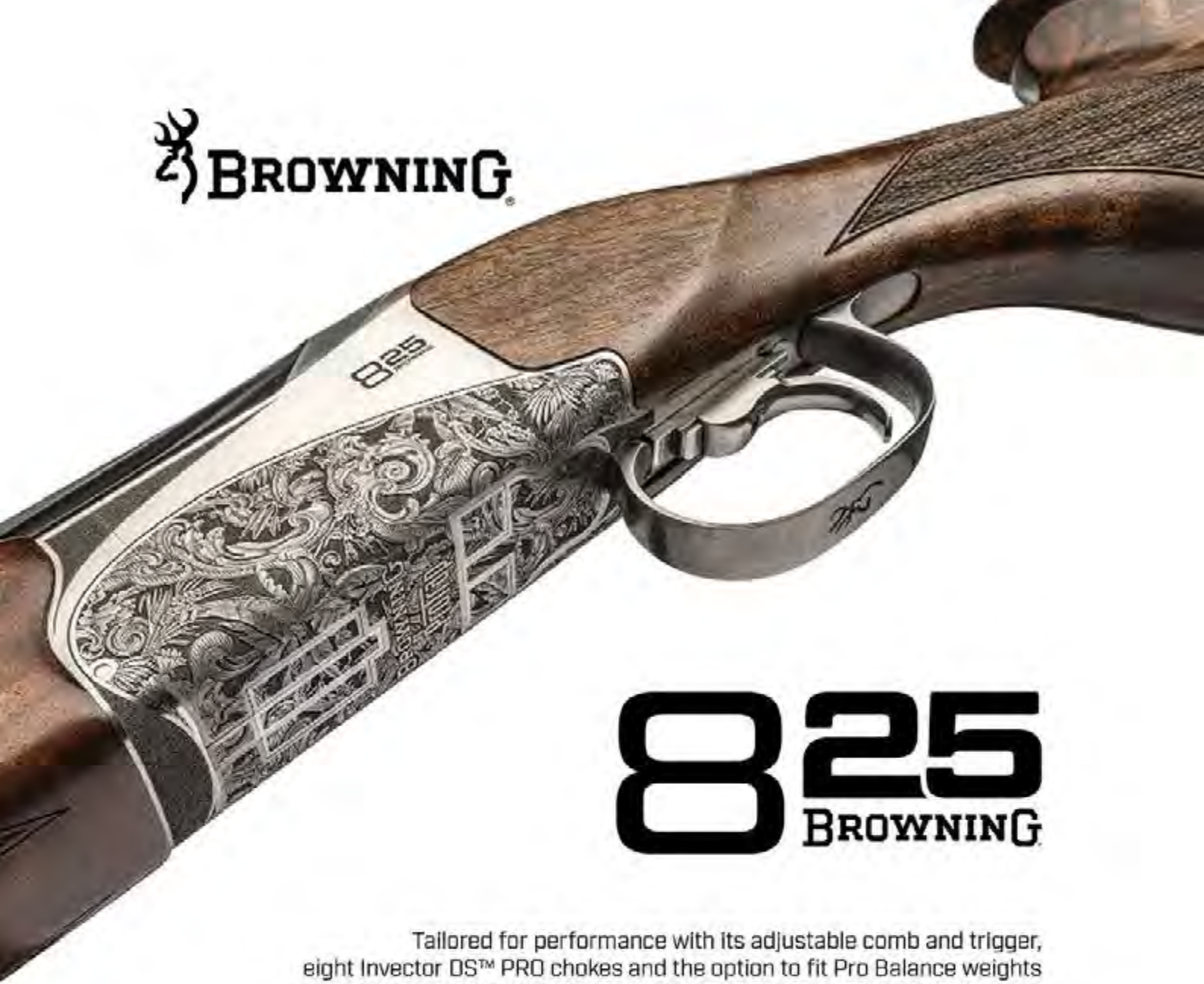

ACTA CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Michael Kruger-Davis – Chairman

The ACTA has never been an openly political body. All this changed with Bondi in December. The ACTA is a member of the Shooting Industry Foundation of Australia (SIFA) which includes companies such as Beretta, Winchester, Noia and member associations: ACTA, Sporting Clays Australia, Field and Game Australia, National Rifle Association of Australia, Pistol Australia, Australian Deer Shooters Association and the Shooters Union of Australia.

The Board agreed that being part of a collective group we would have greater input, and a more impactful use of financial and physical resources. In the aftermath of Bondi, during the NSW legislative debate, the ACTA was involved in the following. Glenn Kable spent two days at meeting with members of the Legislative Council of NSW going through the impacts of the proposed bill, Les and I met with the National Firearms Advisory Council and then joined the campaign to provide information to our members and encourage letters to parliamentarians. I was interviewed by the ABC Riverina regarding the proposed changes.

When the Federal Parliament was recalled in the new year the campaign ramped up again. The National Firearms Advisory Council began to mount an advertising and information campaign, increased push to contact members of parliament and senators. Glenn, Les and I were in meetings with the Home Affairs Department and requested they examine shooting vests, use of carrier services (internet) for information on reloading, firearm parts, etc and concerns that after the Bill was released, we only had 48 hours to respond. The ACTA was able to respond, firstly to our main concerns and then we managed to piggy-back off the National Firearm Advisory Council issues and get involved in the petitions and letter writing campaigns. We also met with Bridget McKenzie to outline our concerns and requested that there be a senate inquiry. Glenn Kable gave an interview on Sky News, and I did another interview with ABC Riverina Radio, Seven News Wagga and was also contacted by the Sydney Morning Herald. Next week we have been invited to a meeting with David Littleproud who is meeting with shooting organisations to see how

these Federal changes will impact on us in the real world.

We provided briefings to our members and state organisations either by email or through our Facebook account. For our membership, it may not have looked like the ACTA was doing much, but rest assured we were working overtime behind the scenes and in collaboration with SIFA as part of a larger, coordinated media, information and advertising campaign to get our message out to a greater audience.

Beretta Cup. *As I noted last month, to coincide with Beretta's 500th year anniversary, the competition will be held Compak format, 200 Targets, over 8 layouts. The event will be held on March 20 and 21, 2026 and Beretta have advertised \$60,000 prize money for the event. It was interesting to see The Beretta Cup being advertised by Sporting Shooters Association of Australia and the regular pop-ups on Facebook. Nominations are now open on MCMS and as of today there were 122 nominations with over 6 weeks before the competition begins.*

Memberships. *There has been a substantial upturn in membership so far this year. Since the membership year started in November, we have had over 1000 new members join the ACTA. The lure of the Beretta Cup for sporting shooters and the likelihood that to have a firearms licence you need to be a member of a gun club may be factors in the rise of memberships.*

World UT Championships. *Even though UT is not an ACTA discipline, the ACTA wishes all its members who are competing in the UT World Championships at Melbourne Gun Club the very best.*

ICTSF DTL World Championships. *On behalf of the ACTA, I would like to wish the Australian teams and all individually registered shooters competing in Christchurch the very best. I expect it will be a great competition.*

On a personal note, I unfortunately will not be able to attend this year's Skeet Nationals and ISSF Skeet Nationals as I have to undergo medical treatment. I look forward to catching up at the DTL nationals in April.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

2026 NATIONAL SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1 All shooters must present their current shooting licence/permit to the events office before competition. **Failure to do so will incur a penalty of one target.**
- 2 Any shooter wanting to compete in the "2026 Skeet Nationals" must be a registered competitor of the ACTA for the financial year 2026, or a "Bona Fide" International competitor.
- 3 Entry and pre-squadding is by pre-nomination only through **MCMS (MyClubsMyScores)**. The closing date for reduced nominations is 5.00pm Friday 6th March 2026. Pre-squadding preferences will only be accepted through online nominations up until 5.00pm Saturday 7th March 2026.
- 4 **Entries on the day will be taken in the events office at the Carnival for an additional \$20 per event, however squadding preferences will NOT be permitted.** Such entries will close prior to the advertised starting time for the day.
- 5 Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to it commencing will be eligible for a refund less a \$10 administration fee. **Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.**
- 6 **Squads who hold up following squads by taking longer than normal (20 minutes) will be sent to the practice trap to complete the round. Rule 7.1(d) (ii)**
- 7 **No competitor is entitled to view targets outside of the prescribed rules 1.21.5. Those competitors who do so will be penalized two targets.**
- 8 MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data, the decision will be made by the National MCMS Handicap Supervisor.
- 9 Any shooter not having shot at least 20 rounds in MCMS, could have their grade reviewed.
- 10 Squads of up to 5 competitors will shoot 50/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps as designated by the Tournament Director.
- 11 The National 28 Gauge Championship cartridge load is limited to a maximum of 21 Grams (3/4 oz), shot size not larger than no 7. The National .410 bore Championship cartridge load is limited to 14 Grams (1/2oz) shot size not larger than no 7.
- 12 Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at the 50 targets or 50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each bracket of targets. **Should the time limit be exceeded a penalty of the Loss of one target will occur.**
- 13 **Any shooter missing their squad and requiring re-squadding will be penalized one target.**
- 14 Should a shooter be late for his/her squad and elect to withdraw from the event they will not be eligible for any refund. **It is the shooters responsibility to make sure they are where they should be and when.**
- 15 All competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. **While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, the penalty of a loss of one target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the loss of one target.**
- 16 **Any competitor interfering with or attempting to interfere with the traps will be penalized five targets.**
- 17 All appeals must be lodged in writing with the Tournament Director together with a \$50 appeal fee. The Tournament Director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned.
- 18 When Team selection is involved shooters will automatically represent in the highest team they qualify for. Team selection criteria available on the ACTA website.
- 19 Eligible competitors are entitled to receive awards in Open, Women, Sub-Junior, Junior, Senior or Veterans section, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
- 20 There must be a minimum of two competitors in sections or grades, including High Guns to constitute a competition.
- 21 Section & grade prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd provided they meet clause 19. Shoot offs will occur for team & graded events. Count back will be used for 2nd & 3rd in categories such as Women, Sub-Junior, Junior, Senior or Veterans.
- 22 Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the ACTA Board, their decision shall be final.
- 23 ACTA dress code is to be adhered to, Tournament Director is to adjudicate, failure to comply will result in disqualification.
- 24 **All competitors must comply with the Firearms Laws of the State hosting the National Championships.**
- 25 Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.
- 26 Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.
- 27 A junior who has not previously competed at a National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to shoot for the cost of the administration fee of \$10 per event. Claim for this concession can be made at the event or within 14 days of the completion of the event, ie; by Friday 27th March 2026.
- 28 The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Tournament Director and trap mechanic prior to the start of the events daily. No further adjustment will be made without authorization of the Tournament Director or Shoot Marshal.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

2026 ACTA ISSF SKEET CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 1 All competitors must present their current shooting licence/permit to the events office before competition. **Failure to do so will incur a penalty of one (1) target.**
- 2 **The National ISSF Championships will be conducted under the ISSF rules governing International Competitions. ACTA dress rules to apply.**
- 3 Any shooter wanting to compete in the “2026 ISSF Skeet Nationals” must be a registered competitor member of the ACTA for the financial year 2026, hold a current shooting licence/permit (all Junior Shooters must hold a valid Junior permit), or be a bonified International competitor holding Australian documents that allow the use of firearms for target shooting.
- 4 **Entry and pre-squadding is by pre-nomination only through MCMS (MyClubsMyScores).** Closing date for nominations is 5.00pm Saturday the 14th March 2026. Squadding will be published on MCMS Sunday the 15th March 2026.
- 5 Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to it commencing will be eligible for a refund less a \$10 administration fee. **Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.**
- 6 MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data for a competitor, they will be graded after their first four (4) rounds. Shooters not having shot 20 rounds in MCMS may be regraded.
- 7 Squads of up to 6 competitors will shoot a total of 125 targets per event, in brackets of 25 targets, shot one visit to a trap each 25.
- 8 Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at 25 targets.
- 9 **If a shooter misses their squad they may be re-squadded, however that is not guaranteed and will incur a three (3) target penalty if they are re-squadded.**
- 10 All competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. **While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, the penalty of a loss of one (1) target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person. Failure to either referee or score will incur a penalty of the loss of one (1) target in the next event.** Should a competitor not be shooting a following event then the penalty will apply in the event concerned.
- 11 No competitor may interfere with or attempt to interfere with the traps, any competitor doing so will be automatically disqualified.
- 12 All appeals must be lodged in writing with the Technical Delegate, together with the \$80 appeal fee. The Technical Delegate shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld, the fee will be returned. If the appeal is not upheld the ACTA will retain the fee.
- 13 Entrants in the Mens and Womens Championships are entitled to receive awards in Junior and Veteran sections as well as grades if applicable.
- 14 Sectional & grade prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd, with 2nd & 3rd place decided by count back.
- 15 Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.
- 16 Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.
- 17 The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Technical Director prior to the start of the events each day. No further adjustment will be made without the authorization of the Technical Director.
- 18 A junior who has not previously competed at a National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to shoot for the cost of the administration fee of \$10 per event. Claim for this concession can be made at the event or within 14 days of the completion of the event, ie; by Friday 3rd April 2026.
- 19 The ACTA reserves the right to alter any conditions of the competition should it become necessary. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the ACTA Board, their decision shall be final.
- 20 By attending the National Championships you will allow the use of photo's and/or video's taken of yourself for advertising or promotional purposes. This will extend to juniors provided the taking of the photo's/video's are in accordance with use and purpose of the ACTA by-laws and policies.

2. Any shooter wanting to compete in the "2026 Trap Nationals" must be a registered competitor of the ACTA for the financial year 2026, or a bonified International competitor.
3. **Entry and pre-squadding is by pre-nomination only through MCMS (MyClubsMyScores).** The closing date for reduced nominations is 5.00 pm Friday 10th April 2026. Pre-squadding preferences will only be accepted through online nominations up until 5.00 pm Saturday 11th April 2026.
4. **Entries on the day will be taken in the events office at the Carnival for an additional \$20 per event, however squadding preferences will NOT be permitted.** Such entries will close prior to the advertised starting time for the day.
5. Competitors who advise their withdrawal from an event prior to it commencing will be eligible for a refund less a \$10 administration fee. **Competitors who withdraw after the commencement of an event will not be entitled to any refund for that event.**
6. MCMS will automatically grade all entrants, in the case of insufficient data the decision will be made by the National MCMS Handicap Supervisor.
7. Any shooter not having shot at least 20 rounds in MCMS, could have their grade reviewed.
8. Squads of up to 6 competitors will shoot 50/75/100 targets in brackets of 25 targets or pairs, one or two visits only to the traps. The National Handicap event is to be shot as 5 (five) person squads, 5 targets per lane then change lanes.
9. Shooters will be squadded as per ACTA rules and regulations and any interpretation of this will be the responsibility of the Tournament Director.
10. Each shooter is to take enough cartridges to shoot at the 50/75 targets or 50 pairs. A time limit of two minutes will be imposed for the changeover for each bracket of targets. Should the time limit be exceeded a penalty of the **Loss of one target will occur.**
11. **Any shooter missing their squad and requiring re-squadding will be penalized one target.**
12. Should a shooter be late for his/her squad and elect to withdraw from the event they will not be eligible for any refund. **It is the shooters responsibility to make sure they are where they should be and when.**
13. All competitors are to check and sign the score sheet after each bracket. Once a shooter has signed their score sheet, the score is accepted. Any score sheet not signed by the shooter will be credited with the score as recorded.
14. All competitors will be required to referee/score during the period of competition. The persons designated to referee/score must fulfill their obligation to do so. **While replacement referees and scorers are permissible, if the replacement does not fulfil the obligation, the penalty of a loss of one target for failing to officiate will be made against the officially designated person.** Failure to either referee or score **will incur a penalty of the loss of one target** in the next event. Should a competitor not be shooting a following event then the penalty will apply in the event concerned.
15. Any unauthorized shooter interfering with or attempting to interfere with the trap **will be penalized five targets.**
16. All appeals must be lodged in writing with the tournament director together with a \$50 appeal fee. The Tournament director shall arrange a jury hearing and should the appeal be upheld the fee will be returned.
17. Mackintosh and World DTL selection will be as per ACTA selection criteria listed on the ACTA website. Shooters will automatically represent in the highest team they qualify for.
18. State shoulder to shoulder representatives may only represent in one team section.
19. Eligible competitors are entitled to receive awards in Open, Women, Junior, Senior or Veterans sections, however the overall winner cannot take any grade prize.
20. There must be a minimum of two competitors in sections or grades, for any prizes to be awarded.
21. Section prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd with placing for 2nd and 3rd decided by count back.
22. Any interpretation of the program and conditions of entry will be the responsibility of attending members of the Board, their decision shall be final.
23. ACTA dress code is to be adhered to, Tournament Director is to adjudicate
24. **All competitors must comply with the Firearms Laws of the State hosting the National Championships.**
25. Payment of the nomination only entitles the shooter to enter the event. Changes to the program including the number of targets shot will not entitle competitors to a refund.
26. Squadding details will be available on MCMS. It is the shooters responsibility to monitor for changes.
27. A junior who has not previously competed at a National Championship in any discipline shall be entitled to shoot for the cost of the administration fee of \$10 per event. Claim for this concession can be made at the event or within 14 days of the completion of the event, ie; by Thursday 30th April 2026.
28. The setting of targets will be under the direction of the Tournament Director and trap mechanic prior to the start of the events daily. No further adjustment will be made without authorization of the Tournament Director or Shoot Marshal.
29. "Para" category refers to shooters having a disability that restricts shooting. A definition will be released before the commencement of the Championships.
30. Five sighter pairs of targets across the lanes will be given will be given to each shooter in the National Double Rise.

2026 National Trap Championships

12 April – 19 April 2026

To be staged at the ACTA National Ground, Tasman Road Wagga Wagga, by the Australian Clay Target Association.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

Entry

Entry into the 2026 Australian Trap Championships is open to all shooters who are registered for 2026 with the Australian Clay Target Association. Temporary honorary membership will be offered to overseas visitors who can produce evidence that he or she is a current financial member of their home country's equivalent body to the Australian Clay Target Association. Overseas Associations must be affiliated with the ICTSF. All shooters must produce a valid shooting licence or permit.

Categories

The competition will be divided into separate Categories for Women, Juniors, Sub Juniors, Senior and Veterans, except the Grand Australian Handicap where places shall be awarded from 1 to 5. Any eligible competitor paying nominations are entitled to receive awards in the Open Section, Women's, Juniors, Sub Junior, Senior or Veterans sections; however, the overall winner cannot take any grade prize. A minimum of two persons must compete in any grade or section before trophies are awarded.

When Mackintosh team selection is involved, the top 25 shooters from the Double Barrel, Single Barrel and Points Score events will make up the Open Team. Sections teams will be selected from those eligible from the next highest scores. To be eligible for selection or naming in any team, competitors must have competed in a clear majority of programmed events.

Age Qualifications

National Competition

Competitors must be over the age of 12, or compliant with state laws.

Sub Juniors – to be under the age of 15 years on the date of competition

Juniors – to be under the age of 18 years on the date of competition

Senior – to be a minimum of 55 years of age and under 65 years of age on the date of competition

Veterans – to be a minimum of 65 years of age on the date of competition

International Team Selection

Juniors – to be under 21 years of age as of the 1st January in the year of competition ie: 2027

Seniors – to be over 55 years of age and under 65 years of age as of the 1st January in the year of competition ie: 2027

Veterans – to be over 65 years of age as of the 1st January in the year of competition ie: 2027

Starting Time

Each day's event shall commence at 8.30am or as otherwise advised.

Shooters who fail to appear in time for their squad may forfeit their nomination. Shooters who fail to be at their squad on time will be required to shoot at an allocated trap at a time suitable to management. Should a shooter being late for his squad then elect to withdraw from the event, they will not be eligible for any refund of nominations. Shooters who miss their squad and require re-squadding, will be penalised with the loss of one target.

Cartridges

For all events, excluding the Grand Australian Handicap, load size for all National Title events is limited to 28gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. For the Grand Australian Handicap load size is limited to 32gr struck measure shot size not larger than No.6. Cartridges of the competitor's choice, including re-loads, may be used in all National Championships. Cartridges will be available for purchase at the National Championships. Random checks may be carried out.

Target and Traps

Targets thrown throughout the program are to be as determined by the ACTA. All targets thrown remain the property of the organisers. All throwing equipment will be electronically operated.

Classification

It is the responsibility of the competitor to see that their entry is correctly classified – an indication can be obtained from the daily scoreboard or refer MCMS. This applies to Sub-Junior, Junior, Women, Senior and Veteran categories.

Major Sponsors

The Association gratefully acknowledges the generous support received from sponsors.

Practice

Practice may be available throughout the championships.

Shoot-offs, Continuation of Events

Where more than one squad participates in a shoot-off, they may commence shooting together on different traps providing management deems that situation equitable. The shoot-offs will continue under the event format until a winner has been determined or at the discretion of the Tournament Director a different format is required to finalise the event. Where necessary, shoot-offs will be conducted until a winner has been determined or until such time as the Tournament director decides. In such a case the competition will recommence where it left off on the following day.

Authority

This program shall control the 2026 Australian Trap Championships. The shooting rules of the Australian Clay Target Association will govern all points not otherwise provided for. The ACTA, reserves the right to, at its discretion at any time prior to the commencement of any event on the 2026 National Trap Championships program, to change or modify the program in any way.

Appeals

All appeals subject to Jury Rule 1.22(a) & (b)

Services and Facilities

Catering:

Arrangements have been made for meal services to be available with an extensive but practical menu.

Trade Displays:

Commercial organisations have supported the tournament by establishing displays of products.

These displays will be located in an area specifically designated for trade exhibits. 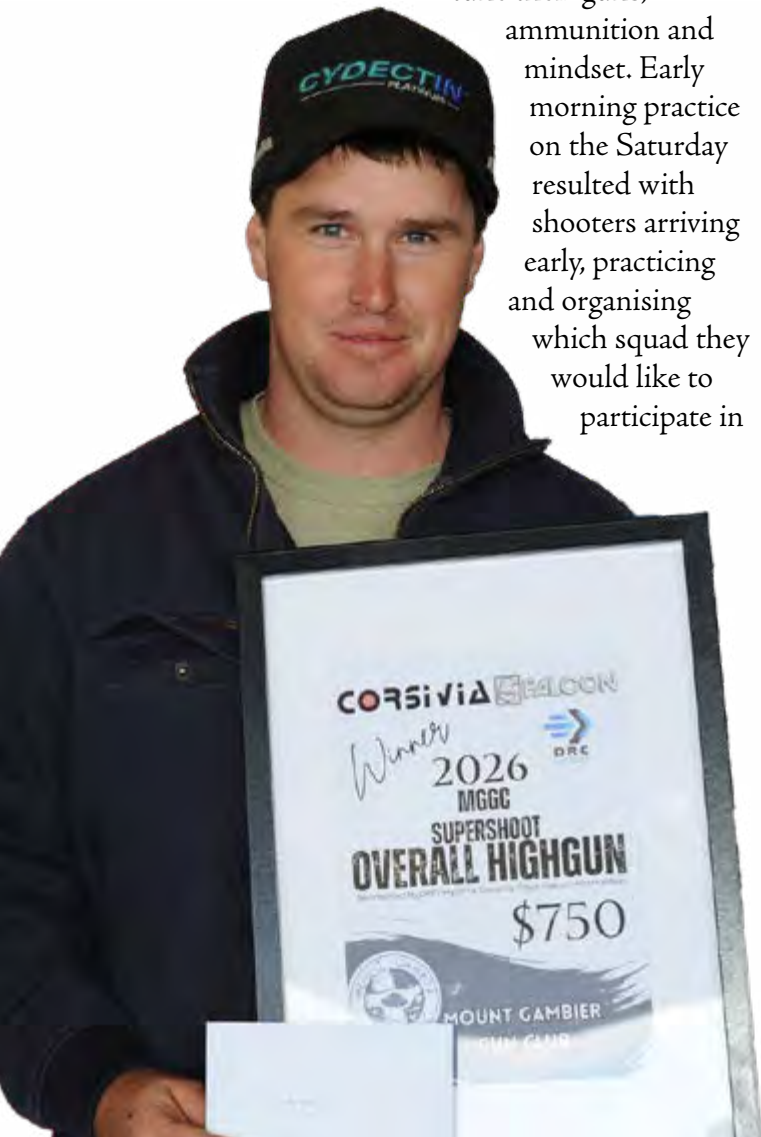
Mount Gambier Supershoot

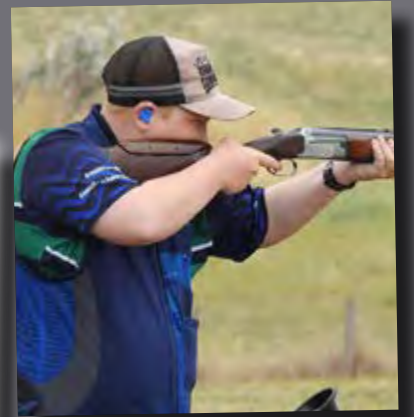

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Dealing with injury

This month I have gone back to a trusted textbook because I need to research the psychology of recovery from injuries and rehab. There is a personal reason for this. By the time you are reading this article, I will have undergone open heart surgery to have two coronary arteries bypassed. As this is not a minor treatment and because I will not be able to shoot for some time, six to eight months, I thought it best to look at what the psychological aspects of recovery might be.

Clay target shooting is not a very dangerous sport. We have very few injuries, mainly because of our adherence to strict safety protocols. Other than what recoil might do to your shoulder or your mind, we do not get battered every time we go out to shoot. Because we don't get injured, like a footballer, or skiers, when we are shooting, our injuries tend to be from hip and knee replacements, pacemakers, bypasses, skin cancers, etc.

What are the emotional reactions to injuries?

Stage Model. This model argues that we go through a set sequence of emotional responses similar to grief. When we are injured, we are shocked, numb, and then we get angry. We get angry at what we did or what happened to cause the injury. This is a normal and natural response to an abnormal event.

Another stage is that we become depressed: this is not clinical depression but is a feeling of being 'down' because we can't do what we want to do or can't do what we had been able to do before the accident, injury or operation. Stage theories are not linear. That is, we do not always go from stage one to stage two, and so on. Being human means we think about what is happening to us and it is more likely we go back and forth up and back through the stages depending on our thoughts, moods and reactions.

Cognitive-Appraisal Model. This model states that the emotional response to the injury, accident or treatment is determined by the meaning, or appraisal, that the individual attributes to an event. Basically, it is not the things in life that affect us but how we think

of them'. A person's cognitive appraisal of the situation determines his or her emotional response, which then sets the stage for how they will behave: how they react to non-participation, rehabilitation, changes in ability, aging, etc.

How can we cope with injuries and navigate a return to shooting.

The problem with open heart surgery is that there will be a considerable time when I will not be able to shoot. Since I've been on this journey I have been learning and revising skills to help the rehabilitation process.

Seek information. This I have done and from several sources: surgeon (what is involved in the operation), nurse practitioner (hospital experience, post op interventions, rehab timeline, etc), GP (pain management), exercise physiologist (breathing exercises, strength exercises), psychologists (who to deal with the anxiety) and others who have had a similar experiences and how they navigated the process.

Return to aerobic activity as soon as possible. The go to exercise for this procedure is to get up and walk as soon as possible. This is good as walking can be easy or hard, steady or graduated and gets you out in the sun and fresh air, and where I live the finding good coffee on my walk will be easy.

Learn to differentiate different types of pain. I am really not sure about this one, but I hope that when the time comes to shoot again, I will be able to tell the difference between the discomfort of strenuous exercise and the pain of reinjuring damaged tissue. Meditation and self-hypnosis are essential tools to limiting and dealing with pain.

Use the time off from competition as an opportunity. During my time off I can gradually build on the physical skills and focus on the mental skills that will be required to compete again.

Learn skills to facilitate rehab

- *Goal setting.* Have a plan (with the help of the rehab team) of where and when I want to be as each week or month goes by. Evaluate and adjust these goals as each milestone is reached or otherwise.

- *Relaxation techniques.* Relaxation can facilitate pain management, dealing with anxiety, thought management, imagery and the healing process.
- *Imagery.* Imagery is an essential mental skill for adhering to a rehabilitation program, as well as promoting the actual healing of the damaged tissues. I have used imagery when assisting clients undergoing chemotherapy for cancer, so I should be able to develop a imagery tool to assist with my chest bones knitting.
- *Thought management.* It is important to reframe the rehab experience as a gain not a loss. I am not loosing time away from my sport, but I will be gaining vitality, energy and hopefully more time to shoot in the years to come.
- *Ensure confidence by a graduated return to competition.* For a clay target shooter who has experienced a major trauma to the chest, recoil and the fear of pulling the trigger will be a big problem. Fortunately, I have a plan for when I will be allowed to shoot again. Firstly, just picking up and mounting the gun. Over and over and over again.

Once I feel ready (and I have the go ahead from the Doctor) I will shoot some skeet using a .410 (no recoil) and when ready progress to a 28 gauge and then 20 gauge before going back to 12 gauge and the trap and Compak disciplines.

My apologies for using this article to focus on my impending operation and subsequent convalescing, but as I have spoken with friends and let them know what am about to go through, I am hearing stories telling me, “ yes, I had a by pass several years ago” or “my mother, father, sister, etc had that years ago and they are fine now,” and as this procedure is significant but rather common place now, there may be may others out there about to go through the same journey I am on right now.

Australian Trap Team wins Gold, Silver, Bronze

AMIR ISSF Shotgun Grand Prix in Qatar

Australia celebrated a stunning surge of success at the AMIR ISSF Shotgun Grand Prix, delivering a powerful statement on the international stage. Competing against some of the world's leading shotgun athletes at the world-class Lusail Shooting Complex in Doha, Qatar, the Australian Shotgun Trap Team produced a series of composed and confident performances, converting strong qualification rounds into multiple finals appearances and an impressive medal return.

In the Junior Men's Trap competition, Victorian athletes Benjamin De Pedro and Lucas Furlan delivered outstanding performances to reach the final.

Both athletes posted qualification scores of 111 out of 125, ranking sixth and eighth respectively to secure their finals berths in a tightly contested field.

In the high-scoring final, and his international final debut, De Pedro rose to the occasion with an exceptional display of composure, hitting 27 of 30 targets to claim the gold medal. He finished just one target ahead of Assylkhan Aisalbayev (KAZ), who secured silver.

Of his first international medal win in the Men's Trap event, De Pedro excitedly reflected, "Winning a medal in my first international final is an amazing feeling. I'm very proud of my result and have learnt a lot throughout this experience."

Summarising his experience in Doha, and the opportunity to travel with senior Australian athletes, De Pedro said, "Doha has been a great learning experience. Being able to watch how the senior team conducts themselves at a world-class competition has been incredibly valuable. I am extremely grateful for the opportunity to learn from the senior athletes and coaches, as I believe this has really enhanced

my ability and understanding of the sport.”

De Pedro’s proud mum Brooke reflected on her son’s journey in the sport; “Since the day he shot his first target, his passion and commitment for the sport has continually grown, but what really stands out is his genuine love for the sport and competition. We are so proud of his achievement in Doha and is truly reflective of his commitment to succeeding in the sport he loves.”

Furlan’s performance in the Junior Men’s Trap final was equally impressive. Dropping only three targets in the final, he finished with 22 out of 25 to claim

the bronze medal, completing a remarkable double podium finish for Australia in the Junior Men’s Trap event.

“Competing at the 2026 Amir Grand Prix was an invaluable experience and an important step forward in my shooting journey. Gaining international competition exposure and being immersed in a senior high-performance environment gave me an understanding of what it takes to prepare for, and perform, at major events”, Furlan said.

In the Women’s Trap event, Penny Smith and Laetisha Scanlan showcased their experience against a competitive field.

Both shot a qualification score of 115 out of 125, ranking 7th and 8th, progressing through to the final. Kiara Dean narrowly missed out on the final finishing with a score of 113 in 12th place.

Into the final Scanlan delivered a composed performance, hitting 25 of 30 targets to finish level with Italy’s Alessia Iezzi. With the scores tied, a sudden-death shoot-off was required to determine the gold and silver medals. Iezzi edged ahead, shooting five targets to Scanlan’s four. Scanlan’s silver medal capped a strong campaign and added to Australia’s impressive medal tally in Doha.

Reflecting on her start to the 2026 international season, Scanlan said, “For me, Qatar was always about setting a strong foundation for the season. My main goal was to use this competition as an opportunity to really focus on my fundamentals in a high-pressure, international setting.”

With the LA 2028 Olympic qualification period to commence later this year, Scanlan said, “With the World Championships being held here [Lusail Shooting Complex] later this year and Olympic quota places for LA 2028 on the line, it was important to treat this event as part of the bigger picture. Being able to compete on the same range that will host the

World Championships in November and the first opportunity to secure LA 2028 Olympic quotas is an invaluable experience.”

Scanlan expressed her joy at medal wins from the two Junior Team members, “I’m incredibly happy for Ben and Lucas to come away with medals at this event. They’re both very talented athletes with huge futures ahead of them, and it was fantastic to see them perform so well on the international stage under finals pressure.”

2025 Amir Grand Prix gold medallist Smith shot 16 out of 20 in this year’s Women’s Trap final to finish in fourth place.

Competition was fierce in the Men’s Trap event, with the Australian team narrowly missing a place in the final despite some strong qualification performances.

Nathan Argiro led the charge for Australia, shooting 120 out of 125 — just one target shy of securing a finals berth.

Reigning 2025 gold medallist James Willett posted 119, while Gabe Sensi recorded 116. Milad Nasr finished on 115, with Marco Corbo and Thomas

Grice each shooting 114 out of 125.

Shooting Australia’s Shotgun Program Manager, Adam Hosking, reflected on the performances at the Amir Grand Prix and the objectives of Australia’s representation at this competition.

“It is fantastic to have Laetisha Scanlan, Benjamin De Pedro and Lucas Furlan win medals at this competition. With the World Championships to be held on this same range in November this year, the AMIR Grand Prix provided an early opportunity in preparation to again compete at this venue.”

Being able to include Juniors as part of the Australian Team in Doha, Hosking said, “The Amir Grand Prix also included a Junior competition which allowed us to integrate the Senior and Junior athletes together at the one competition. I am sure each athlete has taken some key learnings from this competition which will be important as we progress through a very busy and long season.”

As the team looks ahead to upcoming ISSF competitions, the results in Doha mark an exciting start to the international season, highlighting Australia’s depth, preparation and growing presence in elite shotgun competition.

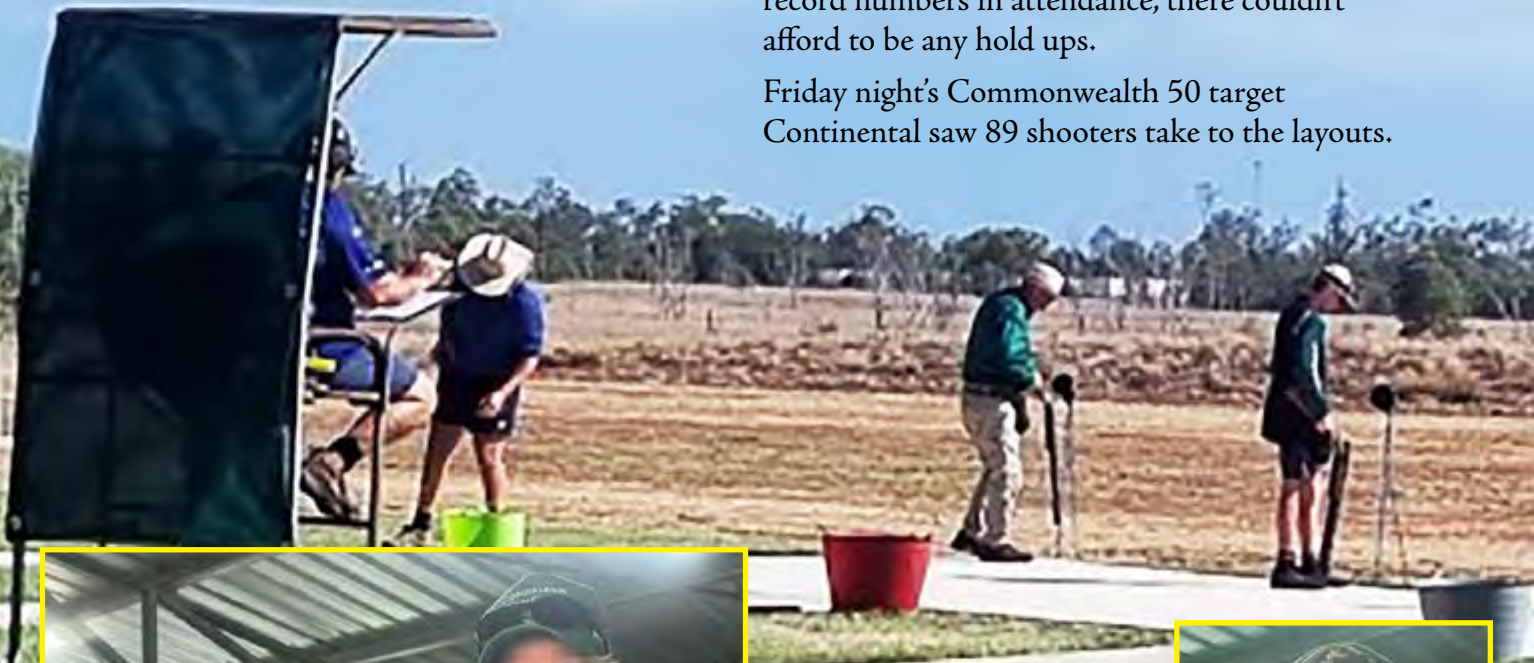
Condamine Annual Two Day Carnival

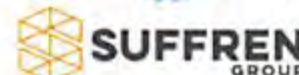

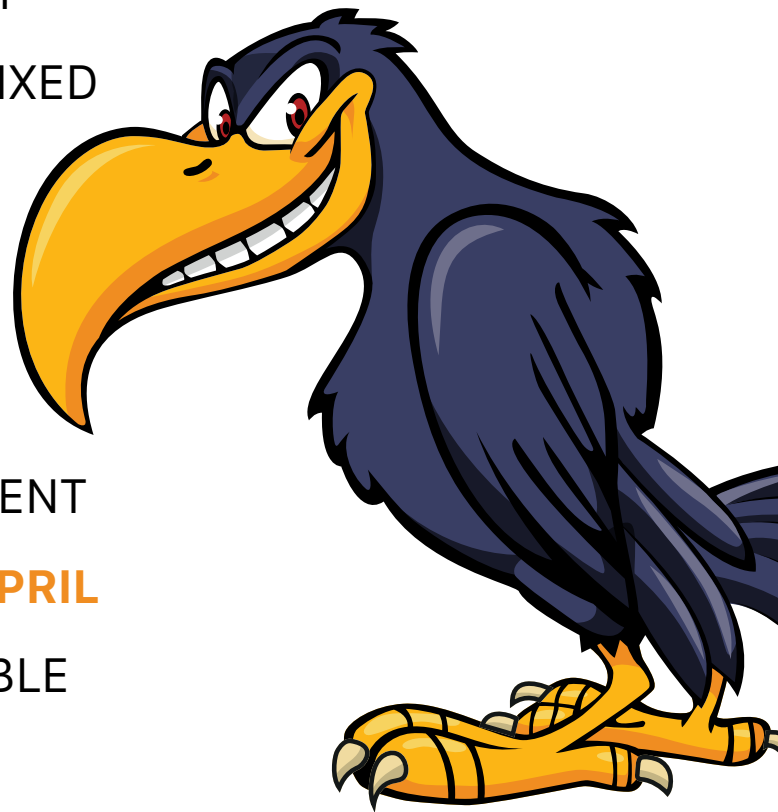

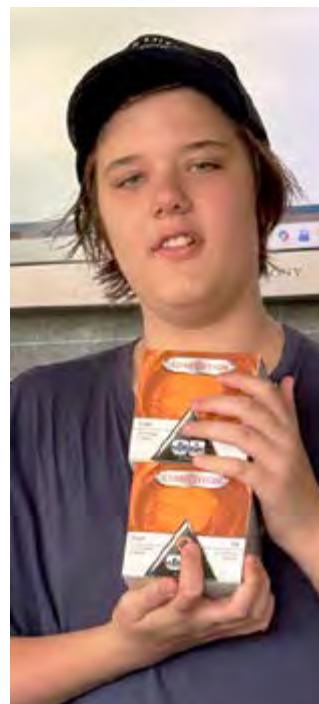
