

THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

Congratulations to the England Team on its outstanding success in the 1948 International Series at Cardiff at the end of June. Taking into account the limited amount of shooting under competition conditions that has been available to the Great Britain teams since the cessation of the war period the all round performances of the competing teams is indeed creditable. In returning the highest team score England registered a total of 1410 (scores to count) for fifteen men with the England champion Percy Stanbury turning in high-gun figures of 98/100 and fourteen out of the top fifteen registering 90 or over. By comparison the Australian effort of 1344 with several well under the 90's in the scores to count appears somewhat mediocre. It is rather coincidental to observe that the competing teams, England, Scotland, Wales, Australia and Ireland finished in the order named and occupied the same positions when the last pre-war contest was staged in 1939.

The 1939 contest was Australia's first appearance in International competition. Although our average was slightly better this year compared with 1939 we are generally still a good way behind the Home Country teams when it comes to International standards. Whilst not looking for excuses, it may be that our team selection methods could be improved. The English method of gathering together its International Team is by recommendation from "scouts" throughout the various counties. The scouts or advisors keep in touch with the Association headquarters in London and forward their recommendations on shooters considered to be potential Internationals and it seems that by this method a top notch combination is arrived at. Whether such a scheme would work satisfactorily for Australian standard is problematical. The great distances separating many of our shooting centres rather discounts the availability of worth while information. In rounding off this





“Tips” and “Tails”

Young Jack Bryant, the latest Victorian single-barrel champion, is a teen ager and one of the best of the rising brigade of first flight trapshots. Son of the renowned Jack Bryant, who in his distinguished career has held many Commonwealth titles, the new champion was well schooled. He had his first introduction to the sport of clay pigeon shooting on the old Blackburn grounds (situated on the Bryant property) in Holland Road, Blackburn. Shooting first with a small bore 410 he astounded good judges by quickness and judgment from the outset. At a private shoot in the pre-war years Wallace Mitchell, one of the leading Victorian bookmakers, presented young Bryant with a special cup trophy when the youngster ran up a good break string with his small bore gun. He has gone a long way in the interim and a Commonwealth title should not be beyond him before long. He shoots off the left shoulder and do those left swingers cop it!

Les Sheldrake is a first year shooter. Introduced to the sport by "Nimrod" (Harry Roberts, the Glen Iris sportsman), Sheldrake was a long way behind them at his first shoot. At a recent meeting at East Burwood he ran up 22/25—his third visit to the traps.

Charters Towers Club (Qld.) is rapidly coming to the forefront among the prominent formations of the Pineapple State, chiefly due to the energy and organisation ability of the popular Secretary—Norman Dungavel. On Wednesday and Thursday, August 21 and 22, the Club will stage a two day programme. On opening day shooting will commence at 1.30 p.m. and will comprise two five birders and a £30 Handicap all single-barrel, plus a three pairs Double Rise £10 Handicap. On August 22 shooting will start at 9.30 a.m. with a five bird (single), then the Charters Towers Single-barrel Championship at 15 birds, followed by a 5 birder and a

Young Bill shows all the promise of a champion and his string of 21 straight rather gives the pointer in that direction. Archer, Sr., won the opening event of the day with the only five straight. Congratulations Charlie and Bill—we look forward to seeing your names coupled in winning brackets more often.

Griffith Club (N.S.W.) had a bumper attendance at its recent annual meeting. The following office-bearers were elected—Patron, L. J. R. McWilliams; President, Dr. J. L. Sertori (replacing W. Gibbs, retired); Treasurer, Claude Carnell; Committee, Messrs. Jim Theodore, Jack Little, Stan Briggs, T. R. Thompson, Don Muir and E. Evans; Vice-Presidents, Aston Street and W. Gibbs; Handicappers, W. Gibbs and E. Fromholtz; Secretary, Ted Fromholtz. The Club's working bees have wrought wonders at the Club's grounds.

THE STOCK AND GOOD SHOOTING (By E. G. BIGGS)

Last month I referred to the importance of having a stock that fits the shooter. Since writing on this point I have had a first hand example of watching a shooter trying to overcome the hazard of an ill-fitting stock and not realising his difficulty. At Blackburn a shoot or two ago I was standing behind a shooter who, to my surprise, was not aware that his gun was cast off for a left hand shooter. He could not understand why he was breaking only about 50 per cent. of his birds and seemed incredibly surprised that the bad fitting stock made so much difference.

Before a shooter tackles lead or swing on given birds at certain angles he must realise that the fit of the stock is all important. A gun is pointed and not aimed, and the shooter must learn how to hold it correctly to the shoulder face. The eye

should look along the barrel—hence wherever the shooter looks or actually his vital eye looks, the gun should automatically be pointing there also. The eye should look down the rib of the gun from breach to front-sight and just see the rib. The stock should be straight enough so that when the cheek is placed snugly on the comb, with the gun held firmly into the shoulder, the shooter will find he is looking along the barrel without any movement of head or neck.


