ACTA Chairman's Report

The ACTA Executive Officer, Brett Somerville, resigned in May to pursue a different career option. On behalf of the ACTA, I take this opportunity to thank him for his involvement in our sport and wish him well for the future. Recruitment for a replacement Executive Officer has begun and hopefully a new Executive Officer will be appointed soon.

I also need to draw members' attention to the advertisements on our Facebook Page and on the website for nominations to the ACTA Board. Please consider nominating for one of the two positions if you feel you have the time, energy and interest to give something back to your sport.

Queensland Junior Shooters Program

Congratulations should go to the Roma Clay Target Club which conducted a Junior Pathway Program which saw thirty-two juniors competing. The program carried the generous sponsorship from Beretta and a full report is featured later in this edition of the magazine.

Commonwealth DTL Carnival

The Commonwealth DTL carnival will be held at Echuca Gun Club on 15, 16 and 17 August, 2025. These dates have changed from those previously advertised.

The program has 10 Hall of Fame Points to be awarded to the High Gun Winner.

Compak Nationals

In preparedness for the ACTA Compak Nationals to be held at the National Shooting Ground, Wagga Wagga, on November 21, 22 and 23. The ACTA recently purchased a number of mobile sporting traps. The ACTA would like to thank Mal Dyson and Ray McFarlane for taking the time to inspect and assess the traps prior to purchase. With the support of Wagga Gun Club, this will allow for 8 ranges to be

operating, consisting of 200 targets over the two days competition. On the preceding Friday we will also be running an English Sporting Championship. The additional traps will also allow for a practise trap to be operating at the Compak Nationals this year.

National Integrity Framework

The ACTA has recently adopted the National Integrity Framework provided by Sports Integrity Australia. The components of the framework include competition manipulation, complaints and disputes resolution, drugs and medicines policy, member protection and safeguarding children and young people. The member protection section deals with behaviours such as bullying, harassment, victimisation and discrimination.

Members are reminded that when they join the ACTA, they agree to follow not only the rules of competition but also the ACTA Constitution, Constitutions of the member States, Clubs and Zones. There is also an expectation that all members behave in accordance with the Codes of Conduct listed in the member protection policy. As firearms licence holders we place ourselves in a vulnerable position if we engage in intimidatory, harassing or bullying behaviour whether it be on the field, at meetings or on social media. If you wish to maintain your firearms licence and your ability to participate in our sport it is essential you are mindful that your behaviour complies with our codes of conduct and expected societal norms.

Thank you for your interest and desire in your consideration of devoting valuable time and effort towards the future governance of the ACTA.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

As detailed in Clause 13 of the Constitution, The Board shall comprise of:

- a) Elected Directors who must be all Registered Shooting Members or Life Registered Shooters of the Company
- b) A Director must be independent and must not hold an Official Position or be an employee (disqualifying position) of the Company or a Member State or Zone. For the avoidance of doubt, an official position on the executive, or as an employee, of a Member State or Zone is a disqualifying position for the purpose of this clause. A person elected or appointed as a Director at the time of holding a disqualifying position must resign from that disqualifying position within 30 days, failing which they automatically vacate office as a Director under clause 13.14.

NOMINATION TIMELINE

- a) **MONDAY 30th JUNE 2025:** At least six (6) months prior to the proposed date of the election for the Elected Director positions falling vacant, the ACTA Board will request from Members, nominations for election to positions falling vacant.

- b) Any Registered Shooting Member or Life Registered Shooter may nominate a Registered Shooting Member or Life Registered Shooter to fill a vacancy in an Elected Director position that is subject of an election.
- c) The Nomination Package to be sent to interested candidates will comprise of:
- (i) A Roles and Responsibilities Fact Sheet (to be read prior to proceeding to commence the Nomination process)
 - (ii) An official Nomination Form, being:
 - (A) in the form required by the Board from time to time;
 - (B) signed by the nominator and nominee; and
 - (C) signed by the president and secretary (or equivalent positions) of the nominee's Club.
 - (iii) Board Compliance Statement, to be signed and dated by the Nominee &
 - (iv) An Election Platform / Testimony, to be no more than 500 words in total.
- d) **FRIDAY 29th AUGUST 2025:** By Close of Business on 29/08/2025, all Nominations being lodged by candidates need to be submitted to, and received by, their respective Member State Associations.
- e) **FRIDAY 31ST OCTOBER 2025:** Each Member State must select, from among all the nominations submitted to that Member State, (up to but not more than three (3) nominees), and forward the name(s) and Nomination Packages of these approved nominees back to the Company by this date.
- f) **MONDAY 3rd NOVEMBER 2025:** If at this stage, there are more eligible nominees than the number of positions to be filled, a ballot of the Clubs will be conducted as a 'first past the post' poll. Consequently, the Company will then send the full Nomination Packages of the approved candidates to all Member Clubs on this date. All Electoral Platforms received will

also be published in the following Clay Target e-News.

- g) **WEDNESDAY 31st DECEMBER 2025:** close off day to vote and renew Club Membership: Every Club to rank and order only their top two candidates (ie vote 1, and 2 only for their preferred candidates), returning these votes to the Returning Officer.

Each Club must vote to renew their membership with the ACTA Ltd. Clause 5.4 h) (iv) Each Club must annually submit a vote in the election for Elected Directors in accordance with clause 12.3.

- h) **MONDAY 5TH JANUARY 2026:** The returning officer and scrutineer will count the votes and provide the result to the ACTA Board.
- i) **APRIL 2026 THE SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES WILL BE ANNOUNCED AT THE 2026 AGM.**

ACTA DIRECTORS DUTIES - REQUIREMENTS

In this document the term 'director' refers to the people who make up an organisation's board. In some organisations these people may be known as the board members, committee members, trustees, councillors, governors or by another name.

To whom do directors owe their duties?

Directors' duties reflect the relationship that directors have with the organisation and its members. Directors are entrusted with the responsibility of governing an organisation and the law expects that they will act in the best interests of the organisation and be accountable for their actions.

Directors owe their duties to the organisation as a whole – meaning that they must act in the best interests of the organisation and its members. It is assumed that the organisation will exist on an ongoing basis (in perpetuity), and as such the interests of future members should also be considered.

In exercising their responsibilities, directors

also need to consider how their decisions might impact other stakeholders who are not members, such as clients and community members.

Role of the board

The board is responsible for the overall governance, management and strategic direction of the organisation. As a result, the board has ultimate accountability for its activities and performance. Boards are comprised of an organisation's directors who can only exercise their authority when acting as a collective.

This means that directors may still be held legally responsible for decisions of the board, even though they may not have supported any particular motion individually.

The role of the board may vary slightly depending on the nature of the organisation. The boards of smaller or newer organisations or those without paid staff, may have a more operational focus, whereas the boards of larger and more established organisations may take a more strategic approach to their work. Boards must decide for themselves how best to contribute to their organisation to make a positive impact and to meet their duties under the law.

The role of the board can be broken down into six different dimensions:

Strategy

Establish strategies to guide, monitor and control the organisation's activities.

Resources

Make resources available to achieve the strategy and oversee their use.

Performance

Monitor the organisation's performance, both financial and operational.

Compliance

Oversee processes to comply with legal and regulatory requirements.

Risk

Oversee a risk management framework that supports informed decision-making by the organisation.

Accountability

Report progress and align the collective interests of members, stakeholders, board, management and employees.

Directors' duties

There are two sources of directors' duties: general law and statute.

Under the general law, directors have duties that are based on the relationship they have with the organisation. This is a special relationship based on trust; a relationship akin to being the trustee of someone else's money, and for this reason directors' duties are sometimes called 'fiduciary duties'.

Directors' duties are usually also set out under statute, though the way this is done will depend on how the organisation is incorporated.

The four main legal duties based on general law and statute are to:

1. Act in good faith and for a proper purpose

This duty has two parts. Firstly, acting in 'good faith' means that directors must act honestly, fairly and loyally. It requires that directors act in the best interests of the organisation (rather than in their own personal interests). The requirement to act for a 'proper purpose' means that a director's decisions must further the organisation's purpose and be made within the board's legitimate authority.

2. Act with reasonable care, skill and diligence

Directors must take their roles seriously and be diligent in the exercise of their responsibilities. That includes taking the necessary time to prepare for board meetings, keeping abreast of the organisation's activities and understanding the organisation's financial position (including making sure the organisation can pay its debts when they are due), and attending and participating in board meetings.

3. Not to improperly use information or position

Information provided to directors to support them to fulfil their roles must only be used for the benefit of the organisation. Directors

cannot use information provided to them as a director, or their role as a director, to harm the organisation or to gain an improper advantage for themselves or another person or organisation.

4. Disclose and manage conflicts of interest

Directors have a duty to act in the best interest of their organisation. At times, a director's personal interests (such as their investment interests) or their other duties (such as to another organisation of which they are a director) may conflict with this duty. This is called a conflict of interest.

Conflicts of interest can also affect other people involved with the organisation, such as management and staff, and it is important that these conflicts are also identified and managed.

There are three types of conflicts of interest:

Standards of Governance, for example, privacy, disclosure of conflicts of interest and compliance with internal policies

Standards of Behaviour, for example, respect for diversity, use of organisational resources and professional communication

Unethical Behaviours, for example, prohibiting use of illegal substances, sexual harassment and bullying

The first step to managing conflicts of interest is identification. It is good practice for the chair to invite directors to declare any conflicts of interest at the beginning of each meeting.

Once a conflict has been identified, the board must decide how it will be managed. For example, it may be required that the conflicted director:

- Refrain from participating in any discussion about related matters;
- Remove themselves from the room; or
- Abstain from voting on any matter related to the conflict

This is called taking remedial action. The appropriate remedial action will depend on the nature of the conflict and boards will need to determine how best to manage a conflict based on the circumstances of the situation.

There is some misconception that directors who are not remunerated for their work (sometimes called 'volunteer directors') are subject to lower standards of legal responsibility. This is not the case, and individuals should think carefully before accepting the responsibilities of directorship.

Who can be a director?

Criteria for eligibility as an ACTA Director is detailed in the Constitution under Clause 13.

Before accepting an ACTA Board Member's position, the individual needs to ask the following questions:

- Do I understand the responsibilities of this role, including my legal duties?
- Am I prepared to dedicate the time and energy to perform this role in the way required?
- Do I have the skills and experience to discharge the responsibilities of directorship?

Only if the answer to these questions is 'yes' should a person accept the responsibilities of directorship.

Sometimes a director of an NFP may also have other roles within the organisation. For example, a director of a sporting club may also be a coach, a player or a parent of a player. It is important for directors to be able to separate these roles and not allow one to improperly influence the other.

ERN HAWKINS PERPETUAL TROPHY

Correction

In the June 2025 edition of the Clay Target magazine the winner of the Mackintosh Veterans's 65 plus Ern Hawkins Perpetual Trophy was incorrectly recognised. The ACTA wishes to apologize for this error and acknowledges that the winner for this prestigious award was Wayde Hawkins who shot a great 298/300.

History of the award:

In 2011 the Ern Hawkins Perpetual Trophy was given to the ACTA by the Hawkins family to honour Past President of the ACTA, Mr Ern Hawkins. The Trophy was to be awarded to the highest scoring Veteran, 65 plus years, from the Mackintosh Team scores, regardless of which Mackintosh Team they shot in. Ern was President of the ACTA from 1976 to 1980 and together with the Perpetual Trophy the family decided to also present each year to the winner, a memento of considerable value and significance. These trophies have always been a superbly handcrafted presentation case made by one of Ern's sons, Colin. Originally the case contained a Puma hunting knife, but these became hard to acquire and for some years the case contained a tomahawk. For the last few years the presentation has returned to the Puma knife, as pictured in the photo below.

The previous winners of this award are: 2011 Peter Holmes, 2012 Gary Rootes, 2013 Gary Kelly, 2014 Rob Viney, 2015 Max Medhurst, 2016 Fred Heinze, 2017 Fred Heinze, 2018 Fred Heinze and 2019 Gary Hayden. In 2020 and 2021 there was no contest but in 2022 Glen Castellaro was the winner, with the 2023 award going to Clyde Mitchell and 2024 to Greg Hipwell.

As previously mentioned, in 2025 Wayde Hawkins was the winner. In speaking with Wayde at the presentations about his win he said, "I have always enjoyed seeing the reaction and gratitude of previous winners of this award, and am so pleased and proud to have been fortunate enough to win it myself this year". Well done Wayde. The ACTA would like to thank the Hawkins family for their continued commitment.

2025 NSW STATE SKEET CARNIVAL

With shooters coming from all over the Country, we welcomed around 100 Skeet shooters to Wagga Wagga for 3 days of non-stop competition with some of the best Skeet shooters in Australia.

The weather was looking quite questionable on the Thursday with 90% chance of 10–20ml rain and boy did it rain. Thankfully the weather held off for the 3 days of competition even with it being forecast.

Day 1 was jam packed with three 50 target small gauge events (20 Gauge, 28 Gauge and 410 Bore) being shot. Daniel Sacchetta from Frankston was victorious on the layouts with his 50/50 in the 20 Gauge Championship against 75 other entrants.



ROMA GUN CLUB JUNIOR PATHWAY TO QCTA 2025 – 2028



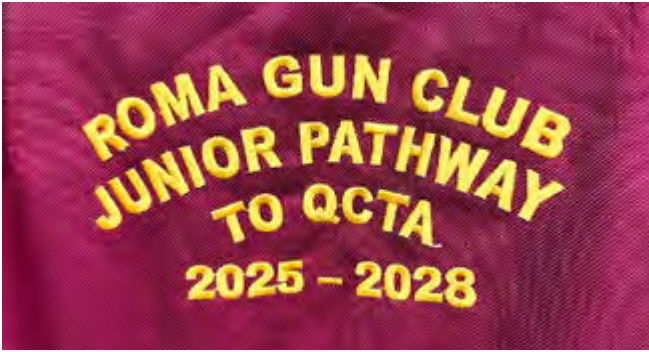
Thirty-Two ecstatic Juniors were involved in the first presentation from the Roma Clay Target Club – Junior Pathway Program (RCTC JPP).

Is it better to be confident or competent?

In May I attended a Sport Psychology workshop being run by the Newcastle branch of the Australian Psychological Society called “Bridging Clinical and Sport Psychology: Helping Athletes” presented by Hugo Webster. I was hoping to learn new and exciting advances in the field. That didn’t happen, but it didn’t matter because the presenter went over the things that I have been researching, writing about and teaching to others. I felt validated because I was on the same wavelength as the much younger than me presenter who is a leader in the field from Sydney.

There was one area however that sparked my interest. And that was the difference between being confident or being competent.

Confidence comes from the Latin and means “with trust”, and therefore it is an abstract construct. By that I mean it is not something that is concrete, you cannot pick it up for example or go the supermarket and buy some confidence. Confidence as “a thing” is an integral part of how we see ourselves and interact with the outside world. It is tied closely to the values and attitudes we hold. It is also a component of mental toughness: that set of behaviours and beliefs about yourself, your work, your sport, and how you interact. The characteristics of mental toughness are being competitive, confident, in control, committed, composed, courageous and consistent. Being confident means that you never fall victim to self-defeating thoughts; to be confident you need a can-do attitude, a belief that you can handle anything that comes along. Patrick Cohn from PeakSports defines self-confidence as “how firmly you believe in your ability to execute a physical skill or perform a task”. Confidence, according to Cohn, comes from a baseline assessment of past performances, training and preparation.

What is competency? Competency is having the knowledge, skills, abilities and behaviours that

contribute to individual performance. So being good at trap, skeet or sporting means you have the knowledge and understanding of how the shotgun works, how the cartridge works, how the targets fly and what is a proper presentation. It also means having the physical and technical abilities to be able to hit the target. To do this well in competition also means you have the mental and competition skills and behaviours to execute each shot.

Webster argued that “Competency is where you place your trust”. This is how you harness the skills, knowledge, and abilities to hit the target. As your competency or skill mastery grows, your confidence becomes proportionally stronger, which is strengthened more with successful training and quality practice. This also ties in with the work of Tim Gallwey, author of the “Inner Game of Golf” who argues that to play well you need to “trust and let go”. Trust being the faith that you have the competencies to hit the target and letting go of past judgements about yourself, your past performances or future fears.

Confidence is a feeling, competence is a behaviour. If you make behavioural changes and become more and more competent in your knowledge, skills and abilities to shoot each target you will see and feel a difference in your performance.

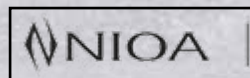

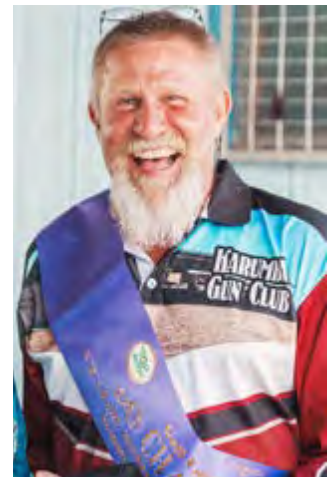

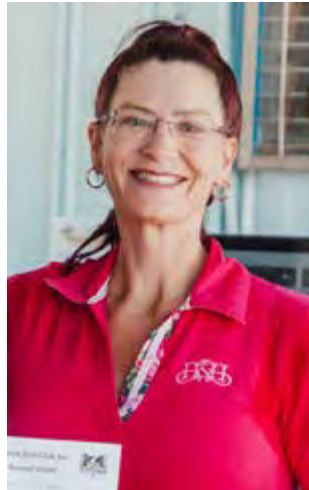

Finally, we were at the Nationals.



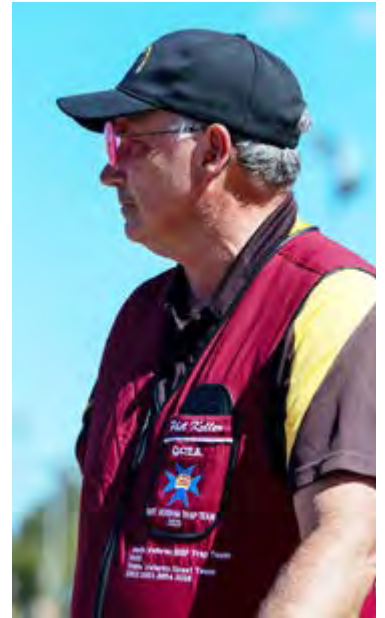

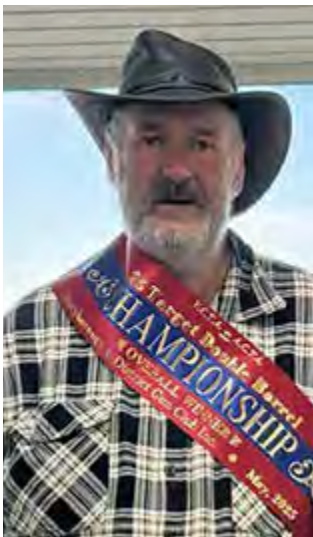
Two Competitions at the Maryborough Gun Club in May

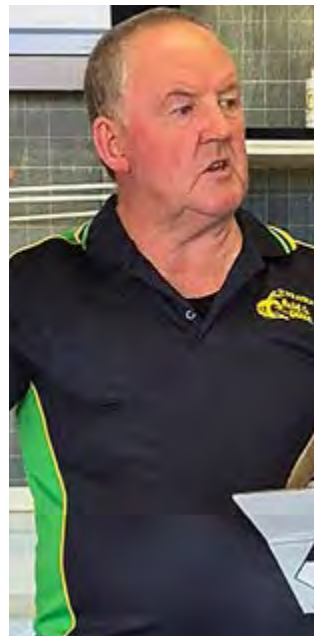
