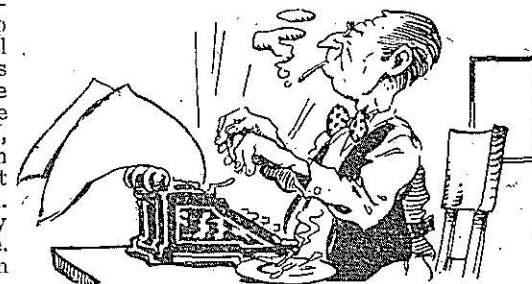

## THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

With the holding of the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association's all day shoot on June 13 (King's Birthday Holiday), on the East Burwood grounds of the Australian Clay Target Club, that body's competition shooting for the current season will be concluded. The programme, as already advertised, is most attractive. The morning will be given over to the deciding of the Association Intermediate Championship.

This is a 20 bird event and no shooter whose handicap on June 13, 1949, exceeds 16 yards will be eligible to compete. The reaction among shooters on forward marks has been most noticeable. This is particularly applicable to shooters in country clubs. Many feel that, with the top liners ineligible for the competition, a very interesting contest will result among those not usually seen winning

contest up to the importance of the Champion of Champion's Cup (Australian National Championship).

Forty-five birds will be released to each contestant in the handicap, which will be decided from Association marks. (The Association reserves the right to alter or change any shooter's handicap at any time.)

Squadding of shooters will operate under the same conditions as the recent March fixtures. Names and squad number will be called as soon as the draw is completed—squad numbers only will be called afterwards. In the Intermediate Championship competitors will make two visits to the tracks, that is to say they will shoot 10 birds from No. 1 trap and a similar number from No. 2 trap. In the handicap competitors will shoot at fifteen birds per visit (three from each track) with one visit to each of the three tracks to complete the forty-five birds complement.

Clubs shooting championships under A.C.P.T.S.A. rules are requested to observe the Association By-law, which directs that no championship should be commenced later than 2.30 p.m. during the winter months. That is during May, June, July and August. The shorter days have a tendency to upset the equity of the competition and all clubs should bear this in mind.



## U.S.A. Shooting

Our American correspondent, Mr. Rex Miles, provides a tip this month having reference to the use of shooting glasses. Mr. Miles says:

"Always wear them at least an hour before you shoot, to get your eyes accustomed to the shade. It will be found that, particularly on a dull day or poor light, they will bring the target out more distinctly. Many of our boys put them on in the morning and wear them all day—I used to do this when I was in my best shooting days."

Mr. Miles goes on to mention that Washington State Association has just held its big Inland Empire Shoot—close on 600 entries, "in fact, entries had to be refused, we just could not handle any more than 600, even with our twelve traps."

Despite gusty wind the scores were good. President of the Spokane Club, Bill Meyerhoff, stopping 193/200 on the first day (16 yards) 49/50 pairs second day, 100/100 third day and 98/100 on the final day, (a Sunday). He actually missed four "down-the-line" targets in 400, or 99 per cent. "kills." He shoots from 23 yards in handicaps and according to Mr. Miles is the best shooter in the Washington State area during the past 38 years. In 1947 he was "high-gun" for the whole of U.S.A., that is on 3,000 registered targets from 16 yards, his grand average was .9880.

The recent Inland Empire Handicap was won by an unknown shooter, H. B. Kautz, with a perfect 100 straight (18 yards). There were, strangely, no 99's, but seven 98's. It should be understood that the above scores are all registered under single barrel conditions.

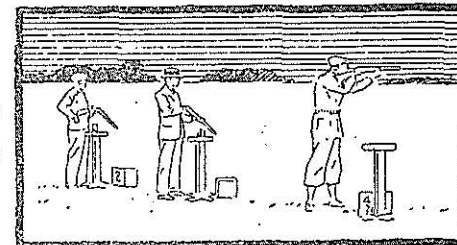

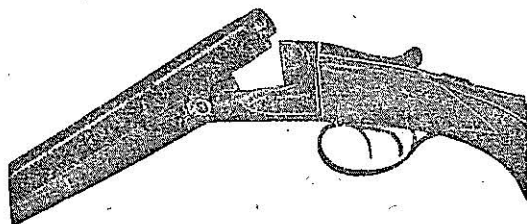

against it, owing to the lack of accommodation during the big week and so the shoot has been arranged for July 23.

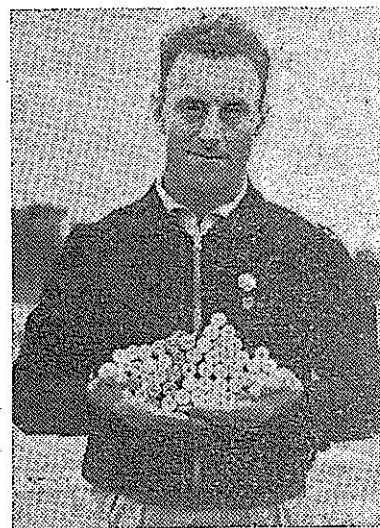
The second is the Victorian Walk-up Championship and the date set for this is October 8.

## "Tips" and "Tails"

Townsville Gun Club (Nth. Qld.), through the advertising section of this issue, makes preliminary announcement of the 1949 Commonwealth single-barrel championship on its first class grounds on August 6. The fixture will cover

two days, August 6 and 7. The period has been chosen for the reason that August is usually a good month in the Townsville area for wild duck and this, combined with the full moon and North Queensland famed winter weather, should make for an attractive venture for those who intend to make the trip.

Leeton Club (N.S.W.) intends opening its modern skeet lay-out officially on June 11. The club has gone to considerable expense to make its ground attractive and it should be rewarded with good attendances at all its future meetings.

A new club is likely to be formed at Cavendish, in the Hamilton district (Vic.). If it eventuates this will be one of the first in Victoria's far-western district area.

The following is reprinted from the King Island "News" and is an extract from the paper, "King Islander," of May 11, 1910.

"A meeting was held on Saturday, at Parer's hotel, with the purpose of forming a club to arrange the breeding of pheasants on King Island. Pheasants will be immediately imported from England to commence the scheme. Dr. Cunningham was appointed President of the club with a committee comprising Messrs. G. P. Huxley, R. Kennon, R. and F. Forrest, A. Bertram, P. Bidstrup, Coulson, W. Scott and C. H. Haigh (Secretary)."

The foregoing provides details of the initial efforts to get pheasant breeding on a proper basis on King Island. To-day pheasant shooting on

the Bass Strait Island is one of the locality's greatest attractions. A recent recommendation was made to the visiting members of the Animal and Bird Protection Board that swamp hawks be removed from the protected list, due to their becoming a menace to the pheasant population.

Ollie Cox and Geoff Bragg vouch for this one. At a recent meeting of the Holbrook Racing Club, of which both are interested executives, a galloper bearing the name of Regras started on three occasions on the one day and won at all three outings. Punters were slow to accept him on the first two occasions, but at his final effort they were compelled to lay odds on his success, which he duly accomplished.

Jerilderie Gun Club (N.S.W.) will hold its official opening, on July 16, with the New South Wales Mixed Birds Championship and a £50 handicap is listed for decision. Bob Ferris, the Club Secretary and former shooter at Kyneton (Vic.) and Melbourne fixtures, claims that Jerilderie's shooting ground will equal anything of the kind in Australia's MA State. The location is the Jerilderie Racecourse and the background is completely clear, that is to say only the earth and sky-line show up when the shooter calls for and shoots at his target. A good crowd of Melbourne shooters is expected to assist Jerilderie at its opening. Bob Ferris has always been a generous supporter to Melbourne shoots and is also a donor to Association funds.

Albury Field Shooters' Club will hold its annual clay pigeon shoot on its well set up ground over the Murray at Wodonga, on July 30. Allan Manser has taken over the secretarial duties from Jack Butson.

Hobart Club's shoot, on July 2, will include a £20 handicap at 15 birds, points scoring two and one. Two double-rise events are included. The club mixed birds championship will be the main event on the Footscray Club's programme, on June 18.

Lance Small, of Caulfield, was warmly congratulated when he won the metropolitan single-barrel cham-

pionship on the Coburg Club's grounds (Vic.), on May 14. His effort was the more meritorious when it is known that he had to fight it out to the 35th round against J. Bryant, probably one of the best single-barrel shots in Australia, as well as being one of the "very tough" ones when tie shoots are called for. The tie shoot scores read: Small, 5 5 4 5; Bryant, 5 5 4 4. Shooting conditions were all against single-barrel shooting, a half gale coming in from the side tested even the most experienced.

Melbourne shooters will be pleased that Wing-Commander T. S. (Toss) Ingledew is again resident in the Southern city. This fine sportsman has been stationed in New South Wales for some time and his presence on Melbourne tracks has been missed.

The Cup Day and attendant week-end programme has been announced by the Coburg Gun Club. On the Saturday preceding, October 29, a £50 handicap will be decided in the morning, followed by the Victorian double-barrel championship in the afternoon. During a visit from George Turner, King Island Gun Club's up-to-date Secretary, last month, it was learned that the club intends staging a \$25 open handicap on its well laid out grounds at Currie, on June 5. This will coincide with the visit of many mainland shooters to the Island in connection with the opening of the pheasant season. George advises of the reforming of the new Acclimatisation Society on the Island, with a credit balance of £130. This Body will control the fish, pheasant and game seasons and bag limits. The Tasmanian Fauna Board paid a visit to the Island recently and the local sports were pleased to meet Launceston identity, Bill Rainbird. Bill is a member of the Fauna Board. In order to preserve pheasants the limit bag permitted for the forthcoming season will be four cock birds. The shooting of hens is barred completely. Also, a possession bag of 20 is the maximum. By this it is meant that no shooter can leave the Island with more than 20 birds. This ruling has been introduced to prohibit the wasteful shooting and wholesale destruction of the birds which has been known to take place in recent years.

T. R. (Dick) Wightman is wearing the widest of smiles these days. He has come right back to his best form over the past couple of months and has now introduced Dick Wightman, Jr., to the traps, who, on his showings to the present, bids fair to be perhaps a better shot than his father. Young Dick got his first cut in a five birder at Camberwell recently, shooting 6/6 in a miss-out. He has only shot three or four times, and has the makings of a really good shot, with the right temperament.

Grenfell Club (N.S.W.) has again affiliated with the Association. Grenfell has been more or less in recess since Bill Richardson left for Casino. A good centre for sporting affairs, Grenfell Club should develop into an up-to-date club very quickly.

We do not often hear these days from the great veteran sportsman and world champion trapshot of other days, but in an interesting note last month he reckons, "not too bad for a young fellow"—we are referring to Mr. Donald Macin-

tosh. Mr. Mackintosh, who was an absentee from the recent big Association shoots and International writes:

"I have to thank you for your kind and welcome lines re the International clay pigeon match and hope our boys may come out on top, but they are up against a big population. I would like to have a copy of the conditions of these contests at your leisure, when the results come to hand. I was not feeling fit enough to get along this year but am now pretty well for a young fellow. With all my best wishes to you and yours."

(Mr. Mackintosh, who is the donor of the 100 guinea International trophy, which is now a feature of trapshooting throughout the British Empire, is sure of a warm welcome any time, on any ground, anywhere, and we hope to see him in good form for a visit to the Association's next big feature. Good luck, Mr. Mackintosh.—Ed.)

Cup (Australian National Championship), on March 12. The presentation was made at the Coburg championship shoot, on May 14.

A bunch of Roma (Qld.) shooters visited St. George Club on May 1. They had a day out. The \$50 handicap was won by Nev. Bassett, with a possible 25/25. Five possibles were recorded in the open trophy event, all were Roma boys, Keith Cameron, Nev. Bassett, John Dyson, G. Best and C. R. Fletcher (Club Secretary). Keith Cameron won on the 25th round. The special Roseneath Cup, for teams within a 300 mile radius of St. George, was taken from St. George for the first time by Roma with a margin of 15 birds. To cap it all the Secretary's father, D. (Dad) Fletcher, collected the novice trophy after a shoot-off against three others. (The "300 mile radius" condition has rather intrigued South-erners.—Ed.).

Jack Moore won congratulations for his eagle-like eye success when he won the metropolitan D.B. championships at Footscray (Vic.), on May 21. The tie shoot went to the 30th round and the light was so faint that the referee was almost lying on the ground to ensure correct decisions. Strangely, both tieists, Moore and runner-up, Harry Ceresa, are ex-residents of Bendigo (Vic.).

Dave Watson has again been moved to write his reflections on his recent trip to Deniliquin. Dave writes:

Nomination fees are kept as low as possible in "B" grade in order to meet the pocket requirements of many, who are lads and have not the money to enter in "A" grade competitions. It has been found that "B" graders always display more confidence when they know they are shooting in their own class. The scheme seems to work very well, for club interest is growing continually.

The Burnie (Tas.) shooter, Allan H. Barnes, is apparently a master of brevity. In a brief note recently he said: "Keep up the good work." (We will, Allan—Ed.).

A new champion loomed up at Finley (N.S.W.) last month when "Red," who is actually the young red-headed son of W. F. Robertson, of "Hopewell," Deniliquin (the latter a former President at Deniliquin) won the Riverina single-barrel championship outright, 18/20, from a first class field. It was "Red's" first success of sizable proportions and he was warmly applauded. Now that he has broken into class company he will have more confidence to attack the bigger events in the months to come. The same meeting saw Stan Barrett, one-time Secretary at Griffith, back in winning brackets. He divided the \$25 handicap first prize with Tom Connor. "Kim," otherwise J. Sans, of Surrey Hills (Vic.), gained a most popular win in the Australian Club's premier double-barrel title for 1949 at East Burwood on May 21. "Kim" gave a display reminiscent of his best in pre-war years, when he was back on the 18/19 yard mark. He shot 20 straight, all first barrels. Now he has tasted success in good class company again, "Kim" can be expected to sometimes forego his fondness for the sport Sir Francis Drake made immortal. "Kim's" bowls form has been good during the past year

or two and he has been torn between fondness for two attractive pastimes.

Frank Litchfield, Footscray Club's energetic Secretary, has furnished particulars of the screed which his club wishes to bring under the notice of all affiliated units of the Association in connection with the 1949 competition for the McCraith Shield.

Frank writes: "As holders of the McCraith Shield, Footscray Club now desire to announce arrangements for the challengers to compete against this club for the right to hold this impressive trophy for the ensuing year. The right to challenge the holders shall be decided not later than September 10, 1949, and the following conditions are laid down for the challengers: (1) An elimination event should be staged wherein a club's proposed team of ten will shoot 20 birds from Association handicaps. (2) Official score sheets, duly certified, together with the names of the team members and two emergencies, should be forwarded to the Secretary, Footscray Gun Club, 70 Pickett Street, Footscray, W.11, Vic., on or before September 10, 1949. (3) The team scoring the highest aggregate score will be deemed the challenger and the Shield Match will be shot at Footscray on a date to be determined as soon after September 10, 1949, as practicable. (4) An entry fee of \$5 per team (payable on the day of the match) will be charged to assist in defraying expenses. (5) As uniform ammunition is an express condition of the match, Footscray Club will have an ample supply on sale at the ground on the day appointed."

Frank Litchfield also advises that the shield donor, Mr. Jack McCraith, has also consented to donate replicas to the winning team. Footscray Club will present a handsome trophy to the "high gun" of the final round.

Leeton Gun Club (N.S.W.) will shoot the Riverina walk-up championship on Saturday, October 1. The club's skeet lay-out will be officially opened on June 11, the Saturday prior to King's Birthday holiday.

Coburg Club will shoot the metropolitan double-rise championship at North Coburg on June 25. This will be preceded by the club's double-rise title on June 11.

In the International, Australia registered 1,748 aggregate. A. Love, 118/125 was high from "Dubbs" (V. L. Fankhauser), 117/125 and J. Bryant, 112/120, these three all registered 98/100 over the original course of the event and shot-on. Rowley Pitt, of Hobart, was next with 92/100, then Fred Burns, 91/100. Donnelly scored 15/20 in his title win. At Moree, Ted Holmes registered 23/25 to win from his twin brother, Bob, 22/25, with "Pee-Wee" (Jack Thompson) of St. George, Queensland, in third place, in the N.S.W. title event.

In the Champion of Champions event Burns won 49/50 from Geo. Purcell (Launceston, Tas.), 48/50; J. Bryant, 47/50; "Duxbac," 61/65; W. B. Wilkinson, 60/65; H. Waight, 53/58; W. R. Johns, 48/53; "Brown-ing" (J. L. Lowe), 47/53; W. Rainbird (Tas.), 51/55 and Cdr. C. R. Price, 50/55.

## "REFLECTIONS"

On the "Champion of Champions," "Teams' Match," "International," and other events which led to the shooting of showers of shot at truckloads of targets on Australian Gun Club grounds during the memorable days of 12th and 14th March, 1949.

If these "reflections" are a bit foggy, don't blame me. I'm not shining too brightly at the moment. Propped up in bed with a typewriter balanced precariously on my knees, in a ward full of "cardiac" cases—the majority of whom are here because, like Dave Watson and me, they led such saintly lives between fifteen and fifty—doesn't make it an easy matter to think straight.

It would of course be much easier if the Head Sister wasn't so easy to look at and if the Second Sister's father hadn't been such a polished anatomic architect, and if the Night Sister didn't have those big, soft, brown eyes that keep reminding me of the last time I was in a military hospital—thirty-one years ago!

It might help too if that little nineteen-year-old Nurse who makes the beds near me didn't bend over them quite so far when she smooths out the quilts. I never saw such a better-filled pair of Nylons anywhere. Hell! If I called "PULL!" and got a left quartering target from No. 1 Trap at Burwood I'd quite likely smash a right quarterer from No. 3!

I've been figuring out quite a lot of things while I've been in bed and I've nipped out a plan for winning the next Champion of Champions with my pants down. All I need do is arrange for Freddie Burns, Jack McCraith, George Biggs and the rest of the tribe of top-liners to be shot into this Ward for a week before the event. At the end of that period they'd be so cock-eyed I'd undertake to lick the lot of 'em with a shanghai!

The new system of squadding indication used this year is simple enough for a kindergarten kid to

compre. Bill McCullough should have this indicator photographed and publish the picture in "Clay Pigeon News." It might well be adopted by every congregation of clay-clouters in the Commonwealth and thus avoid that monotonous repetition of:

first purred: "PULL!" I'm quite satisfied that if you slit Freddie open from top to tail of his torso and dissected him with a pair of fine forceps you wouldn't find a solitary nerve in his make-up. But his pretty little pal, Mrs. Freddie, was as jittery as the day she stood beside him and whispered, "I will!" When Freddie lashed out at his 57th bird with a couple of cartridges loaded with dough-nut patterns and only raised a film of dust off a cast iron clay that careered towards the clouds like a tomcat that had suddenly lost all interest in feline philandering, her heart thumped so audibly that everyone in the pavilion looked round to see who had dropped his gun. Great team, those two youngsters.

Jack McCraith was runner-up as usual with a fine score of 58/60. Jack's luck is as stiff as a stalagmite in a limestone cave.

The day Jack wins the Champion of Champions — which he'll do yet, with a perfect score — a roar of heartfelt congratulations will rise from every thirsty throat on the ground, and the loudest voices amongst them will be those of Fred Burns, Horrie Donnelly and George Biggs. Being a good loser is one thing, but a good loser deserves to win sometimes — particularly when he has proved time after time that only a hoodoo stands between him and the honoured hand-out.

the point in most instances. Jock Wilson, the Association's President, delivered several short, but typically virile addresses which started like "Anthony's Oration" and ended in words that, had Robert Close used them in "Love Me Sailor," he'd have served his full sentence. Verbatim they ran: "Shooters! (pause) . . . SHOOTERS ! ! (pause of similar duration to first one) . . . S H O O O - T E R S ! ! ! . . . (pause of similar duration to first one) YOU ———! . . . IF YOU WONT ——— WELL LISTEN, YOU CAN ALL GO TO ———." Tumultuous applause in each instance drowned his final eloquence and the crowd chorused a lyric which querulously queried why Jock should have been endowed at birth with such striking beauty and even debated the wisdom of his parents in having brought him into the world at all.

Shortly before a succession of "raspberry-like" sounds were heard emanating from the sparrows roosting in Vic. Fankhauser's fruit trees, the party broke up, Vic. staggered

away to a bed that had remained unruffled for more than forty-eight hours and the 1949 "Champion of Champions" was already an historic event.

Presentation of the prizes was carried out on the Monday by those two very personable people—Jock Wilson and dear old Dave Watson, Presidents respectively of the A.C.P.T.S.A. and Australian Gun Club. In rich, fruity accents, redolent of "haggis" and Mountain Dew, that even eclipsed the "tone poems" murmured into the microphone all morning by "Muggs" McInnes—the man in the mutilated millinery—these two called the prize winners to the pavilion and presented them with the dinner sets and utility sets of choice china ware.

The only suggestion I have to offer is that next year a "consolation" prize should be provided for the tail-end of the tournament. It could be of china too—decorously decorated with "Dandelions" round the rim and with a clay target, hand painted by William Dobell, in the bottom.

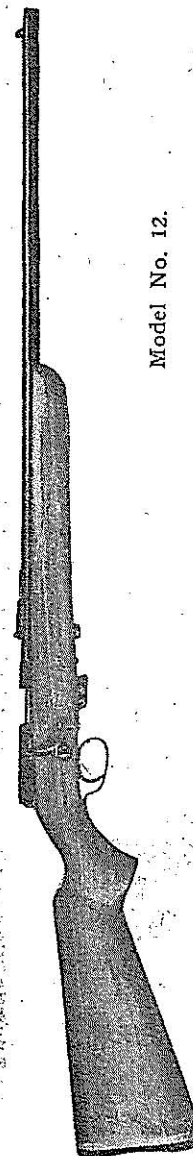

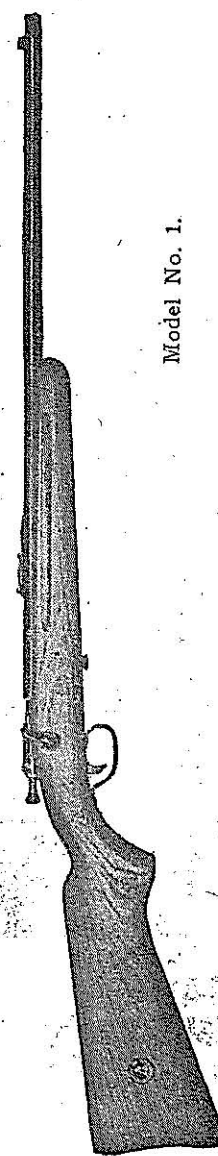
