from other clubs and Territory regions. It was overwhelming to see such massive support from our local members – thank you! A big thank you and nod of appreciation must also be sent out to those South Australian shooters who made the trip up here to compete. It's always fantastic to have visitors attend our clubs and events.

The DCTC grounds were immaculate as usual, manicured and lush green with four layouts available for competition use. While physical distancing was not mandated it was encouraged, and there was plenty of sanitiser and personal hygiene measures located around the club for use by attendees. 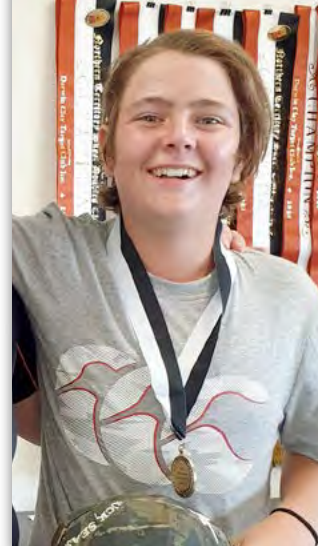

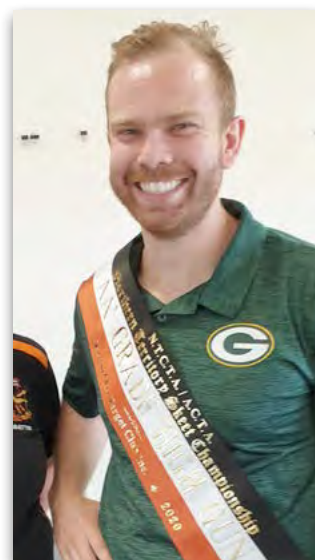

Insight on Sight

PART 1: An Optometrist's Thoughts on Dry Eye Syndrome and the Tear Film

In this article (part 1 of 2) I wanted to discuss a common issue reported by shooters on the range. Many shooters report eyes that are sore and gritty, constantly weeping, or vision that fluctuates considerably while they are on the range. Many of these symptoms are caused by a condition called dry-eye syndrome.

Now before I get into much detail, I would like to encourage any shooters that are having issues with their vision to visit their optometrist. The details discussed in this article are not a replacement for clinical advice from your regular optometrist, who can provide tailored diagnosis and management of their patients. This article aims to enhance the reader's knowledge of a particular part of our vision that is essential for good vision on the range, and highlight issues that can occur.

Dry-eye syndrome is a broad term used to define a range of conditions that impact the tear film.

The tear film is essential for good vision, and essential for a healthy eye surface.

The tear film is a complex coating that covers the surface of our eye. It is produced by a range of mucus and lipid secreting glands located in the conjunctiva and the lids of our eyes, and the lacrimal gland that is situated under our top

lid. These glands work together to produce the mixture of oils, mucus and water that makes up our tear film.

Our tear film is made up of three layers – an oil (lipid) layer, a water (aqueous) layer and a mucin layer. These three layers work together to help maintain the health of our eyes and ward off infection.

Normal tear structure and function

The tear film serves a number of purposes. When functioning properly, it provides a smooth layer for light to enter the eye, so it is vital for good optics and vision – this is essential for seeing the clay targets clearly.

The tear film also protects the front of the eye from the environment and allows the lids to slide comfortably over the front surface.

The tear film consists of three major layers;

- The outer *oily or lipid layer* that prevents the tears from breaking up and evaporating, and also helps the tears spread over the cornea. This layer is produced by the meibomian glands, about 25 of which line the margins of each eyelid. The oils secreted by these glands should be clear and run freely, resembling olive oil. Sometimes, however, the glands become blocked and/or the secretions become hard and waxy, no longer flowing freely.
- The middle *aqueous layer* that makes up the bulk of the tears. This layer is produced mainly by the lacrimal glands along with a number of smaller glands in the conjunctiva; it also contains various salts, proteins and anti-bodies that are critical for corneal wound repair and resistance against infection.
- The inner *mucous layer* that is responsible for enabling the tears to wet the eye by adhering to its front surface. This layer also removes unwanted fatty compounds from the corneal surface.

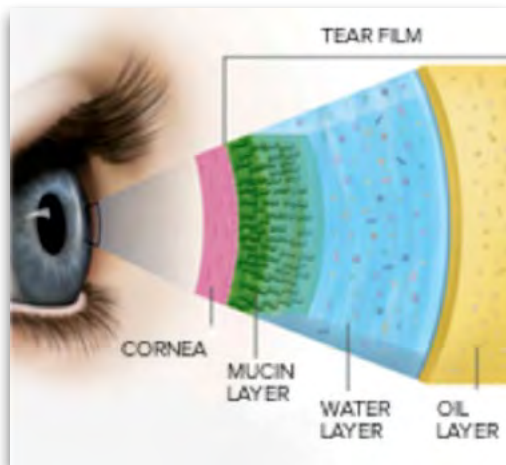


Figure 1: A normal tear film showing the three different layers of the tear film

Tear quantity is determined by the aqueous layer

whereas *tear quality* is generally dependent on the oily and mucous layers.

Types of dry eye disease

There are two main forms of dry eye disease – these are typically called *evaporative dry eye*, caused poor quality tears, and *aqueous insufficiency* due to low tear quantity.

- Evaporative dry eye accounts for around 80% of dry eye disease and is caused by poor functioning and/or blockage of the meibomian glands, also known as meibomian gland dysfunction (MGD – see also below). Decreased oil secretion by the meibomian glands results in rapid evaporation and breakup of the tears.
- Aqueous insufficiency occurs when the lacrimal gland fails to produce enough of the watery component of the tears. This results in hyperosmolarity of the tears, which means the tear salts and proteins become highly concentrated. In turn these high concentrations irritate the front surface of the eye, causing it to become inflamed.

Other conditions related to dry eye disease

Aside from *meibomian gland dysfunction*, other conditions that are often associated with dry eye disease include *anterior blepharitis* and *Sjögren's syndrome*. Some systemic medication and general health conditions have also been associated with dry eye disease. Contact lenses can also disrupt the tear film and cause dry eye symptoms.

- Meibomian gland dysfunction (MGD) describes chronic abnormality of the meibomian glands. It can occur if the glands become blocked, if the oily secretions become thickened, or dry out, or if there is low production of oils by the glands. It is important to note that if blocked meibomian glands are left untreated they eventually cease to function and "drop out" – once this stage has been reached the glands can not recover or ever produce oils again.
- Anterior blepharitis refers to inflammation of the outside edge of the eyelids, most commonly caused by staph bacteria infection or by dandruff of the scalp and eyebrows. Anterior blepharitis frequently leads to secondary infection of the meibomian glands.
- Sjögren's syndrome is a disease where the body's immune system attacks its own moisture-producing glands, including the lacrimal

glands. It most commonly co-exists with rheumatoid arthritis, systemic lupus, systemic sclerosis (scleroderma) and polymyositis/dermatomyositis. Because the lacrimal glands are affected by this condition, aqueous insufficient dry eye disease results.

Common symptoms of dry eye syndrome

Irritation, light sensitivity, dryness, transient blurred vision, burning/stinging, "something in my eye" – foreign body sensation, gritty feeling, discomfort during contact lens wear, itchy stringy mucus in or around the eyes, scratchiness, excessive tearing, swelling/puffy eyes, redness, eye pain.

I recently had a trap shooter present to my practice reporting that while they are shooting targets, particularly in hot windy conditions that they struggle to see the target, and their eyes water. This patient was diagnosed with dry eye syndrome, with the sub-type 'evaporative dry eye'.

What was occurring in this patient's case was the meibomian glands were becoming blocked, and were not secreting sufficient lipid/oil in to his tear film. This led to a lack of the protective lipid coating over his tear film, allowing his tear film to rapidly evaporate. Once the cornea feels it is drying out it prompts the lacrimal gland to secrete lots of tears to rehydrate the cornea – leading to the excess watering of the eyes.

A stable tear film is essential for clear vision as it is the first structure of the eye that light encounters. If a tear film is unstable and of poor quality, it leads to the light being scattered, and ultimately degrades the image quality.

A good analogy for this is if you imagine a pond of water when there is no wind – the surface is stable and flat and you can clearly see the bottom of the pond. Now if the wind suddenly picked up and caused ripples to form, the surface is uneven, and you can no longer clearly see through the water.

Fortunately, with careful diagnosis, dry eye syndrome can be treated and managed effectively. *This will be covered in Part 2 – Treatment of dry eye syndrome, next issue of Clay Target.*

History of Wangaratta Clay Target Club

Compiled primarily from the booklet, Wangaratta Clay Target Club 1919–1999 by Bev Penny, Club Secretary in the 1980s and 1990s, and updated by the club's committee for publication in The Wangaratta Chronicle on the occasion of the club's centenary, June 2019.

2019 marked the 100th anniversary of the Wangaratta Clay Target Club. On the 9th of May 1919, a group of shooters held a meeting at the Bulls Head Hotel in Wangaratta and the Wangaratta Gun Club was officially formed. Mr J.J. Teague was elected as the club's first President and the new club's first competition was scheduled for the 3rd of June, the King's Birthday public holiday. A date clash with the Chiltern Races meant that the inaugural competition was rescheduled for 11th of June. It is interesting to note that both dates were weekdays, giving an insight into the importance placed on such sporting events in those days.

The main event at that first shoot was a handicap competition open to club members only. First prize was the impressive sum of £10, which was more than twice the basic weekly wage at the time. Five hundred live birds were required for the shoot and they were procured at a cost of

threepence each. Nominations were 10 shillings double, 7 shillings and 6 pence single, and five shillings star. 10% of sweeps were kept for the benefit of the club.

Up until 1929, the club shot live birds in the area that is now the HP Barr Reserve and the Wangaratta Rovers football oval. During the early 1930s, the club relocated to its present site behind the Vine Hotel at North Wangaratta and membership had grown to around 30~40.

Attendances at competitions varied from 20~30, with some shooters travelling from other districts by train to compete. Apart from the comradeship typical of any club, betting was also a drawcard at competitions. Bookmakers were a part of the scene at many sporting events of the day. Club member Les Goodwin, who was top shot at the time and worked the live bird traps, later recalled a bet of £1,600 being placed on the pull of a trigger.

The club continued competitive shooting throughout WWII, depending on the availability of

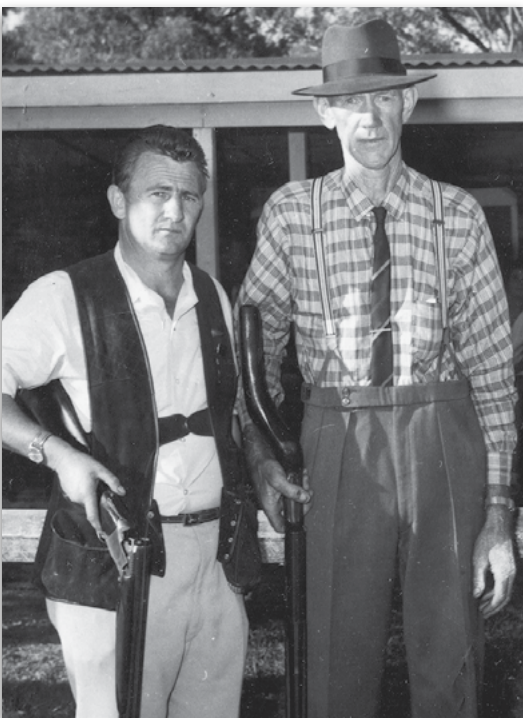
gunpowder. Permission had to be gained from the authorities to use gunpowder for any purpose other than the war effort, such as for splitting fence posts, but it is believed that on many occasions powder ended up in shotgun shells used at the club.

After the war, attendances increased and some of the top shooters competing at Wangaratta in the late 1940s and early 1950s are names still familiar to modern day Wangaratta; Gordon Twamley, Ed Tippet, Claude Fell, Les Goodwin, Roy Grossman, Barnie Nedway, Charlie Priesley. George Walker was a notable

shooter at the time and would become a stalwart of the club.

George won the Commonwealth mixed bird championship at Tottenham in 1949. In 1950, he won the Victorian Galah Championship in Bendigo and two weeks later won the Loddon Valley mixed big bird championship at Myer Flat without using a second barrel. Other shooters attending this shoot could not recall a championship being won using only the first barrel. It is reputed George also broke the bookies that day. George Walker had the first under and over gun in the area. It was a Marlin bought in 1939 for £22. His first Browning automatic was purchased in 1926 for £10 Pounds, which was a lot of money back then.

Life member Ian Reith, who sadly passed away this year, joined the club in 1947. It was George Walker that got him started in competitive shooting when he paid Ian a box of cartridges in return for marking some lambs. Ian recalls the club having only one shooting ground and very rudimentary facilities at the time. He saw George Walker shoot on many occasions and recalls bookies taking huge bets on George

and the presence of a policeman to supervise the betting.

During the 1950s, the club had some of the country's top shooters compete at their events: Roy Grossman, Victorian State team member in 1954; Claude Dean, National Clay Target Single Barrel Champion in 1958; Alex Jamieson from Corowa, who was one of only ten shooters in the Commonwealth who shot off the 26 yard mark. In 1953, lights were installed to allow for night shooting. The lights were declared connected by the Honourable Keith Bradbury MLC, and were officially switched on for the first time by Mrs J.E. Walker, wife of then President George Walker. Live bird shoots were banned in the mid 50s and betting stopped around the same time.

The late Ian Reith, over 90 years of age, was a regular face at the club. Ian was a member of the club's team that won the Hudson Shield at Narrandera in the late 1950s (1957?). As the winning club, Wangaratta was to host the same event the following year, so major upgrades were undertaken and a second shooting ground was constructed.

During the 1960s and early 1970s, improvements were made to the club, fences erected, tracks paved, trees planted trees and an access road built. The club gained a reputation as one of the best country clubs in the state. In 1967 club member Vic Bussell competed in a Double Barrel Championship at Euroa, where he shot 349, to

run second to Alf James. The shoot off took three and a half hours. 1966 saw the commencement of a regular junior competition, and the club successfully hosted a number of Winchester and IMI School Boy Carnivals during the 1970s. The club was a strong supporter of skeet shooting and hosted the first Victorian State Carnival in 1977. In 1978 Bill Attwood and club member Kevin Law donated an impressive silver cup to promote skeet shooting and the Attwood-Law Skeet Cup continues

to this day.

In 1980, the club moved into a new club house, with a fully equipped kitchen. Prior to that, the club had operated out of what was known as The Old Tin Shed with somewhat primitive amenities and the constant threat of infiltration by marauding chickens in search of scraps.

In 1986 a grant was secured from the Wangaratta Shire Council, so the club was able to purchase the land which it had been renting for over 50 years, thus providing some security for the future of clay target shooting at North Wangaratta. In 1987, the club changed its name to the Wangaratta Clay Target Club.

In the 1990s, the club continued to develop its facilities, with the installation of underground electrical supplies and the building of the metal boundary fence behind the clubrooms and the carpark. The trap equipment was upgraded, too, with the purchase of three new DTL traps and two skeet traps. The 1990s

also saw the club further consolidate its future by acquiring the land north of the shooting grounds, known at the time as Morrison's paddock.

The new millennium saw Sporting Clays gain popularity and the club started hosting monthly competitions for that discipline, as well as the usual Down the Line.

In May of 2016, the club was temporarily closed, due to a lead contamination investigation by the EPA. It was a year before shooting recommenced under strict guidelines imposed by the EPA. Throughout the closure, the club's committee worked tirelessly to overcome regulatory obstacles. Current vice president Brian Reid was instrumental in the successful outcome and the club's continuation. His tenacious pursuit of the outcome and his diplomatic approach to the authorities saved the club from possible permanent closure.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM NSWCTA 2020 CANCELLATIONS

The NSWCTA Executive regretfully advise that both the NSW State DTL and the NSW State Skeet Championships scheduled for later in the year have been cancelled.

individual and made to the specifications of the purchaser. No two guns are the same but some components can still be interchanged. There are no off the rack guns available. You order what you want: barrel length, barrel weights, finish, trigger types, wood quality, shape of stock or forend, etc.

One of the other aspects of precision when it comes to shotguns is interchangeable chokes. Chokes and barrels have to be so precise that it is possible to change the tubes without compromising the performance of the gun and still manage to allow for the change in the pattern density the tubes are designed to achieve. It is interesting to note that the UK choke company, Teague Precision Chokes, market their products using 'precision' in their name. Nigel Teague, who worked as a quality control engineer for Rolls-Royce would be no stranger to precision and quality workmanship.

well. Having some idea of what goes on behind the scene in making our guns will engender pride of ownership and foster brand loyalty.

This book is well worth reading. If you are interested in history or engineering or the history of engineering, or you just have an interest in how things came about, this book will satisfy. And, during the lockdown having a good book to read is essential.

Since receiving the book, Ramsay sent me text with a photo of himself in the winners sash for the skeet doubles at the Northern Territory Championships. A great achievement.

That's all folks! See you round the traps.

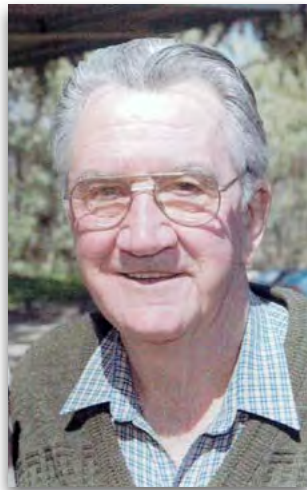

Ian Reith

Ian Reith, a much loved and valued Life Member of the Wangaratta Clay Target Club, passed away on the 3rd of June 2020 at the age of 91.

Frank Mann's poem 'The Farmer's Creed' was read at Mr Reith's funeral service and summed up nicely the integrity and pragmatic nature of this man.



Ian was awarded Life Membership of the Wangaratta Clay Target Club in 1989 in recognition of his immense input since joining in 1948. In 1997, a trap shooting event was conducted to commemorate Ian's 50 years as a registered ACTA and club member. An unbroken membership record of 72 years and continued involvement with the club up until the time of his passing is a remarkable effort in itself.

Ian was an active and valued committee member

for many years and dedicated an enormous amount of time working to improve the club. His 'can do' attitude and skilful mechanical knowledge proved invaluable on the occasions of equipment failure.

During the sixties and early seventies, many improvements to the club's facilities, such as erecting fences, concreting, installing lighting and planting trees, were made by a group of dedicated club members and Ian Reith was heavily involved in these works. Ian was the main driver when arranging working bees and his efforts helped the club gain a reputation for being one of the best country clubs, often attracting over 100 participants to competitions.

Ian had the ability to entertain with his stockpile of hundreds of stories, many humorous, about his long history of shooting and fishing expeditions. Ian and his closest friends, Trevor Hargreaves, Jim Kelly, Graham Reid, Neil Haydon, Kevin Law and Marge Pettit were known around the club as the 'Wilby Gang'. When the 'Wilby Gang' turned up to a social event it was set to be a great day.

The Wangaratta Clay Target Club thanks Mr Ian Reith for his enormous, unselfish efforts and lengthy service in advancing the sport of clay target shooting and supporting the club he felt so dearly about.

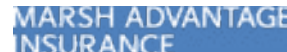

The ute is then driven around the front of the clubhouse and the ransom demanded for his release. Surely the "perfect plan"??

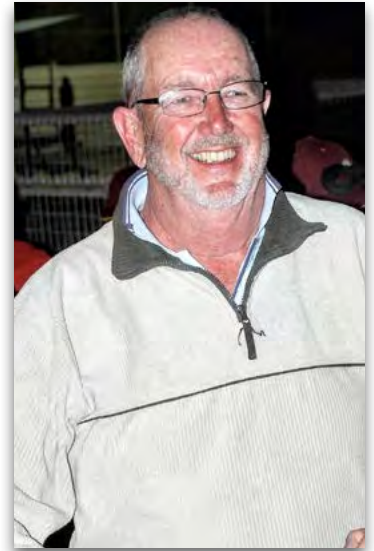

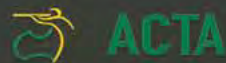
