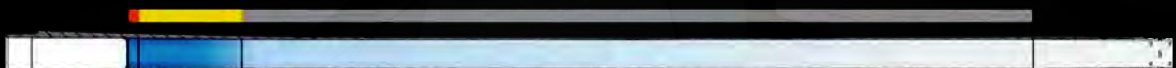

ACTA REPORT

Mal Dyson – President Paul Gilbert – CEO



Unfortunately, the Covid-19 situation is still impacting us as we navigate our way through 2021. In the last 2 weeks alone, first Perth, then Melbourne, and now Wollongong have responded to “potential leaks” of the new UK strain of the virus from hotel quarantine back into the community, resulting in various levels of new lock-downs, border closures and quarantining requirements. It was precisely for this reason that the ACTA Executive Committee postponed the March 2021 Trap Nationals at their meeting in the middle of January. As we all know, it just takes one cluster outbreak in a suburb or hub to set the process back into overdrive. We are currently proposing the rescheduling of this event to October when, hopefully, most, (if not all), of our more senior members will have been vaccinated and the environment will be more healthy and satisfactory for a conduct of a National event.

2021 Memberships

We are pleased to report that 2021 ACTA memberships are currently at around the same level as the same time back in 2020, which is fantastic news to report! This means that most of you are still excitedly participating in and enjoying your sport and that most of our clubs are still viable and, hopefully, in a state of reasonable health. To those of you who are still to rejoin this year, please be mindful that you need to be a financial member prior to competing in Club, Zone, State or National competition or to be a recreational member in order to shoot club practice / targets only. This is because clubs need your membership contribution in order to provide you with their facilities and services, (all of which cost money), and our ACTA insurance runs on an annual cycle which lapses at midnight on 31 December each year, which is also, incidentally

the date 2020 members became unfinancial. As insurance only covers current, (i.e.: 2021 re-joined) members, in the event of an accident, we wouldn't want for you, the people around you or the club, to be held accountable in the event that any claim was voided due to the person causing the accident being unfinancial. Even worse, if the person next to you on a layout or at your club facility was unfinancial and they caused any injury to you, this would automatically result in no Association Insurance (liability) being available to cover your claim. That said, please don't show up at the club with the expectation that they will “turn a blind eye” to your unfinancial membership status and “just let you shoot this time” . . . to put it bluntly, it's not fair to the club or your fellow members and no favouritism to anyone should be requested or expected. Also, please don't mistake the 1 January to 28 February time frame to be a “grace period”. On 1 January you are unfinancial and on 1 March your membership becomes “lapsed”.

2020 Financial Report

We are pleased to report that the ACTA had a most unexpected but favourable financial result in 2020. This was despite the fact that we couldn't run our Trap, Skeet or Sporting Clays Nationals, (which are always budgeted to be cost-recovery anyway), and the Function Centre being closed for 9 months courtesy of Covid-19. Due to these financial circumstances, we were able to apply and qualify for the Federal Government's Stimulus, Boost and Jobkeeper support packages which, along with a strong focus on keeping spending to an absolute minimum and not replacing lost staff, surprisingly kept us in the black for the year. Let's just hope that 2021 allows us to rebuild clientele at The Range and provides

some national events so we can better perform our core duties and return to a state of relative normalcy as the year progresses.

My Clubs My Scores

With over 70% of our clubs now using or in the process of setting up the MCMS Shoot Program, it's interesting to hear the feedback from clubs who have now started using the program. Here are some of the comments:

- We've had major increases in office efficiency
- The program is very quick and simple to use
- You do not need the latest in computer technology to be able to run the program, and as promised, we didn't need internet access during our event to run our shoot
- It's user friendly and a huge asset to our club

Going forward, we need all of our clubs to get behind the implementation and use of the MCMS Program, as the automated grading / handicapping algorithm is now in beta testing phase and close to running in parallel with the

current handicap books. In order to best check the accuracy and efficiency of the system, over the coming months we need all clubs using the program so every member's actual shoot data can be compared. As previously mentioned, the program is free to your club and you only need to acquire the hardware to run the program.

In closing, that's about all there is to report this month. Obviously a quieter one that we anticipate will, no doubt, be unlike others in the months to come! As always, enjoy your shooting and keep safe and well.

This year the event was conducted over three full days, but with a shortened program largely because of COVID. There were five separate State titles contested as well as respective Open, Ladies, Veterans and Junior State Team selections. Participant numbers were slightly down on last year, which was to be expected; however, 140 plus competitors took part in the event over the 3 days. The Carnival was opened by the Hon. Tania Rattray – the Legislative Council Member for McIntyre.

Strong competition for the first event, the 50 target State Double Rise Championship,

commenced early with several 49/50s. After a shoot off, the overall winner was Mersey Clay Target Club's Tim Atkins with 79/80. Michael Stacey with 78/80 from the West Coast Clay Target Club won A Grade whilst Michael Kelly with 46/50 from Mersey Clay Target Club won B Grade. Lewis Kenny from the Hobart Clay Target Club won both C Grade and the Junior's category with an exceptional score of 45/50. Ladies was won by Amy Smith with 44/50 from NSW and Roger Duthie from Victoria, with 46/50, won the Veteran's section.

The second event of the day was the 50 target State Handicap event. After a solid shoot off there were nine possibles, with it getting down to Kent Marriott from Hobart Clay Target Club and Mitchel Hill from Tasmanian Gun Club who was the eventual winner with a score of 100/100 off 21 metres, 2nd Kent Marriott with 99/100

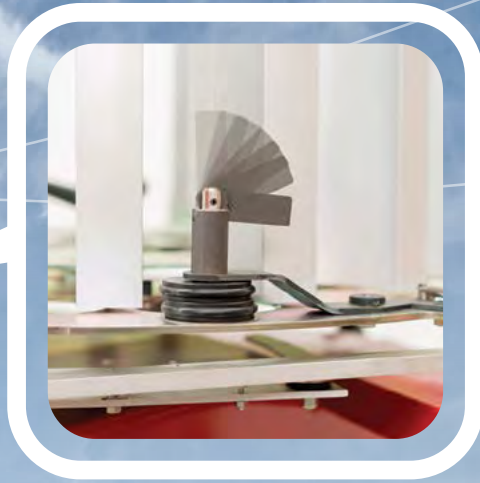

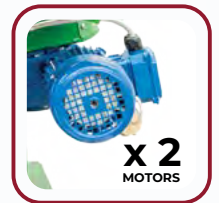

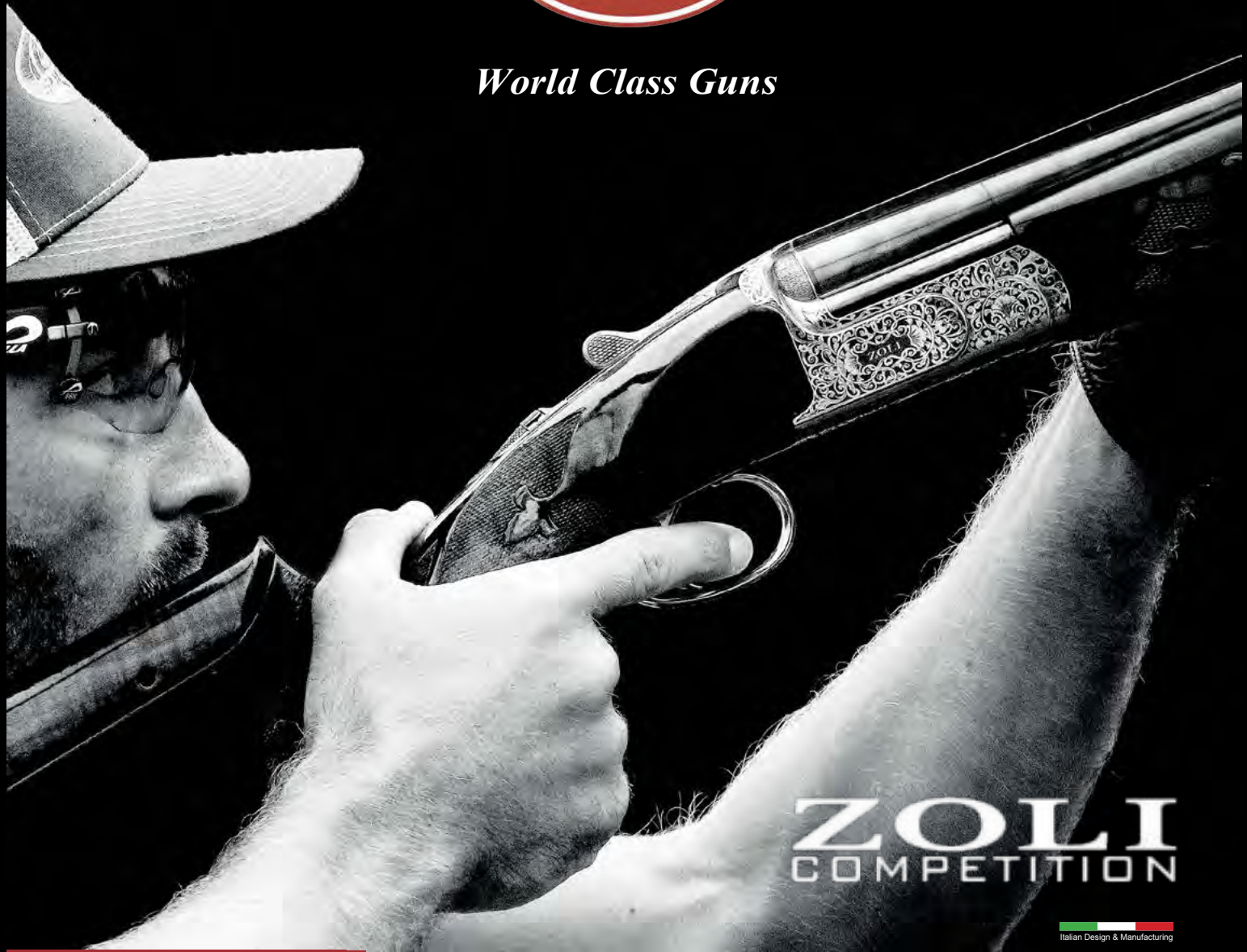

A word of advice from Queensland Coach, Bill McCarthy

COACHING . . . COME AND TRY . . . CASUAL . . . FORMAL

Although it is pleasing to see the dedication of all shooters in their efforts to assist newcomers and others, we believe it is time to both delineate and clarify our individual roles and on some occasions temper our enthusiasm.

In come and try situations we rely heavily on our rostered personnel who to date are doing a sometimes thankless job albeit they are doing it very well.

Basics are the go. Not too much information in one go. Straightaway targets please.

Casual: More confident and a little more experienced. These guys and gals usually try the full swinging targets, normally with a mate. Don't normally seek help and frustrate those of us who wish to help. Step back unless asked.

However if asked, stick to the basics. A couple of more lessons to Olympic standard. Just very basics. If you are NOT a coach (club or competition) don't be afraid to seek some help. Forget your ego. While you may identify that someone is lifting his or her head, a "fully trained coach knows most, if not all of the reasons, which may be contributing to that fault.

Fully Coached: Very tempting to go out and help. However, that shooter has his or her coach and has that shooter catalogued in their diary and is fully aware of the level of progress of that shooter. If asked, the shooter will or should inform you that they are on a coaching program. Their coach is also aware of those faults and is correcting them in accordance with the procedures he or she has learnt. NB: The coach has a diary of all matters necessary to bring that pupil to the desired level. Please understand it is discourteous to interfere despite your genuine desire to help.

Remember there is no ONE SILVER BULLET in coaching. There are many.

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Scaffolding

Back in 2013 at a coaching clinic in Mt Gambier, I was asked by a shooter what help can we provide the novice shooter. I wrote an article, called *Novice*, to look at ways to help new shooters with mental skills needed for shooting.

I revisited the article this week, I noticed that the introduction read;

On the face of it, this seemed a simple question, but on reflection several factors became apparent.

Firstly, shooting is a muscle memory sport. By that I mean it has to be done over and over again, thousands of times before it becomes automatic. That is, before we can even start to explore the psychological fundamentals involved we need to have the physical skills learned and developed.

Secondly, it is necessary to have a firm grasp of the technical skills involved. We need to know how to address the target, ie. where and how to stand, how to swing and follow through, what type of and amount of lead is required and how to be safe.

Thirdly, our gun must fit. Too often novice shooters fit themselves to the gun they have purchased rather than have the gun made to fit them.

This seems like common sense. But recently, I was at the gun club on a practice afternoon and was shooting a couple of rounds of skeet. A new shooter to the club came over, introduced himself and asked if he could shoot with us and said that he had only shot skeet once before, didn't really know what to do and could I help by giving some coaching.

"No problem."

We went out onto the field, gave some pointers on where to stand and where to hold the gun, making sure you followed through, and then got straight into shooting.

We demonstrated and asked the shooter to follow. The score was not good but the shooter did what we suggested and gave it a good effort.

On my drive home, 110 kilometres, I had time to

ponder what should have happened for the new shooter and what I would do differently next time. What the shooter needed was not coaching. He didn't have the requisite skills. He needed teaching and instructing on what was required to shoot skeet targets. I went back to *An Introduction to Clay Target Shooting with Hints for the Novice Shooter* by Newton Thomas, who stated "It is essential that the new shooter is trained in first principles."

Next time, if I get the chance, I will start by teaching new shooters where to stand and how to stand when addressing the targets. I will teach them to look at where the target goes, where to pick it up, where to hold the gun and where to pull the trigger. In shooting language: the pick up point, the hold point and the kill point.

After looking at several targets, I will then get him to shoot a couple of targets and then talk about being in front of the target and following through. I would avoid for the time being talking about sustained lead, measured lead, follow through, etc.

As a teacher, I am aware that people need to be taught the basics. Instruction may involve demonstration, breaking the task into component parts, giving them an opportunity to have a go and then the teacher getting feedback and the student giving feedback. This unfortunately didn't happen this time.

Coaching and training, involves improving and learning new skills. Training can be defined as the 'act, process or method of one that seeks to improve skill, knowledge or experience in a certain area'. In the past I have written about physical, technical, mental and competition skills as the requisite components of clay target shooting.

For the new and novice shooter, the technical skills of shooting need to be developed and learnt before any improvement can take place.

During the round of skeet the novice shooter was given some advice as well as encouragement. During this time we didn't ask for or expect feedback from the shooter. We assumed he understood what we were saying. While the non-verbal

cues such as a smile or nod can be taken as acceptance we really had no idea of whether or not what we were saying was understood and taken in by the shooter. It became apparent at the end of the round that the shooter was using 7.5 shells and using ½ and ¾ chokes. For the novice shooter skeet is hard enough, but to handicap yourself by using the incorrect chokes and too large shot, you are really setting yourself up to fail.

Scaffolding is the process of building up the skills and abilities based on understanding and mastering the requisite skills needed for the next stage of learning. An important part of the process is setting up the learner for success. This is what happens when you are teaching reading or maths, etc and it should be exactly the same when teaching shooting, golf, tennis, dancing or any other sport or physical activity.

Once the basic and foundations skills have been taught and more importantly mastered, then we can move on to high order technical skills, mental skills and even competition skills. When I was the mental skills coach for the Southern Sports Academy, I had the opportunity one weekend to travel to Sydney with the cycling squad to train at the Dunc Grey Velodrome. All these cyclists were proficient in road cycling but no one had ever been to a velodrome let alone ridden on one. When we entered the facility it became apparent how big and steep the track was. It was daunting, and I wasn't on a bike.

We allowed the cyclists to have several laps to get the feel of the track and the facility in general. The purpose was to train the squad in racing a "pursuit". We didn't just send them out. The NSW

Institute of Sport cycling team came onto the track and demonstrated as their coach gave a running commentary. We then ran a relaxation session with the squad and during the session did some visualisation of them riding on the track. After the relaxation, the squad watched the NSWIS team do another pursuit and then we put them onto the track, after talking them through what was expected. For these cyclists we scaffolded the activity and the component parts well. For the young novice shooter this week shooting his second round of skeet, I didn't.

So when we are teaching or coaching we need to look at the current skill level of the shooter: technical, mental and competition and work out via their goals where they want to improve or develop. The next step is to break the activity into the component tasks and teach them to master one after another until the "whole" is achieved. Once this training/coaching/teaching has occurred then the shooter needs to practice these skills so that they become second nature.

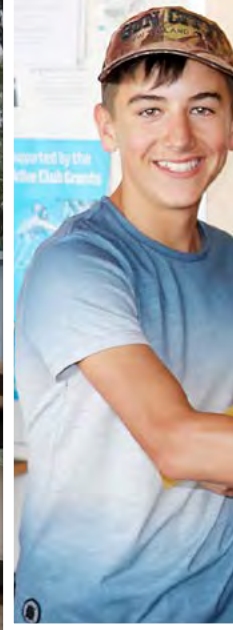

My Clubs My Scores

In November last year the ACTA announced that they had partnered with My Clubs My Scores (MCMS) to deliver a completely new and improved, automated, online handicapping and grading system for the ACTA.

To achieve this exciting project the following milestones have been put in place:

- **1st December 2020**
 - o all ACTA affiliated clubs to be given **immediate free access** to the core components of the MCMS shoot management system (if you do not yet have access please email MCMS at info@myclubsmyscores.com)
 - o whilst the MCMS system is web based it can run **completely offline** at the club and then synchronise scores to the cloud when reconnected to a home WiFi
- **1st January 2021**
 - o a working committee comprising the National Rules Supervisor, National Handicapper and Victorian Rules Supervisor formed to work with MCMS to review and document the new grading system algorithm (as agreed by the ACTA Executive in November 2020)
- **2nd quarter of 2021**
 - o MCMS to have delivered the handicapping and grading algorithm
 - o MCMS and the working committee to continuously review the outcomes with a view to fine tuning the algorithm parameters to ensure the calculated grade and handicap for a shooter is reflective of their ability to shoot (and not to manage their book!)
- **Mid 2021**
 - o MCMS and the working committee will present to both a full rules supervisors meeting and an ACTA executive meeting to confirm that outcomes are as expected and start planning for go-live
 - o The updated set of rules to support the new algorithm will be finalized and disseminated
 - o All scores for all shooters at all clubs from this time **must** be entered into the MCMS system
- **2nd Half of 2021**
 - o MCMS algorithm will run in the background with outcomes available for review by clubs and shooters
 - o Handicap books will continue to be updated and to be used as the shooter's official grade and handicap
 - o This period will be used to collect as much data as possible to ensure on go live the MCMS calculated grades are as reflective as possible of a shooter's ability
- **1 January 2022**
 - o The MCMS calculated grade and handicap will become all shooters official grade and handicap
 - o Handicap books will no longer be updated and new stickers and books will not be issued
 - o Shooters will be provided with an electronic membership card for use when nominating (an option for a permanent physical membership card will also be available for members who don't have a smart phone)

The following list shows all ACTA Clubs in Australia and denotes whether they were current users of MCMS as at January 1, 2021, designated under the status column "Existing", all Clubs that have applied for the program or have made contact to obtain the program as "New" and all other Clubs yet to be compliant with the ACTA request to trial and use MCMS. It was now mid-afternoon, and the weather was hot, everything was running well with Mark and Rick keeping up the clays to the layouts, so straight into event 3, the 50 target

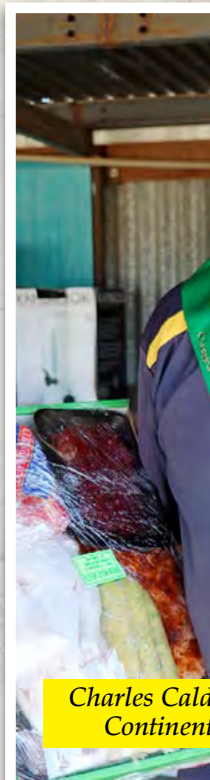
