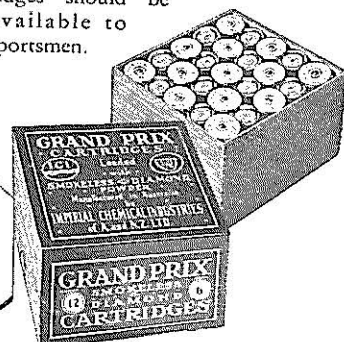

THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

With the holding of the 12th Annual Meeting of affiliated Club Delegates followed by the newly elected Executive Committee's initial meeting interest centres on affairs of the Festive Season plus the expectation of things to come in 1949.

(Full resume of the above-mentioned meetings appear in another section of this issue).

Of premier 1949 importance is the arrangement for the holding of the next Champion of Champions and International meeting. As the Victorian Eight Hours Holiday Week-end falls next year over the period March 12 and 14, the Association has decided to sponsor the big events on those dates. The Champion of Champions Cup will in future be known as "The Champion of Champions Cup—Australian National Championship." The Association has always considered the first portion of the above title to be something of a misnomer.

About its success, however, there has never been the slightest question. Popularity, when it comes to a shoot-

ing event, has to be earned the hard way and the Executive Committee was loth to make changes.

The event as it stands is really the Australian Championship, hence it would seem that its prestige has been further enhanced by the addition of "Australian National Championship" to its title.

Another important change agreed upon is that the big contest will be staged over 60 birds, instead of 50 as previously, and shot from 16 yards instead of 18 yards as in former years. Two and a half inch shells as provided on the day of the series by the Association will be the only cartridges permitted to be used. These conditions coincide exactly with International conditions and those aspiring for 1949 International honours as members of the Australian team will have a full day's practice under proper International conditions during the first day's shooting. The new arrangements should do much to bring about a levelling up of competitors and also provide added con-

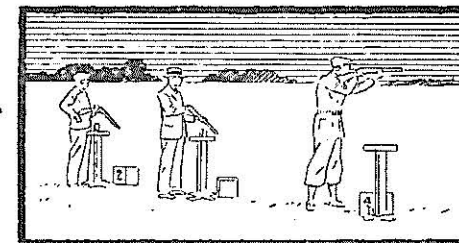

AROUND
THE CLUBS
AND MEETINGS...



JERILDERIE (NSW).—Club officials at Jerilderie, where the inaugural meeting was recently held, are, President, W. T. Clark; Vice-Presidents, Messrs. H. Ashworth and G. Taylor; Hon. Secretary, Bob Ferris; Hon. Treasurer, W. W. Elliott; committee, Messrs. G. Dowdle, P. Saunders, F. Steele and A. C. Brownless. Recently an approach was made to the local racecourse authorities for permission to establish the club layout on its property. It is understood agreement has been reached and the new lay-out will be one of the best in New South Wales with a crystal clear sky-line. Permission will also be obtained to use the racecourse buildings as pavilions and lunch-rooms.

AUSTRALIAN C. T. C. (Vict.).—Of chief interest during the November shoots was the re-inclusion of the famous Duke of Gloucester Cup competition for the first time since 1941. This cup, which is probably the largest of its kind in trapshooting spheres in the Southern Hemisphere, commemorates the first visit of the Duke of Gloucester to Australia in 1934. It was purchased, following the subscription by many enthusiasts, for competition among Nobel Club members. When Nobel and Blackburn clubs amalgamated recently the famous Cup came back into circulation. The winner for 1948 was W. (Bill) Finnegan of St. Kilda, a new recruit to the sport and actually his first win—his only previous cut was from a five birder on the same day as his Cup win. (20th)—No. 1, 5 birds, div., F. Skate, Ben Cook, N. Guy, W. Finnegan, John Bryant, W. Hurlstone, "Bruino" (Bill Scott), Bert Goodear and "Day" (J. O'Brien) 5/5. No. 2, Duke of Gloucester Cup, 15 birds, possibles by "Doncaster," "Bruino," "Peters" and W. Finnegan. Tie shoot, Finnegan 24/24, "Bruino" 23/24, "Peters" 17/18, "Doncaster" 15/16; 14 yarder, O. Kurrle 18/19; 12 yarder, L. Bryne 11/15. No. 3, 5 birds, 11 possibles, tie shoot, "Day" 19/19, Frank Tuck 18/19, A. J. Russell (Warrandyte) 11/12. Finnegan went on to break 34 straight before missing. Club officials are setting about arranging for one of the biggest shoots of the year when the Christmas shoot is staged on December 18.

FOOTSCRAY (Vict.).—The usual good attendances again favoured Footscray Club shooting on its No. 2 enclosure at Tottenham. For the first time for many years an all women's event was conducted by the club—entries were not large—but the shooting attracted many interested spectators. The winner shot under the name of "J. HOLBROOK (NSW).—Holbrook Club has been able to stage regular shoots over the last two or three months—allowing for one shoot per month. Members are naturally pleased that this has been possible—in marked contrast to recent years when a cartridge in Eastern Riverina districts was something of a novelty. Bragg 5/5. No. 9, 10 birds, L. Creasy 9/10. Missout divisions went to Creasy, Hall, Ted Matthews, J. Puma, N. Plunkett, Finnemore and O'Brien.

WANGARATTA (Vict.)—The first State Championship ever held under A.C.P.T.S.A. direction was conducted by the Wangaratta Club on its North Wangaratta grounds on November 20. The Club's ground arrangements were

first class. The day was good and the leafy oaks surrounding the ground, plus the availability of refreshment at the Vine Hotel, made for most pleasant conditions. Secretary Cordy and his assistants have come in for much commendation for the good organisation enjoyed by all of the sixty or more competitors. The title event, the Victorian Walk-up Championship (at 25 releases) went to the Yarrawonga sportsman, Norman C. Bott, who stopped 22/25 to win outright. Keith Veall (Pahran) was runner-up, 21/25 and C. Cook (Wangaratta) third 22/30 after a tie shoot with Tom Savill (Goorambat and one time Nobel shooter). The local shooter C. Wise won the front-marker award. The £50 handicap which followed (at 15 birds) provided a splendid exhibition of good shooting. At the end of 15 rounds the following took £5 each from the prize money, J. A. McCraith (Essendon), H. R. Donnelly (Bruthen), W. R. Johns (Malvern), Tom Connor (Moonee Ponds), Dean (Wangaratta) and Lester Collier (Jerilderie). They then shot on for the balance of the money, £20. Tom Connor eventually gained the honours 42/42. Tom also registered a break of 55 straight for the day (he did not shoot in the title event).

YARRAM (Vict.)—Yarram Club, recently re-formed after war time recess, held its opening shoot mid-last-month. The local newspaper scribe mentioned that "cars galore traversed the road to the Yarram Gun Club opening." As may be imagined attendance was good and the club officials went to no end of trouble to ensure Yarram hospitality lost nothing of its popularity. The club expects to be one of the best in Gippsland. Results were: No. 1, 5 birds (R. Barlow Trophy) won by J. Harrison 13/13, novice Perce Barlow. No. 2, 5 birds (Dr. H. H. Martin Trophy), A. No. 4, Deauville Doubles, div., M. Atkinson—A. Irving, G. A. Wheildon—H. Gasson. No. 5, (Holman Trophy) 5 birds, G. Williams 9/9, sweepstake, Williams and Gasson.

COLAC (Vict.)—The usual cordiality pervaded the Colac Club's double championship meeting on its picturesque grounds last month. Attendance was good although not as great as the October meeting. The main events were the Victorian Deauville Doubles Championship, followed by the Western Districts of Victoria Double Barrel Championship. The first-named contest, shot at the regulation 20 pairs from 18 yards, was not productive of good shooting. Recognised good pairs unaccountably failed to combine with the certainty expected. No possibles were scored, the best being 18/20's by the two Bryants, Frank Tuck-George Biggs, Geo Crosse-T. Shelton, W. R. Johns—"Duxbac." The tie shoot went only on round of 5 pairs. Tuck and Biggs were the solitary compilers of a full score in the shoot-off, and ran out winners 23/25. A further shoot-off for the places resulted in "Duxbac"—Johns gaining second 27/30. Crosse-T. Shelton won the Club's award for the best local effort. The Western District title went outright to Johns 20/20 from G. Crosse 24/25 and John Bryant 19/21. Front-marker prize "Double-H" (H. Harrison) 27/29. President Theo Norman's hospitality was on "tap" in no small measure and all enjoyed another of Colac's good days.

BARELLAN (NSW).—Barellan Club re-opened after years of war-time recess, when about fifty shooters attended at last month's fixture. Jerilderie, Griffith (a bus-load), Narrandera, Cobar and other close centres were well represented by shooters. The attendance actually took the organisers by surprise and accommodation was taxed to the utmost. Arrangements are in hand to approach the local Show Grounds Committee for permission to establish the Club's lay-out on its spacious grounds. If the application is granted Barellan will have appointments second to none, with ample refreshment rooms, booths, and shelter from indifferent weather. Shooting opened with a sweepstake and this was divided by Bob Ferris (Jerilderie), A. Patten (Kamarah) and W. McNamara (Cobar). Bob Ferris donated his winnings back to the Club. The main event, a 10 birder for President, Emil

Alberts Trophy was won by Alf Patten 14/15 from G. Taylor 13/15 and Lester Collier (Jerilderie) third. Barellan hopes to stage a New South Wales title event if the Showgrounds lay-out becomes available. In pre-war Barellan Club frequently held State title events and on many occasions shooters from as far away as Melbourne attended. The Club was one of the pioneer organisations affiliated with the A.C.P.T.S.A. Its original Secretary Ted James, after many years of great service to the Club, passed on during the war years.

TOWNSVILLE (Qld.)—Early in November Townsville staged another of its well organised shoots over two days. The chief attraction was the Queensland Single Barrel title event, 25 birds from 20 yards. Newton Thomas maintained his good form of several months by winning, after a tie shoot, 23/25, from Jack Melville 22/25 and J. Carrington 18/25. A £50 handicap at 20 birds single barrel followed. J. Melville and G. Archer (Charters Towers) divided first and second each 17/20. S. Ball (Powlthanga) was third 16/20. Fourth, fifth, and sixth prizes were divided by Newton Thomas, R. H. Winn (Home Hill) and J. Carrington. M. Johnston (Yarwun) won first prize in a £20 Handicap (single barrel) 10/10, the remaining prizes were divided by W. J. Hanran, V. Colless and G. Archer 9/10. The Charters Towers shooter V. Colless won a special front-markers award in the championship and a similar award was divided in the £20 by R. White (Townsville), J. Gerber (Home Hill), W. J. Baxter (Charters Towers), R. H. Winn and G. Nelson (Mackay). A full round of skeet (20 birds) was next on the programme. This created more than usual interest as the type of shooting is new to North Queenslanders. J. Carrington was best with 17/20, S. Ball 16/20. Newton Thomas and W. J. "TIPS" and "TAILS"

Newly affiliated clubs during the past month, include, formations at Yeo, Alvie and Pirron Yallock—all situated in the Western District of Victoria. With Colac as the parent club in that area clay pigeon shooting is becoming well established in the districts known as the "Garden of Australia."

Australian Club President, Dave Watson introduced a gesture which was warmly approved by all competitors at the Duke of Gloucester Cup presentation after shooting on November 20. As the Cup was an original Nobel institution, he called upon Les. L. Schilling, a former Nobel President, to distribute the trophies. Les, made an excellent job of this assignment. He is now a veteran in the sport of clay pigeon shooting, having been one of the first Nobel members back in 1927. He also holds original badge No. 2 as issued by the A.C.P.T.S.A.

New clubs are continuing to emerge from among the main country towns in the Victorian and New South Wales country districts. Two of the latest which are now rapidly approaching the fullness of complete organisation in New South Wales are clubs at Rand and Tumut. The latter organisation is sponsored by the Australian Legion of Servicemen, Tumut Branch. A. J. Baker, formerly of Ganmain and well known among Victorian shooters is one of the men "behind the gun" at Tumut. His assistance and advice will doubtless be of great assistance to the new club.

England's top ranking shot Percy Stanbury, although a tutor at the London Shooting School at Greenford (Middlesex), still retains interest in his farming property in Devon. He represents Devon County on the Farmers Executive. Recently he had a busy period at one of the Dairy Shows in that County. One of his duties was to escort H.M. Queen Elizabeth during her attendance at the function. Reports are to hand that Percy was indeed honoured and thrilled with the charm of the Queen. It appears Her Majesty was so interest-

ed that she was reminded on three occasions by the King who said, "Really, my dear, we must be getting back." "Just one moment more" said the Queen and persisted in her desire to get the information she wanted. Stanbury once gave a shooting demonstration to Their Majesties and has therefore been "presented" twice.

How's this for a new one? It was noticed recently that several young shooters in the Western District of Victoria has shown remarkably quick development in their respective ability to cope with the "busting" of the elusive discs. A whisper passed round that the quick improvement is easily explained. It appears that during leisure hours the young sportsmen congregate at an arranged rendezvous behind some farm buildings and whilst one of the party tosses up the egg supply from various farms (questionable vintage and otherwise) the others set about breaking the "birds" thrown at all speeds and from all angles. We have heard of many uses for eggs but never before as practice for clay pigeon shooters.

Dugald Stevenson, the Otway Forest (Vict.) 74 year old veteran, who has been shooting for nearly 40 years, was paid a nice compliment by the Colac Club last month. Unknown to Dugald (whose has long adopted the shooting name of "Otway" after his home district) the Club ran a testimonial event on his behalf. A double figure sum was raised and handed to "Otway," who was greatly surprised and deeply appreciative of the Club's thought; Dugald, when he attends shoots at Colac or even in Melbourne (where he has frequently competed) rides his bicycle from his back-country property to Colac, a distance of 27 miles, plus his gun tied up in a gunny sack and strung across his back. An enthusiast if ever there was one and a sportsman from foot-sole to crown.

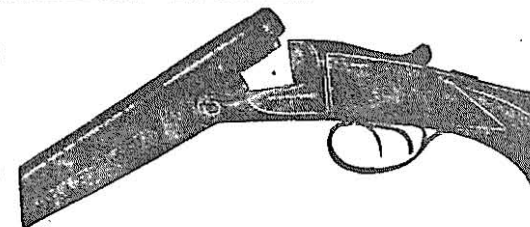

Association 12th Annual Meeting

Thirty-three delegates and members of the Association Executive attended the 12th Annual Meeting of the Association held in the Wilson Room at Scott's Hotel, Melbourne on November 3.

The election of Office-bearers to 31st October 1949 resulted in the President, Mr. J. M. Wilson (Ringwood, Vict.) being returned unopposed. The election of Vice-Presidents resulted, Messrs. G. L. Bragg (Wagga, NSW), V. L. Fankhauser (Burwood, Vict.), W. E. H. Rainbird (Launceston, Tas.), J. M. Tyquin (Hobart, Tas.) and G. H. Watts (Coburg, Vict.).

The following were appointed Hon. Vice-Presidents for the 1949 year, Messrs. F. C. Abell (Hobart, Tas.), F. Brook (Gilgandra, NSW), W. J. Hanran (Townsville, Qld.), K. G. Henkel (Sydney, NSW) and L. P. Hughes (Sydney, NSW).

The election for members of Executive Committee resulted, Messrs. E. G. Biggs (Malvern, Vict.), J. O. Cox (Mangoplah, NSW), A. F. Johnson (Balwyn, Vict.), D. B. O'Callaghan (Brighton, Vict.) and A. E. Poxon (Launceston, Tas.).

Messrs. D. Watson and T. R. Wightman, retiring members of Executive Committee did not seek re-election. Both the latter were thanked warmly by the President for their service to the Association. He mentioned that Mr. Wightman had been a member of the Executive for nearly ten years—during several of which he acted as Chairman of the Executive. Mr. Wightman holds a unique record in that during all his years of service he did not miss one meeting of the governing Committee.

Mr. K. D. Courtney was re-appointed Association auditor.

The President indicated that he would press for 2½" shells to be used during the Champion of Champions Cup 1949—adding that he felt it was the only way Australians could expect to record reasonable scores against Great Britain International teams. Considerable discussion took place on the method of selection for the Australian International team—ultimately it was agreed to leave the matter to the Executive Committee's first meeting.

would rescind the motion on its records that "break records would not be recognised by the Association."

A further Notice of Motion, that "Rule 8 of the Association Constitutional Rules, under heading "Delegates," shall not apply to any member club, unless all other rules, as laid down, have been observed and obeyed (i.e. that no member club shall have delegate representation at annual or any other general meetings, unless all its members are registered shooters). The submission of the Motion brought forth long and animated discussion. Some speakers contended it was directed at one or two clubs—others indicated that they felt it was the only way in which the Association could properly control the sport and its member clubs. The motion was agreed to finally by a four to one majority.

A letter submitted by a member club requesting that "the limit mark be shifted back to 16 yards and the maximum for back-markers be 25 yards," was not discussed at any

length owing to the club's delegate indicating that he knew little of the proposal and was not conversant with what was intended.

A suggestion that the Champion of Champions Cup be decided in January was not persevered with. Several delegates deplored the fact that large money prizes were noticed coming into the sport—many agreed that this was not desirable. A Victorian country delegate mentioned that clubs failing to obey the Association rules should be fined 20/- for the first offence with an increasing scale for subsequent infringements.

A Tasmanian delegate strongly recommended that the Association enforce its regulation whereby 20 per cent. of all prize money over £25 should be allotted to winners in trophies. This will be dealt with by the Executive.

Ten Years Ago . .

W. R. Bloomfield, the Sandringham (Vict.) veteran struck a purple patch of success winning several major clay pigeon shooting titles on end. His main success was in the Commonwealth Double-rise Championship at the now non-existent Victorian Clay Target Club. About the same time he won the Southern Hemisphere Double Barrel Championship at Nobel's (West Footscray). (Inciden-

tally this event has not been shot since.—Ed.).

He topped off these successes by annexing the Victorian Skeet Championship decided on the grounds of the Castlemaine Gun Club, shooting 18/20 rounds and winning outright. This was the last time a clay pigeon shoot was staged in Victoria's midland town.

Gun Gossip . .

(By "North Country" of the British Shooting Times).

Rabbits offer some sporting shots when turned up from tussocks. This is a time for the small-bore gun or other light weapon, where this is not used all the time. I am not in favour of too much choke in 12-bores. I have found that unless a small-bore has a fair amount of choke its killing powers are rather limited. It is all very well to shoot rabbits at the closer ranges, but out in the open the range is soon increased. The rabbit you spot sitting in a tussock and pick out will be certainly near enough. But as the autumn draws on rabbits will jump up farther out, and in any case some are sure to start up at an unexpected angle and get well away before the shooter realises what is happening. A strong running rabbit at 35 yards, if going away, may quite easily defeat the marksman.

At one time I did a lot of shooting with 28 bores—delightful little guns. I had two of these guns, both with outside hammer actions. One gun was bored improved cylinder, the other was choked in both barrels. Now both these guns were by first-class makers and of good quality and carefully bored. Their patterns were even and well distributed. But there was no question as to which was the better weapon for serious field work. The choke-bore was definitely superior. The cylinder was satisfactory up to perhaps 30 yards, but beyond this range it lacked effective stopping power. I do not mean to infer that it was impossible to kill beyond 30 yds with this gun, for I killed farther than that with it. But I never felt confident over the longer shots and too often I only managed to get quarry down at a distance. The latter would be hit by one or two pellets only and perhaps carry on for another 100 yards. The whole thing was so indecisive. But for shooting at 20 to 25 yards or so the cylinder gun was very effective, light and always a pleasure to handle.—(By exclusive permission of the Editor. British Shooting Times).

U.S.A. Shooting . .

The 1948 printed programme for the 49th Grand American Handicap Tournament, extending over the period August 23-28 last is to hand. The series was staged at the American Trapshooting Association's own field at Vandalia, Dayton, Ohio. It was a most comprehensive affair and included the following events, Veteran Competition, Husband and Wife Event, Father, Son and Daughter Championship, Junior Championship, Sub-Junior Championship, Brother and Brother event, State Championships, Men and Women, Amateur Clay Target Championship of North America, Women's Clay Target Championship of North America, Class Championships, State Championship, Preliminary Handicap, Professional Championship, Double-target Championship, East and West Teams competition, All-round Championship, High-Over-All Championship, and of course, the greatest attraction in the series, the Forty-Ninth Grand American Handicap.

From Monday to Saturday (August 23-28) each competition would shoot at 1,000 targets per man. Of comparable Australian interest is the Champion of Champions for men, this is shot at 100 targets per man from 16 yards.

HINTS TO HITS

(By Late W. P. Grosvenor)

I cannot remember which of the American trapshooters I contacted in years gone by who collaborated with me in preparing "Hints to Hits," but I send it along as it should be of assistance to you in the building up of an article for your future issues. I suggest that you quote it as a whole.

1. When targets are hard to "pick-up" (with the eyes) after leaving the traphouse, poor visibility, weak light, or due to poor back-ground, with the result that the swing is hurried in order to get on the target in time—try holding at a point a foot or more above the traphouse, or slightly below the line of the back-ground where the target first becomes visible. This materially lessens the distance of swinging and hence obviates hurry, which is apt to cause overswing or snapping. There are times however, when it is better to hold low on the traphouse, as momentum of swing will help the shooter to carry through smoothly, after a slow start.

2. If extreme angles are severe (wide), take stance and point of hold so as to favour that angle when swinging. There should be no strain against the muscles at the end of the widest swing. Shift the feet and body so as to meet the condition before calling the target. This is

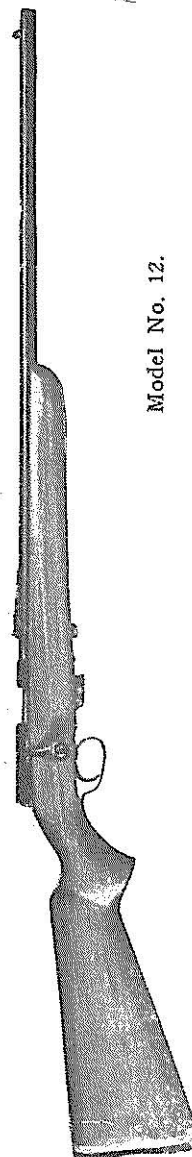

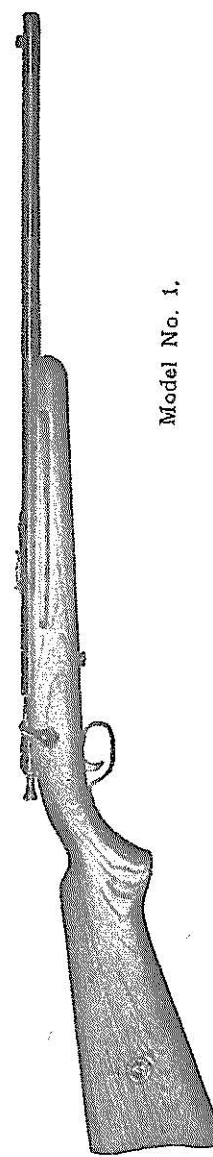
especially necessary on stands one and five, with left and right angles respectively. Also take more time on your angle targets than on quarters and straights and be sure you are pointing correctly before pulling the
