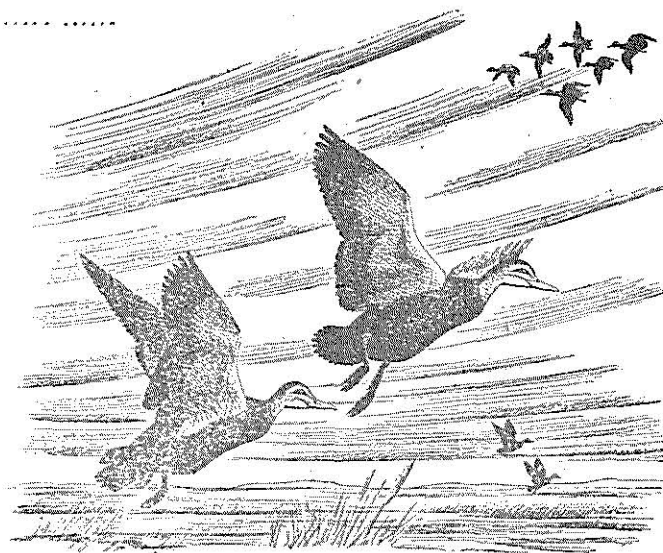

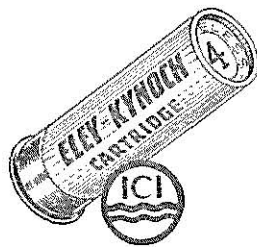

## THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

With information to hand of entries from as far north as Central Northern Queensland, and as far south as Hobart, the A.C.P.T.S.A. Champion of Champions Cup (Australian National Championship) and International meeting, fixed for March 12 and 14 at East Burwood (V.), appears likely to exceed previous records. When this issue goes into circulation the big week-end of shooting will be but a few days away. Conditions of the series have been fully publicised in recent months. Shooters, whether they secure a place in Australia's International Team or otherwise, will shoot at 160 clay pigeons each at least, during the competitions. This total per man will easily be a record number of birds for Australia. Intending competitors are reminded that only the special International shell will be permitted throughout. An important variation decided upon since the first publication of the International Match conditions is that the members of the Australian International Team 1949 will not be required to pay for entrance to the event, birds and cartridges will also be supplied free. This departure from the previously advertised conditions

has been brought about through the generous interest and support of Messrs. Imperial Chemical Industries A. & N.Z. Ltd.

It will be the shooters' responsibility throughout both days to take particular note of his squad number—only squad numbers will be called over the microphone system after the initial announcement of names and squad allocation. Competitors not present to shoot when their squad is called are liable to have lost birds recorded against them. Indicator boards will display the order of squad shooting over the three shooting tracks which will be in use.

For the convenience of visiting shooters and those without motor transport, the A.C.P.T.S.A. has arranged with Mr. Chas. Wignell to make his large conveyance available (seating capacity of 40). This transport will leave from outside The State Theatre, Flinders Street, Melbourne, between 7.45 a.m. and 8.0 a.m. on Saturday morning, March 12. A small nominal fare will be charged. Those desirous of securing seat reservation should make application to the A.C.P.T.S.A. secretary without delay.

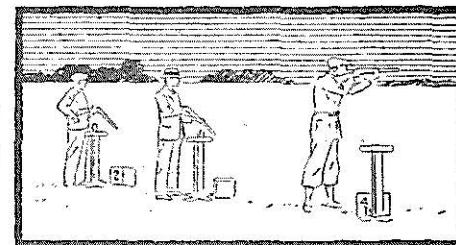

# AROUND THE CLUBS AND MEETINGS...



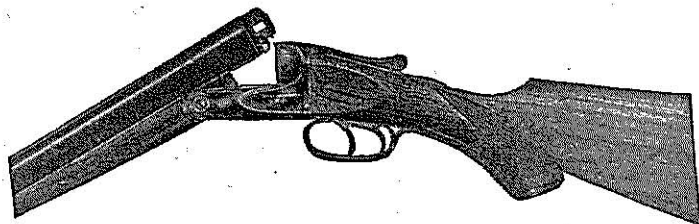
**WONGABRI (N.S.W.)** (formerly Berrima District G.C., Bowral).—Wongabri Gun Club replaces the name of the former Berrima organisation at Bowral. When the club was formed a couple of years ago, it was thought that district influence would be more emphasised if the district name of Berrima was included in the club name, notwithstanding that its headquarters were at Bowral. However, although the name was entirely satisfactory, it was found on occasions that supplies were sent to Berrima instead of Bowral, and much time had to be spent bringing about a realisation that the club situation was actually at Bowral. Looking around for a suitable change of name, officials happened on the idea of calling the club "Wongabri" after the estate on which the club's grounds were situated. This met with general satisfaction among shooters, and particularly with the owner of the property "Wongabri." Therefore the name now stands as "Wongabri Gun Club, Bowral." The shooting grounds are the same, Wongabri Corner on the Moss Vale Road. The club's annual meeting took place on January 25. President, C. H. Metcalfe; secretary, Alex. Palmer; and treasurer were re-elected. Vice-Presidents are J. Upton, Gordon Shepherd, and P. Davidson. A very healthy balance sheet was presented, showing assets at £120, plus small buildings, plus credit at bank. Club membership rose during the year from 18 to 47. Many of the younger members of the club are now gaining confidence to travel and compete in open events at other clubs. It is expected that the club will have representation during the big Association matches on March 12 and 14.

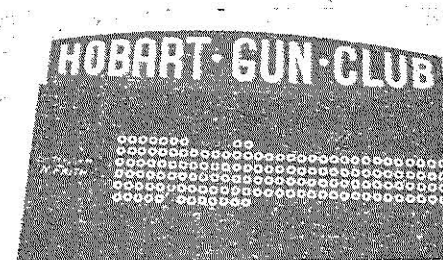

## U.S.A. Shooting

Secretary, Washington State Trapshooters' Association, who has so kindly provided Australians with interesting reading matter on doings of shooters in U.S.A., writes this month, "I really enjoy reading your magazine. I know from experience that there is nothing that will foster the sport better than the right kind of publicity—just your kind. Would very much like to be over for the Big Shoot in March. At present I could not hit a 'Bull Elephant on the Posterior with a Base Fiddle,' and that is poor marksmanship; still, I like the 'music of the gun' going off. Your Champion of Champions seems to be an open event. In U.S.A. only those shooters who have won their State Championship, or, in case the winner is not at the Grand

American, then the runner-up is eligible to shoot in the Champion of Champions' Race, the same thing applies to the women. They have a similar event. Year 1948 Mrs. Moselle Cameron won it with 100 straight. In 1947, Mrs. Lela Hall Frank won it with 100 straight (Lela is a Life Member of the Hiyu Indians). Lela won the National Championship eight times, she is the greatest woman trapshot in the world. Last year at the Grand, Moselle and Lela tied for the National Women's Championship, with 197 x 200. The shoot-off was terrific. Lela 24, 25, 25, 25—99; Moselle 24, 25, 25, 24—98. You will read the account of this in the Grand American Number that is on the way to you."

## The Grosvenor Corner

"Hints to Hits" (by late W. P. Grosvenor, cont. from Feb. "News")

11. Study your hits, and if you are not centering your targets, try and find out why, and correct before you lose one.

12. If you are forced to use a gun with a stiffer trigger-pull than you are accustomed to, be careful you do not shoot under straights and behind angles, as you are apt to neglect the fact that your shots are getting away a little slower. Also, be careful on a light pull, that you do not trip the sear before you are ready, owing to the pressure on the trigger. Make your trigger-pull quick and decisive when you are ready, and don't put preliminary pressure on the trigger except to take up the slack.

13. Study whether your angle targets are dropping, rising or travelling level at the point where you break them, and allow accordingly. This is especially important on the second target in doubles.

14. If in doubles shooting, one target is falling away exceptionally fast, try and take it first, even if, under ordinary circumstances, it would be unwise to do so.

15. Don't waste swing on the first target in doubles. Hold at the point where you figure the target will be when you will want to break it. This allows for a fast first break, and the more time to get on the second target which should be taken when still rising, as the tendency is usually to shoot high, due to the displacement of the gun and head, from the jar of the first shot. However, allow a safe margin on the first target so as to be sure that your point of hold will be below and slightly behind the target when it gets to the "spot." Be sure to swing after it and not try to cut it off, or stop it, for in this way only will you gain swing momentum enough to keep from stopping your gun swing to your desire to get after the second target, as the first target is travelling fast and rising (probably) when taken. Here a slightly open barrel is an advantage.

**Gun Gossip**

(by "NORTH COUNTRY" of the "British Shooting Times")

An Irishman wrote some time back, and I think the experience he describes is well worth publicising. He says, "It is almost forty years since I first got into discussions on the question of chokes. In fact, as the "Battle of the Bores" has been raging almost since the advent of the shot-gun, so we may say that the "Challenge of the Chokes" has been the cause of a gallant, yet undecided, action. I venture to state that never will the "Battle of the Bores" or the "Challenge of the Chokes" be lost or won. As a boy, and later as a youth, I never had a gun that carried "sufficient choke." At that time it was rare that I kept a gun for 12 months, almost invariably I sold it and bought another that seemed to "shoot closer." In my own youth I did much the same sort of thing, for always was I searching for some super-weapon which would kill at a few yards further. My ambition was for more and more gun-power, irrespective of other considerations. But this reader goes on to relate how he happened to be at a clay-pigeon shoot, minus a gun, and, deciding to join in, borrowed one. He says, "There were two or three famous shots of the day participating, and not a few local warriors. Well, at the end of the day, I was 'high-gun.' A gentleman came up to me and said, 'That must be a very good gun that you have been using. May I see it?' Somewhat flattered, I handed over the gun (a D.B. hammer-gun). The gun was taken apart for, I think, the first time since it had left the factory, and, on inspecting the flats, the gentleman echoed a loud 'Lord, deliver us! The kid here is using an improved cylinder.' Puzzled and rather cast down,

I collected my winnings and straightway went home to delve amongst the grand old books on shooting in the bookcase until I found all I could on the improved cylinder. And from that day I have always preferred a gun bored on those lines."

Another interesting item referred to by "North Country" follows. He writes, "The history of British sporting gun trade during the last 100 years or so would make some interesting reading, particularly as it would cover the Augustan period of great shooting bags, famous shots, and still more famous personalities of the late Victorian and Edwardian days, and those few brilliant seasons immediately prior to 1914 when "the lights went out." Shooting men generally will be reminded of those spacious times by the news that the well-known gunmakers, Messrs. James Woodward & Sons, were taken over at the end of the year by Messrs. James Purdey & Sons. Shortage of skilled craftsmen is one of the main reasons for the decision. It is sad to think that this business will no longer be a separate entity. At the same time, gun enthusiasts will be happy at the thought that the future, as well as the traditions, of this House will continue in safe hands."

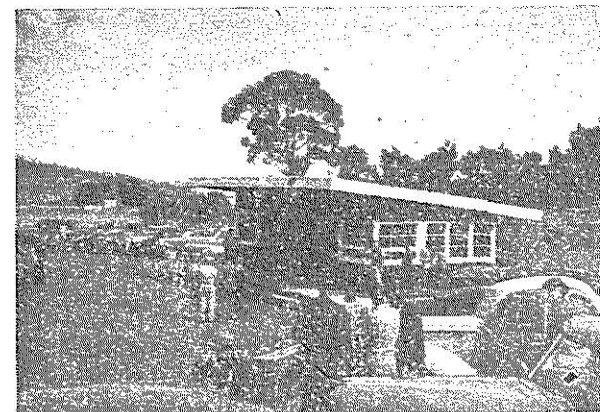

## "A Crew from Cressy Collects Deauville Doubles Down South"

On Saturday, December 11, 1948, Hobart Gun Club staged a Deauville Doubles Championship and Christmas Shoot. 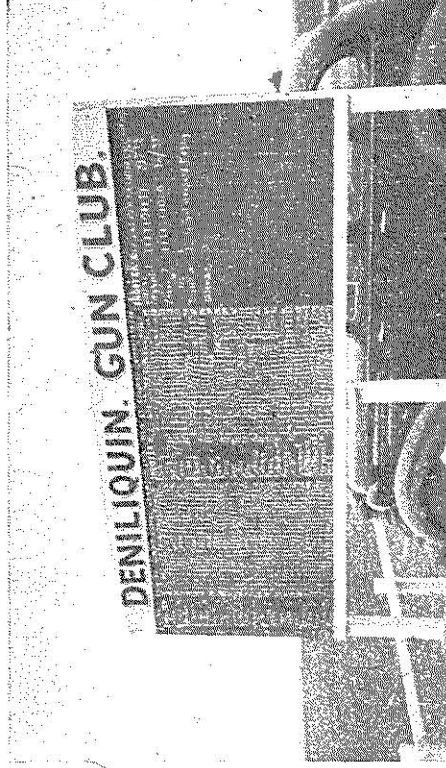

on table to come forward while I say "Thank you, Marjorie, for a most enjoyable lunch!"

Billy Rainbird, the Poxon brothers, Rex Powell and other Tamar-side trapshooters turned up in time to test the trap and—as events proved later—to take home the trophy. They brought with them young Terry Casey. Notwithstanding his extreme youth—Teddy is only SEVENTY-FOUR!—his name has appeared on many score boards, usually followed by an unbroken string of white washers which, if they represented "quids" and you put a "one" in front of them would place the "Kid from Cressy" in millionaire class any day.

In the Doubles, which called for twenty pairs from eighteen yards, Ted partnered big Rex Powell, and the combination jacked up 19 x 20. This, however, didn't give them an outright win because Alf Poxon and Bill Rainbird's white rings added up to the same total. Breaking five brace each in a five-bird shoot-off failing to alter the balance, the

tie-ists toed the line again, and this time turned in four pairs each. This was repeated in a third attempt to shake each other off, and the tally after still another five salvoes showed each team with 37 x 40 on the board. It began to look as if the dispute would have to be taken before the League of Nations, but the fifth shoot-off tipped the scales. The "Kid from Cressy" and his big clobber again eliminated the lot, but Poxon and Rainbird's final frantic fusillade failed to find a fast-flier, and the small boy on the score board was reluctantly obliged to take off the white washer he'd already slipped on the 45th nail, and substitute a red one.

It was a great match, shot out by four sportsmen who have won so many major events at various times that they can win—or lose—graciously.

Although they did not make a place in the Championship, the Pitt brothers of "Hobart" (R. S. & R.) staged a classic exhibition of Deauville Doubles teamwork that, frankly, was worth going down

to Tasmania to watch. The superb timing of the brothers resulted repeatedly in simultaneous discharges that gave the impression that one or other of the two must have been using a gun that shot a pattern wide enough to enclose both birds, while the other had a couple of "snap-caps" in his chambers! Interestingly watching their performance, I came to the conclusion that such precise timing, though delightful to witness, might have its disadvantages when the targets were trapping unevenly, in that the desire to maintain perfect unison could cause one or other of the shooters to throw the switch a split second before he had attained complete coverage of his bird. Nevertheless, it was sheer artistry in gunpointing, and I would have liked to have seen the Pitts make the shoot-off.

As a visitor, I was honoured with the pleasant duty of presenting the prizes at the conclusion of the main event. Rex Powell grinned broadly, and left it to his diminutive partner to reply. Ted Casey has a voice like a Firth of Forth fog-horn suffering from pharyngitis, and after he'd spoken there was no need to telegraph the results of the match, to the Launceston "Examiner": the Sporting Editor heard them direct.

After the main event, the balance of the day was devoted to "down the line" sweeps and the hours slipped by easily and pleasantly. Jimmy Bilyard was out on the ground, busy as a little bee (Compositor: Please note that word is spelt "B-double E") entering up scores. Occasionally the Referee would vacate his chair and go and have one, and if there was any uncertainty about the result of a shot, Jimmy just recorded a "kill." That's the way to run a really pleasant afternoon's trapshooting.

Doug. Bridges was out there, too, with Mrs. Bridges and two of his three lovely young daughters, and two very charming sportswomen, Mrs. John Tyquin and Miss Weymouth were busy with pencil and score sheets unobtrusively doing one of those little odd jobs that help so materially in making a day's trapshooting run smoothly.

You know it has always had me mystified why the wives of trapshooters put up with their husbands. As a type they're nice fellers, mind you; but as "nutty" as a bar of Bulgarian Rock. They come home reeking with the smell of smokeless powder; brag for hours about their clay-busting ability, and spill nitro solvent oil all over the wall-to-wall Wilton

in the lounge room. That's why you will always find that trapshooters' wives are the nicest and most even-tempered women in the world. If they were not, they'd club their consorts to kingdom-come the first time they came home from a clay contest.

To tail off the afternoon, the Club put on the Christmas Shoot, the prizes for which usually consist of turkeys, or sides of pork, and bottles of this and that, and so on. I'm a trifle hazy about the final result of this event. I know I was pulling trap towards the end, and John Tyquin, Bill Rainbird, the Poxon boys, Dudley Ransome and others, finally shot it out "off the box" and Bill Rainbird won half a cow, or half a sheep—or maybe it was half a rabbit: I'm not too sure. It was Christmas, so what the Hell?

When it was too dark to distinguish a penny from a two bob bit, we turned it in, climbed into cars, and took off for Tommy Weir's pub at Pontville, where a buffet spread, that would have made Menzies' head waiter hang his head in shame, was laid out.

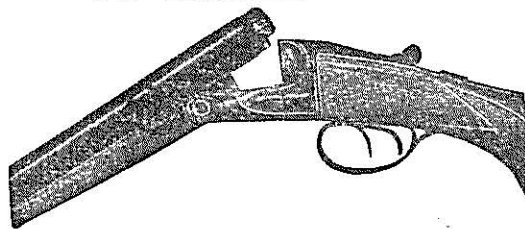
Of course, before we started to stave off starvation there were a few important little matters to be attended to: a few toasts and whatnot. Let's see, there were about thirty of us altogether, and you know, you simply must be democratic about that sort of thing. So we toasted everyone present, and just to be sure that no one was missed out we went through the list a second time; and, of course, a few got in on the grouser and got in a third time. The winning team and the runners-up, too, had to be toasted; first as teams and then individually, and this took up a bit of time. I was toasted, too—and pickled as well—by the time someone delivered me home to "Wrest Point" where I was staying. I tell you, it was a grand day.

Following day three carloads of us went out to Dudley Ransome's beautiful property at Campana. Dudley flew a fighter kite in the 1st World War, and believe me the fellows who had nerve enough to jack those crazy crates off the ground in those days had what it took—and took, well, took anything that could be poured out of a bottle. Of course Dudley to-day is a quiet country squire with a charming wife, and two very handsome kids—a boy and a girl. But that old 1914-18 glint still flickers in his eye.

## Hartleys Break Badge

The Executive Committee of the A.C.P.T.S.A. recently approved acceptance of the special Break Badge offered by Hartleys Ltd., of Melbourne, to be awarded to every registered shooter compiling a break of 50, 75, 100 or more. Should a shooter produce additional breaks of or above the totals mentioned, a metal star (if available) will be provided for attachment indicating the repeat performance. Although a definite date for commencement of this award has been fixed: i.e., March 12, 1949—the day of the holding of 1949 Champion of Champions' Cup (Australian National Championship)—any special effort produced immediately prior to that date will probably receive favorable consideration for the distinction. The rules governing the allotment of the Hartley Break Badge are as follows, "Recognised only when shot under double and single-barrel conditions and in competition—break may be carried from one day to another provided the shooter does not compete in any other type of event or shoot at practice—"down-the-line" shooting only. Should a shooter take part in any other type of event his break ends and such scores do not register for the break sequence."

## Late News

Since the initial preparation of copy matter for this issue, information has been received that Messrs. George Brammall & Co., the famous Waterproof Garment experts, of Footscray (V.), have decided to sponsor the first trophy for the Champion of Champions' Cup (Australian National Championship), 1949. The trophy which, will be unusual in character, will be valued at £50. There is a strong possibility that this generous firm will continue to support the big event annually, and make the sponsoring of the trophy a perpetual event. This is big news indeed for clay pigeon shooters, and should make the series more attractive than ever. We are also pleased to announce an additional donation of £2/2/- from Mr. Fred. Burns, also of Footscray.

A suggestion has been made that this issue should contain a detailed description of the actual route to the East Burwood shooting grounds, so that shooters traveling by car and visiting the area for the first time would not become confused. The route from Melbourne is quite easy to follow, providing the following basic method is adopted. Taking Flinders Street Railway Station (Swanston Street) as a commencement, car drivers should cross Princes Bridge and travel east along St. Kilda Road until they reach the intersection of Toorak Road (about 1 mile). Here they should turn left, it is then almost a straight road to the ground, with a right-side entrance. Toorak Road becomes Burwood Road after leaving the tram terminus, but this should not be confused with a smaller road bearing the name of "Burwood Rd." which runs past the Hawthorn Town Hall.

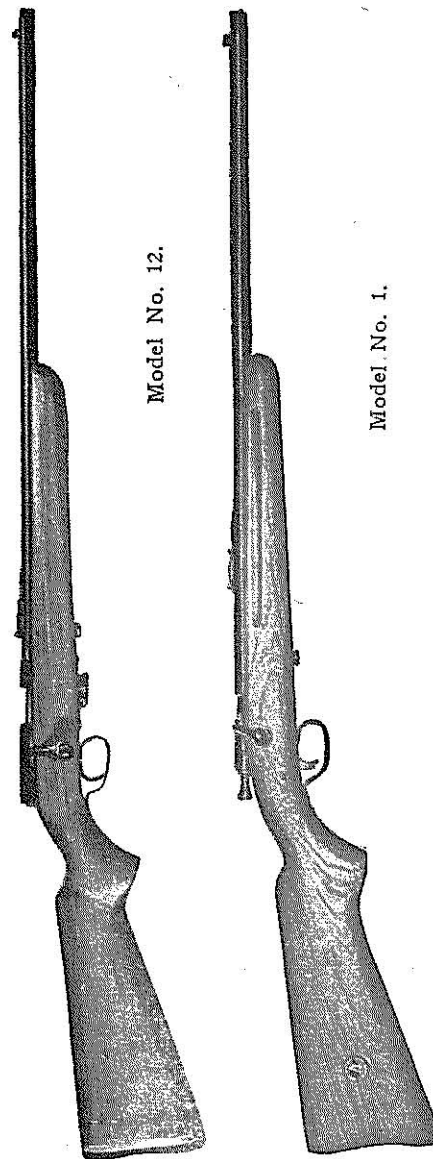
