# **ACTA CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

**Michael Kruger-Davis – Chairman**

*Congratulations Laetisha Scanlan on taking the Gold Medal in the Women's Trap ISSF World Cup in Lonato Italy. Laetisha then followed up this performance with Mitchell Iles to win the Gold Medal in the Mixed Trap team event.*

*Credit is also due to all the other shooters who represented Australia at the World Cup event in Lonato.*

*ACTA Australian teams will also be competing in the World English Sporting Championships in Grande Prairie, Alberta, Canada in August and for the first time the ACTA is sending an open and veterans team to compete in the World FITASC Compak Championships in France. The ACTA wishes the teams competing in these world championships all the best.*

## **EO Recruitment**

*People Fusion, a Corporate Recruitment Agency from Newcastle, NSW, has been advertising and filtering candidates who have expressed an interest for the role. Shortlisting of candidates has now occurred, and interviews will be held shortly. The successful applicant will be announced as soon as possible after the recruitment process is complete.*

## **Additions for the 2026 DTL Nationals**

*The ACTA will run a Ball Trap Championship on the day before the start of the official DTL National Championships. This will be an ACTA National title and comes with a Royal Blue Sash and Silver Australia Badge. There are currently two layouts at the National ground and plans are afoot to install additional layouts for 2026 and beyond.*

*The ACTA is also creating a new section for the 2026 Nationals. The new section will be known as 'Para section' and will be available to disabled and handicapped shooters. The ACTA is working to define this category and will be using similar definitions that are currently used by Shooting*

*Australia and the ICTSF. The details of the Para section will be released once they have been formalised. For 2026 this section will be for the Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Points Score events but will be broadened to all the DTL events, and other disciplines such as Skeet and Compak, if there is good support from competitors.*

## **Behind the Scenes**

*In the last couple of months, I have had the pleasure of representing the ACTA on various International and National shooting organisations.*

*In May together with Glenn Kable, we attended the meeting of the International Clay Target Shooting Federation (ICTSF) which are overseeing the upcoming World English Sporting Championships in Canada and the DTL World Championships in Christchurch, NZ, in 2026.*

*The NZCTA has announced that nominations for the DTL World Championships in NZ are now open and can be completed online through the NZCTA website. The NZCTA also advised that they had been working with NZ Police to streamline the NZ Firearms Licence process, and that information is also on their website.*

*In June, I was also party to a General Assembly meeting of FITASC, based in France and can now announce that the ACTA now has the COMPAK licence for Australia. There was overwhelming support from the other member countries for the licence to be removed from SCA and given to the ACTA. I also attended a meeting with Shooting Australia to ratify changes to their constitution and to address the crossover between SA and the ACTA.*

*A final reminder for the Commonwealth Championships being held at Echuca Gun Club on August 15, 16 and 17.*

# From the Desk of the EO

Welcome to a new addition of the Clay Target News magazine that looks to provide information on the happenings within the ACTA. We are looking to cover items of interest, changes in policy and newsworthy items that would be of interest to shooters from within the ACTA, that may not be readily available.

## What Constitutes a Competition

There has been confusion and various interpretations of how many shooters would be required to compete, for sashes to be awarded at the Nationals. At one point it was a minimum of 3 and then it was 5.

The Board reviewed this matter and also took into account the definition of what a competition is. As a result, the Board will now consider a competition will have taken place where 2 or more shooters compete. Sashes will be awarded on this basis.

This will now be the case going forward, with the first National event being the Compak Championships to be held in November this year.

## Classifying Shooters Over 55 Years of Age

At the most recent Board Meeting and further to a recommendation from the sub-committee, the ACTA will now classify shooters aged 55–64 as Seniors, 65+ as Veterans and should the discipline require a Masters classification, age 73+ as Masters. These classifications are meant for National competitions only and are not expected to be extended to State or Club level.

There has been some confusion over recent years where during the DTL World Titles a Sub-Veterans classification for 55–64 was adopted. Since then, a Super-Veterans was toyed with which has contributed to the confusion.

It is hoped that this revised classification will make this clearer.

This new classification will be adopted for all National titles. For example, for the 2026 Skeet Nationals, there will be a category for Seniors for the age group 55–64 introduced.

Any queries should be addressed to the ACTA Head Office.

## 5 Pair Eye Opener for Double Rise at Nationals only

During the Double Rise event at the recent National's held in Perth, a miscommunication resulted in shooters shooting 5 pairs not to count, just prior to commencing the event.

Whilst this was not planned, we have received very favourable feedback from shooters who advised that this enhanced the shooting of the Double Rise event. Double Rise is not necessarily shot often at club level, which does restrict shooters gaining proficiency within this discipline.

The shooting of the 5 pair allowed the shooter to gauge the flight and feel of the event prior to the commencement of the competition, resulting in scores more in tune with their ability.

The Board sees this as a positive incentive to this discipline and has decided to trial this at the 2026 Trap Nationals.

## ISSF Skeet to be shot at Wagga

In conjunction with interested parties, the ACTA has decided to split Skeet from the Trap ISSF event and hold it in Wagga following the Skeet Nationals in March 2026.

It is the intention of the ACTA to upgrade its facilities to comply with International standards and provide a shooting ground for ISSF Skeet. This is not only for the event scheduled in March, but also as a facility available for use and training throughout the year.

It is hoped that by scheduling this event straight after the Skeet Nationals, that shooters who have not shot this particular discipline will choose to stay on and participate. It is hoped that numbers could increase.

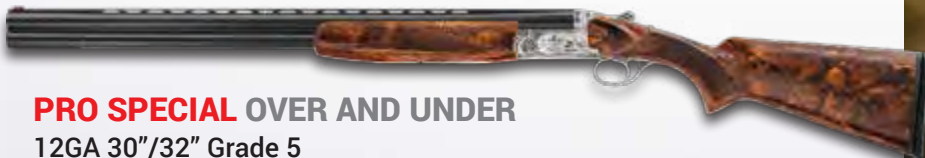



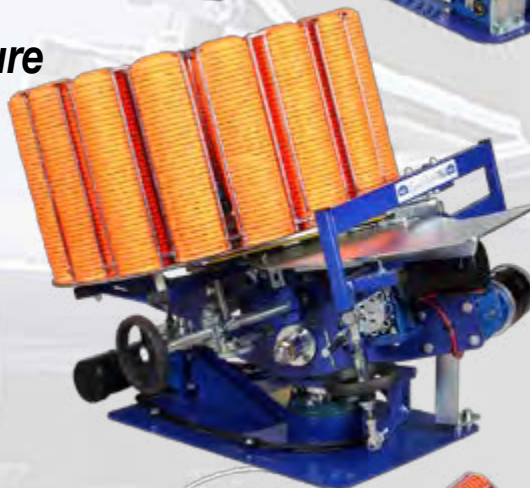

10. A minimum of three teams must nominate to constitute a competition.
11. Competition result sheet and score sheets signed by the referee to be forwarded to the ACTA and received no later than the first working day of January in the following year.

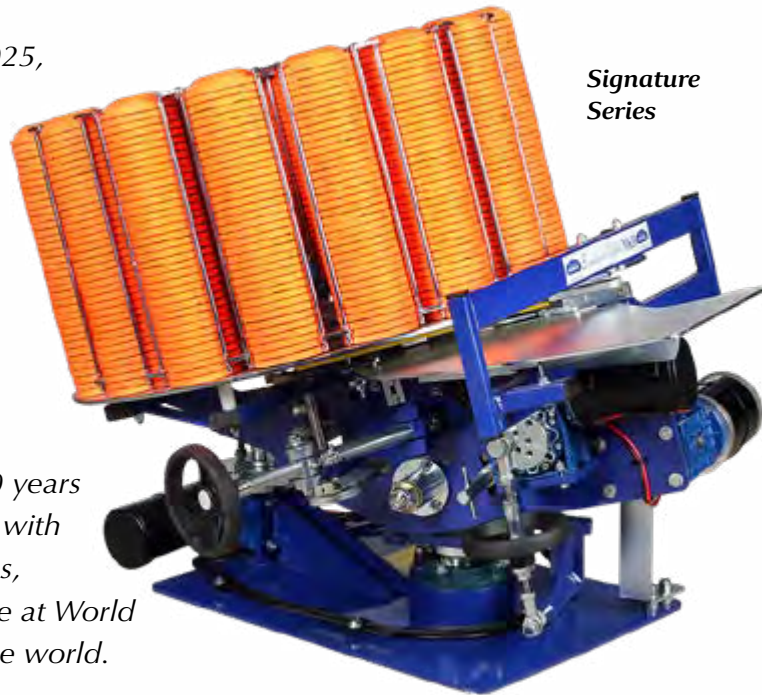

# ITALIAN WORLD CUP GOLD: Laetisha's Love for Lonato Continues

Australia's Laetisha Scanlan secured her 14th World Cup medal, winning Gold at the International Shooting Sport Federation Shotgun World Cup in Lonato Del Garda, Italy.



Competing in the Women's Trap event, Scanlan shot an impressive qualification score of 120 out of 125 targets to secure her finals berth, only one target behind top qualifier and world number 2, Silvana Stanco (ITA).

Fellow Australian's also competing in the Women's Trap event included Molly Bretag who shot a score of 109 out of 125, and Penny Smith and Kiara Dean both shooting 107. A score of 115 secured a place in the final.

Competition in the final was fierce with 50 world cup medals collectively across the top 4 qualifiers, with a field complete with Olympians, Olympic medallists and top 10 world rankings. This did not deter Scanlan as she remained calm and retained her composure, taking an early lead.

Speaking about the depth of talent in the final, Scanlan said, "The level of competition in Women's Trap right now is as high as it has ever been. I knew going into the final that I was up against some of the best in the world, so it was always going to be

a high-scoring, high-pressure match. I've made some key adjustments over the past eight weeks, and it's really encouraging to see those changes paying off."

Stanco won the silver medal, 2 targets behind Scanlan, with Lada Denisova (AIN) winning the bronze medal.

With success in Lonato spanning nearly a decade for Scanlan, and her second individual gold medal at the Lonato World Cup, having won the same event in 2023, Scanlan reflects, "There's just something about Italy that feels so special. Every time I come to Lonato I say to myself that no matter the result, I always have a wonderful time. Of course, I come here to compete and give it everything I've got, but some places simply resonate with you, and Italy definitely holds a special place in my heart."

With 14 World Cup medals now in her collection, Scanlan describes the feeling of the new addition. "It's always an incredible feeling to win a World Cup gold. These moments are rare and never guaranteed, so I feel extremely grateful to still have the opportunity to compete at this level in a sport that I truly love. Every medal has its own story, and this one is especially meaningful."

At the age of 35, with her time in the sport spanning over two decades, Scanlan reflects on her development as a competitor. "I feel like I'm

constantly evolving. This sport has taught me so much about myself, and as I get older, I find that I appreciate the journey even more. I'm still learning, still growing, and moments like this remind me that I'm moving closer to the long-term goals I've set for myself. It's a really fulfilling stage of my career."

With one day of competition left in Lonato, Scanlan will now team with Mitch Iles for the Trap Mixed Team event. When asked if she approaches this event any differently, Scanlan said, "My approach stays the same. I stick to my processes and routines. I have full confidence in Mitch; he's an exceptional shooter and a great teammate. I'm looking forward to seeing how we perform together and excited for the challenge ahead."

James Willett and Penny Smith will also combine forces to compete in Sunday's Mixed Team event.

Other results from Lonato in the Men's Trap competition, running parallel to Women's Trap, Mitch Iles and James Willett both shot a qualification score of 120, narrowly missing a finals chance by 1 target. Thomas Grice shot 115 out of 125 targets, Nathan Argiro 112, and Marco Corbo 108. A score of 121 was required for a finals opportunity.

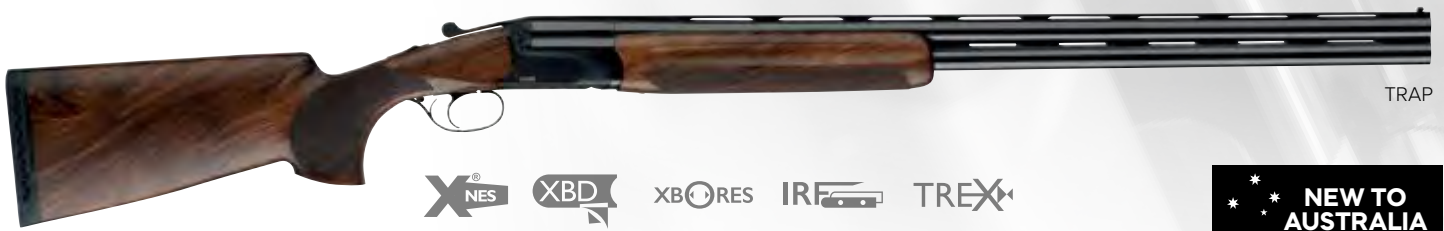

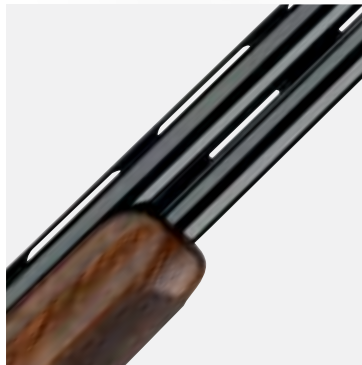

# Golden Duo: Scanlan and Iles Trap Mixed Team Gold in Lonato

Australia's Laetisha Scanlan and Mitch Iles secured gold in the Trap Mixed Team event at the ISSF Shotgun World Cup in Lonato Del Garda, Italy.

In their first international appearance as a mixed team pairing, Scanlan and Iles finished qualification tied with three other teams on 143 out of 150 targets, forcing a shoot-off to decide who would advance to the gold medal match. The Australians faced two Spanish pairs and Great Britain's Matthew Coward-Holley and Ellie Seward before going head-to-head against the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Champions, Alberto Fernández and Fátima Gálvez in the gold medal match. Scanlan and Iles shot a combined score 45 out of 50 targets, over Spain's 41 to clinch the gold, while Great

Britain took the bronze over Spain's Andres Garcia and Mar Molne Magrina.

After an epic end to qualification, with four teams tied on 143 and having to shoot off to secure their place in the gold medal match, Iles reflected that "It felt very good, that was our ultimate aim and we achieved it."

The win capped off a remarkable Lonato campaign for Scanlan, who had secured the Women's Trap individual gold just 24 hours earlier.

"This really has been a dream event for me," Scanlan

“Going into today’s final, my past results reinforced that I’m confident in my process and just to be confident in myself,” he said.

The 2025 Lonato World Cup featured over 500 athletes from 73 countries competing across Trap and Skeet disciplines, including 183 entries in Men’s Trap and 102 in Women’s Trap, highlighting the event’s world-class standard.

“Giovanni Pelliolo winning gold in the individual [Men’s Trap] shows that you can still be more than competitive at the ripe old age of 55 against the best shooters in the world,” the team reflected. “It’s also impressive for a country like

said. “I couldn’t have asked for a better performance in the individual and teams. I’m really happy Mitch and I walked away with gold this afternoon against the reigning Olympic champions.”

This medal continues a successful year for Iles, who has now earned three World Cup podiums in the mixed team event, following earlier successes of a

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

by Michael Kruger-Davis

## I Think my Problem is Psychological!

Often at a shoot, shooters either tell me their problem is psychological, or they ask me, is their problem psychological? The real issue what is the problem? Is it missing targets? Is it being distracted? Is it not being able to concentrate? Is it trying too hard? Is it . . . ?

We know the skills we need for shooting well involve technical skills, physical skills, competition skills and mental skills.

Technical skills involve the fundamentals of shooting: for example, stance, lead, target acquisition and follow through. If you need help with any of the technical skills, then some time with a coach maybe worthwhile.

Physical skills, for example, involve those aspects such as strength, agility, stamina, muscle memory, dealing with fatigue, hydration and nutrition. Sessions with a dietician, strength and fitness coach or masseur may be appropriate for this area.

Competition skills involve not being overwhelmed, dealing with distractions, dealing with the success of others, etc. and mental skills involve things such as concentration and attention, visualization, mental rehearsal, relaxation and goal setting.

As a shooter you have to identify what the actual problem is, then look at how to correct it, to improve your performance. This is easier said than done. Finding the root cause of your problem may give you insight into why you are not performing well. It is possible that once you have insight into your problem you are likely to become anxious about the decisions that you now have to make to correct the problem. Just knowing the problem doesn't help: you need to have a solution. However, when we are not performing well, we are likely to get unsolicited advice from everyone, and we can end up with too many choices. Having choices can lead to anxiety because we do not know which option we should take.

Having too many choices can lead to self-doubt. Firstly, you have to identify what the problem is. If the problem is psychological, then according to Nideffer (1992), it is most likely one of concentration or arousal control. If the problem is technical, then the solution involves technical and/or tactical changes. Secondly, you must have responsibility for choosing and following through on the course of action. This means you must make a commitment to follow a specific course of action. Once you have faith in your choice then you can quiet the doubt and conflict going on in your mind. According to Nideffer, how do you know that your problem stems from the loss of control over your physiological arousal or the ability to concentrate,

and isn't simply a technical or tactical mistake? Nideffer describes four questions which can be used to test if the problem is psychological or technical aspects of your performance.

- 1. Are you satisfied with your skill level when you are shooting well?** If the answer is no, then you probably do not have the skill level necessary to perform to your potential. If the problem is strength, or speed, stamina, etc then any amount of mental rehearsal will not help. Physical practice with expert technical coaching will help.
- 2. Do mistakes occur at random or do they increase in pressure situations?** A purely technical or skill problem will occur in a wide variety of settings. You will be unable to see any pattern. When the problem is psychological, the mistakes will tend to occur more frequently under pressure and will have a predictable pattern. Such as, missing the first or last target, or the first target in the shoot off.
- 3. When you are having a problem, how do you feel?** According to Nideffer, if you feel confident, and in control of your thoughts and feelings, then, the problem may involve nothing more than a simple technical issue. If, on the other hand, you

feel a sense of panic, if you feel pressured, rushed, confused or overloaded, then the problem is psychological.

- 4. Is the problem affecting only one aspect of your performance or are several things going wrong at the same time?** Nideffer states that when stress is a factor, the increase in muscle tension interferes with your vision and concentration. Under these stressful conditions, you are not likely to be dealing with a single problem: instead, you will find that everything is going wrong. As you try to make up for each subsequent mistake you will keep making more because you will be trying make up for each mistake. This is what happens when you see three missed targets in a row.

If you can find the cause of your problem, commit to an action to resolve the issue.

**4 October 1948 – 27 June 2025**

*From his early childhood, Jim loved the outdoors and loved playing sport. His early passion was for AFL as well as cricket, where he excelled both as an opening batsman and an opening bowler. Due to injuries he sustained playing these sports, Jim made the decision to try shotgun shooting, mainly in the form of hunting.*

*In 1970, Jim attended his first DTL National Championships in Perth, WA, winning the Double Barrel, Single Barrel, HOA High Gun and the National Team. This was the beginning of his amazing competitive career in Clay Target Shooting.*

*In 1973, Jim made the Australian ISSF Trap Team for the upcoming World Championships in Melbourne and by the time he retired from International shooting in 1987, he had achieved 2nd and 3rd places at the World Championships as well as qualifying for the 1978 and 1982 Commonwealth Games and the 1980 and 1984 Olympic Games. At the 1982 Commonwealth Games, Jim and Terry Rumble won Gold for Australia in the Pairs Match.*

*In 2006, Jim was inducted into the ACTA National Hall of Fame, having won 9 National Championships, 10 State Championships and qualifying for 9 Macintosh Teams. On top of that Jim had also won 5 Australian ISSF Trap Championships, 11 Australian ISSF Team High Guns and a Australian National Skeet Championship along with a New Zealand Ball Trap Championship.*

*Jim was a life member of Canberra International Clay Target Club and was instrumental in establishing the club on its current grounds.*

*For those that knew Jim, he was a true gentleman and a loyal, trustworthy friend. He generously gave of his time to help those around him, helping many achieve success in shooting and in life.*

*Jim also enjoyed playing cards as well as performing many of his coin tricks, to the delight of many!*

*Jim was also a dedicated family man, ensuring that his family was always well provided for.*

*To Jim's wife Ann, daughters Deonne & Elisha and their families, our deepest condolences go out to you. He will be sorely missed, but never forgotten.*

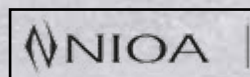

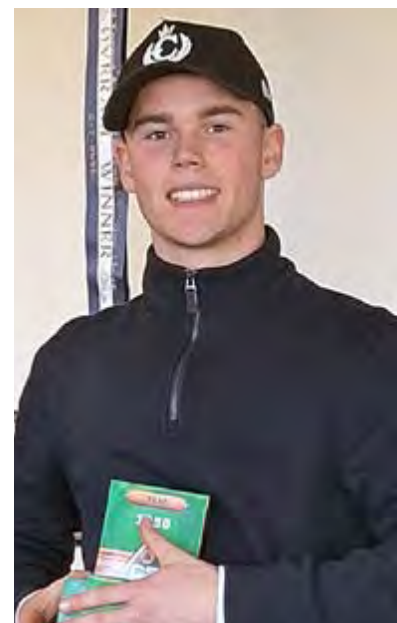

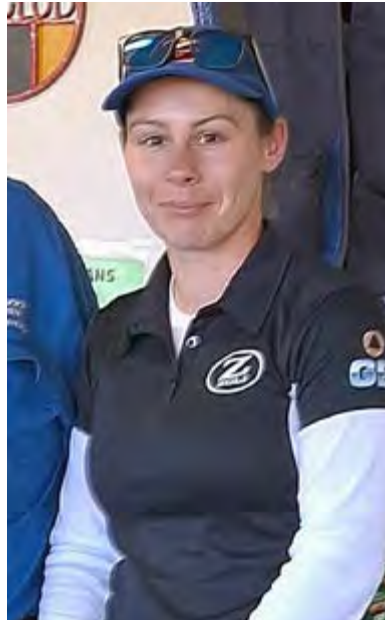
