ACTA REPORT

Mal Dyson – President Paul Gilbert – CEO



Having negotiated our way through the first quarter of 2021, we are almost ready to host our members back at a Nationals event at the National Ground for the first time in 14 months! At this point in time, it appears that the 2021 Skeet Nationals will ACTUALLY occur, which will bring a smile to all of our Skeet enthusiasts, (unless another major and untimely Covid-19 outbreak occurs within the next week).

Needless to say, the majority of the last few months has therefore been spent putting this event together, along with preparing for the 2021 AGM which will be held on the evening of 16 May. This has included moving our nomination process across from the old method via our website to the new My Clubs My Scores portal, ordering sashes and medallions, administrative tasks, touching base with and confirming prizes with sponsors, obtaining risk assessments, applying for event and arms fair permits, organising the Hall Of Fame Dinner, etc.

Sports Integrity Australia – National Sports Integrity Framework Policies

The Australian Sports Commission has, over the last year, established a new business unit named Sports Integrity Australia which has developed a new National Sports Integrity Framework. Their policies are:

- (i) manipulation of sporting competitions;
- (ii) improper use of drugs and medicine in sport;
- (iii) abuse of children and other persons in a sporting environment; and
- (iv) failure to protect Members and other persons in a sporting environment, from bullying, intimidation, discrimination, or harassment.

As such, these first four policies articulate what constitutes an offence in each of these areas. These are all then dealt with through ONE Complaints, Disputes and Discipline policy.

It is anticipated that the Framework will be live in the next few months and applicable to the whole-of-sport from NSO, (in our case, Shooting Australia), its Member Organisations, (ACTA, PA, NRA, TRA, SCA), and all the way down to ALL ACTA clubs and individual members. Within this new structure, the ACTA will likely need to set up “Integrity Units” in each State and at National Level in order to enact the process. It is anticipated these will include a number of

“Integrity Officers” (formerly Member Protection Officers), within each unit, headed by a “National Integrity Manager” and “Complaints Manager”. (These may or may not be at Shooting Australia level.)

The Member Protection Policy has been substantially revised and no longer includes or covers any “Code of Conduct” guidelines. Additionally, there are clearer definitions to communicate what does or does not constitute a breachable offence under the new policies. The policy also deliberately does NOT cover any personal grievances or Association / Club governance issues as these are determined by Sports Integrity Australia to fall outside the Framework. That said, a Code of Conduct may also need to be developed outside of this Framework, (either through SA or independently by us), which additionally provides for other disciplinary processes, procedures and measures as a parallel document to the Sports Integrity Framework.

We will advise everyone as to the activation timeline and required obligations of members to this new disciplinary process as it is rolled out over the coming months.

Constitution

OK – we’re not going to sugar-coat this:

The ACTA Executive Committee, (your State Association-nominated representatives ... i.e.: people who have been elected to represent all of our membership from Clubs to Zones to States to National), elected a Constitution Sub-Committee in August 2019 with the mandate to contribute even more of their precious time and energy in the hope of them preparing and presenting a new “Company Limited by Guarantee” Constitution. These Constitution Sub-Committee Members had only one ambition in mind; to bring the ACTA into the 21st century with a new governance structure that could amply and professionally carry this Association forward.

So, firstly, at the conclusion of this process, these people need to be thanked and acknowledged for stepping onto the Committee: Mal Dyson, Daniel Allam, Alan Styles, Colin Kneebone and Lynne Curtis.

The process involved unpacking all of the negative criticism that was levelled at the previous attempt in 2017 to present a Constitution, with the hope of correcting all of the identified shortcomings and

creating a new Constitution that would be acceptable and accepted. One of the most contentious issues was always that of moving away from a "Federated Model", choosing instead to propose a Board elected by the Membership based on each nominee's commercial and business acumen and capacity to contribute these capacities. Other important changes included the segregation of some parts of the Constitution out of the Rules, (where they didn't belong), and into By-Laws where they can be revised and updated as required without the need to have to re-vote for changes to these policies as constitutional amendments every few years.

Moving forward 20 months, and using this project as an example, it is interesting to see the dynamics and culture of this organisation in play. Firstly, only a handful of members ever put their hands up to do the job. Then, only a handful of about the same number responded to the Committee's requests for feedback. These people, however, were adamant that their individual views were more valuable, applicable, important, (and should therefore be unquestionably adopted by), than those recommendations of the Committee who, as a democratic and open-minded group, had already considered all of these options but had determined that another option was deemed to be in the best interests of the Association. Next, the antagonists, (some being the

respondents, but including a small group of others which didn't provide feedback), then started a campaign to white-ant the efforts of the Sub-Committee. Some distributed emails with irrational statements while others invented scare tactics. Possibly the best of these was "the ACTA becoming a company limited by Guarantee means that its affiliated clubs can no longer be not-for-profits"!!! As a consequence, misinformation quickly consumed the practical benefits of the new, practical Constitution while the old, broken Constitution, with all its glaring drawbacks, remained unquestioned.

So, yet again, we see the best attempts of some devotees being savaged by the disruptors who are obsessive to the point of having to destroy something completely if it's not exactly as they want it. Sadly, it is not likely that things will ever improve or move ahead until everyone gets on the same page and works with each other towards the better good and in the best interests of our sport. Till then, it will, no doubt, unfortunately remain frustrating, fragmented and unproductive for all.

Other than this, we have nothing else major to report this month. We look forward to welcoming our Skeet shooters back to competition at the National Grounds on 16 May!

The final day was a traditional English Sporting bush walk; a creative presentation of sporting pairs with a mix of following targets, on-report targets and simulated pairs that challenged and entertained all competitors.

everyone just had a great weekend with great people.

5-Stand kicked off on Saturday morning about 9am in cool NT style conditions with a slight dry season breeze. Each stand presented three single targets shot double barrel with the final two targets a pair of targets with the second released on the report of the first shot. Each squad was required two visits to each of the two courses to achieve the 100 targets, and as expected there was a general improvement in scores on the second visit as competitors made variations in technique to address the differing targets. Top End Gun

Club member Marcus Karlsson took out the NT 5-Stand title with a consistent score throughout the 4 rounds returning with an 86/100. A grade was won by Ramsay Fish, posting a handy 85/100, with TEGC President Gavin Lovelock taking second on 83/100. B Grade shooter Nadine Katarski took grade honours shooting 80/100, with the young Zane Karlsson posting a 78/100 to take second place. C Grade was won outright by Roger Spera on 72/100, while second place was hotly contested in a shoot-off between James Pocock and Matthew Doyle. James took the win, and second place, finishing with 82/120.

ACTA NEWS

REVISED RULE BOOK Revised May 2021

A new copy of the ACTA Rule book is now available on the ACTA website. This new release is available in either a PDF format or as a Flippable book via a link.

Changes to the book have been made, either because a rule was inadvertently left out when the book was restructured, or because, after review by the Executive, some Rules needed amendment.

Below are the rule corrections, all changes are in **RED**:

1.4 FIREARMS – addition to (c)

(c) Any firearm which has a gauge larger than 12 gauge is not permitted, nor shall any barrel length be shorter than 63 centimetres overall. **No additional advantage will be given to shooters using guns of a gauge smaller than 12 gauge.**

1.28 LONG BREAK RECORDS

(e)(vii) Skeet, **20 gauge, 28 gauge, 410 bore**

4.3 TITLES

(a) National Titles shall be a graded event, minimum of **100** targets. Two days may be taken to conduct this event.

5.8.9 CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS

A Champion of Champions event shall be a combination of a series of 25 targets double barrel, 25 targets single barrel and 25 targets points score targets shot in any order from 18 metres.

Shot squad system under rules applicable to the appropriate section with target numbers and shooting marks in accordance with the appropriate championship.

Note: any event shot as a combination of Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Points Score not shot from 18 metres or at 25 targets of each should be designated MEDLEY.

5.10.15 DISTRICT/CLUB EVENTS (Day or Night)

(h) The Double Rise Championship shall be shot

as a **minimum** of 10 pairs of targets from 15 metres.

7.13.13(b)

(b) At the discretion of Club Management, shoot-offs may be conducted in conjunction with following events or as doubles from Stations 1 to 7, or as doubles from Stations 3, 4 and 5, or any other format that is mutually agreed to between shoot Management and all shooters involved, **however Management must make the final decision.**

Page 90 – General indexes have been added for Trap and Skeet, these were developed by ACTA Toowoomba member, James (Viv) Nolan and we thank him for his valuable contribution.

As yet there is no index for the Sporting Sections.

With the MCMS program set to be used from January 2022 the Rule book will change dramatically, necessitating a complete index review.

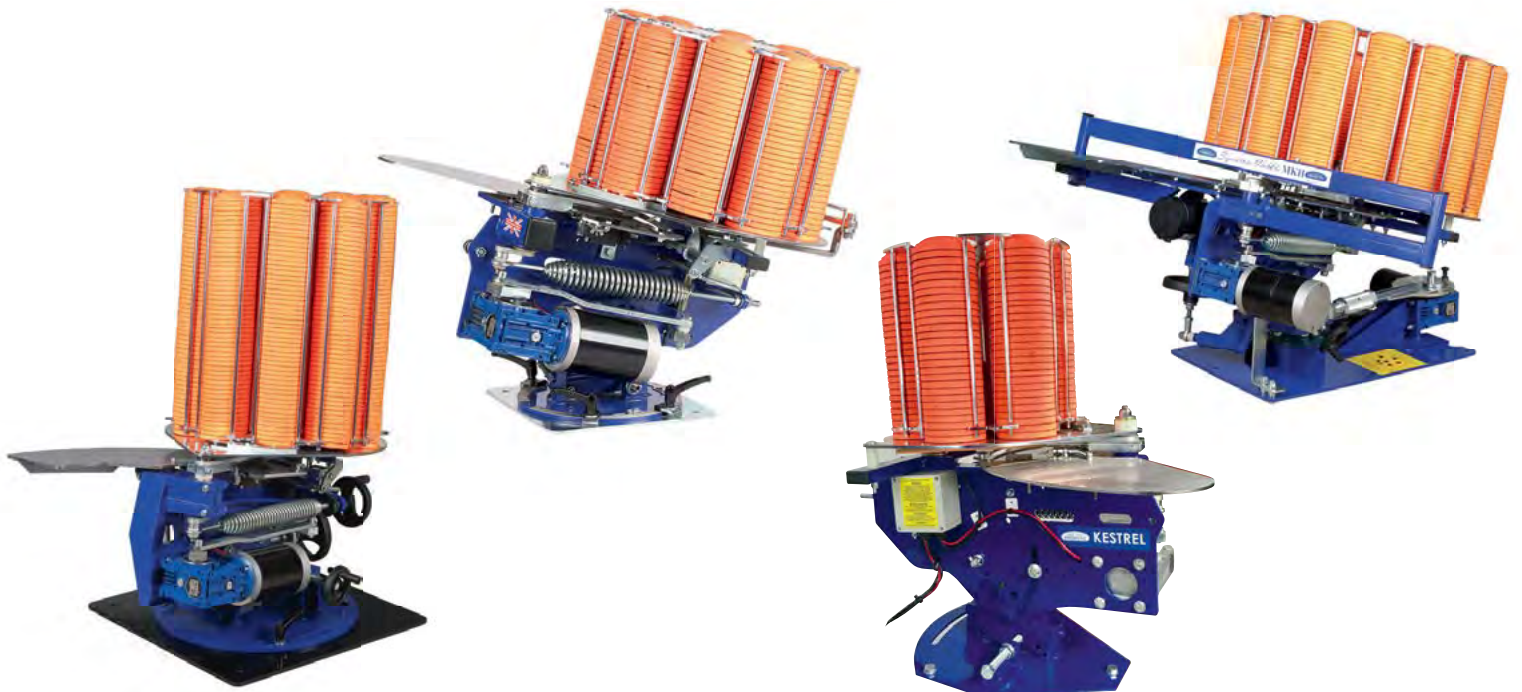

The Easter Carnival for the Mildura Clay Target Club was the opportune moment to officially open and acknowledge the new shot curtain upgrade. The club had applied for a grant to install a ShotStop Curtain and an upgrade to the DTL traps as well as the installation of a new ISSF Olympic Trench layout in 2018. A grant of \$1.2 million was approved in late 2019 by the Federal Government, which



saw the project built and completed over the next 18 months.

Government and praised the management and the quality of work that was carried out. Other than curtains that were erected in Brisbane for the Commonwealth Games, which are not used at this time, this facility in Mildura is the only one of its kind in Australia which provides shooting athletes the opportunity to train in conditions that they would encounter in overseas competitions.

Not only are the facilities in Mildura the only one of its kind, but is also the most environmentally friendly shooting range in Australia. 100% of the lead shot is collected as well as collection of plastic wads and the use of ECO friendly clays.

Also in attendance were: Mayor of the Mildura Rural City Council Councillor Jason Modica, Mayor of the Wentworth Shire Council Councillor Sue Nichols, Councillors from the Mildura Rural City Council – Councillors Glenn Milne, Helen Healy, Ian Arney & Liam Wood, President of the Australian Clay Target Association Inc. Mal Dyson, President of the Victorian Clay Target Association Lynne Curtis, President of the North West Zone of Victoria Colin Dunn, Director of ShotStop Curtains and Green Range Construction Craig Mitchell and Board Member of Shooting Australia and Olympic and Commonwealth Medalist Deserie Baynes.

A chance encounter five years ago by the committee and Craig Mitchell, planted the seeds of this

COACHING NEWS

Recently I had to provide some coach numbers for the Annual Report and for the Shooting Australia Coaching Reference Group and found a worrying trend. Thought we had 160 coaches in New South Wales but on checking the latest print out from the ACTA we only have 130 fully paid up and accredited coaches in NSW.

This is concerning as 30 coaches have for some reason decided that they no longer wish to be members of the ACTA.

This is above my pay grade but it is hoped someone needs to investigate the reasons why and an answer found to arrest this worrying trend.

On a brighter note, I have received several inquiries from around the State regarding clay target shooting for school sport.

With the lock down easing and the fact that the

whole of last year was severely restricted many of the more progressive private schools are keen to expand their students interests in some of the less popular Olympic sports and our clay target shooting will certainly fit this criteria.

Here is a wonderful opportunity for clubs to approach schools in your area particularly the private schools as the state schools will be limited by the bureaucratic structure that controls the running of the state school system.

With the fact we have 74 clubs in NSW and the reintroduction of the NSWCTA School Shooting Championship from this year forward we have the chance to grow our sport and experience the opportunity to compete and learn the joys of clay target shooting and promoting safe gun handling.

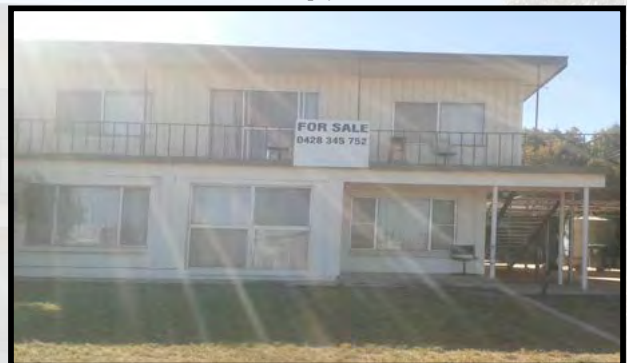

Where have the past 39 years gone? Hard to believe that next year we will be celebrating our 40th year at Monarto and we do hope that you will come and join us for that one. The way the years are flitting past it won't be long!

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Converting Anxiety Into Confidence

In April, I attended the Wagga Gun Club Veterans games. This is a must attend shoot. It is well run, friendly with tough competitions across three disciplines; trap, skeet and sporting. The competition is organised along age groups rather than grades, and while most people claim that it is just a friendly competition, the rivalry and the effort that goes into hitting each target: the competition is far from relaxed. I noticed this especially when two very good DTL shots in my squad admitted to shaking uncontrollably during the event. They claimed they were nervous, but this is a friendly competition with the only prize being a medal. So, it made me think what were they nervous about? Most likely, the fear of missing a target. Note, that I said the fear of missing a target and not actually missing the target.

At the shoot, I was also lent some back copies of *Clay Target Nation*, the Official Magazine of the NSSA and NSCA. This is an American magazine with some great articles, primarily relating to skeet and sporting, and written by proven achievers such as John Shima, Todd Bender and Gil Ash to name some of the contributors. With the 2021 Skeet Nationals in full swing when this article hits your computer inbox; an article by John Shima looked like it was written for the two DTL shooters who were shaking in fear. This article should also be of interest to all those competing at the skeet nationals.

According to Shima, anxiety is connected to an outcome that is out of your control. Anxiety is the fear of some future event. When adults are faced with uncertainty, we are generally predisposed to respond with either anticipation or anxiety. Over the years I have written that to deal with anxiety, you need to stay in the here and now and stay focused on the process of shooting rather than the outcome (your score). Shima

argues that mismanaged anxiety is a major confidence killer. Fear of failure to shoot a certain score, the distress of being judged negatively by others, or a lack of perfection are factors that deprive shooters of the confidence to perform to their best.

What are the components of turning anxiety into confidence?

1. **Acknowledge Anxiety.** We should all be able to recognise the signs that we are anxious: change in breathing rate, muscle tension, clammy or shaking hands, butterflies in your gut, etc. The sooner we can acknowledge there are negative changes from our peak performance state, the sooner we can redirect our energy back to positive emotions, being process orientated and being in the here and now.
2. **Embrace mindfulness.** To be in the zone you need to be in a heightened state of awareness: what is happening to you right at this moment. What can you feel, hear, taste, see and touch. Mindfulness will bring you back to the present. Focusing on your breathing and relaxing will also help.
3. **Employ rational thinking.** Successful athletes can develop an internal 'locus of control' and are able to convert anxiety to anticipation because they understand their fears are merely an emotional response to a mistaken interpretation of the situation and is not related to any actual threatening circumstance.
4. **Focus on your strengths.** According to Shima, it is important to make a mental checklist of the mechanical, visual and mental aspects of shooting that you perform well, then visualise how good it feels when you shoot that way. Remind yourself continually that targets break when you concentrate on the process of shooting 'that way'. It is essential that you approach each station with

the intention to quiet the mind, and focus on each target while also focusing on the process of shooting each target.

5. Positive self-coaching. Before occupying each station, you should use self-talk as if you are coaching your best friend's son or daughter. Provide positive reminders and an abundance of encouragement that celebrates the good shots and forgets the missed targets. It is about enjoying your shooting. This is easier when you focus on the process, have a defined pre-shot routine and focus on only hitting 'this' target. Focusing on hitting one target twenty-five times is less draining than trying to focus on hitting all twenty-five targets.

6. Abandon perfection. The 'perfection paradox' argues that if you are preoccupied with perfection during a competition, this interferes with optimal performance, directs attention towards mistakes and drains your confidence.

7. Play the part. Avoid the 'what if' mindset and employ a 'what is' mindset.

Play the part of pretending to be confident until you actually feel confident. If you stay focused in the here and now, stay focused on the process and breathe, you will perform better and then you will become more confident because confidence breeds confidence.

Shima concludes that if you follow the above points, you will develop a mindset that will convert anxiety to anticipation. When you can accept that your anxiety is related to an outcome beyond your control it will be possible to look forward to the pure joy of shooting during every competition.

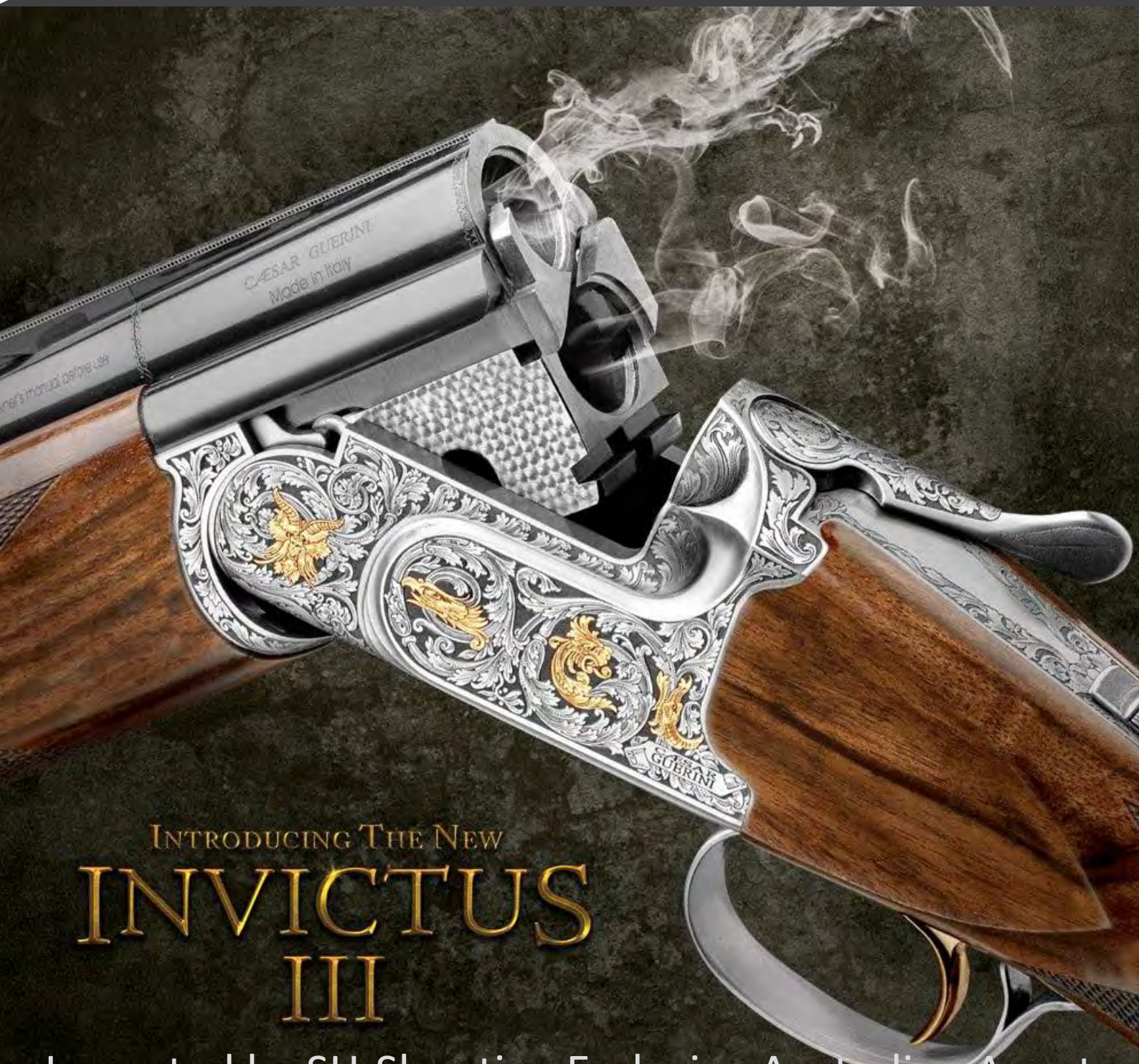
