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

THE EDITOR'S NOTEBOOK

With the holding of the Australian Clay Pigeon Trap Shooting Association's all day shoot on June 13 (King's Birthday Holiday), on the East Burwood grounds-of the Australian Clay Target Club, body's competition that shooting for the current season will be concluded. The programme, as already advertised, is most attractive. The morning will be given over to the deciding of the Intermediate Association Championship.

This is a 20 bird event and no shooter whose handicap on June 13, 1949, exceeds 16 yards will be eligible to compete. The reaction among shooters on forward marks has been most noticeable. This is particularly applicable to shooters in country clubs. Many feel that, with the top liners ineligible for the competition, a very interesting contest will result among those not usually seen winning

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contest up to the importance of the Champion of Champion's Cup (Australian National Championship).

Forty-five birds will be released to each contestant in the handicap, which will be decided from Association marks. (The Association reserves the right to alter or change any shooter's handicap at any time.)

Squadding of shooters will operate under the same conditions as the recent March fixtures. Names and squad number will be called as soon as the draw is completed - squad numbers only will be called afterwards. In the Intermediate Championship competitors will make two visits to the tracks, that is to say they will shoot 10 birds from No. 1 trap and a similar number from No. 2 trap. In the handicap competitors will shoot at fifteen birds per visit (three from each track) with one visit to each of the three tracks to complete the forty-five birds complement.

Clubs shooting championships under A.C.P.T.S.A. rules are requested to observe the Association By-law, which directs that no championship should be commenced later than 2.30 p.m. during the winter months. That is during May, June, July and August. The shorter days have a tendency to upset the equity of the competition and all clubs should bear this in mind.



U.S.A. Shooting

Our American correspondent, Mr. Rex Miles, provides a tip this month having reference to the use of shooting glasses. Mr. Miles says:

"Always wear them at least an hour before you shoot, to get your eyes accustomed to the shade. It will be found that, particularly on a dull day or poor light, they will bring the target out more distinctly. Many of our boys put them on in the morning and wear them all day—I used to do this when I was in my best shooting days."

Mr. Miles goes on to mention that Washington State Association has just held its big Inland Empire Shoot—close on 600 entries, "in fact, entries had to be refused, we just could not handle any more than 600, even with our twelve traps."

Despite gusty wind the scores were good. President of the Spokane Club, Bill Meyerhoff, stopping 198/200 on the first day (16 yards) 49/50 pairs second day, 100/100 third day and 98/100 on the final day, (a Sunday). He actually missed four "down-the-line" targets in 400, or 99 per cent. "kills." He shoots from 23 yards in handicaps and according to Mr. Miles is the best shooter in the Washington State area during the past 38 years. In 1947 he was "high-gun" for the whole of U.S.A., that is on 3,000 registered targets from 16 yards, his grand average was .9880.

The recent Inland Empire Handicap was won by an unknown shooter, H. B. Kautz, with a perfect 100 straight (18 yards). There were, strangely, no 99's, but seven 98's. It should be understood that the above scores are all registered under single barrel conditions.

The following is reprinted from the King Island "News" and is an extract from the paper, "King Islander," of May 11, 1910.

Bryant, 112/120, these three all registered 93/100 over the original course of the event and shot-on. Rowley Pitt, of Hobart, was next with 92/100, then Fred Burns, 91/100. Donelly scored 15/20 in his title win. At Moree, Ted Holmes registered 23/25 to win from his twin brother, Bob, 22/25, with "Pee-Wee" (Jack Thompson) of St. George, Queensland, in third place, in the N.S.W. title event.

In the Champion of Champions event Burns won 49/50 from Geo. Purcell (Launceston, Tas.), 48/50; J. Bryant, 47/50; "Duxbac," 61/65; W. B. Wilkinson, 60/65; H. Waight, 53/58; W. R. Johns, 48/53; "Browning" (J. L. Lowe), 47/53; W. Rainbird (Tas.), 51/55 and Cdr. C. R. Price, 50/55.

"REFLECTIONS"

On the "Champion of Champions," "Teams' Match," "International," and other events which led to the shooting of showers of shot at truckloads of targets on Australian Gun Club grounds during the memorable days of 12th and 14th March, 1949.

If these "reflections" are a bit foggy, don't blame me. I'm not shining too brightly at the moment. Propped up in bed with a typewriter balanced precariously on my knees, in a ward full of "cardiac" cases—the majority of whom are here because, like Dave Watson and me, they led such saintly lives between fifteen and fifty—doesn't make it an easy matter to think straight.

It would of course be much easier if the Head Sister wasn't so easy to look at and if the Second Sister's father hadn't been such a polished anatomic architect, and if the Night Sister didn't have those big, soft, brown eyes that keep reminding me of the last time I was in a military hospital — thirty-one years ago!

It might help too if that little nineteen-year-old Nurse who makes the beds near me didn't bend over them quite so far when she smoothes out the quilts. I never saw such a better-filled pair of Nylons anywhere. Hell! If I called "PULL!" and got a left quartering target from No. 1 Trap at Burwood I'd quite likely smash a right quarterer from No. 3!

I've been figuring out quite a lot of things while I've been in bed and I've nutted out a plan for winning the next Champion of Champions with my pants down. All I need do is arrange for Freddie Burns, Jack McCraith, George Biggs and the rest of the tribe of top-liners to be shot into this Ward for a week before the event. At the end of that period they'd be so cock-eyed I'd undertake to lick the lot of 'em with a shanghai!

The new system of squadding indication used this year is simple enough for a kindergarten kid to

compre. Bill McCullough should have this indicator photographed and publish the picture in "Clay Pigeon News." It might well be adopted by every congregation of clay-clouters in the Commonwealth and thus avoid that monotonous repetition of:

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the point in most instances. The only suggestion I have to offer is that next year a "consolation" prize should be provided for the tailender of the tournament. It could be of china too — decorously decorated with "Dandelions" round the rim and with a clay target, hand painted by William Dobell, in the bottom.
