

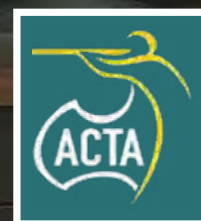

# ACTA CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

**Michael Kruger-Davis – Chairman**

## **8th ICTSF World English Sporting Championships**

*In August the 8th ICTSF World English Sporting Championships were held at the Wapiti Shooters Club in Grande Prairie, Alberta, Canada. I had the pleasure of being the Team Manager as well as a member of the Super Veteran's team. For me, and I believe the rest of the team it was a thoroughly enjoyable experience. The Australian teams stood out in both our formal team uniforms and the green and gold shooting jackets, which were worn with pride. The sportsmanship and camaraderie displayed by the Australian team members was commented upon by others and the ACTA can be proud of these ambassadors for our sport. All the teams featured on the podium and there were also some spectacular individual results.*

## **Compak Nationals**

*Organisation for the Compak Nationals in November is well underway with the delivery of twenty-two traps to the National Ground in Wagga. These traps will be inspected and serviced over the coming weeks and an assessment to be made on appropriate release sequencers to purchase for the event.*

## **2026 NZCTA Nationals**

*As listed on Facebook, Nominations for the 2026 NZCTA Nationals open on September 16, 2025. There has been an enormous interest in the ICTSF World Championships in Christchurch following the NZCTA Nationals, so it would be advisable to nominate as early as possible if you are intending to attend.*

## **ICTSF General Assembly Meeting**

*Both Glenn Kable and I attended the ICTSF General Assembly meeting held during the World English Sporting Championships in Alberta, Canada. I attended in person, while Glenn was on a zoom session in the early hours of the morning. The main topics included the finishing touches to the English Sporting*

*Championships and organisation for the World DTL Championships in New Zealand.*

## **National Firearms Registry**

*The ACTA has been involved with Stakeholder Engagement meetings for the implementation of the National Firearms Registry. We have responded to policy topics involving licencing categories, lending and borrowing of firearms, minimum licence requirements, etc. We have stressed the need for unhindered interstate movement of competitors who wish to compete in all Australian States without the need to apply for a particular state permit three months in advance. Sub-gauge tubes were also included in this discussion and the right to be able carry them with a firearm.*

## **NZCTA Gunshot Magazine**

*I have been a contributor and subscriber to the NZCTA Gunshot Magazine for many years. I have always been impressed by the quality of the magazine. The NZCTA have made the decision to only publish the magazine in a digital format from 2026 and beyond. The decision to move to a digital format was mainly due to cost. Paper magazines are more costly to produce and distribute. Paper costs, printing, wrapping and postage all inflate the cost of production. A digital magazine still requires typesetting, formatting, etc but the physical cost components of getting the magazine out to households no longer exists. There were also the multiple costs when more than one copy of the magazine was sent to same household. The September Edition was the first digital copy.*

## 2025 ACTA NATIONAL FITASC COMPAK SPORTING CLAYS CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1 All competitors must present their current shooting licence/permit to the events office before competition. **Failure to do so will incur a penalty loss of one target.**
- 2 Any shooter wanting to compete in the “2025 FITASC COMPAK Sporting Clays Nationals” must be a registered competitor of the ACTA for the financial year 2025, or a bonified International competitor.
- 3 Entry is by pre-nomination only through MCMS (MyClubsMyScores). Squadding will be available Friday 21<sup>st</sup> November 2025.
- 4 Late nominations will be taken on the day for an additional charge of \$20 per event **but only if there are vacancies available. Note that there are caps on events.**
- 5 Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to commencing will be eligible for a refund less a \$10 administration fee. Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.
- 6 MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data the decision will be made by the National MCMS Handicap Supervisor after the first 50 targets for English Sporting and 100 targets after the Compak events.
- 7 Squads of up to 6 competitors will shoot brackets of 25 targets per visit to the traps using the Squad method. Should there be sufficient numbers, the Line system of shooting will be used. For English Sporting, a walk through system will be employed.
- 8 Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations.
- 9 Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at the 25 Targets per layout.
- 10 Shooters who miss their squad may be re-squadded towards the end of the event, but this is not guaranteed and non-participation is possible. **If a shooter is able to be re-squadded a penalty loss of one target will apply to that event.**
- 11 Should a shooter be late for his/her squad and elect to withdraw from the event they will not be eligible for any refund. It is the shooters responsibility to make sure they are where they should be and when.
- 12 Competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, **the penalty of a loss of one target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person.**
- 13 **Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap will be penalized five targets for that event.**
- 14 All appeals must be lodged in writing with the tournament director together with a \$50 appeal fee. The Tournament director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned.
- 15 Eligible competitors are entitled to receive awards in Open, Women, Junior, Seniors, Veterans or Masters section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 16 ACTA dress code is to be adhered to ACTA rules, Tournament Director is to adjudicate.
- 17 All competitors must comply with the Firearms Laws of the State hosting the National Championships.
- 18 Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.
- 19 Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.
- 20 A junior who has not previously competed at any National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to shoot for the cost of the admin fee of \$10 per event, claim for this concession can be made at the event or within 14 days of the completion of the event ie; by the 8<sup>th</sup> December 2025.
- 21 The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Shoot Marshal. No further adjustment will be made without authorization of the Tournament Director and Shoot Marshal.

## From the Rule Book

### GUN SLEEVES

It has recently come to my attention that some shooters at Compak events, most likely those who have only recently become members of the ACTA, are not aware of the Rule regarding the use of GUN SLIPS or SLEEVES on ACTA grounds.

**Rule 1.1(b) Safety reads:** *All guns carried on or about the shooting ground must be held in a position of safety, with the breech open and unloaded at all times. Gun sleeves and slings are not permitted in any ACTA discipline.*

### GUN ACTIONS LEGALLY USED ON ACTA GROUNDS

Shooters often ask, "What firearms can be used on ACTA grounds". For the avoidance of doubt and rather than listing all the guns that cannot be used, be aware that only 2 types of actions are mandated for use. Break Open Double Barrel – U/O or S/S and Semi-automatic, these must be plugged to allow 2 cartridges only. **See Rule 1.4 Firearms.**

### SIGHTER TARGETS FOR DOUBLE RISE

In the August edition of Clay Target, on the Executive Officer's page it was reported that henceforth for the National Double Rise Event, 5 pair of sighter targets would be offered to the shooters before the event start. Please be aware that this only applies to the National Title and Clubs, Zones and States are under no obligation to follow this path for their Double Rise events.

# Commonwealth Trap Carnival

A fantastic Commonwealth Carnival was recently held at the VCTA State Grounds—Echuca Clay Target Club, over the weekend of August 15-17, with 101 competitors making the trek from many States to the Echuca facility, which remains the showpiece of the Victorian Clay Target Association.

Those bracing to brave the Echuca winter weather were fortunately greeted with blue skies and mild temperatures, for a while. In typical Victorian style, each day brought on new conditions, with Sunday afternoon being very wet. As per usual, the Commonwealth Carnival events (except Handicap) were shot from the 18m mark; this, combined with wind, frequent clouds, and changing light conditions, made shooting challenging indeed.

Once again, the grounds crew provided an immaculate venue, the product of hours of hard work by Echuca Gun Club and VCTA volunteers.

Friday was the first day of competition, kicking off with the 25 pair Commonwealth Double Rise Championship in the morning and the Commonwealth Handicap in the afternoon.

From 18m, Matthew Stokes (Cobar CTC) emerged victorious in the Double Rise, taking the Overall Royal Blue Sash with an unbeatable 48/50. The top two in AA were tied on 46/50, and Don Pratt (Mt Gambier), 55/60, emerged victorious after a shoot-off. A Grade was won by Zachary Felmingham (Cosgrove) with 46/50, B Grade by Lee Vella (Colbo) with 42/50, and C Grade by Kristopher Trotter (WVCTC) with 52/60. Macka Codrington (Brewarrina) took out the Ladies, Don Pratt the Veterans and the Juniors and Sub-Juniors were won by Harrison Glennen (Noorat) and Roy Davis (Bendigo) respectively.

Dark clouds rolled in for Friday afternoon's Commonwealth Handicap event. Although the sky was dark, the Corsivia Green Dream targets stood out boldly against the near black sky. With the rain holding off, five competitors managed

to shoot the possible 50/50. After more than a round of shoot-offs, Jason Trotter (WVCTC) brought home the win with a magnificent 86/86. Adam Laureano (WVCTC) was our runner-up, scoring 85/86; Castlemaine's own Ted Weeks took third with a 74/75; Josh Nixon (Beaufort) was

(Alexandra) won Veterans, while Lenny Dobbins and Roy Davis took out the Junior and Sub Junior categories, respectively.

Saturday afternoon was time for the big one, Double Barrel. With nine perfect scores from the 18m mark, the shoot-off was on. Andrew Brady emerged victorious with 145/145 and took home the Overall Commonwealth Royal Blue Sash. Runner-up and AA Champion was James Patterson (Noorat) 144/145, Harley Pickford (Noorat) won A Grade 94/95, Paul West

The Backmarker division was also hotly contested, with no fewer than four 25m+ shooters posting a 49/50. After another round of 25, Daniel Cleary (Mornington) proved too strong and took home the Backmarker prize with a 73/75.

Saturday brought cooler weather, accompanied by relatively comfortable shooting conditions.

Event 3 was everyone's favourite, the 50 target Commonwealth Single Barrel Championship, again shot from 18m. Matthew Stokes led the pack with an uncontested 49/50, once again emerging as the overall winner.

Andrew Brady (MCC – ACTA) took home AA with 48/50, Kane Evans (Castlemaine) was the A Grade winner, taking his shoot off 52/56, Mark Zielezna (Mornington) was the B Grade winner with 45/52, and Adam Laureano again featured to win C Grade with 45/66. The Ladies winner was Emily Vassallo (WVCTC), Fred Heinze

# 2025 Universal Trench World Championships

**The 43rd World Championships for Universal Trench were held in the Eternal City, Rome, Italy, at Tiro a Volo Roma, located approximately 30 minutes drive from the heart of Rome.**

The range features eight layouts, all equipped with FAB Trap machines, and is owned and operated by Olympic Silver Medallist in Double Trap, Francesco D'Aniello. A record 25 Australians entered the event—15 official team members and 10 individual shooters—which was fantastic to see.

Universal Trench Australia once again assisted all shooters with permits and paperwork. All but one competitor had smooth, hassle-free travel. Unfortunately, John Maxwell experienced airline clearance issues and had to leave his trusty Perazzi at home, opting instead to borrow a firearm in Italy. Many competitors travelled earlier than usual to take advantage of the wide range of competitions offered in Italy—the home of clay target shooting. Our athletes put in some excellent performances at these events. Others planned to shoot a warm-up



event in Rome that was unfortunately cancelled by FITASC at the last minute, though they were still able to train on the layouts.

By Monday, the full team had arrived in Rome and settled into their accommodation, with most staying at Hotel Tivoli, a comfortable hotel 15–20 minutes from the shooting range. A team bus was also organised to transport shooters to and from the venue.

We quickly discovered that range expenses were steep. Ammunition prices had jumped to €135 per slab of 250, compared with the €80–85 we had seen elsewhere. With the exchange rate at AUD \$0.58, food and drinks were also costly—for example, a

standard bottle of soft drink cost €4 (about AUD \$7). Strict firearm laws also applied: all guns had to be covered when not in use, making “gun slip” covers a necessity. Additionally, spectators were not permitted behind the layouts, even if they were part of the next squad. We were told this was due to a tragic incident at another nearby shooting range, which led authorities to impose these rules.

All shooters managed to get in the practice rounds they needed and were feeling confident. On Tuesday night, we held our team dinner at the Grand Hotel Duca d’Este, right next door to our hotel. It was a wonderful evening with excellent food and camaraderie. During the dinner, Craig Bentley was proudly announced as our team flag bearer for the Opening Ceremony.

The Opening Ceremony was spectacular, featuring Roman warriors and an incredible air show filled with smoke and colour. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the evening and returned eager for competition.

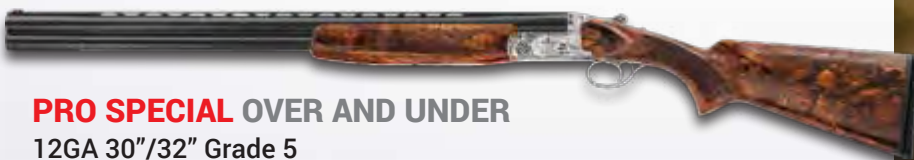

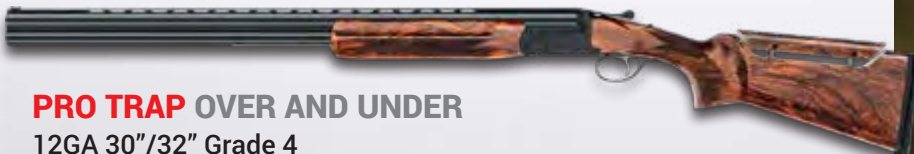

# Psychological Skills for Shooting

## Jet lag again

I have just returned from the ICTSF World English Sporting Championships in Alberta, Canada. Both on the trip there and on the way back, I have been battling jet lag quite significantly. Back in 2013 I wrote about jet lag and how to get over it.

When we change time zones (an increment of 15 degrees of longitude from Greenwich, UK) our bodies need to take time to adjust to the new time zones. Until we are back to normal, our performance will suffer. Corporations and the military understand that performance can be affected by not having proper rest after a long haul flight. The proper rest time varies from individual to individual but age, flight duration, time zone translocation, climate variations, noise, immobilisation, low humidity, etc, all factors that will influence the severity and duration of jet lag. So armed with the discomfort of “being out of it,” and my personal need to have some sort of scientific understanding of the problem and the solution, I decided to do some research into the problem. I found an old book, *The Sleep Book* by James Paupst who described the Buley rest formula for air travellers. Back in the sixties, Dr L Buley developed a rest formula to determine how long a person had to rest following a flight. The rest formula is relatively simple: It states that the sum of one-half flight duration (T) in hours, plus the number of time zones (z) crossed in excess of 4, plus two special co-efficients representing departure times, equals the required period of rest expressed in tenths of a day.  $T/2 + (z-4) + Cd + Ca = \text{rest period}$ .

If z is < 4 it is eliminated.

The departure and arrival co-efficients introduce gains and losses of time: the table follows:

Period of day (hrs)	Departure time co-efficient	Arrival time coefficient
0800-1159	0	4
1200-1759	1	2
1800-2159	3	0
2200-0059	4	1
0100-0759	3	3

For example, for a flight from London to Sydney, you travel across 10 time zones. If you depart at 20.00h on Monday, you will arrive in Sydney on Wednesday at 05.00h with a four hour stop-over in Singapore. Therefore, the equation would look like this:

$25/2 + (10-4) + 3 + 3 = \text{rest period}$ , therefore for this example it would be:

$12 + 6 + 3 + 3 = 24$ , divide 24 by 10 and this means that the required rest time is 2.4 days.

When using this formula, the following rules must be applied:

1. The answer in tenths of days should be rounded to the nearest ½ day. However rest stops amounting to less than a day will not be given unless it is an overnight flight.
2. Travel hours are the number of hours of elapsed time required for the journey.
3. Time zones are computed as increments of 15 degrees of longitude from Greenwich, UK.
4. Departure and arrival times are local.

So according to Buley, you would need to rest for approximately 52 hours following a flight from London to Sydney. Paupst states this formula has been used since 1967 and has benefited many travellers – provided, of course, that they are willing to give in to the fact that their biological clocks exert a force that is stronger than they are, either physically or psychologically. This was the most significant sentence of the whole chapter in the book.

Knowing that no one cannot win over the

biological clock and that the book about sleep was written in the seventies, I searched the net for some more up to date information. Remember that your body will eventually adjust to the new time zone. However, if you're on a quick trip or are required to be highly functional quickly after your flight, you may want to consider keeping these tips in mind.

- 1. Adapt quickly to your new time zone.** When you arrive at your destination, update everything to your new time zone as soon as possible. You'll have trouble at your destination if you continue to eat and sleep according to the old time zone. Eat meals and go to bed according to the time at your destination. This is especially important if your new time zone is more than 3 hours different than your old one.
- 2. Manage sleep time.** Make sure you sleep when it's most appropriate to your new schedule. Your flight may be in the air during your destination's nighttime, so try to log some sleep while airborne. A few things that'll help you rest include: noise-cancelling headphones, white noise, eye masks and ear plugs, comfortable travel pillows and blankets. Avoid the urge to nap when you arrive if it's daytime. This can make it difficult to sleep later on. If you must nap, try to keep it to no more than 15 to 20 minutes at a time.
- 3. Drink water.** Long-distance travel may cause dehydration. Stay hydrated and avoid alcohol.
- 4. Eat smaller meals.** Eat smaller meals to avoid stomach aches and other stomach problems, which can be symptoms of jet lag.
- 5. Try light.** Your exposure to light changes when

you travel and change time zones, which can interfere with your internal clock

- 6. Drink a caffeinated beverage.** Consuming caffeine won't cure jet lag, but it may be a tool to help you stay alert and focused during the daytime.
- 7. Keep your sleeping space comfortable.** Make sure that your sleeping arrangements while traveling are comfortable and facilitate proper sleep.

Your body clock will always win and you will eventually adjust to the new time zone, then you will have to travel home!

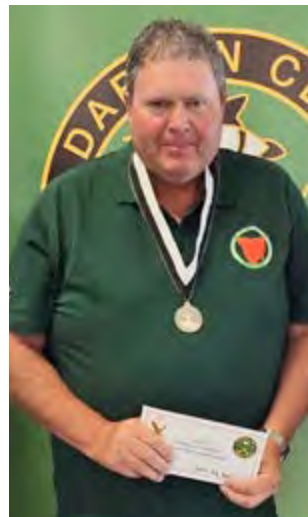
and the prize was taken home by Darwin's own Damian Butler.

misery.

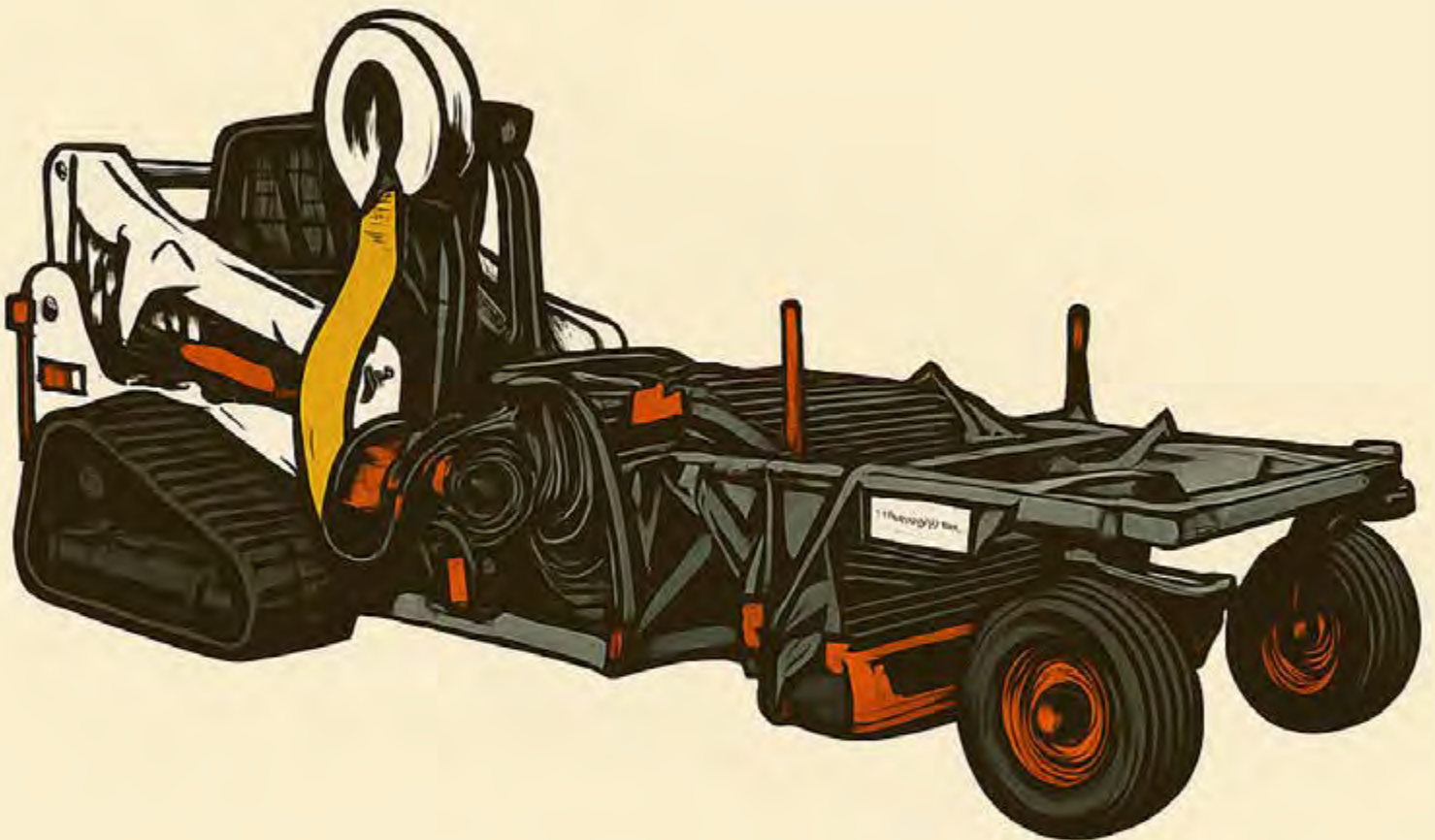
Champion of Champions was the very last event

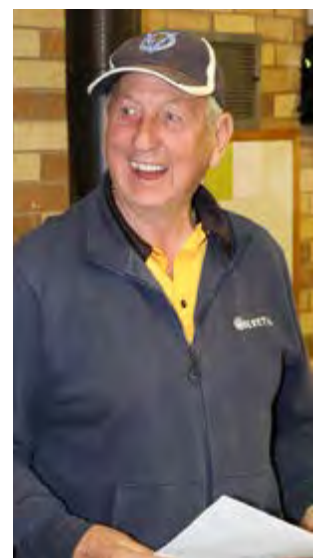
