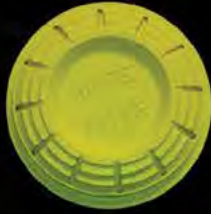

# ACTA REPORT

## **National Skeet Championships**

*Finally, after 19 months absent from National events being held on the*

*National Ground in Wagga Wagga, we successfully held the 2021 National Skeet Championships. With over 160 competitors nominating for the events on offer, it was rewarding to be able to have all States and Territories represented plus three competitors travelling from New Zealand. With frosty mornings leading into warm sunny days, conditions were excellent for good scores being shot. A highlight of the Carnival was Michael Buttigieg's achievements winning four Overall Championship titles plus the Overall Carnival High Gun, the full story is in this edition of the CT.*

*During this year's Skeet Hall of Fame Dinner held on the Monday evening, the induction of Michael Buttigieg into the Skeet Hall of Fame was an entertaining evening; a worthy inductee, congratulations to Michael.*

## **ACTA AGM**

*With the postponement of the National Trap Championships to October the Executive took the opportunity to hold the ACTA 2021 AGM on the Sunday evening of Skeet Nationals. Outside the normal activities of our AGM there were two Special Items of business put forward for the member clubs to vote on. These were:*

- 1. the ACTA move to a Company Limited by Guarantor, and,*
- 2. an updated Constitution to be in line with moving to a Company Limited by Guarantor.*

*It is important to remember that for a change to the Constitution to take place there must be a 75% vote 'For' the motion. With 152 votes cast, a motion required a minimum of 114 to be accepted.*

*The first motion, to move to a Company Limited by Guarantee, was passed with 118 votes 'For' and 34 'Against' (77% in favour).*

*The second motion, to update the Constitution, was lost with 107 votes 'For' and 45 votes 'Against' (70.4% in favour); a very close-run vote.*

*What this effectively means is that we need to pass a revised, satisfactory and compatible Constitution in order to be able to properly implement the first decision – to become a Company Limited by Guarantee. Constitutional*

*review is critical for this 'voted in' change to take place.*

*The disappointing aspect to come out of this vote was that we had 90 plus member clubs that failed to vote at all.*

*On a brighter note, prior to the commencement of the Skeet Carnival, the Executive held their first Face to Face Meeting to implement a Strategic Plan to set the direction and way forward for the future of the ACTA. This meeting was prepared and chaired by Chris Kenward from the CPR Group Resources a Brisbane Company. Also, during this time, we held a meeting with THM Sport & Entertainment, a Sydney Company discussing the opportunities in the future promotion of the Range Centre.*

## **MCMS**

*We now have approx. 200 clubs that have made contact with Martin Smith with many of these clubs already using the program. With the Handicapping Algorithm about to be implemented over the next six months to check on the progress of this system, it is important to have all clubs using the MCMS program in the near future. The State Rules Supervisors and State Handicappers have upcoming meetings in June and August to discuss and monitor the Handicapping Algorithm.*

## **National Sporting Carnival**

*The National Sporting Carnival is scheduled for the 27th to 29th of August 2021. This year we have added the 100 target Sports Trap event to the Carnival. This is the first time this event has been shot as a National Title. The Sports Trap will be held on Friday the 27th with Saturday the 100 target Commonwealth Sporting and Sunday the 100 target National Sporting.*

*We all trust that the Covid Virus doesn't interfere with the staging of this event.*

*With the Corona Virus rearing its ugly head again, we would remind all clubs and members to be vigilant in their activities and ensure that appropriate actions and hygiene protocols are still in place everywhere.*

*In this way we can make certain that our sport of clay target shooting is a safe and welcoming environment for everyone.*

# 2021 ACTA Skeet Nationals

ACTA National Ground, Wagga Wagga, NSW

May 16 – 22



The ACTA was excited and proud to welcome back to the ACTA National Shooting Grounds in Wagga Wagga our Skeet enthusiasts for this, the first National Titles hosted here since The Sporting Clays Nationals back in August 2019. Covid-19 has had a major impact and continues to cause mass chaos and take many lives across the globe, and while Australia has been most fortunate to be geographically isolated and appears to have avoided a major

impact on the health of our greater community, many of our lives and lifestyles have, none the less, been severely affected. Thankfully, over the last 6 months, Australian governments have been able to relax Covid compliance restrictions which has led to us being able to have extended periods of relative normalcy and provided the opportunity for us to be able to deliver this event. So, to our competitors, thank you for your support and participation.

The weather during the event was remarkable. While Saturday 15 May and that practice afternoon suggested cause for alarm with cold, blustery and overcast conditions, the commencement of competition on Sunday 16 May and the remainder of the entire week following brought cold early mornings, 20 degree days, blue skies and still to light breezes. These shooting conditions were appreciated and enjoyed by the 161 participants from all States and Territories across Australia and a small contingent of New Zealand guests who ventured across the ditch following the reopening of the Trans-Tasman bubble. The 8-day carnival therefore proceeded with great enthusiasm, keenness and excitement expressed by all competitors.

## POWER AMMO 6TH NATIONAL 28 GAUGE CHAMPIONSHIP

On Day 1 113 shooters fronted for the first event of the National Championships, the 6th National Skeet 28 Gauge Championship. There were 25 shooters from NSW, 1 from the NT, Qld had 29, SA 6, Tas 5, Vic 28 and WA 6. Making up the sections were 13 women, 2 sub-junior, 6 junior, 19 veteran and 73 open competitors. 59 shooters were AA grade, there was 29 in A grade, 18 in B grade and 7 in C. This event was sponsored by Power Ammo.

The event started off in quite blustery conditions. The 28 Gauge results are as follows: Overall and shooting the only possible was Michael Buttigieg 100/100 from the Frankston Australian club who

took away the National Championship sash.

AA grade was won by Andy Peter 101/102 (New Zealand), Ryan Miller from Frankston came 2nd and Paul Saliba NSWGC placed 3rd. A grade 1st went to Steven Marcon 96/100 (NSWGC), 2nd to Andrew Watson (Frankston) and 3rd to Bill Baird from Bairnsdale. In B grade John Tanuwidjaja 91/100 (Cecil Park) took the first place, with Leonie Johnston from Melbourne taking 2nd and Chelsea Beechey (Bairnsdale) 3rd. C grade place winners were, Athan Phillis 80/102 from Townsville first, Joel Bassett (Frankston) 2nd and Josh O'Keefe 3rd (Wagga Gun Club). The Ladies section was won

Darren Parsons from the Gold Coast Gun Club won B grade with a score of 89/100, Keith Napier, Frankston took out 2nd and Chelsea Beechey placed 3rd. C grade 1st went to Josh O'Keefe 80/100 (Wagga), 2nd to Athan Phillis and 3rd to Lee-anne Walker from the Caboolture club. Aislin Jones (Bairnsdale) 91/100 won the Ladies, James Sacchetta 94/100 (Frankston) won the Junior award for the second day running and Mal Briggs 92/100 from the Gold Coast Gun Club took home the Veterans.

### OPENING CEREMONY

Day 3 of the Nationals saw early morning fog, but this had dispersed by the start of shooting and the day ended up pleasantly warm.

The day started with the shooting of the State Shoulder to Shoulder Team Matches, followed by the Opening Ceremony. The march-in by all State teams were accompanied by the traditional sound

of the bagpipes from piper Ken Lansdown. After the introduction of ACTA President Malcolm Dyson by CEO Paul Gilbert, the President welcomed the official party, Kay Hull our ACTA Patron, Councillor Kerry Pascoe representing

After the initial formalities, the much anticipated Team results were declared. Victoria proved to be the outstanding State, winning the Open (241/250), Junior (68/75) and Veteran (71/75) Teams events with New South Wales taking home the Ladies Team with a very impressive score of 74/75.



The Best Dressed Team, which is a much sought after award, was then announced by Patron Kay Hull. Kay made mention of the vast improvement in Team dress appearance over the years and complimented each State on the State uniforms. Topping off a great morning and dressed in their new sporting jackets the Victorian Team also managed to take this award.

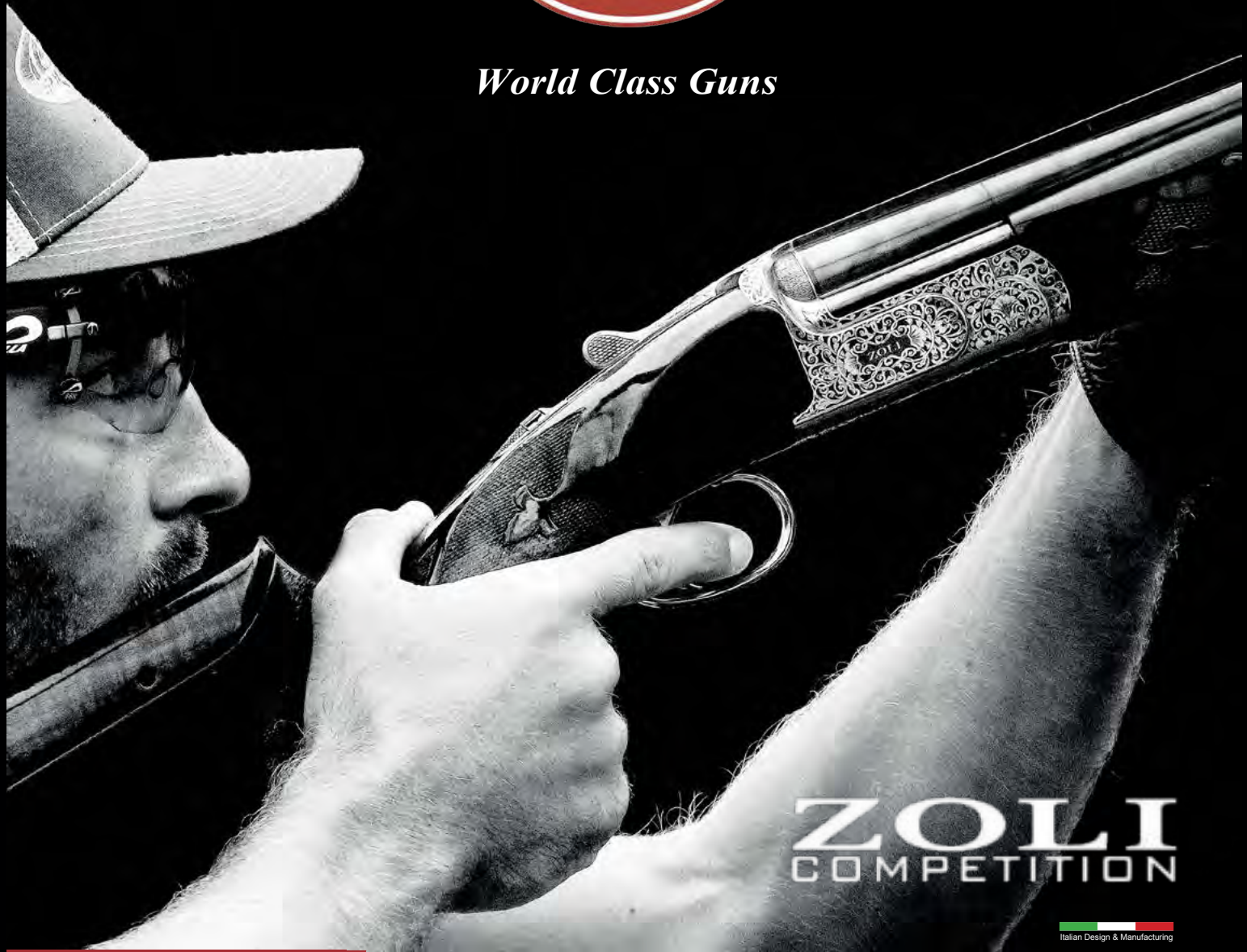

With handicaps added thirty-three shooters managed to shoot the 50 targets, but by the end of the first 25 shoot-off targets only 13 remained, with 7 of these shooters still carrying handicap points. By the end of the second shoot-off round only Sean Collins, still with + 2, Andrew Watson + 1, Glenn Walker, David O’Sullivan and Daniel Sacchetta remained. The third shoot-off round commenced just after 7.30am the following day and concluded with David O’Sullivan shooting from scratch, winning the Overall title with a score of 87/87. Well done David. For his win David received the ACTA Silver Australia Badge, Royal Blue Sash, a MEC Sizemaster from sponsor, Top Shot Industries, and his name will be engraved on the Colin Burt Memorial Trophy. In second place and also starting from scratch was Glenn Walker 86/87. Third place went to Sean Collins, fourth to Andrew Watson and fifth place to Daniel Sacchetta.

### **BERETTA 22ND NATIONAL SKEET 20 GAUGE CHAMPIONSHIP**

Day 4, apart from the early morning frost, weather conditions for the day were quite mild. 151 shooters competed, with 69 in AA grade, 38 in A, 27 in B and 17 in C. NSW was represented by 38 shooters the NT had 9, Qld 31, SA 20, Tas 1, Vic 43 and WA 6.

The Overall went to Michael Buttigieg, (his second Overall for the Carnival), after a relatively short shoot-off with Wally Clarke, Michael finishing with a 129/129. For his win Michael received the ACTA Australia Silver Badge, a Royal

Day 5 and another great day of fine weather with 159 shooters competing in the event. There were 23 women, 3 sub-juniors, 8 juniors, 30 veterans, with 95 competing in the open section. Taking home his third Overall win for the carnival, Michael Buttigieg again prevailed, outlasting Shane Bennett and finishing the shoot-off the next morning with a score of 189/189. For this

Relocating to Australia, Michael did not shoot for several years until he got himself and his family established in Australia. Michael joined the Frankston Gun Club and started out shooting a

Lanber hunting shotgun he purchased from Mialls Gun Shop. Michael shot his first State titles in Victoria in 2011, coming runner up in the 12 gauge event. With a new Browning, Michael started to compete in many ACTA competitions and he started having success winning the 28 gauge Peter Vella Trophy at the NSW State Carnival in 2012 and then winning the Tasmanian 12 gauge State title in October 2012.

2013 saw Michael post some incredible achievements. Michael came runner-up in the National 20 gauge event and then proceeded to win the 2013 Australian National High Gun event. Michael then travelled to New Zealand in November 2013 and did exactly the same. He came runner-up in the 20 gauge event and won the NZ High Gun after shoot-offs with some very experienced shooters. Michael was the first skeet

shooter in modern times to win both Skeet High Guns in the same year.

By the end of 2014 Michael had won a total of 6 National titles 3 x National runner-ups and

8 State titles and had amassed enough Hall of Fame points to qualify (210) for the Skeet Hall of Fame after only competing for 3 years.

2017 saw Michael post some amazing results, the



first beating Adrian Cousens Skeet Long Break of 565 with a new Long Break of 783 straight in the 12 gauge. Michael joined a very elite few with a Skeet long run over 500 straight, only achieved by Adrian Cousens and David O'Sullivan.

It was David and Craig O'Neill from Queensland who Michael shot against in various national events that pushed him to achieve his long run out to 783. Michael of course won the High Gun in 2017. To top that off Michael also ran a 225 straight in Skeet Doubles at Bairnsdale and set the new Australian record for Skeet Doubles.

2018 saw Michael represent Australia at the World Skeet Championships in San Antonio, USA. Michael shot the 150 x 150 clean in the 12 gauge event and shot off with the current stars of the skeet game in the USA, being LP Giambrione and Mike Schmitt in the stadium field for a third place overall in the World 12 gauge event at his first World shoot! Michael also shot a 545/550 and finished in the top 10 worldwide in the World Shoot HOA.

Michael is a dedicated family man and his wife Mary Buttigieg also spoke at the Hall of Fame

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

## WHEN I MISS, IS IT SELF DOUBT?

Recently at the ACTA skeet nationals, I had the opportunity to talk with many old friends, and made some new ones, about shooting and how to keep your mind from getting in the road of you shooting well. I am not sure how many times, I recommended Tim Gallwey's book, *The Inner Game of Golf*, but if you want to understand how your mind works, or doesn't work, this book is excellent reading.

The first article I wrote in the CTSN, looked at how Tim Gallwey explained what happens in your head when you are trying to shoot or take any shot in any sport.

I have reproduced that first article here and hopefully it will spur you on to read the *The Inner Game of Golf*.

The scene is any competition.

You are shooting well, and you are clean.

Whilst you are waiting to shoot you start to hear instructions, in your head, on what to do next, thinking about the outcome of the next shot, adding up your score, working out how many targets are left, etc. With these thoughts dominating your mind, you miss.

You regain your composure and after a few more targets you start thinking about the target you missed and it's possible, if you're not careful, you'll miss again.

Shooting, like all sports, involves two games; the outer game and the inner game. The outer game involves the sport itself; shooting the target. The outer game involves physical fitness, well fitting gun, reliable ammunition, correct stance and gun hold and all of the variables that are outside the shooter. The inner game involves mental fitness, and relies on the shooter to have trust in his or her own ability, to do what is required. Inner game strategies involve concentration, mental rehearsal, awareness, attention, relaxation, goal setting, etc.

The problem with either trap or skeet shooting is that an error will usually cost you the game or the match. There are rarely, second chances. In tennis, you can be down forty-love and still win the game. One or two poor strokes in golf does not put you out of the competition. However, depending on the day, 24/25 or 49/50 may not be good enough. If a person can do something as difficult and as complicated as shoot a small moving object 49 times out of 50, then the problem is not with their technique, equipment or ability. The problem is most likely involves the inner game. We miss because we doubt our own ability.

To understand 'self doubt' it is necessary to look at how the brain functions. Basically and for the purposes of this discussion, the brain is divided into two halves; the right side and the left side. These different sides play an important role in our ability to shoot, play golf, tennis, etc. The right side of the brain is responsible for muscle movement and co-ordination. In shooting this involves seeing the target, identifying it, tracking it, moving the body, holding the gun correctly, pulling the trigger and following through. The right side of the brain does and can continue to do these functions effortlessly and continuously. All that it required is that the muscles need to be relaxed.

The left side of the brain however, houses our language, analytical and judgmental skills. The left side also believes that our right side is incapable of doing what is necessary and therefore provides it with a barrage of instructions and "coaching tips" so that it can do it properly. In his book, *The Inner Game of Golf*, Tim Gallwey identifies these two sides of the brain as ego states and calls them Self 1 for the left side and Self 2 for the right side of the brain. Gallwey found that when he was involved in a competition he would have to

continually listen to a range of self-instructional thoughts. On closer analysis of these thoughts he determined that it was Self 1 doing the talking, it thought he knew how to play and was supervising Self 2, the one who had to hit the ball or hit the clay target in respect to shooting. Self 1 did not only give Self 2 instructions but criticised Self 2 for past errors, warned Self 2 about probable future ones, and harangued him whenever he makes a mistake. These instructions and judgments lead to an increase in tension, which in turn tightens the muscles; the result, is that we are no longer fluid or relaxed and therefore we cannot perform to our potential.

To summarise, Self 1 – the talking, thought producing self – is a lousy boss when it comes to control the body's muscle system. When Self 2 – the body itself – is allowed control, the quality of performance, the level of enjoyment and the rate of learning are all improved. Self 2 is the total human organism, the natural entity. Self 1 does not have a physical existence; it is a phenomenon of mental self-interference who can and does interfere with our ability to perform.

For the brain to function closer to its potential the interference needs to be minimised. This means that the basic premise of the inner game is; Performance = Self 2 (potential) minus Self 1 (interference). The object of inner game is to limit the interference of Self 1 and trust in Self 2 to perform and achieve.

Inner game techniques involve applying mental training skills that enable the shooter to maintain concentration, optimise performance and achieve results. These skills are not just the province of elite sportspeople; they can be learnt, so we all can increase our performance, enjoyment and fun involved in every competition.

Every time we compete, we make judgements as to our performance. When we are winning, we enjoy the handshakes, pats on the back and as a result we see ourselves as good. However, when we lose a competition or miss a shot, it is just as easy for us to judge what we did as bad. This value judgement of our performance has wide reaching implications. For example,

for a right-handed shooter, missing a hard right hand swinger from lane five. It is possible that Self 1 will say something like: "you missed again, you always miss those right hand swingers, you're really no good at these." If left unchecked and you miss that shot again, Self 1 will increase the criticisms and begin to make it personal; for example, "you missed it again. You're just no good at all." We now see ourselves as the problem not just the fact that for some reason or another we missed that target.

The first step to inner game success is to **let go** of the judgements. It is important that we see our performance as simply that: how we performed today. We must let go of the need to base our self-image or self-esteem on what we have achieved or what we think others will think about us as a result of our performance.

The second step is to **trust** Self 2's ability to do what we have to do and to stop trying. When we give ourselves the instruction to try harder, what we are really doing is tensing and tightening our muscles. In short, trying fails. Once we can let go of our judgements and trust in Self 2, we can go on to quieting the mind.

He started work in Sydney at The Sun newspaper then headed to Wollongong and worked at Radio Station 2WL for a short time but he loved the Press so back to the Illawarra Mercury for 28 years.

Bob's shooting career started at the Illawarra Gun Club in 1989 and he took to it like a duck to water. He lived and breathed shooting and attained AA grade in 1991. He was also successful at many Club, Zone, State and National competitions and loved improving his Trench scores.

Bob was in the Trap Macintosh Open Team in 1993, 1997, 1998, 1999 and 2003, the Glenn Cup Team in 1997, 1998 and 1999 and the Allen Brown Club Teams Match in 1997

He competed in the Grand American in Dayton Ohio in 1997 and shot very well in A grade and at the World Championships and NZ Nationals in Christchurch New Zealand in 2002, winning numerous places in events.

Bob's health took a turn after he contracted Leukaemia in 2008. He had a stem cell transplant in 2011 which was successful and he was in remission until 2016 when the Leukaemia came

back. Different medications he had to take from 2017 caused complications which eventually affected his heart. If there was a 10% chance of getting a side effect Bob got it. Bob also had Shingles on his face which affected his eyesight. Not good for a shooter and Bob was devastated. Bob travelled the world and every State in Australia. He had a good life but was taken way before his time. There was still so much he wanted to do with his wife Mary who misses him so much but she is grateful that she has a wonderful family and great friends.

Bob died from a massive heart attack on 3 March 2021 at the age of 69.

He is survived by his wife Mary and their 2 children, 4 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren.

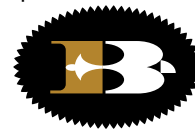

## SAFETY CONCERN

After the Skeet Nationals I had a question asked in relation to gun malfunctions and to the protocol to be observed for checking the firearm.

I was amazed to learn that a squad referee had taken a gun from a competitor to test fire. Many Rule books ago this was in fact the procedure, but the present rule, introduced with safety in mind, ensures that no referee without the correct endorsement, for example a semi auto licence or release trigger accreditation, can handle those firearms.

The present Rule under MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS FOR OFFICIALS reads:

1.19.14. The Referee must not restore a target if the competitor opens their gun after a malfunction. In the case of a malfunction the Referee shall visually check the safety catch is not in the on position and that the action is closed. They will request the shooter to test fire the gun once only. Under no circumstances will the Referee attempt to test fire the gun.

# Kempsey Clay Target Club – 100 Years and Still Going Strong



It was only a small group of shooters celebrating our anniversary but what an anniversary to celebrate! In May 2020 the Kempsey Clay Target Club would have turned 100 years old but due to Covid-19 and all that came with it, we couldn't blow out the candles. So even though we are officially 101 years old, we held our 100th birthday in May 2021. The club was established in 1920 by persons unknown. We do know the club operated until the War using live birds in an area of Kempsey that

Following the War, three local men, Len Baker, Sol Thomas and Jack Coope, banded together to reactivate what was then called the Kempsey Gun Club. At this stage the shooters had to purchase their cartridges at the local police station and held its events in the middle of the local racecourse, on non-racing days obviously. It then moved to an area to the left of the racecourse before re-locating to a more suitable area in Aldavilla, an outer area of Kempsey. There was only one trap house and the concrete bunker still remains in the middle of

NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

- (a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or
- (b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or

through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

- (a) the licence or permit number of the seller,
- (b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
