ACTA REPORT

Mal Dyson – President Paul Gilbert – CEO



Well, it's now November, and finally Melbournians appear to have come out of lock-down! The rest of the

Nation can only imagine how difficult this last 6 months must have been for you, and we are extremely pleased to see that things may be returning to "normal" for you all at last.

Many things have been happening with the ACTA recently, so let's give you a brief update of these news items:

ICTSF DTL World Championships

The 2021 ICTSF World DTL Championships, (which were rescheduled from July 2020 to be held at the Bywell shooting grounds in England in July 2021), have again been postponed. The ICTSF member countries will meet in 2021 to consider the reprogramming of the event in 2022. The decision to postpone has been made due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, individual country travel restrictions and the wellbeing of our competitors.

2021 ACTA National Trap Championships

After much deliberation, the Executive Committee has agreed that the 2021 Trap Nationals will be conducted in a condensed format. This means that the approved program is as follows: (open State borders pending).

- Saturday 20 March: Pre-Nationals (50 tgt P/S, 50 tgt H/Cap)*
- Sunday 21 March am: Pre-Nationals 25 pair Double Rise*
- Sunday 21 March pm: National Douville Doubles and Family Douville Doubles.*
- Sunday 21 March 7.00pm: ACTA AGM*
- Monday 22 March am: State Teams event, Official Opening Ceremony*
- Monday 22 March pm: 75 tgt National Champion of Champions*
- Tuesday 23 March: 50 tgt National Double Barrel*
- Wednesday 24 March: 50 tgt National Single Barrel, 50 tgt National Points Score*
- Thursday 25 March: 50 tgt National Handicap, 25 pair National Double Rise*
- Friday 26 March: Team shoot off and Macintosh event*

There are a number of significant reasons why this decision has been made. Firstly, it is understood that the Covid-19 virus has had a considerable impact on all communities, (ours included), which will have compromised people's financial capacity. Reducing the duration of the event will decrease out-of-pocket costs by a few days and lessen impact on employment commitments outside the program week, allowing participants to be back at work in time for the following Monday. We also appreciate that some of you that are employees may have less recreation leave available to you than normal due to employers having placed rec leave requirements on employees during the early part of the pandemic. This makes a compressed one-week carnival more user-friendly to you. Knowing only too well that people come to Nationals to shoot at Nationals, we have programmed 2 x 50 target events on most days, therefore providing 100 targets per day. Consequently, while reducing the targets thrown per event but keeping the event tally up, we can also reduce the cost of event nominations / participation. Please be mindful that, as we are keeping prices down, cash prize pools may be significantly impacted. The DTL Sub-Committee will meet soon to determine what capacity we can or cannot deliver in this regard. The most important thing, however, will be delivering a professionally run and enjoyable event for you to attend. We will report further on this issue in coming editions.

We also intend to return to the full 7-day program in 2022 when all the difficulties around Covid-19 are hopefully behind us and a distant memory. In the interim, we thank you for your kind acceptance and understanding in this regard.

Constitution Sub-Committee Report

The Constitution Sub-Committee has been having frequent meetings to move this item towards completion. It was reported that the revisions to the Governance and Election Procedure appear to have been accepted and will now be incorporated into the 2017 draft document; other parts of that previous draft remaining substantially the same. Landers and Rogers, as the authors of the 2017 draft, will complete this process for us. Once returned to the Constitution Sub-Committee and confirmed as correct, the final draft will be circulated to the Executive Committee. Following their approval, the document will be circulated to all ACTA clubs and States via email and published for members in the next ACTA e-News. The timeline for completion of all components of this process and notification of this Special Business is 27 December 2020 (a full 12 weeks prior to the 2021 AGM).

Automated Shoot and Grading / Handicapping program

This is just a quick note to watch this space. The Executive Committee is close to making an announcement on this issue which will finally provide clubs with a 21st century electronic shoot program, grading and handicapping system.

Noticed on the Shooting Australia website where Shooting Australia CEO Luke van Kempen reported a grant of \$287,000 over two years for Performance Pathways Solutions.

This grant is an outcome of a significant piece of work undertaken by Shooting Australia's High-Performance Unit and will be used to identify and develop future Australian representative athletes in both Trap and Skeet.

The grant is separate and in addition to Shooting Australia's existing high-performance funding from the AIS which supports the continuing development and performances of current Australian and Olympic representative athletes across pistol, rifle and shotgun disciplines.

CEO Luke van Kempen said the Performance Pathways Solutions Grant funding is recognition of the outstanding international results achieved within the shotgun disciplines in recent years.

He also added that Australia has a proud record in shotgun events, particularly international men's and women's trap and this grant will assist Shooting Australia to identify and engage our future Olympic and World Championship athletes.

It's also important recognition of the work achieved to date by the Shotgun National Program led by National Coach Richard Sammon.

I am sure we all look forward to the roll out of this exciting program.

LAKE ALBERT'S 42nd ANNIVERSARY

Well, another year has come and gone since we've written another couple of pages, and once again on the long weekend of October 3rd & 4th, the Lake Albert Gun Club on the Coorong at Meningie in South Australia hosted another quieter but successful Anniversary shoot.

This is obviously a year that everyone would prefer to forget, and should be cancelled due to a lack of interest. 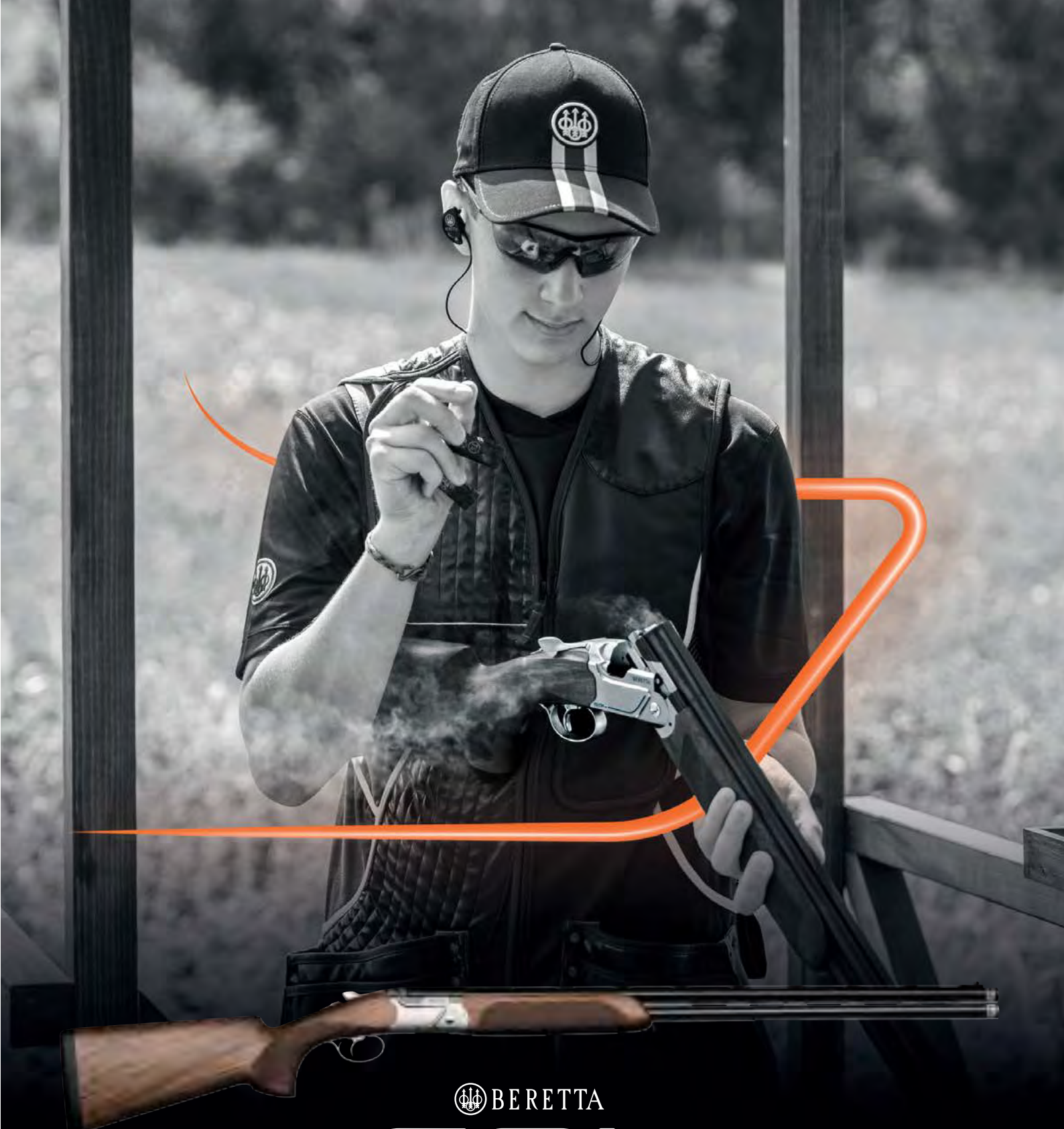

President Mal Collins thanked our valued sponsors for their continued support, the club's



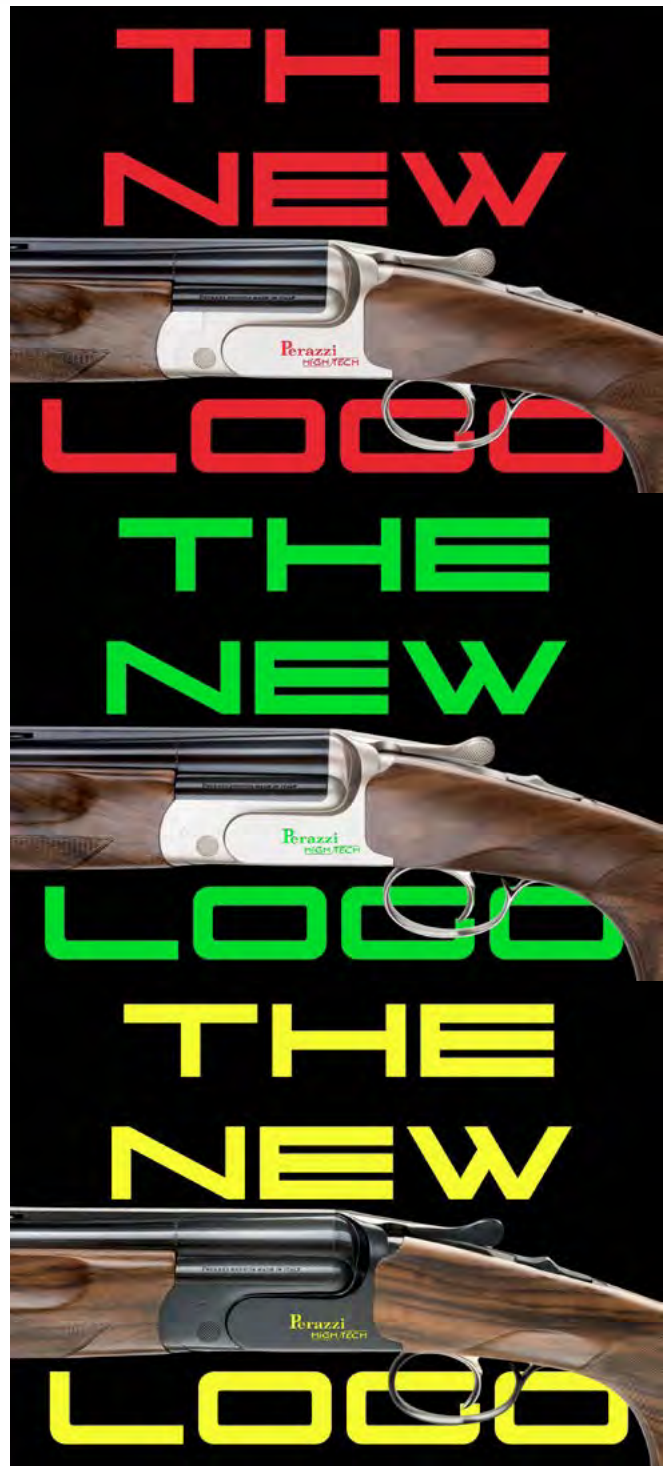

What's happening in the VCTA

As I begin to write this report the whole of Victoria waits with 'bated breath' to see whether Premier Andrews makes the much anticipated call to open the 'Ring of Steel' currently around Melbourne and allow interaction between Metropolitan and Regional Victoria.

While both Regional and Metro have been able to recommence a strictly regulated regime of competition activities, Regional hasn't been able to shoot at Metro and visa versa. Hopefully, by the time this goes to print the decision will have been made in a positive light and things will be almost back to normal again!

One of the biggest disappointments of the COVID-19 restrictions has been the need to cancel the State Carnival. In recent years, the Carnival event has gone from strength to strength and continued to attract record numbers of competitors to the State Grounds at the Echuca Clay Target Club. Even with the relaxing of restrictions we would not have been able to hold the event with any certainty as there are still restrictions on numbers of competitors, social distancing and hygiene requirements that would have made hosting the event an enormous challenge. Don't forget that a letter of support is required from VCTA for your project and needs to be attached to your application. Good luck to all those clubs that take the time and effort to submit a proposal – it will be worth it in the long run.

Coming from Regional Victoria, I have been able to take advantage of the relative 'freedom' granted to country members, to travel to a couple of clubs on the 'other' side of Melbourne from me and sample their hospitality. Over the Melbourne Cup long weekend, I was fortunate enough to travel to the Walmer Gun Club and the Castlemaine Clay Target Club and participate in their monthly shoots.

Not only was I well received by the clubs and their members, but the hospitality and competition

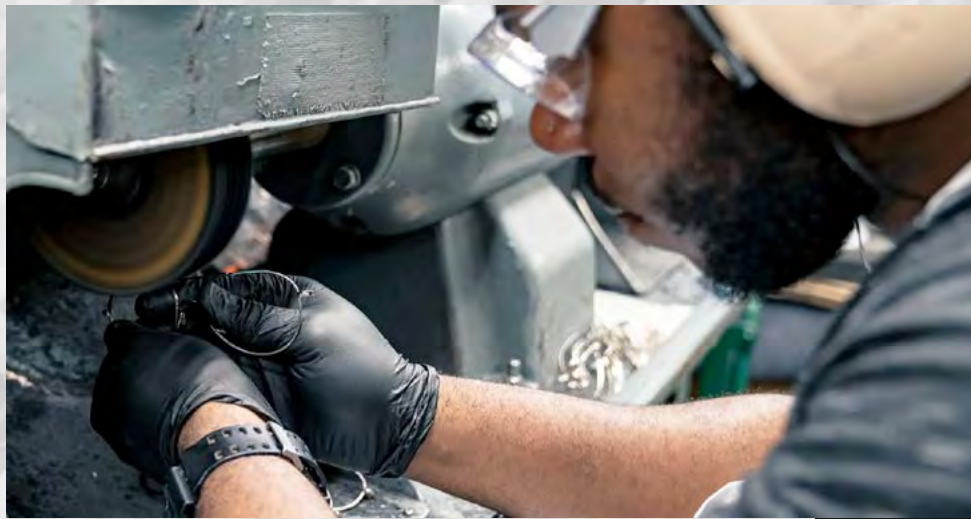

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

Stress and Resilience Revisited

I have often mentioned in the articles the fact that we still deal with stress the way our primitive ancestors did; we either fight, freeze or take flight. So when we are anxious a primitive part of our brain takes over and we become fearful and the end result for sportspeople is that we choke: we tense up, our muscles cannot move the way we want them to, we stop focusing on the here and now and our breathing becomes fast and irregular. It's at this point that we usually miss and quite possibly miss again.

As a psychologist, this understanding of stress is bread and butter stuff. This is what we try to teach our clients and what we want people to understand; because, if they can understand it, then they can control some of their reactions to these stressors. This year we have all been through a lot; the drought, then the fires throughout every state of the country, then COVID-19. The health concerns of the pandemic are significant. It is silent, invisible and very easily to catch. It can be mild and asymptomatic or it can be debilitating or fatal. It has caused people to lose their jobs, livelihoods, businesses and assets. Communities have been locked down and families have been separated. It has been impossible for some to be with dying loved ones or been at significant life events such as births and special days. Year 12 students have been disrupted and rites of passage events such as exams and formals have been changed dramatically. Our sports, football, racing and shooting have been disrupted or have ceased altogether.

2019 and 2020 have been years of incredible stress and hardship but stressors, or the things that cause stress come in all shapes and sizes and we shouldn't just think that it's only the big serious things that cause us to be stressed. Work, finance, relationships, health, etc, are all likely to be stressful at some time or another. But it's the accumulation of small things that can sneak

up on us and get us when we least expect it.

To deal with stress effectively we need to have several factors working in our favour. We need to have adequate support from those around us. Whether it is family, workmates or shooting or golf mates, we need to be accepted and have a sense of belonging to a group so we don't feel alone and overwhelmed. Secondly, we need to have realistic and achievable goals. If we are striving for the unattainable then we can often feel we are a failure because we cannot achieve those things we are striving for. Coupled with realistic goals we need to be confident in our abilities and competent in our actions. Next, stress can be limiting if our perception is that the world is against us and we see every change as a threat instead of an opportunity. These factors help us become resilient. Resilience is the ability to bounce back after we have suffered a set back. For shooters it is how we regain our self-control after we have missed a target or lost a championship. There has been lots of research that has looked at resilience in the workplace and the research is showing that resilient workers will be less stressed, have fewer problems with bullying and harassment, fewer days absent and be less prone to depression. Being connected with an organisation, being competent in your abilities, having the confidence to achieve and having a sense of community all lead to resilience which in turn leads to us being mentally healthy. Resilience is not new; those human's who survive have the ability to look at what has happened to them and deal with the problem and move on. Ric Charlesworth, former Olympian and Coach of the Australian Women's Hockey team has written another book called "Shakespeare the Coach" where he examines the writing of William Shakespeare and relates it to modern day organisational and sport psychology. In Henry VI, part III Shakespeare wrote

*"... wise men ne'er sit and wail their loss,
But cheerly seek how to redress their harms"*

So the next time things don't go your way, don't sit and cry but happily look at ways that you can fix the problem.

So what can we do to deal with the stressors in our life? Well if you're reading then you probably shoot and sport is a great way to unwind. Even the pressure of a competition can still be a good form of stress management. Relaxation, exercise, laughing and doing something different can all be effective stress relievers.

Remember, stress doesn't always have to be negative. It can provide useful motivation for us to perform our best when we complete tasks or events. It is only a problem if we don't learn how to bounce back when things do not go our preferred way. We cannot always do what we want; there are often constraints that get in our way; family, health, money, work, etc but we can make sure that we don't overdo it and if going to a shoot will make life more enjoyable then we shouldn't be too critical of our decision to go.

As this article will be published in the December

issue, I would like to wish all readers Seasons Greetings. It is likely that next year will be COVID normal and not as normal as we would like it. From time to time this will cause stress and anxiety as we will be on guard to help limit the spread of any outbreaks. During 2020 we were able to get through the worst of the pandemic. Those shooters from Victoria need to be given extra congratulations for the hard work they did and the sacrifices they made in limiting the second wave.

chose Warwick in which to bring up their family and run a business. After a period with a news agency, they took over Warwick Outdoors and Sports and set about applying their entrepreneurial flair. It became one of the finest, most highly regarded firearm and sporting goods shops in the country and combined with his shooting prowess, made Greg a household name among generations of shooting enthusiasts.

Greg was fortunate that his business, his passion for sport generally, and the shooting sports in particular, were intertwined. But this also added to the workload. Warwick Outdoors and Sports was a 7-days-a-week operation, trading in-store 6 days, and then bundling up the mobile store to attend a competition clay target shoot somewhere in Queensland or northern New South Wales on the Sunday. This hectic business life and the demands of a growing family didn't slow Greg down. He volunteered an enormous amount of



time to community leadership. Some weeks, every night would be taken up with meetings.

Among his achievements, Greg was President of the Warwick Chamber of Commerce, the inaugural Chair of Warwick TAFE and a driving force behind it, Chair of the Warwick Tourism and Events Board, Chair of the Warwick Fire Brigade Board, a Paul Harris Fellow and President of Rotary, Treasurer of the Warwick RSL, and the role in which I knew him best, President of the Warwick Gun Club for more than 20 years.

In addition to all this, he competed in national and international clay target shooting at the highest level, winning a World Cup Gold Medal in Lonato Italy in 1992 and narrowly missing selection by one place in the Barcelona Olympic Games team.

He was also passionate about fine motor cars and in his later years, found more time to devote to his collection of classic cars and share some precious time pursuing this interest with Beth and his brother Jeff.

Greg's love of the shooting sports and fine cars were in many ways connected. Those who dedicate their spare time to both do so because of the

history, tradition, and etiquette that accompany both pastimes, in addition to the love of fine machinery and craftsmanship.

Fine sporting guns and indeed classic cars represent a way of life and a discipline. The real enjoyment came from sharing this passion with likeminded friends.

Greg did much to teach the next generations about these things. He established clay target shooting as a sport at Nudgee College in Brisbane, and coached Scots College students in Warwick. Greg would teach countless young people the right way of enjoying sporting firearms and the importance of adhering to the etiquette established centuries ago.

Since that fateful day in September, Greg has been honored by gun clubs across the nation.

We have lost a champion of family, community, sport and above all, a champion of honesty and decency. As we farewell Greg, we also pay tribute to his wife Beth as she battles on courageously to recover from her injuries.

New Layouts Opened at Townsville

After much anticipation the Townsville Gun Club opened its new Trench layouts, hosting the Northern Zone ISSF Carnival over the weekend of the 17th and 18th of October 2020.

After servicing the region for in excess of 40 years, Townsville's Trench layout was in need of a major upgrade. A grant application was submitted through the Queensland Government's Sports and Recreation "Get Playing Spaces and Places" Funding Program and after a visit from Sports and Recreation representatives in 2017, \$150,000 in funding was awarded towards the project which included the reconstruction of the existing trench layout and the installation of an additional layout. The Queensland Clay Target Association has also provided a Venue Support Loan to help finance the project.

Construction started in May 2018 after the State DTL Carnival. During construction the club managed to limit disruption to the shooting calendar, hosting the State Skeet and Sporting Carnivals and annual shoots during this period. After careful consideration Promatic traps were selected for installation in the new layouts, with Promatic sending their trap mechanic, Kevin Newton, over on a "working holiday" to help us get our first new layout set up. Kevin travelled all over North Queensland during his time in Australia, with his boss suggesting he "slip down to Melbourne for the day" on his way back from Cloncurry (which would have added 4200kms to the return trip). After a few minor setbacks the club opened their first layout at the start of 2019, however the excitement was short lived. Two days after the new layout was finished Townsville was hit with a "once in a lifetime" wet weather event, flooding the first new layout destroying a set of 15 traps and support equipment. Fortunately, the traps were covered by insurance, and with some disaster funding assistance provided by the Queensland Government, remedial works were completed to restore the first layout. The newly reconstructed layout played host to a coaching clinic in December 2019 for members of the Australian Olympic Team. Construction of the second new

layout was completed in early 2020, with fit out being completed mid-2020.

The new trench layouts are both fully wheelchair accessible and can hold Olympic Trap, Universal Trench and Double Trap events. The Townsville club now boast 10 DTL layouts, 6 Skeet layouts, 1 ISSF Skeet layout, 2 ISSF Trap layouts, 2 x 5 Stand layouts and one Tower.

Due to current restrictions the club was unable to host a "Grand Opening", however a semi-formal opening was held prior to the commencement of the Zone ISSF Carnival.

48 Competitors travelled to Townsville to take part in the Northern Zone ISSF Carnival over the weekend of the 17th and 18th of October 2020, with 40 shooters taking part in the ISSF Trap and 8 shooters competing in the ISSF Skeet event. Saturday's events commenced after the opening at 11:30am. After 3 Rounds of Trench and 4 Rounds of ISSF Skeet the day concluded with a Zone meeting, steak burgers for tea and footy on the big screen.

The traps were reset for Sunday, with the competition recommencing at 8:30am. At the completion of the qualifying events the scores were tallied and the finals contested. The Overall Northern Zone ISSF Trap Champion for 2020 is

Antony Ballarino (Port Denison) with a 109/125 + 17/25. Antony also managed to christen our new layout posting a 25/25 in his first round on Saturday. The Overall Zone ISSF Skeet Champion for 2020 was Cody Chapman (Townsville) with a score of 80/125 + 34/60.

In the ISSF Trap Wayne Reeves (Normanton) won A grade with 101/125, with Townsville President Wayne Benson taking out B Grade with 90/125. Will Bosworth (Herbert River) won his last C Grade Prize, shooting 96/125 putting him in B Grade for his next competition. The section medal winners were: Junior Cody Scalia 80/125 (Burdekin), Ladies Diane Reeves 90/125 (Normanton) and Veterans Doug Killick 82/125 (Charters Towers). In the ISSF Skeet Cherie Reeves (Normanton) took out A Grade with 83/125. Phillip Craig (Cooma) won the C Grade prize with 69/125 and Glen Farmer (Townsville) took home the Veterans medal with 62/125.

After the ISSF presentations the Townsville club put on a 50 Target Universal Trench Cash Divide event. After a quick run through of the rules, the traps were reset and competition was underway. As no one had shot UT before, all shooters were provisionally graded on the 50 targets. B and C Grades were combined, with Ben Beazley (Townsville) taking out first with 41/50. Second was won by Wayne Reeves 39/50, with third split between Wayne Read, Riley Mikkelsen (Townsville) and Joe Scalia (Burdekin) on 35/50.

Thanks must go to the Townsville club for hosting a successful carnival, the workers in the kitchen, bar, office, and members around the club in the lead up and during the event and to the travelling shooters for their support.

The Townsville club would like to thank everyone involved with the trench project. Thanks to those who wrote letters of support: Townsville Mayor Cr Jenny Hill; Burdekin MP Mr Dale Last; Diane and the Northern Zone QCTA, our neighboring clubs and the Queensland Clay Target Association. Thanks must also go to those who contributed to the construction of the Trench bunkers: Joe, Sarah and the boys (S&J Constructions), Glenn Reeves (Glenn Reeves Electrical), ASAP Scaffolding, Josh West (W&F Constructions), Jim and Joe Davis (CJD Earthmoving), Steve Ryder (Rydweld) and the members who were out at the club and were heavily involved throughout the project; Brendon, Pio, Beno (the old man), Jeff, Barry, Glenn, Richard, Henry & Wayne. Thanks goes to David McMahon (Sports Grants QLD) and Brendon Bullick for their time spent on the grant application and the acquittal. Thanks must also go to the Queensland Government–Sports and Recreation for their financial support and in particular Jim and Susann from Sports and Rec for their support and assistance.

The club hopes everyone enjoyed the weekend and we hope to see everyone in Normanton for the Zone ISSF Carnival in 2021.

BEGA BACK IN ACTION

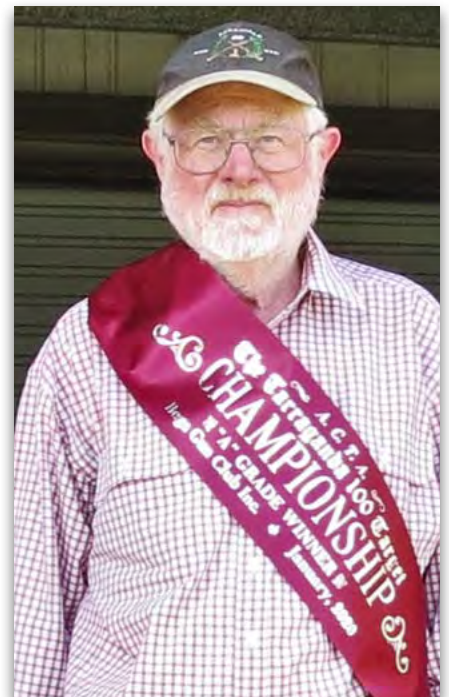

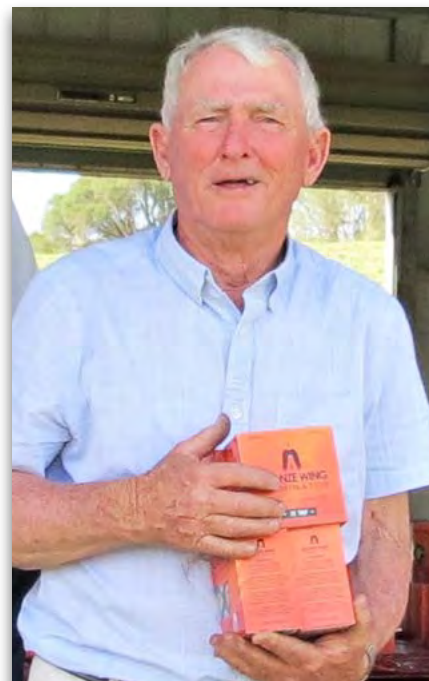
