ACTA REPORT

Mal Dyson – President Paul Gilbert – CEO



As we move towards the end of the first quarter of 2021, things gradually seem to be moving forward. While a number of members, in hindsight, have expressed dissatisfaction that we appear to have “prematurely” postponed the March Trap Nationals given Covid-19’s current “dormancy status”, we need to remind everyone that we are not mind readers and were required to act on the situation that was before us at the time, we had to make the hard decision . . . the UK strain had just landed in Australia and this was triggering State border closures when our pronouncement was made. That said, the latest news out of the Europe indicates that the new vaccines now appear to be taking a strangle hold on the virus, and with the majority of Australians being scheduled to be vaccinated by October this year, we now feel confident that the 2021 Trap Nationals, (also being scheduled for October), will be much more Covid-safe!

Nationals Dates

The most recent Executive Committee Meeting confirmed the dates for all ACTA National Events (Covid-19 pending). These will be:

- Skeet: 16 – 22 May (National Grounds Wagga Wagga)*
- AGM: 16 May (National Grounds Wagga Wagga)*
- Sporting Clays: 27 – 29 August (National Grounds Wagga Wagga)*
- Trap: 6 – 10 October (National Grounds Wagga Wagga)*
- ISSF: 17 – 23 October (Perth WA)*

As above, it is noted that the 2021 AGM will be held on the Sunday evening of the Skeet Nationals. This AGM includes two items of Special Business:

1 For The Australian Clay Target Association

Incorporated to transition from an Incorporated Association to a Company Limited by Guarantee, effective as at the close of business 2022 ACTA Annual General Meeting.

and

- 2 For the ACTA Membership to adopt the proposed Constitution of the “Australian Clay Target Association Limited” (Company Limited by Guarantee) to be enforceable as at the close of business of the 2022 Annual General Meeting.*

The Executive Committee is fully aware that the Skeet Nationals is a much smaller event than the Trap Nationals at which the AGM would normally be hosted, hence Club Delegate numbers will likely be significantly reduced at the Skeet event. As a consequence, the 2021 AGM will be performed with, both, physical and online attendees. All Clubs utilising online attendance are requested to provide their Delegate’s email address at least 7 days prior to the meeting so GoTo Meeting link invitations can be issued.

*Furthermore, (in order to allow the maximum opportunity for clubs to cast their votes), we have been advised by our solicitors that the vote on the above two motions will need to, either, occur through live vote at the AGM or via postal vote **prior** to the AGM; in the second scenario, the results being announced and ratified at that meeting. This being the case, and given that the 2020 Annual Report will be posted to all clubs at the start of April with the Notice of 2021 Annual General Meeting, we will now also include a postal voting form and reply-paid envelope. Return of ballots will close at COB on Wednesday 12 May 2021, four days prior to the AGM. We ask that all clubs that have ANY further questions regarding either of the above two Motions to please address these to me (ceo@claytarget.com.au) before the end of March*

so I can circulate these to the Constitution Sub-Committee and have them clarify any queries for you. Given the current situation, we feel that this is the fairest and most inclusive method by which we can deliver this process.

The Trap Nationals will now be held from Tuesday 5 to Sunday 10 October. While these dates do coincide with the SCA Nationals, the Shooting Calendar in October is already very full and it proved very difficult to find any other week where this event could be placed. This event will still be run on the shortened program that was proposed for March 2020/March 2021.

My Clubs My Scores

MCMS continues to be rolled out across Australia with almost three quarters of clubs now subscribed. One of the unanticipated benefits using MCMS is that it has proven to deliver ways in which this sport can improve its accountability and service to our shooting members. The way this happens is because it links competition activity, grading and handicapping of ACTA Members via their Member number. The converse of this is that, if an ACTA Member number is not attached to a shooter's nomination, it flags that the shooter is a non-member.

As we have stated many times over many years, the importance of the privilege for ACTA-only-members to participate at ACTA-Member-Only-Competitions is every bone-fide ACTA member's exclusive right, and we see this as paramount and nothing short of what you, as an ACTA Member, would expect us to demand. Just to reiterate, imagine a scenario where a club deliberately and knowingly allows a shooter that is not an ACTA member to participate in any ACTA-Member-Only-Competition alongside you, their ACTA members. In the event that the non-member causes an accident to occur and any member is forced to lodge a claim, access to ACTA Associations (liability) insurance will automatically be voided. It also goes without saying that members will, justifiably, take very unkindly and strongly to losing competition prizes to a club-admitted participant who is subsequently found to be a non-ACTA member, and therefore not entitled to compete for any prize purse. So, as we identify these indiscretions,

we make no secret of the fact that we will be communicating with clubs that are breaching their responsibilities to our members with a message that, while commencing with a gentle warning, will become more robust with successive infringements.

MCMS also reports that the grading/handicapping algorithm is progressing well and will be in beta mode shortly. While this is occurring, please be reminded that your handicap books are still the official method by which grades and handicaps are being applied in 2021, so bring these with you to your shoots and make sure your 2021 label is stuck to it. A small number of members are also apprehensive about the likely demise of shoot results books. Please be assured that the ACTA has ownership of the ACTA Member's shoot scores that are generated in MCMS. That aside, every result you record through the MCMS platform moving forward will be stored in your personal member's area and you will have ongoing access to this portal. This is another reason why full club uptake is vitally important, as any club that doesn't use the platform post-2021 will no longer be able to furnish their members or visitors with an official posting of their scores.

On a final, positive note, the ACTA appears to have seen a slight INCREASE in memberships across the last few months! This may be a timing issue as some members may have re-joined early in 2021 and 2020 saw a glitch in our ability to process partner memberships that created lag-time, but things currently look promising in this regard. We will advise again on this issue in the next couple of months.

2021 South Australian State Trap Carnival



Well, another year has come and gone. And Boy!! What a year we've seen!! Yes, almost 12 months to the day, we were all here at the South Australian Clay Target Association State DTL Carnival – just before the world changed forever. Although we managed to get through the Carnival last year before the mandated club closures, we might be in a slightly better position this year but certainly not in the clear yet. This year from Thursday February 3rd through to Sunday February 6th sees our 5th year that the Carnival is extended to be 4 days of competition, based on the success of the reintroduction of the State Champion of Champions.

By Wednesday afternoon, the grounds of the State Shooting Park are normally buzzing with activity as the usual caravanners and campers arrive. This year was a little more sedated as competitors assessed if they could get back home without having to isolate for 2 weeks should something go amiss over the next 4 days and borders close. Friends who hadn't seen each other for ages were seen all over the park having a good laugh, telling stories and catching up on the events that had transpired over the past 12 months. Our interstate visitors came in with their families for the event, and this certainly made for a large crowd of onlookers and a great ambience at the grounds considering the

tragic economic climate over the past year.

Even the office was a flurry of activity as we made sure everything was in readiness, especially the important stuff like all the lollies being in their respective bowls for the staff (very important)!! Hopefully everyone would have a great 4 days of competing without a worry in the world. The office was prepared for the rush of shooters at the ticket window and with 145 pre-nominations already in place, the job at hand for the office

staff was made so much easier. Thank you all for getting your nominations to us nice and early. And, with squadding on cue, right on 11am sharp, 102 competitors – 18 squads, exactly the same as last year, started to get called and filed out to the lanes to contest the first event which was the 75 target State Champion of Champions title off 18m. Lurking around every corner and walking amongst us you could see some of the best shooters in Australia waiting to pounce and claim one of the available Red State title sashes. Breezy conditions greeted the shooters with temperatures in the high 20's. Squads shot their whole 75 targets in 1 visit to the trap with just a reload in between 25's. As they went along their merry way, the sky started to darken and a few drops of the expected 30mm started to fall, but shortly after it started, it slowed to a steady fall. The grey sky was hampering vision for a lot of the competitors, but it's one thing we all know, we can't control the weather when we're planning events 12 months in advance. After shoot-offs, when all had gone quiet, the results were counted and came out as follows: C Grade 1st went to Alexander Sologub 108/125 and 2nd was Vicki Batten. B Grade 1st went to Anna Evgeniou 115/125 and 2nd was Paul Phillips. A Grade winner was Norm Basile 118/125, followed by Rito Borzillo in 2nd place. AA 1st was taken by Darryn Nicholls shooting 173/175, with Deserie Baynes in 2nd place. The Junior category went to Molly Bretag, Veteran winner was Robert Andrews and the highest scoring Lady was Deserie Baynes. The highest accolade of Overall Open for this event was taken by an elated Eric Parletta 124/125, only taking a second shot on his very last target and scoring himself a 'Black Crow'. Eric

The event was over fairly quickly, and when the final results came in, they looked like this: C Grade winner was Brock Thompson 39/50 and 2nd went to Sydney Cloughton. Squad sheets were already out for the competitors so everyone started getting kitted up and at 11.30 we started the rounds to get through 22 squads of shooters. Conditions started to change as we got a bit further into the day with the afternoon winds that prevail here to contend with, as well as the skies starting to darken. 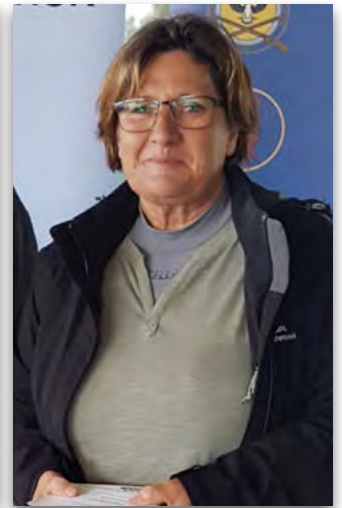

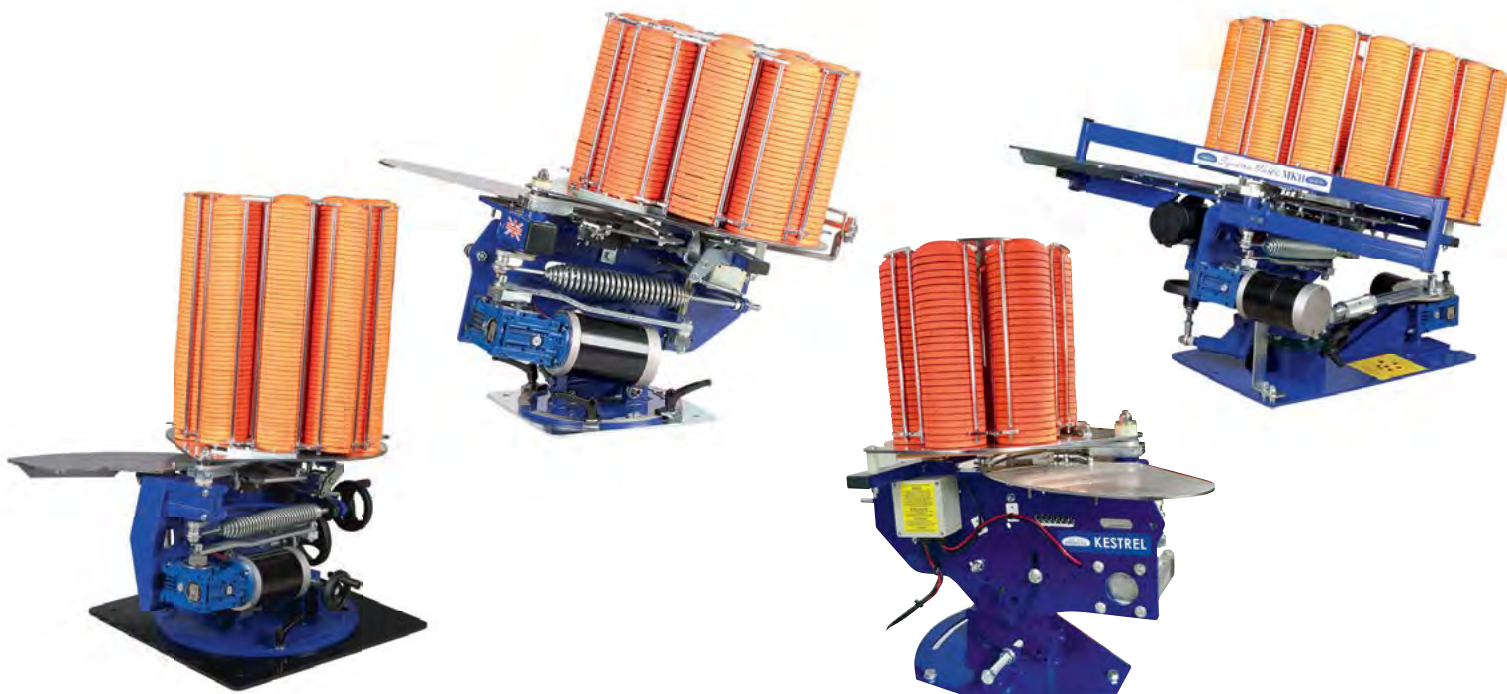

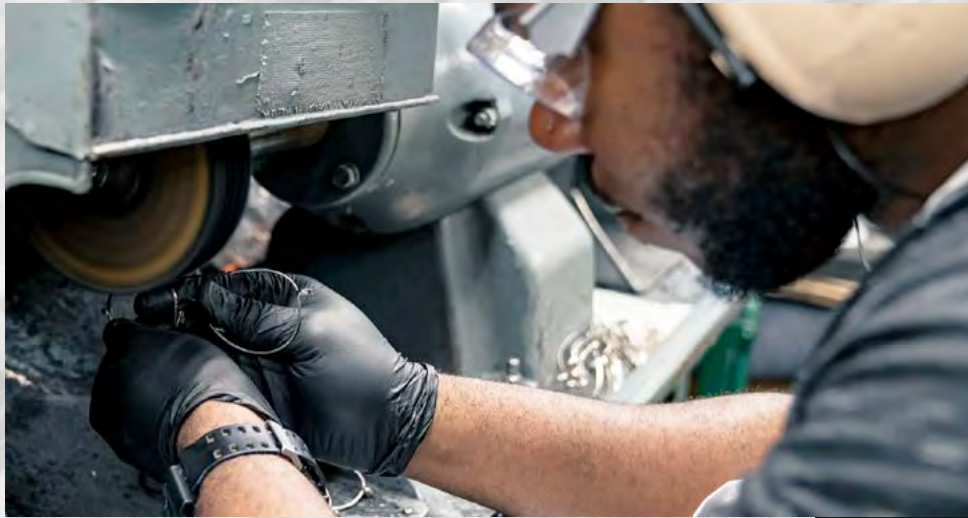

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Reverse Sloping High Rib: Is it worth a try?

I have been reading UK shooting magazines: *Clay Shooting* and *Shooting Gazette* for some time. I often drool at the exceptional guns pictured on the glossy pages, the superbly set out and manicured shooting grounds and the review of products. Some of the products: like the Arrow Laser Shot used for determining point of aim and point of impact and The SP (shot parabola) used to correct eye dominance, I have been able to bring to the attention of readers.

One of the other innovations I have often read and thought about is the concept of the Reverse Sloping Rib (RSR). I first saw this concept when reading about John Jefferies HPX Customised guns. I will let John Jefferies explain the concept,

"I have worked hard on developing a better rib always looking for better target vision when shooting a shotgun and some 5 years ago I first introduced the Perazzi HPX RSR, which was the first design to really take my ideas to a new dimension. The RSR- Reverse Slope Rib, allows a higher head position raising the master eye some distance above the breech of the gun. This on any other conventional gun would present the point of impact higher than the point of aim. With my RSR rib, the target vision is highly superior to that of a conventional gun and point of aim equals point of impact – the results becoming immediately apparent once the first few shots are taken."

Because of the cost and the bother the whole concept of the RSR slipped to the back of my mind. Two weeks ago, I received a phone call from Michael Hunt, from Hunts Shooting Supplies telling me about a new shipment of the Victory RT25 guns that had arrived. Michael mentioned the new sporter model, the black chromed action model and then he mentioned two really important things; firstly he had some high rib models that had reverse sloping ribs and when could I come up and test these guns. My response, 'How about next Monday.'



Because most targets rise, shoot gun barrels are not parallel. The bottom barrel points up and the top barrel is flatter. Therefore, the bottom barrel shoots higher to catch the rising target and the top barrel shoots flatter for when the target flattens out. Reverse sloping rib guns have the ribs higher at the receiver than at the muzzle but they do not shoot high. I hope my basic description isn't too confusing.

The gun I was given to test drive was a Victory RT25 High Rib Deluxe. Excellent wood with an adjustable Monte Carlo stock, hand engraved and this version had 32" (81cm) barrels with a 20 mm rib at the receiver end and a 15 mm rib at the muzzle. It was well balanced and for gun straight out of the box was the right length: LOP 370 mm, cast 12mm at toe and 6 mm at heel, angle of pitch 85 degrees

and drop at the comb 37 mm and drop at the heel 44 mm with a Monte Carlo drop of 20 mm. All the guns suited me fine, they were well balanced and felt very comfortable between the hands.



This speaks for itself

Upon arrival at Cowra Gun Club, the club president Michael Crowe had a trap set up and the pattern plate ready. Over to the pattern plate and . . .

I will freely admit that I missed the first two shots because I was shooting it like my own gun, holding on the trap house and coming up under the target. After a couple of deep breaths I changed what I was doing and held the gun straight out. This seemed to be a long way above the trap house because of the 20mm rib. From that moment on targets just disappeared in a cloud of dust. The targets were very easy to acquire and the gun movement needed was very little lateral movement. I was able to shoot chips (if there were any) easily and even played around with shooting up the side with the first barrel so I could hit it with the second. The trigger pulls were effortless. The triggers are heavy robust flat V springs that set off beautifully. When you think about pulling the trigger the target has already been hit. The bore size is 18.7 so there was very little recoil to speak of. This gun was a pleasure to use and really broke targets well.

I would like to thank the Cowra Gun Club for the opportunity to use their well-presented grounds. I would also like to thank Hunts Shooting Supplies for the use of their gun, free shells (1250 fps) and the free targets. Most of all I am thankful that I have now had the opportunity to test drive a Reverse Sloping Rib gun. All the Victory RT 25 high rib guns are RSR. Either the 20mm to 15mm like the one tested or the smaller rib version, 12mm to 7 mm. The guns come in right and left hand models in either 30" or 32" barrel lengths.

The verdict: I was not disappointed using a RSR high rib gun. It met all the expectations I had. Handling, balance and recoil: 5/5. Target acquisition: 3/5 initially moving to 4.5/5 once I learnt to drive it. Presentation: 5/5. This is a premium made Turkish gun, well presented, with a spare trigger group and a 5 five-year warranty. A RSR Jefferies would cost considerably more. When I first tested the RT25 I said I might be looking for one for my granddaughter in a few years. She is getting taller and will have a long, slender neck so there will be a need to keep her head up. A High Rib Victory RT25 might be an ideal place to start.

COACHING NEWS

All coaches that are due for re-accreditation this year should have received notification from the National office in recent weeks.

If you have received a letter, contact should be made to the Zone Coaching Director or the State Coaching Director in your State to organise a suitable date and location to complete your re-accreditation.

All coaches doing their re-accreditation will need to have their coaching skills observed and assessed by a competition level coach.

All coaches will also need to read and sign the new ACTA Coaches Codes of Conduct form that is to be kept by the State Association.

A coaching record card and a copy of the 10 shooting fundamentals and a laminated 10Fs card should also be issued to the coach.

The coaching record card and the laminated 10Fs card are available from the National office, and all State Coaching Directors should have a supply to make available to the assessors that are doing the re-accreditations.

The reintroduction of the coaching record card will give the coach an idea of the hours invested in their coaching and also the assessor a complete record of the coach.

If the card is empty or very limited in the amount of coaching undertaken by the coach over the previous four years, the assessor would be entitled to ask why the coach needs to be a coach.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – National Skeet Championships

1. Any shooter wanting to compete at the Skeet Nationals must be a registered member of the ACTA for the current financial year that the championships are being held.
2. **The closing date for pre-nominations is the 9th May 2020. Preferential squadding will only be accepted on nominations received prior to this date.**
3. Every shooter is to provide their current and previous Record Card when requested by the State or National Handicapper at State and National Championships.
4. In the event of any shooter not being able to produce his/her Handicap Card, a duplicate shall be issued for the duration of the National Championships. This card will then be forwarded to the Club Secretary to enable scores shot to be recorded. Note: A \$20 fee will be charged for the issue of any duplicate Handicap Card.
5. Shooters will be Pre Squadded and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
6. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 50 targets/100 targets. A time limit of one minute will be imposed for the changeover for each 25 targets. Should the one-minute time limit be exceeded then a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** may be incurred.
7. For the National 28gauge Championship load size is limited to 21gr (3/4oz) maximum struck measure shot size not larger than no. 7. For the National .410bore Championship load size is limited to 14gr (1/2oz) maximum struck measure shot size not larger than no. 7"
8. Any shooter missing their squad and requiring re-squadding will be penalised one (1) target (at the discretion of the Tournament Director).
9. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event he will not be eligible for any refund of nominations paid.
10. All shooters should sign the score sheet after each 25 targets. Once a shooter has signed his score sheet he has accepted his score and grade. Any score sheet not carrying the shooters signature will be credited with the lowest score recorded.
11. All competitors will be called upon to referee and/or score throughout the period of competition. The persons' designated to referee and score must fulfil their obligation to do so. While replacement referee and scorers are permissible, the penalty of a loss of one target for their failing to officiate shall be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** in the next event. Should a following event not be programmed then the penalty of the **LOSS OF ONE TARGET** will be incurred in the event concerned.
12. Any unauthorised shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalised **FIVE (5) TARGETS**.
13. All disputes must be in writing together with \$20 deposit, which is refundable subject to the appeal being upheld.
14. All disputes and deposits must be lodged with the Tournament Director, who shall arrange a hearing with the appointed jury.
15. When team selection is involved, shooters who are eligible for the open team selection as well as section teams shall choose in which team they will be selected. They cannot compete in both Open and Section teams.
16. Any eligible competitor paying nominations is entitled to receive awards in the Open section, Women's, Junior's or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
17. A minimum of three persons must compete in any Grade or Section, including High Gun before sashes, medals trophies and/or cash are awarded, irrespective of nomination paid.
18. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final. The ACTA reserves the right to alter the program.
19. An acceptable standard of dress is required for all competitors, Tournament Director to adjudicate.
20. **All Competitors must comply with Firearms Licensing Laws in their State of residence and in the State hosting the National Championships.**
21. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 50 targets in one visit only to the traps. Squads of 5/6 to shoot 100 targets in one or two visits to the traps or as designated by the Tournament Director.
22. Payment of the nomination fee only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not be eligible for any refund.
23. Free junior nominations, open to any junior who has not competed in a national event of any discipline & only by pre-nomination. Claim for this concession must be made at time of nominating & will not be refunded retrospectively. Late nominations will not be eligible for this concession.
24. Shooters will be Pre-squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director. Withdrawing from an event needs to be done in writing or by ringing the National Office (02 6938 2121) & leaving a message PRIOR to the event. All refund requests will be dealt with on an individual basis.
25. The setting of targets will be conducted by the Tournament Director and the trap mechanic prior to the start of the event daily. No further adjustments will be made to traps without the authorization from the Tournament director or the Shoot Marshal.
26. Shooters must have at least 200 targets recorded on their Record Card to establishing a grade **PRIOR** to entering State and National Championships.

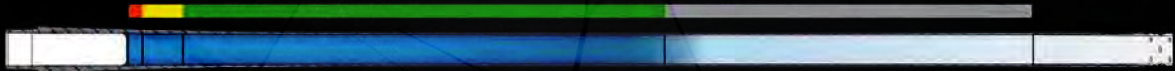
