GOLD AND SILVER FOR AUSTRALIA

Golden Day in Buenos Aires for Australia's Penny Smith

At the Buenos Aires, Argentinean ISSF World Cup recently, Paris Olympic bronze medallist, Penny Smith, secured the gold medal in the Women's Trap event.

In the first World Cup of the 2025 season, Smith shot a qualification score of 121 out of 125 targets; equal top qualifier with Italy's Silvana Stanco. With a finals berth confirmed, Smith and Stanco entered a sudden death shoot-off to determine who would wear bib number 1 in the final. Shooting 5 shots to Stanco's 4, Smith secured the premier bib which



holds significance in determining elimination ties in the final.

In the Men's Trap competition, fellow Australian Mitch Iles also shot a leading qualification score of 121 out of 125, and secured bib number 2 for the final.

Of their qualification score and the strong wind conditions, Smith and Iles reflected, "It was good to shoot 121 in trying conditions. The weather has been challenging for the past 3 days and it wasn't much easier in the final."

With qualification held over three days instead of the typical two days, when asked if this changes their process, Smith and Iles said, "No, it is all the same and you just have to focus for an extra day."

In the Women's final, Smith missed a few targets early on before demonstrating her competitive strength and determination to take the lead, only missing 1 target in the last 31. Finishing the final with a score of 44 out of 50 targets, 2 targets

ahead of silver medallist Carey Garrison (USA), Smith said, "It was a solid final with the weather a challenge but I just had to keep working my way through. My back half of the final was really good."

Chinese Taipei's Wan-Yu Liu took the women's bronze medal.

Following his impressive qualification score, Iles shot 18 out of 25 targets in the first phase of the men's final and was eliminated in sixth position, his equal best performance in a senior World Cup. Asking what key takeaways he has from competition, 26 year old Iles reflected, "If I do my best, it will be enough to get me into the final."

The other Australians competing in the individual men's and women's trap events included James Willett, Gabe Sensi, Milad Nasr, Kiara Dean and Laetisha Scanlan. With one day of competition remaining in Buenos Aires, Smith and Iles will join forces to compete in the Trap Mixed Teams event later today. When asked if preparation is any different for a team event they said, "No, we will do the best we can in the mixed teams event. Everything is the same as an individual event." Willett and Dean will compete as the second Australian Team.

The Buenos Aires World Cup is one of two backto-back South American World Cups this month. The Australian Shotgun Team travels to Peru for the Lima World Cup in the coming days and Smith and Iles said, "We will have a few quiet days of rest before we leave for Peru then we will hopefully get some training on the range when we arrive and back into the swing of competition."

World Cup Silver for Australian Duo Penny Smith and Mitch lles

The Buenos Aires ISSF World Cup came to close with the Australian Shotgun Team adding to its medal tally, winning a silver medal in the Trap Mixed Team event.

On the back of their strong individual trap performances and finals berths the day prior, Victorians Penny Smith and Mitch Iles combined competitive forces overnight to contest the Mixed Team event.

The duo were required to shoot 75 targets each across 3 rounds of 25 to combine a qualification score out of 150 targets. At the end of qualification Smith and Iles scored a total of 143, placing them equal second qualifiers with 3 other teams. They

then entered a shoot off to determine which team would join Chinese Taipei in the Gold Medal match. After an additional 8 targets, Smith and Iles secured their Gold Medal match place. The second Australian Team of Kiara Dean and James Willett finished qualification on 140/150, placing 8th.

In an extremely close Gold Medal match contest, and with just ten targets for each team to go, Chinese Taipei led 37 targets to Australia's 35. With Smith and Iles hitting all ten of their remaining targets, and Chinese Taipei missing 2, this meant both teams were tied on a score of 45 at the end of the 50 target match. Entering a sudden death shoot off to determine who would take home the Gold and Silver medals, the Australian's missed their 5th target to win the silver medal, with Chinese Taipei securing gold. Italy secured the bronze medal.

Speaking to the performances in the Gold Medal match, Olympic Shotgun Coach, Renae Birgan, said "There was some incredible shooting done in tough conditions and both teams delivered a performance in the final worthy of a gold medal."

Of Smith's individual gold medal win the day prior and Iles making the Men's Trap final in Buenos Aires, Birgan said, "I am incredibly proud of these two athletes for backing up their individual performances from the previous day. Today they gave it everything they had left and more."

The Australian Shotgun Team will now have a couple of days rest before departing for Lima, Peru where the second World Cup of the 2025 season will commence on 13 April.

With the move from ACTA 5 Stand Sporting to ACTA Compak Sporting and with the National ACTA Compak Sporting Championship to be held at the National Ground, Wagga Wagga on November 21–23, States were left little time to conduct their individual State events. A major difference will be the make-up of the State Shoulder to Shoulder Teams. Under the new format competing State Teams will be made up of the best 3 Open shooters, 1 Lady, 1 Junior and 1 Veteran or Master member. From these 2025 Compak Nationals Teams will be selected to represent Australia overseas in 2026.

Since the introduction of the National ACTA 5 Stand Championship, the first Championship being held in 1994, States where possible have had their representative teams attend.

Victoria has been without exception represented at all Nationals with outstanding Teams and the conduct of the Victorian State Sporting Championship has alternated between Maryborough and Bendigo. With this year's event being Bendigo's turn in rotation, members immediately sprang into action and organised all aspects of the Championship. Athletes are then allocated to a tier of categorisation (i.e. Podium, Podium Ready, Podium Potential, Developing and Emerging) that reflects their current performance level and their potential to progress to podium level performance in the future. This in turn informs the financial and other support that will be provided to them during the year by Shooting Australia and the National Institute Network (NIN), including the AIS.

Shooting Australia's Chief Executive Officer, Adam Sachs, explains, "The athletes selected for categorisation in 2025 have delivered performances that demonstrate they're on track to qualify for the Olympics or Paralympics and are capable of producing successful performances at the Games. These are the athletes that Shooting Australia and the high-performance system will prioritise for access to opportunities and resources. We congratulate the 19 athletes who have been categorised for 2025."

Through the categorisation process, categorised athletes are granted a range of benefits to help develop and drive their success. These benefits include access to performance support through the NIN, opportunities to engage in National Squad and other development activities, priority access to selected fully funded international competitions, and direct athlete funding through Shooting Australia's Categorised Athlete Support Program

Adam Sachs highlights, "Shooting Australia is proud of the significant financial investment that it continues to make in categorised athletes, both in terms of direct funding and funding to cover the costs of engagement in international competitions. The level of financial support that categorised athletes receive is dependent on their tier of categorisation. Shooting Australia is committed to providing this ongoing support for its athletes that exceeds the opportunities provided by many other sports."

Psychological Skills for Shooting

Lies we keep living by

Often when we fail, and for shooters that will mean missing targets, we beat ourselves up. We look at our performance and we make value judgements about ourselves and our performance We often come to the conclusion that we are a failure because we didn't 'win', or shoot well.

One current approach to dealing with everyday problems that humans face is called 'cognitivebehaviour therapy'. Put simply, this approach refers to our behaviours being influenced or affected by our thinking. If our thinking causes problem behaviours, then changing the thoughts will lead to behaviours changing.

As a cognitive-behavioural therapist, this is important when helping clients deal with the issues they bring to counselling. This is also important in helping athletes improve their skills and performance. For example, if a shooter doesn't like right hand swingers, then it's likely that his thoughts will tell him he cannot shoot them. This may cause him to tense up and doubt his ability to shoot the target when he sees it. The combination of tension and self-doubt will lead to him miss the target and reinforce his belief that he cannot shoot these targets.

In her book 'Great Lies we live by,' written by Dr Stephanie Burns, she examines the lies that we often tell ourselves if or when we don't succeed. This book, is essential reading as part of the Parelli Natural Horsemanship course, which believes you will be a better horseman if you can understand how horses think and behave. Stephanie Burns has a background in teaching adults and together with Linda and Pat Parelli they have put together a program to get people to enjoy their sport more by understanding both the horse and themselves more. The book is written in two parts and I want to examine the first part which explores the lies we tell ourselves that hinder our ability to learn, grow and develop. For clay target shooters we can never understand the target or a trap because they are inanimate objects, but if we can understand our mind, well...

As you read down the list of lies that impact on our ability, remember that when we shoot, we are in fact learning and trying to improve: be it to win a national championship or achieve a personal best. These lies get in the way of learning, improving and having fun.

Lie No. 1 I am stupid. Whilst you might think you are stupid, look at what you have learned over your lifetime. We are all learning all the time. Believing that your stupid only gives you an excuse not to try to learn because you think that you will not be able to meet your expectations or the expectations of others.

Lie No. 2 I am a failure. Failing is an interesting concept. Whilst it is possible that we do not pass an exam, this doesn't mean that we are a failure. It may mean that we didn't prepare properly, we were anxious, or we hadn't generalised the skills well enough. Burns believes that learning requires incorporating all the steps needed in moving from incompetence to competent. Getting something wrong or failing may be an important step in eventually learning the skill. Failure often occurs because we haven't learnt to think differently and we keep trying to do the same thing and thereby continue to make the same mistake.

Lie No. 3 I need talent. Most people who perform well do so because they were taught properly, practise often and persevere. They also have a belief in their own ability. Talent is something that comes once you've learnt the skill because you are able to effectively set goals and are persistent in achieving them.

Lie No. 4. Learning just happens. Learning

happens when we make the choice to improve a skill, concept or knowledge. This choice may be a subconscious thought but it happens easier if we are able to break the task up into smaller parts and learn the foundation skills first, and then when these have been mastered move onto the more complicated parts. An important aspect is that learning occurs faster and easier if we are having fun at the same time.

Lie No. 5. I am not bothered by what other people think of me. I said earlier in a previous article that 'what others think of me is none of my business'. Whilst this is a great credo to live by it is very difficult to attain because we all have expectations of our self and often believe that we need to live up to the expectations of others as well. Tim Gallwey, author of the Inner Game of Golf, believes that to perform well we need to rid ourselves of the judgements of our performance; both our own and those of others.

Lie No.6. Concentrate on your mistakes and not on your achievements. This has to be the greatest lie of all. If you focus on what you do wrong then you'll keep making the same mistake. For the shooter, it is important to look at what you are doing right when you hit the targets. Then explore what happened when you missed. Correct the problem and then go back to what you did right and do that again. Focus on the success. When you shoot well, ask yourself 'What did I do differently?' What did other people notice that was different?' How different did it feel to shoot well?' Lie No. 7. We all learn the same. It would be easy here to become very technical and explore differences in perception and information processing, learning styles; visual, auditory and kinaesthetic. But I won't because it probably doesn't matter. What matters is that as a learner you are motivated, encouraged and enjoy the teaching/learning process.

Part of learning is to take risks. However, formal education usually teaches us that risk taking is dangerous. By dangerous, I mean dangerous to our self-esteem or self- concept. If you were to walk into a kindergarten class and ask 'who can sing or who can draw?' The whole class would enthusiastically put up their hands. By year three, the same questions would be answered by only half of the class putting up their hands. By year six, it may be only five or six children, and by year twelve, it would be one or two at best. To effectively learn, be prepared to take risks, try differently and have fun. If we think that we can do something, then our thoughts will lead to actions that will prove ourselves right.






