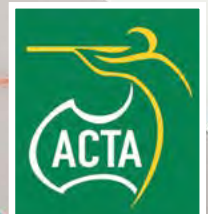

ACTA REPORT

Wow . . . to state the obvious, what a difference a month makes!

Covid-19 Update – Cancellation of remaining 2021 Nationals Events

We had just published last month's Clay Target e-News when the Executive Committee voted to postpone the 27–29 August National Sporting Clays event and set a line in the sand during August for announcements on the future of the 2021 (already postponed from March) 4–10 Trap Nationals in Wagga and 18–23 October ISSF Nationals event in Perth. Since then, the Covid-19 situation has deteriorated with Victoria declaring NSW an "Extreme" Zone (above Red), meaning that no-one can now enter / return to Victoria from NSW without approval. A permit system has also been reintroduced at the QLD border. WA will now not admit entry from QLD, VIC or SA without an approved permit and commitment to 14 day's quarantine and Covid testing upon arrival. For travellers / WA residents returning from NSW, the current directions state that travel from NSW is not permitted, unless you are an "approved" traveller. Meanwhile, the Sydney region outbreak remains uncontained and we are currently seeing new transmissions in Victoria.

As a consequence the Executive Committee voted on Thursday 12 August that the ACTA needs to cancel the remaining Sporting Clays, Trap and ISSF National events for 2021. While not the outcome we ever would have hoped for, we thank you for your kind support and understanding in this regard. We hope that this announcement allows you to revise any arrangements that were still up in the air prior to this advice.

Executive Committee Changes

Following the 2021 AGM, two new Executive Committee members have replaced past Delegates. David O'Brien, (new NSWCTA Delegate), has replaced Kim Nealon while Cheryl Arnol, (returning TCTA Delegate), has replaced Alan Styles. We would like to publicly acknowledge and thank Kim and Alan for their valuable contribution as Executive Committee Members, and Alan as well for being our Treasurer for a number of years. We also welcome David and Cheryl onto the Executive Committee with the expectation that they will provide a positive and productive contribution.

Les Kadziela has been appointed into the Treasurer's position and has hit the ground running with Executive Committee interim reports at his first meeting in this role.

Constitution

Following on from the May AGM when there was a won / lost vote for the two special items of Business, the Executive Committee has now reappointed the Constitution Sub-Committee to work towards the successful completion of this process. This involves a three-pronged strategy. Firstly, the President has already written to all State Associations and Clubs requesting their input as to what elements within the proposed Constitution might have influenced clubs to vote against it. We need to obtain constructive feedback before the end of August in order that we can then reassess the components within the constitution that still require revision. Secondly, we are currently contemplating engaging the services of an Associations Constitution specialist to assist us with the re-writing or deletion of clauses that, on reflection, are identified as impractical or improper. Finally, we will continue to communicate with all clubs to clarify any issues of conjecture in order that you will be able to better appreciate the rationale / justification for these final changes as they evolve.

As it is now evident that, with 71% of the clubs having voted for the new Constitution in May, it is obviously that we are not too far away from the mark. This gives our Constitution Sub-Committee a sense of assurance that we are on the right track and to recommit their energy to completing it. We therefore intend to work this process through in a timely fashion and make sure it is as close as we can get it to 100% acceptable so when we bring it to you next, it will win your approval. While this will not necessarily now be completed in time for the 2022 AGM, we hope it will occur as soon as practicable.

Strategic Plan

We reported to you a few months ago that the ACTA was having a Strategic Planning session with CPR Group on the Friday prior to the Skeet Nationals. Following this meeting, it was identified that the ACTA needs more information from you, our participants and clubs, in order to more accurately flesh out the

elements that the strategic plan will contain. To this end, we have therefore sent out questionnaires to State Associations, Clubs and all individual members in order to obtain a clear direction from you. This is just a quick, 10 question survey with room for comments if you wish to justify your response. We thank you for your valuable contribution to this process and we trust it will provide us with a clearer and more member-friendly participation experience moving forward. While over 500 responses have already been received to date, we welcome as much input as possible, so please feel free to respond. The survey link again is:

Clay Target e-News advertising rates

The Executive Committee, at their July meeting, reassessed the costs being charged to clubs for advertising in the Clay Target e-News. It was identified that, with the transition from hard to electronic copy, costs of production of ads is now much less, formatting, typesetting and distribution costs now the main factors. That said, it was decided that the new advertising rates to affiliated States, Zones and Clubs will now be:

Full Page: \$100.00

Half Page: \$50.00

Quarter Page: \$30.00

Eighth Page: \$20.00

We hope that this will encourage clubs to recommit to return to this advertising medium given that their current Facebook posts only go to their subscribed followers, while the Clay Target e-News is distributed to every ACTA member – our total shooting community.

My Clubs My Scores

The Rules Supervisors met via GoTo Meeting on 21 July and recommended to the Executive Committee that the ACTA continue to engage MCMS for the deployment of the grading algorithm. This came following a six month period of discussion, development and trials that satisfied the Rules Supervisors that MCMS is, indeed, able to provide a satisfactory alternative to the old, manual calculation process and that it needs to be given the green light to go live in order to demonstrate its capacity to our clubs and shooters. This is a wonderful outcome, as, once in place, it will serve club handicappers by taking most of the burden away from this often thankless task.

NSW Border Clubs

We are pleased to advise that, after a long and arduous revision, the NSW Firearms Registry have decided to continue to recognise border clubs within close

geographical vicinity to NSW State borders as NSW-approved clubs. The initial decision to not recognise these border clubs had the potential the curtail activity for NSW members who's nearest club may have been in the ACT, NT, Qld, SA or Victoria. This decision is therefore of great relief to many of the cross-border members as they won't be constrained to clubs in NSW only, as it is to many of these smaller clubs that rely on cross-border membership in order to remain viable.

So, as you can see, never a dull moment! We hope that this report is keeping you up to speed with everything that's happening in your Association. Let's all keep fingers and toes crossed, (in the absence of mass-vaccination!), that things normalise again soon and hope that the disruptions to our sport will be short-lived. Thanks again for your kind understanding and patience as we continue to be forced to deal with and respond to the dreaded Covid-19!

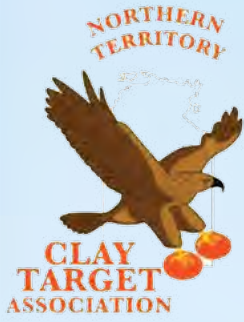

Darwin CTC Annual Four Day Shoot Incorporating the NTCTA DTL State Carnival



Every year for the Darwin Show weekend the Darwin Clay Target Club holds its 4 day shoot. 2021 saw a slight change with the club combining with the Northern Territory Clay Target Association (NTCTA) to incorporate the DTL State Carnival.

The committee had discussed how many competitors the club would get due to the four day event being so popular in the past. With most Australian shooters generally not being able to travel to large events due to COVID-19, the club was expecting a large contingent of interstate travellers.

The club needed to ensure that people didn't travel across the country only to be told the event was full and be turned away, and that

there would be adequate preparations to hold the number of competitors that would be expected. It was decided to cap the event at 240 competitors.

Pre-nominations were opened on the 1st of April and the 240 nomination numbers were reached in just nine weeks. There were many disappointed people as they had not got to nominate, so a wait list was opened which at its

peak reached 13. Darwin saw its first COVID shutdown for a week in late June. Darwin had limited COVID numbers and no community transmission which meant that the committee was confident it wouldn't impact on the shoot.

Then, the ultimate nightmare, COVID hotspots and lockdowns were being called throughout the country. The committee and the competitors

watched the COVID updates with keen interest and a little confusion on who could leave their area without having to go into isolation once in the NT. Numbers dropped off and the wait list disappeared. The other issue shooters had were flights being changed by the airlines. This caused a lot of stress and indecision. Shooters waited for their squads to be published on My Clubs My Scores (MCMS) meanwhile in the

background the MCMS was getting punished with squad changes with the removal and addition of competitors. Frustrating for all. A big thank you to Paul West on his assistance with this. Once all the confusion settled the competition ended up with a total of 158 shooters.

The Queensland State ISSF Carnival was yet another shoot to fall victim to Covid, with a strict lockdown of Victoria's borders announced just two days before the event. Some shooters had already arrived in Queensland, many had to withdraw, and others were stranded in limbo. The healthy number of pre-nominations received for the last Shooting Australia selection event before the Olympics dwindled substantially.

The shoot proceeded with 81 nominations across the disciplines and it was great to see our Olympic team members in Brisbane shooting alongside the locals.

For the Mixed Pairs event on Friday, we included a novelty teams event for those without partners, which proved to be a good warm-up for the weekend's competition. In the Mixed Pairs Thomas Grice and Penny Smith won overall gold, William Freni-Lizzi and Natalie Rooney won the silver, and Michael Coles and Kiara Dean the bronze. In the Novelty Pairs local father and son, Andrew and Campbell Taylor, won the gold medal, Mike Swale and Phil Keller the silver,

and Barry Bosworth and Craig Mitchell bronze.

12 men and 5 women nominated for the Olympic Skeet Championship which commenced on the Saturday, with the

Well done to all the skeet shooters, especially those shooting competition for the first time.

We were happy to end up with 9 full squads competing in the Men's Trap Championship. After a very close final James Willett from Deni took 1st overall and the Queensland title shooting 112/125 + 5/5 + 39/50 from Sydney's Thomas Grice close behind in 2nd place with 110/125 + 1/1 + 38/50. After excellent shooting in the qualifying event, Nathan Agiro from Mildura was 3rd overall with 117/125 + 30/40. 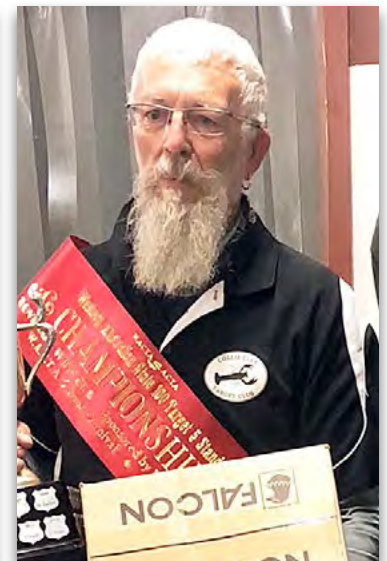

Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

The Tension of Execution

The title comes from John Shima, former five times world skeet champion, and involves the psychological and physiological factors that relate to a shooter's ability to master the mindful process of watching the target until it breaks. Mindfulness is about training yourself to pay attention in a specific way. When a person is mindful, they:

- focus on the present moment
- do not to think about anything that went on in the past or that might be coming up in future
- purposefully concentrate on what's happening around them
- avoid being judgemental about anything they notice, or label things as 'good' or 'bad.'

Mindfulness is often confused with relaxation. Although both conditions are important for consistent shooting performance being relaxed is physiological and being mindful is psychological. According to Shima, a shooter can feel relaxed and not mindful, but a mindful shooter is always relaxed. Shima continues by stating 'that watching the target until it breaks requires a higher level of mental engagement and a prolonged phase of attentiveness to the primary task, which is to detect and acquire the target and progressively increase the visual focus on the specific aspect of the target until it breaks'. The transition from having a soft focus in the acquisition zone to a hard focus in the break zone must be done at the exclusion of everything else.

Mindfulness is often used to reduce performance anxiety, which is the perception of increased psychological and physiological stress that often arises during a competition.

The external factors involved with completion are the triggers of performance anxiety, it is the internal self that provokes doubt, worry, anxiety and fear of failure associated it.

Shooting requires some level of *tension of execution* for the shooter to achieve peak performance and must be adjusted for each target presentation.

Excessive tension of execution causes shooters to be too careful. They may rush preparation or pre-shot routines, look too hard for the target, fire prematurely or stop the gun. Excessive tension can cause the shooter to change their technique when they are shooting well to protect a score we haven't already achieved. When this happens because of our fear of failing: we miss. Insufficient tension of execution causes shooters to be too complacent: lacking discipline in preparation and pre-shot routine, become surprised when the target appears, lose the feel for the speed of the target or lack a sense of engagement with the target in the break zone.

Often when shooters go to the gun club for practise they shoot targets and practise shooting targets. While shooting targets is important, practise should not be about improving your shooting, it should be about becoming more mindful when shooting. This will happen when you focus on the process of shooting, the preparation, pre-shot routine and the execution of the shot. According to Shima, to maintain an optimal tension of execution practise (and competition) must involve three components.

Firstly, **mechanical**, this involves refining the preparation before walking onto the pad or station. It also involves having an efficient and effective pre-shot routine. Mindfulness will help here because it keeps you focused in the here and now and directs your mind back to the mechanical process of shooting. Being aware of you posture, stance, balance, cheek pressure on the comb, grip pressure, forehead grip as well as the tension of execution during the detection and acquisition of the target, tracking the target, matching the speed engagement and releasing the shot and following through.

Secondly, **visual**, which involves being able to adjust you vision from the soft (broad) focus to hard (narrow) focus. It also involves settling the eyes between shots to allow the eyes to project the depth of focus beyond the path of the target.

Projecting the depth focus is crucial because it prepares the shooting eyes to detect and acquire the emerging target naturally.

Finally, the **mental** process that assist in keeping the mind quiet. A quiet mind eliminates self-talk and damaging random thoughts. Shima argues, these distractions are the greatest barriers to achieving automaticity during the shot sequence.

Automaticity is the best way to balance the tension of execution. This involves shooting from a subconscious level: doing it automatically without thinking about it. To explain this concept I want to remind every reader that during their lifetimes they have hit the target without missing over a million times. The target I am talking about is your mouth. Without thinking about it we move a fork or spoon to our mouth over and over again and never miss. Why, because it is automatic and done from our subconscious mind. We do not think about it. Please keep eating the same way; do not think about it.

If you think about it you might poke your fork in your eye.

When we are shooting well we often feel we need to change our technique, to protect a score we haven't already achieved. When this happens

because of our fear of failing: we miss.

In this article, a couple of months back, I revisited Tim Gallwey's *The Inner Game of Golf*, that explored the build up of self-doubt due to Self 1, the talking, thinking and critical mind, interfering with Self 2, the physical, motor driven mind.

To achieve automaticity the shooter needs to trust in their own ability and let Self 2 execute the shot while keeping Self 1 quiet.

Shima believes, managing the tension of execution is within our control if we eliminate the desire to break the target and trust automaticity. A quiet mind is essential to shooting clay targets with automaticity. Shima concludes by stating preparation to shoot must be deliberate and conscious while the execution of the shot needs to automatic.

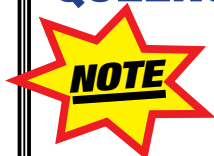

COACHING NEWS

The new ACTA coaching accreditation cards have started to be printed and posted to the entire 360 accredited coaches throughout Australia.

The three advanced coaches were first followed by our competition coaches and then the remainder of the club coaches will complete the program. This should be completed over the next couple of weeks.

No cards have been produced since Shooting Australia declined participation in the coaching program in late 2019. The National ACTA Coaching Committee renewed the program, purchased a card printer and the program needed to produce and re-introduce the coaching accreditation cards.

The card shows the coaches name, accreditation level and expiry date.

As no cards have been produced for almost 2 years, it was decided to issue new cards to the entire coaching list ensuing every coach received the acknowledgement of their accreditation.

Coaches will need to keep an eye on the expiry date as the new system deletes coaches from the list once the expiry date is exceeded. Coaches will need to contact their Zone or State Coaching Director a couple of months prior to the expiry to start the re-accreditation process.

Once coaches have exceeded the expiry date they can be still be re-accredited in the normal process and returned to the program without having to do a full coaching accreditation course.

Coaches due for re-accreditation are reminded a coaching record card with a list of coaching completed by the coach will greatly assist and simplify the re-accreditation process.

If there is no record or the card is empty the question may well be asked why the coach wants to be a coach.

This month the coaches from Queensland and Victoria are published and next month New South Wales will complete the list.

NSW Members and Dealers:

As stated in Firearms Act 1996, Section 54 "A person must not cause an advertisement for the sale of a firearm or firearm part to be published unless:

(a) the person is a licensed firearm dealer, or

(b) the proposed sale is to be arranged by or through a licensed firearm dealer and the advertisement contains such particulars as may be prescribed by the Regulations".

The Regulation states, "For the purposes of section 54(b) of the Act, the following particulars are prescribed in relation to an advertisement for the sale of a firearm that is arranged by or through a licensed firearms dealer.

(a) the licence or permit number of the seller,

(b) the name and address of the dealer concerned."

The Firearms Act 1996 applies to both the Publisher and the individual placing the advertisement. Failing to abide by this Section attracts a maximum fine of \$5,500.
